#### SKY LANTERNS

We had a report on April 15th that a company selling Chinese night lanterns is encouraging people to release them every Sunday night to show support for the NHS. The company say the money made will be donated to the Health Service.

There's been a strong reaction from the farming community, who have seen livestock panicked by these. And if the dry spell when this report is written continues into May, the fire risk from lanterns falling to earth will be high, to both crops and livestock.

Fay Jones, MP for Brecon and Radnorshire, is quoted in Farmers Weekly as saying: "These lanterns are a menace to rural areas. They start fires, pose a huge threat to livestock and litter the countryside. Please don't use them."

South Wales Fire and Rescue said: "At a time of increased pressure on all emergency services, sky lanterns pose a significant fire hazard."

### NO NEED TO BE LONELY

#### **BT BOTHERS (AGAIN)**

Regular readers may recall the problems I had with reporting a fault to BT some time back. As they have installed a new boss with potential earnings of £8 million a year, have things improved? Read on and find out...

A (different) friend was having problems with her phone and asked if I could report it as a fault. So I rang the advertised number and a recorded message immediately told me that 'All calls are now answered in the UK or Ireland'. That sounded promising and my call was answered pretty quickly which was even better. However, when the voice on the other end immediately told me that he was based in Stockport this started to worry me a little as his accent didn't sound like anyone I have ever met from Stockport (and I lived near there for some years) so it dawned on me that this could be the start of another BT based adventure.

Still, nothing ventured, so I attempted to explain the situation which was an experience similar to walking through mud up to the knees. I was asked who I was and for my telephone number which was fair enough and then it then got more surreal: BT man: 'What is your date of birth?'. Me: 'Why do you want that?'. Him: 'It's not compulsory'. Me: Then you can't have it'. Him: 'What is your E Mail address?'. Me: 'Is that compulsory?'. Him: 'No'. Me: 'then you can't have that either'. At this point, he changed tack and asked for the number of the faulty line which I gave him. Then he wanted to know the full name, address and postcode of the account holder which I had to hand following the previous saga. He came back to say that the name I had given was not that of the account holder so, as she shares the house with her daughters family, I told him it might be in the daughter's name. It was and you could hear a light come on in his head. 'If you hold, I'll have the line

checked'. There was then a delay of about two minutes during which I could hear a number of his colleagues in the background taking calls (which I suspect he should have blanked). This was very interesting as none of them sounded remotely as if they came from Stockport.

He then came back to say that there was a fault on the line and that it had already been reported. This looked like we were getting somewhere until ....I asked when an engineer would be attending. He replied that this wouldn't happen until the account holder contacted them in person and (as far as I could make out) undertook to pay any costs if the fault turned out to be something that was not a BT liability. I asked why this could not come from me and he replied that EU data protection rules prevented this. I then asked if my friend could give the undertaking but he declined, insisting that EU....etc. In fact he latched on to this line (perhaps it was writ large on his crib sheet) and must have this mantra about 20 times in an repeated increasingly desperate tone. By this point, he wasn't the only one becoming increasingly desperate... Eventually, I got fed up, rang off and advised my friend what was needed. About 10 days later I rang to find that the call had been made and an engineer had been and fixed it.

Mulling this experience over, I think there could be several possible explanations:

BT have secretly infiltrated a team of non local call handlers into suburban Stockport or....

This team is based in the other Stockport of which we were previously unaware but which is situated somewhere a long way away from the Stockport near Manchester or...

#### POTHOLE OF THE **MONTH**



Once again, a new month brings a rich harvest to choose from for the 'slight undulation in the road surface' most likely to damage your tyre beyond repair or leave you with an alloy rim in need of skilled repair.

We photographed it after overnight rain filled it to the brim, so you wouldn't know how deep it was, and as it's just around the corner as traffic coming south on B4363 turns left on B4201 towards the Golf Club and Bewdley, you wouldn't see it unless you were driving very slowly. But you'd know you'd found it by the frightening sound of your nearside front wheel hitting the rim of its deep bowl and the way the steering wheel jerked in your hands.

