QUALITY ACKNOWLEDGED

Shropshire Council Cleobury election result in Mortimer was a n acknowledgement of the work our established councillors have put in for the last period in office. Anyone who has followed events and developments should be aware that these two people have worked hard for the wider community, not just the town of Cleobury.

In case you didn't see the full results, they were:

Madge Shineton 1181 votes Gwilym Butler 1011 votes Maurice Alton 672 votes Peter Martin 452 votes

One very positive aspect of the poll was that the two newcomers, who seemed to have pinned much faith on support in one infamous shop window, were so soundly beaten. Anyone prepared to stand for such a big job as a Unitary Councillor deserves respect, but expecting winning support to come from that source was extremely naive and may have hinted at a lack of suitability for the job.

The Parish Council only had seven candidates willing to stand for office, so there was no election. The advantage in terms of simple cost is that there were no election expenses to meet, but a lack of people willing to give their time to the community does not bode well for the future of local democracy. Let us hope that the new council will be able to work together in harmony and get enough done to convince others that it is worth standing.

May I thank you all for the support and trust you have shown in me in the recent elections. I feel very honoured.

I will be holding surgeries every three months to give anyone an opportunity to come with problems or put points of view on Council matters. The first one will be in September; please look out for the date nearer the time.





Crumbed Fish with Garlic Mushrooms

Ingredients:

1 tbsp olive oil 3 garlic cloves, crushed 250g pack chestnut mushrooms, sliced Small bunch parsley, roughly chopped 4 x 140g/50z fish fillets, ie cod/haddock 1 thick slice white/brown bread, torn into pieces

50g/2oz cheddar, grated

Method:

- 1. heat the oil in an ovenproof frying pan, then fry the garlic and mushrooms for 5 mins, until softened, but not coloured. Throw in the parsley and mix together.
- Push the mixture to one side, place the fish in the pan, season, then spoon the mixture over the fish.
- Heat the grill to High. Remove the fish from the heat, sprinkle over the bread and cheese, then grill for 5 mins, until the fish flakes easily.

Great Day Out at Live The Adventure Centre Open Day

It was too good a chance to miss. We took our two oldest grand daughters to the Live The Adventure Open Day in Stottesdon. 13 year old May knew the facility from a Scouts camping weekend, but it was all new for eight year old Lily.

We walked around to see what was on offer. A lot happens in this place, from pony riding through canoeing to overhead wire descents from the trees. We watched a demonstration by the Riding for the Disabled charity, with three carers to each happy, smiling rider, some of them waving to the crowd and making the most of the moment.

Our younger charge fancied a ride, available pony Anthony Eddies-Davis gave a talk about what this place does, including adventure holidays in Nepal and Bhutan, plus training courses that include local services tutored in flood rescue. If you've been saved from an unwanted soaking recently, these people could be behind that.



We stopped to make friends with a ten week old spaniel, then back to the riding area, where I counted 17 mounts, a donkey, ponies and horses all available. Lily was looked after by Plum Wagstaff and fitted with a helmet before meeting Simon, a mild mannered pony.

A pony is small to a rider used to hunters and the like, but to an eight year old that saddle is a long way from the ground. Led out at walking pace, Lily looked very doubtful about the idea. But my words cannot express the difference between the start and finish of her first ride. Photos can:

About five minutes later she was back, Simon still walking calmly and his novice rider very much at ease:



Who said I was nervous?

That was a measure of the Adventure Centre, catering for anyone from nervous youngsters through to adventurous teenagers, all with a smile and calm assurance. Our two tried canoeing, a staff man watching and only moving to rescue them from being stuck on a bank. Archery called Lily, while her experienced big sister looked on and once again gentle help was available. All for free and the catering by resident chef Birch was excellent, but driving duties meant no Hobson's ale.

Star of the Small Ads - Natalie Taylor



Natalie Taylor, a local lady building a reputation for her caring touch.

Natalie Taylor was working in the care industry, where her quiet sincerity won her a lot of friends, and realised that there was a need for foot care amongst many of her clients. That sparked an idea and she looked into what she could do to train as a foot health practitioner.

The answer was a twelve month course at the Blackwell College of Foot Health Practitioners. She had to pay her way through the course, which meant keeping on part time work as a carer as she took on the double task of studying and paying her way. But it was worth it, and she completed her training and was awarded a

diploma to confirm her ability to do a job that is a combination of technical knowledge, careful treatment and the ability to listen and chat with people. Anyone who's worked in the caring professions will tell you that the quiet chat is an important part of any treatment.

