

PENSAX THRIFT SHOP

Built on land leased from Mr Arthur Jones of Abberley Hall and opened in 1911, Pensax Village Hall has served the communities of Pensax, Menith Wood and Stockton for over a century. The hall has been the venue for community celebrations of all kinds, social events, evening classes, a youth club, a play group, Church and Parish Council meetings and, of course, it still hosts the local polling station.

In 1974, the then Chair of the Hall Committee, Mrs Elizabeth Head, had the inspired idea of opening a weekly Thrift Shop. The aim was to provide an outlet for cake-makers, needle women and gardeners, for anyone with unwanted items to sell. It would be a source of income, 10% of the selling price of goods being retained for hall funds. Word soon spread and people from further afield would travel to attend Thrift Shop on a Wednesday morning. The venture brought many more economic and social benefits for all its supporters than had been hoped for, and it offered a meeting place for those looking for company, fulfilling exactly the aims of many current efforts by village halls to reach out to the community.

In 1978, the Thrift Shop was able to help Pensax Parish Council to purchase the hall and since then it has been responsible for paying the bills for hall maintenance. Over the years Thrift Shop customers have also supported special charity fundraising with contributions made to local hospitals, hospices, children's charities, Midlands Air Ambulance, to name but a few.

More recently Thrift Shop has had fewer customers than before - Ebay hadn't been heard of in 1974 – and it was with a heavy heart that volunteers decided finally to close this year, but not until we had celebrated 45 years of trading on 23rd October. Real friendships have been forged over the years and Wednesday mornings will not be the same without Thrift Shop to go to. Customers and volunteers alike will miss it but, sadly, all good things come to an end.



One of them, Herbie, came and rested his head on the coffin. The story of their meeting and a slow blooming love that lasted 25 years was a masterly performance that made us laugh and cry.

How do you follow such a performance? You sit and listen to Led Zeppelin's "Thank You" with Robert Plant at his best; it was one of her favourites. When the time came for the coffin to be moved on, the flowers were removed and one of her horse blankets was folded by the family and placed over it.

There were no prayers for this staunch atheist, but those who have faith will be confident that the Almighty will make such a loving human being welcome in whatever place lies beyond life on earth.

We left to the sound of Bob Dylan's "Forever Young", the selection of music reflecting her zest for life. People were smiling and saying what a wonderful send-off. It seemed that all of us found our way to the Eagle and Serpent, one of her favourite eating places, to recall more memories. Quite a lady; quite a day. ΙR

FUTURE HEALTH SERVICE

The lengthy discussions and consultations on what services and where they will be delivered in Shropshire took a positive step forward on September 3rd. The Secretary of State for Health gave permission for the plan for the future of the Princess Royal Hospital in Telford and the Royal Shrewsbury in Shropshire to go ahead.

THE CLEOBURY COMMUNITY HUB



You walk into what used to be the Methodist Chapel on Church Street and the immediate impression is "Wow!" On a cold, wet Friday morning I walked in to find about half the floor area given over to a soft toy play area, with toddlers climbing, rolling in a big ball pond or laughing as volunteer Andrew Keeley led a game. Nearby, their mums sat over coffees and chatted as they watched.

In the corner is a kitchen area, where food and drinks are prepared. The place prides itself on the range of coffee and chocolate drinks it offers, and if you just want to sit and be quiet there's one of those inviting old leather wingback chairs waiting to almost put its arms around you and make you welcome,

next to a wood burning stove giving out deep warmth from behind its protective guard.

There are lots of tables and chairs for those who want to eat or drink and the range of cutlery is kept in what was once an upright piano, but proved to be beyond economic repair. So it's now leading a second life as a cutlery cupboard. Great idea.

Most of the work in converting this to a bright and welcoming place was down to local children with a little adult guidance. High in the vaulted roof is a chandelier, designed by youngsters and fabricated by a local craftsman. The colour scheme is light and airy and the floor is carpeted - better for the toddlers who tend to fall over occasionally.

But this is more versatile than it appears to be. If there is a service to be held in the chapel, it can be easily changed. The big mirrors that add to a feeling of space (sponsored by the Town Council) can be moved aside and play area cleared to make room for chairs and give access to the altar. It's an object lesson in making a building adaptable.

The plans do not stop there. Team leader Mark Greaves has seen an enthusiastic support for climbing, but that means driving to one of the regional facilities. With a climbing wall here in Cleobury, our carbon score would look better. If they can raise enough grant funding there's a plan for one right here in The Hub.

Try the experience and you'll find it hard to believe that this whole enterprise runs on the efforts of volunteers with just two paid staff - Mark and Molly Perkins. Remarkable.

And what do the younger customers think of the place?



We'll put that down as a success, then.

