Ludlow Rotary Club are inviting everyone in this area to join a global drive to rid the world of polio. 40 years ago 350,000 children a year were being paralysed. The fight began then and now the disease is endemic only in Pakistan and Afghanistan, but the drive is still on, with the aim of wiping the disease away altogether.

On Sunday the 22nd this month, you can sign on at Ludlow for a route to follow and walk just one mile. You can contribute just £1.00 pound, more if you choose, and for every pound raised the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation will add another £2.00.

Ludlow organiser Tom Hunt explained: "There's no cure for polio but there is a safe vaccine which we need to continue to roll out until there are no more cases."

So take a gentle walk around Ludlow, donate and help remove a dreadful disease.

THE BREAKFAST CLUB

In September 21 members assembled for a talk on the Isles of Scilly. Mark Baldwin gave a brief Powerpoint introduction to set the scene, reminding everyone that the five occupied islands are smaller than our parish, and have a lower population. They have been occupied, and farmed, for some thousands of years, but the sea level has risen and the sea now covers much of the area cultivated by islanders a few thousand years ago.

Bill Duley then provided more detail on a number of points, explaining how climate change has meant that many crops formerly exported to the mainland, can now be grown on the mainland itself, so the islands have been robbed of their advantage. One island, St Mary's, has about 80% of the whole population, and this is where most visitors stay, using the regular small boat service to travel to the other islands. Not surprisingly, the pace of

life on the islands is unlike that in the rest of Cornwall, and they provide a wonderful place for a holiday, whether you are interested in history, bird-watching, the subtropical gardens of Tresco, wreck-diving, or just want to enjoy a virtually car-free environment.

Bill added a little about Star Castle, built in 1593 as a defensive structure on Garrison Hill by Queen Elizabeth and modified over the years. Originally the perceived attackers would have been Spanish, but later they would have been French. The last military upgrade was in the early twentieth century, but the castle itself is now a 4-star hotel.

Next month's meeting is on October 10th, when Kit Smith will be exploring and explaining one of the great ecological revelations of the past few years — the extraordinary interaction between trees and their extensive underground fungal connections. 

Rotary International, along with other agencies, continues to raise funds to bring this devastating and crippling disease to a world-wide end.

course, she can offer her craft to produce whatever a private customer might want.

LOCAL DEER

Most of the deer seen in the Wyre Forest are Fallow Deer. They are a familiar sight in the quieter parts of the forest and at this time of the year the bucks will have moved to their rutting grounds where they will contest their right to mate with a harem of females. As well as the Fallow Deer there are a growing number of both the exotic Muntjac and the Roe Deer. Even in 2015 Roe were rarely seen in the forest (according to 'The Nature of Wyre' by the Wyre Forest Study Group) and it may come as a surprise to hear that they are native to the British Isles, alongside Red Deer.



During 2020's lockdown we frequently saw one lone individual on our walks in the Coldharbour Coppice area of the forest and sightings are gradually becoming more frequent. The buck in Mick Farmer's photo was seen in Withybed Wood near Buttonoak and I believe they are often

in that area. It is very probable that they are now breeding in Wyre rather than wandering in from nearby populations. The 2023 spring census reported sightings of 26 Roe Deer. However, for the first time a drone survey, using thermal imaging, was also carried out and it located 48 Roe, fairly well scattered in groups of up to 4 individuals throughout the forest.

As you can see from the photo, the Roe have a chestnut coat without spots, a big black nose and a white chin. Smaller than the Fallow and larger (and more elegant) than the Muntjac, the bucks have short antlers which are much less extravagantly-branched then those of the Fallow, having up to 3 points. At this time of year they may have shed their antlers, having already mated earlier than the Fallow in July and August. The mated does then delay the implantation of the fertilised eggs and give birth, often to twins or even triplets, in May or June. The kids are spotted with white and must make a very pretty sight.

Deer in general are masters of detection and it is very rare to see them before they see you. Consequently the pale, buff-coloured rump of the Roe may be almost all you see of it as it bounds away from you!

Philip Dunne's Letter from Westminster

Last month, in my role as a Commonwealth War Graves Commissioner, I joined a delegation on a visit to war grave sites in Italy, eighty years after the first Allied landings on mainland Europe presaged the end of WW2.

