Such sad news that Moffats School is to close at the end of the month. It started life in 1934, founded by Natalie Engleheart in Hertfordshire and taking its name from the house there. It moved around during the 1939-45 World War until settling at Kinlet Hall 71 years ago, with the Engleheart family involved up to the present day.

It has followed the established tradition of remaining small in terms of numbers, which makes for a family atmosphere for the younger children, who would find a large establishment overwhelming. Chairman Julian Engleheart explained that the financial pressure on a small establishment is such in this numbers-ruled world that to commit to another year was not realistic.

We understand that there will continue to be educational events at the Hall and the Clarion will be happy to help publicise those happenings. We wish the family and staff well in the future.

THE CREATIVE WRITING GROUP

It should be easy for creative people to take on a new idea, and at our June meeting we did just that. New member Ann Webber explained that in New Zealand a writing group would have a special test, writing about an object without once saying what it was.

So that is one of the options we have: either write about a barn without mentioning that word, or write any story or script using the three words consequence, steeple and stillness, all within 1000 words. We meet at the library at 6.30 on Monday the 10th to see how creative we have been.

CLEOBURY PATIENTS' VOICE

It's probably fair to say that of all the industries that will be affected by Brexit when it finally happens, farming is facing some of the greatest uncertainty. Over 70% of agri-business exports currently flow to the EU, which provides over £2.5 billion in annual farm payments to UK farmers.

So it is timely to hear of the Farming Community Network, which seeks to support farmers and families within the farming

community through difficult times. It provides free, confidential and practical help to around 6,000 people a year on a range of farming-related issues, including financial difficulties, animal disease, mental health and family disputes. Many of its 400 volunteers across England and Wales are involved with farming, and will "walk with people" to help them solve their problems. They can be contacted on 03000 111 999.

Prescription charges have risen again, now £8.60 for each item. Perhaps less well known is the Prescription Prepayment Certificate (PPC). This costs £29.60 per quarter, or £104 for a year, and offers significant savings if you are having to buy more than one prescription item every month. The 12-month PPC can even be paid for in monthly instalments if you use Direct Debit. It's an NHS scheme and the pharmacy can provide a leaflet and more details.

Talking of Cleobury's pharmacy, many who live in the more remote parts of our area with little access to transport have benefitted in recent years from its free delivery service. Thanks to Government cuts to the funding of community

pharmacies, it has had no option but to introduce a fee of £1 per delivery in partial support of the service's continuation. It has also rationalized its delivery timetable, and most villages will only receive deliveries on one day each week (e.g. Coreley and Hopton on Mondays; Far Forest on Tuesdays; Highley and Stottesdon on Wednesdays, etc.). This means that if you rely on this delivery service, you will need to factor this into your timing when ordering repeat prescriptions. More information from the pharmacy itself on 01299 270219.

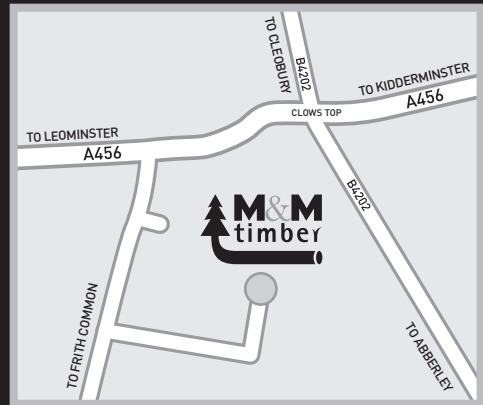

What a success that was. There was a great deal of thinking and hard work put into one day, with an enthusiastic response from all sorts of clubs, services and local businesses. They were rewarded with a dry day and a steady stream of people for most of the open hours.

In the Market Hall Clare Carter was assuring us that people would start to arrive at about 11.00 and was proved spot on. Downstairs Marion Wilson sold plants and Pam Elmer pictures and postcards, while upstairs Edwin Sayer and Vicky Winterbourne were talking books and selling a few while Iris Todd worked at her spinning wheel and Myfanwe Baldwin quietly progressed the weaving of a wicker chair seat.

Corrina Payton's 'Moonshine Designs' attracted attention with their bottle bases and matching shades. She was happy with sales, her customers perhaps reminded of the potions that had once left them with a hangover. You have to admit, using liquor bottles as the base for lamps is good way of building your stock.

Behind the church Fee, Rachel and Jem were giving very popular glass blowing demonstrations with a portable kiln purchased thanks to help from the town's capital fund. More about them when we can sit and talk at length - they were busy all day.