I write this year's Christmas Letter from Westminster decidedly early – my last act on my final day as your MP for Ludlow, before once again becoming your local candidate for election on December 12th. So it is refreshing to look forward and think of the season of goodwill, rather than December's bracing weather on the campaign trail. Like many in South Shropshire, I shall be celebrating Christmas with my family. But sadly, for many Christians around the world, the simple act of celebrating the birth of Christ runs the risk of persecution and death.

I firmly believe the UK can and should play a role in ensuring freedom from persecution of Christians around the world. So I have followed closely the Independent Review of Foreign and Commonwealth Office support for persecuted Christians, conducted by the Anglican Bishop of Truro, the Right Reverend Philip Mounstephen, which was published earlier this year.

The Review is the conclusion of a project that began in December 2018, when the then Foreign Secretary, Jeremy Hunt, asked the Bishop of Truro to carry out this important research, with the full support of the Foreign and Commonwealth Office

Bishop Mounstephen's report has identified specific steps the UK Government can take to address the issues faced by persecuted Christians around the world, and I am pleased Ministers have accepted the recommendations.

The freedom Christians enjoy in this country allows the Church of England to continue to play its important role in South Shropshire – from spiritual guidance, to educator, and protector of heritage and the environment, the Church fulfils many roles in our community, as the Archbishop of Canterbury saw first-hand on his recent tour of the Hereford Diocese.

There will be many Midnight Mass and Christmas Day services in most of the beautiful churches around South Shropshire, and Christingle services to help raise funds for the Children's Society.

Of course, Christmas is not a time of relaxation for all, including those who work over the holiday, like our Armed Forces and Emergency Services staff, to whom we should be immensely grateful for their constant professionalism. I also visit the Royal Mail sorting office each year, to thank local posties for coping with the mad rush to deliver cards, parcels and presents - and this year election leaflets and postal votes - before Christmas Day.

So if you get the chance, please take the time to thank those who you know will be working over Christmas. A kind word goes a long way, and will let them know how much you appreciate what they do.

I wish everyone in South Shropshire a very happy and peaceful Christmas, with best wishes for the coming year.

SAINT MARY'S BREAKFAST CLUB

The Club met at Cleobury Café in November to hear Vicky Franklin tell how she became a practitioner of the Bowen technique.

With two engineering degrees, Vicky was well qualified to work as an aeronautical design engineer, which she did for many years. However, following her move to Shropshire, she became disenchanted with a daily drive to Manchester, and decided to devote more time to her particular interest - horses. She took early retirement about five years ago, but still needed an income to support herself and her horses. She enrolled on a course to study the Bowen Technique, a gentle manipulative therapy, described by Vicky as a cross between acupuncture and osteopathy.

The technique was developed in Australia by Thomas Bowen. Following his studies of the human muscular structure, he discovered that certain moves on the body helped recovery from many conditions. Vicky is particularly well equipped to be a Bowen practitioner, as she brings the analysis of an engineer to bear on the muscular and skeletal problems of her clients. She emphasised

the need to work out how the clients' problems arise, so that she can address the causes of these, and not merely treat the symptoms.

Treatments Vicky described, assisted by a full-sized complete replica skeleton (attracting some surprised reactions from other customers coming into the café), included shoulder pain, headaches, neck pain, IBS, and the all-too-common lower back pain. She finished with good advice about posture and gentle exercise, which should help us to remain mobile and pain-free as long as possible.


Facebook is working well, with 197 followers and a post reach over 100. Parish Festive Walks scheduled for December 1st and Boxing Day.



Our native Corvids (Magpies, Crows, Rooks, Jays and Ravens) are very intelligent birds but they are a noisy lot. The colourful Jays have been busy eating and burying acorns 'while stocks last' and set off with an affronted shriek if I disturb them. We see Crows and Magpies too, far too many of the latter for my liking, but it is the Raven that gives me a thrill when I hear its grating call, usually high above the woods or fields as it flies over its territory hunting for pigeons or other birds and small mammals. In these circumstances it is hard to guage its size but sometimes other birds will mob it, trying to send it away, and then I can compare them. With a wingspan of up to 150cm they can be larger than Buzzards, whose call is more musical (if that is the right word) but just as haunting.