The diploma is not a permanent gift and she has to provide proof of keeping her knowledge and skills up to date every year to keep it, by completing courses, taking exams and attending conferences. She's naturally CRB checked and has her own professional insurance, available through the college if her records show she's keeping up to date.

Natalie's business is basically mobile, with her mostly travelling to treat clients in their homes. She can give treatment in her own home, but the greatest demand is for her to call. That means driving up to 75 miles a day, with clients as far away from her Cleobury home as Ditton Priors.

The average treatment call takes about an hour: "Less if I'm giving somone regular attention. I do take time to listen, I don't rush them, I'm not just in and out again."

You can see why in two years in business she has built up a list of about 60 regular clients, with more people happy to welcome her into their homes as they hear how well she does a job that is vital for the less mobile.

She has a very honest approach to her work, and will readily explain that something beyond her skill should be treated by a specialist.

What does she recommend people do to keep their feet in good health? "Have them checked by a professional like me, wear sensible shoes, keep your nails trimmed and if you have diabetes you need to take extra care because you won't feel some problems until they've become serious." It's largely common sense, but for the elderly with reduced mobility, a call from Natalie can mean simple comfort restored.

"I like talking to people and a lot make me feel so good about what I do. Clients say I make a difference."

You can see why she's happy in her work and her long term ambition is to build the foot health business. She doesn't want to grow big and employ other specialists, prefering to keep the personal contact with people who trust her. "I'm happy doing what I'm doing", she says. "I know I do a good job." That diploma suggests it's true; her growing band of happy clients confirms that it is.

JOHN PETERS - A TRULY AMAZING SPEAKER

It was late in April when John Peters spoke to a roomful of people at Lacon Childe School. You would not recognise this smartly dressed man as the RAF Squadron Leader who appeared on our TV news screens in 1991, bruised and apparently beaten, reading from a script to 'confess' his role as a spy.

He was an electrifying speaker, moving between explanation of his role, his Tornado aircraft and the experience of low flying across the desert at about 50 feet. 16 metres if you prefer. No room for error when you're doing 500 or so mph at that height. The aircraft was hit by a missile and

crashed, John and his navigator fleeing and trying to hide in the desert; not easy in bright orange overalls designed to make rescue simple. They were beaten with rifle butts and taken to a camp where there were more beatings and torture for seven weeks.

All this he described in detail sometimes horrific, with occasional sidelines to make you laugh. He held his audience almost silent for about 45 minutes and emerged as a man with humility, most concerned that he had failed in his mission to bomb an enemy airfield. That's military training for you. He bears no grudges and has moved on to build a new career as a very powerful motivational speaker, in this instance at no charge because it was for the school. That humility showing through.

If you get a chance to hear this man speak, please grab it with both hands. It's more than an address, it's a theatrical performance of a very high order.





Letter from Westminster - Philip Dunne MP

Fair funding for schools in rural areas has been a key issue on which I have campaigned since I became your MP. In 2006 funding pressures on the Education Authority in Shropshire led to proposals to consider closing 22 of our schools. I argued that the formula used by the Department for Education to allocate funding to schools across the country had been distorted away from rural authorities towards metropolitan.

Shropshire and neighbouring counties were amongst the ten lowest funded education authorities out of 150 in England and Wales. The formula had become so complicated that around the same time the government decided rather than review it, to freeze the formula and increase it each year by a simple percentage. I set up a campaigning group of MPs in Parliament to argue for fairer funding for public services in rural areas. This was an uphill struggle as the population clearly lives predominantly in urban areas and therefore there are many more MPs representing cities and large towns than rural shires.

The coalition government was formed in the depths of the severe financial crisis, so securing more funding to address the imbalances across the country was not possible. School funding was however fortunately ring-fenced from spending cuts. For a year until last September I was the departmental whip to the Department for Education, during which time several initiatives were undertaken to improve allocation of scarce resources. The most significant of these has been introduction of the Pupil Premium, which is being steadily increased to £900 per pupil now for those eligible on Free School Meals.

Using Free School Meals as the determinant of this extra financial resource for each school is not ideal for rural areas, since there is widely assumed to be reluctance to apply for free meals in rural areas than urban. So I have encouraged local residents in Shropshire who might be eligible to apply, and encouraged our schools to ensure their parent bodies are aware of the help the school receives from the Pupil Premium and how it is allocated.