We saw some of the impressive work being undertaken to ensure those who made the ultimate sacrifice in the two World Wars are remembered and honoured by future generations.

It is impossible to walk among the immaculate rows of white headstones and not be moved. As time moves on, and living memory moves to becoming history, such a tangible reminder of the human cost of war is important as we seek to impress upon younger people the sacrifices of previous generations.

For those not aware, the Commonwealth War Graves Commission was founded in 1917, and its mission is to commemorate the nearly 1.7 million Commonwealth servicemen and women who died in the two World Wars, along with the countless others who perished in subsequent conflicts. The Commission operates in 153 countries and territories, ensuring that the final resting places of those who fought and died are well maintained and that their stories continue to be told.

By my estimation there are around 65 CWGC grave sites in South Shropshire, spread all across the constituency. Details of all of these sites, including the names of those commemorated, can be found at the very useful CWGC website: www.cwgc.org. I would encourage readers to find out their nearest site, perhaps in the lead up to Remembrance Sunday next month. The CWGC is always looking for volunteers to help maintain the more isolated graves and the website gives details of how to volunteer to look after a grave near you.

The Commonwealth War Graves Commission draws its Commissioners from political, diplomatic, academic and military figures, from across the Commonwealth nations. I was appointed a Commissioner in 2019 and have been joined on the Commission by senior military officers from each service,

with an admiral from the Royal Navy recently appointed as new Vice Chairman, being joined by a senior British Army general and Royal Air Force air marshall this summer, with each of whom I had worked when at the Ministry of Defence.

While known for the upkeep of grave sites, the CWGC's work extends beyond the confines of cemeteries and memorials. Through research and documentation, it seeks to ensure that every individual's story is known and appreciated – reminding us that behind every headstone is a life that was lived, and a family that grieved.

As custodians of a large amount of outside space, the Commission also has an interesting role to play in pioneering horticultural excellence around the world. Certainly in the larger Commission maintained sites, such as those I visited on my trip, the beautifully maintained gardens and landscaping adds to the tranquil and contemplative atmosphere of rows of headstones and names etched in stone. It is a fitting tribute to those who gave their lives for a more peaceful world. As my own small act of commemoration I was able to plant a rose in the Cassino cemetery, near the graves of those I presumed had fought with my late father-in-law in the Italian campaign in the autumn of 1944 when two battalions of the Scots Guards had landed at Salerno in September 1944, steadily fighting their way up the Apennines to Rome.

My role as one of only two parliamentarian Commissioners of the Commonwealth War Graves Commission is an immense honour and a privilege. The work we do is not just about maintaining graves - it is about preserving the memory of those who paid the highest price for our freedom, ensuring their stories are told and their sacrifices are never forgotten.

Stepping Out! Who's Walking, When and Where.

Last month during a walk by the River Rea near Papermills Cottages one of our members spotted a kingfisher. For many decades the river was very industrial with many mills along its banks particularly papermills. It is now known for its abundance of wildlife. The glorious sunshine was a treat for the people who joined the Country Walk in September. We welcomed six new people, a couple from Bayton, another couple who had moved to Cleobury at Christmas and two people visiting from the North East. The walk was based on leaflet 17: A Round of Golf. This lovely varied walk traces a rough circle around Cleobury, passing through farmland, the Golf club and Mawley Estate. Going along the path from Upper Forge to the Bayton road the views over Cleobury are stunning. The next walk is on Sunday 1st October starting at 10.00am outside St Mary's church. Walking For Health is always popular and well supported. Eighteen people went on last month's Away Day to Arley. We usually go there in June so it was

interesting to see the countryside so different during our walk. The two mile walk from the car park by the river Severn to the Arboretum is a mixture of lanes, pastures and an orchard. A welcome break at the Tea Rooms before heading downhill back to the car park. A reminder that we meet at 10.00 am on the second and fourth Wednesday outside St Mary's church. A leisurely walk lasting about an hour followed by refreshments and a chat at the CoCo coffee morning in the Market Hall. Although it was a rainy morning for the work party the planned work was completed. Working just outside Milson two stiles were repaired and two dog gates fitted at Bassardsbank. The group then split into two. One half cleared a local path while the others headed back to Cleobury to repair a couple of rotten slats on the bridge between Workhouse Bank and Cleanlyseat. Rotten slats are a regular occurrence particularly on bridges under trees. Falling leaves build up and cause the rot. It would be a great help if anyone seeing a leaf build up on bridges would scrape them off the wood. This can be done very simply with the side of a boot.

