

ALAN AYCKBOURN'S 'BEDROOM FARCE' AT THE REGAL

Aykbourn is a great favourite with theatre audiences, thanks to his ability to make them laugh. So to have Concord Theatricals presenting his "Bedroom Farce" for three nights this month confirms that our local theatre is getting ambitious and aiming high.

This play has been a hit in both London and New York, with its madcap story of four couples, three bedrooms and a night to remember, even though they probably wish to forget it.

It's on for three nights, with a 7.30 start on Thursday the 24th, Friday the 25th and Saturday the 26th, plus a 2.30 matinee on Saturday. Tickets are £11.50 for adults and £5.00 for Under 16s.

THE BREAKFAST CLUB

On 8 February, Kit Smith gave us a summary of the status of raptors in the Cleobury area. There are about 19 species in Britain, with the Golden Eagle being one of the best known. There are six species which nest locally at present: Buzzard, Sparrowhawk, Kestrel, and three owls – Barn, Tawny, and Little. In the near future, they may well be joined by a seventh – the Red Kite. Many of us will have visited the kite feeding centre near Rhayader, and kites have spread from this centre in recent years.

Kit then gave us a run-down on these six local species, and provided clues to help identify them. Some have extraordinary powers of hearing or sight, and the Kestrel can additionally see ultra-violet radiation, which allows it to track down field voles, whose urine (unfortunately for them) shows up in UV light. The Little Owl, only about the size of a starling, is not a 'native' species, but a successful 19th-century introduction from mainland Europe.

Finally, Kit described the steps that he and his colleagues are taking to log evidence of these raptors, and how they can be helped by providing suitable conditions for nesting and feeding. Most raptors are avid consumers of voles, so retaining conditions amenable to voles (e.g. open pasture) will be good for our raptors as well. Cllr John Greaves will speak in April, and we hope the March slot will be filled by Phil Howl, to update the history of his restoration of the old Neen Sollars station house. He first spoke to us about this in March 2020. To attend either meeting, please contact Angela Drennan on 270636.

Just to whet your appetite here's a few facts about that land around our Shropshire churches. They have many yew trees locally that are more than 1000 years old (and the odd one that is even older!). The white and yellow spots on gravestones are not made by messy birds, they are in fact lichens, many of which are only ever found in graveyards. Toadstools and mushrooms enjoy the environment too, undisturbed for hundreds of years, and many are home to a plethora of wildflowers.

Kirsty Stevens (<u>kirsty@cfga.org.uk</u>) is leading the project, ably assisted by Megan Gallant (megan@cfga.org.uk) and they are planning a programme of activities and events focused on on nature-based volunteer involvement and participation, which they hope will help reverse the loss of habitats and species decline. This will include discovery days with environmental art, bug hunts, nature walks and activities. Children will be encouraged and entertained - and educated -with some schools already aboard this Ark. Conservation is also on the agenda with a chance to try a variety of skills, including learning to scythe with the Churchyard Task Team.

It is not all physical stuff as you will get the opportunity to go on a nature walk, hear some great speakers at a series of talks and the planned "Hay Days" in June could give you some good ideas for your own garden, take away hay to help create your own meadow and a chance to just enjoy the peace that is a churchyard.



POTHOLE OF THE MONTH




Wouldn't it be really good if we didn't have to keep on reminding ourselves - and possibly even Shropshire Council - of the parlous state of our roads?

This pothole is on the corner of High Street and Tenbury Road, where heavy vehicles turning towards the various works on that route add a twisting motion to the grip of their tyres and the result is what you see here. In truth almost all the A4117 through the town is in what looks like a state of gradual disintegration, with long areas showing the top surface missing and the next one down being spread along by the passage of traffic. CLEE HILL WILDLIFE GROUP

Have you heard your first Curlew of the year yet? If so, please tell us. They usually start returning to the area in late February, and continue to arrive throughout March.

Our Annual Lapwing and Curlew Survey re-starts at the end of March. If you care about what's happening to these birds, or just enjoy walks in the countryside, we'd like your help, please.

