



THE HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY

On a cold winter night members gathered for a very interesting talk bv Rachel Salisbury on 'The Great Plant Hunters.' She had selected some of the first, who have made a great impact on our gardens. It all began in the 17th Century, when the hunters were keen botanists, their trips funded by benefactors generous who wanted to have new plants in their gardens. Some went west, some to the east and they often had local to rely on guides, meeting hostility from the local people. At this time they sailed everywhere and devised many ingenious ways of bringing the plants home. They needed light and water but also had to be protected from the salty spray and water. Unfortunately some plants did not survive but many did and we were able to view them on the slides Rachel showed to us. 

On The Market - Belinda at Snoggable Garlic

You must admit, Snoggable Garlic is not a name you forget. And with about 5,000 customers spread through the UK, America and Switzerland, it clearly has a global appeal.

It started 15 years ago, when Belinda tired of driving for a living and opted to do her own thing. She was already growing and selling herbs, but needed a winter earner and started to learn about olives and the way to get the best out of them. She soon realised that this is a complex business, the fruit needing a lot of precise handling before it can be eaten.

That lesson is still applied today; there are no short cuts if

you want quality. She won't reveal much of the secrets learned over years, but showed the copious washing facilities needed to soften the fruit and improve its flavour: "Everything is tasted by me before it goes out." The exception is the chilli olives: "I value my taste buds too highly to take the edge off with them," she smiles.

A year after working with olives she moved on to garlic, not a popular choice 14 or so years ago. From an initial 20kg batch in brine, she established that they had a great taste and with the right process had no smell. Hence the Snoggable Garlic title. And she's experimented with flavours, today offering a range of eight, from Oak Smoked to paprika, with specials at Christmas like Pomegranate and Star Anise.

The Snoggable Garlic title is registered and Belinda protects it fiercely if she sees another trader using it. After all, she was developing her knowledge long before others jumped on the bandwagon. Her supply comes from the Clermont Ferrand area of France, near the source of Volvic waters in a National Park. It arrives in a raw state and is processed - another secret - before storing in olive oil and maturing for up to six months

before being sold. "I start making my Christmas stock in about August. You dread getting to Christmas and running out," she explains.

What she emphasises in talking about her processing is the need for cleanliness and proper handling: "You can't just take it out of a brine container and put it in olive oil. I've seen some of that on stalls and the garlic is blue; that's a sign of botulism and it's very dangerous."

She has all those customers because she knows her stuff. Up in Scotland, fishermen are keen on garlic, as the dreaded midges don't like it and stay away; she has a buoyant mail order trade there.

She sells at markets within economic reach: Newcastle-Under-Lyme, Solihull, Stourbridge and the Talbot Inn at Knightwick as well as Cleobury, a place she likes. "I do well considering the footfall." All this plus nut roasts suitable for vegetarians and vegans. "Cooked fresh for the market so customers can take them home put straight into freezer." Take a close look at this month's market - this is quality stuff.



Diabetes: Starvation in Too much sugar in the Times of Plenty blood is dangerous and

Diabetes in animals is very similar to the disease humans. It's often referred to as 'Starvation in Plenty' because your pet will be eating very well but continually loses weight. Some common signs that your pet may be diabetic include excessive drinking of water, urinating more than normal and unexpected weight loss.

So how does diabetes come about? Most of the food our pets eat is turned into glucose (sugar) for their bodies to use for energy. Insulin enables this process and a lack of insulin production from the pancreas means that sugars provided by their food don't make it into the cells and remains in their blood.

blood is dangerous and your animal's defence is to pass it out in the urine, but this requires more water leading to excessive urination, and your pet has to compensate by drinking more. Another side effect is that the sugar in the urine excellent provides an for growth medium bacteria – meaning diabetic animals are more prone to recurrent urine infections.

The main problem, however, is that the brain cannot function without If the glucose. brain's glucose levels drop too low the body panics and breaks down fats to use as an energy source, which can diabetic lead to crises. comas and even death.

Once diabetes develops, your pet will most likely

require life-long insulin injections which can be costly and reduce the quality of life for both you and your pet.

Testing for diabetes can often be performed via a quick urine test, which can highlight problems early on and allow time to start treatment before your pet gets too poorly. As always, prevention is better than the cure - the best thing to diabetes prevent is to control your pet's bodyweight and ensure they are not eating food which has excessive sugars. If you have any questions or concerns about diabetes, always speak to your vet.