There was a variety of music in the church, but the editor's inability to resist the cakes and tea on offer stopped him going in. We talked to Carol Turner

later, who'd spent most of the day serving and talking to visitors, including one couple on holiday in the area who were most impressed by the community spirit the day generated. The church funds were swelled by the catering and people who had never been in there before found a friendly welcome and a warm old building. If anyone took up the offer of a bell ringing trial we don't know.

John Carter opened his back garden cottage as a gallery for his range of artworks and hand made furniture. The place is a model of what you can achieve with an older house, modest funds and artistic flair.

Just up The Hurst was John and Daphne Tuck's open garden, which people were enthusing about. Walk through the gate and you could see why, it's a magic place with lots of modest sheds made attractive with colour and artwork. So much to see and I did like the carved figures: "Just some Thermolite blocks I found behind the shed," explained John.

In the Primary School was artwork portraying the town in different ways, each alternative the work of a particular year. The offering from the Reception Class was a real eye catcher. All in the hall, where artwork is evident around the walls. Inspirational for young minds.

Lacon Childe gave emphasis to a series of memories from past students, outlining their life since moving on. Quite a revelation to see where talented people have gone since getting a good start at our local

The day should be considered in comparison with the first such event last year. This was a huge advance and reports from the post event meeting suggest that it will become an annual event. There are details to improve, but this was a really good day.

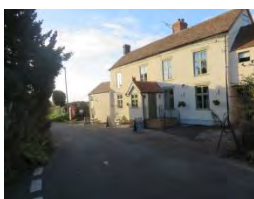

PERFECT PARTNERS



Mike and Shelly Roberts with her Christmas present, eight litres of turbo-charged Volvo tipper.

We've written about Shelly Roberts before, when her Volvo FL6 tipper truck had recently clocked up 1,000,000 kilometres. That faithful old servant has just been retired, partly because Shelly had a back problem that required surgery and she really did deserve a little more in the way of creature comforts.

That old truck was a tribute to Volvo quality and careful driving and maintenance. It has now covered 1,200,000 miles and stands in the yard, waiting to be rebuilt. We quizzed Mike about the replacements it has needed since he bought it brand new in

1992. "It's had a couple of clutches and a new head gasket at about 800,000 miles. I thought I'd have to do the bearings then, but it was all OK. And it's had a new gearbox because the shell was cracked - they're known to do that. We found one that a chap was breaking and fitted that."

It's unusual in having both a turbocharger and a positive supercharger: "It's a fire engine unit, cost an extra £5,000 when I bought it new." The tipper body is the original, an alloy unit made in Wisbech that gives the truck a carrying capacity of 11 tonnes in its regular haulage work in the local area. "It's a pretty good record, considering it's all been up and down Clew Hill," he grins.

Mike does the maintenance on the trucks, except when they're still under warranty. He was trained at Leyland Trucks in Lancashire, because his father Chris ran Leylands in the family transport business, and can take on just about any mechanical job. The restoration of the FL6 will be handled by them both.

Shelley's new truck is an eight litre turbo-diesel Volvo called Molly. It came from South Wales with over 500,000 kilometres on the clock and it's getting a smart paint job in between hauling

aggregate and asphalt materials to local construction and highway sites. It's relatively small compared with the big haulers we see passing through Cleobury, but that's an advantage when most of your work is in a rural area with narrow lanes where the monsters are just too big to get in and out again.

That's Shelly's speciality, the ability to deliver to difficult sites. Like the current work getting stone and gravel to an embankment slip on the Severn Valley Railway at Severn Lodge Farm. She backs down to tip the load onto the tracked vehicle that's the only thing that can get through. She does like her new daily ride: "I've got air conditioning and a comfortable seat!"

Mike's own Volvo is a very serious piece of metalwork, with a 13 litre turbo-diesel power unit putting out 560 horsepower through a 12-speed automatic gearbox. "Easier to drive than the car," he assures me with another grin.

They grin a lot, these two. Not what you might expect from people whose working day can start before 5.00, but they're totally engrossed in what they do and they obviously do it very well.

A recent addition for female dogs is key hole neutering, a modern approach to spaying which results in less pain, lower risk and faster recovery. Our vet, Daniel Nicholls, talks here about the method and the extraordinary benefits it can bring to the recovery process of your pet.

Key-hole (Laparoscopic) surgery is something that was barely on my radar at university. It was always something that was discussed as possible but not really normal practice. So, when I started at Severn Edge, key-hole surgery wasn't something I had seen much of or had much experience with. It's only since being here I have seen an array of operations that have been done using key-hole methods. My eyes have most definitely been opened to the possibilities.

