JACKIE THE HEROINE

In the May edition of the Clarion we reported on Cleobury Mortimer resident Jackie Handy, embarking on the Camino de Santiago, a 500-mile walk across Spain. All to support Dementia UK and raise funds towards a specialist nurse for Shropshire.

Jackie returned recently after completing a total walk of 536 miles, starting in St Jean Pied de Port in France and finally ending at the Atlantic Ocean in Muxia, Spain. The Camino officially ends in Santiago de Compostela but after a rest day Jackie decided to continue walking the additional 86km over three days to reach the coast.

"What an incredible pilgrimage the Camino is" Jackie says, "I walked an average distance of 25 kilometres per day over 37 days over mountains, crossing rivers and over plains - all with a 8kg (16lb) rucksack on my back in 25 degree heat! If you'd have told me a year ago, I could do it, I wouldn't have believed you".



Jackie, whose mum lives with Dementia, remains committed to her fundraising even though her walk is complete. "People have been incredibly generous and donations have been received from all over the world so far."

With 20 classes for dogs entered to show off their good looks, agility or training, there's something of interest for every dog lover. CLEOBURY GARDENERS

Sorry not to be in contact last month; I ran out of height, airspeed and ideas, all at the same time. Carrying on the flying analogy, we are joining the world of social media and are pleased to announce the launch of our new website with t h e address cleoburygardeners.co.uk.. You can also find us on Facebook and Instagram. We hope to keep you updated with our failures and successes, so please look for us, and lots of "likes" please.

It's July, the half year mark, the end of one season and beginning of the next; time now to introduce the hardy annuals in response to the changing light levels; shortening days, but warmer (we hope) when we put out those plants that thrive in heat; e.g. dahlias, sunflowers, agapanthus, cannas; those big, beautiful, blowsy flowers of high summer.

My foxgloves have been stupendous, same for the clematis, poppies, irises and roses, but the easy maturity of the early summer planting is coming to an end and now is time to invest in those plants of early summer, their glory now spent. With a judicious pruning and cutting back, and a good feed, they may produce a late season show for you: lift irises and divide the rhizomes to make more, cut back the old stems and replant/pot so the rhizomes are surface-mounted and can bake in the sun; cut off the finished foxgloves and

simply lay them on the soil where you would like new ones to grow. I am told propagation of clematis by cuttings is very easy to accomplish. Give these early summer plants your attention now so they will return early next year.

Part of this backward look is the task of tidying up your borders. Clear away the old, vellowing and tatty foliage of the clumping perennials, e.g. alchemilla mollis, aquilegia, bergenia, lupins, hardy geraniums. Weed the exposed ground and feed, all the while looking for seedlings for free plants. I always have a number of pots prepared for these gifts.

If you were just breathing easy because your greenhouse and coldframe were looking empty, consider taking softwood cuttings. But that's another day. And there is always the deadheading!

Remember, live each day as though it is your last, but garden as though you will live forever.

Stepping Out! Who's Walking, When and Where.

The hay meadows around Cleobury this year are the most colourful I have seen. Among the different grasses are red campion, cow parsley, clover, sorrel and poppies. It is worth mentioning the stunning large swathe of poppies in the fields opposite the Blackstone Car Park near Bewdley.

The Country Walks continue through the Summer on the first Sunday of each month. Starting outside St Mary's Church at 10.00am, the four to five mile routes often follow one of the leafleted walks. Definitely worth setting aside a couple of hours to enjoy our local scenery.

The work party in June had a very full agenda. A new bridge was installed over a small stream flowing into the River Rea. It was securely anchored to the ground but also chained to a nearby tree to prevent it floating away when the river is in flood! They also put in a hand rail along a stretch of path that is very slippery after rain. During June there were a couple of clearance walks.

Several volunteers walked a three to four mile section of footpath clearing any weeds, brambles and nettles that had encroached into the path. The next work party is on Thursday July 13th. If you would like to join in, do make contact through our website.

I'm taking liberties with the title this month, since it's not about the forest itself but one of the other landscapes that interweave with the woodland to make up the character of the Wyre Forest as a whole.

