If you want a domestic safe, he'll supply and fit one with a £1000 cash rating for insurance purposes, for £50.

He has a wide array of tools to keep criminals out of your home or business premises and The Clarion has arranged for him to talk to the Neighbourhood Watch Scheme at their Spring 2012 meeting in the Methodist Hall.

AN AMAZING EVENING



KEEPING THE WAY CLEAR

The Clee View Bridleway Group was formed just over a year ago, to help keep bridleways clear for horse riders and walkers. They also work on RUPPS, which makes life easier for farm vehicles on the move.

Early in October we talked to a work party laying a new drainage pipe along an ancient highway that runs off the Oreton Road, on to the Clee Common and the road to Cleeton St Mary. The overhanging trees had already been cropped back to let Steve Jones's digger through, to dig a ditch for the new pipe.

The main reason for this work was safety, so that horses and

riders can move along this path in peace, instead of on the road amongst traffic.

John Sutton is the chair, a man with a wealth of local knowledge and appreciation of the need to keep the more obscure routes open for everyone to use. With the probable exception of 4WD drivers, who sometimes charge down quiet rural routes, often to end up in a ditch and ask the nearest farmer to pull them out.

The Group concentrates on restoration and maintenance of the bridleways that do not get attention from the County Highways, simply because of cost. This local band has had grants from the County, but also organises fund raising events to cover inevitable costs. If you can help them they'd be glad to hear from you; call Chris Bargman on CM 270514.

People who give their time to causes like this are amongst the overlooked heroes of the rural world - and aren't there a lot of those? The countryside we enjoy, to drive through on the way to work, to walk or ride through as part of a hobby, or just to look at and admire from a passing bus, is kept looking so very good because people who live in it are willing to give time and effort to preserve its beauty. They do it with minimal support maximum passion.

HOPTON WAFERS PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The recent community-led plan survey said parishioners wanted to know more about what the Council does. Hence this quarterly update which will appear in the Clarion, on the website and around the parish.

ANNUAL PARISH MEETING: The Annual Parish Meeting on May 23rd was well attended. The annual report and financial report are available on the website.

COUNCIL MEETINGS; These take place on the second Monday of every month in one of the three village halls. The next is on November 14th, 7.00pm in Cleeton St Mary. All residents are welcome.

COMMUNITY WEBSITE: The Council has sponsored a community website, which is a work in progress, but already has full details of Council meetings and copies of minutes etc.

SPEEDING: Almost 5000 vehicles per day pass through Doddington and Hopton Wafers, many going too fast. A top speed of 86mph was recorded past the Crown. The Council has had extra signs put up, with roundels in the roadway. There is also a speed activated sign which will

periodically appear in Doddington. Early indications are that speeds are reduced.

HIGHWAYS MAINTENANCE:

The Council has obtained a grant to help with minor works such as ditch clearing and gritting side roads in winter.

PLANNING: The Council is a consultee on local applications. Except for minor applications, councillors will endeavour to visit those affected by applications to gauge their opinions.

COMMUNITY LED PLAN: After a great deal of work by volunteers, the community led plan has been presented to the Council for their comments. The plan will then be finalised and the Council will be asked to adopt the plan.

Councillors are planning a monthly surgery. Here is your chance to meet them and discuss items of interest or concern. The first will be at Cleeton St Mary Village Hall on 14 November at 6.15pm.

Philip Dunne MP's Letter from Westminster

I rarely discuss my role in the House of Commons through this column, but as it has changed, it seemed as well to let you know. When Parliament resumed in October my government whip responsibilities changed to Education and the Foreign & Commonwealth Office.

On the day I had my first meeting with Secretary of State for Education, Michael Gove and his team, the department announced 79 new Free Schools and Technical Colleges to be established from September 2012, including the first Free School in Shropshire, near Broseley. Welcome news for the campaigners who worked so hard for Barrow primary school after the local education authority had announced it should close.

I also had my first departmental meeting with Foreign Secretary William Hague and his team in the Foreign & Commonwealth Office building, built in an era when there was an empire. In the first week the Foreign Secretary made a statement to update the House on developments in the Middle East and North Africa, where momentous events are unfolding, bringing the first steps towards democracy in several Arab countries.

