

Philip Dunne writes from The Falklands

Last month I spent five days in the Falklands, part of the first parliamentary delegation to visit for three years. As the Whip to the Foreign & Commonwealth Office, I was well briefed.

A fascinating trip; we were there the week before Remembrance Day and laid a wreath at the Memorial to the fallen from the Falklands War, whose 30th anniversary is next year. We visited battle sites and saw the cross commemorating the spot where Sgt Ian McKay VC was killed near the summit of Longden. Members of the armed forces of my generation fought to allow the Falklands to remain free to decide their own future.

Much has changed. From a platoon of Marines and an icebreaking ship, the military presence is now almost 1,000 with a military airfield and naval port providing deterrence through a squadron of aircraft and roulement of Royal Navy ships. The Islands are more secure as part of the Strategic Defence and Security Review last year, but also vibrant. The economy has grown from a GDP of under £5 million based primarily on wool exports, to over £100 million through fishing, tourism and oil and gas exploration, despite an increasing build up of an economic blockade from Argentina.

The sale of fishing licenses has provided the backbone to this prosperity. The government has derived income and fishing companies have been established by islanders, often in conjunction with Spanish trawler companies to catch the loligo squid, which accounts for much of the calamari sold in Mediterranean markets.

Tourism has started to play an increasing role. As the globe shrinks, the Falklands is a more attractive destination for adventure travellers and cruise ship passengers; some 60,000 visitors a year has been achieved, attracted to the uniquely accessible wildlife.

There is interest in identifying commercial quantities of oil within the territorial waters to the north of the Falklands. In January a second rig arrives to drill prospects to the south. By next year it should be apparent if the Falklands have sufficient reserves to justify the investment needed to extract. What impressed most of all is the resilience of the islanders, almost doubled in number since the war, working together to address the challenges of living on a remote set of islands.

May I take this opportunity to wish you all a very happy Christmas and a peaceful New Year. *Philip Dunne*

Heather Kidd's Local View

Knocking on doors across South Shropshire every year, I get a feel for peoples' concerns. Speeding traffic is always in the Top Three in villages, hamlets and on main roads –as is the case in the Cleobury area. It seriously affects quality of life and the safety of children, older people and communities who can find their villages cut in two.

Why is it so difficult to engage those whose responsibility it is to slow traffic and enforce speed limits? One answer is that resources are limited and those in power prioritise in response to government targets, their own views and the outrageous costs incurred in road safety work. Remedies are only put in place when there are injuries and deaths - too late. Even when it is known that it is an accident waiting to happen.

One stretch of pavement I know, if widened would allow safe passage from the village to the school, from school to shop, but is unlikely to be carried out. The cost is estimated at £130,000 for about 150 yards of pavement, partly because narrowing the

road is not possible and the pavement must be wide enough for a pushchair. If the road was narrowed would the traffic be slowed? A better solution than leaving narrow pavements where people are hit by lorry wing mirrors?

With people out of work and money being short I would hope gold plated contracts and excessive regulation would be reconsidered and safety would win out. We might even create some jobs I also wonder if the 'preferred contractor' route by Councils pushes costs up and reduces competition for individual contracts?

The police have limited numbers across Shropshire and enforcement is more difficult than other local police forces. Again, priorities and resources. It is now time to work together, find ways to reduce speeds, pool budgets and tell Government when regulations make solutions impossible. A very Happy Christmas to you all. Heather Kidd



A SHINING EXAMPLE



The smile is for the most important people at Bayton School - the pupils.But Avis Pounder is no softy, taking Bayton Primary from 40 to 104 pupils in ten years.

Let's be realistic. Most people wouldn't expect to find an outstanding combination of a nursery and primary school tucked away in a small village on the Shropshire/Worcestershire border. They obviously haven't been to Bayton.

This is the village that has stood up and fought to keep its school, and then took on the developer who wanted to build lakes, divert streams and change the local landscape. That idea died with the proverbial flea in its ear; you underestimate the willingness of the rural English to stand up and fight at your peril.

Ten years ago the primary school was threatened with closure, its pupil roll down to 40 and the men behind desks said they should be bussed to Far Forest. and the school closed. Enter Avis Pounder, newly appointed head teacher, who didn't think this was good idea. She built community feeling, the village backed her and the school climbed out of the closure category and on up the testing slope of success.

