She has raised close to £7500 for The Haven. Midlands Air Ambulance and MacMillan Nurses in the past year, while she was fighting her own ongoing battle with the disease.

The Food & Ale Trail - Another Cleobury Success

The weather can be a fickle customer in September, when the weather forecast warned of heavy rain coming on Friday the 6th, it seemed the Food and Ale Trail on the 7th might be a victim. But a sunny day with docile looking clouds dawned and by 9.30 there were people in big socks and boots walking up Love Lane to the Cleobury Country Centre, ready for a good day's walking with a little refeshment along the way.

The official word from organiser Carol Franklin is that 165 people actually set out on the walk. If there were any who didn't make the finish it is not clear, but as the walk made its way through Mawley Hall's

grounds there was talk of blisters. Not that such a minor matter stopped people smiling.

Ashley Pugh's mobile unit provided sustenance for the first food stop at The Rookery. People were full of praise for the effort that got them down the lane and ready to welcome the long line of walkers with hot drinks, pastries and cakes.

The well signed route took them on to the Golf Club, where a ploughman's lunch and a range of Mr Hobson's fine ales for the thirsty was available. With a slightly chilly breeze, the option of eating outside and taking in the scenery or keeping warm under cover was welcome. The Club is becoming quite a noted walking attraction, as well as offering one of the most scenic courses in the area. And those who indulged in a little ale to keep their energy up got a souvenir tankard to take home.

The walk on to Neen Savage and that lovely setting for the village hall was rewarded with cream teas accompanied by hot drinks or another Hobsons tipple. You won't be surprised that there were no reports of anyone passing out with thirst before the final leg took them to the ford and along the river back to Cleobury. There the Kings Arms offered burgers or pork baps with musical

accompaniment in the Rectory Field as Food and Ale gave way to Music and Ale.

Congratulations go to Carol Franklin for a great job in coordinating the whole walk and publicity, ably assisted by Alan Kimber and Chris Tibbetts. And Susan Sharp, whose knowledge of the local footpaths was invaluable in plotting a route that showed off the South Shropshire countryside so well. And let's not forget the Cleobury Country team who made their Centre available as the hub of the operation. There were a lot of new faces in town that day, which suggests that the reputation of this happy event is spreading.

It rounded off with a musical evening in the Rectory Field, where the Kings Arms team made sure that nobody went hungry or thirsty and the volume drew people in.

The day was billed as part of the Cleobury Fringe, which seems to have shrunk down from a month of happenings to one day. The result was proof of the old saying that small is beautiful, though the original aim of the Fringe being the umbrella for a range of events seems to have disappeared. But nothing outside the event can detract from a Food and Ale Trail that grows in reputation.

FIONA IN THE PUB

Faith In The Pub is normally an all-male event, where chaps can discuss chaps' matters and spare ladies' the blushes. But September saw new ground broken, when Fiona Hankin was welcomed to talk about credit unions and community banking in general and Shropshire's Fairshares operation particular. She held her audience's attention for almost two hours and left us talking about the possibility of it happening in the Cleobury area.

She started with some horror stories, like the worst Pay Day Loan company who charge a crippling 5,200% per annum for loans - credit unions charge a maximum of 26.8%! She quoted

the cost of borrowing £500 over a year with one of the lower charges, which would cost a total of £941, or 272% interest. The obvious solution would be to put a cap on interest charges, but the government won't do that; we are the only country in Euope with that policy.

So these companies carry on with practices like a customer buying a TV set and having service charges added. And do you have your household insurance policy with you as proof that it will be covered against theft or damage. You Then there's another don't? service charge for insurance. For example, in a few minutes, that £1644 big screen number has gone up to over £4,000. These people are not there to be nice and help you.

Shropshire's Fairshare is very different. You join by signing up to pay an agreed amount into your savings account every month, and after 12 weeks of saving you can apply for a loan. There's no question of immediate loans, you have to prove that you are a steady payer with your own account first.

Last year this company made loans totalling £1.6 million; in Leeds the credit union is so successful that it's now offering mortgages. The more people

who join a credit union, the more finance to offer loans to those in need. You can see why their slogan is 'Local People Helping Local People'; it's exactly what they're doing.

There is even a Junior Members scheme, but that gives no right to a loan until until the saver is 18. But it does establish a good habit of putting money away for the future.

