



REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY A wonderful display of community strength.



Matt Sheehan, whose nine years in the army included a tour of duty with the Royal Scots in Northern Ireland, laid the wreath on behalf of the organising British Legion. As well as his own N I Medal, Matt wore his father's National Service medal and his grandfather's from the 1914-18 First World War.

The town's gathering to remember those lost in action seems to grow bigger each year. This year the parade that assembled in the Talbot Car Park stretched down to Stable Tavern, with an impressive number of children amongst them.

Led by the Bell Inn Band, the parade marched down the High Street to the Bookshop where it stopped to salute the 1939-45 World War veterans, there as special guests of the British Legion It then moved on to the War Memorial, where Rector Ashley Buck led prayers and Jim Hulme of the Legion added the memorable verse from Lawrence Binyon's 'Ode of Remembrance.' It was a moving experience to stand and join the two minutes silence, with not a murmur to be heard from the hundreds of people around the War Memorial Gardens and lining the parade route from the Talbot Yard car park to the church.

The parade moved on into the church, where there was not a seat left. The Bishop of Ludlow had asked to attend the service and gave a brief and pertinent sermon that the many children listened to in attentive silence. Their respectful presence in the parade, the wreath laying and the service was an optimistic sign that those who gave so much will not be forgotten in the future. The collection during the service raised £700 for the Legion's Poppy Fund.

After the service, the veterans were treated to lunch in the

Kings Arms, courtesy of the Legion. Such a nice touch. Walking home, it seemed that everyone thought this year's parade was the biggest they'd seen and there was a warm glow about the day.

BEFORE THE PARADE Deacon Justin Parker had a good experience. In his words:

On the Saturday before the Remembrance Sunday service, I was in church late in the afternoon and heard a loud noise

Thinking it could be a low flying aircraft I popped outside when what should I see but Alan Guest, busily and by himself, blowing, sweeping and clearing all the paths around the Church in readiness for the parade.

What a lovely thing to do. No one prompted him to do it; he just saw a job which needed to be done to make the area clean, smart and safe and did it.

That's how you make a town work.

MAWLEY MILK'S NEW TURBINE

It's a new landmark on the east side of the town, its huge blades using the wind to drive the turbine unit on top of a 30 metre tower. The Robinson family are not given to looking back to how things used to be, but move forward and adapt to new technology.

The new turbine has an output of 50 kilowatts and is expected to achieve an output of 150,000 kilowatt hours in a year. That will cover roughly 75 percent of annual farm's complementing the solar panels on the barn roof that give about 25 percent. This is an obvious investment for a busy dairy farm, whose use goes to provide cold storage for the milk, warm water to wash down the dairy and the milking parlour and to run the milking system 24 hours

There were two years of planning in this development, working with the Galway based manufacturer. This turbine is a new development for them, the biggest they've made and the Mawley installation is Number 11 off the production line. Its assembly was a careful process, with the turbine unit mounted on a rig to having the propeller blades mounted and the whole assembly craned up onto the tower. Wind speed was crucial to that operation, as the unit would not be lifted to that height if the wind was above the critical rate of 9.8 metres per second.

Rachel Robinson tells us that overall the feedback is positive and that the company would welcome anyone who would like to see the turbine close up. Only by appointment of course.

THE RUGBY CLUB LOG DROP

They're doing it again. The Rugby Club will be out on Sunday the 16th, starting at 2.00, delivering bags of logs to anyone in Cleobury Mortimer Parish who gets the government fuel allowance.

It's a little better organised this year, as the delivery information they had last Christmas was three years out of date. Andy Goold has arranged for everyone entitled to the free logs to leave their details at one of the information points. These are at the Severn Hospice shop, Flowers by Fiona, Carrot Tops and the Cleobury Country Centre. Leave your details, please, by December 8th, to help Andy organise a smooth run that means they won't be knocking on doors asking if people are expecting a delivery.

Big thanks to Paul Harding Tree Services and Specialist Foundations, who are donating the logs, and the Rugby Club who are giving their time to make this thoughtful Christmas gesture happen.