In October 2011 it has 104 pupils, the Office for Standards in Education thinks it is "Good with Outstanding Features" and the whole place blooms with success. And next door, so close that they share some facilities in a gentle, lovely rural setting, is the Little Learners Nursery. A place that Ofsted says is "Outstanding", the most obvious source of new pupils for the primary school.

At the Open Morning on October 8th, they were showing off the school's Reception Unit for new pupils, an essential facility for young children taking the step from nursery to the discipline of school. It's roughly the size of a two bedroom bungalow, with its own toilet and kitchen.

And here is the most remarkable part of this story: the new unit

didn't cost the County Council anything. It was financed by local fundraising and savings from devolved capital. The building went up at a very affordable cost after a bidding process won by a local company with grandchildren who are pupils.

Here is a school that thrives because it's a true community place. Out in the grounds - not far from the Forestry School area with its range of bushes, trees and a seat cut from the trunk of an old tree in the same grounds- a new greenhouse was being built. Not expensive unit from catalogue, but a simple wooden frame erected by builder Andy Howells and the walls and roof of plastic bottles. It cost about £180 and will be used by the pupils to grow produce. To call this a special place hardly does it justice.





Clive Davies' Westwood Farm Diary

Work goes on with the livestock at Westwood. In the sheep department the buoyant sale trends have led to us selling out of all the sheep that we can spare. The surplus male lambs have left the farm, most of them as finished lamb but a couple for a specific order for store lambs. They are those that will be fed on for a while longer before reaching enough weight and condition. The autumn period has seen us move on the ewes surplus to breeding requirements. In fact demand has been such that we have retained just twenty to mate to the rams this time. With that period now finished the sires have also left. The senior stock ram that we wouldn't be using again has gone to a recently established flock near Wolverhampton and our show ram of summer 2011 has been loaned out for a while to work in a small pedigree flock not far away. He will return during the winter to enable us to prepare him for some early summer events and then be offered for sale at the Shrewsbury Shropshire Sheep sale. We now have a few shepherding jobs to complete including a worm drenching programme on the ewe lambs before things settle down for the winter period. At the turn of the year we will pregnancy test the ewes to establish the expected lamb crop. This will give us guide to their future management requirements as we move toward the start of the lambing season in March. We have recently completed the most recent calving period for the Herefords. With the main stock bull only used over a seven week period last winter, this year's autumn calving was completed by mid November. The resultant calves are pleasing and with some

kind weather up until now, they have had a good start to their first winter. Most of the calves have yet to be disbudded so that they do not grow horns and then it will be time to get the stock bulls out to commence the process once again. The spring calving herd are approaching weaning time so that we can give the cows a rest before their next calves are due from mid March. The scanning results have revealed one barren cow and one carrying twins, so mathematically a 100% calf crop. The 'empty' cow is a disappointment, but when one day the vet visits we may have a look into why this might have been the case. She is a cow that we would particularly like to breed from again and so it will be best to search out the situation. The spring born calves are half way through a vaccination programme designed to safeguard them from respiratory diseases. When they are housed for wintertime they are always under more disease pressure and conditions like pneumonia can be devastating if they really get a hold. These animals are now due for their second dose and when weaned over the next couple of weeks or so should have better protection. The calves will then go onto full winter feed ration and the cows settled as they move toward their spring calving period. Therefore, over the next couple of weeks we have treatments to complete, winter housing to start and a suitable fee regime to adopt. Livestock work goes on at Westwood.

Dining with Mr Davies - An Evening at Addison's

Clive Davies is something of a favourite in the Clarion office. A contributor whose page is always interesting reading for people who know little or nothing about farming. With his background knowledge about production of food, he seemed the right chap to invite to an evening at Addison's, a recent addition to High Street dining.

It was a quiet evening when we sat and chatted in the bar, browsing the menu before making our choices. When Clive opted for the sirloin steak, I thought it a good move to follow a man who definitely knows about beef. His single Scotch with plenty of water kept well within the drink-driver limits and reminded me of the habit in Scotland of a dram or two with your steak. The Scots know how to produce both beef and whisky, after all. The meat at Addison's comes from a Bridgnorth butcher Ros has known for a long time and who always delivers good quality.

Clive went for the selection of pates, on the menu as a shared dish for two, but willingly served for a solo choice. Such flexibility is a good sign. Mushrooms with garlic bread are a favourite with my better half and went down well.