This was a very interesting evening, mainly because people could see the benefit to the community of people in need being cared for instead of getting further into debt. There are talks going on and we can't say more than that. But do watch this space and do avoid the honey trap of an easy loan that's a money trap in reality.


Writing about the Wyre Forest this month on Page 49, Linda Iles describes the drama of the rutting season for the deer.







Happy on the High Street, Gareth Leach

He won't tell you to boast about it, that's not his way. But when Gareth Leach sold the chippy on High Street and went into the carpet trade, he wanted to learn the craft of fitting. So he asked father Alan to make him a model with skirting board all around the edge. When he had some surplus from a job at work, he'd bring it home and fit it in this trial room to develop his skills.

By the time he opened his little shop on High Street ten years ago, he was able to do a fitting job really well.

He's still modest and admits to using more experienced men if he has a really big job. Like 300 metres to fit out a large hall in the area, where he got the job on recommendation. He gets lots of those.

He's learned a lot in 15 years and his main supplier is Victoria Carpets in Kidderminster, a company that's survived the hard times that closed most of the factories. "They're the best, the service is superb," he says "You won't beat them." He has a good contact there and can often buy the end of a roll at a very good price, which helps the customer's pocket.

The small shop is crowded with samples, dominated by the Victoria display. But he has no dreams of bigger premises and fancy displays. He owns the property and knows what an advantage that is: "Lower overheads." If you don't have a big rent bill to pay, your prices can be keener. And he drives around in a small van, not a limousine; lower overheads again.

He does a lot of work with natural fibre carpets. "Very long lasting and it looks great when it's down. But it is expensive to fit; you have to stick the underlay to the floor, then stick the carpet to the underlay."

He enjoys the work: "Every day's different, in the chip shop the same people would come in on the same day and say the same thing." There are days when the shop isn't open, which means he's busy and out fitting another job. Which can be as far away as London, where happy customer recommendations have brought a lot of work.

It's his high standard of fitting that wins him friends. "Its all about preparation, get that right and it's easy," he explains. I used to work in the carpet industry and can tell he's good. He's very good.



Every year, at this time, we talk about fireworks. You may all be getting bored with it by now, but I am still going to talk about it. Keep on reading; you may just pick up a hint or tip that you did not know before.

Of course, the main pets affected by the fireworks are our dogs. Symptoms of fright can vary massively from a little shivering, and keeping quiet to manic barking and toilet trouble. It is very difficult to comfort dogs in this situation, but there are a few things you can do to help minimise the stress.

Take them for a walk before dark, before the fireworks and bonfires start, to empty the tank, then come home and settle down to a nice quiet evening. Close the windows, close the curtains, turn the telly up a little to drown out some of the noise, and try not to act differently. Letter from Westminster - Philip Dunne MP

In a rural area like the Ludlow constituency, we all rely on an efficient postal service. While email and other social media have become prolific means a communication, we still need post boxes, offices and deliveries to our homes and offices. We have a high proportion of home working in Shropshire and while better broadband is on its way, many rely on Royal Mail for their business. The Government has recently announced plans for a flotation of Royal Mail shares on the London Stock Exchange and I want to make clear that the Post Office is not included in the sale.

With the number of letters we send in longterm decline and online shopping increasing, the Royal Mail needs to have access to the capital to compete with the internet, smart phones and international postal operators. Under successive governments Royal Mail has found it hard to secure the capital investment it needs to maintain or improve its service while technology allows competitors to advance.

That is why the public is being given the opportunity to buy shares in Royal Mail and are being provided to employees. By allowing Royal Mail access to private capital to invest, taxpayers will no provide funds have to investment. This will secure the long term price sustainability the one anywhere, six days a week service that we all rely on.

This universal service is protected by the Postal Services Act 2011, which can only be changed by both Houses of Parliament. It is also protected by Ofcom, who in June introduced new safeguards for postal services in rural communities.

Access to Royal Mail's network of 115,000 post boxes will now be protected with a requirement that 98% of all households across the UK should be within half a mile of a post box. Ofcom has made clear that Royal Mail already complies with the new criteria. This is an important protection, especially for those of us in rural areas, as it will apply across the UK for the first time.

