HIGH STREET LIFE SAVING

With finance from the Parish Council and the Local Joint Committee and guidance from Sandra Cole, there is a potential life saver available in the King's Arms. The pub was chosen as the best location because it has the longest opening hours in the town centre.

It's a defibrillator, with its own power supply built in and a set of simple instructions for anyone to follow if someone collapses and needs urgent treatment. "With a cardiac arrest, the chances of a full recovery reduce by ten percent every minute the patient waits for treatment," Sandra explained. "It is literally a life saver."

17 volunteers have trained to use the unit and if you would like to join that exclusive band, an extra training course can be arranged. E-mail Sandra Cole at Sandracole7@googlemail.com or talk to Clare Todd on CM 272300 if you're interested.

"This is a true community facility and the Parish Council and the LJC were happy to be involved" said chairman Sean Thorogood. "If there are enough keen people to make another training session worthwhile, I'm sure we could find the money to fund it."

There are other defibrillators in the town, mainly with medical and rescue personnel, but this one takes potential help to a new level. Wouldn't it be great if other towns took up this fine example and made defib units available? Some may say that the cost of a little over £1000 is too expensive, but what is a life worth?

LIGHTNING STRIKE

Shropshire Fire and Rescue cleared the area and advised all staff in the Severn Hospice shop to leave, as there was danger of further collapse. We were able to photograph the damage only if wearing a hardhat supplied by the helpful rescue crew. They recommended that the chimney be demolished to remove danger. The High Street skyline has changed dramatically.

Around Town - Happenings

THE PUBLIC WERE HEARD

There was an Extraordinary Meeting of the Parish Council on July 22nd, mainly to deal with some pressing planning matters as the Council do not normally meet in August. Public concern was evident, with 18 people present; they made full use of the Democratic Time and their right to bring concerns to the Council's attention.

The first comments were to oppose a single storey dwelling being built near the River Rea at Pinkham, with concerns about flooding. The applicant then spoke and outlined how the design included a lagoon to hold back water in heavy rainfall.

The new application to build a convenience store on the current Tuffins site was opposed by one resident and a spokesman who read out a brief list of points that neighbouring residents had raised. There was no speaker in support at this stage.

The third contentious matter was an application for consent to build an initial 18 houses on land bordering Tenbury Road. Three residents and a representative of Hobson's Brewery expressed opposition, with concerns about this flood prone area and access at a narrow part of the road.

These speakers were heard with no discussion by councillors, the normal 15 minutes stretching to half an hour. The council members then discussed these and other matters at length. The planning matters are to be dealt with as follows:

- 1: The Pinkham site is to be visited by qualified engineers, to assess the flood risk and report.
- 2: The Chairman had been advised that simple opposition **Tuffins** development the would be noted, but was not likely to be effective. The option adopted was to support the proposal in principle, but a sub committee is to meet with residents and assess what limitations should be asked for.
- 3: The Council will object to the Tenbury Road development, on the grounds of flood risk, over development in that area and an access point that is unsuitable.

These meetings are seldom entertaining, but are vital to the growth of the town. There is 15 minutes Democratic Public Time before each Council meeting, when people can air their concerns, which chairman Sean Thorogood would like to see more widely used. If you feel strongly about a town matter, this is your chance to tell the people who make decisions. The Council meets at 7.00 on the first Monday in the month, in the Market Hall. We'll publish dates in future.

The Severn Edge Vets Pets Page

Well, WCU, the Working Cat Union, replied to my appeal, but Bubbles has a vets' note, signing him off work for another month. Apparently it is 'too hot to work', and as an employer I should provide reasonable and comfortable working conditions for my cat. As with a lot of the animals this last couple of weeks, Bubbles has suffered in the heat. Managing to make it from one patch of shade to the next, from one bed to the next. He can't manage to settle though. It's been too hot for me, I can only imagine what it must be like wearing a black fur coat all day!

Of course – all we can do is try our best to make our pets comfortable. Provide shade, plenty of drinking water, get their hair cut if necessary, and exercise them in the cooler mornings and evenings – leaving the middle of the day as a rest time. Other than that, you can't really do much more, unless you are willing to invest in air conditioning! Of course, please be aware that you should NEVER leave an animal (or unattended in a car on a hot day – even for a couple of minutes – it is extremely dangerous Hyperthermia (high them. body temperature) kills very quickly.