A government whip has three roles in Parliament in addition to MP responsibilities looking after constituents' interests. To ensure the passage of legislation through the Commons; liaising with Opposition whips parliamentary officials timetabling of Bills and ensuring there are enough MPs in the Chamber to speak in debates and vote. We have an administrative role in organising the smooth running of the Chamber itself, with a whip on duty on the frontbench, on a regular rota, to help the Minister or the Speaker to ensure debates and question times work. We tend to take notes to look out for strong performances by MPs, on both sides of the Chamber, and also for possible areas for improvement. The third role is as a link between MPs and government. This has aspects of personnel management but mainly provides about communication channel.

My responsibilities for Ludlow are the most important and often most enjoyable aspect of being an MP. I try to make myself as available as possible and welcome views on national and local issues either in person at my regular surgeries or in writing. *Philip Dunne*

STRESS - WE ALL GET IT.

I have just spent the last few days sitting around due to an injury to my knee. Unable to leave the house as I can't get very far on crutches, I have read a lot, watched day time TV (yes, I was that bored) and gradually got more fed up and stressed. It struck me that I was living a life that resembled that of a lot of pets. They rely on us to feed and entertain them and without our input their lives can be so boring. Not a natural state for them to be in. We take them out for a walk on our terms - how often do you see a dog being towed along by its owner who wants to get back home when the dog just wants to sniff and run and play? "Hurry up" we yell at them "Keep up, walk to heel". Why don't we stop seeing walking the dog as a chore and take the opportunity to spend quality time with our pet? Go a different route a whole new lot of smells is so exciting. Take a toy and play together, use the time to teach him to recall, sit and stay in a fun environment. And when you get home don't ignore him until the next walk. Introduce some less physical activities - make him use his brain, play hide and seek with a toy or invest in one of the many gadgets available e.g. a ball which dispenses food only when it it moved around making your dog think.

Don't forget your cat either, just because they potter in and out as they like, they will still enjoy some special time with you. Groom them, play with them – a piece of string with a wool ball on the end can occupy them for hours. Animals get stressed as well as humans and as their owners it is our responsibility to take good care of them. Mental and physical stimulation will help. Watch out for the signs of stress: over grooming, shaking, shedding, urinating in the house for example.(thank goodness I haven't had any of these!) At this time of year with the firework season upon us these signs often occur. Check with your vet in case there is a medical reason behind any of it but if you think it is down to a specific reason then seek help. There are various ways of helping a pet to cope with fireworks and to get the best result you need to act now. Waiting until the bonfire is aglow is too late. For more advice please ask at your vets, we at Severn Edge have free clinics where the our qualified nurses can talk you through the options available to you and give advice, not just for dogs and cats but also for rabbits and other pets.

Crucial To Our Community - Ashley Buck, Rector



Shropshire born, work hardened in some tough areas and settled happily in Cleobury Mortimer. Our Rector, Ashley Buck.

Ashley Buck was born and raised in Bridgnorth, with the church prominent in his young life. His father was head of Highley Primary School and lay preacher, his mother a teacher. He graduated with a History degree from Manchester University, and was accepted for training for the clergy. In the two years gap before he found a place at Cuddesdon College, he spent the interim working for churches in Manchester and Paris.

Theology college was no easy He served the 1985 summer session in Kirkby, Liverpool: "No shops, tower blocks, dreadful unemployment, the beginning of the drug culture. The church was doing some good there, and a friend of mine went back and did seven years with his young family. In a place like that, the church was seen as caring. There was practical aid, like helping Credit Union, persuading the authorities to

build good social housing and holding three surgeries a week. It gave people continuity and commitment."

Another summer was spent in Rotherhithe, east London, where wealth in the developing Docklands contrasted with poverty visible across the river. A lesson in the gulf developing between old and new people in such an area.

He left college with a degree in Theology and greater a awareness of the problems in the everyday life of some people He'd also met Jo, now his wife, and as she was working in London, he went there too and was ordained in Southwark Cathedral in 1987, did four years as a curate at Addington in Surrey then moved to St Peter's in London's Eaton Square. "I responsible was for the Remembrance Day service at Victoria Station," he explains. "There was just me, the station master and a union man, with wreaths, in the middle of the station, and in seconds you'd have a congregation of about a thousand. It was very moving."

1994 saw him move back to his native Shropshire, joining the Wenlock Team Ministry that covered a big area and provided a complete contrast with his time in London: "A different pace of life and a more stable community," in his words. He was Rural Dean of Condover when the post of Rector of Cleobury Mortimer became vacant and he was appointed in 2003. Why Cleobury? distinct, workable unit, from Milson up to Kinlet."

