COMMUNITY AWARD WINNERS

On a busy May 17th night the Town Council hosted its Annual Open Meeting and the new Community Champions Awards were handed over to the winners. Top of the public poll for their stunning success in dressing the Parish Church steeple in red knitted poppies were sisters Sarah Barnsley and Kate Pearce, while Kit Smith was Environmental Champion and the Robinson family's Mawley Town Farm took home two runners-up prizes. The whole idea and the supporting evening was a great success.

THE MEN'S SHED -MORE SUCCESS

The Cleobury Men's Shed project that saw the foundations laid on their shed site on Tenbury Road Trading Estate was topped by the best news possible. Their application for a £10,000 grant from Awards for All (aka The National Lottery) was successful and they are now in a position to get the building under way.

It's been an extraordinary journey from the seed of an idea in late 2017 to a situation that could see the Shed up, open and running in 2019. And what a fine example of community spirit it is, with many local businesses giving time, advice and in some cases materials, for free. That generosity deserves support and we have it.

THE CLEOBURY MORTIMER LECTURES

After Ashley Buck's excellent telling of the tale of Abelard and Heloise on May 23rd, there are two more lectures to look forward to.

Both will be delivered or chaired by Robert Hodge, a man with a great interest in local history. On June 6th he will relate the history of Bessie Blount of Kinlet. The lady was mistress to King Henry the Eighth and bore him the son his six wives did not.

On June 20th the History Society will raise questions over the trial in 1833 of William Handley of Bayton. Could such a fine village community as Bayton have ever harboured a criminal? You may find the answer in the Parish Church, where both promising events will start at 7.30. Admission is a mere £5.00 on the door and all proceeds will go to the Saint Mary's Youth Project to further that body's excellent work for the community.




















HOBSON'S KITCHEN TAP

It's a new title for an established place that is building reputation for good foodie events and great surroundings for tasting local brews. It's the Kitchen Tap at Hobson's famous brewery and was officially launched on May 2nd with a happy gathering and a hint to the quality food it will be offering.

The Taproom will be open from 10.00 until 8.00, from Wednesday to Saturday; those hours will vary on public holidays. They'll be serving food and as a sample we tried the local rolled lamb breast with Austrian potato salad; very nice, too. The Thai fishcakes with Asian slaw had run out early, but we did manage to get a very chocolate brownie complement the glass Oldfield's cider we were sipping.

Nick Davies was naturally there to meet and greet, just back from a business meeting in London where he was discussing the development of the iSpaniel system of checking the movement of the brewery's beer barrels and its use by other brewers. A check that can tell you where an expensive barrel is

can be a great money saver and there's a lot of interest in the idea



Been in London for a business meeting, then back to the brewery for an evening event. Nick Davies does seem to have boundless energy.

The Kitchen Tap is managed by Duncan Turner, who sees the Tap as the place people can drop in and taste a pint of local beer or cider with a small plate of food to complement, the actual dishes depending upon the best available local produce.

The established habit of Foodie Nights will continue, with Brewery Nights added to the programme. The Brewery Nights will feature the cooking talents of CSONS, using local fare to produce dishes like cauliflower, cashew and Manor Ale humous, Old Henry

Springfield chicken sharkaseya or rare Ludlow Farm skirt steak with salsa verde, salad and Town Crier dressing.

For the Foodie Nights there's a range of talents booked to serve up their speciality. Like Adam Purnell's smoky fire cooking; Atia from Zainz Catering with traditional Punjabi cuisine; the Bakewell Ducks farmed Charlton Farm, Hartlebury for a special Duck Night and in November there's a Beefy Night courtesy of Matt and the team from Shropshire Hills Catering. And to round out all that, three days later there's the established Stir Up Sunday, where you stir up the pudding.

Guest Speaker was Phil Evans, Operational Director for the Met Office, the man in charge of our weather forecasting. What a great evening it proved to be. Phil's talk was entitled "Weather Forecasting – Art, Science or Fantasy?". My own verdict at the end of the evening was probably all three.