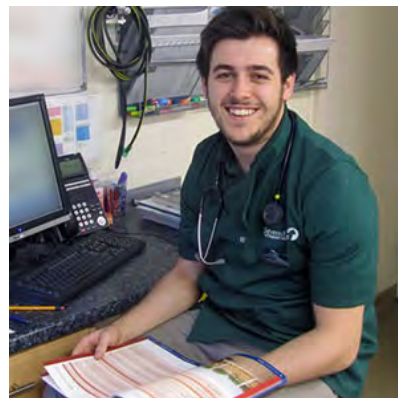
Key-hole surgery isn't something new in human medicine but it's only in the last decade or so that it has emerged in the veterinary world. It can be used for a variety of operations that were previously done by more invasive methods, often opening the animal up (laparotomy) in the traditional method giving you total access to the abdomen.

Why bother with this new stuff? The benefits are mainly seen in the recovery of the animal following the operation. Having abdominal surgery for example is a very painful experience and although we try our best to alleviate that pain using medications, often the discomfort from the surgery is there regardless. Key-hole surgery means that instead of a large hole required to access the cavity, a couple of small holes are used instead. This means there is a lot less trauma to the skin and muscle layers so therefore

much less pain and less time needing to be rested. This all means your animal gets back to normal life quicker than ever before.

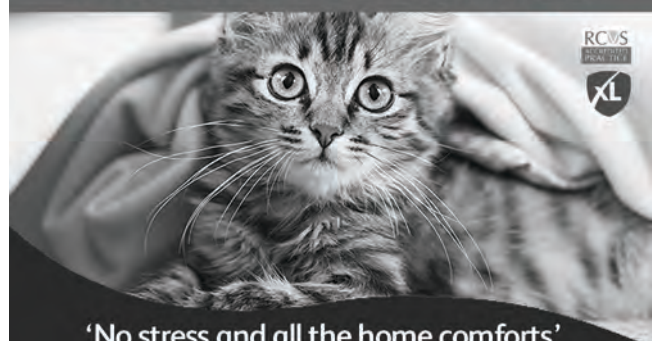
There are a variety of situations and surgical procedures that key-hole is suitable for. At the moment the routine surgery we are doing at Severn Edge is a keyhole ovariectomy (spay). However, we are now using the technique more and more for other things such as taking liver biopsies for patients with liver disease that needs investigating and removing retained testicles (cryptorchid) in male dogs. In my time seeing and performing key-hole operations, I have already seen the dramatic improvement in recovery times and pain experienced post operatively. I am excited to see what we can use the technique for next, so that we can constantly progress and improve our patient's quality of care.

ROLAND EMETT AT CHELSEA

A visit to the Chelsea Flower Show at the end of May led to a discovery for Mike and myself: the work of eccentric British artist/engineer, Roland Emmet. A floral stand was dedicated to his memory, displaying some of his fantastical machines and automata from a larger installation.

Emett was born in London, the son of a businessman and amateur inventor; and educated at Waverley Grammar School in Birmingham; and he studied at the Birmingham School of Arts and Crafts when one of his landscapes, *Cornish Harbour*, was exhibited at the Royal Academy, and is now in the Tate collection. His WWII service entailed working as a draughtsman for the Air Ministry, but he still worked on his cartoons in his spare time. Later, he was published in *Punch* magazine; designed scenes for the Globe Theatre; produced kinetic sculptures for the Festival of Britain; machines for *Chitty Chitty Bang Bang*; and the kinetic water clock in the Victoria Centre, Nottingham amongst others. I can't help thinking that the late, loved,

eccentric Arthur Lane would have greatly admired his work.

The stand at Chelsea, produced by Birmingham City Council, displayed Emmet's 'A Quiet Afternoon in the Cloud Cuckoo Valley', and it was the largest "mechanical thing" (his words) he'd created before he died in 1990. It was a Heath-Robinson type of scenario populated by whimsical machines and figurines. Sadly, it never went on display in his lifetime, but it has recently been restored and exhibited at the Birmingham Museum and Art Gallery, and again brought entertainingly to life in the floral display at Chelsea.

It stands seven metres tall and around eleven metres in circumference, and consists of eight separate sculptures, each of which moves in an ingenious and co-ordinated way to charming musical accompaniment. There's a train with a Mrs Fanshawe sitting elegantly in 1st class; a bike with birds living in the lamp; an ornithologist disguised as a tree; a squirrel stealing from a picnic; and farmer playing the harp to his cows in the meadow. Emmet said, "The first principle in science is to create something

nice to look at and then decide what it can do."

'I Know Why the Caged Bird Sings' by Maya Angelou.