Fundamental overhaul of the school funding formula was thought not possible to reconcile with the public spending cuts required during the current four year spending review period. A one year spending review is now under way for the financial year 2015/16 and the results are due to be published this month. School funding is again expected to be ring-fenced from cuts. I am not expecting a formula review will form part of this exercise, so we shall have to await the next four year spending review after the next election for fundamental reform.

This has not stopped me keeping up the pressure for a fairer deal for our schools. I met the Schools Funding Minister last month to press the case for fairer rural funding, not least to reflect the extra costs of providing education in sparsely populated areas. Smaller schools, greater distances between them, smaller class numbers and/or mixed year groups, all of these impacts of sparse populations lead to a patchwork of primary schools which are expensive to operate compared with larger schools in the rest of the country. These cost pressures compounded for schools with a reputation for offering the best for children with special needs. I received a sympathetic ear from the Minister and am hopeful that some progress towards fairer funding for schools will be made in this parliament. I shall certainly keep on pressing the case for Shropshire schools. Philip Dunne MP

Clarion Coppers - CSO Nick Morris

It's a pleasure to be able to report that in two years there has been a reduction of crime in the whole of West Mercia of 13%. For the same period in the Cleobury Local Policing Area the figure is a 36% reduction. However, it's never a pleasure to report any crime, regardless of the low figures. The relevant ones that I can report are as follows:

On March 1st a set of metal stepladders were stolen from a porch in Milson. On March 17th/18th two Stihl chainsaws were stolen from a porch to a farmhouse in Neen Sollars. Seven quad bikes worth a total of £16000 were stolen from an insecure barn at Prescott between early evening on March 23rd and mid morning the next day. They were all untaxed and not insured for road use. The keys were still in the ignitions! On March 26th a garage at Neen Sollars was broken into and several power tools stolen including three chainsaws, a petrol mower, an electric drill and a router. In Billingsley between 4:00pm on April 15th and 9:00am the next morning there was a theft of parts from various items of plant such as a JCB digger, a paver, a road roller etc., amounting to thousands of pounds. It was discovered on May 7th that three chained up bicycles had been stolen from a shed inside a barn at a farm a couple of miles out of Cleobury towards Bridgnorth. The last time they had been seen was just before last Christmas. Worth noting is that three burglars from the Wolverhampton/Dudley area were caught in the act and arrested at the scene recently in Cleobury North. Police were called by an alert resident on hearing the alarm sounding and the neighbour's

car engine running. The occupants of the house were on holiday at the time. These criminals had already burgled another house nearby.

Good news also is that a man from Martley in Worcestershire, not our area but perhaps it may serve as a warning to criminals, who had been jailed for two years for having a cannabis factory at his home, has been ordered to pay £35,000 under the Proceeds of Crime Act.

Doubtless you have heard the news of a gang in Wellington jailed for abduction and serious sexual abuse of vulnerable teenage girls. Without wishing to scare anyone, it is worth bringing to your attention an incident which occurred in Cleobury recently. A 16 year old girl, whilst walking by herself around 7:30pm one evening in the Pinkham area, was called to by the driver of a white van. He asked if she, "wanted to come in his car" and called her, "beautiful". The girl declined his offer and walked on. Her description of the driver, which is that he appeared to be of Asian origin and wearing a turban, would indicate that he is not immediately local to Cleobury. No offences occurred here but we may wonder what might have happened if she had got into the vehicle. I'm sure that most parents advise their children wisely regarding interaction with strangers, but at risk of being boring it's preferable to remind them regularly about the dangers. Also, of course, young children should never be allowed to roam alone however safe a neighbourhood seems to be, - probably unecessary remark, but it does happen! CSO Nick Morris

The Farming Page - John and Catherine Evans

May started with a bang and it was a real treat to have a sunny Bank Holiday. One person who made the most of the spring weather was the DEFRA inspector who spent the weekend exploring every nook and cranny of the farm checking our Higher Level Stewardship claim. The majority of farms receive funding from the EU via either the (ELS) or Higher Entry Level Level Stewardship (HLS) Scheme. These encourage farmers to care for the environment and protect wildlife rather than concentrating on food production and points are awarded based on the steps taken to achieve these aims. To qualify for the Scheme farmers must manage their hedgerows, only cutting every two or three years; plant bird covers such as cereals mixed with other plants to encourage native birds; mixed farming practices such as varied crops and stock; leaving stubble over the winter as habitat for birds; minimising use of fertilisers and chemicals on grassland and the return to long term pastures. The more undertaken the more points awarded and once a certain total is reached farmers move to the Higher Level Scheme.

