ADRIAN SATTERLY

Mr Satterly appeared before Shrewsbury Crown Court on July 19th to answer the charges of 20 counts of theft.

He offered to plead guilty to 15 of the charges. If this offer was to be accepted by the court, the remaining five charges would be discontinued. The case was then adjourned for the Crown Prosecution Service to consider whether to accept the offer or to proceed to a trial on the matter.

The case will be listed at Shrewsbury Crown Court on August 9th and if the pleas are accepted Mr Satterly will be sentenced. If they are not accepted then the case will proceed to trial. Mr Satterly remains on unconditional bail.

CLEOBURY HILLS CARE HOME

It came as a shock when those living near the Cleobury Hills Care Home received a note from Capulet Care, stating that problems with the building had proved so serious that the safest way of dealing with them was to demolish the building with a view to immediately rebuilding.

That was a brave decision to make and all credit must go to MD Juliet Briggs for accepting the need and advising local people of the fact. The development has not been without headaches, but recent events have resulted in problems that had to be addressed.

The note described how the closure of the building during the pandemic and flooding, meant there a "significant quantity of water ingress." When the building was reopened there was evidence of spores, due to the place being damp and unoccupied.

Changes in building regulations since Grenfell were also considered. "Through no fault of Capulet Care," Ms Briggs wrote, "I feel the safest option for potential clients, staff and local residents is to demolish the building, with a view to immediate rebuilding."

Capulet promises to keep their neighbours updated on further developments.








TENBURY TRANSPORT TRUST

Due to the demise of commercial bus routes, community transport is becoming an important part of rural life and there has been a local community transport group based in Tenbury Wells for 20 years. This was formalised into the charity, Tenbury Transport Trust, in 2014. Tenbury Transport has been extremely busy during the pandemic taking people to both Leominster and Ludlow vaccination centres.

The Tenbury base of this group is a reasonable distance from Cleobury Mortimer but we frequently take individuals to Kidderminster, Worcester and Redditch Hospitals. So if you need help with transport to hospital appointments, or indeed any kind of appointment, Tenbury Transport is here to assist you. All our volunteer drivers are asked to provide two references and go through the DBS checking system therefore you know they can be relied upon and are trustworthy. On the payment of a £5.00 annual subscription, you can telephone the office between 9.00 am and 1.00 pm on 01584

810491 and book a car to pick you up from home, take you to your appointment and return you safely home again. When arranging your car and driver you will be informed of the cost of the return trip which will always be considerably lower than a commercial taxi. We also have mini buses that bring people in from some of the villages to shop in Tenbury, thus helping families and also the local economy. The £5.00 annual subscription covers both the car and mini bus service but seats on the bus do need to be booked by telephoning 01584 810491. This particular service may not be of such interest to Cleobury residents but we are constantly reviewing our bus routes, and transport between Cleobury and Tenbury may










POTHOLES OF THE **MONTH**





HOPTON WAFERS' NEW LIBRARY!




Dorothy McBride, Clerk to the Parish Council, cut the tape and officially opened the door.

Philip Dunne's Letter from Westminster

Parliament rose for the Summer Recess last month, after yet another period of working with social distancing under COVID restrictions.

As I write, these are being relaxed in England as we move through Step 4 of the planned emergence from national constraints on the conduct of our daily lives.

It provides a time to reflect on this unprecedented period in peacetime, in which the nation has been obliged to live our lives without normal contact with each other. I have been struck by the impact this has had on our relationships.

The lack of day to day contact with family and friends has been very difficult over the past 16 months or so. For those who have lost loved ones especially so.

But there has also been a remarkable resilience shown by people across our communities, with helping hands extended to those in need, as the whole country has come together to combat this pandemic. None more so than those in our NHS, treating those caught up with COVID, and the volunteers helping others and the teams of people enabling vaccination of the adult population.

