An adjournment was then granted until May 7th and an extension of his unconditional bail was also granted. We hope our promised report of the trial proceedings will appear in our June issue.


GRAHAM PAIN

Farewell and Thank You, Madge



She's been a councillor at different levels since 1978 and has decided to stand down and let the slightly younger set take over. A true Shropshire lady, born in Oakengates in 1935, Madge Shineton moved to Cleobury Mortimer when she was six months old and her father took over the job of town policeman.

"The Police rented a house for us on Castle Hill and it was in a right state. Then they put us in a better place on The Hurst." She was a kid when World War Two brought so many changes and a range of American troop camps in the area. "I was too young to get involved, but I did learn to jitterbug," she admits with a smile. Ask your granny about that dance...

She left school at 15 and found a job at Mr Duerdin's chemist shop, where she learned a lot under his careful instruction. She had no scholastic qualification, having been ill when she would normally have taken exams, but was clearly bright and when she thought she'd like to try nursing, an application to Dudley Road Hospital in Birmingham got her a place.

Progress through her nursing career to become a State Registered Nurse after four years of studying reflected the determination to learn the business; later she was awarded the Diploma in Traumatic Surgery. From Birmingham she moved to Kidderminster General Hospital in Mill Street, where she was promoted to the post of Sister in Charge of the Casualty Department and making it clear that looking after patients was the vital task, not bending to the will of self opinionated specialists. The woman she was reluctant to allow into her department was one who found her hard to deal with.

"Some times you have to do something to wake people up," she explains. After more arguments than she had time for, she quit the job and went off to work nights at the extended Blakebrook Hospital and give a little time to Fred Shineton, the new man in her life. He was building a business at Hollows Nursery outside Stottesdon and that's where they settled after tying the knot. And just talking to local people made Madge aware of the problem of housing for the young; her sense of justice couldn't be kept down and she sums it up neatly today: "We were desperate for housing and support for small businesses. There are three things you need: Health, Housing and Jobs! Education comes next."

In 1978 she stood as a candidate for Stottesdon Parish Council. "Only to make

up the numbers," she insists. "I didn't expect to get elected!" She was and a new purpose in life emerged.

She made her mark as a lady prepared to stand up and fight for local people, which won't surprise anyone who's dealt with her today. She joined the Shropshire Rural Housing Association and before long there were new affordable houses built in Stottesdon.

She pays warm tribute to John Morris-Jones, chair of the Shropshire Rural Housing Association, who heard of a building on the market in the centre of Shrewsbury and suggested they take a look on their way to an RHA meeting. The result was the property bought and still in use as the Association's headquarters.

She became a very active member of the Federation of Small Businesses, acting as the representative for the three counties of Shropshire, Worcestershire and Herefordshire.

That's a lot to cram into a life as well as raising a family and building the nursery business, plus taking on the job of a County Councillor. Those who know her will tell you she'll find time to listen and offer advice and help if it's needed. What she's never had is an air of someone who thinks they are important. She's respected as a straight lady who's given a lot of time and effort to make life better in this area. After 45 years of giving and working for others, she's certainly earned a rest, but she's still Vice President of the Association of Local Councils.

CLEOBURY MORTIMER ROYAL BRITISH LEGION UPDATE

Chairman Mike Hermolle writes:

The RBL is still here and the Branch has been active throughout the pandemic lockdowns, although we have had no events since our annual lunch in March last Since then we have vear. managed one face-to-face meeting last November, otherwise we have communicated by online meetings, email and newsletters. According to the government's roadmap, our next meeting will be on July 14th and afterwards we hope to restart our regular events as the lifting of restrictions permits.

This year marks the centenary of the Royal British Legion and the Branch. The Legion's anniversary is on May 15th and the Branch's is on July 19th. During that week we hope to have a number of events and will let you know

about them as soon as possible.

The purpose for which the Royal British Legion was formed is described in our Royal Charter and may be summarised as welfare to the service community. This community is defined as serving and ex-serving personnel and their dependents and is now known as Branch Community Support or BCS. RBL has a wide range of services and organisations to help if required and can be accessed through the contact number 0808 802 8080. Or you can contact me, the Cleobury Mortimer Branch Chairman on 07973 699829.