Orchards used to be planted beside almost every farm and in every garden where there was enough room: people were much more selfsufficient in their food in those days. The Wyre Forest and Teme Valley became famous for cherry production when the Tenbury and Bewdley Railway branch line made it possible for perishable crops of fruit to be taken into Birmingham quickly, that is from 1864 until the line was closed in 1962. The old methods of tending standard trees, scaring off scavenging pigeons and thrushes and hand-picking using ladders became uneconomic thereafter and the majority of orchards were grubbed up (with government grants!) during the 1960s and the remainder of the twentieth century. The names of the cherry varieties grown at Hales Park Farm are remembered in the street names of the housing estate built in its place: Waterloo, Elton, White Heart, Ironsides and (misspelt) Governor Wood. Thus it was that traditional cherry orchards became a rarity which was only recognised as precious this century, thanks in part to research by members of the Wyre Forest Study Group into the wildlife living in the orchard at Bowcastle Farm, Bewdley, in 2004. That study found an astonishing 224 species of invertebrates and fungi dependant on the decaying wood of old fruit trees, the most imposing (and perhaps rarest) of them being the Noble Chafer. The photo by Rosemary Winnall shows one of these big, metallic green beetles feeding on an umbellifer – a rare sighting as the adult is short-lived, hatching in mid-summer from the grubs that spend two or three years eating the rotten wood of old apples, plums and cherries. I have never seen one and have to be

content with the tell-tale droppings or 'frass' left by the grubs in tree cavities.



On the other hand I do have frequent sightings of Redstarts - the cheery little birds that live and breed in our orchards in the summer - and can sometimes hear or catch sight of the Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, another rarity that manages to hold on in the Wyre orchards and oak woods.

The annual Bewdley **Cherry Fair** will be on 22nd and 23rd July this year. Bewdley Civic Society and Bewdley Museum will be organising various events including a guided walk to some of the remaining cherry orchards.

June's article mentioned butterflies and the work of the Butterfly Conservation charity to monitor them. There are two opportunities coming up for everyone to contribute to research into butterfly distribution and numbers: the **Big Butterfly Count** invites you to spend 15 minutes in any location between 14th July and 6th August recording what you see and the Garrden Butterfly Survey is a recording project for gardens, community spaces and allotments which can be continued throughout the year.

CLEOBURY'S ROYAL BRITISH LEGION

The British Legion was formed in 1921 and four years later was granted a Royal Charter. The aim was simple - provide support for all our fighting forces.

Cleobury Mortimer was quick to respond and formed our body in the same year the Legion was born. Today the Legion is a very powerful body, with about 200,000 UK members, just 57 of them here in our town. There are 375 Legion clubs, who run the social and fund raising side, donating their profits to causes like the Poppy Fund as well as support of all sorts for those who were wounded and still need care. The devotion to care is very simply put - from the moment you join the Legion until you go to meet your maker, they support our forces.

Our branch has a well known and successful programme of events. In March there's the Annual Luncheon in the club's well established venue, the Sports and Social Club. This attracts good speakers and like all big social events, the wider public are welcome to join the Legion regulars. You'll know about the Cleobury Festival in June

and in September the Harvest Festival Auction sees veteran Jim Hulme on the gavel and the mike, raising money for the charity side. In October it's the Poppy Concert in the Parish Hall as the serious business of raising funds for November's Remembrance Sunday gets into gear. If you want proof of their devotion to the caring cause, in the year of 2021/22 they raised £ £153.5 millions!

The Air Beneath My Wings not a rendition of the Bette Midler song but a talk about gliding by local expert Eddie Humphries. Eddie was a keen water skier but was warned by doctors that the continual physical impacts were having a detrimental effect on his body and he was advised to give up. By chance whilst out in Wales he saw a glider land nearby and the pilot suggested a 'taster' flight. From then on Eddie was hooked! He joined the Midland Gliding Club on Long Mynd, one of the oldest established clubs in the country, and spends six months a year there and six months in Cleobury. He pointed out that gliding isn't an expensive hobby; for instance he has a part share in a glider. A pilot's licence isn't required either but accreditation rules are imposed. After clocking up the hours and experience, he was invited to join a team to take part in the Euroglide race, a 2,500 mile round trip across Europe starting and finishing in Wasserkuppe Germany, the main centre for gliding in Europe. At one point during the race over East Germany they

had difficulty in finding somewhere suitable to land and eventually had to choose a less than ideal site which turned out to be an asparagus field. Locals called the police to report a 'plane crash'. A solitary high ranking police officer arrived on the scene and immediately got his car stuck in the soft earth. He was clearly agitated to find that instead of blood and body parts everywhere, there were two perfectly fit non-German speaking Englishmen. He was followed shortly by the local newspaper reporter who was similarly disappointed not to have a scoop on a gory drama, followed by the farmer who was happy to settle for a bottle of vodka by way of compensation. After much arm waving, shouting or shrugging and blank looks by the pilots, they were able to continue their flight. They didn't get a place on the podium but as Eddie told us, they really weren't bothered and had just enjoyed the experience enormously. 