This month we have had two dogs with an infected uterus (just in Cleobury and Bewdley). It has reminded me to tell you all just how important spaying your female animals is. Especially dogs. Female dogs have a long gap between seasons – allowing time for bacteria to multiply inside them. If an animal presents to us with an infected womb, despite being a complex diagnosis, it is a life threatening condition. Luckily, at the time of writing the two this month were diagnosed quickly, assessed and operated

upon within two hours of presentation. Both are currently doing well. This condition is, however, so easily avoided with routine neutering. We can spay bitches at 6 months old, or three months after any season. There are so many other benefits; pick up the phone and ask to speak to one of the vets to discuss your options.

This month we are promoting cat kidney health. Approximately 1 in 3 cats over 10 years old suffer from kidney disease, with the early signs being difficult to spot. A urine sample is actually relatively easy to obtain, and can give us a good starting point to screen your cat's kidney health. Through August you can pop in and pickup your free cat urine sample kit. We will test the sample and report the results to you with advice on what we should do if there are any abnormalities. Take advantage of this great offer! It can only last one month! Pop in today.

Royal British Legion Clee Hill Exhibition

This was just a part of the Clee Hill Royal British Legion's weekend festival paying homage to those who fought in two World Wars and later conflicts. It drew a steady flow of visitors to the fine Village Hall.

Tracy Loftus explained that she represented the more recent members of the forces, joining the Women's Royal Armoured Corps as a 17 year old and serving for five years, including time with the British Army on the Rhine. Her enthusiasm for that time still shines through when she talks, and she admits she would have served longer if she could. She left with a service record rated 'Exemplary" that helped in her later life working in the NHS.

Tracy has a very high regard for the British Legion, who paid for her mother to move from Northern Ireland to Portsmouth. She was the widow of a Royal Navy man who left the service as long ago as 1962, but they still treated her generously.

Mr and Mrs Parker showed the record of his brother, Sergeant George Parker, who was lost in an RAF raid over France in 1944. He was one of the crew of a Halifax bomber that crashed neat Saint-Hilaire-sur-Rille, but his mother would not accept that

her son was lost and the family were forbidden to talk about him in her presence. That sad story tells a lot about the pressure and tragedy borne by the families of those who'd gone to fight.

There was a happier sequence, when Mr and Mrs Parker travelled to France, where the War Graves Commission had reburied the bodies of the crew in properly marked graves. When they were invited to take tea at the Town Hall, they were amazed to find a civic reception, with a speech from the mayor of Saint-Hilaire, who could remember the bomber flying over the town in flames when he was a six year old child.

Dr Mark Baldwin was a natural choice as an exhibitor and was kept busy talking about the German 'Enigma' machine on which he is a noted authority. But his collection World War II memorabilia stretches far beyond that ingenious machine, and includes a copy of a map issued to German forces as part of the grand plan for the invasion of England; this one is a copy of a British made map of Kidderminster, with the main

roads marked, named and numbered. No wonder sign posts were taken down at that time. It may be a relief for some that none of the roads was shown as leading to Cleobury Mortimer. Did the Fuhrer see Clee Hill as too much of an obstacle for his invaders?

Also on Dr Baldwin's display was a display of cipher discs, one issued by GCHQ in Cheltenham in 2000. But the oldest in the display was a picture of a French disc from 1675. There really is very little new in this world.

Annette Burgoyne has been collecting militaria since she found that a battered old bottle in the shed was a soldier's water carrier. Helmets from as early as 1912 have been presented or bought and a First World War rifle complete with fixed bayonet looked grim and weighed a lot. As she pointed out, men carried that as well as a 60lbs (27kg) through the mud of Flanders or wherever.

She is a talented artist, with some wonderfully detailed pencil drawings of soldiers. When she donated some pictures to the Belgian 'Diggers' to help illustrate a book, they presented her with the remains of a British trench tool found in a battlefield dig. She's an author too, of a history of the 6th Shropshire Light Infantry, formed in 1914 and disbanded in 1919, having made their contribution to that awful war.

A military tendency runs in the Burgoyne blood, and Annette's sons are serving soldiers. One is due to serve in Afghanistan, so that nerve wracking worry that parents knew in the conflicts recalled at this exhibition is still there with those back home.