CHANGES AT THE BOOKSHOP

__Mark & Myfanwy Baldwin regretfully announce that from January 1st they will no longer be opening the Book Shop on a regular basis, although M & M Baldwin will still be based at 24 High Street. In preparation for this down-sizing, December will see a Half-Price Sale on all secondhand goods at the shop-books, magazines, sheet music and postcards.

Opened in November 1986, the Bookshop is pretty well Cleobury's longest-standing business to be run in the same premises by the same principals. However, the market has changed, partly a result of the influence of the Internet, and regular opening is no longer worthwhile. Mark & Myfanwy would like to thank all their customers past and present their support is much appreciated.

The slump in the secondhand book business has been offset to some degree by the continuing demands for Mark's services as a public speaker on a range of World War 2 topics. In the past two years, he has delivered over 100 presentations in a variety of venues - from universities to primary schools, and from theatres to cruise ships. He also works part-time as a Tour Director for ACE Cultural Tours, and has a number of 4- and 5day study tours planned for 2013, one of which will be to the Channel Islands to look at some of the many defensive structures during the Occupation of 1940-45. Jersey alone has over 400 bunkers, and as the standard wall thickness is two metres, you can understand why they're still there.



ELECTRIC QUADBIKE LAUNCHED

All you can hear are the tyres

Electric vehicles are seen more and more as the way forward for universal transport. They've come a long way from the over hyped rushes to production of ten years ago and let's not mention the Sinclair C5 that needed pedal assistance to get up the towering climb of Love Lane.

Today you can buy 120mph cars, vans and scooters that simply use a battery as power, or there are the hybrids that use a combination of petrol and electricity. And now, you can add a genuine British designed and built electric quad bike in sizes from kiddies to farm vehicles capable of pulling half a tonne.

Dave Johnson of Shropshire Quads at Neen Savage is the man behind their presence here and he launched them with an open day when farming folk in the area could try them over the local terrain, including the hills.

The quads are built in Ilfracombe, using a motor

developed for military use and incorporating a regenerative charger that puts power back into the battery when riding downhill with the throttle lever closed. That also aids braking, a useful safety feature on slippery surfaces.

The battery charger has a builtin control that will accept a quick booster charge if needed, but also controls input if the charger is accidentally left on. There are no gears in the conventional sense, just forward and reverse and a high or low option for onor off-road use.

The cost of a typical charging for a smaller unit like the 60 volt Charger Sport is just 60p, but if a farmer has a windmill putting power back into the National Grid, the cost can be zero. And because they have no emissions, road tax is zero as well. You can drive them on a car or motorcycle licence and a 17-year-old can drive one on a provisional licence with 'L'plates on display.

The launch day was busy, with farmers from a wide area looking in and listening carefully to detailsof the operating costs, then looking very thoughtful. It seems to have been a convincing day, because sales have already started to move.

The quietness of their operation is very impressive, with the tyres the only audible warning of approach. The price range starts at £5,000 for a two-wheel drive mini and climbs up to £8950 for a big four wheel drive model, both those prices subject to VAT.

Dave is convinced this is the future way for quad bikes, with running costs so modest and emissions nil. Try the future for yourself - he has a demonstrator.



Letter from Westminster Philip Dunne MP

It is a pleasure for me to have this opportunity to wish readers a very Happy Christmas. With Christmas Day falling on a Tuesday, I expect some people may take a day off on Christmas Eve this year, and so enjoy an extended five day Christmas break from the evening of Friday 21st. It is at this time of the year that most of us can hopefully enjoy a good break. This is particularly welcome for those fortunate to have family near at hand.

But spare a thought for those in our midst who lack anyone else with whom to share this special time. My family have tried over the years to invite any immediate neighbour who we know to be alone to join us for lunch on Christmas Day. I encourage anyone who is able to be a good neighbour over Christmas to drop in to see someone who is on their own.

I also feel for those who either choose or have to work on Christmas Day. From the clergy to carers, the police and other emergency services, there are always some people working when the rest of us are at rest. This also of course applies to the brave men and women in our Armed Forces, on duty at home and abroad, especially those in Afghanistan, together with the civilian contractors supporting them.

Your simple act of thoughtfulness will bring some joy to others and encourage the spread of human kindness in the world.





