George Munro heard the noise and was quickly on the spot with his camera. We'll let him tell the story:

A familiar grinding sound at 2.40pm on March 16th announced yet another vehicle making contact with the stone walls. At this time school traffic, including the buses, was due and so it fell to local residents to send messages to the schools, place warning cones and redirect traffic. This included a first responder with lights flashing en route to a patient; one hopes the delay caused no harm. A massive traffic jam had been averted and there was nothing left for the police to do when they turned up two hours later. Four hours after the encounter with the walls, a rescue vehicle moved the rear of the lorry

around so that it could continue its journey.

The drivers had misunderstood the sign, and this may not just be due to their language difficulties, as it happens regularly to drivers of all nationalities. The present sign showing the weight limit does not warn them of the problems due to the width and length of their vehicle. An HGV sign with far more specific information and warning is needed; better still, stop all lorries from using this part of the road.

FENCING THE SCHOOL GROUNDS

Lacon Childe School issued the following statement to explain the fencing of the playing fields:

The safeguarding of pupils is becoming increasingly an significant consideration in the running of schools and something that Osfted, the body responsible for the regulation and inspection of education services in the UK, sees as one of their key priorities. The importance that Ofsted places in this area is underlined by the fact that there have been a number of cases recently where previously good outstanding schools have been placed into special measures on the basis that safeguarding controls have been deemed to be inadequate.

For some time now the governing body at Lacon Childe School has been concerned that having playing fields that are open and therefore allow unrestricted access to the school grounds is a situation that has the potential to compromise the safety and well-being of pupils. As a result of this, the school has taken a decision to erect a perimeter fence around its playing fields. This means that the security of the school site

will be greatly enhanced whilst also ensuring that members of the public will still be able to use the public footpath which will be unaffected by this development.

Darren Reynolds, Headteacher at Lacon Childe, said "We have thought hard and long about this and is not a decision that has been taken lightly. As Headteacher my first priority has to be the safety of our students and I believe that continuing to allow unrestricted access to the school we are failing in our duty of Unfortunately have examples where the safety of our students has been compromised and therefore I believe that this is something that we needed to address as a matter of importance. arriving at this outcome we have consulted with people who continue to have legitimate access to the school site.

THE BREAKFAST CLUB

Starting with the historic 'driving of the last spike', symbolising the joining-up of the Union Pacific and the Central Pacific Railroads in 1869, Chris provided a brief survey of the evolution, and decline, of passenger railways in the USA. Predictably, the system peaked in the early years of the 20th century, and then contracted under the combined pressures of road and air transport.

In 1971 the US Federal Government intervened to save what was left of long-distance passenger rail transport, creating AMTRAK, government-sponsored company operating passenger trains over privately owned track. Many of the private companies still operate profitable freight trains (some over two miles long), and freight now takes precedence over passenger traffic, often creating delays for the latter. The current passenger network has shrunk so much in the last hundred years that there are now whole states without any passenger rail services at all.

Long-distance passenger rail journeys are therefore now largely undertaken for pleasure rather than for business, which means that the average rail passenger is a little out of the ordinary, and Chris and Heather had met some interesting people on their travels. Having crossed the USA on all three East-West and links. undertaken other numerous shorter journeys, Chris was well placed to give us an insight into the

pleasures of this form of travel, almost all of which uses doubledecked trains, whose provide observation cars unrivalled views the of American countryside and mountains. It looked wonderful!

The first steps to finding your new best friend

Even before you go to visit your new companion your investigation work begins, you need to ensure the puppy or kitten you're about to buy is happy and healthy. You can't be too nosey; ring and ask questions.

Did the breeder breed the puppies or kittens - it isn't a good idea to buy from anyone other than the breeder. Who was the father (sire) and would he be present to visit? If not, find out if you can contact his owner; ask plenty of questions about his temperament, health and other litters.

If you're happy with the breeders and their answers, you need to visit. Always make sure you see mum with her offspring together, it's often best to arrange a viewing when there's more than one puppy / kitten to see. Do the kittens well or interact puppies together? Look for signs of illness such as runny eyes, sneezes or diarrhoea on their tails, also make sure mum is healthy and watch them all in their environment before making your choice.