The only blessing of its presence at that junction was the business any encounter may have brought to Mick Burke's Belle Vue Garage right on the junction. Or if you didn't stop in time and wobbled on down the lane past the Golf Club, it's about a mile before you reached Mawley Oak Garage. Both of these fine establishments would have been happy to help you.

But we're really happy to report that when we revisited the site on April 23rd the hole had been filled in a very basic fashion. It was still an ugly mess, with the surrounding damage to the road surface much in evidence, but it did show some willingness to sort out our county-wide problems. Thanks lads, all of you who got the tarmac out and laid it down. We'll send a copy of this page on to the County Highways Department with a certificate of congratulations on such an achievement. But we don't expect any reply, as we heard nothing after a show of Clarion Courtesy in sending a copy of the April prize specimen.

#### PRICE GOUGING

I lead a sheltered life here in Cleobury Mortimer, as I'd never heard of 'price gouging' until a press release from 'Which' magazine came up on the screen. They had been advised of opportunist sellers on Ebay and Amazon bumping up prices of household items during the Covid-19 crisis.

They quote some examples, like a 250mm bottle of Carex, handwash that you can normally pick up for £1 in most shops and supermarkets, being offered for £10 or more. Or Dettol bleach and cleaning sprays on offer for ten times the normal price and in one case 25 times! Or how about sterilising fluid for baby bottles more than ten times the original price?

Most shoppers won't fall for such extreme scams, but that doesn't mean that a few won't order in a hurry and not check if they're getting a fair deal. 'Which' are asking anyone seeing such outrageous prices to report it to their Which? Conversation; Google will help you find it.

Their advice is to shop around and compare prices, and don't be pressured by suggestions that stocks are low. It's your money, so spend wisely.








# CLEE HILL COMMUNITY WILDLIFE GROUP

Bird Survey and Save our Curlews Campaign.



If you see or hear a Curlew, please tell us

We cancelled our bird survey, and the Curlew nest finding and protection project, as a result of tightened coronavirus lockdown restrictions announced after the copy date for the April *Clarion*.

However, the Curlew situation is critical, with a 77% decline in Shropshire between 1990 and 2010, and a further decline since. There's probably only 120 pairs left in the whole of the County now, and we haven't got long to save them from local extinction. In Clee Hill, the population has declined from 13 breeding pairs in 2012 to 7 - 8 last year, a loss

of almost half in only seven years. We can't afford a total loss of data on their population and distribution in 2020, so we still want to know about Curlews.

With the help of local residents we should still be able to work out if all the Curlew territories that were occupied last year are occupied again in 2020. 





This wretched global Coronavirus pandemic is affecting every single one of us, given the unprecedented measures governments around the world have had to take, including ours. The virus itself has been slower to reach Shropshire, but is now in our midst and local residents have been responding brilliantly to the advice to stay at home, to prevent the NHS from being overwhelmed and save lives.

I have been deeply heartened by the amazing response of communities across South Shropshire to pull together and help those in need.

With around 30% of South Shropshire's population over retirement age, we clearly have a substantial proportion of those at greater risk, and needing to shield themselves. The number of people aged 90 or above in South Shropshire has more than doubled in my time as your MP, many in residential or receiving domiciliary care locally.

So helping those self-isolating or shielding to receive food and medicines safely, has been a key role for the wonderful coronavirus support groups that have sprung up across the county. The number of those volunteering to help neighbours in need, has been truly inspirational to see. Having been in self-isolation myself since mid-March with a chronic lung condition, I am very much aware of the difficulties from not being able to go out as usual to get supplies or work as normal.

I have been working to support those community groups of which I am aware, listed on <a href="www.philipdunne.com">www.philipdunne.com</a>. Local residents can get in touch with Shropshire Council's Covid-19 support line on 0345 678 9028 for emergency help.

While in isolation, I have been doing all I can to support the thousands of local residents who have been in touch by email, many with urgent health issues or concerns about their livelihoods. An initial priority for me and my team was helping local South Shropshire folk who, due to global travel restrictions imposed with little or no notice, became stranded overseas. Some have been in desperate conditions or medically critical situations - for

example, a constituent who had been stuck in a hospital in Florida, after suffering a stroke – who I am pleased to say we helped to get a medical evacuation by air to Princess Royal Hospital. With collaboration between government and the airlines, many people have managed to get home, and we continue to work to repatriate any who remain stranded.

