MEDICAL CENTRE OFFICIALLY OPENED



Philip Dunne MP and Doctor Andrew Allsop shared the duty.

On July 18th the new Medical Centre in Vaughan Road was opened by Philip Dunne MP. He spoke of his pleasure at such a fine facility, destined to serve a growing town and provide more on-the-spot services for the wider area.

Dr Andrew Allsop praised his predecessors, Doctors Holzman and Nixon, who had seen the need to expand ten years ago and driven the project forward. He thanked Mullers for giving the land to the community and the Parish Council for letting it be used for the Centre. Many

other bodies and individuals too many to list here - were thanked. And with a wry smile the doctor outlined how the opposition that briefly emerged had unintentionally helped progress towards this new Centre's opening. People who saw the notices were drawn to express their support and unite behind the doctors and their plan to serve the community's interest. Having the pharmacy on the same site was another move forward.

He promised a better service to the 7,000 patients the practice already has registered, with a medical centre that will be the best in the area.

Representatives of the Parish and County Councils were there, along with others from contractors Matrix, the NHS itself and associations like Cleobury Patients' Voice. It wasn't a long drawn-out affair, the speeches were few and brief, the sandwiches were hardly touched and the drinks were all non-alcoholic. These were busy people, with other things to do, who celebrated briefly and left to get on with their jobs.

YOUR RIVER NEEDS YOU! Susan Sharp has some worrying news about a threat to our countryside:

Severn River Trust would like to set up a new group to take care of the River Rea as it runs through Neen Savage, Cleobury and Neen Sollars.

The initial aim is to get the Himalayan Balsam under control, but longer term there should be other more varied practical work including monitoring. Himalayan balsam is a highly invasive alien plant which is taking over our country especially along waterways. It grows six feet tall and eliminates all other plants. Unlike Japanese Knotweed it is an annual, but when it seeds it throws millions of them into the air and spreads a long way, so one plant one year can lead to a forest the next.

It has been spreading along the Severn and Teme over the last few years. If you walk along the Rea anywhere in this area you will see it. It looks similar in leaf and flower to an impatiens.

I have been told, but do not know if it is true. Kidderminster was one of the sources of it as the carpet making industry led to seeds being brought into this country on the raw materials. There was a feature on Midlands Today a month or so ago about Staffordshire volunteers in trying to get rid of it by pulling it all out before it can seed.

We hope to get together later this year to discuss what people are interested in doing and make plans for next year. Anyone interested in getting involved with this initiative please contact me on susan@eaglelane.co.uk.

KEN DAVIES



The Parish Church was crowded on July 10th, when his many friends and family gathered to say farewell to Ken Davies. This quiet, gentle man will be much missed.

His roots went back through generations and in Farlow church is a copper jug that dates from the late 19th century, engraved in memory of midwife Emma Poyner, Ken's great grandmother; it is used for baptisms to this day. In Simon Evans's local histories you can find Moses Cadwallader of Detton Hall Farm, who was married to Ken's mother's aunt Sarah; she lived to the age of 99.

Ken liked to sit on the bench at the bottom of Love Lane and was happy to chat. It was there that he told me about Mr Link, who had an ancient belt-drive motorbike and box sidecar to deliver fish to the surrounding area in the 1930s.

He was very keen on planes and drew many pictures of them as a lad, then joined the RAF only to be invalided out when he was hit by a taxiing aircraft and disabled. He had a quiet but wicked sense of humour, describing the German Fokker as one of his favourite planes and chuckling to himself when the conversation stopped!

He and Dorothy were married in 1955 and had three children: Nigel, Kathryn and Clare. They would all like to thank the community for the many messages of sympathy received, almost 100 cards. As Kathryn put it: "Just goes to show how fondly the people of Cleobury care." There weren't many men more deserving of respect than Ken Davies.

These are for cemetery visitors and workers use only, to put grass cuttings and soil in. It will also provide a community facility, to take grass or soil for compost, and soil for tubs, hanging baskets and the like.

They are not to be used to leave rubbish and anyone found doing so will be dealt with. The idea is to remove the expensive and unsightly skip, while also recycling and helping the community.







