A4117 ROADWORKS

There will be significant roadworks on the A4117 starting on Monday the 11th of this month and scheduled to last until March 5th. It's all about the installation of a pedestrian the Midland crossing at Counties Co-operative store and attendant work on the road surface and neighbouring footpaths.

This means there will be lights restricting traffic flow to one lane. They will operate from 9.30 until 3.00, which will mean minimal interruption during the busiest traffic times.

The resurfacing of the road will mean a complete closure, again from 9.30 until 3.00, on Thursday and Friday, February 21st and 22nd. There will be a diversion signed during these two days. The contractors do advise that this timetable is subject to weather conditions.

Shropshire Highways are to be congratulated on the way they distributed clear letters to every house in the surrounding area. It does make life easier if we all know what's happening and when, so that everyone can make arrangements to fit in with the work being done.



They came over the water from Northern Ireland with their tractors and large trailers loaded with farm equipment. That was 41 years ago. Now David and Margaret Robinson together with their son Adrian and daughter in law Rachel, farm around 800 acres here Cleobury Mortimer, made possible by hard work and good husbandry.

Their family farming has settled down to growing grass, maize and cereals, all to feed the 300 milking cows and their offspring. Apart from feed supplements bought in, the farm is self-sufficient of grass, silage and enough home-grown cereal feed. Bull calves are reared to beef at 16 months, and dairy heifers brought into the milking herd.

Traditionally the 300 cows would be milked twice a day. However, 5 automatic robot milking units were introduced eleven years ago which allow the cows to milk themselves. The cows decide when they want to be milked - usually between two and four times a day - rather than when a dairyman dictates. Although there is housing for all the herd, the cows do use pasture close to the dairy for over half the year but on a hot or wet or windy day many are very content to remain in the shed chewing the cud. This contented hassle free lifestyle certainly seems to suit them.

The 300 cows can produce 8,500 litres of milk a day or a staggering 3 million litres per

year. The Robinsons started bottling milk in 1982, now selling it locally under the "Mawley Milk" brand and delivering it as far away as Birmingham.

Not only is the farm selfsufficient in animal feed but also for energy as well. Electricity is generated from their windmill on the hill, (75KWatts) solar the barn sheds panels on (100KWatts) and the recently installed anaerobic digester using animal slurry, and manure to produce methane gas. When it is sunny with a bit of wind, the farm produces enough energy for its needs and exports the excess electricity to the National Grid.

David and Adrian's farming to be efficient commercially viable, but they are not prepared to do it at the expense of the environment and conservation. The whole farm is in the Countryside Stewardship Scheme. This provides partial government grants to promote efficient use of resources. training and skills and a wide range of conservation wildlife measures. These include planting and maintaining hedges and trees, sowing 8 acres of wild bird seed pasture, and wider field margins, providing land for the Cleobury Mortimer allotments, by cutting hedges every other year and then only after birds have finished nesting from September. They are very aware of their important role stewards and custodians of the countryside.

Change is about all the time. Brexit does challenge farming. Farm subsidies and the political direction of farming nationally will be altered, but David feels reasonably confident about the future, as their ability to adapt and to produce food for the nation must almost certainly be as efficient and cost effective as most farmers.

The whole Robinson family are firmly based on a bedrock of faith, family and farming and will continue to be highly valued custodians of the countryside that they farm. *Kit Smith*

Funds come from a variety of sources - there are two charity shops, one in Ludlow and one in Kidderminster; tin shakes; a car boot sale on the 1st Sunday of the month from April – October; fetes and dog show. Gift Aid also brings in £18000 a year. In 2018 the charity rehomed 318 dogs, most only spending one to two weeks in kennels. It is inspiring to see the dedication of this committed team, assisted by a band of volunteer dog walkers and foster homes.





Last month the PM published the NHS Long Term Plan, setting out how it intends to allocate the record extra funding for the NHS in England over the next ten years. The Plan has been developed and driven forward by clinicians, patients and medical experts, and sets out a ten year programme to protect the health service for generations to come and improve patient care.

As a former Health Minister, I have seen first-hand the impact that robust forward planning can make to patient care within the NHS. So I am convinced this Plan, backed with the government's investment of £20.5 billion a year into the NHS in real terms by 2023/24, will help transform patient care. There is an appropriate focus on prevention, personal responsibility and promoting good health, with more rapid diagnostics, and a focus on new technologies and treatments to improve care.

I am particularly pleased to see real commitment to bringing the NHS into the digital age. Effective use of technology can help solve many of the issues facing our NHS today and into the future. The steps taken in the Plan will mean everyone in the country will have digital access to their GP, including being able to make appointments, manage prescriptions and view their health records online – helping to streamline the service for everyone, whether IT savvy or not.

This investment will also mean additional staffing throughout the NHS, with tens of thousands more doctors, nurses and other health professionals. Better prevention, detection, treatment and recovery from serious diseases alongside record investment in primary, community and mental healthcare will help improve health outcomes for all patients.

