Benjamin Myers' 'The Gallows Pole' was aptly described by one reader as "beautiful and brutal' in its telling of the Cragg Vale Coiners, who made a living by trimming the borders of coins to produce extra coinage. Set in northern moorland, it featured the story of 'King' David Hartley and his followers as they sought to keep their illegal practise safe from excise officer Deighton, who was murdered by hired thugs. Justice prevailed, Hartley and others being hanged, but not the murderers.

Told in language that appeared to be typical of the rough life in rural areas, this was one of several award winning works from Benjamin Myers, a staunch northern writer telling tales of life in an area too seldom recognised. Not an easy read, but one to provoke curiosity despite its earthy language.



There were also a larger number of inactive but interested We took on members. various items of research ranging from the history of the Blount and Lacon Childe families to the war records of local residents to the UK censuses, amongst a host of others. The society has published a number of reports of its researches as the "Cleobury Chronicles" starting with vol 1 in 1991 and ending with vol 12 in

2016. A copy of each of these has been deposited in the library but if anyone has difficulty in finding any of them, I have a full set which I'd be pleased to hand over

We also held a number of successful public talks.

What I am hoping is that several interested people will come forward with a view to re-starting a history society. I and other recent members would be prepared to share our experiences mostly without taking an active part. There is a bank account with enough funds to get a resurgent society off the ground. There was a website and this has become inactive but could be revived

I am happy to act as a conduit for interested people to form a small steering committee with a view to booking a local venue and get started.

So, get in touch and let's see if you can get it going again.



CLEOBURY GARDENERS

We started our new year of meetings and speakers on January 8th, with a presentation by Pip Smith, on Planting for a Fragrant Garden. Pip was Head Gardener at Woollerton Old Hall for a number of years, and you might have seen him on TV in an episode of "Great British Gardens" with Carol Klein. He is now a Landscape and Garden Designer, and his specialism is reimagining gardens and open spaces to enjoy and socialise.

He explained the two-way bargain between plant and pollinator. Fragrance is produced by the release of compounds of specific interest to certain groups of pollinators. The plants produce their nectar and perfume, and the pollinators come for the sugar sweetness, taking away more pollen to other plants. Bargain honoured. Those plants which give off their fragrances early evening are invariably of interest to moths, whilst those that produce their fragrance earlier in the day are of interest to butterflies and flies, for Once a plant has example. been pollinated, compound release ceases.

Pip really brought his ideas to life with a visual presentation, supported by a comprehensive list shown by season, so we were able to recognise the plants even if we did not recognise their latin nomenclature. The presentation included full information on planting and care conditions, and pruning warnings - be careful not to prune at the wrong time thereby removing future flowering growth. Pip's list is in our files and available for a small fee for funds if it is of interest to you.

Our next meeting, of what looks to be a very interesting programme created by our Social Secretary, Carol Franklin, is on Monday 12th February when Kit Smith will present the latest information on "Fungi the Miccorhrizal Network" or how plants and trees talk to one another. We meet at our new home, the Parish Hall at 7.30pm for a speaker-start at 8pm. Entrance is of course free for members, and £5.00 for visitors including light refreshments.

2023 was not only the warmest year on record globally, but here in the UK we also saw higher levels of rainfall, more persistently from unusual drought conditions in 2022.

This goes to show climate change is impacting us here in South Shropshire, and highlights the importance of managing water resources and treatment, to ensure safe drinking supply, stewardship of our waterways, as well as ensuring we have good treatment to reduce risks from our sewage systems being overwhelmed, as they have

Managing our water systems is a topic on which I have focussed during my time in Parliament since the last General Election and as Chairman of the Environmental Audit Committee. Last month I hosted an event in Parliament for the Chartered Institution of Water and Environmental Management, which was launching its new independent review "A Fresh Water Future", with recommendations for the next government, of whatever complexion, to maintain improvement of water infrastructure and regulation high up the agenda.

I have also been supporting my neighbouring MPs in our River Severn Caucus to seek government support for a holistic catchment wide response to manage flooding of the River Severn valley, to manage excessive rain levels from the Welsh hills through to the Severn Estuary. This is an ambitious £500m set of measures, which would help communities across Shropshire by reducing the flow of water, and the risk of localised flooding.