At the local level we are able to offer Home and Hospital visits (currently suspended) Telephone Buddy support and Bereavement support, which is usually Standard Bearer attendance at a Funeral or arranging representatives to be present, arranged in consultation with the family. RBL support starts after one day of service and

continues through life, long after that service is over.

The Branch welcomes new members to help with these activities and you can join through the RBL website www.britishlrgion.org.uk and follow the "get involved" link. You can also contact me at the number above. Exservice personnel are particularly welcome.

I am aware that there may be ex-service people in the community who I don't know and would be happy to meet you (with no obligation to join). To that end, starting on May 4th I will be at the Cleobury Community Hub every Tuesday from 10.30 to 12.00 for coffee and a chat. Initially we will have to be outside in a group of six or less but as restrictions ease this will improve. Naturally current RBL members are also welcome.

In normal times, our Parish Church serves the community more than most of us realise. Apart from the regular Sunday services, it's where weddings, christenings and funerals take place and once a month the whole place gets rearranged to accommodate the Cleobury Country Farmers Market. But in these strange Covid-cursed days the building was locked down and only opened its doors again very recently.

An occasional church goer, I went to the Easter Day service, partly because that is the day when all Christians are expected to attend and also out of curiosity to see how the need to keep social distancing was managed. The provision to sanitize your hands at the entrance was a sign that care was taken.

There were none of the traditional pews in sight and seating was on carefully spaced pairs of chairs. There was no handing out of prayer books as you entered; these were already on the seats so there was no hand contact made. People smiled and chatted in greeting, but again no hand shakes.

Rector Ashley Buck conducted the service along with curate Joe Simons, a new face to me but established and respected for his friendly manner by regular attenders. In the conventional Eucharist service there is a custom of the congregation offering each other a sign of peace with a handshake and a blessing; this time just a blessing.

The ceremonial breaking of the bread and drinking of wine as a symbol of Christ's blood is very different in the pandemic. The Rector sanitised his hands before handing out the traditional wafer of bread, and no wine was offered. Those who took the bread walked to their seats by a circuitous route, not back down the central aisle.

At the end of the service there was no social gathering in the church, the congregation moving outside and social distancing. I felt better for going - I always do - and was impressed that such a traditional event could be kept with apparent ease. I later learned better.



Social distancing means just 60 chairs carefully spaced out.

I noticed a small group of church goers working through the carefully laid out seating area, spraying the back and seat of each chair and wiping them down. I asked church treasurer Carol Turner if this was normal and she explained that the whole place was cleaned before the doors open and cleaned again at the end of the service. The same on

weekdays; clean before opening and clean before locking up for the night.

Prayer books and hymn books are locked away after the Sunday service and are not touched for a week, when they are safe to be used in the next service.

There is no paperwork allowed - it is a potential source of virus spreading. There are no weddings or christenings permitted and funerals are limited to 30 people attending. Only 30 chairs are put out on such occasions.

This work is led by Wardens Liz Smith and Nigel Hodgson, with Nigel's wife Ina giving vital aid to all this time consuming labour. There is a Track and Trace record book for us to leave names and numbers in case any visitor shows signs of virus infection. The church is open from 10.00 to 4.00 each day, for those who want to offer a quiet prayer or maybe time to sit in the quiet for reflection and undisturbed thinking.

All of this business of housekeeping is handled by a small band of volunteers. All of them devoted to their belief and happy to give time and effort to keep this lovely old building clean, hygienic in the current circumstances and open to the public, whether they are worshippers or simply curious visitors to the town

Seven gates have replaced stiles at Ladyfields, thanks to the landowner. There is now one stile-free route from Bayton to Clows Top. The council are going to replace the remaining difficult stile in the hedgerow; this is in the wrong place so the gate will be at a different point.