This includes earlier and more rapid diagnosis, new screening programmes and an offer of genomic testing to all people with cancer – so that in ten years' time, 55,000 more people survive cancer each year. It will also see improvements in the prevention, detection and treatment of cardiovascular disease, including expanding the use of mechanical thrombectomy in stroke care and improving access to cardiac rehabilitation to be amongst the best in Europe by 2028. Over ten years, the plan will prevent up to 100,000 heart attacks, strokes & dementia cases and ensure 1,600 stroke patients avoid long-term disability each year.

I was a strong supporter of Freedom to Speak Up champions when I was a Health Minister. So I am pleased to see further commitment in the Long Term Plan to making the NHS more supportive of staff, clamping down on bullying and providing better support services, to ensure the NHS is a world-class employer.

There is an expectation that the NHS plays its part in cutting waste and uses taxpayers' money as efficiently as possible. When the NHS is receiving over £120bn per year of public money, even small savings in percentage terms can lead to significant extra funding to put back into patient services. So new digital ways of working and increasing back office efficiency will help save more than £700 million across the NHS.

In coming months the NHS will work with communities to see how this plan will be implemented at a local level, and I shall be pressing to see the detailed impact of this Plan for Shropshire.



DEFIBRILLATORS

Our grateful thanks to Keith Brown for advising us that there is a defibrillator in Rock village, at the side of the Rock Cross pub. No code is needed to access it. There's another in the red phone box at Clows Top, and at this one the ambulance service will give the access code when they receive a 999 call.

Keith is running a First Aid Training course at Rock Village Hall on April 1st, running from 7.30 to 9.30. He makes the point that a defibrillator is useful only if the person operating it has been trained and knows how to give CPR (that's cardiopulmonary resuscitation) until paramedics arrive.

The course in April is free and is provided by the British Heart Foundation through Heartstart and is suitable for people who want to learn life-saving skills, and for those who want to update and refresh their knowledge. It will show you how to give CPR, how to use a defibrillator and give advice on how to help someone who is having a heart attack.

Places must be booked before the course and you can do this through Kath Thornton on 01299 832503 or text 07792 595664. Places are limited, so don't hesitate if you want to take this chance to become a potential life saver. PLASTIC - NOT SO FANTASTIC

We've recently seen images of the infamous "fatberg" on the news. Cleobury friend brought this home to me when she described sewage rising in her last week, driveway following a blockage in the waste water system down the road. The cause of the blockage? Research shows that wet wipes actually make up more than 90% of the material that causes fatbergs and other sewer blockages. (Friends of the Earth, January 2019)

Wet wipes often contain plastic fibres, making them a single use plastic item and unsuitable for flushing down the loo. Invented in 1958, they only became popular in the 1990's so we can survive without them. Alternatives include damp flannels, paper kitchen roll or reusable dishcloths. But if you do need to use wet wipes, they should be binned, and never flushed. Even if they flushable on the packet, they do not decompose quickly and can still cause blockages in the waste water systems. And if they make it through, they can end up in the sea or on the beach,

shedding plastic fibres as they go.

So the tip for this month is bin your wet wipes, don't flush. Or even better, avoid using them wherever possible.





February 14th to 21st is National Nestbox Week. It always coincides with St Valentine's Day, which I think is rather sweet. I'll be using the opportunity to gain some woodworking skills and I'm hoping the birds aren't too fussy about the finish! Advice on the dimensions and siting of boxes for different species of birds can be found in an excellent new book by the British Trust for Ornithology: 'Nestboxes: Your Complete Guide'.

Over the years we have put up many boxes that didn't get used, or didn't attract the species intended. The Blue and Great Tits have probably had a population explosion around here thanks to the boxes we put up to attract Redstarts to nest in the cherry orchard. The answer there is to block the entrance holes until the Redstarts arrive from abroad, but we're not as quick off the mark as we should be. In the garden we have a few boxes that have never been used but I shall persevere and try them in different places. I try to think like a bird: is it safe from cats; will it be too hot in summer; are wasps, bees or mice already using it? You can help to make nest boxes safe by fixing a metal plate or ring around the entrance hole, preventing woodpeckers and squirrels from pecking or chewing their way in to predate the occupants.

Another way we can help is to provide nesting materials. This could include feathers from old pillows, sheep's wool and moss from the lawn. Beware of long fibres in which nestlings could get entangled. Materials could be offered near a bird table in a satsuma net or just left in a shrub or flower bed. Nest boxes can be cleaned out when the nesting season is over, and since several species have more than one brood this probably means waiting until autumn. Old nests are often infested with fleas and other parasites, so all nesting material should be thrown a good distance away from the box.

