CLEOBURY ELECTION - LITTLE CHANGE

The local elections in May saw no great change, with Madge Shineton and Gwilym Butler returned as our Shropshire Councillors. Good to see new blood challenging and good to see a well proven pairing still in place to give continuity.

With only seven candidates standing, there was no Parish Council election, Andy Goold the only new face. Betty Davies, Mike Reiner and Jack opted not to stand for re-election. At their first meeting, the council opted to become known as the Town Council and we cover that in this issue on Page 57.

In neighbouring Neen Savage of refusal the remaining councillors to co-opt replacements for the four who resigned some years ago excited with resistance, the opposed by seven new faces. All seven were elected, the old incumbents recording very low voting levels. A lesson learned about upsetting the electorate? One can only hope so.

No man who has the possibility of a sniper's bullet in that situation deserves to be stabbed in the back.

We should just be glad that British justice has properly defended him. And that the town's reputation will no longer be damaged by unnecessarily offensive notices in any shop window. *IR*

Ian and Janet Ludford have lived here in Cleobury for two years now, and as if to celebrate that residency they staged a concert for two cellos at the Parish Hall on April 9th, where they performed as the 'Ludford Duo'. They are more than capable of doing so, and brought delights the marvellous music to a most appreciative audience.

For 39 years Ian was a mainstay of the world renowned City of Birmingham Symphony Orchestra and played with that orchestra around the world and under the baton of the most celebrated conductors. After periods playing with Sadler's Wells Royal Ballet and the BBC Midlands Radio Orchestra. Ianet's career absorbed demands of motherhood by freelancing. This led her not only to play with a dazzling array of the world's orchestral talent, but also expanding her repertoire accompanying such luminaries as Chris de Burgh, Manilow and Roger Daltrey. She also toured with shows like Les Miserables, My Fair Lady and the Sound of Music, latterly returning perform with the Birmingham Royal Ballet.

With such accomplished performers in our midst we settled down on a surprisingly warm and sunny afternoon and bathed in musical pleasure. This was a classical concert; pieces composed by Haydn, Bartok, Offenbach and Boccherini filled the air. There were lighter works too: Albeniz's Suite Espanole, originally composed for solo guitar, was rearranged by Janet for two cellos and was sublime. Aaron Minsky's 'American Duets' folded classical and popular themes together to create a humorous brew that brought smiles of recognition to many lips. The afternoon concluded with the familiar and well-loved strains of Paganini's 'the Pearl Fishers'.

Thank you, the Ludford Duo, for blessing this community with such wonderful music. Let us all hope they do so again . . . soon!

THE TALBOT IS BACK

Stewart and Diane Seery, mine hosts at The Talbot Hotel.

It's one of the dominant buildings on the town's main street. Its black-and-white traditional frontage makes it stand out from the rest, a true landmark.

The recent change of ownership, with South Coast Inns taking the place over and giving it a total refurbishment reflects a big commitment. That's a good thing for the town, a stand-out hostelry back in business with all the detail work done properly. We've seen the all eight of rooms, them properly en suite and immaculate. It's a credit to the town.

Neat little touches highlight the building's history, like a patch of the wattle and daub internal wall, protected now by a plastic screen so you can see but not touch. There has been a shortage of accommodation in the town, but with eight twin- or double-bedded rooms in the Talbot that problem is solved.

Hosts Stewart and Diane Seery have moved up from rural Somerset, happy to be in a small and friendly community.

The restaurant is going to be a feature, its decor warm and welcoming in a traditional style with a variety of old and new pictures brightening the wall.

The place gives off an air of quality, but the prices look down to earth. A welcome return for what used to be the best pub in town, which Stewart says is him aim for the place.

EARLY RISER GAVIN

Gavin Athwol is the new owner of what we'd just got used to calling Butler's Store before Gwilym sold it. But it's still the local Londis franchise, a handy early morning stop for those on their way to work.

This man is an early riser, up before 4.30 to drive over from Shifnal and open up at 6.00. The store has the best selection of greetings cards in town, a range of stationery, food and drink and a cash machine. It's a very busy place, the biggest outlet for the monthly Clarion, with something close to 130 names of

people who've reserved a copy. You can see why the editor likes the place.

So, having opened up at 6.00, how late would Gavin be staying, we asked. "Tonight I'll be here until 8.00, but I have a good staff and it's not always as long a day as that." Just don't mention the Working Time Directive to him.