I am delighted that last month voters in South Shropshire placed their trust in me, and re-elected me to represent the Ludlow Constituency for the fourth time. The result secured both the highest number of votes for a candidate in the seat's history (31,433) and a record majority (19,286).

I am humbled by the result. To those who voted for me: thank you. To those who did not: my door is always open to discuss your concerns. As I have for the past 12 years, I will hold regular advice surgeries locally to help constituents in whatever way I can. The result nationally was clearly not what I had hoped for, but at this crucial time, the Prime Minister will form a Government in the national interest. As I am writing before the Queen's Speech, the Government is finalising arrangements with the DUP to support specific elements of a programme for government in the best interests of the United Kingdom. I expect this to focus on the Brexit negotiations, economic and security issues, but will mean we will continue to have distinct positions on social and other issues.

Security issues have been all too present in the national psyche over the past few months. The terrible attacks in Westminster, Manchester, and London Bridge, Finsbury Park and the tragic Grenfell Tower fire, revealed the worst but also the best of Britain, as communities came together in support. While our thoughts and prayers are with the victims and their families, I wanted to focus on the response of the emergency services, in particular the health service.

In my role as a Health Minister I attended meetings to coordinate the response to the Manchester attack during the General Election, and

the Grenfell Tower fire last month, and it was clear that on these and the other occasions the response from police and fire services was exemplary. In Manchester, by entire coincidence there had been a full major incident rehearsal only two months before, coincidentally on the day of the Westminster Bridge attack.

The response from the NHS was also first-rate. Not only were there clear and well-rehearsed emergency responses, but staff also showed a dedicated ethos to dropping everything when an emergency arose, running towards danger to help save lives. It is difficult to express the importance of this, and we should all be grateful for their unwavering commitment. Before Easter I visited one of the hospitals to thank staff who had responded to the Westminster Bridge incident, and met patients recovering from their injuries who were full of praise for the treatment received.

Following my reappointment as Health Minister after the General Election, I visited the London Ambulance Service to thank control room staff, including some who had taken calls from Westminster Bridge, London Bridge and Grenfell Tower incidents. I was struck by their calm demeanour and professionalism. I was pleased to learn London Ambulance Service have established teams and protocols with other NHS and voluntary bodies to provide counselling, not just in the immediate aftermath, but an ability for staff who may have been affected from responding to a traumatic incident to access talking therapists and advice whenever needed.

We are fortunate to have such dedicated people working to keep our country safe. But we must all work together to find ways to minimise risks in future and bring our communities together to heal rather than exacerbate grievances.

Farming is in Mike's blood; he has always farmed.

When asked to comment on his time on the Parish Council, Mike's response was "It was an honour to do it".

In the last month the local Safer Neighbourhood Team have taken part in lots of community events in Cleobury. PCSO Eden and PCSO Leek attended Cleobury Mortimer Scout troop and delivered a talk on who we are and what we do. This educated them how the police work and some of the equipment used by the force. I am led to believe the scouts had great fun arresting each other and talking over the airwaves.

We attended the Cleobury Festival on June 10th, along with the We Don't Buy Crime manager Mick Simpson. This was a very enjoyable day and it was great to speak to those who attended.

Cleobury continues to maintain very low levels of crime though we do often hear reports on incidents via gossip and through the grapevine. If you do experience an incident please do inform the police via the 101 service or via the internet. This is the only way we will be able to properly identify issues and challenge those responsible.

Over the coming weeks we will be conducting a series of traffic operations over south Shropshire specifically

targeting speeding drivers and those who use their mobile phones while driving. Cleobury has been put forward as a location for this operation. This is to follow up the recent changes to the way fines for these offences are

issued. Drivers who are caught on their mobile while driving now face a £200 fine and six penalty points. Speeding fines are now calculated as a percentage of your weekly wage ranging from 50% and three penalty points for the least serious offences to 150% with six penalty points for the most serious. For new drivers, who cannot gain six or more penalty points, this would also lead to their licence being revoked. We continue to actively target untaxed vehicles and will look to seize any that are identified.

We continue to engage with the local crime reduction group, town council and other organisations within Cleobury. If there are any events or meetings you would like us to attend please inform us and we will do our best. *Liam Jones*

DIAMOND BUSES – AN APOLOGY

Regular readers may remember that in last month's column, I jokingly suggested that Diamond's new bus tracking app would be improved by the addition of a temperature sensor so that in the event of a fire the emergency services could be alerted immediately.