Phil gave a wide ranging and welcomed presentation questions as he talked. There were many which demonstrated that his audience was very engaged and well informed. We were given a lot of facts and figures as well as weather stories ranging from the Divine Winds of the 13th century in Japan, the D Day weather forecasting heroes to the Volcanic Ash and Cyclones in Mozambique in very recent times. Phil included the history

of the Met Office which was set up to anticipate storms and mitigate against financial losses in shipping in the 19th century, its wide ranging duties, saving lives by forecasting severe weather warnings, as well as the close work with military, environmental agencies and the international global weather community. Reassuringly this community work closely even at times of conflict.

The big issue facing us now is Food Security, we are dependent on small areas of the world who provide 50% of world production. This as well as climate change are our challenges in the 21st century. Thanks Phil, we hope you will come again to inform and inspire us.

Greyhounds for Pets, Not Bets.

Hello, I'm Pearl and this this is my friend Tom. We came to live in Cleobury because our owners love Greyhounds and have had Retired Greyhounds for a number of years. Once we start to lose speed our racing days are over. Fortunately, nationwide there are a number of charitable organisations devoted to rescuing us. These kennels are reliant on fund raising activities, help from volunteers and donations. In the UK, a nation renowned for dog lovers, a greyhound has been found in a ditch with its ears cut off. Tattoos in the ears would have identified the owner. In another European country greyhounds have been found hanging from trees in the woods. There are other unspeakable practices of disposing of us once we are no longer making money. It has to be said that there are responsible greyhound racers who keep their dogs or who pass them to homing kennels.

Despite living in kennels for the greater part of our lives, we make excellent pets. We are just like any we society; have different personalities characteristics. We tend to love children; some of us even live happily with cats. Re-homing kennels will exert every effort to match the right greyhound to the right owner taking into account potential owners' life style. Females like me are snapped up because we are pretty and we know how to be beguiling. Unfortunately black male greyhounds like Tom are often overlooked and can remain in kennels a long time. Tom was a sorry soul when our owner discovered him. He had given up and lay with his back turned. Murphy, who preceded Tom was a black greyhound whom Monmore Green had struggled to place. To hear our owners talk of him he seemed to be a saint, a gentle giant who allowed grandchildren to fall asleep on top of him.

After kennel life there is some adjustment to be made to living in a lovely home. We usually adapt quickly. Despite starting life in the limitations of an all greyhound community, in Cleobury we now enjoy the riches afforded by a multi-breed neighbourhood.

As has been said before, Cleobury is a community of dog lovers and our owners often comment on the lovely people they meet whilst walking us. At first we were suspicious of Bruce because one of our owners appears to adore him and we felt a bit peeved but we actually like him and when we spend time together we bond as a pack. Hero, who lives with Janet Manley is another friend. I guite fancy Hero. He is rather handsome. He doesn't brag but he did win best looking dog in the Forest Rescue show. He is prepared, for a small fee, to sign paw prints with all to Birmingham Greyhound proceeds going Protection. Sunny and Jojo belong to Jill Parker a very special lady who fosters greyhounds for the Birmingham Greyhound Protection. They place dogs in foster care until their forever home becomes available.

Jill and Janet will be available at a stall during the Cleobury Festival on June 29th. As well as raising awareness of the plight of greyhounds they will be raising money for Birmingham Greyhound Protection and for Candy Kane who work with partners in China to rescue dogs from the meat trade and from illegal greyhound racing. Jill and Janet are also hoping to highlight canine blood donation. Greyhound blood is vitally important as we tend to have a negative blood group, often termed the "universal blood type". In an emergency, our blood can be given to dogs with any blood type. Any large breed of dog (25KG in weight) can give blood. No anaesthetic is needed and the procedure is painless. A single donation can help up to four poorly or injured dogs.

If you are a sight hound you are very welcome to join us on June 22nd for a walk in the Wyre Forest, meeting at 11.30 by the café. There will be a BBQ to follow. Bring your owners who will be charged £5 per adult to cover food costs including sausages for us.

Stephen and Alison Evans with their daughter, Kathryn moved to Prizeley Farm in 2012. Under their five year plan, now extended to "on going" they made it their home and their living. They have lovingly renovated and restored the 18th century farmhouse and buildings, added a new cattle/fodder shed along with improving the farm land, with a new artesian well providing a reliable water supply and dependable fencing. The 105-acre farm on the B4202 road to Worcester is ideal for rearing cattle along with an additional 125-acre farm rented locally. It is good grass and beef country; they soon settled down to developing a beef fattening herd. Stephen is a natural beef man, knowing instinctively when an animal is 'finished' and ready for market.