The recent spell of dry weather means we have just about caught up with the planting, the last crop to be planted is maize, some of which is planted under plastic to speed up the growing process, although as different varieties are developed this is less popular as it is an expensive option. Maize is used as a cattle feed, being turned into silage – the crop

is harvested before the corn cobs are fully ripe and covered in plastic to mature, it is then fed to the cattle through the winter months (it smells disgusting!!).

As soon as the weather warms up shearing will start, this is very labour intensive and back breaking work – only for the young and fit! All the adult sheep are shorn to help them keep cool and prevent maggots. All the fleeces are sent to the Wool Marketing Board who pay a fixed price based on the quality of the wool, half on receipt and half 12 months later! At the moment the wool price covers the cost of shearing, which hasn't always been the case in the past!

Haymaking is the last job before harvest so a settled spell of dry weather is needed. Fields of grass are mown on a dry day, then left for several days to dry in the sun, after tedding (turning and spinning of the grass to help dry it) the dried grass is rowed up into rows ready for baling. These days much of the hay is made into large round or rectangular bales which are easy to move mechanically and store undercover ready to feed to the stock in the winter months. Smaller bales are popular with hobby farmers and for horses as they are easier to manhandle but very labour intensive in terms of production – small bales come out of the baler in groups of 8, collected in a specially designed sledge, these blocks of 8 can then be stacked using a grab and loaded onto trailers. The bales are then manually unloaded into the barn. John and Catherine



THE ROAD TO SUCCESS...



June in the Wyre Forest - Linda Iles writes

On our warmer days I've been watching the bees. Having vowed to buy only garden plants that are beneficial to wildlife this year, it's been good to see my aubretias and wallflowers alive with all kinds of insects seeking their nectar, but the real action on sunny days seems to be going on in the house walls! Mason bees have been busy installing their offspring in tunnels in the crumbly mortar, laying single eggs in cells with their own pollen/nectar food supply. Mason bees, leaf-cutter bees, mining bees, honey bees, cuckoo bees, carder bees, bumble bees and bees with no common name (only Latin, poor things): there are over one hundred species around us. I would love to meet Osmia bicolour, a relative of the

mason bee, who builds her nest in an old snail shell! I'm sure I'll be told that we don't get them round here.

Our other house guests include bats: particularly pipistrelles and soprano pipistrelles. They get under the roof tiles and into the tiniest crevices between timbers and stones to roost, though at this time of the year mothers will be giving birth in maternity roosts. Dusk is a good time to watch for their feeding flights along woodland edges and clearings. A couple of years ago when we were keeping pigs in the woods it became evident that the bats were taking advantage of the situation. It worked like this: pigs eat the brambles; pigs leave poo; dung beetles eat the poo; bats fly over the pig-grazed areas hunting the dung beetles. Oh yes, and we eat the pigs.

This year various groups of visitors to Uncllys Farm have helped to make bat boxes, which will be wired up in oak trees on the edges of the fields. They will provide safe havens for the bats and allow numbers to be monitored. We also have boxes

for redstarts and flycatchers in the orchard but have had to temporarily cover the holes to stop them all being taken by blue and great tits before the summer visitors arrive. This month we'll see if this stratagem works!

THE CLIB DEFIB

There's a significant extra safety measure available on the town's main street. It's a defibrillator that is available for any emergency from the King's Arms. If someone has a heart attack, the defib is there and can even be used by an untrained operator. It is a potential lifesaver.

Big thanks go to Betsy Pratt (still the Neighbourhood Watch organiser, despite her escape attempts) and Sandra Cole of St John Ambulance. Sandra did a demonstration at an NHW event and she and Betsy agreed that to have one available for emergencies is what the town needs. And now, thanks to these two excellent ladies, we have one. Thanks also to the Parish Council and St John Ambulance, who provided the finance.

St John Ambulance have a very convincing statistic: 300,000 people a year have a cardiac attack outside hospital and only a third of them make it to hospital and a good chance of recovery. For every minute without access to a defib, a heart attack victim's chances survival r educe by ten percent. And we now have the means of saving people available in the KA, which is open from morning until late evening - that's why it was chosen as the place to keep it.