He's responsible for seven parishes: Cleobury Mortimer itself, with Doddington, Hopton Wafers, Kinlet, Milson and the Neens Savage and Sollars. That means serving and caring for some 5,000 people with just three paid staff: curate Kelvin Price, administrator Sam Adams and Youth Project leader Mark Greaves. He emphasises how important the range of volunteers is to work and reach out to people effectively.

Ashley combines compassion with a wider experience than most of us realise and a gentle human touch. Funerals conducted in dignified, a unhurried style with subtle help when a relative struggles to pay tribute to a loved one, in the same caring way he conducts a wedding ceremony or the regular services. You might call him an uncommonly good man with a common touch.

So where does he see the church in the present day? "It's an open place, where people can meet other people and God. It's owned by nobody but the people of Cleobury Mortimer."

"More than a building, it's people. The first thing I ask those who work with me is if they can show the compassion of God to those they meet."

And looking ten years ahead? "I don't expect it to be weaker. Objective evidence says congregations are growing locally and in the Diocese. There are more people coming into the building and we are committed to going out into the community, showing practical compassion for those who need it."

"I want the church to be strong in its role in the community, helping people."



Clive Davies' Westwood Farm Diary

WESTWOOD FARM October 17th

Is change affordable? Well it probably ought to be, because it is often associated with better methods, greater production or more efficiency. However, it appears it isn't always the case even if the actions are an attempt at improvement. A few examples have come to prominence over recent weeks. Discussion took place amongst a group of farmers at a national NFU meeting about the use of tractor fuel. Those that use large quanities have noticed some significant developments. Over the past year through EU Regulation fuel oil, as it is known, has altered. Most of the sulphur content has been taken out, to match road fuel, and up to 7% of biodiesel added. Our contributors have commented that firstly, tractors and powered machinery are typically using 12% more fuel since the changes and very worryingly others are finding that major engine maintenance is required. One well known West Midland farmer had had to replace the fuel injectors on one of his biggest units at a cost of well over £4000! These fuel changes were an attempt to be kinder on the environment but it looks as though on balance we are no

better off and most probably allround at great disadvantage.

Here at Westwood we have recently been involved with the situation of a development not being as helpful as perhaps first envisaged. In recent years there have been many changes to the State Veterinary Service. For a start it is now known as Animal Health. Most counties had an office, but now there have been repeated amalgamations and arrangements are now very much on a regional basis. Furthermore some specialist areas of work are centred from an office somewhere in the UK. Livestock exports will be one of these areas and it is the AH Office at Carlisle that deals with this. We have had the recent good fortune to have three cattle form part of a consignment to Northern Ireland together with a of other Hereford breeders. These export deals always require a number of health tests and what with trying to coordinate everyone involved and tie-up suitable transport it can all be a challenging task. Arrangements were developing quite smoothly in this instance until the Friday afternoon prior to the Tuesday that dispatch was expected. Quite by chance we established that an IT problem at Carlisle Office would probably prevent the movement

taking place. It was indicated that health status could not be checked; there seemed to be no commonsense way around this malfunction. If the cattle were prevented from going at around the proposed time, complications would kick-in with further health tests needed as well as all the inconvenience to the people involved. Fortunately, with effort applied by several people down a number of routes, including input from a local MP, the stock travelled on Thursday of that week and are now comfortable in their new home in Co Armagh.

But there is a worry on the horizon and that is that there is likely to be vet more centralisation of Government services like Animal Health and all the time there is less contact with personnel with knowledge of local information. It should not necessarily be of concern, but when a computer breaks down and there appears little concern about the consequences from folk miles away then that is not acceptable. At a time when clearly we need to adopt best method for better production in the most efficient all-round manner then change for change's sake is not on. In fact it can be expensive. Affordable change only, please! Clive Davies

A New Clarion Service -Advice from Sophie Gordon

Mrs Gordon has agreed to offer an advice page to Clarion readers, which we feel could be invaluable as times get harder. If you have a worry you want to air, you may contact her by post or e- mail through the Clarion.