This was preceded by the publication of his slightly reduced resignation honours list which, as expected, consists mainly of chums, cronies and party donors. What a disgrace but not a surprise I suppose. Those of you old enough to remember John Major as PM, may recall that he promised to change the system to reward those who had genuinely contributed to society rather than political allies and assorted 'businessmen'. That worked well then...Does this mean curtains for Boris' political career?. I wouldn't count on it although only seven MP's voted in his favour following the debate on his suspension. However, he is still popular amongst rank and file party members who have influence in the selection procedure. Some readers may remember reading in the April 'Clarion' that he was rumoured to be looking for a seat with a comfortabe majority somewhere rural such as South Shropshire.... Now that our Philip Dunne has announced that he is standing down at the next election, could we be in his sights?. I just hope that the local constituency party has enough sense to consign any such idea to the dustbin but if it should happen, you read it here first.

Given that a similar situation and language surrounds Trump at present, I wonder if he and Boris are twins separated at birth. There is the small matter of a 20 year age difference but who knows what genetic experimentation might have been at work. Remember all the Nazi scientists that vanished to South America after WW2... There are so many similarities from their hair to the extremely tenuous relationship with the truth they both possess. Donald is a little more orange but that could just be the light.

Still no news when we might get our Post Office back. We are told that a software upgrade broke the ancient computer and a



Still, despite the glacially slow process of paying compensation to the wronged Sub Postmasters - around 60 of whom have now died without receiving their entitlement there has been no delay in awarding senior Post Office chiefs substantial bonuses for having achieved set objectives (they hadn't). But don't worry, water bosses have reduced the period we will have to wait for a solution to only about 15 years. However we will be paying for it through higher bills.

"THE TOWN'S BEST KEPT SECRET"

An invitation to take lunch at the Golf Club sounded too good to miss. It's been a long time since I last enjoyed their hospitality and with new ownership and a new chef with ambitions, who could refuse?

My lady and I were expected by the dining room staff and were shown to a table in the ground floor room where Sunday lunches are now a feature. I opted for the Creamy Stilton Mushrooms on a crouton for my starter and Mushroom Stroganoff and Rice for the main. I'm not a vegetarian, but most of my English based family are and I've seen enough disappointment for them to know that getting veggie food right is not common; it would be a basic test of kitchen quality.

My lady took a Duck and Orange Pate to start with, followed by Roast Pork with Sage and Onion stuffing. Her verdict: "Absolutely lovely" and I could not argue with that. We both failed to finish the very generous main serving, simply because we were replete. The desserts looked very tempting, but beyond our appetites; we agreed the food was really good, the quantities more than we could manage. And the service was just right; careful attention without being obtrusive. It's also good value, with two courses for an adult costing £14.95 and three courses £17.95.

So this is the standard of catering at the Club. There was an obvious need to meet and learn more about Mike Fazackerley, the man in charge. Nine days later he found a space in his timetable.

He's a local, brought up just over the Worcestershire border at the Tally Ho pub in Broad Heath. Cooking was part of the way of life there and he's been doing for 35 years. No college stuff for him, he's proud to say he's self taught, though I suspect family influence got him started.

Since then he's worked in mass catering, then manufacturing with Wells' Drinks here and in Northampton. He spent time at a wholesaler in Birmingham before moving back here to his roots in 2001. "I like the place and it's great for the kids," he explains. "There's a lot of clubs and places for kids in Brum, but they're always busy. Here you get the same facilities, but fewer people trying to use them." He was working as a chef at the Pioneer Centre until the Golf Club job came up and

he moved a short distance along the road

"The Town's Best Kept Secret" is his phrase to describe the dining service. Sunday lunches were his idea and with the general public welcome to enjoy them he's making his mark. Not such a well kept secret is the breakfast service, serving 80 to 90 people a day. The Sunday lunches feature every two weeks at this early stage.

He's keen on using local services, where they measure up to his standards at a decent price. His aim? "A cracking product at the right price", which he is clearly achieving.

He currently has a staff of five in the kitchen and waiting on tables, with service at the bar to cover as well. He rates these busy and courteous people highly - they do smile and make you feel welcome.

So what's next on his plans? "Cream teas on the patio?" he asks with a grin; it's certainly a good place for such a summer treat. He balances the workload of his staff with recruitment and is happy to talk to anyone who would fit in with the team.

He's not boastful, not given to big promises without seeing the need to recruit and train where necessary. There's a large dining room upstairs that can cater for up to 100 people, but he's not looking there yet.

"It's great. The challenge is good and I think we're going in the right direction."

The man is clearly nobody's fool, down to earth in the manner the Club has established from its foundation 30 years ago. *Jim Reynolds*



Fraudsters stole £2,300 per minute from victims in 2002. UK Finance reports that victims lost a total of £1.2bn to scammers last year. The latest data shows the shocking extent of losses to unauthorised and authorised fraud.

Unauthorised fraud occurs when a scammer carries out transactions without your consent or authorisation – for example, if your bank card is stolen. Authorised fraud, or APP fraud, occurs when you're tricked into sending money to a criminal's account. It's crucial to be aware of how these scams work and take precautions to protect yourself.