With the start of spring growth, it is time for my annual nag about bramble. Because of how long the shoots can grow and their readiness to set root wherever they touch the ground, an apparently clear path can be under threat very quickly and if left unchecked paths can get overgrown to the extent of being unusable in just a few vears. At the time I became footpath warden there were five paths, well used but still at serious risk:

From Timberlake south to Mamble

In the dip between the church and the Mamble Road

The north end of the byway from Colliers Hill through to the B4202.

From Teddon Farm to Beach Hay

From the back of Cleobury Lane to Reaside Manor

A lot of work has been done on them but the problem does not go away. If you walk any paths where there is bramble, please be aware of the problem and help to keep them useable. Spend a minute or so with secateurs or even a stick to bash them. Don't tread on

Philip Dunne's Letter from Westminster

Last month in the House of Commons I paid my condolences to Her Majesty and other members of the Royal Family, and joined other MPs in paying tribute to HRH The Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh.

For anyone under 75, Prince Philip as a key leader in our national life is all we have ever known. So his death marked the end of an era, and has left Her Majesty with an inevitable void, as he has been her rock of support throughout her remarkable reign.

The Duke of Edinburgh arrived on our shores as a young boy, lacking immediate family, having been educated initially in France in an American school, before going to Gordonstoun in Scotland. These experiences clearly forged his determination to help other young people to develop the confidence to shape their own futures, as he did as a young man. He did this through establishing the Duke of Edinburgh award scheme, from which many young Salopians have benefitted and continue to do so.

His wartime experience (where he was mentioned in dispatches for his service with the Royal Navy) and distinguished military service gave him and others of his generation an abiding sense of duty. It also instilled the importance of remembrance of those who had served their country and paid the ultimate sacrifice.

As a Commonwealth War Graves Commissioner, I know the many memorials and dedications he attended were deeply appreciated by the Armed Forces community. Perhaps most telling was one of the earliest, when unveiling the Second World War extension to the Chatham Naval Memorial in October 1952, where he pointed out that like all others who served in the Royal Navy during the war, he had

lost many friends and shipmates commemorated there. He could speak to and for veterans in a way that only someone who has served can do.

Prince Philip was always interested in conservation, but his visits to the southern oceans in 1956 sparked his concern about threats to nature, which made him a pioneer of preserving the environment. He was instrumental in establishing the World Wildlife Fund, and his enthusiasm never waned. He visited hundreds of WWF projects across five continents, over five decades. But he also used his position to promote conservation issues, inspiring people, from members of the public to world leaders, to protect nature and wildlife. This passion has been clearly been passed on to his children and his grandchildren. It will be an enduring part of his legacy.

Many in Shropshire will have fond memories of seeing the Duke of Edinburgh in 2012 as part of the Diamond Jubilee Tour, when he accompanied Her Majesty attending a pageant at RAF Cosford.

He also visited South Shropshire in 2003, with Her Majesty attending the Wenlock Olympian Games, and choosing perhaps provocatively to have lunch in the Discovery Centre in Craven Arms, in preference to Ludlow, the more obvious food capital of Shropshire, where they concluded their visit.

I am sure we will remember the life of Prince Philip for his dedication to our country and our Queen, and for the wit and candour he brought to his role, challenging all who met him to strive to do better in helping others.



The survey area is centred on the open hill land of Titterstone Clee and Clee Hill Common, extending to Knowlegate and Knowbury to the south, Bitterley to the west, Cleedownton and Bromdon to the north, and Catherton Common and Doddington to the east.

If you see or hear Curlew, Lapwing, Kestrel or Cuckoo any time between now and mid-July, anywhere in the area, we'd like to know, please. We particularly want Curlew records. If you've time to go out and look for them, that would be a big help, please.





As a professional will writer, Mandy Weston has precautionary advice to offer:

Since 23rd March 2020 life has changed dramatically for lots of us. It is hard to imagine what some families have gone through over this last year and also the NHS staff who have nursed all those who have had to go into hospital.

It's been a time when all of us have had to look to ourselves, discovering new ways to spend our time. Finding ways to spend many hours without social contact in person has been challenging at times for most of us. Isolation is sadly something which many people suffer at the best of times, but lockdown has made it so much worse and for many more people.

There is no better time to check that your wishes are placed in order and that your loved ones will not be left having to deal with unravelling a mess should you die.