I was briefed on the day I write this by NHS leaders in Shropshire who pointed to their expectation that by mid-August all adults in the county will have had the opportunity to have received their double dose of vaccine. They are finalising plans for booster doses to be given alongside annual flu jabs from September to those most vulnerable. This has been a monumental effort and we are all grateful for the extraordinary commitment they have shown to keeping us safe.

The latest delta variant of the virus is increasing cases rapidly, but the incidence of hospitalisation is vastly lower thanks to the efficacy of the vaccine. As of today there are ten patients with COVID in Shropshire's hospitals, six of which have not been vaccinated. The SAGE committee advising the Government expect cases to rise and that this will lead to an increase in death rates across the country, but to less than the number of people who die from smoking related causes each day.

I am struck by the division of opinion locally between those with understandable anxiety about the risk posed from new variants and the relaxation of restrictions, and those who feel we have to find a way to live our lives by managing the virus through vaccines and treatments like we do other diseases.

There is no right answer to this conundrum, only a balanced judgement. Governing the country requires making difficult decisions. I think the success of the vaccine programme justifies the decision to relax restrictions.

But as someone with an underlying lung condition which has required me to be cautious and vigilant through this long period, I shall continue to take precautions to limit exposure to the virus in confined spaces. I am looking forward to spending as much of August as possible out of doors enjoying what I hope will be a splendid month of summer sunshine in Shropshire. I hope you can too.



But I did get there late on Sunday afternoon, to sit and listen to more good music from Belinda O'Hooley, a woman with the kind of stage presence you see with big stars, who got a prolonged applause when the set ended. And as we stood up

to leave I recognised Nick Davies of Hobson's Brewery a few seats away. He was as keen on what we'd seen and heard as I was and you can bet he'll be involved next year. Next year? This event fitted into the gentle friendliness of Hopton Court so easily it must surely look upon the place as their future venue.

There was a good story behind the presentation of the cake. So here was one of the composers of the song, presented with a special cake by another Anne Lister. As people sometimes say: "You couldn't make it up."



Something a little more serious? Greg Foot will be asking the question "How do we feed 10 billion people on our planet in 2050?"





A Bluffer's Guide to Open Gardens

At the time of writing, it's T-minus six days until we throw open the gates and (hopefully) welcome the masses into our patch of land as part of Neen Savage's Open Garden event.

This in itself is proof positive that the 'rock and roll' years of my youth are far behind me. The very concept of an 'open garden' event is the epitome of gentle middle England at work - nice people doing nice things for charity. Yet despite the bucolic haze that surrounds this biannual event, I'm still stressed to the eyeballs. I shouldn't be writing; I should be out there planting/weeding/mowing/digging/titivating...in short, panicking.

There is no logical reason for my heightened blood pressure. These visitors are our friends who will play their part by 'ooh-ing' and 'aaah-ing' at just the right moment as they walk around the garden, both because they are generous people and that this sort of gentle recognition of the long days spent by the host sweating and swearing at weeds is the polite thing to do.

This isn't our first rodeo - we opened up our garden two years ago and went through this same stressful and timeconstrained process. However, the lessons learned last time have proven invaluable, and it seems only fair to share with you, dear reader.

Lesson 1 - They're not weeds. They are part of our 'nature garden.'

Greta Thunberg should be celebrated for many reasons. Yes, there's the obvious stuff about protecting the one and only planet we have (obvs), but then there is the lesserknown side benefit of allowing the weedy bits of open gardens to be viewed as 'giving back to nature'. I could go on and reference the social dilemmas attached to refreshments (water, tea or booze?), the do I/don't I thoughts around a garden map (our patch really isn't that big, but it seems to be the thing to do) and the power of a carefully cut border edge, but frankly time and a rising sense of panic mean I must dash and continue to make my way through the long to-do list.