I have regular updates with NHS leaders locally, as well as weekly calls with Shropshire Council to discuss responses across the county. I have been in touch with each care home and domiciliary care provider operating in South Shropshire to understand the particular issues they face in keeping their residents and staff safe.

The House of Commons returned from the Easter recess in a partially digital format, though I have been continuously raising issues throughout this crisis with Ministers, who are working flat out. I have chaired the Environmental Audit Committee meeting in virtual sessions to maintain scrutiny of the government.

As I write, it is not yet clear when this lockdown will end. But knowing fit and able people who have only just survived its effects, including of course the Prime Minister, I am well aware of the seriousness of coronavirus. But I am also convinced we will get through this crisis as a country, and I am sure the community spirit and respect for carers shown during this pandemic will last for years to come.

I felt, as usual, Her Majesty, in only her fifth address to the nation as Queen, captured the mood of the nation so well when she said: "I hope in the years to come everyone will be able to take pride in how they responded to this challenge. And those who come after us, will say that the Britons of this generation, were as strong as any."

Keep safe and well.

### MEMORIES OF DAYS AS A SHEPHERDESS

Editor JR has invited me to share a few memories of when I was a shepherdess. I loved lambing time and when I was a lot younger and fitter I went around farms in the UK, helping to bring lambs into the world.

I recall the special times when something happened with a happy ending. Like on the Isle of Mull, where I went three years running. I found a new born lamb in the river. Its mother had decided to lamb on top of a steep bank and the lamb had slipped straight down. Luckily, I was able to scoop it out just in time, cold and wet. It was a beautiful hot spring day and the heat of the sun and the mother's attention revived it. A successful rescue!

In Perthshire I helped to lamb a ewe and was amazed when number four was delivered and then number five. She was just an ordinary Scottish Blackface ewe, but had a lot of fuss afterwards. Two of the lambs were fostered on to other ewes and she reared three. The following year she had five again, but sadly some were stillborn. But if I remember correctly, she still reared three.

At this same farm I heard a clattering in a watering can one day and found a swift inside. It had obviously missed its landing place in the eaves of the farmhouse and fallen into the can. I believe even if it had fallen onto the ground it wouldn't have survived unaided as they cannot fly up from ground level. I threw it out of a high window and away it flew.

Another little incidence that made me smile was when a lamb stamped its foot at me when I approached it - and it was only one day old! I wonder if it would have frightened away a fox.

I looked after a farm for friends in Perthshire once or twice, when they went on holiday. Their beloved labrador Broc was off colour when they were departing and he soon became much worse. I ended up as the vet's assistant, as it was Bank Holiday and no other

staff were around. Broc had a habit of carrying stones in his mouth. He had swallowed one and it was blocking his gut. The vet had to pull out what seemed to me yards of intestine until he found the stone, but all was well and Broc lived for many more years. My reward for that incident was an outing to Pitlochry Theatre. The couple and I still keep in touch.

One of the jobs I was given on their farm was to milk Daisy the Jersey cow by machine and make butter from the cream - an enjoyable job. When Daisy was going to be sold for slaughter I did a deal with the folks and bought her. (I was staying at the farm where the quins were born at the time, so had her there ) There was a very, very small chance that she was in calf and I was thrilled when she proved to be definitely in calf and had a lovely baby in due course. So I prolonged her life and it was a happy one.

When I was helping with my uncle's lambing in Wales, a distraught ewe was looking for her lamb. The stockman and I searched for it but had no luck, so we caught the ewe and penned her up indoors. My uncle came on the scene and insisted on releasing the ewe. She made a beeline for a rabbit hole in the field, where the lamb was stuck down it, completely out of sight and alive. I learned a lesson that day - Mum knows best, and so did my uncle!

