### THE CLARION KEEPS ON GROWING

Then Gwilliam Butler explained that they didn't put any on the counter, because all 130 were reserved. At Simply Fresh it was almost the same; they had 100 a month and only a handful to hand out. So they will both be getting 20 extra copies each month, which we hope will keep more customers happy. A heart felt 'thank you' to our readers who created such a demand, to all our contributors and to all our distributors.

Zac Williams has realised a schoolboy's dream. He's been signed up as a trainee for Wolverhampton Wanderers on a two year contract after a trial with the club.

Not many 14 year olds get such a big chance as this, and it means a lot of work, keeping his school studies up to date and training at the club's Compton facility from 8.30 to 5.30 on Tuesdays, plus two hours on Wednesdays and Saturdays mornings. Then on Sunday he'll be playing in matches. The aim is to earn a Football Scholarship when he's 16 and then move on to full time education at Thomas Telford College with the club's backing.

It's a tough schedule for a 14 year old, but he's a quietly determined young man with no flash or shouting. He was in a group of Under 14s who travelled to Germany recently to play in a tournament that involved 15 teams. They finished 11th and dad Dean is quick to point out that they won three and only lost three other games by a single goal.



### A NEW APPROACH TO CARE

CM Bespoke Care is a new name on the local scene, the creation of two people's concern that care for loved ones should be nurse led and not hampered by hours of paperwork.

Sarah Thomas is the public face who will be responsible for the basic business of caring. She has 20 years experience in nursing, starting in a home, then graduating with a nursing degree and working in care from acute hospitals to local homes. Always with patient care her top priority, but finding the

demands of bureaucracy getting in the way: "I was working a five day week and only spending two half days actually looking after patients," she explains.

Talking to Claire Gittens in her family Heath Farm Meats shop in Bagginswood, she found someone with similar views. Claire had cared for her mother until she went into a home, where she felt the time given was not enough. Not the staff's fault; they too were dealing with paperwork more than people.

The result is a cooperation between nursing and experience with the paperwork burden passed to the backroom lady. It's taken close to nine months to get the business fully recognised and registered with the Care Quality Commission, but it now exists and is recruiting staff and care qualified nurses who want to give their skills to the patient, not to pen pushing.

The range of services they can offer is very wide, catering for adult care at all levels, 24 hours a day if necessary. Too much to list here in detail, but Sarah has a clear capacity for listening to what people want and will tell you more. She also wants to

### TRUST WORKS

It's a bit of a mouthful, The Shropshire Gateway Educational Trust. But it brings a group of our local schools together to offer a better deal for the children.

At the centre is Lacon Childe School, with Cleobury Primary, Clee Hill Community Academy Stottesdon Church and of England School, plus the Cleobury Clee Hill and nurseries. Everyone within those schools now works for the Trust, and there's a regular exchange of information and ideas between them. As Lacon Childe head teacher Darren Reynolds puts it: "We're using our talent to better effect."

It's a Mixed Multi Academy Trust and is unusual in having a C of E Primary within its ranks, with the blessing of the Diocese. "The Church saw the benefits of our local schools looking after local children being involved in the Trust," Mr Reynolds explains. The alternative would mean a long journey if they were to attend a Church Academy for their secondary education.

A good example of how well its work is teachers from the primary level coming to Lacon Childe to talk to their ex pupils and see how they progress.

This Trust is smaller than most and has no ambition to grow beyond its local connection. That reflects Darren Reynolds' determination to keep in close touch with his staff and pupils. "The day I have to stop teaching spend the day paperwork is the day I leave," he states. "I love teaching and I work with three brilliant heads brilliant and business manager."

For a man who heads up a trust that employs 180 staff, it's a very strong feet-on-the-ground attitude, but he doesn't lose sight of the operation's aim: to raise the standard of teaching on offer in the local area. "We have

more buying power and we can share resources and skills. We're not about counting numbers, it's about how well the kids are doing. All the schools are rated Good or Outstanding by Ofsted."

