



#### THE 125TH BURWARTON SHOW



#### **CLEOBURY IN BLOOM**

Each year as part of Cleobury in Bloom, the Horticultural Society sets a gardening challenge for children in the pre-school and primary school age ranges. This year we focused on sweet peas called *Flying the Flag* – red, white and blue to celebrate the Queen's 90<sup>th</sup> birthday.

Four primary schools and pre-school settings entered, tending the seeds that we gave them in March. They were also given a bag of compost, donated by Farlow Farm Nursery. But late frosts, cold temperatures and driving rain meant only four pre-school groups and three schools managed to get their seeds to grow to sturdy plants. In July, judge Jane Barnes joined two members of the society to judge the plants and logs the children had kept detailing what they learned from the experience.

On July 9th over fifty people were at the Methodist Hall to find out who had won. Abkats Day Nursery scooped the winner's prize in the pre-school category, with Ever After Day Nursery runner-up; Grassroots Playgroup and Rising Fives was highly commended and Kinlet Family Playgroup was commended.

Kinlet Church of England **Primary** School won the primary school category, Cleobury Primary was the runner-up and Farlow Church of England Primary was given a special prize for outstanding achievement.

The judges were amazed at the activities that the children had been involved in as part of the project, like reading, drawing, writing and photography. Abkats treated us to a rendition of a sweet pea song they had learned, acting out the sprouting and growing of the seeds as they grew into plants.

The Society was awarded £125 by Muller England Ltd, whose support for the project was much appreciated. We were able to fund prizes that can be put to use in the next growing year – propagators, tools and equipment, dibbers and seeds. Congratulations to the prize winners and thanks to everyone who came along to the event. Flo Hadley

#### LOCAL HOMES FOR LOCAL PEOPLE

Survey of local housing needs to be carried out in Hopton Wafers Parish.

The lack of 'local needs housing' in rural areas is well known, and it has forced local people to move away. The result is older members of the family not able to help with youngsters and the younger adults not able to help ageing relatives.

To establish just what the local level of need is in the Hopton Wafers area, Shropshire Council, Hopton Parish Council and Shropshire Rural Housing Association are conducting a survey during September and October. The idea is to establish who is in need of housing and what local connection they have. Plus how many people have been forced to move away and ned to return.

Affordable housing is for those who cannot afford open market properties. If the survey shows there is such a need, then work still start on the options available to provide a small scale local scheme.

The survey will be delivered to households during September and can be returned free of charge. Or it can be downloaded from <a href="https://www.hoptonwafers.org">www.hoptonwafers.org</a>

from September 19th, or email maria.howell@shropshire.gov.uk and ask for a copy to be posted.

If you are connected to the parish and needed to be move away to find housing, you can still complete the survey and have your view heard. This is a very thorough approach to a matter that affects a lot of families in this rural county and responses like this one in Hopton will guide future moves towards solving the problem. This letter came into the Clarion office in August. Take a bow, everyone in Cleobury.





Kate Maxwell MRCVS Equine Veterinary Surgeon at Severn Edge Equine, explains how to care for your new born during its fragile first few weeks.

Having waited 11 months for the arrival of your new foal, your priority is to ensure it is healthy and remains that way. The first step in assessing your foal's condition is to know what is normal. Gestational length is on average 340 days, although there is some variation, and healthy foals have been delivered as late as 365 days. A normal, uneventful delivery will usually involve an active labour of approximately 20 (10-30) minutes. Following delivery a healthy foal should stand and begin nursing within two hours. In these first few hours, respiration and heart rate stabilise to normal values of around 40 breaths per minute and fewer than 80 beats per minute. The mare becomes rapidly attached to the foal and, likewise, the foal to the mare. The healthy foal will usually pass meconium (black, tarry faeces) in the first two to four hours. Some straining is normal but a dark, sticky stool should be produced. Foals should be watched carefully to ensure they urinate normally, particularly colts. Finally the foal should be checked for any congenital problems that may become an issue later.

**Early warning signs.** An unhealthy foal will often deteriorate and become sick quickly, so it is important to look out for the following early warning signs and to be proactive:

• A premature foal, born at a gestational age of less than 330 days. These often display a soft, silky hair coat, floppy ears, a low birth weight and can be weak; a foal which endured a prolonged delivery of more than 30 minutes; one which fails to stand and nurse within two hours; displaying signs of respiratory distress or breathing becomes increasingly fast or laboured; foal whose dam has only small amounts of milk, which may be a watery consistency rather than thick, rich colostrum; dam refuses to allow the foal to nurse; exhibiting abnormal behaviour or any physical deformities. The new born foal needs careful monitoring for several days as it can sometimes appear normal at birth but develop problems later on.