One day one of his Welsh ewes had twins, one white and one completely black. She took an instant dislike to the black one, so it ended up as my pet lamb on the farm in Warwickshire where I was brought up. She lived for many years and had lambs of her own, but never a black one if my memory is correct. I do remember that she hated being dipped and always had a panic attack, almost drowning herself, so we had to be prepared to pull her out quickly.

I have enjoyed this reminiscing. *Marian Rees*

#### **MEMORIES OF OLD CLEOBURY**

Janet Dickinson writes about the town she knew:



This is Old Cleobury some time before Janet got to know it. The Royal Fountain has come along quite a bit since then.

I remember the old Cleobury, do you?

You did not have to go far for all your needs. Lots of work in the factories, Mullers, Murray's and the jam factory in New Road. Coal from Ted Purslow at Pinkham. Car repairs at Tom Pain's workshop next door to the Manor House.

Get your horse some new shoes at Ted Lane's blacksmiths shop, where the road to Mortimer Gardens is now. Your own shoes could be repaired by Denis Bowden or Sonny Edwards. Sonny's shop was on the corner where the road goes to Tenbury Wells, it was a regular meeting place for men to have a chat.

Sandy Millichip in the High Street had electrical goods, and would top up your accumulator for the old fashion radios, he also ran the local brass band.

Reg Charles had buses, opposite the church, served all the local schools, and took shoppers to Tenbury Wells and Kidderminster from all the villages around.

Christine Korner (Cartwright) was the local dressmaker. There were two banks, Midland and Lloyds. Newspapers could be brought at Webb's and Wakemans. Two shops where you could buy new shoes. Get your hair done at Mrs Wenlocks, where Shirley Pugh started her career.

A.C.Corden had the shop with three windows opposite the church, where they sold clothing, bedlinen and drapery. Also owned what became Ashley's Bakery, where all types of furniture was sold.

There were five grocery stores, Downes, Lloyds, Barrett's, Knowles and Jones.

Three Butchers, Tongues, Humphries and Worralls.

Three bakers, Jones, Potters and Onions. I remember the tasty cream buns from Onions a special treat.

Two ironmongers. I had been to Corbetts ironmongers to look at a catalogue for new bicycles. When I had chosen one, Tom Boddey said he would get it in ready. I had not saved enough money and would not take it till I had. So Tom hung it in the window over the shop, so I saw it each time I passed by. He was a lovely gentle man.

Our favourite shop was the sweet shop, where the carpet shop is now. It was owned by Mr Walster and Mrs Hunt. There were rows and rows of tall glass jars filled with sweets, and you got quite a lot in a diamond shaped bag for a few pennies. We were a long time deciding what sort to have, but the ladies were very patient.

How could I forget the glorious smells from two fish and chips shops? Mrs Lane had one in the High Street and Mrs Charles in Lower Street.

Mr T.H Pain provided the Cinema. Tickets were 6 pence, 1/6 and 2/6 luxury seats at the back. Jock Gibbons keeping law and order over the courting couples.

Sorry I've rambled on. Things change, but memories stay with us.



#### WELL DONE, CLEOBURY

If there were any doubts about the strength and intelligence in this community, the way the coronavirus emergency is being handled should put the matter beyond question. It's not perfect and there may be valid criticisms, but for a small town to take on such a massive problem at short notice is quite remarkable.

With the World Health Authority admitting that it was a pandemic there were people talking already. Town Council chair Debbie Brown, Clerk Matt Sheehan, CoCo coordinator Katja Jones and Councillor Paul French met and drew up a plan using Cleobury Country Centre as a base until the government announced such places should close; Darren Reynolds then offered a room at Lacon Childe School, until that too had to close. So the team all work from home, with a live spreadsheet designed by Debbie Brown for everyone who's working on the project to report and receive news and needs in the town.

People came forward to volunteer help. 80 to Matt Sheehan and Katja at CoCo and the Church pastoral team had a total of 50, making 130, which has now grown to 156. They haven't all been called upon, because their time has been used thoughtfully to avoid lots of people overlapping. Less human traffic means less risk of the virus being spread.