PROGRESS AT THE WELLS



The cottage that is part of the Wells House complex on Church Street is nearing restoration and will be available to rent soon. Basil Mumford was a figure in the community for over half a century. He and Barbara moved from Ludlow into Cleobury in the mid 1950s, when Basil took over management of J Roberts the ironmongers in Church Street. When the Roberts family wanted to sell the business the obvious successor was Basil, who consulted the retired vicar **John** Ashton and was encouraged to take the big step of buying out his employer.

In 1958 the town's ironmonger became B Mumford and he remained in charge until retirement in 1993. The shop was a traditional institution, the outside display left in place when they closed for lunch, and postcards of this memorable place were a popular seller at Baldwin's bookshop.

I had personal experience of his calm, quiet way of giving

service. My mother lived in Childe Road in her final, rather muddled years, and when she found that the gas cylinder for her fire was empty, naturally she phoned Mr Mumford. On one such occasion Basil gently explained that he was only in the shop on Sunday to do a stocktake, but would bring a new cylinder and instal it. No crabbiness, no shouting, just a quiet walk up the Talbot Yard and one old lady left warm and really happy. It was otherworldly level of service.

Mrs Mumford recalls those gentle days: "It wasn't a job, it was such a happy time, when everybody became our friends." Basil retired in 1993 but familiar remained and popular figure as he shopped in the High Street, always with the same polite and dignified manner. He is survived by Barbara, who he married in 1953, and his son Stewart. To them goes the sympathy of everyone who knew this gentle, quiet reminder of old Cleobury.

The family would like to thank the many people who sent messages of sympathy, curate Mark Daborn, who conducted the private service at Wyre Forest Crematorium, and Adrian Satterly of Wyre Forest Funeral Service.

Letter from Westminster - Philip Dunne MP

Christmas can be expensive, so in January I looked at the prospects for those on low incomes in South Shropshire. I am sure we are all united in wishing to address poverty..

There is no doubt that a strong economy helps people into work and alleviates poverty. There has been significant success increasing in employment. Locally, the number of people claiming out of work benefits has fallen markedly over the past five years. Thinking back to 2010, I remember speaking to constituents concerned whether they would still have jobs in twelve months' time. Now, over the past two years, the number claiming Jobseekers Allowance in South Shropshire has more than halved, a remarkable turnaround of local employment prospects, helped I hope by the Jobs Fairs I have arranged during this period.

Reducing the burden of the state is also making an impact. By raising the Personal Allowance, Income Tax has been cut for 27 million people. This has taken the lowest paid in Shropshire out of tax altogether and saves the average Shropshire taxpayer £700 a year - welcome news for people working to tight family budgets.

In a rural area like ours, most rely on cars to get to work, take children to school or do the weekly shop. So reduction in fuel prices is good news, and we have seen a dramatic fall in recent months. Local drivers recall paying over £1.40 per litre little more than a year ago. It is now heading towards £1.00. This fall in prices, combined with the freeze of fuel duty for the past four years, saves drivers every time they fill up.

Freezing Council Tax in Shropshire for the past four years has also been the right thing to do, helping thousands of low income families. There was overwhelming support for a continued freeze from my residents' surveys last year.

Wages are now rising faster than inflation, which helps the lowest paid. The state pension has been protected to rise at the higher of wages, inflation or 2.5% for the past four years. Falls in fuel and food costs should keep cost of living increases low, reducing pressures on budgets.

Welfare reforms are helping end the habit of dependency. The number of households where no one works has fallen to its lowest level for almost 20 years. The spare room subsidy, for all its detractors, has encouraged those of working age renting more rooms than they need to downsize. Shropshire Housing Group has seen the number of under-occupied properties fall from 15% to its current level of 8.7%. Discretionary housing payments are available as a temporary measure for those in difficulty.

Shropshire Council are tackling homelessness in the county: the number of people accepted as being homeless and in priority need has fallen by 35% over the past four years. The past year alone saw a 16.3% fall, down from 239 to 200.

For those who do need immediate assistance, food banks do excellent work. I keep in contact with all the local ones, and have been able to help when delays to benefits payments have caused problems for constituents. Of course, I firmly believe we must continue to provide a safety net for the vulnerable in our society,. I will continue to help support those in our community, but take encouragement that many of the measures to alleviate poverty are making progress.





