# CLEOBURY COUNTRY'S A.G.M.

Changes are coming Cleobury Country, with Dr Chris Dimond stepping down from the board and planning to move away to a quieter life. He certainly deserves it, and could sign off his time in office with a report of progress continuing. A modest profit was shown and Shropshire Council had agreed to an investment grant of £20,000 in the Neen Sollars Hydro Cooperative because of faith in Cleobury Country's ability to oversee its use.

First guest speaker was Paul Steadman of training service Cognex in Billingsley. He gave some sobering figures on Health and Safety with and without proper training and left you strongly preferring the proper option.

Philip Dunne then spoke and took questions on the Coalition Government's plans for the rural economy, which produces £85bn of the country's total Gross Domestic Product of about £600bn. He explained that the Rural Policy Statement expected from DEFRA in May will outline emphasis future on diversification the agribusiness (horrible word!), the development of a Broadband service by 2016 that will be the fastest in Europe with 25 mbg in some areas and developing rural groups rather in the style of Cleobury Country. There will be some investment available to develop new enterprises, such as a timber based energy scheme in this area. A questioner pointed out that in Estonia they are developing a Broadband scheme with a 100mbg rating, so there's plenty of competition out there.

Mr Dunne rounded off the evening with a tribute to Dr Dimond and the work he has put in to both get Cleobury Country started and put it on a very sound footing; a long ovation from the 50 or more people present spoke volumes. His successor will be elected from within the committee, which now includes new members Graham Kelly, Errol Dyer, Simon Hector, William Henry and Val Smith.

Rather sadly, for the second year running a buoyant AGM ended with a minor matter interrupting what should have been the final high note. Whoever takes over as chair will have to look at this in future and apply a little firm discipline; the event does not deserve a Mickey Mouse ending. *Jim Reynolds*

### Philip Dunne MP - Letter from Westminster

Her Majesty the Queen visited Parliament last month to address both Commons and Lords as part of her 60th Anniversary tour around the country.

What an occasion it was; we British do pageantry well. Two thousand of us assembled, seated by the Parliamentary door-keepers with their gold badges of office, the Prime Minister and former Prime Ministers at the front, other Members of Parliament and Peers, their wives, husbands and office staff spread out behind. I sat amongst junior Ministers near the back.

While we waited, the band of the Scots Guards played, the Queen's Body Guard of the Yeomen of the Guard marched in with their pikestaffs, followed by Her Majesty's Body Guard of the Corps of Gentlemen in their white plumed helmets, the State Trumpeters of the Household Cavalry, the Lord's Speaker with her be-wigged clerks processed in followed by the Speaker of the Commons. We could tell Her Majesty was arriving when we heard the BBC and Sky helicopters hovering overhead.

Her Majesty arrived as Big Ben struck and walked slowly up the long aisle, the Duke of Edinburgh at her side, both smiling. Westminster Hall is the most imposing building within the Parliamentary estate. It was constructed by William II in 1097 and is all that survives from the Palace of Westminster originally built by Edward the Confessor. It has the largest medieval timber hammer-beam roof in Northern Europe, with magnificent carving, added by Richard II.

When a bomb landed on the House of Commons in 1941, the main Chamber caught fire. Prime Minister Winston Churchill told the Chief Fire Officer to let the Chamber burn, but to do all he could to save Westminster Hall. The firemen


saved the roof. But the glass in the north window over the main entrance was damaged and replaced with clear glass. The Queen's Diamond Jubilee was the inspiration for a new set of windows, with stained glass image of her royal coat of arms, unveiled by Her Majesty. The windows were commissioned by MPs and Peers through personal donations.

The Queen celebrates the 60th year of her reign, only the second monarch to do so. She has been a constant unifying influence throughout this time. She carries the greatest respect of any Head of State around the globe. During her reign she has developed the Commonwealth, now comprising 54 countries covering one third of the world's population, with more countries seeking to join. She remains Head of State herself of 16 countries. She has been served by 12 Prime Ministers and 8 Archbishops of Canterbury. She has reigned during a period of immense change, presided over a people mostly at peace and with generally rising prosperity.

The Queen re-dedicated herself to continued public service. She has been a shining example to all who devote themselves to the service of others. Later in June we will all have the opportunity to celebrate her Jubilee through the extended public holidays. Across the country celebrations will take place, including Shropshire, where beacons will be lit, street held parties and trees planted in commemoration.

I hope readers will join in and join me in celebrating the Queen's Diamond Jubilee, a once in a life-time event for us all.