The food shops have been tremendously generous and helpful. PD at Select and Save offered to pay for 50 loaves with milk, eggs and butter to be handed out, Phil and Rose at The Talbot Hotel organised an Easter raffle with proceeds going to the Food Bank and at the Coop the home deliveries are shared between their staff and the volunteers, Cleobury Seafood and Freezer Centre is offering home deliveries of their big range of foodstuffs.

The amount of work running this and dealing with the phone enquiries was too big a burden for Matt Sheehan to handle for long and Paul French took over the phone work until he too opted to self isolate and then the work was divided up amongst the town councillors. They work to a rota, all using the established mobile number:

They then pass on messages to the appropriate coordinators. There's team of five, each doing

that job one day a week: Catherine Evans, Mandy Smith, Liz Smith, Pete Blackburn and Giulia Johnson


I must tell you that I have personal experience of the help that is available, when my son made it clear that I should not be off around the county distributing the April Clarion - too much exposure to the virus, which is not sensible for one in the high risk category. So I asked Katja if it was possible to get help and four volunteers came forward. My thanks to David Walford, Sue and Josh Brown, Caroline Bills and Liz Walker; I hope to see them all again on May 1st. I did offer to pay their fuel costs, but none of them took up that idea. Good people and generous too

In addition to this publicised effort are the quiet people, working away. Sue Delmar at Neen Savage saw an appeal in the village Facebook page from Nadeena, an anaesthetist working in Birmingham. She wanted anyone with sewing experience to help in making gowns for the NHS staff and after one approach Sue had a man call at the door with a heap of fabric pieces to make the much needed garments. So far she has got Catherine Evans, Gayna Woodland and Angela Flowers at work and would welcome more. Sue is on 01299 270379. As she explained: "If I can get ten people making one gown a day, that's 70 a week." The effort may be here in the Cleobury area, but the effect spreads far beyond our boundaries.

We talked to Katja Jones. "We've supported 270 people in the first month. If we can, we point them towards shops that we know can deliver." There is good feedback through the Medical Centre team, one patient telling his GP that he didn't know how he would have coped without the support of the volunteers.

It's a system that works well. If you are confined to the house, you can call whichever local shop you normally deal with and pay for your order by card. If the shop can deliver, that's fine. If they are working on a reduced staff, it can be brought to your door by one of the volunteers. Easy peasy.

Stay home, take care and you can stay safe, thanks to the great people of this community. *Jim Reynolds*







The sun is shining, the apple blossom is out and I've seen three Slow Worms enjoying the heat under one of our pieces of corrugated iron down the track. I love May: it is spring and summer, with the freshness of one and the heat of the other. May takes the accelerating growth, warmth and day length of April and leaves it with a full complement of summer bird visitors joining the rest of our wildlife in the serious business of breeding. By the way, the 'mystery bird' which delighted me with its trilling song all around our garden turned out not to be a rare summer visitor but a common Wren, singing its heart out in the effort to retain its territory and mate/mates.

This month is spectacularly marked by the arrival of Bluebells. They are predominantly woodland flowers and look delightful under a canopy of newly unfurled, bright green leaves of oak, beech or other deciduous trees. They have to flower, seed and replenish the energy stores of their bulbs before the shade becomes too dense.

Consequently they won't be found under evergreens, whether conifer, holly or yew, which never allow enough sunlight to reach the ground. They may enjoy a sunnier spot for a while after an area of forest has been cleared, as long as the woodland soil with its store of native plants is still there and the micro-climate remains sufficiently damp. They reproduce both by seed and multiplication of their bulbs. One of our regular magazines often carries an advertisement aimed at landowners which promises 'excellent prices to thin out specified areas (of wild woodland plants) - very little disturbance caused'. I'm sure this can be done in a sustainable way, allowing the plants to replenish themselves, but I can't help feeling concerned. The Wildlife and Countryside Act of 1981 made it illegal to uproot any wild plant without the landowner's permission, but there is a great demand for wild flowers in gardens and amenity planting which may tempt woodland owners to let the diggers in. I hope you'll enjoy the photo of Bluebells in the Wyre Forest (near Beaucastle in this case – thank you Mick Farmer) and be able to experience the sight and smell of the flowers in a bluebell wood near you without disturbing them.