DOG FOULING - THE COUNCIL GETS SERIOUS Kate Adams of the County Environmental Maintenance unit, explains:

People in Cleobury Mortimer are being reminded to properly dispose of their dog's waste – or risk being fined. Simply bagging any waste and dropping it into a dog waste bin, a litter bin or the domestic waste bin is all that is needed.

We are currently experiencing an increased problem with dog fouling on many streets of Cleobury Mortimer and also on the playing fields. Dog mess on pavements, streets and grass areas presents both a health risk and public nuisance. People tread in it, parents push buggies through it and it is walked into houses, schools and businesses.

Ignorance of the incident is no defence. People who ignore their dogs, or let them foul whilst roaming unaccompanied are still liable.

Not clearing up after your dog is illegal under the Clean Neighbourhoods and Environment Act 2005 and offenders can be issued with a Fixed Penalty Notice of £80 by an authorised Shropshire Council officer.

Formal warning letters or fixed penalty notices can also be issued when any member of the public is prepared to supply a witness statement to Shropshire Council detailing a recent, specific incident.

If you are not a dog owner this article may not be appropriate to you; however I would ask for your help in watching out for anyone who may be committing an offence. All information is confidential.

The Fixed Penalty Notice charge is currently set at £80, with a reduced fine of £50 if it is paid within 14 days. By paying the penalty charge, the person discharges their liability to prosecution. Penalties not paid within 28 days leave the offender open to prosecution, which could result in a fine of up to £1,000.

Posters are being displayed around the town and called 'We campaign watching you' will be launched in April in conjunction with Keep Britain Tidy. We are undertaking this work collaboration with Cleobury Mortimer Parish Council.

In another triumph of secrecy, the 2L timetable changed on 22 December. Most of the changes are minor with times going back rather than coming forward, but the main change for those going to Ludlow is the fact that the service no longer goes to the Ludlow Leisure centre. As one passenger found out when it carried straight on to the town centre. She was told that to get to the Leisure Centre she should pick up the Shrewsbury bus in Corve Street which she did. Coming back however, was another matter. Aware of the fact that she needed to get back to the revised route, she started walking and walking... An hour later, she had reached Henley with no sign of the bus and was lucky to be picked up by friends. No idea what time the service finally appeared.

The only good thing to come from the changes is the fact that the 9.25 to Ludlow is now the 9.31 so there should be no argument about paying the £1. However, as I write this on 20th January, this is still being charged on the 9.19 (was the 9.10) Kiddy despite to Shropshire Council's claim on 3rd December that this is not happening. We now have revised timetables in the Market Hall and Cleobury Country centre and some drivers have

got copies of the printed version (it does exist!) so ask next time you use the bus. I thought I should get a supply so went into the Kiddy depot and asked if they had any. They did. Five. The good news is that they gave me four. They had boxes of timetables for other routes so once again we are the poor relations. Talking of timetables, Shropshire Council have again demonstrated that they are asleep on the job as, nearly a month after the changes the information on the bus stops in Cleobury has still not been changed to show the revised

Ι have not had an acknowledgement, let alone a response from Shropshire Council to the letter I wrote on 20th December so I have sent a further missive setting out the continuing problems. Sadly, a number of people have told me that they are now reluctant to use the 2L service or have given up on it altogether. A cynical person might think that this is all a cunning plan to dissuade people from using the 2L service, which could then be scrapped due to lack of use. If true, this would be a work of genius by Shropshire Council so I'm assuming that it isn't. As an aside, when I type in the word 'Rotala' (the parent company of

Diamond Buses) my spell checker suggests 'Scrotal' as an alternative, although I couldn't possibly comment on that suggestion.

Just to show we are not alone with our problems, I read a letter to a magazine recently in which the writer says the bus service in his (unspecified) area is so bad that the only time he uses his bus pass now is to cut a line of cocaine. It still has some use then...

For all the other problems (punctuality, breakdowns etc), they have no powers as these are the responsibility of the West Midlands Traffic Commissioner and suggest I might write to them. 

I always think February is month for looking forward! Christmas is far behind us and everyone is starting to think about Summer holidays (unless you are a farmer), longer days and better weather! The early lambs are all safely delivered and we are waiting for the main flock to start lambing, it could be challenging as recent scanning has shown up a large number of triplets! By the time Lambing Live arrives on the TV we are well on the way to finishing! However it is a round the clock job, checking the ewes regularly through the day and night, fortunately shared between 3 or 4 people so some sleep is possible! Once lambed the ewe and offspring are penned together for a couple of days to bond then once the weather is fine and dry ewes and lambs are put out into the fields. Orphaned lambs or those from multiple births are either adopted onto ewes who have lost their lambs or will be bottle fed (this is always a big hit with the B&B guests!)