We need to know how many breeding pairs there are, and where, before we can try and help them. We located 8 pairs of Curlew last year. We need to know if they all come back, and if there are more.

The group is centred on the open hill land of Titterstone Clee and Clee Hill and Catherton Commons, extending approximately as far as Knowlegate and Knowbury to the south, Bitterley to the west, Cleedownton and Bromdon to the north, and Doddington to the east. The bird survey has been carried out every year since 2012, and we are doing it again this year.

The survey is easy to do, and only involves three 3-hour visits between the beginning of April and mid-June. Simple instructions and a map to record your observations are provided, and there will be a practical fieldwork training session if you want to come.

Whether you join in or not, please let us know if you see Curlew, Lapwing or Kestrel anywhere in the area.

Locating Curlews is particularly important, because we will be working again with the Shropshire Ornithological Society (SOS) Save our Curlews nest-finding and protection project. You can read more about what has been done on the SOS w e h S i t www.shropshirebirds.com/saveour-curlews/.

The Clee Hill Community Wildlife Group public meeting is on Tuesday, March 8th at 7.30 in Clee Hill Village Hall. There will be short presentations refreshments and a raffle.

A Bird Group meeting will be held at 7.30pm on Monday March 21st, at the Recreation Rooms, 22A, Clee Hill High Street, to present the results of our work in previous years, and plans for 2022. All welcome!!!

March in the Wyre Forest

Two dates that get written down in my diary straight away are the two Saturdays of the deer census. The census is a snapshot of deer populations, a measure of the status quo which is needed to make decisions about future management of the Fallow, Roe and Muntjac in the forest. Like the Garden Bird Survey and the Farmland Bird Survey, it relies on the efforts of enthusiastic volunteers to gather the information but unlike them it requires an element of stealthy stalking in the half light of dawn.

Of the three deer species mentioned only the Roe are likely to be native to Britain. There are a brown trunks and fallen leaves of the winter small number in the Wyre Forest but they seem to be increasing year on year so we assume some manage to breed! More successful are the Muntjac, which are the size of a Labrador dog and, appropriately enough, make a loud bark that penetrates the forest. They don't often co-operate by standing in view so this call is the surest way of knowing they are present, along with their tracks or 'slots' and droppings which are tiny compared to the other two deer species. They are adept at slipping or digging their way under fences and will eat a wide range of vegetation, including bark, which makes them no friend of number of pubs!) the forester. They have established themselves widely in the south and east of England since escaping from Woburn Park in Bedfordshire in the 1920s and arrived in Wyre in the 1980s. Muntjac does will come into season straight after giving birth to their fauns and so they are able to breed quickly and are probably here to stay.



It's not easy to spot the deer among the dull forest, especially if they stay still, and they always see me before I see them. In the Wyre Forest there is a mixture of colours of Fallow Deer from black, through brown to white. The white ones are, of course, the easiest to spot, in fact very easy indeed, often leading the eye to a group of darker companions. They have a particular beauty and more than a touch of mystery, having a place in Celtic and other cultures as symbols of the otherworld and of purity. The 'White Hart' was used as an emblem by Richard II, Henry V and Edward IV (and more prosaically by a large

Philip Dunne's Letter from Westminster

Platinum Jubilee of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II

Last month marked 70 years since the accession of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II to the throne, following the death of her father, King George VI.

As Britain's longest serving monarch, the Queen's remarkable seven decades of public service are a source of pride and inspiration to people not just in the UK, but across the Commonwealth and the wider world.

The official celebrations will take place in early June over a four-day Bank Holiday weekend, with an extra Bank Holiday to mark this unique occasion. There will be an extensive programme of national events, including the Queen's Birthday Parade (Trooping the Colour), a Service of Thanksgiving at St Paul's Cathedral, and a Platinum Party at Buckingham Palace.