The Wild Garlic or Ramsons also burst into flower in lush, damp areas of woodland this month. The plant's smell makes it easy to identify and it has become popular with foragers: picking the leaves in small quantities before the flowers open can give a delicious salad, wilted greens or pesto. But beware – the plant is poisonous to dogs and cats!



#### Stepping Out! Who's Walking, When and Where.

#### **ROCK PATHFINDERS**

Rock Pathfinders have been walking as a group for over 30 years. The group was started in 1986 by a few keen walkers who all lived in the village of Rock. At that time many of the ancient footpaths were not passable and so the group set about clearing and re discovering the paths and they formed Rock Parish Footpaths Association.

Clearing the overgrown paths was a major task and and new members were recruited to help with the work. The local parish council was approached to help with funds to purchase finger posts and stiles. Once a few routes had been established walks were organised and held on the first Sunday of the month. Each walker was asked to pay a small subscription to add to the funds needed for materials.

The walks became more popular as word spread about the beautiful countryside the paths went through. The group eventually gained support from the County Council and received aid on the form of annual grant they could apply for. Rock is the second largest parish in the country and ancient maps showed there had been 149 footpaths.

The work was all done by volunteers and it took many years but now all the paths are opened, well way marked. Bridges, ditch crossings, finger post and stiles are still maintained by the volunteers and the footpath warden, although now the County Council provide the materials so the group no longer has to worry about fund raising. However, it is important to keep the paths open by making sure they are regularly walked and any faults reported.

The group changed their name in 2009 to Rock Pathfinders when they decided to increase the walks to twice a month and extended to routes to outside the parish boundary. The walks are now held on first and third Thursdays in the month and during the summer there are some evening walks.



#### Lavender Hill Larks

One dark evening in late 1965, my mate Stan and I were sitting in his car at a set of traffic lights in Lavender Hill, which was then a run down part of South London made famous by the Ealing comedy film. For the anoraks amongst you, Stan's car was a 1954 Sunbeam Mark III saloon based on the Sunbeam Alpine, in turn named after the rally it had won in 1951 and not to be confused with the 1960's hairdresser's car of the same name. It was two tone 'Claret and Grey', although I would have said maroon and beige, with a 2.25 litre 4 cylinder engine and looked very smart. In fact, an identical one sometimes appears at the Marches Transport Festival in Ludlow (16-17 May 2020 should you be interested). Although only about 10 years old, spares were difficult to get but, by chance, during our nocturnal wanderings (don't ask), we had discovered a similar car abandoned, as was common back then, in a rough part of Notting Hill.

That area was far from the yuppie paradise it is today so, in case someone else took a fancy to it, we made regular visits to 'freecycle' much needed parts and were returning from one such foray when we stopped at the lights. On the left of us was a small jewellers shop and opposite on the right was Lavender Hill Police Station so, whilst waiting for the green light, I glanced into the jewellers window. As I watched, a hand appeared from the back of the counter, grabbed a piece of jewellery and vanished. Intrigued, I continued watching and a few seconds later, this was repeated. I pointed this out to Stan and when the lights changed, we parked round the corner and went in to the Police station.

We explained what we had seen to the desk sergeant, resulting in much commotion and the appearance of about a dozen coppers in various states of undress as it was about 10 pm and shift change time. You can tell this happened a long time ago as there was a local Police Station, it was open and it contained Policemen. As one, they thundered across the road and started hammering on the jeweller's door,

whereupon a figure leapt to his feet and vanished into the back of the shop. There was much shouting and yelling from the assembled throng along the lines of 'Oi, you, come back 'ere' etc until someone suggested that it might be a good idea to see whether there was a rear entrance. To a man, like a herd of buffaloes, everyone rushed round to the rear of the premises which was bounded by a high wall. At this point, a head appeared over the top of the wall, took one look at the massed Constabulary gathered below and vanished. There was further shouting along the same lines as before until I asked if anyone had been left to watch the front. It appeared not, and on returning to the shop front, the door was open and the premises empty. A helpful passer by then offered the information that a man had emerged from the shop and legged it into the darkness.

