ADRIAN SATTERLY

Mr Satterly appeared at Shrewsbury Crown Court on November 11th for sentencing. He had earlier pleaded guilty to 15 counts of theft of the 20 with which he was originally charged. The value of the admitted thefts, between March 2016 and May 2019, was estimated at £4,600 taken from charity collection money donated at 11 funerals.

When police investigated the matter in December 2019, Mr Satterly was found to have debts amounting to almost £17,000. The Shropshire Star reported that he was told by Judge Anthony Lowe that he had "reopened wounds" of families and friends of loved ones after an "acutely emotional time".

He sentenced Mr Satterly to a 15-month prison term, suspended for two years, plus 240 hours of unpaid work and he would pay £800 towards prosecution costs.

REMEMBRANCE DAY









OBITUARIES

Peter Osborne died in early November, aged 91. He and Alison lived near Hopton Bank from the 1960s, when they bought a cottage and had to fetch water from the nearby stream. He lectured at Birmingham University as a paleo entomologist and played violin as an enthusiastic amateur at venues like the Regal Theatre in Tenbury.

Dinner parties at the family home, long developed enough to have full domestic facilities, were a lesson in cooking a wide range of dishes on a domestic oven, thanks to Alison's skill, and cocktails of fearsome strength and flavour mixed by Peter. They were happily married for 65 years, in which time Alison explained they never had a cross word. Our sympathies go to Alison and the family.

Janet Dickerson was a local lady who loved poetry and for many months travelled from her new home in Chaddesley Corbett to join in the Poets Society meetings and sometimes read extracts from a book of her own work. When she found travel too demanding, we posted her a copy of the Clarion. A lovely, warm hearted lady. her son Mark advised us on November 5th that Janet had died, aged 84. Our sympathies go to her family.

Alec Osbaldiston

Alec was a much respected figure in Cleobury Mortimer for most of his adult life. He died peacefully at home on 19th October aged eighty-one. Maybe it was no coincidence that the church clock, maintained assiduously by Alec for many years, stopped on exactly the same day!

Born in Cheshire in 1940 he never lost his northern accent. He met his wife of over fifty years, Margaret, when they were members of the local youth club, where they both learned to bell ring. At the age of sixteen, he got a job in a bank but after a couple of vears decided in was not for him and he applied for a place at Chester Teacher Training College where he studied for two years, then for a further year to qualify as a Mathematics teacher. To supplement his grant, he worked as a conductor on the local busses where he used his numeracy skills to work out the most lucrative routes and shift patterns!

In 1962, he started teaching Maths at Lacon Childe School; at the age of twentytwo, he wasn't much older than his pupils! He went on to teach many of their children. He was heard to remark that when bell ringing for weddings he would often get a kiss from the bride whom he had taught; in later years, more likely from her mother! He spent his teaching career at Lacon Childe and tributes have been paid from former pupils from as far afield at Hong Kong, Ireland and Australia, all saying how he had been instrumental in their own successful careers.

Even after retirement he continued working for examination boards, always contriving to get the names of family members and even pets into the questions.

Alec was a committed Christian and attended St Mary's Church where he also served on the Parochial Church Council and as Treasurer. A keen walker, he was a founder member of Cleobury Mortimer Footpath Association and did sterling work maintaining and keeping open the local footpaths. He was also a founder trustee of The Friends of St Mary's Church, and was for many years its Chair, helping to raise thousands of pounds for the maintenance and repair of the church fabric. A keen and extremely accomplished bell ringer, he rang at St Mary's for fifty-six years and was known to other bell ringers throughout the world. For many years, when Santa was pushed for time, he would stand in for him by visiting the primary school in December suitably dressed.

His energy, kindness, intelligence, humour and enthusiasm for life will be sadly missed by us all. He leaves a loving wife, two children and three grandsons. Rest in Peace Alec. You served your community well. Diane Waddington

CLEOBURY W.I.

A fascinating presentation from Dr Mark Baldwin on the Women of the S.O.E. (Special Operations Executive) made our November meeting the busiest one of the year so far. We welcomed twenty-two members and twelve visitors to hear Mark tell the stories of these heroic women whom history has all but ignored.

Young women prepared to sacrifice family, friends and, in some cases, their lives to assist in the organization of resistance activities in occupied Europe and the Middle East. They completed the same kind of training as their male counterparts and were generally wireless operator and couriers as it was felt they would not be accepted by the men if they were in leadership roles.