### The Severn Edge Vets Pets Page

Jeremy Hall, with tales of a sick fish, Bubbles the kitten frustrated and parasites in our pets, with advice on the treatment:

I join you this month having had a terrible time with my fish tank. I can't blame Bubbles my kitten; try as he might, he has still not managed to catch anything through the 8mm safety glass. I think, in the end that something has disrupted the 'ecosystem' of my tank, and caused a build up of Nitrate in the water. My poor fish have been stressed and ill with a disease called WhiteSpot.

Luckily for them, the prescribed treatment from my preferred aquatics shop seems to have helped the situation. WhiteSpot is a parasitic disease of fish. The parasite lives in the water, but part of the normal lifecycle involves multiplication on the surface of scales and fins - showing these little tiny white spots on nearly every fish in the tank. These are itchy, and damaging to the protective layer that keeps them swimming so elegantly. Normally – the fish will fight this parasite off with their own immune system, but in stressful conditions – for example if the filter fails – toxins buildup in the water and the fish are just too sick to fight off the parasite.

So, as well as treating the parasite I have had to complete several large scale water changes in the tank to freshen up their supply. I have since found that the filter was not working efficiently, fixed it, and everything is returning to normal.

If you are worried about your fish tank's water quality, have a chat with your local aquatics retailer, and maybe pick up a home water test kit to check everything is OK. I cannot claim to be a fish vet, I only have a small tank with coldwater fish, so questions would be best directed to the professionals in the aquatics shops.

Parasites do not only affect fish. Dogs and cats can catch a whole host of things. We are fortunate to have reliable control strategies in place for these. April at Severn Edge is Worming Awareness Month and we will be offering 10% off worming treatment for dogs and cats.

Worms don't only cause a problem to the dog or cat that is harbouring them, but can also pose a public health risk. For example dogs can carry a worm called Toxacara canis, a parasite that can lead to blindness in humans, particularly young children who pick it up from the environment when dog mess has not been cleaned up properly. Our recommended worming protocol

for dogs from two months old is worming every month until six months, then every two to three months after that. A tablet wormer will usually be sufficient. Cats follow the same strategy from two months onwards, but may need worming more frequently in adult life depending on their hunting habits. Puppies and kittens younger than two months old still need worming, but I will not discuss the requirements in this article.

April will also see the recurrence of a television advertising campaign to raise awareness of lungworm in dogs. This parasite is being seen and diagnosed more frequently by vets around the UK. It spreads when an unlucky dog eats, or inadvertently swallows an infected slug or snail. If you are worried that your pet may be at risk, pop in for a chat; there are ways of treating and preventing the problem.

We look forward to welcoming you into the surgery to pick up worming treatments. Please feel free to bring your pet with you. It is always nice to make a fuss of them, weigh them, and it provides a 'good' experience of the vets for them. We do need an up to date weight to be able to dispense the correct dose of worming treatment to you.

As always, thank you for reading, and I look forward to reporting a fully recovered fish next month.

What lovely weather we've had recently! This has enabled us to get out in our large garden and play in the sun. The garden is split into several areas so the children can choose to go in the digging pit, climb and balance on the climbing frame, play in the wendy house, sit quietly on the logs or of course there's ride on's, scooters, balls, hoops, bats......the list goes on! Outdoor learning is an important aspect of nursery life as we recognise that some children prefer to learn outside rather than be sat at a table. During the warmer weather we take a lot of our activities outside so the children can experience them in different environments. 



### Clive Davies' Westwood Farm Diary


WESTWOOD FARM DIARY March 21st


It is said that things often come in threes. So they do, GKN, Three Counties Agricultural Society and Crosby Stills and Nash to mention, well, three. It also seems like this at Westwood just now. We are into lambing currently and trios seem to be cropping up all over the place. There are three main issues, lamb crop, malpresentation and the patience of the shepherd. Firstly, when the ewes were pregnancy scanned, it revealed that two of the twenty ewes put with the rams were barren. This was unfortunate because not only did this represent an obviously high percentage and the disappointment of these two not being able to produce young but also for the first time since introducing the Shropshires, we had not bred from all our ewe flock. Thus, over the four lambing times, at least this demonstrated it was our time for some misfortune. What the scanning also showed was that one ewe was expecting triplets and sure enough she has produced and all three are looking happy enough with life at the moment. The lambing period didn't get off to the best of starts, in fact, most likely the worst run of success when compared with recent past lambings. The first ewe to lamb had a 'Ringwomb' which is the name often given to the situation of an undilated cervix. However, with time and some patience, she produced a couple of lambs and went onto a three day course of antibiotics. Another early offering was a ewe lambing during the night but without the lamb's front legs being presented. Unfortunately, as can often be the case in these circumstances, the lamb was dead when eventually delivered. The ewe went onto a three day course of antibiotics. The third issue is with a lamb that has been very slow to decide whether or not to bother living. It