It all starts with someone behind a powerful computer who has access to all social media formats such as Facebook, Twitter, What's App etc. Hacking into some of these accounts is so easy as people continue to use passwords that are easily broken. It is highly recommended that you use a password that is at least 8 characters and includes Upper case & lower-case characters as well as numbers and special characters. It can be hard to remember some passwords but there are methods of remembering them.

Our hacker will start with some basic info that has been obtained from you and start to build a profile. One popular method of obtaining information is called DATA MINING. Simply put, personal data can be bought over the internet through methods I won't disclose here, but be aware that the sort of data is that which comes from companies who offer loyalty cards, or collect your data through adverts or online purchases you may have made. The majority of online sales organisations are genuine and take steps to protect customer data, but even the best gets hacked and data is stolen.

When our scammers have enough data, they can create a fake profile of you and if they have managed to obtain bank details as well, you are in serious trouble. Fraud costs money, costs lives in extreme cases and you can do

a lot to protect yourself from becoming a victim.

If you Bank online, manage your account closely and look out for any transactions that you don't agree with. Guard your personal data closely. Use good strong passwords for any application that requires passwords to access. Use what is known as 2 Factor Authorisation. This usually involves having a verification code sent to your mobile phone. If someone hashacked you, they can't get this code and you

are less at risk. Also keep your mobile phone safe by using access passwords to open the phone.

As we approach the holiday season, fraud takes a new turn. The sun is shining, the temperature is rising and many peoples' thoughts will be working on holidays and all those tempting offers going around. At the same time the fraudsters will also be busy with new scams to unload onto the unsuspecting prospective holidaymaker.

Of last years £1.2bn lost, from May – August alone, more than £4.6m was on holiday fraud

It's not just older people that fall foul of the fraudster, victims in their 20's and 40's accounted for 44% of reported holiday fraud in 2022.

Top tips to avoid falling victim to holiday fraud

- Do your own research: Booking your trip via a company you haven't used before? Do some research to check they're legitimate. Read feedback from sources that you trust. Find a company's official website by searching for them on Google
- Look for the logo: Check whether the company is an ABTA Member. Look for the ABTA logo on the company's website. If you're booking a flight as part of a package holiday and want more information about ATOL protection, visit the ATOL or CAA website.
- Pay safe: Book your holiday with a credit card, if you have one. Most major credit card providers protect online purchases, and are obliged to refund you in certain circumstances. Using a credit card (rather than a debit card) also means that if your payment details are stolen, your main bank account won't be directly affected
- Secure your email: If your email is hacked, it could allow a criminal to access information about your holiday booking. Use 3 random words to create a strong password for your email that's different to all your otherpasswords. If you are offered 2 step verification to protect your email and social media accounts, always use it.







Police & Community Together (PACT).

We were pleased to host another Police and Community Together (PACT) meeting on Wednesday 14th June at the Parish Hall. There were representatives from the Police, Town Council, Neighbourhood Watch, and some residents present. Sgt Kate Oen informed the meeting that the work around a racially motivated event and anti-social issues from last year are ongoing but there has been a reduction in crime since then. It was noted there is some apathy from the public with reporting issues as there seems to be little feedback on any reports. Sgt Oen assured the meeting that all reports are noted but it is not always appropriate to give specific feedback due to ongoing investigations or intelligence gathering. There have been several staffing issues recently, but Sgt Oen is pleased to announce that PC Olly Jones is starting in early July and there will be a new PCSO starting soon too. People are encouraged to report all issues but also sign up to Neighbourhood Matters to receive regular updates from the local policing team too.

Councillor Surgery.

After our Councillor Surgeries were suspended in 2019 due to the Covid pandemic, we were pleased to hold our first surgery for over 3 years on Saturday 17th June 2023. Located in the entrance lobby of the Market Hall, we were pleased to welcome more than 10 local residents who raised concerns with Councillor Greaves, Councillor James and Councillor Buck. The main areas of concern were storm damage to trees, overgrown footpaths, overgrown graves in the cemetery, inconsiderate/illegal parking and the reliability of the post office. In total, 12 separate issues have been logged and passed to the Town Clerk for action.

After the success of this surgery, we plan to repeat these on the third Saturday of the month from 10.00-12.00pm at the Market Hall. If you have any issues to raise, please come along to meet with us at these surgeries or join our formal Town Council meetings on the first Monday of every month.

Boundary Commission's recommendations for Shropshire Council's divisions. Have your say....

The Local Government Boundary Commission wants to hear what residents and local organisations think about the proposals. A 10-week consultation on the proposals will run until 10 July 2023. The Commission is the independent body that draws these boundaries. It is reviewing Shropshire to make sure councillors will represent about the same number of electors, and that electoral division arrangements will help the council work effectively. It is proposing that there should be 72 divisions and 70 single member and two two-member divisions. Most divisions are changing. 