The Post Office network of branches was separated from Royal Mail and is not included in the business being sold. There is a clear commitment under this government that there will be no closure of post offices. £1.34 billion in funding over four years has been committed to maintain the network of at least 11,500 post office branches across the UK.

Regardless of ownership, Royal Mail will continue to be the our universal service provider. It will deliver the six day week service, at uniform prices, to all 29 million addresses throughout the country. I want to reassure local residents that rural postal services will be safeguarded and South Shropshire will continue to receive the same quality service we currently enjoy.



Clarion Coppers - with CSO Nick Morris

It looks as if it's time for everyone to be on guard because there has been a significant increase in break-ins and thefts in our area recently.

Two static caravans were broken into at Earls Ditton towards the end of August. Nothing was stolen from one, but a large amount of money and jewellery was taken from the second. Overnight on September 2nd/3rd, a tack room in Neen Sollars was broken into but fortunately nothing was stolen. Another shed in that area was broken into at about the same time and again nothing was stolen. On the same night frozen food in a freezer and golf clubs in a shed were stolen from a property in Childe Road. On September 6th/7th a garage in Lacon Close was broken into and a motorbike stolen. However, this was later found abandoned near Walford's Bridge. During the same night a parked car which was left unsecured in Langland Road was entered. A handbag was stolen with a purse containing £260 and a couple of store vouchers worth £10 each. Cards were not stolen but scattered about in the vehicle. Caught on CCTV at 0310hrs on September 9th were three youths entering two vehicles parked, (again unsecured!) on a drive in Orchard End. A Tomtom satnav was taken from one and a pair of football boots from the other.

Criminal damage was incurred to a parked vehicle in Tenbury Road on September 14th/15th. Two tyres were let down and bodywork scratched. Investigations are ongoing as there is a suspect for this. On September 18th just after 05:00am an observant and community minded member of the public reported some suspicious looking

characters in a car being driven slowly in the High Street area of town. This was followed up with several police officers being deployed to locate and pursue the vehicle. Luckily the registration number had been obtained which helped to identify it. It was finally caught up with in the West Midlands area and the two occupants arrested on suspicion of theft. The vehicle was found to be full of hubcaps and wheel trims, with another 130 hubcaps discovered elsewhere.

There were several reports later of thefts of hubcaps or wheeltrims in Leominster and on Hopton Bank. During the night of September 20th/21st there were two burglaries. At one, in a house and garage in Lea View, only a holdall was stolen which was found intact later by a neighbour. The other, at a house in Tenbury Road, an Ipad and laptop were stolen along with a wallet and purses. Items from the garage were stolen but not identified at the time of writing.

Lessons to be learnt here are:

- a) Do not leave valuable items in your vehicle on show or at all if possible.
- b) Always lock your vehicle if left unattended.
- c) If you see anything suspicious, get as many details as you can and call Police immediately on 101, (or 999 in an emergency only).

Finally, a date for your diary. A Neighbourhood Watch meeting is set for Wednesday, November 6th at 7:00pm in The Methodist Hall, where, amongst other things, everyone will be updated with how the West Mercia Police Force has been restructured.

The Farming Page

Rachel Robinson with the Mawley Town News. Its (nearly) All About Arable...

As well as rearing livestock, milking cows and retailing some of our milk, here at Mawley Town Farm we are busy with our arable land, where we grow a variety of crops that are used to feed the cattle. A proportion of our land remains that permanent pasture is traditional grassland that we never plough and is used for grazing cattle during the summer and store lambs through the winter. There are also grass fields that we plant with specific varieties such as ryegrass, which is fast growing and makes good grass silage due to its long stems and high sugar content. We can take four or five cuts of grass silage in a year but with each cut it loses some of its quality. If you pass big blue New Holland tractors with trailers piled high with grass, you will know its heading for the Mawley herd!

The harvest is later this year, due to late planting. In the autumn of 2012 we could not get onto many of our fields because of the wet ground, so crops that would normally be planted in the autumn had to wait until the spring. Despite the late start, the crops have done considerably well. We have 200 acres of maize planted as many of

you will have noticed..the maize loved the heat wave we had and we have a bumper crop of an estimated 15-20 tonnes of maize to the acre! The other crops - barley, oats, wheat and peas have recovered well from their cold wet start, and we are hoping for continued good weather as they ripen.