Locally, I know that many towns and villages have already begun to plan street parties and celebrations, as I am already receiving kind invitations to join communities to celebrate. I shall try to join as many as I can, so if you are having an event locally over the Jubilee weekend, please do let me know at <u>philip.dunne.mp@parliament.uk</u>. I shall be lighting a beacon on Thursday 2nd June as part of a national chain of light.

Like many, I recall fondly the post-Golden Jubilee visit of the Queen and Duke of Edinburgh to Shropshire in 2003. Having arrived by train at Telford, the royal couple visited Much Wenlock to take in the Wenlock Olympian Games, the inspiration for the modern Olympic Games as we know them today, before moving to the Discovery Centre in Craven Arms for lunch. They then arrived at Ludlow, where Her Majesty formally opened the new Library and Museum Resource Centre before doing a walkabout among thousands of people in Market Square.

This Jubilee is the first where Her Majesty has not had the steadfast presence of Prince Philip at her side. But she remains just as committed to continuing her service now as when she took her pledge in 1947. It was telling that Her Majesty signed off her official Jubilee message with "Your Servant".

I am pleased that, in keeping with tradition, a Platinum Jubilee medal will be awarded to people who work in public service including representatives of the Armed Forces, the emergency services and the prison services. This tradition stretches back to the reign of Queen Victoria when an official medal was designed to mark her 50th anniversary on the throne.

I am also encouraging people across South Shropshire to get involved with the Queen's Green Canopy – where individuals and communities 'plant a tree for the Jubilee'. This offers a chance to create a legacy in honour of The Queen's leadership of the Nation, which will also benefit future generations.

I look forward to joining celebrations in towns and villages across South Shropshire in June, and encourage everyone to come together and celebrate the Queen's remarkable reign.





Bored, bored, bored

You know that fallow period between Christmas and New Year? The (almost) week where nothing happens, but everyone walks around with a bemused sense that we really should be doing something; we just don't know quite what.

The months of February and March are pretty much like that for gardeners. We're itching to do something, but weather, soil conditions and temperature all conspire against us, leaving us aimlessly wandering around the potting shed or the greenhouse. This lack of purpose doesn't sit well with me - all play and no work makes Simon a pain to live with.

It's one of the reasons I love a list (and I don't think I'm on my own). I wager that most of us gardeners thrive on a decent 'todo' list. In the absence of things to do, we get antsy and start things prematurely, the sowing of seeds being a perfect case in point. For years, I have chanced my arm and gone early. I'll plonk sweet peas into cold and wet seed trays in late January and then watch them like a hawk for any sign of growth. When something does finally appear, it's more out of contractual obligation than horticultural miracle.

Of course, it's not just sweet peas. The my 'to-do' list. information on the back of seed packets lure you in and play to the gardener's love of a job - they urge you to get the seeds into pots as soon as possible so that you can luxuriate in their gorgeous blooms earlier in the season. For example, the seed packets state that you can plant sweet peas in late January. While this might apply if you live in The Azores, it doesn't work in cold and soggy Shropshire. So, with depressing regularity, the seeds either rot, sulk and decide not to play or produce spindly sprouts that never amount to much. So what

does the gardener do at this point? Ditch the first batch and go out and buy another packet of seeds. Oh, those clever seed marketing people...

It's funny how support for my 'to-do' list addiction comes in different guises. As I write, Storm Eunice is (quite literally) blowing a gale outside. My typing is accompanied by the sound of terracotta pots being toppled and then smashed, furniture sliding across the patio, and the squawks of some very discombobulated chickens (I'm guessing egg production will be down for the next few days). There is an upside, though - I've managed to add shopping around for replacement pots, recovering furniture from the hedge and researching therapies for chickens suffering from PTSD to my 'to-do' list.

Update - I've just braved the elements and flying debris to check on my beloved greenhouse. Thus far, it looks to have escaped unscathed, although the deluge over the last 48 hours means that the floor is under 6 inches of water (God bless you, clay soil). On closer inspection, the glass needs a damned good clean - green algae can't be a good sign, right? - so that gets also added to

My advice? If possible, step away from the to-do list and the temptation to start things that really aren't ready to be started. Instead, add something like 'Enjoy the amazing show of snowdrops this year' or 'Lift the heads of hellebores they're always a joy' to your mental list (and wait a few weeks before commencing the sowing).