Little did I know that a few days later, this would have come in handy as yet another of Diamond's finest barbequed itself at Callow Hill. Clearly this incident was entirely down to me mentioning this possibility and absolutely nothing to do with incompetent management, clapped out vehicles or inadequate maintenance, not to mention inaction by the Traffic Commissioners. For this grave error on my part, I sincerely apologise. However, given the recent tragic events in London, I wonder whether enforcement agencies will now start to give more thought to the safety of citizens both at home and whilst travelling.... At least the app now seems to have been installed on the fleet as one driver spent so much time playing with it following a breakdown that he weaved his way along and across the road to the consternation of the passengers..

Back to the usual rash of breakdowns, these seem to be occurring in ever greater numbers with two in a single journey not unusual. Even if your bus does arrive on time, the chances of it getting to its destination are increasingly slim. In one case the 9.38 to Ludlow had to stop to cool down at Doddington and limped to Clee Hill before expiring. The driver contacted base only to be told that they would have to wait for the mechanic as he was already in Ludlow repairing the vehicle from the previous service... The passengers finally got to Ludlow two hours late. Unfortunately, the return trip was no better as the bus failed to show and the journey back to Cleobury also took 2 hours.

At least they did get there as journeys in the other direction didn't even start at one point during the month. Due to roadworks, the bus

could not follow the normal route and merely retraced its path picking up at Tesco's instead of Corve Street. Unfortunately, no-one bothered to tell passengers or put a notice on the stop setting this out so some passengers had a very long wait, having eventually to find an alternative way home. When asked about this, Diamond blamed Shropshire Council who blamed Diamond. Whatever happened to owning up to mistakes and putting things right?

On the weekend of the Ludlow Food Festival, the bus died on Clee hill and the driver advised passengers that there would be no relief service. Luckily, one occupant knew a minibus operator who was summoned and, following a whip round, transported everyone to Ludlow. On another day, the 9.14 was late arriving and when asked why, the driver said that this was the third bus that had been used on the service, the other two having expired.

There have been a number of other incidents such as one vehicle stuck in third gear and another where the driver was asked to operate the ramp to help an elderly passenger alight but declined as he didn't know where the button was...

I understand that Worcestershire Council have employed a company to conduct an on board survey of the 2L route asking for comments on the service. Apparently there have been a few rather ripe responses... I don't know whether we will ever see the results and conclusions of this exercise but we can only hope. However, if you are lucky enough to own an Aston Martin, the company will sell you (for £634!) a set of tyre cushions. These are used when a vehicle is stationary for long periods to stop 'flat spotting' of the tyres as the same area is in constant contact with the ground. Should you be thinking of buying Diamond a Christmas present, a few sets of these would no doubt be very welcome.

Still no news of another operator as currently no-one else seems interested in taking over the 2L route although enquiries are continuing.

We look after one of the many old cherry orchards in the Wyre Forest. These were planted early in the 20th Century to take advantage of the high prices that could be obtained for fresh fruit taken to Birmingham and other urban areas by the newly-constructed railway network. Harvesting the fruit was (and is) a very labour-intensive job, especially when the fruit is growing on an old-fashioned standard tree. I now appreciate the origin of the term 'cherry picking', referring to taking only the best: you can only pick the fruit that is ripe making return visits necessary in the hope that the birds haven't found them first. Add to this the danger of climbing long ladders to reach the branches and you can understand why the fruit commanded a high price. In the heyday of cherry production there would be a man to move the ladders for a gang of 8 to 10, usually casually-employed,

women pickers. Many who worked in the carpet factories during the day would squeeze in some extra employment in the orchards at this time of year.

When we came to Uncllys we set about planting new cherry trees and over the years since have pruned the old trees to keep them standing as long as possible. Even when dead they provide a habitat for some of the forest's rarest creatures, such as the Noble Chafer beetle. Spring brings a wonderful show of blossom, but this is only the second year in 13 when we have anything like a good crop of cherries. Some of the new trees are fruiting at last and nearly all of the 'old ladies' are having a go, so we are being vigilant at checking on the progress of ripening and trying to get the ladder to the trees in time. We have a number of varieties which ripen consecutively from June to the end of July, with each variety yielding ripe fruit over about 9 days. We can't put the time in to visit the trees every day, so the pigeons, jays and thrushes help with the picking and other nocturnal visitors clear up the fruit that gets knocked to the ground.

The Cherry Fair, a revival of the traditional annual market, celebrates the harvest on the weekend of 22nd and 23rd July at Bewdley Museum from 1.00 to 4.00pm each day with music, children's activities, crafts, food and drink. Now, is it to be cherry ice cream, cherry clafoutis, summer pudding, chocolate and cherry gateau.....?