Now for some facts and figures for those of you interested in machinery. Our combine that will be very busy in the weeks to come is a New Holland CX840. With its 24' header it has a 295hp engine, a fuel capacity of 198 gallons (749.5 litres) and has hydrostatic drive and a four speed gear box. At 30' long and 13' high, we try to be considerate to other road users by choosing the quietest times of day when we have to navigate the big yellow beauty through the High Street.

Now from yellow to green – the solar and wind energy we have invested in is working well, and we have exported 5000 more units than we have imported, from a combination of the two generating stations. *Rachel Robinson*





THE ROAD TO SUCCESS...



Linda Iles' October In The Forest

This is the season for one of the most dramatic events of the forest year, when the fallow deer begin the rut. The bucks meet at traditional rutting stands where they will challenge and fight to determine who should become the dominant buck, earning the right to mate with does in the area. You may come across these stands as you walk in the forest: rubbing tree or stump surrounded by worn areas; or you may hear the strange groaning cries of the bucks as they issue their challenges. Other evidence includes frayed saplings and damaged bark where bucks have scent marked, tracks and skid marks at the scene of a fight or muddy wallows surrounded by tracks. This sound can quite intimidating but I can reassure you that the bucks have their minds on one thing and are not likely to notice your presence!

It should be a good time to see toadstools as well. The bracket fungus in the photo grows on old birch trees, of which there are many in the forest. Birches are very successful in colonising heath or clear-felled areas, but their dominance is temporary as they are eventually shaded out by oaks, after which they die. The birch polypore is also called razor-strop fungus, referring to one of its many uses. Another is as a provider of naturally antibiotic sticking plasters (I've

tried these and found them very good!) and, when the fruiting bodies are old and woody, a tough paper can be made from their pulp. There are other toadstools of all shapes and colours to be found in the forest but my advice is to eat nothing unless you're an experienced collector and are absolutely certain you've made a correct identification.





In Business - Sue Brown, Chiropractor



Really getting down to it. Sue assesses Annette's posture in an everyday task at Hobson's.

This is a little different from the regular 'In Business' profiles, as we took a look at Sue Brown taking her gentle chiropractic skills out to industry. Quite a change fom the quiet of her High Street clinic.

What she's developing as an additional service is an extension of the work she did with the RAF. There she recognised the problems helicopter pilots were having after a long shift flying a helicopter whose prime purpose is not comfort for the crew. She does have a very persuasive way as well as experience of the pilot's job, and she persuaded the helicopter training school to include special exercises to ease back pains that a day in a crouched position can produce. It is now part of the school's standard procedure and is being assessed for long term effects.

Her logic in taking the message to industry is simple: get your staff operating with correct posture and you'll reduce hours lost to back pains and related problems. The physical damage she deals with in her clinic is often something that could easily be prevented. Nick Davis was happy to cooperate and both office and warehouse staff were assessed and advised by Sue. Just how well it works we'll check on in six months. And we'll try to get some detail from the military's report; people are always detached in their approach.

She watched every staff member go about their daily tasks, after she'd shown them Bob, her plastic spinal column, and explained how bad posture can put this vital nerve centre out of line and create pain. Correct seating is vital, with the bottom pushed back in the seat and the arms in a natural place. Adjustment of the seat is a legal requirement, because of the range of physical heights and regular tasks; she handed out a leaflet that gives details of the correct stance to adopt. Nick was listening and went off to find alternative chairs for the office staff.

Out in the warehouse the busy bottling plant means lots of lifting. A box of twelve full pint bottles is not a lot, but pick up two in a regular motion and you need to get it right. Once more Sue was watching closely and analysing movement, then suggesting a less demanding way of lifting.

It's a very different task from the gentle manipulation Sue uses in the McTimoney method she applies to customers who can have a variety of ailments. Her reputation has grown enough for her to add a receptionist to meet and greet at the clinic, and she's looking to recruit another chiropractor to provide later opening accommodate and clients outside their working hours.

This business has grown quite remarkably since Sue quit the helicopter service and moved with her family into Cleobury Mortimer to offer a cure for a variety of pains that does not involve drugs.

I will admit a great respect for chiropractic, after discharge from National Service with severe seasonal asthma. Two years of self-injection of the grass pollen I was allergic to saw me dismissed with an assurance I was cured; the wheezing didn't agree.