The Farming Page

With Clive Davies stepping down from writing this column, we have asked a number of local farmers to give their points of view. This month, we are happy to welcome John and Catherine Evans of Broome Park.

Broome Park Farm is one part of RC Evans Ltd, a family farming business that has been based on the outskirts of Cleobury for over 100 years. The Evans family came to Curdale Farm as tenants in 1897 and have farmed there continuously ever since, buying the farm from the Marquis of Bath's Longleat Estate in 1919. Over the years the business has expanded and now farms land in Bayton, Hopton, Catherton and Neen Savage as well as Cleobury. The farming business supports 4 families and we also run a Bed and Breakfast business with 2 letting rooms at Broome Park. The farm is mixed stock (beef and sheep) and arable growing oats, wheat, barley and beans. At Broome Park we have 2 piglets, 10 hens and 1 cockerel, also a mad dog called Mack, a Collie/Labrador cross who is completely hopeless as a working dog and has managed to get himself a cushy indoor life with a basket next to the woodburner.

This Autumn has been a challenging season owing to continuous wet weather. Yields from this year's harvest were poor and shortages are already being reported in the News. It has also been a struggle to plant next year's crops before the Winter. In a normal season we would hope to plant approximately 150 acres of winter barley, 100 acres of oats and 300 acres of wheat but this year so far only 250 acres have been planted and the ground is still very wet and sticky for planting. All farmers are having to

revise their planting plans for the coming year and take steps to swop winter varieties for spring varieties.

Once planting is done most of the winter months are spent tending to the livestock. All the cattle are brought inside and need feeding twice a day. Sheep are left out in the fields until they are brought inside to lamb but also need feeding every day and also checking for health - sheep will die at a moments notice! Expectant ewes are scanned 2 months before they are due and sorted out depending on how many lambs they are carrying. This means those with twins or triplets can be fed extra rations. Lambing will start in January and continue through to April. Ewes and lambs are returned to the fields after 3 – 4 days depending on the weather - cold and dry is better than damp and wet! The biggest worry for livestock farmers at the moment is Schmallenberg virus which causes deformities and still births, it is caused by midges carrying the virus across the Channel from Europe in the autumn. At Broome Park we also have young calves on the bucket - this means they are fed a form of formula milk for cows. We buy the young calves from dairy farmers via local markets at 2 - 3 weeks old and they will be bucket fed for about 6 weeks, then move on to a cereal based diet, supplemented with hay or silage


Welcome back Nick Morris, our man in the Police Station and in the know:

In general the crime figures for our area remain very low, with only an occasional shed break-in over the past couple of months and one house burglary at Hollywaste on October 19th. The latest incidents appear to be linked and occurred at Hopton Wafers. The outbuildings, stables and barns were broken into at two properties between 6:00pm on November 21st and 8:00am the next day. Tools such as a chainsaw, a strimmer and a hammer drill, and a horse rug were stolen from one of the properties, and a nail gun, a screwdriver drill, a hammer drill and fishing equipment were stolen from the other. The number of criminal damage incidents have also decreased, the latest one reported being what appeared to have been a bottle thrown at a window of the Methodist Church and smashing it. This happened during the night of November 16th/17th.

A few weeks ago there were several times when a horse owner in Neen Sollars discovered that a horse had had a plait weaved in its mane and pieces of twine nailed to the gatepost of the field in which it was kept. This obviously worried the owner as it was thought that the horse was marked to be stolen. However, it's now thought that this is not the case and that there is some other unknown reason why this was done. If anyone could pass on to us any information about who may be involved with this, it

would be greatly appreciated as they need to be given stern words of advice.

Quite often we receive complaints about vehicles parked on pavements where pedestrians, disabled people or people with prams have to go into the road in order to get by. This is unacceptable, especially on a busy road. Usually a quick word with the driver or a note left on the windscreen does the trick, so let us know if you are having a problem with cars blocking your way. But bear in mind that some roads are very narrow and when car owners have experienced wing mirror damage or worse, without anyone owning up to causing it, it is extremely annoying. Since PC Tony Sewell moved on to pastures new, a few residents have voiced their concerns about the lack of police presence which he provided. PC Ann O'leary, who is covering our area in addition to Highley, will be working hard to provide what is expected. You may not see as much of her as you did Tony, but she is a 'no nonsense' police officer and deals with miscreants robustly. If you need to report anything which requires logging the number is 101. 