There are lots of important pieces of information to find out about your new little one. Ask about its environment and routine, what does it eat and how often ask to see a sample or a bag of food, can you buy this yourself or take some home? Where is the puppy or kitten kept, has it interacted with lots of people, has it been exposed to noises such as television, vacuum cleaners or children? A puppy, which has been in a quiet environment, may have to be carefully

introduced to new experiences to make sure it doesn't grow up afraid!

Find out about its medical history, have the puppies had their vaccinations, are they micro chipped? Has the litter been wormed? It's worth doing a spot of research about your chosen breed also! Are there any problem diseases they are susceptible to, for example, British Short Haired cats can inherit certain heart deformities and Labrador Retrievers, unfortunately, can pass on genes for poor hip and elbow structure. Different breeds have different screening tests to make sure the chance of passing inherited diseases is low, ask to see certificates of screening for problem diseases, vaccinations, and micro chipping.

When you are ready to choose an individual pet, don't be rushed, spend plenty of time with the litter and watch the puppies or kittens grow – hopefully one of them will become your responsibility and will enrich your life for many years to come.

CLEOBURY PATIENTS' VOICE

The most significant news of the last month has been the retention, for now, of Shropdoc, the cooperative of local GPs which provides an excellent out-of-hours service for which many of us have had cause to be grateful. The plan was to put this service out to tender at a regional West Midlands level in conjunction with the muchtroubled 111 non-emergency telephone helpline. Following a public outcry, the part of the plan that would have affected Shropdoc has been postponed until 2018. However, the local health authority (now known as Shropshire CCG) has refused to guarantee the existence of a separate, dedicated phone number for Shropdoc beyond October this year: watch this space.

Shropshire CCG is in "special measures". This means there is a team of external accountants crawling all over it to see how it can manage its finances more effectively. The CCG is required to find savings – or make cuts, depending on your viewpoint – of £19million next year, and we have already heard that knee and hip operations are being

scaled back in order to save money. If you have been affected by measures such as this, CPV would like to hear about it.

On a brighter note, NHS England has published the results of its GP Patient Survey for 2015. Overall, Shropshire scored above the national average and Cleobury Mortimer scored above the Shropshire average in most categories. It ranked amongst the top ten practices (out of 45) for confidence and trust in both GPs and nurses, helpfulness of receptionists, waiting times and overall experience. When it came to success in getting an appointment and convenience of that appointment, Cleobury matched the Shropshire and national averages, respectively.

CPV meets at the Medical Centre every third Monday of the month at 6:30pm. The objective of the group is to promote positive patient involvement in monitoring, improving communications about, and developing our local health and social care services. THE HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY

Kath Thornton of Rock gave a thought provoking illustrated talk on the plight of the bumble bee to our March meeting. There are only 24 different types of bumble bee in the United Kingdom. They have a very distinctive furry body and it is the pattern of the stripes or the colour that distinguishes them from one another. They also have favourite parts of the country so what we see here in Cleobury will not be the type you would see in Scotland.

Bees are hardworking lovable creatures but their populations have declined during the last 80 years. We have lost many of our hay meadows with the wild flowers the bees enjoy collecting nectar and pollen therefore their sources have disappeared so the bee has turned to our gardens more and more. As a result of this, some garden centres are labelling plants that are a good food source for the bees and we are encouraged to plant such species. Farmers are being encouraged reintroduce wild flower areas their land either meadows or around the edges of their cultivated fields.

The queen is the only bee to survive the winter in the nest and when conditions are right she will venture out and get food before making a new nest and laying her eggs. She relies on the nectar she has collected as she keeps the eggs warm. They take about two weeks to hatch and then a new colony is ready to carry on the very important work of pollinating our plants. Without them many

of our food sources would not produce the seeds and fruits that we consume, they are a very important creature that we should not take for granted.



Letter from Westminster - Philip Dunne MP

With Easter falling early, spring is very much in the air. A wonderful time to appreciate the natural beauty of the Ludlow Constituency, and to celebrate new life, both through the resurrection of Christ and the seasonal reawakening of plants and animals. Leaves are greening hedgerows and trees and lambs leaping around the fields.