There are five mini buses on the Lacon Childe vehicle fleet, bringing children in beyond the traditional catchment area, offering parental choice of secondary the education wider community.

The Academy status has made money available for capital funding, which has meant a leaking roof repaired, windows replaced and other building work done that the County could not afford.

With 180 staff employed and the possibility of other local primary schools joining in the future, Darren has a big job. He smiles: "Yes, it's my name above the door - but it's exciting."

Our vet, Daniel Nicholls, talks more here about the method and the extraordinary benefits it can bring to the recovery process of your pet

Key-hole (Laparoscopic) surgery is something that was barely on my radar at university. It was always something that was discussed as possible but not really normal practice. So, when I started at Severn Edge, key-hole surgery wasn't something I had seen much of or have much experience with. It's only since being here I have seen an array of operations that have been done using key-hole methods. My eyes have most definitely been opened to the possibilities.

Key-hole surgery isn't something new in human medicine but it's only in the last decade or so that it has emerged in the veterinary world. It can be used for a variety of operations that were previously done by more invasive methods, often opening the animal up (laparotomy) in the traditional method giving you total access to the abdomen.

Why bother with this new stuff? Well the benefits are mainly seen in the recovery of the animal post operation. Having abdominal surgery for example is a very painful experience and although we try our best to alleviate that pain using medications, often the discomfort from the surgery is there regardless. Key-hole surgery means that instead of a large hole required to access the cavity, a couple of small holes are

used instead. This means there is a lot less trauma to the skin and muscle layers so therefore much less pain and less time needing to be rested. This all means your animal gets back to normal life quicker than ever before.

There are variety of situations and surgical procedures that key-hole is suitable for. At the moment the routine surgery we are doing at Severn Edge is a keyhole ovariectomy (spay). However, we are now using the technique more and more for other things such as taking liver biopsies for patients with liver disease that needs investigating and removing retained testicles (cryptorchid) in male dogs.

In my time seeing and performing key-hole operations, I have already seen the dramatic improvement in recovery times and pain experienced post operatively. I am excited to see what we can use the technique for next, so that we can constantly progress and improve our patient's quality of care.

The Friends are working well with the Cleobury Country staff who have been trained in the business of running our library. That does not make any of them qualified librarians but they are there to help with enquiries and book borrowing, and do show a very positive attitude to some of the ideas we put forward.

The first of these is the establishment of а Local Authors section, which will mean one shelf at this early stage, but we hope it will grow as we try to help local writers publicise and maybe sell their books. It's a simple idea: we write a review of a book and the author donates a copy to the library for you to read and see for yourself how appealing the work is.

The first book is Neil Burns' "Haunted by Neil Armstrong", from JocknDoris Publishers. Neil lives in Kinlet and this is the third book in a series that

reflect his belief in ghosts. Meet him and you realise that he's a down-to-earth mature man with a twinkle in his eye and a good way of telling a tale, so if he's seen a ghost or two, who's going to argue with him?

This book is built around his early career as a chartered accountant and travelling around the world for his company, including a stop in America and playing in a team golf tournament that they won. The others in the team were military men, one called Neil. But Neil Burns had to leave next day, so didn't take up the prize, which was a round of golf at the fabulous Mauna Kea.

In August 2012 Neil Armstrong died and Burns was getting messages to go back to America and take up that prize round he'd missed long ago. He packed his bags and went, where he says he met the ghost of Neil Armstrong, who admitted that the 1969 moon landing was in fact a hoax. Believe it or not, it makes an intriguing tale that he tells with modesty and a lot of amusing asides. Pick up his book in the library and decide for yourself.

Another project at a very early stage is putting on a

display of some of the Simon Evans memorabilia which the special weekend we had last year produced. We have to talk to the owners, not all of whom will want to lend what can be very precious mementoes to them, but we will do our best and keep you posted on progress in a later Clarion.