Letter from Westminster - Philip Dunne MP

Let's talk Smartwater - real crime prevention

Let me make it clear that this is not an advert of any sort and no money or freebies have come my way to persuade me to write this article. It was when Nick called to say he did not have time to get his regular column written before going on leave, that I realised I'd never given proper coverage to the special deal that has made Smartwater available here in Cleobury at a special price. That was arranged by the Neighbourhood Watch Group - and it's about time someone sung the praises of the great job Betsy Pratt has done there - and what was once available only to NHW members is now available to anybody who wants to keep their property safer.

Smartwater is very simple to use. You buy a small bottle or a spray and your name and address is recorded against the unique chemical 'code' that every bottle and spray has. That record is kept on a database that's very secure - to ISO27001 standards - and any stolen property recovered is checked with an ultra violet light that makes the marking glow. And it confirms who the property belongs to.

The bottle version can be used to mark any property, any size from a wedding ring to a combine harvester, and is not visible to the naked eye - only the UV scanner can pick it up. If the spray version is used over a range of things, it will come off on the hands of any thief touching or carrying them. There is at least one police station in London where an ultra violet light comes on when a suspect is brought in, and once they realise that they've

been Smartwater sussed, they tend to talk more freely about being naughty.

I first saw this revolution about 15 years ago, when it was very new and I wrote about it for a motorcycle trade magazine. The Smartwater folk wanted to get space at the International Motorcycle Show at the NEC, because bike thefts were such a problem, and I had contacts there. They had it on show and the industry were very impressed with the idea, enough for Honda to later sign up and provide it with every new bike sold. It's a pity they dropped the idea later.

The reason for telling you this is that I know there are occasions when the Police will stop machines leaving a race meeting and scan them; sometimes they have rich pickings that way. Whatever the property that's covered, it doesn't become obvious until the UV light is shone on it, or the thief reads the Smartwater sticker and decides it's not worth the risk to pinch that one.

The simple sticker turns thieves away, so it's no surprise that 95 percent of Police forces in the UK use the stuff. And if a thief is taken to court and Smartwater evidence presented by the prosecution, the conviction rate is 100 percent.

You can buy your own supply from the Cleobury Country Centre in Love Lane, with prices starting £20 for a household kit. If you think that's expensive, think what you might lose in a burglary. *Jim Reynolds*

Next to it stood Roger Messenger's Citroen Roslea of the same vintage. It's a car we think of as French, but this one was made in Slough, in the days when Citroen had a

Noel Stenson showed off a 1936 Chevrolet Master Sedan, a model well known in movies of the 1930s, when over a million of the model were built. A more local product was Sue Chivers' 1930 Star 'Comet', built in Wolverhampton by a company financed by Tate and Lyle Sugar money. They both dressed in period and sat in the shade with a glass of bubbly; lovely touch on a sunny day.

More modern classics included Howard Freeman's graceful 1963 Austin-Healey 100/6, a car rescued from America and converted to right hand drive as part of a full restoration. Lovely.

There were Jaguars whose owners I didn't meet and a TVR that looked better than new in its super paintwork. For a village fete, there was a remarkable selection of motoring history and proof of some very capable engineers in this area, working away to keep old skills active in retirement.

The summer weather was kind to our market, the sunshine probably adding to its reputation as a good place if you want something out of the ordinary.

Inside the church it was busy, but we found one of Good Game's fine parcels of pigeon breasts wrapped in bacon still available and snapped it up. Steve Powell revealed that they are moving out more into local markets and the public eye. Their concentration has previously been on trade supply, but you don't build your own brand name that way. The pigeon breasts were great, with lots of flavour and texture. If you missed them on

this day, you can talk to them on 07940 133 237.

Scrummy Stuff, from just over the county border in Dunley, only deal direct with the public and were proudly showing off the Heart of England Fine Food Diamond Award for their Spiced Damson Chutney, so we bought a jar. Wow! You'll travel many miles to find one to match this, which has earned a place in our standard cupboard after just one tasting.

At the same awards ceremony, the only pork product in the final of the Meat category was Scrummy Stuff's rolled shoulder of the Berkshire pork from pigs reared just up the road. We bought some dry cured leg bacon and will be reporting later.