Somewhat deflated, the constables drifted back into the nick. Clearly the events of the evening had not been considered a success as when I asked the Sergeant if he wanted a witness statement so that the incident could be properly recorded, he invited me to go forth and multiply (or words to that effect). And that was the end of another interesting evening in Sarf Lunnun. As for Stan, he joined the Army shortly afterwards for reasons best known to himself. I was impressed at the effect that organisation had on my friend as, when he returned from initial training, he had been transformed from fat slob to slim, fit and very smart squaddie. This didn't last, as he told me that although he was a trained telex operator in civvy street, he had convinced his superiors that he was a Devil worshipper and spent his three years in the ranks as a dental assistant. After discharge he was last seen driving a minicab. And the car? Sadly, it was not long for this world. Shortly after joining up, Stan sold it to a fellow squaddie who painted it black and then wrote it off, so RIP MNR 571 (or possibly 471, it was a long time ago...) Steve Todd

As soon as we were informed that we were expecting a pandemic, the Town Council acted straight away identifying groups in the community that were gearing up to help the vulnerable. We contacted Katja and Ashley to see what they were doing, and we also had to consider the food bank.

As well as this we took steps following government guidelines to close certain amenities, but we are lucky here to have so much open spaces. Other things we had to do straight away was cancel the Town annual meeting and the Festival, put together posters and start working from home.

We were lucky that our Chair Cllr Debbie Brown is working in the NHS and was aware of what would be facing. We took the lead in a working collaboration of CM Town Council, the voluntary sector including Co Co & the Pastoral Care Group and agreed to put together a fund of £1,000 each in a pot to help over the coming weeks as needed. We worked straight away to design posters, spread information and use one phone, the council mobile, which is now shared by councillors to gather information to pass on to the Co Co volunteers to deliver the needs required.

We work alongside Katja and the Co Co volunteers to identify and list volunteers and marry them up to vulnerable people in need. We also contacted local shops and businesses to see how we could help each other and work together. Hence working alongside the Co Op, some shop owners, Landlords and food outlets, all working to get the information out there.


The Town council also contacted surrounding Towns and Parishes to get a list together of what they were doing in their area, so in some cases we could sign post and work together not stepping on each other's toes. We get regular government updates and make sure we put it out there either on our website or through social media.

The Town council continues to work in partnership, keep the Food Bank every Friday going and look for and accept funding to help us through this crisis.

Our future meetings will be on Zoom with access for Public to join us, which will be widely advertised, and were sorry to lose a couple of councillors recently and have already filled one vacancy and will be looking for the second one by end of May.

A big thank you to all volunteers and people and businesses going that extra mile to help others and we hope it continues long after this is over. Take Care and Stay safe.





#### IN BUSINESS - Julie Widdowson at Severn Architects



If you're starting a business where hard earned skills and an ability to get along with people is important, Julie Widdowson is a good example of how to do it well. The daughter of a miner, born in Chesterfield, North Derbyshire, where they have a noted twisted spire at their own Saint Mary's parish church, you could believe she was fated to settle here in Cleobury Mortimer. Deja vu with a strong note.

Julie showed signs of independent thinking early on, leaving school at 16 with just three O Levels to her name and working in a local drawing office in an atmosphere that convinced her she really should get some decent qualifications. The model late developer, she took up evening classes and worked towards her goal via O and A Levels. At 24, an age when many young women would regard themselves as settled, she left work, applied for a grant and enrolled at what is now Birmingham City University as an architecture student. That was in 1984 and she knew there was a long road ahead to qualification, seven years of it. She just got her head down and worked towards what she had realised was her goal in life.

You'll gather from the length of time it took that becoming a qualified architect is no easy matter, as the student learns the rudiments of a wide variety of skills and materials, and how to coordinate them on site when the building starts. Julie has a strong feeling for design, "It's a bit of an artistic element in me," she explains. She wants the project, which can range from a domestic extension to a multi million pound new building,

to look right, with the close attention to detail that gives the best finishing touch.