### HISTORIC PARISH RECORDS AVAILABLE

Cleobury Parish Council have bought copies of John Barnes's careful detailing of local Parish Council records around the turn of the last century. Now in the town library are the records for Cleobury itself and surrounding parishes, some 18 books in all.

You will also find single parish records in churches in Neen Sollars, Hopton Wafers and Doddington.

As John himself modestly puts it: "They should be quite a valuable resource for anyone researching their family history."

All there, carefully recorded, for you to examine free of charge. Some seven years of John's work, all done as an intellectual exercise and for the benefit of local people.

Tom and Mavis moved into Cleobury in the 1970s, taking on a small cottage in Lower Street that has grown into a sizeable house with the quality of work and fittings for which he became famous. They were both a vital part of the Cleobury Players until Mavis's sad death, since when Tom has been a producer, set builder, lighting technician, you name it and he could do it.

His building work was renowned for its quality, and when he built John and Valerie Cope's retirement cottage, John was amazed to see the oak beam over the fireplace being shaped with an adze. A call to the hospital delayed the return, Tom's crew were here soon after 8.00 to get the blockage cleared and the place cleaned and disinfected.

Tom admits to being in his 70s and slowing down a little. He has earned the right to do that and to start a new, less urgent life in Wales. Happy days, Tom, and thank you for so much.

### Letter from Westminster -Philip Dunne MP

On 23rd June the British people will decide whether Britain remains or leaves the European Union. The campaign has dominated the political scene for months, as this is an historic choice for our country. Even those wearied by the claims and counter-claims of each side should reflect that the referendum will be a positive day for our democracy, the people rather than politicians having the final say on our future in Europe.

I encourage all constituents to register to vote 7th June deadline at <a href="www.gov.uk/register-to-vote">www.gov.uk/register-to-vote</a>. Whatever the outcome, a high turnout will settle our relationship with the EU for generations. Our children and grandchildren will be most affected by this decision. Many know how they will vote, evident from the public meetings I have attended so far; many others have yet to make up their mind. I have been asked why I believe that the stronger, safer option for Britain and the Ludlow Constituency, is to remain within the Union. Some readers may have seen my thoughts on this topic before, but given the significance of the vote, I write again with my reasons for supporting Remain.

There are many elements of the EU that can be improved. But the risks of leaving, known and unknown, offer a far from perfect scenario for Britain's future. My decision came down to a judgement call, based on my own experience.

Last month, two Ludlow Constituency businesses were recognised with Queen's Awards for Enterprise due to their thriving exports. (See Page 13 - Ed.) Access to the single market is vital to enable UK businesses to export, creating more jobs. Our economy and the jobs that go with it, depend on trade, and the EU is our largest

trading partner. So we will need to negotiate access to the EU if we vote to Leave. There is no evidence that this will be on as good terms as we enjoy now. France and Germany have indicated that it will not. A vote to Leave would be a leap into the dark, undermining jobs here.

I have visited many countries and companies around the world. There is a consistent message – they all want Britain to remain within the EU. They see us as the gateway to the single market, and invest here because of it. This creates jobs, and brings in revenue to pay for public services. As a Defence Minister I have insight into the role the EU plays in our security. NATO remains the cornerstone of defence, but the EU is increasingly important in complementing our security. Britain in EU provides an effective buffer, with an enduring veto against creation of an 'EU Army'. If we leave, this would risk duplicating NATO structures, undermining its effectiveness.

Shropshire's economy is deeply affected by the health of farming – 86% of the land area supports agriculture. Leaving the EU would risk the future of farm subsidies and European export markets, potentially this vital local industry. The National Farmers Union recently decided to support Remain, as did a clear majority of the farmers who attended the local branch NFU meeting I addressed in April.

But this decision will be made by the British public and my vote will count the same as any other. I encourage all residents in the Ludlow Constituency to use their vote and have their say in this referendum.