She is not able to deal directly with readers, through pressure of her normal work. *Ed*

My husband was recently made redundant and I lost my part time job 18 months ago. We are both in our 50s and have a mortgage that his pay-off will not clear. We are both looking for jobs, but the situation is not easy and we are two months in arrears with our payments to the building society. Please can you tell me where we can turn for help or advice?

There is little detail in your letter, so if some of what I write is unnecessary or does not apply to you, just ignore it. Perhaps it may help somebody else.

It's clear from your letter that you realise your first consideration must be regarding your mortgage. You and your husband should make an appointment as soon as possible at the building society to discuss your problems. They will be familiar with the situation you face, and will want to help you reach a satisfactory arrangement. If you can show them you are doing your best to get work and are economising sensibly, that will help to make a good impression.

Before you see them you should consider your financial circumstances – how much money is going out and how much coming in – and how you can economise. Set out a list of your outgoings

over the last year so you can see where the money goes, and work out where you can save money, and what you can do without. Some simple ways of saving, especially in Cleobury, include not using the car when you can walk, shopping locally instead of going to the supermarket (where the quality of food and the bargains are not always all they are cracked up to be!), avoiding ready meals and cooking fresh food. Don't be tempted to buy things you don't need! And remember that it is quite unnecessary to give expensive Christmas presents; inexpensive or home-made gifts are wholly appropriate.

You have not said what sort of work you have done, or what you are looking for, but in the present economic situation, don't be tempted to turn down an offer in the hope that something better might turn up. And when you go for a job interview, be enthusiastic and present yourself well.

Beware of borrowing money unless you can be sure that you will be able to pay it back with the interest, and <u>only</u> borrow from reputable companies such as banks and building societies.

As winter begins it is important to keep warm – but that doesn't mean the house should be like an oven! Only warm the rooms you use, when you use them, and don't overheat them – wear warm clothes. Many of us grew up without central heating!

Other organisations who can help you are the Department of Work and Pensions (about benefits) and the Citizens' Advice Bureau.



BIG AMBITIONS AT SIX ASHES

There are new faces at the 6Ashes Equestrian Centre. Jane Cooling, who learned to ride there and has long nursed an ambition to work with horses, is one. Her business partner is Kelly Wood, who has worked with horses all her life and has a BSC (Hons) in equine studies. In October they signed the lease and moved in, bringing eight of their own steeds to live alongside the nine they bought with the business.

They were up to their elbows in painting, cleaning and refurbishing the stabling when the Clarion called to talk about their plans for the 22 acre site. They have a five year plan, as

Kelly explained: 'We want to make it a big equestrian centre, holding competitions. A buzzing place, where people can live horses and riding. And we have verification that 6Ashes is approved for training schemes by Pink Lizard, Lantra, City and Guilds and First for Sport, an Olympic pilot scheme.."

The facilities are much more than you can see from the road. Like a floodlit menage ring and they have the agreement of the landlord to ride out beyond their own boundaries and develop a cross country course.

A VERY FINE HALL, FOR ALL OCCASIONS



Clarion size photos can never do justice to the hall or its setting.

Times are changing all around and Hopton Wafers is one place that will feel a major effect if its primary school closes, as it is due to do next year. With the pupil roll down close to 20, it has become a victim of economic pressure over local loyalty.

But one public facility that will remain is the village hall, sitting proudly above grounds that are the village green. It is a rather special place, with modern facilities in a smart building, and all set in a fine piece of Shropshire landscape. You won't find many halls to match this for setting and access - it's less than 200 metres from the A4117, with plenty of parking space..

It was extended in 1990 when a the conservatory was added, which allows guests to sit out and admire the countryside or maybe watch over the children playing in their well equipped area. The hall itself will seat about 80 people, and the rental includes crockery and cutlery as well as use of a kitchen that looks like new. As you'd expect, there is a toilet for the disabled and wheelchair access

Rental is £25 - £30 a day, depending upon the event, and if you need time to set up equipment and there's no booking the day before, access then is free of charge. The toddlers have it for one hour on Thursday mornings and other regular users are the Bridge Club on Tuesdays and neighbouring **Primary** School, who use the play area. When the Clarion called, the car park was marked out **Bikeability** training for the children.

This is not a commercial venture, it's a community facility that can be rented; it's no surprise to learn that it's a popular venue for birthdays and wedding receptions. Funeral parties use it too, and if they use the Parish Church for the service, the hall is available at no extra charge. As we said, not a

commercial venture, more a caring one.