"I'd like to say a big 'Thank You' to the local people, they've really made me feel at home," he added as we left him to deal with more customers.

He's certainly proved to be very cooperative with local people, and Clee Hill historian Alf Jenkins was very happy when Dr Mark **Baldwin** suggested that he offer his popular tapes and books to the Londis store when his own bookshop operation closed. Alf was given a warm welcome and you can find a selection of his works available, handily next door to what used to be Baldwin's Book Shop.

Errol Dyer is best known for the office he ran in Church Street, offering insurance and financial services. Real down-to-earth stuff, with not a hint of the musical and artistic talents deep within the man.

"I was a keyboard player and left home in India when I was 18, to play a job in Aden. Moved on to London from there and played with all sorts of groups and people. Two years ago he took up painting: "I was bored, needed something new to do. I fancied painting, so read up about it and bought materials. I found You Tube really useful for information and help, there are lots of films showing you how to do things."

He chose to work with acrylics on canvas, applying them with a pallet knife after learning that technique through You Tube. You begin to see that outlet in a different light after talking to this energetic man who seems to still have a great thirst for life and learning. His success as a novice artist came as a surprise.

He's sold other pictures and is still developing techniques. Like the artist who paints directly onto steel, letting that element shine through as a highlight. Errol gets a similar effect with kitchen foil.



BROWN CLEE MEMORIAL SERVICE

There is a little known but very touching tradition acted out on Brown Clee every summer. It's a memorial service for aircrew lost on that slope during the 1939-45 World War.

The 23 lives lost on that hill are not all RAF personnel. During the war a German Junkers, an American Mustang and Typhoon all made some error of navigation and paid dearly for it. More recently, a Jet Provost crashed in January 1969 and the two crew men perished. The list is a solemn reminder that flying in those distant days was far from an exact process, not to mention that when times were really bad pilots hardly out of training were being sent up.

On the 22nd of this month the ceremony will be repeated. As is customary, there will be a lunch at noon in the Boyne Arms in Burwarton before a convoy heads up the hill, with the consent of the landowner, and standards will be lowered as lost men are remembered.

It is an open ceremony, which all who are concerned may attend. It is expected to start at about 2.00, but timing in this instance is not precise.

Recently new powers were granted to PCSO's by the DVLA. This enables PCSO's to seize untaxed vehicles on a public highway. We used this new power for the first time in Cleobury and had an untaxed vehicle recovered from Childe Road. In the upcoming weeks and months we will be actively seeking to use this power and recover any vehicles found to have no tax. If you are not currently using your vehicle you must apply for a Statutory Off Road Notice and store the vehicle off the public highway or face it not being there when you return.

It's the time of year when we see an increase in garden crime. Shed breaks are common and because sheds are not generally designed for safe storage, it is advised that valuable equipment is not stored in them. If there is no alternative storage place, then fit a closed shackle padlock to the door. Fittings should be bolted through the door, and screws concealed. Fit grilles or mesh to any windows and fit an alarm. Secure valuable items inside the shed by chaining them together or lock them to a secure fixture. Any items stored in a garage would be safer if they were secured in the same way, so that if a thief breaks in they would be difficult to take away. It seems obvious, but never leave an insecure shed or garage. It only takes an opportunist thief seconds to enter and take items. Fortunately there have not been any incidents of this

reported recently.

Car crime in the area is on the rise, though some of this appears to be accidental. There have been incidents of car wing mirrors colliding in the high street causing damage to both parties. If you discover damage to your vehicle and you are unsure of how this occurred please contact us via the 101 service.

Finally a bit of feedback concerning the "We don't buy crime" initiative in Cleobury. Since the distribution of Smartwater around the town, Cleobury's scheme has been recreated with success in several communities across the West Mercia force area. I am informed by Mick Simpson from "We don't buy crime" that to date since the project started there hasn't been a domestic burglary in Cleobury. This was the first project of this kind in the country and thanks to the support of both the townspeople and the town council, hopefully it will continue to deter would be criminals.

We continue to engage with the local crime reduction group, Parish council and other organisations within Cleobury. If there are any events or meetings you would like us to attend please inform us and we will do our best.