Both he and Alison have a saying that their cattle grow from two week old bought-in calves to 24-month old market weight steers/heifers with "dignity, quality of life and with at least one summer on grass"- slow but sure high quality beef production. The specifically designed calf unit carefully rears the bought in calves with computerised fed milk substitute for the first six to eight weeks when they are weaned onto calf nuts and cereals. The 350-strong beef herd are made up of Aberdeen Angus and Wagyu and are all black. The Wagyu are of Japanese origin coming to the UK in the last decade. Their meat is renowned for its quality and excellent fat marbling. In Japan some Wagyu are cosseted by being massaged, fed beer and have classical

music played to them, developing a huge financial premium. Stephen sells his beef to the large supermarket chains without the massaging and music but just with good farming, care and rich Shropshire grass. The farm grows 80-acres of cereals along with silage and are all consumed by the cattle on both farms.

Although a small sized business they do devote time and effort to the care for their farm's future environment. Trees have been planted and they are concerned about soil erosion, soil compaction and quality. They are currently researching direct drilling of crops whereby the land is not ploughed and have undertaken a programme of drainage improvement to protect watercourses.

Stephen and Alison, like so many farmers, work long and hard hours. If there is a job to be done even on Christmas Day, it gets done by the two of them with occasional help.

Thankfully, they both have the ability to switch off for a week every now and then, and have bought a cottage in North Wales to renovate and be a bolt hole for holidays, as well as for self-catering rental. Watch the Clarion for when it is ready for hire later this year.

Stephen is not only good with cattle but also with timber and can turn out planks and robust timber beams from whole trees on his mobile sawmill. He would like to develop this business further and if it looks as good as his beef business he will be on to a good thing.

A SWIFT REPORT

At mid May it was becoming apparent that swallows, house martins and swifts were at least ten days late arriving from Africa and fewer than we might have expected. We do not know what the usual numbers of swallows and martins are, as we have not surveyed them before in any real detail. We do know there are less at this stage than last year. We hope to survey this year so we have a base line to compare with in future years. We do know from two years of swift surveys that we might expect a total of 27 as last year. However, they were ten days late arriving and only 12 in number in mid May this year. The cuckoo has been heard in Cleobury.

Any changes and survey work will be reported in the next Clarion and at a public meeting at the end of the breeding season in the last week of July. *Kit Smith*

Support for the Armed Forces

Thursday June 6th marks the 75th anniversary of the D-Day Landings – a real turning point in the Second World War and the beginning of the Allied liberation of Europe from Nazi tyranny.

To mark the event, there will be a major joint commemoration on Normandy beaches, involving surviving veterans, senior members of the Royal Family, and military chiefs from UK, US, Canada, France and other Commonwealth nations. It will involve the largest Royal Navy flotilla of recent years, with 4,000 personnel and at least 11 Royal Navy vessels, with multiple aircraft from the Red Arrows to the iconic Spitfire.

For me, such momentous anniversaries in our history take on a new significance, since joining the Commonwealth War Graves Commission as a Commissioner earlier this year.

Soldiers from across the Commonwealth played a crucial role in defeating fascism, and defending Britain and the values for which it stands. Without the significant support of Commonwealth nations, Britain's war effort may have ended very differently. So it is important to remember the service of all who played their part in the Second World War, especially those who sacrificed their lives for our freedom.

The service of Commonwealth personnel continues to play a vital role in sustaining our Armed Forces. There are today some 4,000 regular and reserves personnel from the Commonwealth in our Armed Forces.

I have recently supported calls in Parliament to scrap visa fees for Commonwealth veterans who wish to stay in the UK after leaving military service. Current legislation exempts Commonwealth personnel from immigration controls while serving in the Armed Forces, who become

eligible for Indefinite Leave to Remain following a minimum of four years' service. But application costs for Indefinite Leave to Remain mean a service leaver with a spouse and two children could face a bill of almost £10,000 to remain in the UK.

As a result, many Commonwealth service leavers rely on financial support from charities such as the Royal British Legion to meet the cost of visa fees to remain in the UK. Approximately 400 Commonwealth service leavers apply for Indefinite Leave to Remain each year.