Next month, this will be celebrated at the Royal Horticultural Society's Malvern Spring Festival, from 5th to 8th May. I am delighted to be attending as this year's President of the Royal Three Counties Show. I hope to see some familiar faces from South Shropshire exhibiting at the Spring Festival, and others at the agricultural Royal Three Counties Show from 17th-19th June.

As England's largest livestock and equine show, the Royal Three Counties celebrates the best of rural life and farming. This sector has been at the heart of the Marches counties' economic and cultural heritage for centuries. Farmers have faced some tough times recently, so these Shows provide welcome opportunities to demonstrate the best of British rural life.

As a farmer myself, I am acutely aware of the current challenges facing many in farming communities. We have just had two cows test positive for Bovine TB recently, the seventh time in recent years. Any farmer will tell you of the distress caused by Bovine TB, but it affects us all, not only piling pressure on British producers, but also adding to costs in the shops and costing taxpayers £100 million each year. The Government is working through a 25 year multipronged strategy to eliminate the disease. This is

essential and momentum needs to be maintained.

It is worth making clear that it is not just livestock farming that is facing pressure. Statistics from the Department for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs show that in the last five years, incomes in horticulture have fallen by 43%. Arable farms have been hit by falling global prices, as incomes from cereals and general cropping have more than halved since 2010.

To alleviate pressure on farming, the Government is taking action to enable a productive, resilient food industry by further cutting red tape (there have been 34,000 fewer farm inspections a year since 2010), as well as working to create more apprenticeships and grow our skills base. Since 2010 more than 600 new export markets for UK food and drink have been opened, nearly three a week, growing sales by over £1 billion.

From this month tax changes come into effect to enable farmers to average their incomes for tax purposes across a five year period, rather than the previous two, reflecting seasonal differences and volatility in food prices. This should also help farmers in South Shropshire.

While industry pressures need to be tackled, there are plenty of encouraging things going on in the countryside. I am pleased that my Parliamentary Private Secretary is leading the campaign to restore hedgehog numbers, working with the British Hedgehog Preservation Society, whose Chief Executive leads this organisation from her home on Clee Hill. I am taking a close interest in their progress.


In contrast to the unusually large number of reported crimes in the last issue, this month there are only five, (that's only five too many).

Overnight on February 17th/18th there was a burglary at Clee Hill Plant Ltd., where a large number of tools were stolen from a workshop and office. On March 2nd/3rd power tools were stolen from an outhouse at a dwelling in Pound Bank. The whole exhaust system, including a catalytic converter, worth £2000, was stolen from a Mercedes Sprinter van which was parked in Stanbrook Road, Burford. This happened overnight on There 9th/10th. March was attempted burglary at a house in Burford between 10:15am and 10:15pm on March 12th. At 8:00am on March 15th it was discovered that a securely locked Ford Transit van which had been parked overnight in front of The Talbot, High Street, had been stolen. There had been a number of tools inside the van.

March 18th was National Child Sexual Exploitation Awareness Day. The object of this was partly to bring to everyone's attention a crime that can affect any child, anywhere, regardless of social or ethnic background. Sexual exploitation occurs when child has been a persuaded that the sexual activities they are involved in are a normal part of adult life. The offender will try to drive a wedge between the child and parents or carers. Young girls (and boys), are groomed and then abused leaving them traumatised, potentially with permanent psychological harm. There are several useful numbers available for anyone who needs to discuss their concerns relating to children. These can be found on the West Mercia website along with more information about 'CSE', the signs to look out for and what to do if 'CSE' is suspected.



On the Buses - Steve Todd reports

Another fun month which included the second Local Joint Committee meeting to discuss the 2L service. But more of that shortly. The usual rash of breakdowns continues leavened with other adventures – never let it be said that travelling with Diamond is dull.

One morning, passengers arrived to board the early bus to Kiddy to find the driver and a supervisor peering at vapour coming from the back of the bus. When they boarded, the supervisor repeatedly asked for all the windows to be opened to prevent 'the fumes getting to the driver'. These attempts appear to have failed as although things went well until the steep climb up into Far Forest (the one with the solid white line and blind bend at the top) when the driver decided to overtake the vehicle in front... True, this was only a digger but in an ailing Diamond bus with a lorry coming the other way? - no, me neither. Still the lorry was missed (just) and Bewdley was reached in one whereupon the driver dismounted for 15 minutes for a fag, presumably to settle his nerves. History does not relate how the passengers felt.