I am also pleased to be able to report by the end of December the government was able to announce that all Combined Sewer Overflows and treatment works were now fitted with event duration monitors (only 7% had them installed in 2010 - now 100%) so that comprehensive data will

This was something I was determined to broke their banks in places. For some poor push through in my Private Members Bill on households affected by the rising flood waters, this sewage pollution, which the government then was the second time in 12 months they had picked up in the Environment Act 2021. While I flooded, including some of those I visited in the warmly welcome this progress, the key is to upgrade our water infrastructure to prevent sewage spills damaging aquatic life in our waterways in the first place.

To that end, the Government has a 25-year Plan September to December. This followed a year of for Water, under which water companies are together developing plans which amount to £96bn of investment over the next 5 years, once approved by Ofwat. Severn Trent is at the forefront, having pledged a record £12.9bn investment, with improvement of at least 562 storm overflows, as they try to meet the Government's target five years early.

> Looking around at the impact of Storm Henk last month, it was clear the impact would not only be for households and business, but also for farmers whose fields had been submerged, with grants up to £25,000 to farmers whose land had flooded and damaged crops. There has also been recent progress in bringing water management more holistically into the wider DEFRA support mechanisms for agriculture, with the latest iteration of the Sustainable Farming Incentive published in January including 15 new measures to help farmers manage water flows and reduce the impact of farming practices on water courses and nature.

> There is also further government support available for homes and businesses, provided certain thresholds are met. I raised Shropshire's case with the Flooding Minister in the House of Commons last month, to seek to ensure the Flood Recovery Framework scheme is activated in Shropshire. In order to do so, it is vital that for any floods in in South Shropshire every homeowner affected informs Shropshire Council if their home or business has been flooded.

Flooding is a terrible experience for anyone who has to live through it, and it is right that we do what we can to mitigate the impacts and adapt to reduce the risk for those communities where it is becoming increasingly likely as climate change becomes a reality. Philip Dunne



But here's the thing - all these lists forget to mention the stuff that makes gardening truly special. The joy of creating a garden, nurturing it, and watching it thrive is an experience that transcends trends and fads. The simple pleasure of sitting in the middle of your garden, surrounded by the fruits of your labour, with family and friends, enjoying a barbecue and a cold beer, is what gardening is all about (at least for me).

So, as you embark on your own particular gardening journey in 2024, try not to be swayed by the latest trends and buzzwords. Instead, focus on what truly matters – the love and care you pour into your garden and the moments you create within it. Trends may come and go, but the timeless pleasures of gardening are here to stay. Cheers to another year of growth, beauty, and the simple joys of the garden.

Every time a Council has gone bust (and it is happening more and more frequently) they blame a reduction in grants from central government. However, this may not be the entire truth. These include speculative investments funded by borrowing. As you know, Shropshire Council is putting Council Tax up by the maximum allowable again (5% or 24/25) so it might be worth asking about such investments. Shopping Centres come to mind...

This was followed by a press release from Philip Dunne confirming this. Only it didn't happen, with no sign of life, intelligent or otherwise, on the premises. No idea why this was promised but the latest rumour says that someone is under training to take over although no date is mentioned. Believe it when you see it...The recent ITV series on the Horizon scandal has created a storm of activity with even politicians finally waking up to the scale and depth of the scandal. Given that all the main parties have had Ministers responsible for this area, even the Lib Dems in the person of their current leader, no party can claim innocence. Instead they are running around blaming everyone else involved. Just what are Police and Crime Commissioners for? Introduced by David (call me Lord Dave) Cameron, they made policing into a political football. This goes against all the principles of policing by consent introduced by Sir Robert Peel 200 years ago. Rumour has it that the West Mercia PCC has around 100 staff, some on substantial salaries, with the cost being around £2.4 million a year. A rough 'back of a fag packet' calculation indicates that this sum would pay for some 400 front line officers so which would you prefer? With a general election coming up soon, it could be a useful question for prospective candidates.




BRUCKNER'S BIRTHDAY BASH

How many Curlews and Lapwings are there? Please help us to find out

If you enjoy seeing Curlew and Lapwing, and would like to do something to help stop their disappearance from the local countryside, we would like your help, please.