Brave feats under the noses of the Nazi Regime were characterized by ingenuity and fearlessness, all the while knowing that, if captured, they could face torture and execution. Sadly, some ended up in the concentration camps at Ravensbruch and Dachau and others were tortured in the infamous Gestapo Headquarters on Rue Foch in

Paris. Thirteen have their names carved with pride on the SOE Role of Honour. Three were awarded The George Cross, the M.B.E. and Croix de Guerre. Inspirational women to be sure.

We proudly took our place once again in the Remembrance Parade on Sunday 14th November to remember the service and sacrifice of so many in conflicts past and present. Particularly remembering the Women of the SOE.

THE BREAKFAST CLUB

In November members heard Pete Blackburn explain what has been achieved at the Men's Shed, and something of its future.

Following an initiative by Katja Jones, a group was formed to explore the possibility of creating a Men's Shed in Cleobury. The Men's Shed movement is dedicated to addressing the isolation experienced by some older men, due to redundancy, bereavement or retirement. The solution is a welcoming place open to any man, where he will find a supportive atmosphere. The Cleobury Shed will contain a range of woodworking machinery, which shedders interested in carpentry will be able to use.

David and Margaret Robinson supported the scheme from the first, providing a suitable plot at a nominal cost, the first of many generous donations from a range of local businesses and individuals. A caravan was installed on the site for meeting and socialising, and connected to mains services. Obtaining planning permission for the shed was the next step, followed by the casting of a concrete floor slab. The shed itself is a well insulated single-storey structure, with doors and windows protected by steel grilles (made by a shedder), and a second caravan has now been added, where members can store their partially finished projects.

It is hoped the Shed will open to the public early next year.



A YORKSHIRE LAD'S STORY



This interesting book combines two elements: the boyhood and later adult life of Leeds born Bill Walker, with a detailed history of his service in the 1939-45 Second World War. Bill had quietly written his memories and at his Golden Wedding Anniversary party he handed the notes over to his son. That's Ralph Walker, long term resident of this parish.

Ralph did nothing with the notes for 25 years, then decided to commemorate his father's 100th birth date by putting the work together as a hardback book. It does make a fascinating read.

Bill came from a modest background and did not shine at school except on the sports field, where he represented his school at both cricket and football, while holding down a job in the tailoring industry.

When war broke out in 1939 Bill was already in the Territorial Army as a volunteer and it's true to say that six years of service really brought him out: learning to drive, excelling at sport and taking on and beating the squad bully. He moved on to other areas, always with a streak of stubbornness showing through and eventually he was placed in the Long Range Desert Group, where he drove a squad from attack and back to base until a serious wound from a German tank landed him in hospital in critical condition. He almost lost a leg through infection, but came through to fight and drive again.

His description of events and some of the senior men

he met are down to earth, the blunt view of a man who wasn't trying to boast and just told it like it was. All these years on, he's safe from any libel action.

He did get back to Leeds, but was then transferred to Sweden, where he met Gerd, the love of his life, and they were married before he was finally demobbed back into civvy street. If you think getting back to normal in 2022 might be tough, read this story and be grateful that you live today.

By the time we get to December we have to admit that it is winter. The old Celtic calendar launched into winter and the new year at the feast of Samhain on November 1st but I'd rather regard that month as part of autumn. So here we are again, with the year having turned full circle, the trees and so many creatures having gone into shutdown.

If you spend a lot of time around trees they become recognisable even at this time of the year by their shape, twigs, bark and other characteristics. Silver Birch (Betula pendula) trees stand out against the rest of the woodland with their white bark and black diamond-shaped fissures, but most of the forest birch are hybrids between Silver Birch and the duller Downy Birch (Betula pubescens), which have brownish bark that turns grey with age but lacks the diamond patterns. Showers of their seeds have been finding their way into windows, cars etc. for several weeks as the female catkins break up, but if you look for them you'll see the new male catkins still green on the twigs and getting ready to shed their pollen next spring. Excellent pioneers of bare ground and open spaces, the birch soon give up when other trees shade them out. The dead and dying trees provide nest sites for holenesting birds such as woodpeckers and Redstarts, and are hosts for the Birch Polypore fungus whose brackets have been used for sharpening razors and can be pulped to make a surprisingly strong paper. I'm sure someone could tell me whether the natural plasters made by cutting strips of the Polypore's top surface get their antiseptic properties from the compound called betulin which occurs in the tree's bark. Wikipedia is silent on this subject but mentions other interesting properties

including beneficial effects for arteriosclerosis and obesity and shrinkage of cancerous tumours.