On The Buses Steve Todd

Still no news yet from Shropshire Council about the result of their Bus Strategy or negotiations regarding a replacement operator for the 2L route. It now seems that the current contract with Diamond runs until the end of 2017 so this may explain the lack of response from Worcestershire. The recent election will also have delayed things as responsibilities may change and any new postholders will need time to get up to speed.

More news on Diamond's £600,000 investment in contactless ticket machines which was due to be implemented on 23rd April 'Across the whole of the West Midlands and Worcestershire' There is no mention of Shropshire and we haven't used the bus since then so I don't know whether it happened. What they have said is that the associated tracking device will give real time information to passengers about the location of their bus which they can access via the app using their mobile phones.

However, the evidence tends to indicate otherwise as the other day, the early bus from Kiddy failed to appear and after 40 minutes waiting, Diamond were contacted to ask where it was. They replied that it had 'left 10 minutes late'. Obviously not was the response as by this time it was nearly an hour adrift. 'Oh, in that case, it left 20 minutes late' Clearly not correct so what does the tracking device 'Rolled out on 23rd April' show? 'Don't know as that bus hasn't got one but the next one will be on time'. I wonder when it is installed whether the system will show not only the location of the vehicle but why it has broken down. It could also incorporate heat sensors so that the Fire Service can be alerted immediately if the vehicle is ablaze...

The usual run of breakdowns continues, dead buses being sighted in various locations including down by the Fire Station in a pool of water (which was apt), on Hopton Bank, Clee Hill and on the outskirts of Kiddy where one service ground to a halt, being unable to manage an incline. The driver said that the passengers weighed too much so they all got off and the vehicle started to move. It was then suggested to the driver that when he got to the top of the hill, he could pick them back up and carry on. He replied that now he had got moving, he wasn't going to stop again... Cue a wait for the next service.

There was also a letter to the 'Shuttle' about yet another service delayed by multiple breakdowns which incensed one passenger so much that when he finally got off, he picked up a stone and hurled it at the bus. Whilst not condoning violence, you can understand his feelings... Another Ludlow bound service was apparently stuck in first gear and although you might think that all Diamond buses are like that, this was even slower, having to stop several times to allow the engine to cool. It did get there eventually though.

Even when stationary, Diamond can still cause problems. The other day, the 'Cleobury only' service was parked opposite the Co-op and decided to pull off as a minibus came past and a car was coming out of Childe Road. Fortunately, no contact was made but apparently it was a close run thing. Perhaps the driver hadn't been on the 'mirror, signal, manoeuvre' course.

Diamond's problems are not just confined to the 2L. Until recently, they were used as a subcontractor by a larger company for trips the latter didn't really want to do. This arrangement has now been terminated due to the unreliable service that Diamond provided.



THE MURDER AT DUDLICK MILL

Cluedo may never seem the same again. Come along to the next talk in the Cleobury Mortimer Lectures, at 7.30pm on June 15th in the church, and hear members of the History Society present the evidence in a gruesome murder. There was blood all over the mill, with bloody hand- and footprints amid signs of a vicious struggle. First one charged, then person was another. But neither went to trial and the case was never solved, the involvement of despite Sotland Yard. Contemporary newspaper reports from all over the country, inquest records and the original Scotland Yard files provide the drama in fascinating case.

Swallows seem to have arrived early this year, the first being spotted on March 31st. I hope to see swifts too: a bigger bird with long, swept back wings suitable for a bird that spends nearly all its life on the wing. Their screaming calls will always evoke summer for me, and earn them the local name 'Jacky squealers'. They like to nest in old buildings, if they can find any these days that aren't renovated and wildlife-proof. I've heard that a group in Cleobury Mortimer are making efforts to protect and encourage swifts in and around the town. Members of the national Swifts Local Network, they share information on sightings and swift conservation, like offering design advice for architects and builders or instructions for building wooden swift boxes to attach to houses. They also give advice to anyone finding birds grounded.

Thank goodness for people like these who really care about the natural world. Official policies and designations can only do so much, and the efforts of those who notice and do what's needed to save the wild and beautiful things around us from destruction are so important. One such is Hannah Bewdley, who feeds underweight from hedgehogs so they survive through the winter. This spring she has been finding homes for her protegees around the Lakes estate. Their needs are fairly simple: some untidy bits of garden in which to forage for invertebrates, ways through the garden boundaries so that they can find enough food and meet a mate, and a bit of consideration so that they don't end their lives on the end of a garden fork, in a bonfire or at the end of a strimmer. Have a look at www.hedgehogstreet.org for lots of information on what you can do in 'your patch' to help them and also www.theguardian.com/environment/2017/mar/01/hedgehog-apocalypse-extinction-britain-favourite-mammal for a discussion about the complex reasons for their decline.