As promised last month, I spent £10 on a small bottle of Elizabeth Grinker's Tipsy Tart Green Apple Vodka. A little too sweet at first, but the second glass was deeper in flavour. By way of comparison I bought a small can of Smirnoff with Coke at Simply Fresh. Tarts are not cheap, but they do win by a country mile on flavour.

Next door was a range of stands in the Market Hall, and in the entrance Helen Smith was selling plants.



The Footpath Association - Doing Their Share

The Footpath Association have been walking and working on the local countryside for over 20 years. Their efforts have opened up old rights of way, introduced new ones like the paths from the Golf Course to the Wyre Forest Visitor Centre and saved the county thousands of pounds with their voluntary maintenance work. And they can party pretty well, too.

We went along to one of regular work parties. They were replacing a stile on the path along the River Rea beyond Pinkham. The old one had to be cut down in an urgent moment to get a stretcher to a walker who had fallen and broken a leg.

Four fine men were digging out the wooden remains of the old stile and wielding a fence shovel to accommodate the galvanised steel kissing gate that is now the County's standard for paths. Easier passage for walkers and dogs, but more secure for sheep and cattle, it has a cleverly engineered sloping hinge that gently closes the gate after you. Neat use of simple gravity, which is available free of charge.

Susan Sharp was in nominal charge, sorting out the equipment and signs in a happy, get-it-done atmosphere. She puts in many hours as a member of CMFA and a representative of the Ramblers Association, as well as organising the working party programme and striding out quite a bit herself.

Susan explained the Snip and Slash signs that encourage walkers to carry secateurs and cut back intrusive growth that can block paths if not controlled. A simple extension of what you do in the garden.



Easy to do and helpful, too.

We left them working to go to another job, meeting Roy Powell on the way with tea for the workers. He estimates that up to 200 walkers a day pass along this path in the busy season.

At the end of the day we looked in to see the kissing gate neatly installed:



The finished job includes a sticker saying the the CMFA installed the gate and another warning that dogs must be on a lead when crossing farmland. It's a problem for farmers, the miscarriage of lambs because of dogs worrying the flocks.

This is what the CMFA do to make walking easier on local paths. Membership is not costly and the people welcoming and helpful. More information on their website:

THE ROAD TO SUCCESS...



August in the Wyre Forest - Linda Iles

The Wyre Forest provides us with such an array of rare or remarkable flora and fauna that it is easy to overlook the common. Many of us who pay attention to the natural world have been concerned about falling populations of butterflies, but if you walk across any field, rough grassland (or "rough" in the golfing sense) you are almost certain to see the aptly, if not imaginatively, named meadow brown. The photo shows a female which, unusually in the animal world, is larger and more colourful than the male. The false eye spots on the fore wings are assumed to be a device to frighten off predators and must have been proved by evolution to be successful, although they may be snatched by determined birds.

Meadow browns are really a grassland species but I feel justified in including them in an article about the forest because vou can encounter them at this time of year at Lodge Hill Farm, Park House, along Tanners Hill and St John's Lane or any other patch of long grass where they can lay their eggs and the caterpillars can subsequently feed through their long eight or nine month development. I am puzzled to read that they have only four functional legs, in common with the fritillaries. The fore legs are small and brush like and presumably have some function feeding. in Their relative, the speckled wood, is to the shadier seen in environment of woodland rides.

I am writing this on a hot summer's evening. A breeze that sprang up has died again and it no longer seems to threaten thunder. On cloudy, warm nights like this there will be plenty of flying insects about to feed bats such as the pipistrelle and brown long-eared species that frequent the forest. It would be a good night too to set up a moth trap with its bright light to attract them into a receptacle where they will await identification. There is a surprising variety of day and night-flying moths, many of them very beautiful. (See "Curious incidents in the garden at night-time" by Allan Shepherd for an educational and entertaining read on the subject).

Meanwhile, with the kids off school, a day in the forest is a perfect way for everyone to unwind, explore and enjoy nature. Why not get the imagination going with Forest Fairy Trail on 22nd August to find if there are fairies (or pixies) in the forest? Follow a trail, look for their homes, and join us for some craft activities. It costs £3 per child. No booking is required, just come to the Forestry Commission's Discovery Centre, Callow Hill at 10.30am (until 12noon). children must be accompanied adult. 
Nick Davis, the man to blame for all this success.