She's worked in private and public sectors, specialising in school design and large PFI projects in Yorkshire, Nottinghamshire and Shropshire. One of her biggest projects was the Hadley Learning Centre in Telford, where she liaised with Doctor Gill Eatough, who readers may remember from her days as head teacher at Lacon Childe. The two of them got along well, with Julie taking time to talk everything through with the client and listening carefully to what they wanted. That capacity to listen and understand what the client wants is a great strength in her customer relations.

Julie's last public sector appointment was heading the design unit at Worcestershire County Council, until the unit was sold into private hands. She says very little about that, but it's clear the new set-up did not fit in with her views. "I voted with my feet," as she puts it.

In 2014 she opted for self employment and went into partnership with another architect when a partner retired. There she developed a client base in bespoke residential projects which included some one-off individual houses with a strong emphasis on Eco design. Now, in an amicable split she's opted to work from home as an independent, that streak that was obvious in youth coming out again.

So she's widely experienced and knowledgeable, how does she get along with clients? We chatted to Robin Greenwell, who found her after parting with an architect lacking in manners and human understanding. He talked to Julie on the phone, sent pictures of the old barn he and his wife wanted to convert and Julie came to see the place.

"She was obviously on the same page as we were," he says. "She got her quote in on time and helped us develop our own ideas of what we wanted. I think the key to our relationship was her understanding of the emotional part of it." As Robin had recently retired, what he and his wife were looking for was a place that was developed around their needs and talking to him you realise they've found it. And when he was tackling the building of a stone wall in the garden, he got the expert advice he needed on the best mortar from Julie. Helping her clients doesn't stop when the job's finished.

# Kit Smith takes a look at life as we know it and ponders on the future we could build for the benefit of us all.

We live in quite extraordinary times. An almost invisible organism has changed all our lives. At the time of writing this article in mid April, we do not know how it will all play out and for how long it will last. It has brought great sadness and misery for too many in such a short time. Local businesses large and small are closed or on short time opening. Many families are in lock down in their homes while other essential services are maintained by a wonderful band of workers. Above all those in the NHS or allied services risk their lives and their health on an hourly basis for all of us. The sound of clapping, bashing of pans and live music on a Thursday evening is testament of our deep thanks to all of those people.

In many ways we are so lucky in this part of rural South Shropshire. The danger of infection is less than in a big city and we in Cleobury can all reach the open countryside within a five minute walk of our homes. Not so for city dwellers, many of whom are trapped in tower blocks with their children and unemployed husbands and with no access to parks and green spaces. As we walk our footpaths we can hear the chatter from the hedgerows with nature wondering where all the humans have gone - they are usually much noisier than this? What is reassuring to us is that the rest of the whole animal and plant kingdoms carry on as usual.

We have spoken face to face to very few people since lockdown but thank goodness for the phone and a huge IT resource. There has been a simple but clear common message: we are optimistic and are re-

evaluating our lives in a new and simpler way. We are determined to carry our optimism through the epidemic and make changes on the other side, for our future and that of those who follow us. Here in Cleobury there is a robust community structure to plan and implement change. The gold awarded Town Council had agreed a series of plans for the future before the virus struck. The Neighbourhood Plan sets out where imposed new housing will be whilst seeking the least damage to the total environment. The Council plan a Carbon Foot Print Assessment, leading to a Carbon Free Cleobury. There are plans to plant 1,000 trees and provide even better access to the countryside. We have over 75 amazing clubs and societies who have shown from the start of this epidemic that they can contact, care and look after their membership. A Dementia Friendly Group and plans for the Methodist Hall for St. Mary's Youth Group will help the young and the elderly. Over 130 volunteers are helping vulnerable people with all sorts of services, care and friendship. The Plastic Reduction Group have postponed going for a Plastic Free Cleobury until after the virus allows people to meet again. As ever there are many unsung people's effort and valuable work. All in all, real people working for the wider community.

Perhaps we can ask that at the suitable moment at the end of all the restrictions the Town Council will lead us with a meeting or assembly to capture our new found energy and resolve and to voice our hopes and fears to plan a new and invigorated Cleobury Country. Meanwhile let's stay indoors, fit, healthy and keep washing our hands.