Whilst we don't produce milk we are very concerned about the problems affecting Dairy farmers at the moment concerning the price of milk which is continually being pushed down by supermarkets and other global influences, irrespective of how much it actually costs the farmer to produce. In no other industry

is the customer allowed to dictate the price so why with our food? Once supermarkets have put all our Dairy farmers put of business they will start on the egg producer or beef farmer and before we know it all our food will be imported, is this really what we want? We buy many of our calves from dairy farmers where they are surplus to their business of producing milk and rear them on to produce beef for the butchers, without dairy farmers we would have to change our way of farming. In 2001 there were over 20,000 dairy farmers in the country, at the start of this year that figure had fallen to under 10,000. Last year farmers were getting 31p a litre for their milk, this year it is down to 20p a litre and the supermarkets are trying to push it down further, despite it costing around 24p a litre to produce. So when doing your weekly shop, whether in Cleobury or further afield, please try and buy British dairy products:- milk, butter, yoghurt and cheese. We are lucky to be served by Mawley Milk so there is no excuse not to buy local and even have it delivered. Surely it is worth paying a penny or two more for our daily pinta to ensure a sustainable future for our dairy farmers to look forward to.

Reported crimes in Cleobury area for last month:

Criminal damage to a car on December 19th/20th in Kinlet; driver's window smashed and panelling scratched. Between December 23rd and 29th an unoccupied house in Woodlands Rise was burgled. An untidy search was carried out, keys to a safe were found from which contents including a gold pocket watch and chain were stolen. In Clee Hill village on January 2nd/3rd someone maliciously punctured four tyres on a vehicle parked on a driveway. Four new JCB tyres worth £2000 were stolen from a farmyard Oreton on January 2nd/3rd. Also in Oreton on January 3rd/4th a red Scania flat bed lorry was stolen. On January 5th/6th a Daihatsu Fourtrak was stolen in Clee Hill High Street; it was later found in the River Rea near Coneybury Coppice. Forensic examination has been carried out and investigation is ongoing. Between Clee Hill and Bitterley a theft of power tools from a parked van occurred between December 29th and January 5th. A shed at Stottesdon Primary School was broken into between December 19th and January 5th, but there was nothing of value inside. On January 5th/6th two vehicles parked outside their owners' properties were entered; one had a radio stolen and the other a 'satnav'. Two sheds at a house in Clee Hill were broken into overnight on 7th/8th but nothing stolen. offender(s) may have been disturbed by a powerful searchlight which was activated. On January 10th/11th a large lantern worth £100 was stolen from the doorstep of a house in Clows Top. Overnight on January 15th/16th power tools worth about £1500 were stolen from a shed at Milson. And finally an attempt to break into a workshop at a house in Ditton was foiled by a drop bar on the back of the doors and by door handles which had electricity passed through them.

I am told by PCSO Shaun Cullis of something which everyone should take note of, that occurred in Bishops Castle. Some males had been knocking on doors of houses of elderly residents, pretending to sell items from a case. They were in a blue/green Mk2 Ford Focus and one had a large tattoo on his neck. They managed to talk their way into one house and stole a leather bag containing £6000. Obvious lessons to be learnt here. Do not let strangers into your home and do not have large amounts of cash accessible are the two main ones. Report any suspicious activity to Police.

Immigration Officers have been proactive in the area recently and two people were arrested in Cleobury on suspicion of immigration offences. I have to mention yet again the problem of owners of dogs who don't pick up their dogs' muck. In recent weeks a collection has amassed on the footpath by St Mary's Church. If you witnesses this happening anywhere and can identify those responsible, please pass details to myself or Matt Sheehan in The Market Hall so that we can do something about it.

Linda Iles February In The Wyre Forest



Linda's photo is simply captioned 'Coppice in Snow' and captures the winter mood of the Forest.

As I write this the country is suffering dramatic weather: high winds, wintry showers, hail and thunder mostly affecting Scotland. I don't know what February will bring, but can it be worse than the incessant rain and floods of last year? I hope for more 'normal' weather, but in February that almost anything mean ('February brings the rain, Thaws the frozen lake again' said Sara Coleridge, but Flanders and Swan despondently modified this to 'February's ice and sleet, Freeze the toes right off your feet'!)