MR KIPPIN RODE OUT And here is true story in his own words:

June's Clarion told about my forthcoming bike ride from Cleobury to Land's End, in aid of the restoration of the chancel roof at St Mary's. I'm glad to report the ride was successful, and I returned safely on July 11th. I started after morning service on Sunday 6th, given a splendid send-off by Rector Ashley and the congregation. The bells rang just as I pedalled off, and their sound cheered me as I tackled the first hill up out of the town.

The ride took five days through Shropshire, Worcestershire, Gloucestershire, Somerset, Devon and Cornwall. I rode 60 to 70 miles a day and after I'd reached Land's End, rode back to stop overnight in Penzance, from where I caught the train back to Ludlow on Friday. The bike behaved perfectly, and I don't seem to have suffered any long-term ill effects.

People ask which were the best and worst bits of the ride. Flippantly I could say that all the downhills were the best bits and all the uphills were the worst. But for me the highlights were Brunel's suspension

bridge at Bristol, which I cycled underneath this time rather than over, the Cathedrals at Worcester, Gloucester, Exeter and Truro, all special for me as a bell-ringer. Seeing the north and south Cornish coasts at the same time from the top of the hill out of Redruth, and the Mounts Bay unfolding on the hill down into Marazion, the sea glittering in the sunlight and St Michael's Mount in the foreground. Reaching Land's End after five days was pretty good too.



I didn't train. Day 1 is training for day 2, and so on. I planned the route and knew which towns and villages to head for. On main roads route-finding isn't difficult, on country lanes more tricky. I had driven or cycled most of this route before, and have a good memory for maps and directions. Did I get lost? I got a bit off course a couple of times, but was able to recover quite quickly. How to motivate yourself to ride 320 miles? Think in small chunks – to the next coffee break usually. On hills sometimes to the next tree.

I was hoping to raise £1000, possibly by 100 sponsors giving me £10 each. Luckily I have a wide circle of friends, and with email I've managed to secure over £5000, which will increase to over £6000 by the time Gift Aid is taken into account. And a letter has been sent to all addresses in the town explaining what needs to be done at St Mary's and asking for donations. This is bringing a steady stream of donations. 

Letter from Westminster -

Last month Lord Falconer's Assisted Dying Bill was debated in the House of Lords. This would enable competent adults who are terminally ill to be provided at their request with specified assistance to end their own life. I recognise this is an extremely difficult area, since coping with terminal illness is extremely distressing for the patients and their families. These cases evoke the highest degree of compassion and emotion and I shall follow this debate with interest. As this was a private member's bill it is unlikely to make further progress but it has brought the issue to national attention. I have long opposed assisted suicide, since I do not believe one individual should have the power of life and death over another.

While Lord Falconer's draft Bill is well intentioned, hoping to relieve suffering of the terminally ill, it still places life and death decisions in the hands of others. Who is to determine that a person is in control of their faculties? How to prevent vulnerable people from feeling under pressure to agree to such a decision? I also fear that should the Bill's approach to assisted dying be adopted, it would represent a slippery slope. Once such a principle is established, where would this end? Where to draw the line?

My views are partly conditioned from indirect personal experience. The father of a good friend suffered polio in his mid-20s shortly before his son was born. The father was in Africa at the time, and very nearly died. He managed to return to the UK, but soon after became a quadriplegic other than the ability to

move his head, yet with full mental capacity, sight and hearing. He was given six months to live and at the time, he wanted to die. But he lived until nearly 60, an inspiration to all who met him. He founded a charity to provide respite care for those who look after loved ones with severe physical disabilities.

If Lord Falconer's Bill had been in place at the time, he would have been killed and his son, my friend, would have never known his father or the remarkable things he was capable of doing by sheer will-power and a very supportive family. I believe palliative care is the best way to give the terminally ill dignity in their declining days. We must make sure this is as good as possible. In Shropshire we have excellent facilities at Severn Hospice for adults and Hope Hospice for children, where doctors and staff do a magnificent job. The Department of Health's End of Life Care Strategy is also intended to improve access to good quality palliative care and encourage the Government to develop further specialist palliative care and hospice provision.

I fully accept that suicide, assisting or encouraging suicide, assisted dying and euthanasia are all subjects on which it is entirely possible for people to hold widely different but defensible opinions. This area is not a matter of party politics but of conscience. Should the law in this area ever be altered, it would be a free vote, with all MPs voting according to their conscience.