We belong to an increasingly urban society and need opportunities to get out of our built environment and into the countryside. Open Farm Sunday is on June 11th: an occasion when we will welcome people to participate in guided walks around Uncllys Farm (signed from The Hop Pole) and its surrounding woodland at 10am and 2pm. There will be activities for children along the way and a chance to buy some tea and cake (and maybe some home-reared beef and apple juice) afterwards. The walk will last about two hours and you will need to be ready for uneven and possibly muddy terrain. I'm afraid you won't be able to bring your dog.

THE SWIFT WATCH

Cleobury Swifts have arrived a day early. Flying over 5,000 miles from Africa, our Swifts arrived with us on Friday May. 5th. Starting with five that day; by mid May numbers have reached approximately 22. There will hopefully be more to arrive by the end of the month. Last year there were a total of 27. However, it is difficult to count black silhouettes in the sky as they race around at 60 mph.

Within two hours of arrival the first swifts were claiming their nest sites in the church eaves as Saint Mary's Youth Project found out when we fitted cameras in and around their last year's nests. The images of activity in and around the nests are transmitted to a screen in the church. We hope to be able to improve the positioning of the small cameras to get a better view of their nesting activity but it is difficult and we will be able to do better next year.

Up to ten new nest boxes made by SMYP are being put up under the eaves of the church for next year's occupancy.

There is a map of Cleobury in the church so please do add

findings of Swifts, your Swallows and House Martins nest sites in the town. Also add your comments, notes and research with Post It Notes next to the TV screen in the church. We need to build a full picture of sites and numbers of all three species. Please help us and our migrating birds. There will be a Swift Watch evening 9.00pm at the Church on Monday June 19th to watch the swift's pre roost 60mph fly past. If you want an occasional newsletter please leave your email address on the notice board.



Paul French adds to his stories about local men in the 1914 -18 Great War,

I am grateful to Rifleman Percy Herbert Jones first and foremost for his service in the conflict of the Great War but also as a reminder of the fact that pieces written at the front and letters sent from the front enlighten us to how important these documents are as records of feelings, observations and comments from those involved.

Percy aged one is recorded in the 1891 census living in a house which is now Mumfords ironmongers in Cleobury Mortimer. When he enlisted his residence was given as Westminster and in the 1911 census he is twenty one , single and working for Marshal and Snelgrove ,Oxford Street London as a drapers assistant. I wonder what he thought of the change of pace?

He served as a Rifleman in the London Regiment, entered the war on the 25th January 1915 and was killed on the 19th April 1915 on his 26th birthday. He is buried in Armentieres France. He is also recorded on the Cleobury War Memorial and also on a splendid plaque in St Marys church.

The following piece was written by Percy and is called "Practice on Parade" it is both accurate, ironic and a fine example of observation and comment. This is the piece in full.

"We parade in our "front line" and take "enemy trenches" several times a day. Excellent practice, could anything be simpler? It is a fine sight to see 4000 men advancing as if on parade and capturing in half an hour a model of the enemy trenches at Gommecourt. The country chosen is quite different from that of Gommecourt Wood and I honestly believe that the practical value is nil"

There are many pieces of writing like this that stand alone as observation and commentary but there are also the letters written at the front. These very often are a mixture of comment, observation and chat with loved ones and friends. These days it would probably be via a digital medium but the need to be in contact, to tell someone what goes on in your life, to tell someone they are in your thoughts never changes.

The following extracts are from letters sent by the staff of the Great Western Railway Audit office at Paddington to their colleagues and friends.

Serving in the Dardanelles

Please remember me to all fellows who are left in the office. Mr Miller and Goff and Hills and George Williams, and all the boys generally. I can't write to all separately, also for details of my experiences you must wait until I get back, if ever I do, of which sometimes I despair.

Recovering from wounds

Well old chap, I am glad I am wounded to get out of that hell, and if you ever meet a chap that says he wants to go back call him a liar.

Trenches... being under fire

This show had been occupied by the Germs and then by the French from whom we took over. The filth and stench was too awful for words, one of our batteries striking rather unlucky in coming across Germs buried just under the surface when they started digging their guns in. The air was blue for miles...