The Hunter Full Moon is on October 28th. This bright moon together with longer nights are perfect conditions for night stalking. Like the Harvest Moon last month the name reflects the season for gathering food for the Winter.

Simon Morton In The Garden

Digital Daisies - The Future Of Gardening?

Much has been written about Artificial Intelligence.

If you subscribe to all the scaremongering (and there is a lot of it), you'd be justified in thinking that the role of 'expert' will be redundant within the next 12 months. Monty, Alan and their like must be quaking in their wellies. But do they *really* have anything to worry about?







CLEOBURY GARDENERS -LEARNING TO GROW FOOD

Last year, we gave our annual growing competition for pre-school and primary-age children a new look, launching 'Learning to Grow Food' to help them understand better how the fruits and vegetables they eat are grown. They learned so much about seeds and growing conditions, thoroughly enjoying the brief they'd been given, that this year, supported by a £250 grant from The Rotary Club of Ludlow, we extended it to explore whether seed size matters.

It is often difficult for nurseries and schools to fit competitions into their timetables given the demands of the statutory curriculum but three pre-schools and four primary schools entered, often involving whole groups and classes: in all, it was enjoyed by well over 120 local children. In March, they were given a selection of seeds of varying sizes (radish, cress, lettuce, carrots and pumpkins) and a bag of peatfree compost, kindly supplied by Farlow Farm Nursery. The children used their knowledge and imagination to explore ways of germinating the seeds and then growing them on to strong productive plants to eat. During the planting and growing period, they kept a log of their activities to show: the key events; any problems with growing their seeds and how they solved them; any advice they sought; how the growing conditions influenced their crops; and their overall successes and failures. We visited them in July to judge the logs and the produce, and it was obvious that they had learned a lot about growing food and how seeds of different sizes have varying rates of germination and growth to maturity; it was equally obvious that they had enjoyed the activities and eating what they had grown.

In the pre-school group, Stottesdon Gateway Nursery won first prize, with Abkats Nursery runners-up; Farlow Church of England Primary School won first prize in the schools' category and Kinlet Church of England Primary School was runner-up. Prizes were strong garden forks and rakes designed specifically for children that will last for years to come. In addition, all of those who entered this year have been given a bug hotel in preparation for the 2024 competition that will focus on the role of pollinators. They can't wait to get going so they'll have plenty of pollinators for next year's competition crops!

SIMON EVANS – HIS LIFE AND WORK.

Just what we need in Cleobury – a vape shop... We already have to skirt round quantities of discarded packaging when out and about and this won't improve things as it appears that vape users, like many dog owners, haven't yet grasped the concept of using bins. This might be helped if the government's slow realisation that the disposable flavoured and coloured versions are proving irrestible and harmful to youngsters, results in them being banned. I wouldn't hold your breath though as it has been revealed that the Tories have had a donation of £350,000 from a company linked to the marketing of these devices. Interestingly, China, where most are manufactured, has banned flavoured versions although they are happy to carry on selling them to the idiot westerners... Rishi has now stated that a ban will happen 'within weeks' but we shall see..

More woke news. The Mullers factory site is shown as 'under offer' and there is a rumour that a large retailer may be eyeing it up. Another take on this says that an engineering firm is interested. As with all such stories, they may or may not have legs so another case of wait and see. My bet is on more houses but what do I know?

Note the word 'towards' which is important as the actual cost, depending on a number of factors such as the age of the premises, levels of insulation etc, is likely to be far higher. Even then, reports indicate that they might not make your house very warm but perhaps global warming will take care of that...

Question

I have a temper. This is nothing new. I have struggled with it most of my life. I have lost friends because of it. I say things that I regret later. Even if I apologize, sometimes the damage is done and cannot be reversed. I also yell a great deal while driving. I know that anger can be a sign of depression, but I have been tested and

it is not the case for me. What can I do?