Clarion Coppers With PCSO Nick Morris



Before I list reported crimes for last month I want to reiterate that I try to list those in the area covered by the Clarion and not just in Cleobury. The crime level remains very low regardless of how the 'people of doom' see it. (Victims excused!).

The first reported crime was the theft of a locked Ifor Williams trailer worth £2500 from a residential area in Bliss Gate overnight on June 19th/20th. On June 28th/29th the wooden fence in Bull Alley, off High Street, was vandalised again. There was an incident involving dogs in the Clee Hill Road area of Burford on June 29th when a loose dog attacked another which was secure on its own patch. This resulted in stitches and antibiotics from the vet. The matter was settled privately but has been recorded for future reference. On June 30th there were several reports of a vehicle driven in an extremely dangerous manner. Police responded and caught up with the driver, who didn't take kindly to being talked to by Police and began to play up and make threats. He was arrested on suspicion of drink driving and found to be many times over the legal limit when breathalysed.

On July 6th at 4:00am a male with a woman's stocking over his head was captured on CCTV attempting to open a garage and a porch door at a house in Pinkham. Nothing was damaged or stolen but there is a suspect under investigation for attempted burglary. On July 12th in the early hours an assault occurred in Talbot Square when a male was refused entry to a pub to have a drink as it was closed. The offence is being investigated. Between 10:30pm on July 11th and 1:00am on July 12th a car parked on the roadside in Church Street was broken into and had the handbrake released, with considerable damage

to the passenger door and other parts. The incident is still under investigation and the town CCTV has yet to be viewed, to try to identify suspects. This crime may be linked to another incident where a car parked in the same area walked over, causing denting. Again, CCTV may reveal the offenders. Another crime which may be linked was the wooden fence by The Market Hall being damaged. We are hoping that CCTV will have picked this up as well. Overnight on July12th/13th a detached garage at Billingsley was broken into. Diesel and a CD player was stolen from the car inside, plus heating fuel and an electric garden shredder. A workshop on a farm at Chorley was broken into sometime during the day on July 17th. Several power tools worth a total of £2500-£3000 were stolen. During the night of July 17th/18th a catalytic converter was stolen from a van parked in Forresters Road, Burford. In The Crescent, Clee Hill, a pressure washer was stolen from a padlocked shed on July 18th/19th. During the same night a caravan parked in The Crescent was broken into and a mountain bike worth £200 stolen. A successful drugs warrant was carried out in Ludlow recently and a male was arrested on suspicion of supplying cannabis.

There has been concern that youths have been climbing the fence to Cleobury Primary School to access the grounds. It would be appreciated if anyone who sees anybody in there who shouldn't be would report it to Police on 101 as soon as possible. There is also evidence that there has been drug activity within these grounds, so please help us to stop this and other offences happening by reporting anything suspicious as soon as possible. Police may be in the area to attend; if not, they will attend if not already committed.





The Farming Page - Jenny Everingham looks at life from the farmhouse

It was interesting to read Rachel Robinson's comment last month about their seasonal increase in cream orders. The soft fruits have been lovely this year and Mawley double cream tops them off the best.

All farming is weather-dependent of course, be it fruit, veg, grass or grain. Weather patterns during the growing season help to determine the quality and quantity of the crop, but even the best can be compromised by "the wrong kind of weather" at harvest. Silage has largely replaced hay as a means of preserving grass for winter fodder, as it is less weather-sensitive, but you can't beat good hay. However, this needs four or five warm, dry days on the trot to be safe, so the decision to cut is a nerve-racking one. Of course, the Meteorological Office, with its mammoth computer, offers a little more information than the bit of seaweed by the door, but still the five-day forecast is subject to change – in timing, if not in substance. Recently we lost a good hay-making week because the forecast

was for showers which didn't materialise, and this week we've gambled on the dry forecast, so we're watching the advancing weather fronts with trepidation. Will they reach this far before the precious crop is dry, baled and in the barn?