appears that he is choosing to stay on this Earth for a while longer just yet but has required just about every remedy, other than a three day course of antibiotics, various feeding methods and some of the time consuming forms of encouragement best known to man, or at least this shepherd. Anyway, everything is settling down quite well now, the lambs are strong, by and large, the ewes milking well and the weather just great. Ewes and lambs are going out to grass now and into three different locations. With sun on their backs, grass under their feet and no more set-backs the 2012 crop, if not numerous should hopefully be successful and rewarding for this developing enterprise. Three other groups of sheep have received some attention just lately. The ewes approaching their first birthday were shorn about a month ago and have now been turned-out onto The Furlongs, behind the Sun & Slipper. This early shearing is so that the sheep will grow-on better and be in a presentable state for the breeding sheep sales in summertime. The rams have also been shorn for the same reason. The three rising yearlings have settled OK. Well, they had until we attempted to put our Champion yearling ram from last year in with them. He of course is nearly two years old, or two shear as some will call him and for fairly obvious reasons. The difficulty is though that when mixing rams strange to one another, they need to develop a pecking-order and get fairly aggressive in the process. We have them in a relatively small pen so that they cannot damage each other too much. It is hoped that after about a three week period they can be turned out. However, a well experienced friend has indicated that peace can take about twelve months! Time, we haven't got, just The Good, The Bad and The Ugly!



#### **Clerk's Progress Report for March 2012**

Plans for the new toilet block are being reviewed and we are pushing ahead.

After a call from the public last year, the Parking Review is producing some useful comments, which are put in a folder in Clerks office to be reviewed. Please keep them coming.

Some people are still parking on the Zig Zags outside the Talbot which is causing problems.

After a concern about the missing Welcome to Shropshire Sign on the road to Clows Top, it will be replaced in due course.

Big Tidy Up litter picks. We need areas where litter is bad so please let me know.

As a result of meetings with Highways and Western Power, the streetlights in Church Walk and Steeple close will be done on 28<sup>th</sup> March. Western Power have pencilled in the earliest date of April 2<sup>nd</sup> to connect them. Please be aware that Church walk will be having the underground cables put in, so the path may be closed for a couple of days.

## MATT'S IN THE LONDON MARATHON



We photographed Matt when he was just back from an easy six-mile training run. Next weekend it would be 20 miles.

IT consultant Matt Yarranton has a novel approach to getting away from the demands of travelling all over Europe and spending hours staring at a computer screen. He goes running. Serious running. Like marathons.

"About seven years ago I needed to lose some weight and get fit," he recalls. "A mate was doing half marathons and I did the Great North Run with him. I wanted to keep on and did half marathons until there was a chance to do the real thing - the Berlin Marathon in 2009." He did other big runs, like the Three Peaks and Lyke's Wakes, then in 2010 took on the Dublin Marathon. He had try to get in the Virgin London Marathon, the big one with about 50,000 entries and regularly oversubscribed. His best chance would be raising money for charity. Matt's choice was Get Kids Going, which funds wheelchairs for disabled

youngsters to take part in these events. He was accepted - "It's the one to go for, in Olympic Year," he reasons and has been in training for months.

His basic circuit is from Cleobury through Bayton, Clows Top, Buckeridge, Far Forest, Furnace Mill, Kinlet, Bagginswood, Neen Savage and back home. According to the schedule's demands, he drops sections out or adds more to hit his target. When we talked on March 24th it was a resting weekend with just six miles to do; on the 31st the target was 20 and from then on it reduced as he built up strength and "carbed up" his reserves before the big day on April 22nd.

He'll need those physical reserves, and reckons he'll burn about 3,000 calories and lose half a stone. In training he carries a two litre water backpack; in the event he'll use roadside supplies.

Matt's minimum target is £1500 for the charity, and he's already taken in £600 from a Quiz and Curry Night at Neen Sollars. You can support him, as the Clarion has done. Call him on 07870 655587 to pledge, up to the end of the month. That way you can become part of the biggest fund raising event in the world - £557 million so far!