If you cohabit with someone and you are not married or in a civil partnership the law does not provide for your cohabitee upon your death. It is very important that you make a Will. Your cohabitee does not even have the right to organise your funeral. This is a responsibility for the personal representative (Executor or Administrator). Neither does your cohabitee have a right to deal with your estate. This is all laid down by law and this may not be what you want. I believe it is much better to make a Will to ensure that the people you would like to arrange your funeral and administer your estate are the people you choose and not let the law dictate what will happen.

Furthermore, if you have children who are under the age of 18 years and you do not decide who is to be the Guardians of your children then it will be up to those left behind to apply to the court to be the Guardians of your children. This may not

be what you want and can cause delay and uncertainty for your children. You can appoint Guardians of your children in your Will in the event that all those who have parental responsibility for your children have died.

It is also important to consider who would be the Executor of your Will and Trustee of any continuing trust holding money for your children. It is recommended that the Trustees are different people to those appointed as Guardians. However, if it is not possible to find another two people to look after any money you leave for your children then it is possible to have your Guardians as Trustees also.

Did you know that if you do not have a Lasting Power of Attorney and you lost capacity, someone would have to apply to be your Deputy? Deputy applications are made to the Court of Protection and are an expensive and a time-consuming exercise. It is recommended that you put in place Lasting Powers of Attorney whilst you are fit and able so that everything is set up and in place should you ever need an Attorney to step in and act on your behalf. Over the last year or so there has never been a franker reminder that none of us know what lies around the corner and being ready for whatever we can is the best option. By putting in place Lasting Powers of Attorney you can rest easy in the knowledge that you have done everything you possibly can to make the job of those having to pick up the reigns and support you with finances and health decisions so much easier as it will all be in place ready.

Fists Aloft, Shouting at the Moon

I used to think that weather reports were a bit of a waste of time. Granted, there would be the odd times of the year when you'd watch them like a hawk - during cold snaps for snow (the chance to bunk off school) or during heatwaves (anything above 25°C was worth getting excited about as your Dad reached for the barbecue tongs). But the day-to-day climate that hangs around for 99% of the year was deemed so unremarkable that I'd immediately zone out as soon as a weather map appeared onscreen.

Oh, how things have changed. I now find myself glued to the short and long term forecasts. I've got multiple apps on my phone. And I'll check my knackered barometer when things get particularly tense.

The reason? Plants.

This year, I've embarked on yet another rollercoaster ride in the garden. Like previous years, it's high octane stuff:

- My overwintered collection of Sweet Williams appear to flinch at the merest temperature drop, despite me continually coddling them in the greenhouse.
- My tulips yes, the saga continues play silly beggars by playing hide and seek (1 in 5 seem to have shown the fortitude to show their heads, the rest remain nestled underground, where I assume they will now stay until next year).
- And my sweet peas have been in and out of the cold frame so many times that I unconsciously start humming the 'okey-cokey' every time I walk past them.

Much of my obsessive temperature checking is down to my big 'Garden 2021' plans; plans that run the risk of remaining a

well-intentioned doodle in a notebook if I don't get the seeds out of the packet and into some compost pronto.

All of this said, if there's one thing that growing older and having a few gardening seasons under my belt has taught me, it's that we have little to no control over any of this stuff. I can swear creatively at Carol on BBC Breakfast as she informs us of yet another unseasonal cold front hitting our region, but it won't change a thing.

The seasons will tick over as they always do.

It's happening right now - as I look out my window, the sun is shining, the daffs are starting to drop their heads and retreat, and the tulips are limbering up for their moment of glory. It won't be long until the bluebells kick in, and then, in the blink of an eye, we'll be hurtling towards the end of Summer and thinking about raking up leaves.

So no, I won't wish my time away or pray for an early Summer. I'll go with the flow, happy in the knowledge that nature will take care of the flowers as I crack on with the other jobs in the garden. One final quote, courtesy of Marie Huston, sums it all up rather nicely:

"The gardening season officially begins on January 1st and ends on December 31st."

This month lends its name to various plants and animals that are conspicuous at this time of year.