The need to share experiences, to communicate in times of stress , anxiety or just to say hello or I love you are common to mankind.

This is just a tiny sample from the period. If you wish to read more, try searching on "Letters from the First World War".



IN BUSINESS - Noah's Ark Small Animal Boarding

"We encourage people to come and look around. One lady came in and said she was surprised there was no smell. There shouldn't be if you look after the place properly."

Maureen takes a great deal of of the animals care she welcomes to the boarding she and husband Mike have developed on the slopes of Clee Hill. In 18 months since the business was launched they've built up a very impressive pets hotel and a reputation to match. Customers coming from as far as Liverpool and Coventry hint at the quality of the place.

They've lived here for about ten years and it was when Maureen retired from working with disabled people in Birmingham that Noah's Ark started. A friend was running a similar business and gave advice, while Maureen's long love of animals was the clincher.

They have one and a half acres of garden, with a variety of pens for both animal guests and their own chickens; beyond the hedge are their five sheep, happily grazing. These outside units are part of the accommodation range, with animals moved back under cover in the converted garage overnight. The range of facilities there is impressive.



Your hosts at Noah's Ark, Maureen and Mike. Rosie the chicken is not a member of staff, just a pet.

The hutches in the boarding room were made after Maureen had consulted a number of local vets about the best size and style. They all have a separate ares for the pets to sleep and there are toys and climbing facilities to give them exercise.

According to the type of animal, the floor is cover with either a vetbed or washable rug, the latter changed every day when the animal is in an outside hutch and Maureen is cleaning down with Anigene disinfectant, as approved by vets. "The washing machine's always on the go," she admits with a smile. Hygiene extends to all guest

rabbits needing a certified VHD and Myxomatosis injection.

There is a separate kitchen within the boarding room area, used only to prepare the animals' food. Normally owners provide the dry food for their pets, so that they have their known diet, while Noah's Ark provide fruit and vegetables.

They're very proud of the large outside hutch they found for sale by a retired couple who had used it to accommodate their Bengal cats. Mike has adapted it to provide feed for birds, or it will house animals, with ladders to reach the sleeping area and a variety of toys to keep the animals amused. The same rule applies to all the outside hutches - there are animal toys in every one.

It's a small animal and bird hotel, and that includes ferrets and even a corn snake due in the week after we called. The most unusual guest so far is a degu, a rare desert rat.

Will the place change and grow? "I don't want it to get any bigger," explains Maureen. "I feel it's just right as it is." Visit the place and you'd find it hard to argue with that.

Long term plans? "I'll carry on as long as I can," says Maureen. "I just love it."

STATEMENT FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL

Change of name from Cleobury Mortimer Parish Council to Cleobury Mortimer Town Council

In recent years, we have seen many changes to Cleobury Mortimer. We have grown as a community and our Parish Council has had to diversify and change to accommodate roles and functions that were previously undertaken by the old District Council and Unitary Council.

Cleobury Mortimer has had a Market Charter since 1226, and thus our status as a town has been longstanding. Many of our near neighbours have Town Council status, such as Tenbury and Ludlow.

We have had many helpful discussions and taken advice from the Rev. Justin Parker culminating in the following motion that was put forward, and agreed unanimously, at the May 2017 Council meeting:

"Pursuant to section 245 Local Government Act 1972 IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that the parish of Cleobury Mortimer shall have the status of a town effective as and from the 8th day of May 2017 and in furtherance thereof the name and style of this council shall on that date be the Town Council of Cleobury Mortimer"

Many of our surrounding small parishes view Cleobury Mortimer as a 'hub' town, as we provide services and organisations that benefit not just the residents of Cleobury Mortimer.

By changing our name to Cleobury Mortimer Town Council this does not change the area for which the council is responsible, or the people who are the electors.

Looking to the future, however, it does change the status of the council to match the town that it serves.

A PLAN FOR CLEOBURY'S FUTURE TO 2036

Councillor Jon Bodenham outlines a plan for us all to have a say in the town's future development:

Cleobury Town Council has agreed that a formal Neighbourhood Plan should be prepared for the Parish. neighbourhood plan is planning community-led framework for guiding the development, future regeneration and conservation of an area. This is a formal that consultation will forward to the County Council decided and will be referendum of the whole of the population of the Town with a legal status.