The birdsong has been absolutely riotous this year but now that we are into the summer there is a change in the message. We still hear 'Here I am!' and 'This is MY territory' but also a lot of 'Where are you, baby?' and 'FEED ME!' (I wrote about the noisy dusk-time squeaking of the Tawny Owl chicks last month). We're particularly pleased to hear frequent contact calls from Redstart families in our orchards and the woodland edges, proving that they are breeding well in the Wyre Forest despite a general decline in Europe as a whole.



Mick Farmer's photo is of a Pied Flycatcher. Numbers of these birds fell to a few breeding pairs in the late 2000s but have since recovered and are up to at least the mid-teens. (The count is based on the number of males heard singing, but as they may have more than one mate it's difficult to say how many will nest). Pied flycatchers arrive here in April from West Africa and if their arrival coincides with

an abundance of invertebrates in the oak trees then they have a good chance of success. Their natural nest sites are woodpecker holes in older trees but they readily use nest boxes as long as other occupants haven't got there first! Additional human intervention can prevent Great Tits and Blue Tits from occupying boxes by blocking the holes until the Pied Flycatchers appear but, as we have found trying to do the same for Redstarts in the Uncllys orchards, the timing is tricky and the tits are always ready to take up residence! (Thanks to the Worcestershire Wildlife Trust's surveyor, Craig Reed, for the update on the Pied Flycatchers).

We all need as much good news as we can get, and I was delighted to learn that the new Burlish Meadows reserve (the old golf course and landfill site on the edge of Stourport) has, under the management of the District Council Ranger Service, already become a diverse habitat rich in wildflowers and crammed with all kinds of insects including Common Blue, Small Copper and Brown Argus butterflies and the Six-belted Clearwing moth. OK, I know it isn't the forest but in conservation terms connectivity is vital, and Burlish Meadows connect to Droppingwell Farm (Worcestershire Wildlife Trust's new acquisition), which connects to the River Severn, which connects to the Wyre Forest. Among many other volunteers I helped to plant trees at Burlish Meadows last winter, and I'm looking forward to seeing how this important tract of land grows and develops.



There is a suggestion that appointments to the Cabinet should not necessarily be filled by an MP. This, the authors say, would widen the talent pool that could be trawled. I have some sympathy with this approach as looking at the current residents of the House of Commons, I see not so much a talent pool as a talent ever so slightly damp patch. I'm not sure whether the gender of potential recruits would make a difference but Maggie Thatcher always said that when she wanted someone to talk about a problem, she would ask a man. If she wanted someone to do something about it, she would ask a woman. This approach certainly worked in the case of the vaccination programme (just don't mention Track & Trace...)

Some 60 elderly members of the House of Lords have recently been threatened with sanctions for failing to attend an in house anti bullying course (total cost around £885,000). Reasons for non attendance included recent heart surgery and recovery from a knee operation. Nevertheless, several have been placed under formal investigation for this 'offence'. Sounds like a classic case of bullying to me.

I recently saw the CEO of Oxfam complaining bitterly about the recent cuts in the Overseas Aid budget and how people in poorer countries would suffer. How unfortunate that his plea for extra funding came at the same time that it was revealed that Oxfam had suspended their country director in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) and another staff member, sacked three other staff and told another that their contract would not be renewed. This followed the results of an external enquiry into local activities that had been commissioned after many complaints from fellow staff dating back to 2015. Over the last few months, I have been writing about the various scams that have a single purpose and that is to defraud you or more simply steal your money. I have shown how there are many ways these scammers work, contacting you either in person, on the telephone, by email or sometimes even by letter. All of these are direct approaches but there are still some indirect approaches usually through Internet and social media communications that can, on the surface, appear attractive but are far from that. In this article I will summarise some of the many email and telephone scams that are doing the rounds today. Email scams are very prolific these days and scammers have the ability to send an email where the senders detail looks very authentic, eg. HM Revenue, TV Licensing, DVLA, BT and other mobile providers. The scammers also mimic the real pages that these companies use so if you click on the e-mail you will be directed to a web page that looks very authentic. Here are 2 tips to check if what you have received, or are looking at, is authentic. First of all, when you get an email that you were not expecting, click on the name of the sender. Sometimes you need to click twice to expand the senders full email identity. One from the mobile firm EE came up as this EE couk@limited-Another one from .GOV.UK invoice.co.uk about self-employment support came from spam address GOV.UK contact@gobotify.com These are just 2 examples of spotting a scammers real email TIP, do not ever try to respond directly to any of these spam addresses because if you do, the scammer will then know that you have a valid and active email address and that has a value to them as something that can be sold on to other rogues. The second thing to look out for in a scam email or web site is the fine detail (usually at the bottom of the web page). Here you find things like, Help and Contact or About us, which on a genuine web site you can click on and be directed to the company or organisations help pages. Frequently these items look like they can be clicked on as they are underlined and highlighted, but if you do click on them and nothing happens you know