Paul French and Toby Kirkby are new faces on the Parish Council, each of them making their mark with effective work. We talked to them about their motivation, vision of the future and asked if they enjoy the job.

They both come from families with an active community background. Toby's mother is a Chamberlain, with Birmingham Lord Mayor Joseph and British Prime Minister Neville in the family tree; public service is almost an inbred habit with him.

Paul French's mother was born in London's East End and worked her way up to become a very active District Councillor. So the habit's in his blood as well.

Toby came to Cleobury as a child, his father the maintenance engineer at what is now the Pioneer Centre. The man himself has done a variety of jobs, including training as a cabinet maker before, as he puts it "I decided I wanted to do something more than work for the gold watch." He and a partner started Hope Farm in Derby, where they with voung offenders referred to them by Social Services or the church. From there he went back into industry and developed the first electrically operated loft ladder; it's still in production, which tells you how good it is. Today he's self employed as a Health and Safety assessor, which means fairly flexible working hours and availability for council work.

Paul has lived in the town for close to 30 years and recently retired from the steel industry after 39 years. He's seen some changes, starting out with British Steel, which became Corus and then Tata before the recent morphing back to British Steel.

Both of them were co-opted to when vacancies council appeared, going through quite a demanding interview. They both offered their services as a way of putting something back into the community, Paul after he'd worked on the Parish Plan and wanted to be more involved. "One of the best decisions of my adult life, you definitely get out what you put in," he says. Toby could see the need for a businesslike approach and change: "I'm trying to wheedle out the hobby approach," as he puts it.

They both recognise that this is no easy picnic they've taken on, as the town's own council takes on more responsibilities. Paul: "We're going to have to pedal harder to keep up progress next year, and more so later." Toby: "With the demands that will come we've got to hit the ground running if we want to keep up. I'm up for it."

Is this all about the cutbacks we are seeing at all levels, with less money available from the County as they get less from central government? "Yes. We've no clear idea of what's coming," explains Paul. "But we do know we're going to get less."

It's to their credit that neither of them sees this as a reason to get out of a hot seat that is clearly not going to get cooler.

"We're managing the cutting of the grass now, why not mend the roads?" He describes the tortuous process of mending a pothole he recently watched, with four men doing one process and then standing back while another handled the next stage. His logic is that one well motivated and trained man could do the lot.

He cites the working example of Roger Potter, recruited because of his experience and on the spot when needed. "Look at the way he looks after the cemetery and other areas," says Toby. "Does it promptly, at a lower cost for a better job. We should be looking at doing more town maintenance and training people for the long term." Paul agrees: "There are always people out there who want a job." It's good logic - keep jobs local and don't bring in expensive contractors.

They've both seen progress in the way the town is run, the SmartWater and We Don't Buy Crime campaign a good example of what can be done. Toby is overseeing the scheme to instal proper CCTV in the town - at a much lower cost than the current inadequate and expensive service. Paul grasped the nettle of the town's Christmas lights that impressed so many last December, with more efficiencies to come. These two don't just sit and talk, they get out there and get it done.

So who impresses them in their work? Council clerk Matt Sheehan was the obvious choice of them both, so who else would they pick "Paul out? Toby: for his communication chairman and for bringing business Sean knowledge to the job." Paul: "The way the chair and vice chair back each other, even if they don't always agree."

Such optimism is a good sign from two men with experience and intelligence to offer, both of them willing to give time and effort for other people. It's what makes this place work so well.

The Ludlow roadworks appear to have finished – at least there do not seem to have been any more problems in that area. We risked a trip into Ludlow the other day and were on time both ways although the tortured sounds coming from the gearbox climbing Hopton Bank on the way there made us wonder whether we might end up pushing. One of the new timetable holders on the bus stops in Cleobury has vanished and the other is empty so that went well.... Our stocks of timetables are also running low and I have been offered more but in the past such offers haven't resulted in any deliveries.