The sirloin steaks came with a very generous portion of chips and the offer of more if we wanted them, I could feel my belt straining at the very idea. Red wine helped it down, and as a non-specialist I cannot recall its name. If you are looking for one of those finely detailed

records of every item, its constituents and served temperature you're not going to find it here. This was a social evening, with concentration on the pleasures of the occasion.

My wife's main course was pork, well cooked but with a sauce too sweet for her taste. And we rounded off with treacle tart for madam and the men couldn't resist the siren call of a Bailey's Cheesecake.

Clive is an interesting talker, his recent visit to Brussels part of his responsibilities representing livestock farmers' interests to the body who lobby on their behalf in the EU. They may have been out to eat in the evening, but the trip was clearly no holiday, as Clive own report suggests.

Should we call this part Letter From Brussels? Over to you, Clive:

Recently, a number of eating establishments were visited. Three were memorable, for varying reasons. Two were in Brussels. The first, Moroccan styled, offered an experience! Three courses were accompanied by free flowing wine; the first course a pate selection, followed by a main course of mainly skewered meats. The chicken was recognisable and good; not sure what else was served! The sweet course was various marzipan based choices. The most amazing part was that our party of 24 plus other diners were all served, without any delay by just one waiter.

Next evening the party had grown to 30, less than a tenth of the

people enjoying the delights of Chez Leon in old town Brussels. What a place this is and has been over its 100 year plus history, do visit its website. The meal of soup, beef steak and meringue was just the job in the busiest restaurant you could ever imagine. There was some room for improvement in the steak department. Thank goodness there was the chance of a remedy when getting into Addisons a couple of evenings later. This recent addition to Cleobury's eating experiences offers a comfortable reception area where pre-meal drinks can be enjoyed and the menu pondered. I settled for a fairly direct comparison with the long established Belgium venue. The soup and the sweet were quite equal, although we did just rush the chef with the Baileys Cheesecake! What of the decisive main course? Was the British steak dish any match for its Continental European counterpart? You bet it was! The Addison chips must be something of a speciality but the sirloin was excellent. Thank goodness that our British farmers and butchers can still produce taste, succulence and tenderness. And that Addisons can cook it!

DECEMBER IN THE WYRE FOREST

Seasonal wisdom from Linda:

Brrrr! Cold weather is here again. The berry crop on most trees has been excellent during the autumn but I noticed that the birds were stripping the trees fairly early in the season. I hope they will be able to find enough food for the winter – we'd better keep topping up the bird feeders.

Hollies seem to be doing well in the forest where I live. I thought it would be fun to find out more about this seasonal symbol and turned to the Flora Brittannica by Richard Mabey. Among all the facts, folklore and anecdotes I found the following:

Holly was cut as winter feed for sheep and cattle. Apparently it is a good source of energy and nutrients, so the deer know what they are doing! A group of hollies cut regularly for feed was called a "hollin," a word that appears in place and family names in the north of England.

There was a widespread belief that cutting down a holly tree brought bad luck.

Holly is one of the hardest woods and was used to make walking sticks.

Holly is tolerant of shade and seedlings often sprout among

the bird droppings under trees used as roosts.

The leaves stimulate sweating so were used to treat fevers in colds, flu, bronchitis and rheumatism.

Christmas is coming and we will be hosting schoolchildren visiting the forest to enjoy the season and make a natural Christmas decoration. We hope they'll also find out a little about the animals that live in the forest. Whether you want to gather evergreens and cones for festive decorations or get away from it all, the forest could be the place for you. There are Health Walks every Tuesday and Sunday, meeting at the Visitor Centre at 10.30 for an 11.00am start. The walks are free, led by trained leaders, and are especially for those who wish to improve their fitness perhaps after illness. Forest Friends meet outside the Forest Café at 10.00am each Thursday in term time for an hour of forest activities for pre-school children and their carers. The charge is £3 per child.

It's good to share good news. Since I sent that "Endangered Species in the Wyre Forest" article last month there has been a stay of execution from the Forestry Commission. The team at the Discovery Centre can now

deliver educational programmes to schools and others until 2014/15 while still looking at alternative models of doing things and doing our best to match income with expenditure. However we do value everyone's support and would be delighted to receive your messages, which we will keep on file and use when necessary. Linda Iles, Forestry Commission

CLEOBURY MORTIMER OLD PEOPLE'S FUND

Roger Gittins has an amazing history to tell:

The Old People's Fund began back in December 1971, when

customers at the King's Arms raised money by playing dominoes and running raffles. This first year 28 people, nominated by the two local nurses, received £1.00 each. In 1973 the Sunday Domino League was formed, which raised £116.