you are on a scammer's web page. Again, **DO NOT** click on any request on these pages as they can take information from you that may compromise you in the future. has also been an upsurge (due to the good weather) of scammers knocking on doors claiming to be contractors to the local government and that they have spare materials that could be used to fix your drive or path or whatever. A reasonable price is quoted but always beware that these people are usually not genuine and will, if you agree to, undertake work that ends up being considerably more and of course more expensive than you will have agreed on. In cases like this note any relevant details of the individuals, their vehicles and what they are Ask for a number or a offering to do. reference of work they have done locally and if you are at all uncertain then politely refuse and if you feel threatened in any way call the Police on 101 or 999 if a more serious immediate threat exists. There are many ways the scammers are trying to break through our barriers and fortunately the authorities including the major banks and Government agencies are stepping up to the plate to make the public more aware. If you have access to the internet, it does no harm to sign up to local Neighbourhood Watch groups on social media such as Facebook or to register with the national Action Fraud Alert scheme. Our West Mercia Police have a local alerting scheme running and our Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT) for Cleobury and District also are now sending out warning and update messages relative to activity in the Browse for these organisations on the internet and feel free to sign up for any or all of them. None of them will cost you any money but information from them may save you the loss of a significant amount of your money through fraudulent scams. The message is as always, BE AWARE, STAY ALERT, STAY SAFE Thanks again for reading.

A short walk up the Bridgnorth road and you'll find the business park dominated by Kudos. Founded, run and led to great international success by a lady, Dinnie Jordan.

In the town centre is another growing success, Tracey's Kreations. It started in late 2019 as a small sweet shop in Lion Lane and made a lot of friends with Tracey's smiling face and friendly words. Soon she was offering balloons and party treats and if you took your child there in fancy dress for Halloween, they got a treat.

In the first lockdown, Tracey noticed that the town centre 28 High Street shop was vacant. A really kind touch is the shelf unit at the front of the shop, where any out of date fruit and veg is left overnight for those in need to just collect.

She has a range of cards on show and the pricing is one of those simple Tracey ideas - they are all just £1 each. That's a sign of her early days in business as a teenager working the markets and car boot sales. Whatever happened to car boot sales, Tracey? "The traders came in and it all turned commercial, so you couldn't find bargains so easily."

You'll find collection boxes for the Cleobury Men's Shed, Cleobury Responders and the Cats Trust, all designed to help others.

The shop is crowded with stock, which she estimates at about £15,000 value. That's a lot of items to watch over and make sure she doesn't run out. ""I couldn't take one item out of the shop and not miss it," she explains. "Everything is wanted."

The latest addition is a display of hardware, brought in after the hardware shop nearby closed its doors. "I hadn't got a clue what to get in when I started it," she says. "But there was nowhere to buy hardware in the town, so I just asked people what they wanted." It's working well and people are coming in and asking her to order what they want.

The future for Tracey? "Expand hardware and open another shop, away from Cleobury."

Watch this space.