Regular breakdowns continue to be a feature of the route. One pupil hoping to get to Ludlow College spent two and a half hours on the top of Clee Hill which wouldn't be too bad if you didn't have to get anywhere and it was a nice day so you could savour the view. As this isn't normally the situation, it's just inconvenient. There are also tales of groups of passengers standing by the roadside on Long Bank awaiting rescue. Some friends were recently returning from a holiday abroad and said they only realised they were truly back home when they were coming through Blakedown and spotted a Diamond bus broken down....

More drama in Kidderminster as a Diamond bus (not a 2L apparently) was seen somewhat crumpled in the middle of the road with an ambulance and Police cars in attendance. Apparently it had hit the back of a taxi carrying a woman and two children. The taxi driver was taken to hospital and the passengers treated at the for minor injuries. Diamond scene 'investigating' apparently. And as I was writing this column, news reached me of yet another Diamond bus broken down in the middle of the road by Kiddy Hospital causing traffic chaos. Still, at least medical help would be close at hand for any stress related illness which resulted.



### June In The Wyre Forest

### Linda Iles

By now most of the Wyre Forest butterflies will be on the wing. The 'cabbage white' you saw in the garden may be more interesting than you suppose. It will actually be a Small White or Large White, but if you saw it at a flowery road verge it would be more likely to be a female Orange Tip and only if you were really lucky and saw your butterfly along a woodland ride would it be a Wood White.



The commonest butterfly in the fields of Uncllys is the Meadow Brown (pictured) – each brown fore wing with one orange-circled eye spot, unlike the two eye spots on both fore and hind wings of the Ringlet. The Meadow Brown loves open grassland and woodland rides, and is one of the species you will be able to see along the Elan Valley pipeline which crosses the forest. The disused railway line is another good spot to see butterflies and other nectar-loving insects.

Meanwhile I found this in the Readers Digest Field Guide to Butterflies, "The word butterfly was probably first used to describe the buttercoloured Brimstone. It is a common species and is probably the first and last butterfly seen each year, as it can be in flight from February to November. 'Butterfly' eventually came to include all species and Brimstone acquired its present name which relates to the colour of sulphur." In fact you probably won't see this butterfly in June as the individuals which hibernated will have reproduced and died, and the young will only reach adulthood in late July.

If you have some young Homo sapiens in your care then you may like to bring them along to **Toddler WildPlay** at the Forestry Commission's Callow Hill centre on the first Wednesday of the month (1st June) from 10am to 11.30am or Fridays both in the morning and afternoon. 'Breath of fresh air' run these sessions for pre-school children and their carers, and promise to include plenty of fun in the woods as well as a warm drink and snack. During school holidays there may be longer sessions to include a camp fire, and older siblings will be welcome. And of course, you know what happens on 23rd June, don't you? As nature lovers I hope your referendum vote will take account of the impetus that the EU gives to pollution control, carbon reduction and wildlife conservation. Farmers and other land managers get a lot of help from EU to help wildlife and look after the beauty of the landscape: in our case that includes replanting orchards, maintaining wildflower meadows by grazing and running educational events and training in countryside management skills. "Narrow Road to the Deep North" by Richard Flanagan, is a novel set in Australia, Japan and on the Burma Death Railway. It is an examination of what it is to be a good man and a bad man in the one flesh. Starting with his old age, the stages of the life, loves and problems of the main character, Dorrigo Evans are interwoven with other interesting characters. After the fall of Singapore, Dorrigo being colonel and surgeon, finds himself the acknowledged leader of the Australian prisoners in the POW camp. This section of narrative is appallingly graphic, telling of savagery, death and survival. Though disturbing, it deserves reading as the human spirit shown was amazing. Much research has obviously taken place, in fact the author's father worked on the Burma railway. An excellent book, well crafted, well written, harrowing but not too depressing. We recommend, would though possibly not to anyone with experience of that time.