If you walk in the woods in or near Ruskin Land you will notice that a number of larger boxes have been placed for Tawny Owls, Barn Owls and Kestrels. Our support for wildlifefriendly farming comes from the EU via a Countryside Agreement with the Department for the Environment, Farming and Rural Affairs. The parcels of land which belong to the Guild of St George and others under private ownership all have their own agreements, all of which are designed to increase biodiversity. The substantial, triangular-shaped boxes are built for us by the volunteers of the Wyre Community Land Trust and then placed in positions which should be attractive to Barn Owls. There is no guarantee that they will be avail themselves of the best 'des. res.' in the area but we'll keep a lookout for the tell-tale blur of white swooping low at dusk.



On buying a car. Part 1

According to the papers, car dealers throughout the UK have got their heads in their hands because of a substantial slump in the number of new cars being sold. Given some of my experiences when trying to buy from them, I wonder whether they really want to sell me anything at all. Perhaps they are afraid of disturbing the showroom display...

On one occasion, I went into a showroom and asked for a brochure on a particular model. I was commuting to work on a motor cycle at the time and had my bike gear on which may have confused the salesman but I don't think this justified his greeting which was "Are you really interested in buying a car or are you just collecting the brochures?". As I was in my 50's at the time, I don't think I could be mistaken for a spotty teenager... Nevertheless, despite this unpromising start, I returned for a test drive which went well until I asked him to give me some idea of what it would cost me to change my current car for his new model. Despite repeated requests he just wouldn't say, only wanting to talk about the extensive range of features and wonderful styling of his product. I'm not sure whether this was some kind of psychological ploy to soften me up for the kill or whether he was just a useless salesman but sadly it didn't work as I left and bought elsewhere.

At a different dealer, Having asked what the cost to change (i.e. the cost of the new car less their trade in offer) would be, all the salesman would say was "That will be £90 a month for 36 months" despite me not having mentioned anything about a loan or HP. Again, despite repeated requests, he could only parrot the same figures saying that for anything else, he would have to consult his Manager who was out. I assume that he must have been anticipating a healthy commission on any finance deal he concluded but once more it didn't work and I went elsewhere.

On another occasion, the salesman assured me that they were doing really great deals if I purchased straight away. I asked him to put some figures together and he came back with a deal that involved paying the full list price with a part exchange offer of £1000 less than I had been offered elsewhere and in a colour I didn't want. He seemed surprised when I declined the opportunity.

All this assumes you can find the dealer in the first place as there seems to be a game of 'Musical Franchises' at present. Dealers for several makes I might be interested in have vanished from Kiddy requiring me to travel either to Stourbridge or Worcester. When considering a purchase, I usually do some research at home to produce a shortlist of four or five potentially suitable models and then get brochures on these for further study. Or at least I used to. Have you tried to get any hard copy information on a car lately?. Any enquiry normally involves a reference to the relevant website which as a paid up member of the BOF (Boring Old Farts) Club, I don't find nearly as useful as being able to study a brochure. Any request for a printed brochure is usually met with 'They aren't in yet - have a look at the website' which doesn't impress me.

One company does offer the option to order hard copy on line but, having negotiated their complex application screens, the last question requires your postcode – or would if it accepted the details. Somewhat frustrated, I spotted an E mail help desk address and contacted them with my problem. 'No sweat' they said promising to send me a copy in the post. They did say that it could take up to 10 working days but, two months later, nothing has appeared. Perhaps they don't work on many days... At this point, we haven't even considered the pros and cons of individual models. This can be considered in more detail next month





We are very concerned at the disruption and the way it will affect businesses and the Medical Centre and are trying to get someone from Shropshire Council to come and talk to us. Hopefully by the time you read this it will have happened.

The Town Council are committed to get some of the projects done this year and we are getting quotes for the three in the Skate Park. A wildflower meadow, A bike trail and a large dog training area, which we hope to get done for the summer. We could use some help in design of bike trail and putting it together from possible users with their parents. The wildflower meadow is a good start and we may create more if successful. The Dog training area will allow all dog owners a safe place to train and let their dogs run, and we may have a scheme to book it privately and are working on that. I know these things take time and a few volunteers have helped with consultations and getting quotes, which help the volunteer councillors get everything together. It doesn't happen on its own and we are lucky to have dedicated working councillors and volunteers but could always use more.

We are also going through quotes and looking at re vamping the Love Lane play area, which we have to secure funding for the project to move forward.

Something else that we are doing, is working with the Primary School and funding a lollipop person, as we are all concerned for the children's safety. A much needed and welcomed step forward.

Please remember that we all are lucky to live in such a beautiful part of the country and to keep it like that takes a lot of work from dedicated people, and with more cuts coming our way we have to take up the slack. We have a continual battle to get things done and we will continue to do so.

We have met the new Police Inspector and Sergeant for our area and raised our concerns for more patrols in our Town and parish and will continue to do so.

As the first town to have Smartwater we have been asked to take part in a video for the West Mercia police and two members of the public will be working with us on this. Cleobury Mortimer is a name that is used a lot now.

Don't forget to put 29th June in your diary for the Cleobury Festival, which we have already started working on it with some volunteers, but could always use more.