Firstly we can look out for the arrival of white hawthorn blossom along the hedgerows. Called simply 'May', the white, five-petalled flowers with dark pink stamens appear after the leaves, unlike the blackthorn which is in a hurry to get its white blossom out first and beats hawthorn by a month. It seems to have been noted as a boundary marker at least from Saxon times but became much more common when it was used extensively as a hedging plant to divide the commons during the enclosures of the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries. 'Flora Britannica' by Richard Mabey devotes six pages to the hawthorn and its folklore. The superstition that it is unlucky to bring May into a house seems to be pretty widespread across the UK, and this might have something to do with its rather pungent smell, which repels some people (its chemical composition includes a compound produced by decaying flesh) but is certainly attractive to many insects.

This brings us to two insects linked to the month of May. Mayflies are associated with freshwater and fishing. Clouds of the adults, with struggling flight and trailing tails, rise from the water as they hatch from aquatic nymphs (the young stage) this month. They make easy prey for fish and birds and, in any case, they are very short-lived, mating, egg-laying and dying within a day in some species. The name of the mayfly order is

'Ephemeroptera', referring to their brief lives.



The Maybug. Not a friend of gardeners with its habit of leaving grubs to feed on plant roots.

The second insect is the huge beetle often called a Maybug, which flies clumsily around external lights at night in early summer and can often be found, exhausted, on your doorstep in the morning. Also known as Cockchafers, they are well-known and disliked by gardeners. The adults eat fruit and flowers but the larvae are the main objects of wrath: they hatch from eggs laid in grasslands and spend the next three or four years feeding on roots and causing the sudden death of favourite garden plants. You may have found these fat, white grubs with brown heads when digging, and they make a good meal for Rooks and Badgers.

May is the usual month for dawn chorus walks. Set your alarm early and get yourself to some woodland for about 5.30 to experience one of the natural world's most delightful performances. I know there are 'apps' to help with identification of different songs but I'd be more likely myself to take a look at (and listen to) the website www.songbird-survival.org.uk.

Welcome to May, the month when our world should be reopening for business as we used to know it. Since last March 2020 when the impact of the CoronaVirus started to take effect and impact our daily lives, many of us "took to the hills" figuratively speaking and were fortunate enough to have employment/employers who enabled us to work from home. During these last 13 months, scammers have upped their game as well and we have seen an exponential increase in those who would try to deceive us and rob us. Fortunately, our knowledge of these practices has also increased. Across the world there are still thousands of people who have been tricked and lost a lot of money, in some cases their life savings. The authorities have always been behind in tackling this crime but in fairness the amount of information that is available today does make it difficult for the criminals to conduct business. I regularly get reports from readers who have had calls on home phones, on mobiles and emails all with the common thread that starts with a gentle threat of possible legal action if the respondent does not comply.

As I outlined last month, the advances in technology have made it so much easier to canvas thousands of people a day at little effort from the scammers. A recent example quoted to me suggests it is from what is known as the Government Valuation Office Agency. The email advises the recipient that they are due a tax refund and offers a link to a form that requires your personal details. I have detailed the dangers of responding to any unsolicited request for personal details, so the delete key on your email is the one to use. Interestingly enough there is actually such a department in the Government, but it exists to value property for the benefit of calculation

things like council tax. Nothing to do with personal taxation. Another scam not involving the internet or phones is also doing the rounds. It's more complex for a scammer to set this up as you will see but the rewards can be high for them.

The target unexpectedly receives a new Debit Card from their bank. It was not contactless as most if not all new cards are these days. The enclosed letter had all the normal info on using the card and activating it. For most people, getting a new card that is not contactless is not much use, but in the example I am quoting the recipient went to their bank and asked to change the card. The bank checked and said they had not issued a new card and it was just as well the user had not activated it as their accounts would have been immediately compromised. The bank immediately cancelled all the user's cards and issued new 'real' ones.

Sadly, the list goes on. Thank you for reading the various articles I have presented over the last few months, as we exit our lockdowns and life starts to resemble normal, I wish you all the best and to continued awareness and being alert, it is your money after all. 