### THE FOUNTAIN FUN RUNNERS

The first preconceived notion fell over when we met in the Sports and Social Club and there were these people in track suits supping their ciders and lagers. Then they explained they'd just had a short run of about four miles and felt thirsty; as you would. They do this for fun, and the regular Thursday night run ends at the Club and gets sociable. So none of that deadly serious stuff here.

I talked to Vicky Hulme, who started running in 2012 "Because I wanted to get fitter and healthier." She's done that with a vengeance and to date has run 40 marathons since her first in June 2014. She aimed to do that before her 40th birthday - she looks ten years younger, so this running is clearly good for you - and plans to do 100. How many miles a week, Vicky? "15 to 20, but it's about 40 if I'm doing another marathon."

Chris Preece has been running a long time, starting as part of his training routine for boxing. He was good, rising to be West Midlands Welterweight champion and runner-up in the wider Midlands contest. Today he finds the social side of running is good - boxing training tends to be a lone effort. His stamina is high, contesting events like the Shropshire Mud Run, which is ten kilometres across wet countryside with assault course obstacles to deal with. His best time to date is 41 very busy minutes.

Sheila Dwerryhouse is the mature presence, persuaded to try running by club mate Ceri Little. Sheila was a very active horsewoman in eventing and racing, still riding for pleasure but also keeping fit enough to run the marathon; that's 26.2 miles. Her time for the distance is about four and a half hours. "Not very good," she says modestly. "But no matter what you're doing, it's better than sitting on the sofa, watching TV."



Dawn Lloyd was running her first half marathon in May, Sheila has done a few. Both smile at the idea.

Dawn Lloyd is the newest recruit to talk. She started running in April last year, on the "Couch to 5KM" scheme that took eight weeks and inspired her to move on. "It gives you the belief that you can do it," she explained. "I'm doing a half marathon in Chester next week. I went into Kidderminster recently and it suddenly occurred to me that I could run there!"

Charlotte Hewer is super competitive. Played rugby for 14 years, up to Championship One level: "We were five points short of the Premiership in the final game," then swapped running four years ago. She's done two London Marathons, with best time of 3 hours and 51 minutes, and has tried a half Iron Man competition, moving up to do a full version another half this year. The full one means a 2.4 mile swim, a 112 mile cycle ride and the 26.2 marathon run at the end. All within the maximum allowance of 17 hours. And all for fun!

Many, many years ago I had a girlfriend who liked to wear a lot of perfume. Sadly she didn't have a very sophisticated sense and insisted on buying the cheapest variety that Woolworths had to offer. the result was an odour closer to what you'd find in an air freshener than on an attractive lady. The romance didn't last.

Rhian Gurney knows what I mean. She produces a range of delicate odours under her Magpie Hill Soap title, all hand mixed and made in the kitchen up at Watshill on Clee Hill. It's a skill she learned from her mother and initially she made it just for herself and to share with friends. They liked it so much

they told her she should be selling something this good. And here it is, available at the Farmers' Market every month.

I tried the intriguing Eucalyptus and Spearmint at first. And liked it so much that I bought three bars in May and can tell you that Sandalwood and Cedarwood is just as pleasant. It's not cheap, but goodness me it is good.

She offers nine different scents, all made with essential oils except the Chocolate (!) that comes from cocoa powder. All the colourings are natural and even the water is a good quality - genuine Wenlock Springs. She also offers an extra pure baby soap, which the man on the next stall told me he'd tried and it cleared up his psoriasis. The Honey and Oatmeal uses only Shropshire honey, too.

Rhian is a member of the Guild of Craft Soaps and Toiletries and all her soaps have been tested and passed the European Soap and Cosmetic Suppliers Assessment. Which may sound like another example of bureaucracy invented to make life more complicated, but in fact it makes sure that any soap carrying the label is made to a really high standard. Talk to Rhian about the ingredients that are used in some those soap

dispensers that are so popular and you're in for a bit of a shock. Nothing that you could call dreadful, but in no way sympathetic to the need to avoid pollution of the planet.