Just this week, passengers caught the 9.38 into Ludlow with no problems and intended to return on the 12.20. Departure time came and went with no sign of a bus until eventually, a passer by told them that the service wasn't picking up from Corve Street as roadworks meant it had to return by the same route it arrived and was picking up at Tesco. There was no notice at the stop and the driver that had delivered them had said nothing. As they were not psychic and had failed to divine that this was the case, they had to wait for the 2.20. When this arrived and they asked the driver why nothing had been said, he became abusive and said he was 'only the driver'. Another PR triumph for Diamond.

Which brings me on to the LJC meeting on 23rd March with the 2L discussion lasting a full 2 hours. Diamond were represented by their Operations Director and two staff from their Kidderminster depot including their

communications person. As you can see from above, she has got a challenge on.... Shropshire Council were also represented. Madge Shineton, the Chair, asked for questions and comments to be delivered initially to Diamond. And they were. Lots of them. And none were complimentary. Person after person spoke passionately about the the poor timekeeping effects of unreliability on passengers, especially the elderly and students who are having their education disrupted. The attitude of many of the drivers was also questioned. At times, the Diamond representatives turned quite red (and it wasn't just the heat) and seemed surprised that their buses were problematic quoting a recent official inspection of the Kidderminster depot which had revealed only one small problem. Clearly they need to get out more.

The conversation then covered the convoluted route, which Diamond said was caused by the fact that the 2 service was run on a commercial basis but the 2L was subsidised and any extra passengers picked up on the way round helped their financial position. This might be true if they did pick up extra passengers but as they rarely do, I don't think this argument works. The Shropshire Council representative gave an excellent explanation of the background and why we are where we are with this service and seemed genuinely concerned that things were as bad as they are. The reason that Shropshire pay 80% of the subsidy on the 2L route was finally explained (after months of refusals to discuss it) in about 30 seconds as this only covers the stretch from Bewdley to Ludlow, most of which is in Shropshire.

I spoke to the Shropshire Council representative after the meeting and he seems determined to get this situation sorted, even if it means creating a fresh contract with a different operator although any solution is clearly dependent on sufficient funding being available.



Linda Iles **April In The Wyre Forest**



Now that Easter has come and gone we can say that 'the season' has begun: the growing season, with days longer than the nights and trips out into the countryside. (It's amazingly difficult to find destinations with refreshment facilities open in February or March and, let's face it, what's the point of a walk without a cup of tea and slice of cake at the end of it?)

The hardy blackthorn has already blossomed but soon the cherries and damsons will brighten the orchards with their boughs of white flowers. This winter we have lost a few more of the old cherry trees at Uncllys but will keep the dead wood stacked in the rows for the benefit of beetles and other saprophytes. The survivors have been augmented with new plantings, now old enough to flower and fruit, and you can visit the orchards of Tanners Hill and Ruskin Land by joining a **Blossom Walk** (with tea!) on May 1st. For more information call 01299 488083 or email info@wyreclt.org.uk.

The wild cherry, or gean, on the other hand is the one you will see in bloom at the woodland edges in early spring. It is the inspiration for Housman's lines from 'A Shropshire Lad':

'Loveliest of trees, the cherry now Is hung with bloom along the bough And stands about the woodland ride Wearing white for Eastertide'

The fruits are small, ranging from yellow through red to black, and edible when fully ripe (although birds and small mammals may not leave them this long). Flora Britannica by Richard Mabey and Archie Miles' Silva mention that cherry brandy can be made from the fruits by steeping them in brandy in much the same way as sloe gin is made. Both books also praise the wood of the cherry, with its red-brown heartwood and pink or yellow sapwood, its fine grain and ability to take a high polish. It is prized by wood turners and used to be made into smokers' pipes. Richard Mabey also mentions that the resin which oozes from the trunks and hardens into sticky lumps was used as a country chewing gum – possibly healthier and certainly more natural than the commercial version.

Damsons will soon follow with their blossom later in the month. They are well known and, I hope, appreciated in these parts as a fruit for puddings, jams and cordials. We inherited six old trees when we came to Uncllys Farm, but two of them have since succumbed to old age. They have been succeeded by their offspring, grown on from suckers and fruiting well, while the timber of one of the parents was offered to a local woodturner, Steve H., who very kindly gave us back a very fine turned vase which shows off the glowing red grain of the tree to perfection.