Birch is moderately good as firewood but it is close-grained and clean-looking, making it a good choice for whittling spoons or turning bowls. Its fine twigs were used to make not only the utilitarian besom brooms but, when peeled, kitchen whisks and 'wiskets' for removing fluff from carpets in the local factories.

If you'd like to become familiar with some winter twigs, see if you can find the following:

Ash, with black buds opposite each other on either side of the stem

Alder, often growing beside water and carrying its tiny cones and purplish catkins during the winter

Beech, with pointed , shiny-brown buds set alternately on slender stems

There are oak, ash and hawthorn in the photo. No prizes for getting the Holly!

Philip Dunne's Letter from Westminster

Reflecting back to this time last year, it is striking how far we have come.

Last year, just before people began to move around the country for the Christmas break, it was with the bitterest regret that the government had to impose restrictions on gatherings over the festive period. This change, which we all wished to avoid, meant last minute disappointment for so many after a tough year, and I know it was particularly difficult for those with children, as well as for grandparents.

But of course, the first doses of the covid vaccine had only just been administered in the lead up to Christmas 2020, meaning very few people were protected against the worst of the virus. In contrast, the rollout this year means almost 90% of the adult population have received at least one dose of the covid vaccine, with many now having received a booster jab or third dose.

We also now have effective drugs to combat the worst cases of covid, such as the recently approved Molnupiravir, which was found to reduce the risk of hospitalisation or death for COVID-19 patients most at risk by 50 per cent.

I write well before Christmas, and I have no wish to tempt fate, since we all know how resilient covid has proved. But local clinicians are working flat out to get more jabs into arms, to do all we can to avoid any reimposition of

restrictions. So I am hopeful that this year, unlike last, it will be easy for friends and family to come together and celebrate Christmas as we all normally would.

This year will also see the resumption of Christmas services in the many churches in South Shropshire, which I know will bring great comfort to those with faith. The very nature of collective worship meant that congregations and choirs were particularly restricted when covid restrictions were in place, so I am grateful these services have resumed.

While enjoying the Christmas and New Year bank holidays, please spare a thought for those who cannot be with their families – including all those who work in our NHS and emergency services, and those serving in our Armed Forces, who have continued their vital work while still adapting to the challenges of covid this year.

Once again this year, as the long lasting impact of covid remains, the work of volunteers has been critical to the health and wellbeing of our communities. So I would like to thank all those who have given up time, in whatever capacity, to help others in need this year.

I wish everyone in South Shropshire a very Happy Christmas, with best wishes for the year ahead.



Talking to someone else outside our immediate close circle can enable us to express ourselves more freely and so can help reassure us that our feelings and reactions are a normal part of the grief process; feelings of guilt and maybe anger for example are experienced by many and such powerful emotions can be particularly hard to accept.

In a safe and confidential space people can come along on a 'drop in' basis to talk to others, to listen, to be heard or to just be there and feel supported.

Building connections and friendships with others can be an important and valuable first step towards what may feel like a fragile and uncertain future. Many also gain knowledge and resources to navigate a route through the essential practical issues needing to be addressed.

Come along and receive the warmest of welcomes on the first Thursday of every month at 2.00, next one December 2nd. We are also trialling an additional evening session with the next one being December 9th at 7.00.





October 31st saw the Branch hold its Centennial Luncheon at the Sports and Social Club, with Colonel Chris Joynson as guest speaker. He had agreed to speak at our Annual Lunch in 2019, but heavy snow overnight forced cancellation of the whole event. Colonel Joynson spoke enthusiastically about the work of the 'Battle Back Centre' at Lilleshall. where he is the Recovery Operations Manager. The centre was founded in 2009, and has already helped over 7,000 wounded ex-service personnel to regain their selfconfidence and motivation after their physical injuries had been treated. Costing over £20M to set up, and £2M a year to run, it is the RBL's biggest investment to date. Many of those who listened to the Colonel's talk felt that the excellent work of the centre deserves to be more widely known. Too many people only perceive of the RBL as a focal point during Remembrance events.

The Cleobury Branch of the

British Legion (not 'Royal' until 1971) was formed in 1921, less than two months after the new national body had been created on 15 May 1921 to represent the interests of ex-servicemen by merging together three existing bodies. Our branch is therefore one of the oldest in the country.