Magpie Hill production is limited, about a dozen bars in each batch, which then takes four weeks to cure. It must be a very crowded kitchen up at Watshill on occasions. At this stage it's a hobby that has grown, but when Rhian's youngest child is at school she can see the operation growing. Right now she only does the Cleobury market, but will spread her wings further as the business develops.

She's very particular about the use of materials that are kind to Mother Earth and the packaging is compostable. Ask if she's happy giving so much time and effort to this hobby and her smile breaks out: "I love it! It's so much fun."

Building work is in Chris Stokes' blood. His granddad and dad both worked in the business and when Chris left Lacon Childe School one of the first things he did was a bricklaying course. A sure sign that he knew what he wanted to do and was going to succeed in it.

He's been self employed for at least ten years, building up a reputation for a job well done, of his work most coming through repeat jobs and customer recommendations. His advert says Roofing Building, but there's very little that he can't do and do well. "I touch electrics plumbing," he explains. Those specialist areas he hands over to known and trusted local people.

It's a measure of his standards that he gets a lot of work putting right what others have done badly. And the cowboys don't always do the job on the cheap; he can tell of one character who took a £30,000 deposit to build an extension that the building inspector said had to come down and start again. The man has't been back to attend to the matter yet. "They could have come to me. I'd have given them a price for the job and done it properly from the start," he says with a shrug.

\malt house. Today it's two lovely holiday flats and ground floor storage.


He employs two men full time and calls in others as work builds up. Dad is available and keeps his hand in when Chris needs his skills, and there are two uncles who add to the family atmosphere when necessary. The strength of this line-up is that he knows every man working on a scheme, and can trust them to do the job right.

His work is concentrated in the South Shropshire area, with lots of it coming from Craven Arms. But with his reputation for quality jobs he does get to travel quite a bit. Like installing prebuilt pods for an Oswestry company in London. These are assembled and trimmed out in the factory, then delivered to site ready to be installed.

One of these pods was a test of his thinking, built to sit on the flat roof of a three-storey house. "Got a big crane in and had the street closed for an hour," he says. "That cost £1000." But in the crowded capital it saves time and hassle.

He's an approved installer for the ingenious Firestone rubber sheeting that makes flat roofs a practical proposition. The rubber comes as one big sheet -"The size goes up to 30 metres by 15," he explains. It needs care and skill to handle such a job, but the roof comes with a 20 year warranty from Firestone and the current life expectation of the rubber is about 50 years.

He works long hours. "Five or six days a week, seven if we're really pushed." But he tries to keep Sundays for the family and watching his very sporting children developing their skills at football and gymnastics. Will you let your sons come into the trade, we asked? "If they want to." That would make four



Market update:

The property market has seen a marked increase in activity since the beginning of the year. Various unrelated events such as elections, referendums, Stamp Duty Land Tax changes etc inevitably have an impact however it is fair to say that there has been an increase in properties coming to the market, viewings and sales.

That said, it is still a challenging time and the heady days of 2007 are unlikely to return to our region for many years, however we are seeing properties achieve realistic prices and a number of agents are seeing levels of interest not seen for nearly a decade.

Traditionally the market peaks in Spring and Autumn, however there is a constant stream of both sellers and buyers getting in touch which can only bode well for the year to come. Confidence, despite the uncertainty of the referendum, will hopefully continue.

The average asking price for England and Wales jumped a further 0.8% since May with stock of levels edging up further, but

still 10.6% less than in May last year. There are still low levels of quality stock which benefits the seller so now is the time to seek advice if you are considering selling.

At the time of writing, there are just 100 properties for sale in the whole of DY14 with an average asking price of £389,811.

### What is the value of a good agent?