David Walford's Poetry Reading Evening



David Walford staged a poetry reading at the Sports and Social Club in March. A small attendance, but all impressed by his words.

Given a set of David's four booklets of poetry, we handed them out to members of the Writing Group and asked for their opinions:

I am not qualified to judge the writing of others, whether poetry or prose, but I am qualified to judge the effect they have on me.

I have just read 'Poems of War' by David Walford and can honestly say I was deeply moved. Two poems in particular stood out for me, "The Young Widow" and "They Came To Remember". "High on a Windswept Hill" remembers

friend and foe who died in war. It reminds us that whilst war is sometimes unavoidable, should only be a last resort to protect ones people and their freedom. People on both sides war. One poem, die "Attention," caused me to smile. It describes a soldier's first contact with military discipline, haircut. As the military national serviceman Ι underwent this induction ceremony, but being in the RAF did not march afterwards. We were made to double back to our barracks.

As I said at the beginning I found this collection very moving and to be able to communicate one's feelings in words as David has done so well is quite an accomplishment. *Roy Morris*

Thoughts on David Walford's Reflective Poems:

David's anthology begins appropriately with 'Reflections From a Shattered Mirror', remembering a happy rural childhood. But growing up brings doubts, uncertainties and a bitter-sweet nostalgia for more innocent times. The Old Dock Worker has poignant memories of an active dockland life, but in

his old age has the consolation of a loving family.

Trapped in Life's Gilded Cage reflects the longing to escape life's treadmill and find solace in nature. Another form of relaxation can be found in local hostelries, shown in Three Silver Darts and To A Barmaid Kate. Many poems highlight the gross inequality between greedy materialism and the struggle to survive, as in A Child Cries Out.

The inability to mentally 'switch off' is a common problem, as in The Edge of Madness. In contrast, The Brass Plate reveals the spirit of a man to whom a bench was dedicated, as he meanders through a park on a beautiful summer day, delighting in children's laughter, leaves ruffled by a warm breeze, a glimpse of moorhens among the reeds.

These are just a few of the many memorable poems in this book which concludes with Nature's Beauty and Its Beast, a moving account of how the ferocious power of water tragically claimed the life of a vibrant young woman.

A diverse and thought provoking collection, full of colourful and emotive imagery. *Yvonne Bunn*

David Horton has become quite a feature at the Farmers' Markets, sitting and spinning yarn from a natural sheep's fleece. And nearby is a range of pieces knitted by his wife Carole and their daughter Alice. Most of them in natural colours, all of them warm to the touch in the way that only wool can give.

They work from a smallholding near Craven Arms,

David having opted out of what you and I regard as normal employment to concentrate on what he and Carole love doing. The long process of developing their two acres to provide them with enough food to live on is taking time, but part of that is the pleasure of doing what they want. Carole is still employed, but can see better things ahead.

They draw their woollen fleeces from selected flocks, like the Elmley Castle one near Pershore and others nearer home. Where did Carole learn her knitting skills? "At mother's knee," she smiles. Ah yes, the famous UMK, or University of Mother's Knee; there's been a lot learned there over the years. It's where daughter Alice learned, too.

David is good - very good - with wood. He's another who learned by watching craftsmen and listening to their advice, and the challenge of taking a run down place and making it habitable rewarded the skills he acquired. Their stall features a

range of his work, with that gentle glow of natural wood that no synthetic material can match.

They happily pass on their skills to others and offer one-to-one tuition in spinning (drop and machine style) and knitting. Carole has a natural curiosity and thirst for knowledge, readily admitting that she learned how to give the fingers of her gloves a smooth closure with a trick she watched on You Tube and applies to what she sells.

They are a refreshingly open couple to talk to and question; nothing is protected as a trade secret, they want to share their knowledge and enjoyment. They do smile a lot, as most of the small volume traders in the market do.

They're regulars at Cleobury Market and at Craven Arms, plus craft fairs in the Marches area. Ask about the different wools and Carole shows you how the softness of feel differs with each breed of sheep. Good people, whose happiness in what they do shines through.