In the forest, I hope that the ground has a chance to dry out

to make walking more pleasant. None of us like the mess left by 'forest operations' - not so much the felling of the trees as the churned ground concomitant with their removal by tractors, forwarders and log lorries. I've heard that such disturbance can be a positive factor in the development of the woodland, providing a suitable growing medium for newlyarrived or long-buried seed with the bonus of the increased light levels brought by felling or coppicing. Who knows what long-dormant plants may reappear? At Kingswood deep ploughing brought not only poppies but a reappearance of small-flowered catchfly (Silene gallica), absent in these parts for many years but persisting in the soil's seed bank. Bluebells often pop up where conifers have been removed, having remained dormant for decades. Slightly more prosaic is John Bingham's discovery of a clutch of tomato plants among the needles of a clear-felled patch in Withybed Wood – testimony to a forester's lunch box.



In the Wyre Forest, as in other woods in the UK, alternatives to clear felling and replanting are being trialled. Selective felling and coppicing, using a mixture of tree species, are probably less disruptive to wildlife and may be more resilient to plant diseases and climate change. The publicly-owned areas of the forest will see conifers continuing to be removed and replaced by deciduous trees, so in those areas clear felling will still be a feature for a while to come, but what replaces them may be very different to the even-aged stands of oak that dominate the forest now. Let's darkness hope so: uniformity are neither good for me nor the woodland wildlife!

This month look out for hazel catkins, snowdrops, leaves and green flowers of dog's mercury, brimstone peacock and butterflies emerging from hibernation if the weather is warm enough, and perhaps some birdsong nestand making.





IN BUSINESS: Julie Grimes at Carrot Tops



Julie Grimes has been running Carrot Tops less than two years, but her smiling welcome is one of the best known on the High Street. For over three years she was a popular figure at Bowkett's a company she has

Street. For over three years she was a popular figure at Bowkett's, a company she has nothing but praise for, before moving down the road a bit to take over.

"When I first heard that Sarah Barnsley had sold to Rachel Siddall I thought I'd have liked that. I had this dream of having my own business," she recalls. "Then someone said it was up for sale again and I went straight down to talk to Rachel." Two months later, in June of 2013, she had the keys to her own shop.

She's changed the layout, giving customers more space to look around and bringing in big chiller units to help show off the wide range on offer. There's a bigger range of fish in stock,

with even more available from her nearby supplier if you place an order. A whole range of Tops labelled jams, Carrot pickles, cakes and biscuits are on the shelves, along with Wenlock Edge Farm bacon and plus Clun sausages, cooked meat, cheeses and Llaeth Y Llan yoghurts, made by Gareth Robert and his family at Llannefydd. Those yoghurts are a real treat and one taste should explain why they sell so well. And they carry Saddler's Barn eggs and just one range of milk and cream local Mawley Milk, of course. She sums it up: "I try to be a little bit different."

Vegetables and fruit are delivered fresh six days a week to the shop, which opens seven days. They do good trade with a lot of local businesses, including the Royal Fountain, The Lamp and Cleobury Cafe, but that doesn't mean that the customer wanting to buy a small quantity is overlooked. "You can come in here and buy one carrot, or one potato," says Julie. "And if you want me to split a pack of peppers because you only want one, I'll do it."

A very handy service is their box deliveries, up to ten miles from the shop and free of charge if you spend over £10.00. For fresh produce delivered to

your doorstep, it's a lifeline for people who don't have transport or access to a computer to reach the supermarkets.

She's in the shop seven days a week, some days for a little while when Sue or Pam take over. And Mike's there when he's not busy with his own consultancy, QES Systems Ltd. They carry on Julie's habit of making sure everyone who enters the shop is greeted with a smile. At those times Julie will be at the cash and carry or dealing with the inevitable paperwork. That thought tends to take the smile off her face: "I surprised how paperwork there is."

She has a very warm relationship with her customers, several of whom make jars of jam for her. And one lady saw her shivering on a cold morning and promptly went home and came back with a flask of hot soup. You don't get that in any supermarket.

Future plans? Like extra lines to offer? "If anyone wants something we don't have, tell me and I'll look into getting it." And does she see a move to a bigger shop in the future? "I'll stay here. I'm never going to be a millionaire, but I'm happy."

No wonder it's such a welcoming place.