It does not seem right to me that those who come to this country volunteering to serve in our Armed Forces, can be presented with a hefty bill if they wish to remain here once their duty is done. So I have joined calls on the Home Secretary to do the right thing, and waive these fees for good.

This month also marks Armed Forces Day, on Saturday 29th June, with events taking place in Shrewsbury and Telford. I encourage residents to show their support for the Armed Forces and those local organisation and businesses who have signed up to the Armed Forces Covenant. This pledge recognises that those who serve or who have served in the armed forces, and their families, should be treated with fairness and respect in the communities, economy and society they serve.

As a former Defence Minister, and local Royal British Legion member, I feel strongly that we must ensure that current generations recognise and respect the service of those who wear the Queen's uniform and defend the freedoms we hold dear – just as previous generations have done.

And here in Cleobury, you can buy your fruit and veg in paper bags at Cleobury Fruit and Veg. Cleobury At the Country Market each month, you can meet Lynn who, as well as selling products from her small holding i n Wem (wackleybrook.co.uk), also brings Ecoleaf Laundry Liquid, Fabric Conditioner, Washing Up Liquid and Multi Surface Cleaner in bulk. She will refill any container, any size, that you bring to her. She is also open to suggestions for other products you want to buy as refills. A great way to start refilling locally.



I try not to be too gloomy in my articles even though the overall picture regarding our wildlife is inescapably bad, so it's wonderful that I can bring some good news. Following last month's article which mentioned the disappearance of Nightjars from the Wyre Forest a friend got in touch with me to say that he had a heard a Nightjar 'churring' behind his house on the edge of Ribbesford Woods last summer. Let's hope that it returns this summer, bringing some friends with it!

I have waited to hear the Cuckoo with some anxiety in recent years. It's a huge change from earlier days: an elderly lady who used to live along Tanners Hill told me that the noise of Cuckoos calling incessantly in the late spring and summer in her youth was maddening (enough to send anyone 'cuckoo'). precarious state of the bird species such as Meadow Pipit, whose nests they invade, combine with the dangers of migration from sub-Saharan Africa to threaten the continued presence of this iconic bird in our forest. However I was relieved to hear my first Cuckoo on 24th April and have since heard the distinctive call, sometimes distant, sometimes loud and nearby, many times during May.

Another chance encounter was with a Woodcock, which flew over us as we walked back to the farm at dusk recently. It was flying low and uttering a squeak, much like a child's or dog's toy when trodden on, at regular intervals. I checked that I hadn't trodden on a frog then concluded it was a rare sighting of this heavily camouflaged woodland bird which looks much like a Snipe, with a long beak for probing soft ground. At this time of the year the males

perform a courtship flight known as 'roding'. They fly a circular track at dusk, uttering a strange croak or groan followed by the squeak I've described. The sound we heard lacked the croak, or at least we didn't hear it, so it may have been a male or a female. Norman Hickin records that this goes on for about an hour, usually from March until August. The wonders of a dusk walk are arguably as rewarding as those of the dawn walk I was advocating last month!


Now that the forest has closed up and new leaves block the long views it is harder to see Fallow Deer. This applies even to the white deer, which make up a small but increasing percentage of the Wyre herd. This is the month when fawns are born, hidden among undergrowth by their mothers in the very quietest parts of the forest. Let's try not to disturb their peace. Linda Iles







A SPRING MORNING IN NOVERS WOOD

7.30 on a misty morning and the lower slopes of Clee Hill do not offer any recognisable sign of where the Novers Wood car park is. Satnav is not in a friendly mood and the Google map just shows an area next to the road down to Tenbury. I stop and ask a man in a parked car: it's Bob Clarke from Cleobury, another lost soul. We're joined by a third and it looks like becoming a crowd puzzle when Glyn Barratt arrives and rescues us.

Clue for the future. Turn in by the Knowle Sports ground and carry on straight ahead.

We join a gaggle of parked cars and hurry to get walking boots on and join the party. They are on the edge of the wood, standing silent as walk leader Gareth Thomas talks quietly before stopping to listen for a bird call. Was it a whinchat? Difficult to hear what he says from the end of the queue and this ignoramus would not know.



Tracing birdsong is naturally a quiet and gentle process.