This year, the branch has been unable to run any of our normal outings, but it is hoped to resume these in 2022.

Our Parliamentarians haven't been covering themselves in glory recently. There was No10's botched attempt to get Shropshire MP Owen Paterson off the hook . 'Found guilty by the standards system? - then let's change the system! After all, he is one of us...'. This was followed by a screeching U turn and the resignation of said MP. Not that other county MP's are faring much better - Daniel Kawczynski (Shrewsbury and Atcham) is being looked at following allegations that he intimidated his staff and also questions about his second job working for a mining company. Even our own Philip Dunne is facing questions over his failure to declare that he is being paid about £425 an hour by an aerospace firm, when speaking in debates in which he repeatedly called for increased defence spending. He has, however, declared this in his register of interests. Still it must all be OK as a minister has said that these activities 'enrich Parliament'. Maybe so, but not nearly as much as they enrich the individuals concerned...

More No10 skulduggery over the shameful levels of raw sewage being discharged, legally and illegally, into our waterways (over 400,000 occasions in 2020). To his credit, Philip Dunne had proposed a private members bill to introduce a requirement for action. However, this went out of time and ministers promised to reflect his thoughts in the forthcoming legislation. They didn't, and gullible MP's (but not Philip) were persuaded to vote for the status quo by the simple expedient of issuing highly inflated figures on the possible cost of fixing things. These were claimed to be over £150 billion. When the correct figures were published, these ranged from £3-62 billion, which is very close to the £57 billion in dividends paid out by the industry since privatisation in 1991. Fortunately, the House of Lords sent the legislation back with an amendment based on Philip Dunne's original bill. In the end, a compromise was reached with a watered down requirement inserted and

adopted. A number of MP's have now proposed a change in their approach to voting. They have said that, in future, they will read the paperwork and actually understand what they are voting for. This is radical stuff- fancy understanding what you are legislating for - it'll never catch on...

Another organisation that hasn't impressed recently is West Mercia Police. A man who had been diagnosed with a terminal illness drew up a 'Bucket' list, the top entry being mooning at a speed camera. This he duly did but was somewhat taken aback when, within 30 minutes, six police officers turned up at his house, broke the front door handle trying to gain entry and then transferred their attention to the side gate which they smashed open (despite it not actually being locked...). They then wrestled him to the ground, handcuffed him and held him for several hours before releasing him. However, some good has come out of this. Should you ever need police to attend an incident urgently, on no account use words like 'murder', 'robbery' or 'assault'. Just say you have seen somone mooning at a camera...

The Post Office scandal rolls on... Ministers are blocking the Williams inquiry into this from examining the questionable conduct (found to be 'oppressive and misleading' by the High Court) of the expensive legal team hired by the Post Office. This was the last throw in their doomed attempt to prevent justice for the hundreds of subpostmasters wrongly accused and convicted of fraud when the problem lay with a faulty computer system. The ministerial view is that this would 'slow down' proceedings although a cynical person might wonder whether it had anything to do with the lack of curiosity by various ministers since the saga erupted over 20 years ago, not to mention that there may be very well paid positions in the legal sector should second jobs for those in Parliament remain possible. Not that anything like that would ever happen.... A J Grumpy







CATHERTON COMMON

Shropshire Wildlife Trust Reserves Officer Clive Dean tells us about gorse.

I thought that I might follow up last issue's mention of our winter work programme and the work with Butterfly Conservation to talk about gorse. Both the winter programme and the work for butterflies involve cutting and treating gorse to try and control its spread.

So what is the problem with gorse? Well gorse is a native plant and is not out of place but it does seem to be increasing in extent. As with a lot of plants on the common it just needs to be kept in balance. If it starts to dominate then it will start to shade out and reduce other valuable plants such as heather, grasses and wildflowers.

The traditional way of managing it was to burn it every few years. For people with sheep on the common this was particularly popular as it created a flush of sweet grass. The burning often didn't kill the gorse and it usually helped gorse seeds to germinate so after a few years gorse would return and the cycle began again. Burning still has its place but can be damaging on wet heath and bogs. My personal observations suggest that burning may not be as effective as it used to be and that gorse returns more quickly and much more dense than it used to.