CATHERTON COMMON UPDATE

After perhaps the driest January on record I am now in the middle of some incredibly stormy weather. The River Severn might have one of its biggest flood events for a long time a c c o r d i ng t o th e Environment Agency. So what are the implications of all this wet weather for Catherton Common?

Well, it's all good news! Catherton Common is a place with many diverse habitats and this is one of its unique features. It has some areas that are quite dry acid grassland, the heathland areas are a mix of dry and wet heathland, in many places the two exist as an intricate mosaic with Common heather and Cross Leaved Heath (an indicator of wet heath and bog) next to each other. However, probably the most environmentally rich and

valuable habitat is the wet flush and marsh close to Cramer Gutter and there are also other low lying areas of bog and marshy ground very rich in wildlife across the common which benefit from wet winter weather.

Over many recent years we have had less rainfall than usual and many of these wet areas showed signs of drying out. If that continued it might significantly reduce the variety of plants and animals on the reserve and also increase the amount of bracken and gorse, which thrive on drier ground and are also favoured by the warmer conditions we are experiencing with climate change. This could lead in the long term to a much less diverse range of wildlife on Catherton Common.

So keep doing your rain dances, and feel free to send the water flooding your garden back onto the common! But a bit of sunny weather in the summer would be nice.





It's March and two months of the year have passed already. But while this time of the year heralds the start of Spring, there is no Spring for scammers. They would like to think that every day is Christmas Day for them. But the more we build up awareness of their schemes and the more they try to come up with more ways of thieving from us, the fewer victims will fall to their evil ways.

This month I would like to outline some of the scams that have come our way and how we can avoid them. Local residents report receiving calls on their mobiles, from a Leicester number starting 0116 300 xxx, where the last three numbers can be different. An Asian voice suggests it is from a call centre not based in the UK, but the caller tries to offer 30% more mobile usage and extra data. If the victim falls for this and gives out Bank details then the scam reaps rewards. These have been verified as scam calls purporting to be from O2, Three, Carphone Warehouse etc . You will be asked to stay on the line to supply details. Please don't fall for this and never give out personal or financial details over the phone. Shropshire Council are advising people that, following the very recent Government announcement of possible council tax rebates to offset the National Insurance and Energy price rises, residents are receiving calls from scammers posing as Council Officials and asking for Bank Details in order to make refunds directly to their bank. This is a scam and residents are advised not to pay any fees or provide any other information such as bank details if asked. If you receive one of these calls, please report it to Action Fraud on 0300 123 2040 or if you have access to the internet, report it here on https://orlo.uk/ WrpFO. Phone calls are being received about roof insulation. The scammers can be very persuasive convincing the victim that roof insulation will reduce their energy bills and of course save money. You may be asked for a deposit before work starts and of course you will never see the money again or the workmen. Be aware, don't let a cold caller convince you that any work needs doing on your property. If in doubt hang up and talk to a reputable local trades person about any work you think you might need. Social Media scams continue to flood users with Facebook and Whatsapp being favourite platforms. This is despite the Governments claiming to be coming down on these providers and stopping it happening. You notice a new friend requests and you realise that it's someone who is an existing friend on Facebook. The first thing to do in this instance before accepting the request – is to determine if it is genuine by contacting your friend by other means than the social media platform. It might be genuine. After all, sometimes people lose access to their

accounts and have to start again. We recommend contacting the friend outside of Facebook. Over the phone, by text or in person in best. You can also contact them via another social media channel or if all else fails their original Facebook account. (Tip: If you choose the latter options, try verifying their identity by asking them a question only your friend would know.) If your friend claims they did not send you a friend request then it is likely a cloning scam. This means a crook has created a new account with your friend's picture and name in a bid to trick you into accepting a request from the cloned account.