It is about the use and development of land and will contain a vision for the town, planning policies, proposals for improving the area or providing new facilities, or allocation of key sites for specific kinds of development.

The Town Council are to designate the proposing whole of the Parish of Cleobury Mortimer as a Neighbourhood Area. We are seeking residents' and business owners' views on this proposal. If you have any comments, please contact the Town Clerk by 30th June 2017. Shropshire Council will publicise this application on-line and across the neighbourhood for a period of 4 weeks.

What happens next?

The views and involvement of the community are important to the success of preparing any Neighbourhood Plan. Following the approval of the designated area by Shropshire Council, Cleobury Mortimer Town Council, through a working group will be organising community events and surveys in order to gain insight into what should be in the plan.

Volunteers Needed

To bring the plan to fruition we will need volunteers with skills and or enthusiasm. You can see the volunteer role description on the council website.

Neighbourhood The Development Plan (NDP) cannot cover strategic issues, for example mining major development, but can guide local issues. For example the plan should be able to say which important green spaces will be protected, or could identify a small affordable housing development. NDPs could also guide design standards in their area, to make sure that new development is of a high quality.

NDPs have to conform with 'the strategic priorities' of the relevant local county plan, but in planning decisions, if there is a conflict between a neighbourhood policy and a non-strategic local policy, the neighbourhood policy will take precedence E.G.:

The homes and jobs needed in the area.

The provision of retail, leisure and other commercial development.

The provision of infrastructure for transport, waste management, water supply, wastewater, energy, the provision of health, security, community and cultural infrastructure.

Conservation and enhancement of the natural and historic environment, including landscape.

BRITISH JUSTICE AT WORK

We have reported in recent months the prosecution of Mrs Elizabeth Griffiths by the Crown Prosecution Service for harassment of Matt Sheehan in his capacity as Clerk to the Parish Council. After two preliminary hearings, the trial proper was listed at Telford Magistrates' Court on May 26th.

There was a strong feeling of support for Matt within the community, the local branch of the Royal British Legion being particularly offended by a letter questioning their acceptance of him as a member. He had served as a regular soldier, including periods of duty in Northern Ireland at the times of the troubles.

It was agreed that hiring a mini bus would make sense, to carry several people and minimise parking problems at the Court. At 8.50am the bus arrived at the Parish Hall and 13 passengers filled it to capacity.

At the Court there were several other people who had travelled independently. 20 people in total were there to show support for our Town Clerk, the British Legion members in smart blazers with medals on display making their presence very noticeable.

Court proceedings began at 10.00, when there was a delay as three other cases were also listed for trial in the same courtroom. The trial was moved to another courtroom at one point and there was a lot of movement between courtrooms and the waiting area through the day.

Part of the delay appeared to be a process of negotiation quite outside the courtroom. The first we members of the public were given to understand was for a request for the charge of harassment to be dropped if Mrs Griffiths consented to be the subject of a Restraining Order. The prosecuting team refused to accept the proposal.

Some time later we were told that there was an offer to change Mrs Griffiths' plea to Guilty if the charge was changed to one of a contravention of Section 5 of the Public Order Act. This was also refused.

The time was approaching 1.00, the normal lunch break at the Court and the time for the hearing to begin was revised to 2.00pm. As we public trooped out to find lunch, there was a verbal message that the plea would be changed to Guilty, but no other details were available.

We were back in court in good time, nobody wanting to miss any detail, and the hearing started at 2.00. The defence barrister advised the magistrates that Mrs Griffiths wanted to change her plea to Guilty, which she then did. He explained that this was on the basis that notices in her shop window had not been intended to harass Mr Sheehan, but simply to draw public attention to the Parish Council's practises. Mrs Griffiths did accept that she had been notified that the notices were offensive.

After much detailed discussion, the magistrates retired to consider the sentence at 2.15, returning to the court at 2.30.

Mrs Griffiths was made the subject of a restraining order for 18 months and was also given a conditional discharge for 18 months. The chairman of the Bench stated that if she was convicted of any further offence in breach of the conditional discharge, she would be liable to be resentenced for the present offence and that if she breached the restraining order she could be sent to prison.

The chairman also directed that any reporting of the hearing must be accurate. With this in mind, the Clarion asked for sight of the Restraining Order in order to publish details, but it was not made available before we went to press. If it does become available in time, details will be published in the July edition.