December in the Wyre Forest - Linda Iles writes

It seems that winter is the time to get busy in the Wyre Forest. While the trees and wild creatures are in "shut down" mode there is no excuse for us to follow suit.

Butterfly Conservation have dates for winter conservation tasks aimed at improving habitat for some of the rarer butterflies like the Pearlbordered Fritillary and Wood White. This work, in collaboration with the Forestry Commission and Natural England, will focus on improving links and re-spacing coppice as part of the SITA Trust-funded 'Reconnecting the Wyre' project. The remaining dates are December 16th, February 17th and March 17th. Meet at Earnwood Copse car park on the B4194 Bewdley-Kinlet road (GR. SO744784) at 10.00 am and we will then drive into the forest. There is also a midweek task on January 16th, meeting at Dry Mill Lane car park, Bewdley at 10.00 am (SO773764) with a follow up on February 24th with the same meeting arrangements.

Uncllys Farm is also the setting for three new Wood Working Courses which start in January. The six week courses are funded through the LEADER Programme to give people living in rural Worcestershire the opportunity to learn and develop skills for new or existing businesses. Liz Melley and Susan Grazier have both worked in the caring industry for years. And in their new business that's what they will concentrate on.

Liz came into this work via an agency, but left and joined Worceser County Council to get their better training. She stayed there for 13 years.

Susan started with the Manor House Nursing Home Cleobury's High Street, 16 years ago, when it was a renowned and highly regarded nursing home. 

IN BUSINESS: Cleobury Mortimer Playgroup

It's the veteran amongst local playgroups. Cleobury Playgroup can go back more than 45 years to the days when Cath Bills wanted a place where her infant son Dan could mix with other children in safety.

There wasn't one, so Cath rolled up her sleeves and opened her Playgroup Nursery in the Parish Hall. Mums and youngsters rolled up in numbers and Cath knew she'd made the right move. What she did purely as a concerned mum, with no formal training, was start a new venture that's grown and grown.

The Group moved on to the Market Hall with its better facilities at the time. Lovely room, excellent storage, good access on Church Street, but the room was shared with other events and the big

range of equipment had to be stowed away at night whenever there was another event happening.

In April this year they moved again. They were offered a room at the Primary School, a natural setting for the children to get used to the big step up in their education when they started at what we would call proper school. To a four or five year old that's a big step, but if it's a move next door to a place they know, far less daunting. The school's motto, "All Friends Together", certainly fits neatly with this arrangement.

They're settled in their own room, with their own door to give access to the wild life area in the school grounds. Now the children can move easily out to the fresh air, where they mix happily with children from the school.

Jane Preece is the manager of the operation, with Rachel Evans her deputy. Working with them are Sue Powell and Jane's daughter Lauren as assistants. All of them properly trained and qualified, all of them CRB checked as a matter of course.

The Playgroup is licensed for 26 children, with three staff to watch over them. Jane's policy is to keep class sizes down to 20 and have four staff present, a more thorough and less stressful way of keeping quiet control of the children.

There's a lot of toys and equipment around, all of it in good condition. It represents a big investment and there will be more of that when it's needed. "We're always looking at new ways to help make the place better," says Jane.

In addition to its big range of equipment and toys, the nursery has access to other school facilities, such as the library and the main hall. If a parent wants a child to have a primary school dinner, that can be arranged. "There's such a calm atmosphere here, it's a lovely place," says Jane.

The ladies running this place are all very able, the sort of people who could have made careers in better paid areas, so why do they choose to work here? "It does fit in with school hours," Rachel points out. "But you've got to love it, or you wouldn't do it."

Iane has to answer to the who committee responsible for this registered charity, most of them parents, and they in turn answer to the County Council. standards are not allowed to slip, with Ofsted inspections just like bigger schools have. the latest one, playgroup were awarded a 'Good" rating, which today means it has high standards all through the organisation. And you only have to see all the children smiling to realise that's true.