The forest seems emptier now that the leaves are nearly all off the trees. It still offers some protection from the weather and you will feel warmer there than in the surrounding open landscape. Fallen leaves carpet the ground and are especially thick where they have drifted in the wind. This is where you will find concentrations of the little leaf eaters such as worms, slugs and millipedes, and the decomposers (eg bacteria and protozoa), all busy despite the winter. In 'The Woodland Trust Book of British Woodlands' Michael Allaby writes that only 1% of the total volume of leaves is eaten on the trees the rest provide energy for all these organisms which live in and just above the soil, recycling each year's leaf fall so that the nutrients can journey through the soil and air to supply living plants and animals again. Dead wood is also broken down but it takes longer. It resists digestion by most creatures but this is where the fungi play a major part: like animals they secrete digestive enzymes which can break down complex molecules, including cellulose and lignin in wood, into simpler ones which are then absorbed. The fruiting bodies of fungi, mushrooms and toadstools, usually show signs of being nibbled: a fleeting food source for slugs and larger animals.

Talking of larger animals, most of them are out and about during winter months, with only dormice, hedgehogs and bats really hibernating. Dawn only arrives after 8am this month, so that is a good time for a quiet walk to enjoy beautiful effects such as that captured in this photo, or perhaps to spot Fallow Deer before they spot you. On Christmas Day the sun will rise at 8.17am, giving a day lasting 7 hours 47 minutes before sunset at 4pm. Make the most of it!

The new 292 timetable did come into use from 4th November and seems to be running fairly well with most services more or less on time although there have been a couple of breakdowns. Comprehensive stocks of the new timetables have been placed at a number of points including bus stops, the Library and Market Hall thanks mainly to Madge Shineton and Bruce Webster. I used the service to go to Kiddy the other day and it was on time both ways. There is one temporary alteration to the schedule as the service doesn't stop at the Swan Centre while they are carrying out roadworks to de-pedestrianise the area. Naturally, I hadn't asked about this and watched as we sailed past. Luckily, the driver let me off at the bottom ring road lights near Sainsburys so I didn't have to walk too far back...

Although not strictly bus related, you may have wondered why the roads around Cleobury resemble the surface of the Moon. The following may be part of the reason: In response to a Freedom of Information request, Shropshire Council (very reluctantly and only after being threatened with enforcement action by the Information Commissioner's Office) revealed that they had spent just over £80,000 on resurfacing a lane near Oswestry leading to just a few houses. As

'Private Eye' pointed out in their 'Rotten Boroughs' column, surely this reluctance could not be connected to the fact that one of these few houses belongs to a senior Tory county councillor, or the fact that another Tory councillor sent an email to the highways department urging them to get on with the job and mentioning the resident councillor by name. The road in question was also not on the list of roads needing repair held by the local parish council. Strangely, the council isn't saying. This could be good news of course as we have two county councillors living in Cleobury so can we expect to hear the roar of road surfacing machinery in the near future? Probably not.

This is the second edition of 'Private Eye' running where Shropshire Council has featured in that column, the last entry referring to the fact that a number of councillors had failed to pay their Council Tax on time. The suggested in-house solution? Increase their allowances! You couldn't make it up...

Apparently, a number of bus companies in the West Midlands have been discussing the introduction of a common scheme to reduce fares for off peak travel. One notable absence: Diamond, who have refused to take part.





David Cameron is busy pushing his memoirs at present. Not that I think he really needed the £600K advance. Still never let it be said that he didn't achieve anything during his spell as PM. He seems to have done more damage to the United Kingdom by accident than Adolf Hitler ever caused on purpose. And all this just to sort out the divisions in his own party (which went well..). And after everything, we have ended up with another arrogant posh boy in charge (for the moment). Mind you, the alternatives are no more attractive with all parties shouting 'My magic money tree is bigger than yours' (note to all: there is no magic money tree).

Why do doctors or nurses say 'Just a little scratch' when giving an injection? It's not a scratch, it's a jab with a sharp and pointy needle. Take Hinkley Point as another example. Years late and way over budget at a current estimated cost of £22.5 billion and with no reactor of that design having produced a single watt of electricity. The earlier site at Flamanville in Normandy was supposed to be up and running in 2012 at a cost of less than £3 billion. It now looks like it won't come into operation until 2022 at a cost (at present) of an estimated £11 billion. However, EDF with a breathtaking sense of optimism, are pressurising the French government to order another six. Fortunately, by a stroke of genius (or accident) the Hinkley contract ensures that we don't start paying through the nose for our electricity (about three times the current going rate) until it actually produces some which looks like a vanishingly distant prospect.

No doubt any subsequent enquiry will be met with the response that 'Lessons will be learned' but we all know from bitter experience that this just won't happen.

Oh well, mustn't complain(!). I hope you all have a happy Christmas and New Year.



THE FESTIVAL OF AGEING

This was brave experiment that worked well. All about dealing with old age and some of the problems it might bring. With speakers to tell it didn't really hurt, and traders and associations ready to help

Claire Cartlidge brought her bicycle in, the one she'd ridden to Greece and back with her husband. Definitely not your average retired librarian.