The WhatsApp Scam continues to be a source of serious concern and even though this has been outlined in previous issues, the problem remains and the public are warned to be vigilant. The basic format used is this: The suspect will send the victim a message via WhatsApp claiming to be their son/ daughter/friend and that they have had to change their number, having lost or damaged their phone. The Scammer will then say they are now using a new phone number. As a result of this, the Scammers will claim they are getting in touch in order to borrow money to purchase the new device, or pay off a debt. After this, the Scammer will give their bank details so a payment can be made to them, with some coming back with further demands for money. Other scams over the phone recently reported are impersonations of Police Officers asking for some form of payment. Police Officers will NEVER do that. If in doubt hang up and call your local Police Number 101 from another phone.

Finally, a new one came up very recently. The caller claims to be from an investment firm and claims that you have deposited a sum of money in an investment and the caller asks if you wish to withdraw the money. If you are fooled into thinking you are about to receive some money. You won't. The caller will try to extract your bank details saying that they need them to make the transfer. Again, hang up. But beware these scammers will call back immediately if you hang up and persist with their scam routine. The best way to stop this is to block the number. In the recent case the number was 020 8077 1647, but the scammers use many variations of these numbers. Stay safe, Protect your money, Think! Does this call or request make sense? Are they asking for money? Remember that scammers prey on people's kindness, trust and willingness to help. If in doubt say no or hang up.



Dog Mess

A regular complaint about our town is the amount of dog mess which is not picked up. It looks terrible and gives a bad impression that people do not care about their town, their fellow residents and visitors. There are so many incidents of people treading in this and walking the mess into cars, schools and homes causing justifiable annoyance at the smell and inconvenience to clean shoes and carpets.

The Town Council asked the Primary School children to design a poster to be displayed around town to highlight the issues and encourage people to pick up their dog's mess. We are pleased to announce two winners, a pupil from Year 4 and a pupil from Year 6. The winning designs are being made into 60 notices to be placed all around town to send a message and help inform everyone of the need to pick up dog mess.

There are plenty of bins around town and bagged dog mess can be placed in any bin. Please support your community and help keep Cleobury Mortimer a clean and tidy place to be proud of. If you notice any bins which are full or feel that there should be additional bins in any area please contact the Town Council on 01299 271154 or email cleobury.council@gmail.com.

Trees

Whilst some of us have to tidy up after the recent storms please be mindful that trees should be maintained by landowners and inspected on a regular basis. If you do need to do any work on trees please consider that the work should be done preferably when the trees are dormant is mid-late winter.

For general tree maintenance, Shropshire Council has sent the following advice for those people who live in the Conservation Area:

If you live in the Cleobury Mortimer Conservation Area and wish to remove or prune established trees you are required to give the local planning authority (Shropshire Council) six weeks' notice before carrying out work, this is called a section 211 notice. There is no fee for submitting a notice. You do not need to give notice if you want to work on trees less than 7.5 centimetres in diameter, measured 1.5 metres above the ground (or 10 centimetres if thinning to help the growth of other trees). If in doubt, check with the planning authority.

Enforcement action may be taken by the planning authority where the six week notice is not given and trees are felled or pruned. Those who damage or carry out work without permission on a tree with a Tree Preservation Order (TPO) or in a Conservation Area may be:

- * fined up to £20,000
- * prosecuted for felling without a licence

* served a notice to replace any protected trees that have been destroyed.

Serious offences may be escalated to Crown Court trial and result in an unlimited fine.

Upon receipt of a notice to work on or fell trees by local planning authority The Town and Country Planning Act gives the authority three options, they can either:

* make a Tree Preservation Order (TPO) to protect the trees if justified in the interests of amenity. Any future works proposals would then have to be the subject of a formal application under the TPO regulations, or * decide not to make a TPO and allow a six week period to expire and make no formal reply, at which point the applicant has de facto permission to carry out the proposed work as long as it is carried out within two years of the date of the notice, or

* decide not to make a TPO and inform the applicant that the work can go ahead.

When making a decision on the merits for raising a TPO a tree's condition, longevity and public visibility are all taken into consideration.