We move on slowly, Glyn Barratt taking time to explain the history of Novers, once a busy lime quarrying area that was abandoned to nature long ago and bought with some generous grants to be rescued as a nature reserve. 30 acres of uneven terrain with no easy access limited its market appeal.

Regular trekking by local (wild life) enthusiasts has marked paths, which deer now follow. The ground has been hollowed out as miners long ago dug out limestone, in places not very deeply, in the biggest instance close to 80 feet deep with a mine shaft branching further into the earth. All that soil removed by hand labour, the lime stone moved on sleds from less productive areas and on rail carts from prime sources.

The wood has been used for school parties and the South Shropshire Youth Group, the latter building natural shelters from the abundant young trees and bushes and spending what must have been a demanding night camped out.

The simple paths have needed some landscaping work to make access slightly easier and on one long climb there are steps with timber facings to prolong their life. Glyn and other volunteers did that - not that you'd know unless you walk through this secluded area and ask questions of the right person.

Gareth Thomas is a great leader, with sharp hearing and a broad knowledge to identify the range of songs we hear. He can analyse the character of the calls, explains the repetition and what that can mean in some of them. He carries a recorder with a good storage range and plays some recordings to illustrate the subtle differences in what the untutored might think the same calls. Nature is always subtle.

Gareth admits that some of his recordings were made in earlier hours than we experienced. The task of carrying recording equipment in the pre-dawn hours along rough, steep paths must have been seriously demanding, but enthusiasm for the subject does tend to drive the determined on.

At the end of the walk we gathered around one of the tepees that serve as accommodation and storage, as coffee and biscuits were served.







Gina Basker has been involved in catering and cooking for 35 years. She started out helping part time in a local Italian restaurant and worked her way through all aspects of the industry to today's happy position of her own business.

After moving to Cleobury she worked in the kitchen at the Primary School, then at Casa Mia in Far Forest. With friends asking her to cater for their special occasions once they'd tasted her cooking skills, demand for her service grew. So she had to make a decision to take on premises with room to do the job easily. After all, holding down a chef's position and running a part-time business out of her home kitchen was no easy life.

She found the solution in Burford's Aspire Centre, where she and her partner cleaned and decorated the place before installing cookers and extractor units with the capacity to prepare, cook and despatch food for 100 or more guests at whatever the event is. Like canapé parties, hot and cold buffets and big pan food. Latest acquisitions are a hog roast and a pop-up kitchen for when there aren't facilities available.

With about 48 square metres of space there's a limit to the amount of crockery and cutlery she can supply off the shelf, and the answer is a Worcester based hire service that she knows and trusts.

What you will not find here are big freezers and refrigerators stuffed with ready-made food. Gina's proud boast is that Platters and Plates serves fresh hand-made food. And if that means something special in the way of bread, she'll make it; if the customer just wants good quality bread and rolls, she uses Swift's up on Clee Hill. Meat comes from Heath Farm at Baginswood and fruit and vegetables from Bewdley Farm Shop or Cleobury's Co-op store if she has to work late. The customer states what they want, how much a head they want to spend and Gina comes up with the answer.

Hygiene at all stages of preparation is strictly observed. Food Hygiene Level 3 certified, Hygiene Level 5 (the highest there is) and she's a member of the National Catering Association. The whole process from cooking to serving is recorded as approved practice dictates; the temperature when delivered is recorded and if it's a buffet where the guests will serve themselves, there's a clear note of the maximum time it can be on display before being removed from the table. Each dish is labelled with details of any allergens; this is 21st century catering and standards are high.

She has a co-operative agreement with a Kidderminster caterer to share part-time staff that they know and can trust. She does have a strong sense of presentation for buffets and is used to guests wanting to photograph the spread before they eat, because it looks so good.

The matter of delivering food to an event is dealt with by large insulated containers that fit into her estate car and the newly acquired trailer if more space is needed. All carefully temperature controlled.

Gina works hard and if you call and don't get her it's because she's out working. She's putting in about 50 hours a week at this stage, but what some of her customers say suggests that may grow.

Gayna at the Severn Hospice shop in Cleobury has used Gina and is a great fan: "Marvellous, I've never seen anything like it before. Just wonderful to look at and delicious to eat."

Her own down to earth approach, an ability to listen to what her customers want and a smiling manner all add to the service. You can see why she's so successful.