IMPRESSIVE PEDELECS

Shropshire Quads at Neen Savage have taken a further step into electric transport. One of the first quad bike specialists to stock electric versions, Dave Johnson has now expanded the range with electric bicycles. The trade they call them pedelecs.

The first stock in was from the Austrian off-road specialist KTM, who have a very good name for their bicycles and motorcycles. Dave has done some riding around the local

roads, with some very serious cyclists, and found the ease of travel a revelation. Would you believe climbing Farlow Bank with little effort? That's quite a test.

I took a ride around the farmyard on the same bike. It's just like riding a normal pedal cycle, with Bosch motor assistance all the time you're pedalling. Stop pedalling and you coast, touch the brakes levers lightly and you stop. First time I've ridden one of this new transport offerings and I was well impressed. And the quality the build and all the accessories were really good. At £2500 it's the top of the range unless you're into serious competition, but you could tackle almost any hill, up and down, with complete confidence.

The more sober alternative is the Ebco, looking like the pedal cycles you see in thousands in Holland. Upright riding position, sensible mudguards and for the business commuter or shopper a set of panniers that will fit over the rear mounted battery. It comes with a range of gear sets, from three to seven, and prices start from £990, which makes it an affordable

alternative if you have a short journey to work. It is presented as a City Bike and you can see that as its natural place.

The big advantage of these two extremes in a new market is that they are regarded as bicycles so long as they have limited speed and power - 15mph and 250 Watts, which both do. So no need for a driving licence, road tax or insurance, though you would need a strong sense of mortality before you tried to join the big tractors and Mitsubishi Shoguns on local roads. Treat them as a serious means of travel or play and they make a lot of sense. Sense of fun, that is. Just dress sensibly and wear a helmet, because falling off at even 15mph can hurt.

Dave is also expecting the Italian made and styled Benelli range, which offers a range from shopper to super sports. All with Italian flair; the pictures look gorgeous.

Electric power is making big inroads in car transport. Scooters and mopeds are well established and they don't directly pollute the atmosphere. You can see some of the future at Neen Savage and Dave is always a straight talker, not at all a sharp salesman after a quick buck.

been and gone yet it doesn't really feel like Spring yet! The daffodils have been out since January, alongside the snowdrops and primroses but it has been too cold and wet to plant anything in the garden or the fields. Finally the ground is drying up and ploughing has started for the spring planting. Yet to plant there are beans, fodder beet, spring barley and a whole crop pea and barley mix to cut as silage for the beef cattle. This is a change the usual maize crop hopefully be ready for harvesting in August rather than late October for maize.

As the weather is dry there is also lots of spraying to do, keeping the weeds down and preventing diseases but John is happy to get out and about in his self-propelled sprayer.

The end of March brought a sheep inspection. This is a spot check by the Rural Payments Agency to see if we have what was declared at the annual Iohn and Catherine Evans

Who can believe Easter has already return in December, check all the movements on and off the farm and that all the records are up to date. Not so easy when there are over 1100 ewes and 500 store lambs and rented land has a different holding number to the rest of the farm so every time sheep are moved from one part to another a movement form is needed, as well as when sheep are bought or sold. Each ewe has a unique number and two electronic ear tags, fortunately lambs tagging don't need until Hopefully everything was as it should be but a huge amount of paperwork and not really farming.

> Here at Broome Park the last two pigs are in the freezer (very tasty sausages and bacon) and have been replaced by two new piglets, named Hillary and Donna as a nod to the elections over the pond. The cattle have been TB tested and passed which is always a relief and we have two lambs on the bottle, always popular with guests.



If you get the chance to talk to Mark, ask what is the secret of his work. The likely answer is that he helps to build strong relationships with all those he comes into contact with. No doubt he will be willing to share why faith drives him.

The PCC have faith in the value of the relationships that

the Youth Project brings to young people; our act of faith was that we believed we would be able to find the funding to move the youth project forward. With a great deal of hard work we have been able to find the funding from donations. Last year we were able to secure funding from the Diocese of Hereford to expand the work to include families well, bringing in another full time worker to take over some of Mark's activities.

Mark is infectious. He seizes opportunities to engage in schemes to help all youngsters, like the mentoring programme he has set up in the local schools, drawing in members of The Church to support him. He finds time to organise and lead informal worship times in St