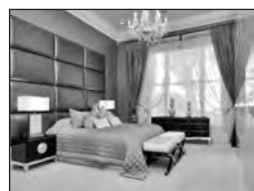

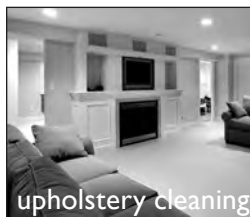

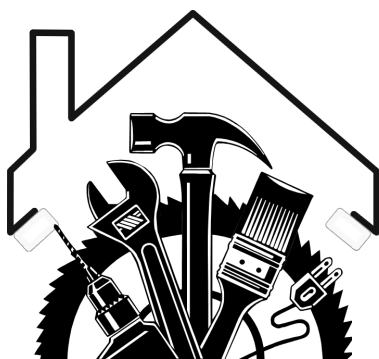

Paul French adds to his stories about local men in the 1914 -18 Great War,

Howard Cyril Pratt... Gunner 113504 150th Siege Battery, Royal Garrison Artillery was born in Cleobury Mortimer on the 4th April 1890.

He was the youngest of six children, four of whom are buried in Cleobury Mortimer Cemetery. His father William was a hotel keeper at the Kings Arms and his mother was Harriet.

Howard made a good start in life as evidence confirms. A card exists from the Childrens Memorial of the Mission issued when he was nine years old , on the back of which is written "I will try to be reverent in the Church, Howard Pratt". As we will see this good behaviour did not always continue.

He enlisted in Smethwick in December 1915, he was twenty six years old and was a "metal worker". On the 30th November 1916 he embarked at Folkestone for Boulogne.

It was in December of that year that Howard rather blotted his copy book because on the 16th he was given seven days field punishment No 2 for 'urinating in a refuse bin'.

(No 2 was being placed in leg irons and handcuffs but still allowed you to march with the unit.)

On Febuary 17th 1917 Howard was docked seven days pay for "quitting his billet without a pass" and "being improperly dressed, contrary to Doullens town orders". One wonders what those dress codes were and what would the Mission have thought?

In December 1917 he was posted to 56 Siege Battery and died of wounds in September 1918 aged 28 and is buried in Heilly Station Cemetery, Mericourt l Abbe , Somme and his plot number is No V11 B66.

We don't know exactly what part Howard played in his battery for these reasons.

A siege battery comprised 5 officers and 177 other ranks, 17 riding horses, 6 draught horses and 80 heavy horses, 3 two horse wagons and 10 four horse wagons

Each battery would normally be grouped with three others under a Siege Brigade.

Records were held and covered the Brigade details and movements but were not Battery specific

However we can get an idea of what Howard did. Siege Batteries used heavy fixed guns to lay down destructive fire on strong points roads, railways and behind enemy lines. The range of the heaviest guns was four miles.

Howard's resting place is with many members of the Australian contingent, .it is likely therefore that he is with those who he supported in 1918

Courtesy of form 118A (list of effects) we know that his sister at the George Hotel, Bewdley received the following: letters, photographs, a broken knife, note book, watch (broken). collar badge and disc.

As always we are grateful to Howard for his part and although detail maybe lacking we know that he did what he had to do.

Thank you Howard.

The writer also applauds Howard's apparent disregard for dress code.

A CHANCE TO SAVE MONEY

Kit Smith outlines one of the benefits of Cleobury being a Smartwater town and part of the 'We Don't Buy Crime' campaign.

The community of Cleobury Mortimer have worked together to feel safer and to be safer.

Police report lower levels of crime in the town and higher levels in other towns and villages. Cleobury is being used as a model by other communities.

One insurance company so far has realised that their risk is reduced in Cleobury and have reduced their insurance premium by 15%

Smart Water: Cleobury Mortimer is the first town in the UK to be covered by Smart Water. 80 plus percent of households are now involved with over 20,000 items of value individually marked. The town has many notices of "We Don't Buy Crime", and houses have Smart Water window stickers. All police officers carry torches which can identify Smart Water marking on valuables, and so are able to link stolen property direct to individual homes and return them. This cost £15,000, raised from grants and gifts.

Closed Circuit TV (CCTV): 12 new high resolution cameras send images 24/7 to the Fire Station monitoring centre, which records the images, to be used during or after an incident. This is augmented by a network of private CCTV security cameras. Cost £20,000 funded by the Parish Council, Police Commissioner, Shropshire Housing Group and individuals.

Police presence: Despite national reduction in police footfall, especially in rural areas, Cleobury has managed to increase police presence by welcoming the mobile police station, encouraging police dog training in the town, exploring the potential for Special Constables and generally working closely and productively with the police.