Gorse does not like to have its feet wet and therefore mainly grows in drier areas, this does help to control its spread. Gorse is also vulnerable to frost and sustained low temperatures. Many of you may have noticed evidence of this early this year. In March we suffered low night time temperatures for many days in a row, perhaps as long as three weeks. Temperatures usually dropped below zero. Many people commented on how gorse seemed to be dying in April. You may have noticed it going brown and dying back across the common. This was the result of those sustained low temperatures.

We have all heard about climate change and global warming and we don't get the cold winters and long, hard frosts that we used to. Also we don't get the heavy snow that used to flatten the gorse and break its stems. I believe that this is why gorse is doing so well at the moment and that burning is less effective. I feel sure that following a burn the burnt gorse and many of the new seedlings would be killed by the following cold winter meaning the gorse took much longer to recover.

At Shropshire Wildlife Trust we are now trying different ways of managing gorse to try and avoid some of the problems resulting from burning. Many of these methods are slower and more labour intensive. We are cutting gorse by hand and poisoning the stems, where the gorse is big enough. In other areas we are cutting it with brushcutters and then sometimes flailing the resulting stems. In the near future we also hope to trial spraying individual bushes with a herbicide. We also hope to create more wet areas of the common and prevent other areas from drying out in order to hold back the gorse.

ANGER IN THE AIR

The fact that Adrian Satterly had been found guilty of theft from funeral charity collections and been given a suspended sentence of 15 months, plus 240 hours of voluntary labour and the repayment of £800 of court costs came as a blow to the many people whose lives have been blighted by this whole sorry business. As I write these words there is an atmosphere of anger that so much hurt as not been eased.


I will not write in anger; that is not the way to be objective and balanced. But I will ask why a guilty plea on 15 of 20 counts of theft brought the total figure below £5,000 and thus removed the customary jail sentence for such theft. Will the grieving widows and widowers be told if their loved ones' collections were paid in full to the chosen charity? I hope to have answers in our February issue, but cannot offer a guarantee of that. IR





Sadly I can't say that but I can give you as always some positive guidance to keep most of these criminals at bay. Many of you may have heard of Martin Lewis who is the 'money man' on ITV programs. He is continually campaigning to ensure that we, the public, get the best for our money and keep it safe as well. He appeared on Breakfast television on the 17th of November and he was extremely agitated at a proposal being put forward by the government to address the issue of fake endorsements on social media. He believed the government is not going nearly far enough to address this issue where significant sums of money are being conned out of innocent people who believe that an endorsement of a product or service by a celebrity must mean it's ok and safe.

Examples of this are: Richard Branson allegedly endorsing money investment schemes such as Bit Coin, or Suzanna Reid the presenter of Good Morning Britain endorsing a weight loss product that 'actually works'. cNO IT DOES NOT but if you sign up for it you will part with a significant amount of money to try it for yourself only to find the claims are false. Too late! You signed up and if you ever managed to get a hold of someone who conned you they will just say, it does not work for everyone.

Bitcoin, Crypto currency and other get rich schemes are equally misleading but you don't find out until you invest the minimum amount (usually £250) only to find a so-called expert who is there to help you at every step, will persuade you that the real money is to be made when you invest a larger sum. Promises of fast and big returns could convince you that this is a great idea. Suddenly the Money Manager stops

returning your calls, and even the number you were given is suddenly unavailable. Result, your hard earned savings have disappeared.

These and many similar scams invade Social Media every day and if you have a Facebook, Twitter, What's App or Instagram account you are a target. It does not stop there. In past articles, I have described how your email and personal data is frequently stolen (unknown to you) and sold on to the dark side and the scum who operate almost with impunity. You could suddenly receive an email possibly appearing to come from a trusted source with an advert for one or other of the scams mentioned above.

The obvious response is to ignore it and delete it, no matter how attractive it appears. The old saying is that if it looks too good to be true, it certainly is not true. So what action can you take against this emerging form of scam? Delete, Delete, Delete. You can ask Facebook to stop sending certain types of personalised adverts, but they just change it to non personalised and the flood continues.

Meanwhile our Government is obfuscating on what they can do to stop this but as Martin Lewis very elegantly put it, "It's not enough and probably too late to do anything about the big Social Media giants who work very hard to manipulate our lives." They get paid by the advertiser for every fake advert that is placed by scum, so there's not a lot of incentive there.

The only impact is that if we the public are aware of the issues, we can use the DELETE button to the best effect. It's your money they are after, keep it to yourself.

Big smiles all round for a communal job well done.