Doctor William Bird talked about people staying active and his work building the Health Walk scheme that we see in action here in Cleobury. His easy way of explaining how to keep alert and properly alive was worth the visit alone.

There were sessions the big crowd could attend and my first selection was a county library scheme, "Reading Aloud." We sat and I think it was Team Librarian Heather Rodenhurst who read a selection of short stories. Nice works, but no chance to comment or exchange opinions. It wouldn't go down well with our Reading Group, that's for sure. After all, a good argument is one way of staying alert.

A chance to walk around the trade area meant a chat with the Severn Hospice staff. When I went on stage I did a commercial for them, as I was wearing one of my newer jackets, bought at the Cleobury shop for £5.49. I had been online and looked at Hugo Boss offerings, but couldn't afford £600 for a similar jacket. That got a round of applause good old Severn Hospice.

More activities to try in the afternoon and I opted for a yoga session, knowing how popular it is in Cleobury. This was a gentle version of the discipline, with sloooow stretching, mostly done whilst sitting down. It certainly was





PLASTIC NOT SO FANTASTIC

Reuse your plastic fake tree, or real trees are plastic free. Make your own Christmas food and snacks; many ready made products come wrapped in large amounts of plastic.

Wrapping leftovers, choose reusable containers over single use cling film. Waxed paper or beeswax wraps is another alternative.

Use wrapping paper that is not "plasticised" Scraps of brightly coloured material can also be used to wrap presents and can be reused. Shredded paper can be used as packaging for breakable items as an alternative to bubble wrap.

Christmas crackers can be personalised and homemade paper hats can be added; non plastic cracker kits are available from Oxfam-£5.99 for six.

CATHERTON COMMON

For a long time now I have been bemoaning the, generally, dry weather and worrying about the common drying out and changing. This came into sharp focus earlier this year when a resident was telling me how he used to cross the common with his children 20+ years ago (there was far less tall, dense gorse then) with a small boat and play about on a small pool!

Well what a difference a few months can make. Wandering across the common at the moment all the small pools and wet flushes are once again filled with water and the common is well served with damp hollows spread in every corner. This is very important for the diversity of the common which is an intricate mix of wet and dry heathland. These wet areas, occurring throughout the common, are very important to our insects, animals and birds and not just to the plants that are adapted to them. People often understand the value of a pond but small seasonal wet hollows, boggy ground and wet flushes (areas where water runs in sheets on and just below the surface) are probably of more value and overlooked.

The value of the common for wildlife is greatly increased by these widely spread wet areas but they also help it to act like a sponge soaking up heavy rainfall and reducing flooding. For that reason we try to avoid diverting the water into ditches where it runs off quickly into streams and rivers causing downstream flooding. Please push your flooding problem back onto the common.





The Jackson family and their TLC Care At Home service have been featured in these pages before, but their outstanding rate of success justifies an update on a story that shows what care and knowledge can achieve.

Peter and Jacqui started the business from their Neen Savage home in 2013 and discovered a need for the care they offered. As Jacqui puts it: "One room at home we could cope with, but when it got to three rooms we had to find somewhere else." They found it in 2016 at Load Street, Bewdley, above the Kemp Hospice shop. Walk through the street door and you're in

no doubt that this is a friendly, clean and efficient workplace.

Their operation covers the Cleobury Mortimer area and Wyre Forest, with carefully selected and trained carers. From the beginning they have given time and effort to training and developing their staff, and they have their own training facility in the Bewdley base. All the carers are required to achieve Care Certificate and Level 2 Health in Social Care, and are then encouraged to move further up the qualification scale. A typical thoughtful touch is carers having specific qualifications to support the individual needs of each client.

Quality Assurance checks are carried out monthly and include spot checks, observations, medication competency checks and care plan reviews and updates. That does sound like a big administrative load, but what it does for the clients is make sure the service is safe and working well. Regular feedback forms are sent out to both clients and carers to confirm they all feel they are supported and properly looked after.

There is a bespoke management system that tells the manager when carers have arrived safely at their clients' home and it will also alert staff to any medical conditions such as allergies or diabetes. It can also supply specialised menus for clients with such special needs.

In addition to the company's in-house training facility they use specialist Worcester Care Training Solutions to deliver Moving and Handling, First Aid and Level 2 Medication to both internal and external individuals. A high percentage of the workforce are qualified to sign off Medication Competency for new carers in training.

The Management System has links to NHS websites to understand and give details of clients' conditions and needs, to help give the correct support. They also have Sepsis red flag and stroke assessments to guide staff and ensure the best outcome for the people they support.

It's a complicated process for the client to face, and many find it difficult to understand. TLC can help.

And in November the Care and Quality Commission gave them an 'Outstanding' rating for their service. Less than 3% of English home care companies have done that.