Traffic. The Cleobury Crime Reduction Group is researching measures to reduce traffic issues in the town with new surveys and electronic speeding signage.

The local MP Philip Dunne along with the Police Commissioner John Campion have endorsed and encouraged the crime reduction work of the community.

The items above were sufficient on an individual basis for the NFU to reduce a premium due to reduced risk to the community and to them and their underwriters. It is suggested therefore that if you wish to apply to your insurance company for a premium reduction, you do so individually in your own words, and at the time of your annual renewal of home/household insurance.

Editor's Comment: This is another success for the community of Cleobury Mortimer. The work being done to protect the town and reduce crime can be used to reduce your household insurance cost, if your insurer is made aware of the facts.

They are unlikely to give you a reduction if you simply say that we are a Smartwater town, because few companies will know about this very effective deterrent. At this early stage it's up to individuals to explain the measures we have taken, but the Clarion will suggest that the Town Council prepares a simple leaflet that explains what we do, so that you can send it to your insurer and ask if they will co-operate in view of the reduced risk of a claim.

We'll keep you posted on progress with that idea. And if you do get a reduction in your insurance cost, please advise Town Clerk Matt Sheehan. We will also publish the names of cooperating insurers in the Clarion; so far the only company reported to have given a reduction is the National Farmers Union Insurance.

THE SWIFTS REPORT

Our swifts' breeding season here in Cleobury will be over at the end of the month and they will all fly the 5,000 miles back to Africa, hopefully to return next May. It is nearly impossible to count fast flying swifts in the sky as it proved at an evening gathering of swift watchers June 19th. However, we have identified and recorded seventeen successful nest sites mostly around the church but also at the far end of Lower Street and at the old Junior School. By taking two breeding adults per nest and adding some maturing juveniles and fledglings we believe we will have a departing population of 70 plus swifts of all ages. That information provides us with a base to judge in future years whether numbers are reducing or increasing year on year.

The Saint Mary's Youth Project group have put up eight new nest boxes on the church as future nest sites. It is really good to report that those boxes have been inspected by juvenile swifts this summer. We have high hopes that they will use at least some of them next year as they become mature breeding pairs. The camera in the swift nest and its images in the church

give us unclear information. It looks as if the pair using that nesting site are either immature or infertile. Next year we hope to have a few more cameras in nests, even in one of our new nest boxes. Please do enjoy our swifts' antics this month as they feed up their chicks and increase their evening displays of fast flying and apparent playing before they roost in their nests or at 10,000 feet. "Bon voyage" and hope to see you all next year.

There will be a post season meeting with a presentation in the autumn to review Cleobury Swift Watch's first year and plan for 2018.

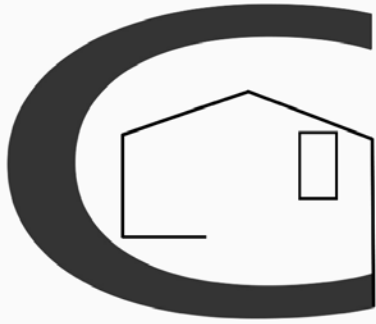

OUR VOICE IN SHREWSBURY

Members of the Breakfast Club assembled in the Cleobury Café on 13 June to hear Councillor Madge Shingleton talk about her work representing our area on Shropshire Council. Steering clear of the recent General Election, Madge moved quickly to the problems facing the new council, with 16 newly elected councillors and a new leader. Madge has real-life experience of running a small business, and managing a hospital casualty department (which produced some interesting reminiscences), so it is appropriate that she should sit on the council's Planning Committee, and be Vice-Chair of the Health & Adult Social Care Committee.

One problem that most, if not all, councils are facing is shortage of funds. Shropshire is no exception, and is in the difficult position of having few major industries, and thus having a small rate base. Also, being a large county with a small population makes it difficult to provide the services the public has come to expect. For instance, road quality and the distances involved make it impossible to meet desired ambulance response times. And, what about the 2L bus . . . ?

Mention of this infamous bus brought forth a more animated reaction from club members than anything else Madge said.

We were all encouraged to participate fully in the upcoming consultation which our Town Council will be launching later this year. This should be the best way to steer council activity towards meeting the needs of our community. This is the least we can do to back up our councillors – and aren't we fortunate to have a hard-working and experienced person like Madge to argue Cleobury's case on the Shropshire Council?