We need to know how many breeding pairs there are, and where, before we try to help them. The group is centred on the open hill land of Titterstone Clee, and Clee Hill and Catherton Commons, extending approximately as far as Knowlegate and Knowbury to the south, Bitterley to the west, Cleedownton and Bromdon to the north, and Doddington to the east. The bird survey has been carried out every year since 2012, and we are doing it again this year. People who have helped previously will be asked to help again, but new helpers will be very welcome, please.

The Curlew results in 2023 were the most encouraging for some years: 7 - 8 pairs were found in the original area, one more than last year, and two more in the extension. Three nests were found, one a relay by the same pair, but although all three of those nests were predated, a chick fledged from each of two other nests, one on Magpie Hill and one near Coreley. This is great news, the first fledged young for some years!!! A distribution map can be found on our website. Let us know if you know of any other pairs, please. For other species, there were 2 - 3 pairs of Lapwing: at Hollywaste, the only known site since 2017, and 8-9 pairs of Kestrel: Clee Hill is a county hotspot, and we are supporting a nest box and ringing project. Five nests were found. At least two Cuckoo territories were located, but there must be more, and there were more Barn Owl: sightings than for many years. There were probably 3 pairs, and one nest was found with 3 fledged young. Two Red Kite nests were also found, in the same places as last year. A full report for 2023 is being prepared. If you can recognise Lapwing and Curlew (and preferably their calls), you can make an important contribution to our work. If possible, we would also like you to record Kestrel, Cuckoo, and other target species, but that's an optional extra. The survey is easy to do, and only involves three 3-hour visits between the beginning of April and mid-June. Simple instructions and a map to record your observations are provided, and there will be an outdoor training session if you want to come. Whether you join in or not, please let us know if you see Curlew, Lapwing or Kestrel anywhere in the area.

Our survey contributes to the Curlew monitoring carried out across Shropshire, by 10 Community Wildlife Groups altogether. You can read about this, and the work of the Shropshire Ornithological Society (SOS) Save our Curlews project on the SOS website www.shropshirebirds.com/save-our-curlews/. This describes the results in detail, our future plans, and the overwhelming evidence that predation by foxes and other predators is the main cause of Curlew's continuing decline. It is clear that the annual release of millions of pheasants for shooting, only a third of which are actually shot, results in an over-abundant food supply which maintains the numbers of the Curlew's main predators well above naturally sustainable levels.

We still need to monitor the local Curlew population, and check all the pairs we do find, to see if they produce young, and if any fledge, so if you can do so, please help..

A Bird Group meeting will be held at 7.30pm on Monday 18 March, at the Recreation Rooms, 22A, Clee Hill High Street, to present the results of our work in previous years, and plans for 2024. All welcome!!!

Neighbourhood Development Plan

The result of the referendum held on Thursday 7th December 2023 was 84% in favour of the Neighbourhood Development Plan. Shropshire Council are due to adopt the Neighbourhood Plan at their March meeting. When it comes into force it forms part of the development plan for the area alongside the Local Plan. Local planning authorities and planning inspectors considering planning applications or appeals must make their decisions in accordance with the policies of the Neighbourhood Development Plan unless material considerations indicate otherwise. This is the first time that residents in Cleobury Mortimer have been able to influence the type of housing to be built and the provision of open amenity space.

Proposed Sewage Treatment Works

The planning application for the proposed sewage treatment works off Station Road has been approved by Shropshire Council. We have asked Severn Trent to arrange a public drop-in session as soon as possible to present their final plans and the likely construction timeline. This is a significant investment in the ageing infrastructure within Cleobury Mortimer and will ensure that we have sufficient capacity to treat the wastewater from our growing community whilst protecting the biodiversity in and along the River Rea.

Councillor Surgery

Cllr Greaves, Cllr Tysall, Cllr Abbatiello and Cllr Clarke attended the monthly Councillor Surgery which is held in The Market Hall alongside the Farmers Market. We were visited by a small number of residents who discussed various issues around the town; the main issues being excessive vehicle speed along Tenbury Rd from New House Farm to Eagle Lane and the ongoing issues with the erratic sequencing of the traffic lights at the Catherton Rd junction.