There are times in life when anger can be positive. It can be directed into action. It can motivate us to make changes in our lives. It can also serve to make changes in our families and our world. It can be transformative if kept in check and directed toward positive outcomes.

Anger can also take forms that are not constructive. For some it may be yelling, for another it may take a more passive- aggressive form. This includes remaining quiet, but seething inside with resentment. Whatever form it takes, there tend to be basic ways of thinking that contribute to escalating anger within.

Taking offense and personalizing situations are often found in those with anger issues. "How dare that driver cut ME off?" "I am being disrespected when you don't say good morning to ME!" There are often rigid assumptions as to how others should behave.

If you find yourself getting angry, take a pause and ask yourself if the situation is really about you.

Lisa Baldwin's advice.

Isn't that driver is likely to cut anyone off? Perhaps the driver is having a bad morning and is in a hurry for some reason that has nothing to do with you.

Learn to ask questions of others such as "help me to understand what you meant by....." instead of assuming a negative intention that may not be there.

Decide not to react until you have more information. Stay curious and remain openminded to another's point of view.

Self care is also an important part of managing anger. Getting enough sleep, eating healthily, and vigorous exercise can also be helpful. Seek to have balance in your life. Avoid alcohol if you tend to say things you regret while drinking.

Keep a journal and take time for self- reflection. Ask yourself what assumptions you are making about a person or situation. What are you fearful of? Are you uncomfortable with uncertainty? Do you have a need to control outcomes with others?

By becoming self-aware, we are able to look at our assumptions squarely and consider how they are contributing to angry outbursts. Even though you may have had a problem with your temper for many years, you will improve by understanding yourself and your personal thinking patterns. With this understanding you can choose to react differently, which will improve your relationships with others.



Do you have Powers of Attorney dated pre-2007?

From 1st October 2007, Enduring Powers of Attorney (EPA) were replaced by Lasting Powers of Attorney.

Lasting Powers of Attorney enable you to grant powers to another person enabling them to make decisions on your behalf, allowing you to plan for your future health and financial needs if circumstances change.

A very important advantage of the new Lasting Powers of Attorney is that there are two Powers of Attorney. There is one specifically for your health and welfare and then another for your property and financial matters whereas with the old Enduring Powers of Attorney, they only assisted with your property and financial matters.

Disadvantages of Enduring Powers of Attorney

- Registration with the Office of Public Guardian is carried out only when the person starts to lose capacity; if the Office of Public Guardian find that the document is invalid for any reason, it will not be registered, and the person may no longer have sufficient capacity to correct that mistake. If this was to happen, then the person would be reliant on somebody applying to be their deputy leaving them in a very vulnerable position with no-one appointed to act until the Court of Protection appoints a deputy. This can take a year or more.
- The cost of registration of an Enduring Power of Attorney can often be the same as putting in place new Lasting Powers of Attorney.
- Enduring Powers of Attorney do not give Attorneys power to make decisions in respect of health and welfare matters.

Advantages of Lasting Powers of Attorney

- Registration of the Lasting Powers of Attorney starts after you and your Attorneys have signed the documents giving peace of mind. Registration can take anywhere from two to four months. It is therefore advisable to plan ahead and get the documents in place well before they might be needed.
- Lasting Powers of Attorney can be used at any age, for example it may be useful if you spend long periods of time abroad. It is not just about getting old and losing capacity. You may want to consider putting Powers of Attorney in place for your children when they turn 18. When your child turns 18 you no longer have power to make decisions for them. If your child had an accident and lost capacity, wouldn't you still like to be able to assist them?
- Lasting Powers of Attorney for health enable your Attorneys to appeal any funding decisions for care.
- The Health and Welfare Lasting Powers of Attorney also enable Attorneys to assist with life sustaining treatment decisions.
- Next of kin means nothing in law. It is necessary to be appointed as the person's Attorney.
- A Property and Financial Lasting Power of Attorney is recognised by all financial institutions. Some financial institutions no longer accept Enduring Powers of Attorney.
- It is possible for the person to include preferences and instructions for their Attorneys to follow about their specific needs/requirements regarding their care, their religious views and anything else specific to that person.