St Iohn **Ambulance** reommended this model, that you switch on and it gives you clear instructions what to do. To make survival chances even Cleobury old better, good Country are offering a three hour training course. No date set yet, but talk to Sam at CM 272300 so she can get an idea of support for the course and if it

would be viable. The cost will be about £55.00 plus VAT; that's a very affordable way to save a life - or for someone to save yours.

So Cleobury does it again and leads the way in really valuable facilities available to all. Great stuff! Thanks to everyone who's made this possible.

PETER COWIN

Everyone who met him will remember Peter Cowin with affection. A dapper man with moustache that hinted at his fighter pilot history, combined with gentle charm and impeccable manners.

He was more widely known for his book 'Half Wing to Full Wing' that told of his career with the RAF. From a navigator with half a set of wings on his badge, to become a Spitfire pilot with a complete set adorning his cap.

He wrote the book in his late 80s, and warmly acknowleged the help of friends in the area who helped him. He promised that if it made a profit the proceeds would be donated to charity. It soon sold out, but he could not be convinced to take on a second print run; perhaps he realised that many friends had given time they could not afford twice.

He lived in Cleobury Mortimer until failing health made a move to an RAF approved facility in Cheltenham more practical. He lived there happily, if a little muddled as the years took their toll. He died on May 16th, aged 94. A lovely man, he will be much missed by all who knew him and our sympathies go to his son, Tim.

A SPECIAL ADDITION TO THE LIBRARY

An interesting addition to the local reference section of the library is a work in three folders on local wild flowers. The folders list over 200 varieties that can be found within the area, with a page devoted to each plant. There are also confirmed photographs of the flowers together with information on where and when you can find them, alternate names where these exist and the purposes for which they have been used in the past.

With rare exceptions, the plants listed can be seen either from a public right of way or in open country. For this and other reasons, the work does not claim to be a survey of all the flowers in the area but is intended to be a useful guide to people, particularly walkers, interested in their local environment.

The work to compile these folders took a good five years of walking the local tracks and footpaths. As the compiler says, it is not yet - and probably never will be - complete, since the local flora continues to change both in range and density as the years pass, some plants disappearing whilst others thrive and spread. So space has been allowed for you to suggest additions or changes so that the work can be updated as necessary.

DOG FOULING - POSITIVE ACTION TO CONTROL THE HAZARD

There is a cooperative move by Cleobury's Parish Council and the Unitary Council's 'Streetscene' unit to combat the nuisance and health threat of dog fouling. 

IN BUSINESS: The Female Fixers

The advert appeared in last month's Clarion and there was an immediate reaction at home. There was a kitchen recently replastered that needed to be painted. "I'm going to book them before anyone else gets there," declared my wife. With a head start, we wouldn't have a long wait. One phone call later the Female Fixers were on the doorstep.

They explained that they'd got together because they shared an interest in manual work as a relief from the regular jobs. Lisa Cotgrave works in the IT industry after a successful spell selling advertising, while Lindsay Wilson is a professional photographer, a graduate from Sheffield University's unique

press training course. Both very capable professionals, so why the wish to fit in a second job?

"I was restoring old houses, listed buildings that needed very careful attention, so decided to learn about the work I would be overseeing," explained Lindsay. "It grew from there, because I was doing the painting myself and enjoying getting the detail work right."

Much the same for Lisa, whose speciality is plastering and tiling. She finds a weekend exercising those skills is a complete break from the predictable disciplines of business. Two compatible people who don't meet over the normal working days, then swap tales and share jobs in a friendly weekend atmosphere.

They looked at our problem, Lisa admiring the plastering Adrian Booton had done, and asked for the room to be cleared of the domestic stuff that accumulates in any real world kitchen. They could come on Friday and work through the weekend, if that was OK? Yes please.

By 9.00 o'clock on Friday morning they were in action, washing and rubbing down the walls, then putting a filler coat on the ceiling before two coats of the Dulux Lindsay recommends for its quality and covering power. I offered to get them tea, but they preferred to make their own as it fitted in with the work. Lunch took just half an hour and the whole day was free of the blaring Radio Noisy that seems to come as part of the package with some tradesmen.

They worked beyond 5.00 on Friday and were back at 8.30 on Saturday morning. It was the same routine, as the ceiling got three coats of paint and the walls two, working side by side as Lisa applied the roller and Lindsay concentrated on getting good cover in all the corners and a straight line along the top of the wall, where the colour coat contrasted with the white.