NEARING NORMAL

It's good sign when a musical evening sells out a week before the event, but that was the case with the Rock and Blues Night at Clows Top Victory Hall on November 26th. See February's Clarion for a report on that, but I have to confess that I nearly missed by trying to book in late. The ever helpful Dani called in response to my message and asked if I just wanted one ticket. The gig was sold out; she could fit in one person, but had groups waiting to hear if there were any cancellations they could take up.

I've written before about musical events at Victory Hall and I know that if Remi Harris is headlining that it will be an entertaining gig, whatever style of music it features. Sold out early - that sounds like a healthy normal.

BARN STORED LOGS

I was intrigued by the Small Ad offering barn stored logs and knowing what a good source of services those little ads can be, decided to try some for myself. A phone call established that I could buy just a sackful, a modest amount to assess how the wood burned.

Out to Clod Hall on the Tenbury Road, where Mrs Morrison introduced me to Roger, who looks after the 17 acres of the Hall. When he trimmed out some of the trees, Mrs Morrison asked if they could sell them as logs. Indeed they could.

The barn stored emphasis in the advert is because after cutting and splitting down to 12-inch logs, the timber is stored in a dry barn for a year before being sold. Roger knows his timber and the day before we met had been called out to fell two trees at the Live and Let Live in Neen Sollars.

He explained that thorough storing means properly dried logs with a damp content of just ten percent. Kiln dried may be the popular alternative, but if that process is hurried you can find the damp content is as high as twenty percent. You don't have to be a forester to work out which of the two final products will burn more easily. One sack of barn stored oak in the back of the car, I headed for home to further the experiment.

The usual routine to light the stove, kindling with two Co-op firelighters to get the blaze going and the vents ajar to keep a modest flow of air before the Oak logs were laid on top off the glowing mass.

The burning process was gentle, with no blaze and rapid consumption of the logs. I assumed that the density of the wood was the reason for a slow burn with a good generation of heat. This calculation is guesswork, but the logs seemed to last at least 50 percent longer before they were just embers; certainly longer lasting than any other logs I can recall in a little under 40 years of a wood burning stove. Barn stored good value and giving our a strong warmth? Definitely.

MUCH HAPPENING IN TENBURY

A busy November Saturday evening in Tenbury Wells, with the Christmas lights being switched on and the performance of an adaption of Charles Dickens' 'Christmas Carol' to follow, in the Regal Theatre. It promised too much to ignore.

Parking was easy and not expensive before walking up Teme Street and realising that the place was filling up fast. Somebody with influence was involved in this, as the street was closed to traffic and a growing crowd spread across the full width of the road in front of the Regal Theatre, where the DI was based.

There was a slight disturbance when an artic unit tried to drive through, but he was persuaded to turn around. No easy task in a crowded street. The place was buzzing, with loads of food outlets open and doing well. At the appointed hour the lights came on, an impressive sight from the bridge over the

Teme and through the town. Nice one, Tenbury.

From there into the Regal Theatre, where manager Westley Bone made me welcome and explained that the cast of children from five through to 18 years were in a final rehearsal before the performance. Five year olds playing their parts in front of a live audience, this was quite a revolution.

Westley explained that this was the first public performance by the Regal School of Creative Arts, whose aim is to bring out and nurture the talent of youth. He's theatre manager, the only full employee, backed up by four part-timers and 80 plus volunteers

The students are taught a broad theatrical programme, covering drama, singing and dance, in a weekly three-hour session. For the youngest there is an exception and they face one hour tuition in their subject of choice. Charges are £10.00 for the three-hours and £5.00 for the junior members' one hour sessions. That's quite a considerable bargain in the expensive 21st century.

I was early for the the 7.00 o'clock start and watched as the cast were put through their routines one last time before curtain up. All in the theatre aisles, getting young people used to the atmosphere of the place. There were families coming in and quietly watching; either drawn by their children already in the cast, or maybe to see what this School of Creative Arts had to offer their offspring.

The performance was quite remarkable for such a young cast. You could expect the older students, like the lads playing grumpy old Scrooge and the mild mannered Bob Cratchett, to come over as experienced and competent players, but five year olds who could sing and dance along with the older members was a telling demonstration of the quality of tuition they'd experienced. I was well impressed.

A reflection of the care for the children was the simple statement that the cast's names were not for publication. Quite right too!

This was another side to the friendly theatre that hosted Robert Plant recently. They're working hard to bring people into town and if you book for a show online, they offer you details of how you can get a meal locally. You can see why they succeed.