And we have two other local lads in training for The Big One. Wayne Smith of Hobson's is raising funds for Tommy's, a child death research charity and Rob Cooper of Gecko Carpentry runs for Monty's Corner, which helps parents whose children anr suffering from cancer. The Clarion wishes them all sucess in running and raising money.

#### A GLIMPSE OF THE 70S

The annual Cleobury Show was a very big event, with lots of floats laden with enthusiasts of all ages. Who won the wards? We don't know and it didn't matter, it was just a big day.

Where did they go camping? Another mystery to most, but some very young faces were identified, including the late Tom Pain and Jack Castle. Those were the days when a Ford Consul was regarded as a pretty posh car and the upmarket Range Rover hadn't been invented.

An evening of pleasant nostalgia for those who lived here 40 years ago and some surprises for newer comers who thought that not much happened. All those years ago the place had a buzz of its own.

## Clarion Clippings - The Local News Tim and Rob's Breakthrough Design

And this is the complete unit, which can sleep up to four people and comes complete with toilet, shower and washing facilities. All wired up and ready to plug into the site electrical system. Easy camping.

Tim Preece's Timber Buildings business on the Old Station Business Park has got another success on the expanding order books. A festival promoter liked the look of Tim's new Isabella portable unit, but needed to carry eight on one flat-bed truck.

Tim got together with Rob Gittens, a relative newcomer to the company, and they worked out how to build the 16' x 8' unit with the floor in two parts. The back half contains the shower, washroom and toilet, with all the electrics built into the walls. The front half folds down and bolts into place and the walls, bunks, door and whatever extras the customer orders fit into place. It takes just six bolts to put the main structure together, which means the unit can be put up for the event, and then dismantled and moved on to the next location.

Tim gives full credit to Rob for his thinking and input on the design, and after less than a year with the company, Rob is now in charge of Small Unit Assembly. An ex pupil of Lacon Childe School, he's the classic Local Boy Makes Good.

The first order is for 20 units and there's strong interest from Glastonbury, where an alternative to tents in their traditional quagmire will command good rentals. And it all comes from an attitude of 'what the customer wants, here in Cleobury Mortimer they can make it'.

There's a more traditional version, complete with cast iron wheels, on the stocks and if the customer wants the Isabella to use as a cook house or a shower block, they'll do that too.

This is a company that doubled its sales last year, just when some people were talking gloom, doom and the end of life as we know it. Good old Shropshire common sense and skill rules.

# IN BUSINESS Dan Jones Plumbing



Dan puts the finishing touches to a typical bathroom refurbishment. He can handle everything, from planning water and heating systems, tiling and installing the hardware and flooring, and even the painting.

#### HAPPY IN HIS WORK

Eight years ago Dan Jones left Worcester College with a GNVQ in Advanced Engineering. "It gave me a wide knowledge, but not much practical experience," he admits with the grin of a man who's learned the hands-on stuff since.

"I asked people where I should be looking for work and a lot of them said they wouldn't go into engineering. My dad was building houses and he gave me lots of experience. I seemed to fit in better with the plumbing side." He signed up for a course in Birmingham, where he gained practical experience and had no problems with the theory as a trained engineer. With supprt from the Gateway Token Course via the Job Centre and a grant from the Prince's Trust to finance tools. buying Dan Iones Plumbing was born.

He's learned a lot since then and has kept his skills up to date, like getting the Part P Certificate that shows he's approved to handle electrical work related to his plumbing. That way he can get an installation done without waiting for a sparks to fit in with his needs.

At first he took on a lot of subcontract work on building projects, to pay the bills until his own reputation could be established. Today his work is mostly domestic, with contacts via his Clarion advert and personal recommendations. Let's be straight about this: Clarion adverts are a good way of reaching people, but in a personal business that involves having a tradesman in your house for several days, personal recommendation is always the best.

As his name has spread, so the work has become more varied, like the complete refurbishment of a house he's just booked. For that he can call on other local tradesmen, in this case Wade Davies to handle the flooring and help with painting. "Some of the refurbishment work is like stepping into a time capsule," he explains. "I've taken the side off a bath and found a newspaper, lunch wrappings and all sorts of bits, just left there by whoever did the original job."

Does he still enjoy the work? "Yes," he says without hesitation. "There's a lot of satisfaction in doing the job, then standing back and seeing how it looks. It's like a reward at the end of the day." Being happy in his work makes life easier, with four children to care for and feed. He's a very proud dad.

So was that decision to become a plumber eight years ago the right one? "I like living in a rural community. I'd be better off working in a city, but I grew up here, I like working here and it's a good place to bring up children."