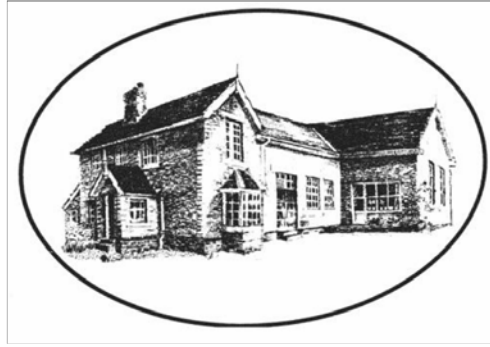

AFTERNOON TEA, WITH GREAT CARE

A Garden Party and Afternoon Tea in Tenbury Road does sound rather posh. But this one in June was organised by the Cleobury branch of the Carers' Support Group and friendliness and care was the order of the day.

The local branch is run by Wendy Duley and Janet Manley, two ladies with their feet firmly on the ground. The Party was in Janet's garden, the place dressed up for the occasion with banners and bunting. I asked Wendy if she'd sit and talk about the service, but she directed me to Sharon Malins. Sharon is a care advisor with Carers Trust 4 All, who liaises with Lisa Prince and Margarite Davies of People 2 People..

She has quite a task to deal with, backing support groups in Bishops Castle, Ludlow and Cleobury Mortimer. A bundle of smiling energy, always willing to call and chat to anyone who needs anything, from simple advice to help in caring for an aged or disabled relative. "I've called on everyone you can see here," she explained.

She'd also brought a box of produce from the Shrewsbury Food Hub. Food that had run past its supermarket sell-by date

just yesterday and was passed on the the Hub for distribution. It was at the party for guests to take a bag of what they needed or fancied and make a donation to the funds. Simples!

What Sharon and the team are organising is part of a county wide support network that helps carers whose work for their charges saves the country a great deal of money. If there is a shock domestic event that requires prompt help, there's an County Emergency Response Service that will act fast and at no cost; that is met by the County Council.

Sharon has been in the job eight months and she's made her mark. She identifies carers via local GP practices and other sources of local knowledge, then offers them support. You can contact her on 0333 323 1900 and be sure of a positive response.

So what attracted her to this job? "I was assistant manager in a care home and wanted a change from all the paperwork, more contact with people, so I took on this job," she smiles. "And I've enjoyed every day of it." It shows in her friendly approach and the way she sits and listens with the team as carers tell of their experiences. Friendly, but working out how to help.

Sharon is full of praise for local organisers Janet and Wendy. "Wendy's a physiotherapist and Janet has cared within her own family, so they understand what's needed."

We talked to Val and Graham Simpson, Val in recovery from a stroke and Graham full of praise for Wendy. "Before Val came home from hospital, I was asking about changes I saw and she was assuring me it was all quite normal." It's that assurance and continuing advice that makes carers such a vital part of a community that is seldom recognised beyond those whose experience knows how

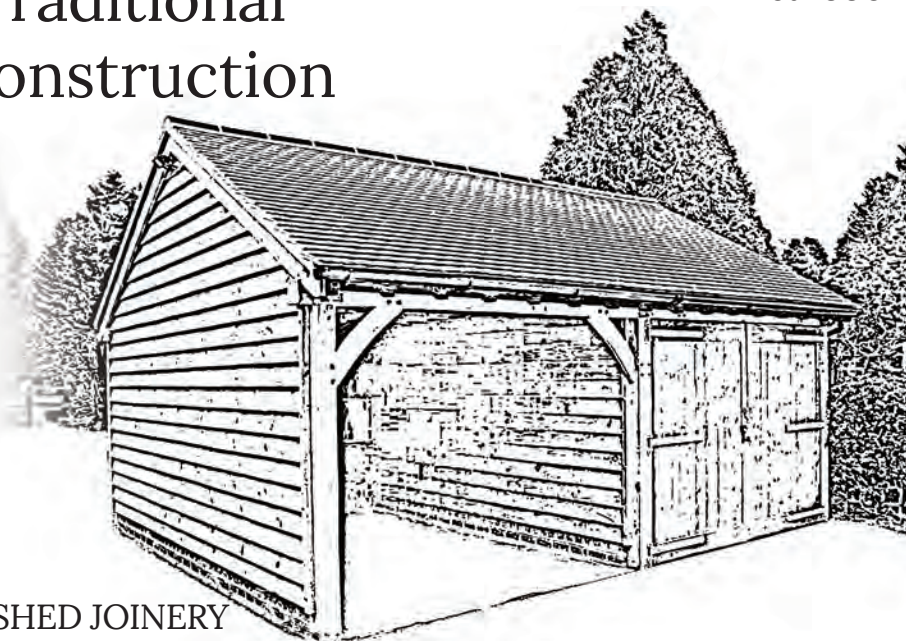