The formation of the committee changed to Chairman Harry Heath, Malcolm Forrest as Secretary and Treasurer and the Captains of the Domino Teams. New rules were agreed that only pub teams in the town could contribute and those receiving gifts must live in the parish.

In 1979 the Darts League was added, spreading fund raising over 12 months. The committee changed over the years, but Malcolm Forrest remained in office until 2005, by which time over £100,000 had been raised.

I took over from Malcolm and have distributed £23,250 over the last six years. At the AGM in June it was agreed, 100 percent in favour, that money raised by the Sunday League would now donated to worthwhile charities. This vear the Nightingale Nurses and MacMillan Nurses will receive 40 percent of the fund. I estimate this will be around £2,500 apiece.

This means there will no longer be little envelopes dropping

through Senior Citizens' letter boxes at Christmas.


FATHER CHRISTMAS ON TOUR AGAIN

IN BUSINESS

Gilbert Carter Carpenter and Joiner

Gilbert Carter's roots are firmly local. Educated in Cleobury Mortimer, he left school to work in the plastics factory at Shakenhurst, where there was a lot of woodworking machinery. Maybe that's what inspired him to quit and sign up for a Manpower Services joinery college course at Southampton.

"The interview was at ten in the morning, so I travelled down by train overnight, not knowing where I'd stay. I actually slept in a graveyard, in my sleeping bag! I reckoned nobody would be daft enough to interfere with you in there," he laughs.

Fresh out of Southempton at the age of 21 he got an improver apprenticeship with a Kidderminster joinery company, where he met and listened to craftsmen as he broadened his knowledge and experience.

In 1986 he took the big step of becoming self employed, ready to travel anywhere to work and learning all the time. The thirst for knowledge didn't die, and years later he went back to college for two years of evening classes, emerging with distinctions and credits in joinery.

Along the way he qualified as a college lecturer, as a strained back persuaded him to look at physically demanding work. "I started teaching in Hereford and hated it!" recalls. So he turned his talents to specialist joinery, making to measure in whatever wood the job required. He never stood still, investing in machinery that made work quicker and better finished. That priority of work quality showed when he moved the site where he still operates, just outside Cleobury. He looked over the garage that would become his workshop before he glanced at the house.

In the workshop today are a dimensional saw and spindle moulder plus a variety of other machinery and hand tools. On one shelf is a range of ancient planes up to 150 years old he inherited from a craftsman and he holds one with pride: "In the hands of an idiot, this is just a block of wood," he explains. "With somebody who knows what he's doing, it can produce beautiful work."

He works with any wood, and does have a favourite: "I do like non tropical hardwoods, because I don't like the idea of cutting the rainforests down. But it isn't always possible to use that."

"Oak is very popular today," he says. "I get my supplies from a Black Country merchant." He makes everything to order and when The Clarion called he was halfway through a houseful of windows, every one a different size. That's his strength, the

ability to adjust to the customer's precise requirement.

"If you want a standard size for an estate of houses, you go to someone like Magnet," Gilbert explains. "I'm not trying to compete with them. I'm a traditional joiner, and that means quality."

Almost all of his work is local, with hardly any more than ten miles from home. He has long experience working of restoration projects and knows what can be done to comply with building regulations, yet still offer modern standards of insulation and draught proofing. Like the set of sash windows, made to measure as like-for-like replacements for the originals, but with a clever twist. From outside they look just like the old windows, but these are double glazed and offer high thermal efficiency as well as proper draught proofing. They're destined for a local Grade Two listed building.

His knowledge means he can readily identify the name and style of moulding on ancient frame. And he has the tools to make perfect replicas.

He does lots of built-in wardrobes and can construct staircases for any dwelling from a traditional cottage to a manor house, a man with pride in the work he does. "It takes a chap 25 to 30 years to be the master of a trade. Call me up and ask me to build a brick wall and I won't. I'm a carpenter and I'll do a proper job at that. I used to work with craftsmen who believed that just because you couldn't see part of a job it was no excuse for it not to be properly finished." From a gate to a staircase, he can do it well.