The alternative for us is big bale silage, as we don't have a clamp. Wrapping it in black plastic is designed to exclude the air so that it doesn't go off, which would be fine without the attention of battalions of crows. We THINK they are after the insects which are, in turn, attracted by the heat, but the outcome is that they tear the wrap to shreds. This is not good news. So it's hay for preference, silage if we must, and fingers crossed.

On a more positive note: Remember the awful winter weather? One of the things it put a stop to was cutting hedges around the fields away from the roadsides. "Every cloud has a silver lining," they say, and this one is...a good crop of hazel nuts. *Jenny*



Linda Iles August In The Wyre Forest



Summer weather draws me to the delights of water, whether it is pond, stream, river, lake or sea. In a drought, of course, the water bodies become life savers for the wildlife of the forest and taking up an observation position nearby can be very rewarding. Dowles Brook runs through the heart of the forest and brings a rich collection of wildlife in and by it as well as visiting from the surrounding landscape. The water is clean and fast-running, making its way through riffles and pools in the shade of oaks, hazels and alders. If you watch quietly from one of the bridges you will probably see a Dipper fishing for insects and other aquatic life among the rocks in the stream bed, occasionally demonstrating its characteristic bobbing up and down. You may see it submerge completely, as it is able to walk along the stream bed under water, using its wings to help propel it along while it searches for its prey. And what of that other iconic inhabitant of the waterways, the Kingfisher? This is so tiny, so quick and so blue that when you catch a sight of it – and it is usually a flash in the outer field of vision you feel blessed, if something as otherworldly has broken in to our duller surroundings. There again, if you set aside the time to seek out their fishing perches along the Dowles and can watch and wait, there is no reason why your patience should not be rewarded with the full performance: the dive, the catch, after which the fish is given a blow or two on the perch then swallowed head first.

Otters visit here and you may be exceptionally lucky and see one. It is more likely that you will see the remains of their dinners (fish heads and tails, crayfish claws) under a bridge or their droppings, called 'spraints', deposited on a riverside rock, or web-toed footprints in the mud of the shore.

The brook eventually flows into the Severn with its slower and deeper waters, which separate the main block of the Wyre from Eymore and Arley. These are often counted, along with Ribbesford, Burnt Wood and Kinlet, as one unit, which they undoubtedly were long ago.

This month do have a look at the Environmental Photographer of the Year exhibition at the Wyre Forest Discovery Centre if you haven't already done so. Entrance is free and you'll be inspired by the photographs you see there. Apologies, by the way, for the bad quality of last month's photo of a spotted flycatcher. I didn't realise it wouldn't travel well.






Al and Helen at the Royal Fountain said they would get back to providing food and they've kept their promise. They've recruited local chef Ross Hector and he's been very busy keeping up with demand for his Mediterranean style menus.

Ross is producing a range of tapas, including a chorizo sausage braised in red wine and served with crusty bread, for those with a Spanish taste. If you prefer Italian, his pizzas are hand-stretched and baked in a real pizza oven; top of a wide range is the Summer House Special with pesto, prosciutto, olives and mozzarella, He also offers smaller portions for the Kids' Menu, which comes with a Wordsearch puzzle to keep them amused.

This is all part of what's on offer now, but it will be revised every three months to keep the interest fresh. We'll try it and report in the next issue

NEEN SOLLARS AND RENEWABLE ENERGY

Neen Sollars is unique in the area in having a community hydro electric scheme on the River Rea. There are houses in the village with solar panels on the roof, too. But the community felt threatened by two recent proposals to develop what have become known as solar farms in the parish. We understand that one at Bransley has now been withdrawn.

The second proposal is for something like 30 acres of land on the hillside, to the south of the village. The last information we have seen is that no planning proposal has been submitted, but that may not be so now. Apologies that the editor has not been able to follow that up, due to domestic pressures.

The Save Our Green Hills group has been formed as a result of this threat to the local amenity, which a 30 acre site would clearly be. They have a press pack that sets out rational arguments against large scale solar farms, with government policies and statements quoted that seem to support such a view. Not that politicians are above changing their minds, of course. There is the matter of

the intrusion upon the amenity in such size, which arguably is the case with 30 acres or thereabouts of glass.

We have to wait and see what is put forward if the idea does go for planning consent. I hope to write more about this when I have spoken to all the parties involved. *Jim Reynolds*