The foal should become stronger and more active in the first few days. Therefore, if it appears to be sleepy spending increasing amounts of time lying down, seek veterinary attention. Below is a list of problems to look out for that might not be immediately apparent at birth but will become more obvious: with a distended abdomen and who fails to pass urine in the first eight hours; does not pass meconium, strains to pass faeces and appears uncomfortable; eyes and gums appear yellow in colour (jaundiced); develops diarrhoea and also appears dull and depressed; develops lameness or swelling; heat, swelling, pain or drainage from the umbilicus.

Predisposing factors for problems. It is often impossible to predict whether the impending birth will result in an unhealthy foal, but there are some predisposing factors. These include conditions that affect normal foetal maturation and development, normal delivery or the peripartum period. For example: twinning, dystocia (difficult birth), premature placental separation (red bag delivery), placentitis (inflammation of the placenta), vaginal discharge, premature births, hypothermia and mare illness. Furthermore, poor husbandry and a dirty environment to foal in increase the risk of the foal developing disease.

A vital step in the maintenance of health is the transfer of passive immunity via colostrum. This ensures the foal is well protected against disease and consequently it is important that the foal is tested between 15 and 18 hours after birth to ensure it has received adequate colostrum and subsequent immunity from the mare. The test is simple and is carried out by your vet, a blood test that measures the level of immunoglobulin (IgG) circulating in the foal's blood. If the level of immunoglobulin is insufficient this could be for several reasons: insufficient or no colostrum available from the mare; low levels of immunoglobulin in the mare's colostrum; foal has not nursed well; not absorbing the immunoglobulin proteins well.

Once a foal develops a systemic infection it rapidly becomes very sick and the infections are difficult and expensive to treat. As a result of this, if the immunoglobulin level is low when the foal is tested it is recommended that a plasma transfusion be given immediately, before the foal becomes sick, as prevention in this situation is far better than cure.

When to vaccinate. The mare should receive a tetanus booster vaccination four to six weeks prior to foaling. This will ensure the foal is covered for tetanus for six to 12 weeks following birth.

If the mare has not received this booster vaccination prior to foaling then the foal can be given a tetanus antitoxin injection soon after birth. This tetanus antitoxin will also provide initial cover against tetanus. At six months of age the foal can start their primary tetanus vaccination course of two injections four to six weeks apart.

The burning topic of the moment in our National Health Service is the Sustainability and Transformation Plan or STP. NHS England has divided the country into 44 areas and tasked each of them with devising a blueprint - the STP - for the future of the local NHS. You might think that this was so crucial that there would be significant public involvement consultation but NHS England has instructed local health authorities not to place these plans in the public domain until after they have been finalised in October. Fortunately, a draft version of the plan for

Shropshire has been shared with Shropshire Council's Health and Wellbeing Board, and this reveals the primary driver behind the local Sustainability and Transformation Plan: a projected shortfall in healthcare Shropshire funding for £140million by 2020/21. No wonder that a local GP recently that we commented won't recognise local our health service in five years' time (and not in a positive sense). In these circumstances, it is not very surprising that the local health authority has just approved a 'Decommissioning Disinvestment' programme that will see various mental health and disability services next in the firing line of its continuing attempts to save money.

#### COMMON SENSE DOESN'T HAVE TO BE BORING

Clare Todd does common sense very well. She manages the Cleobury Country Centre in a down to earth manner that gets things done once a decision has been taken. Waffle doesn't come into her life.

Her new wheels are typical of this attitude, replacing a Toyota pickup that looked ready for any terrain in the country and had quite a thirst. Not to mention a high insurance rating. She wanted greater flexibility to to fit in with her lifestyle and a camper seemed to be the answer, if she could afford one.

Back in May she talked to CCCampers at Clows Top, who had one of their medium size van conversions on offer. But Christian pointed out to her that it was eight years old, and she could buy a more modern van and have it converted for the same total price. "It was a no brainer," as she puts it. "I bought a six year old van and once we'd agreed what I wanted they did it in about two weeks. Mind you, I was there every day, nagging them."

It now has an elevating roof that accommodates a double bed, with another double down below. There's a twin burner gas stove, fridge and small sink all built in, dark glass windows all round, loads of storage space and a water tank that's filled through a simple hose inlet on the side of the van. There's a electrical hook-up if she's camping on a proper site and even a USB port for her phone.

This is basically CCC's Shelsley conversion in the short wheelbase version, which means it's actually smaller than her Toyota truck and much easier to park. Better on the fuel as well, and the insurance is less.

Still to be fitted is CC's own conversion of the twin passenger seat into a revolving unit that can be moved backwards to provide seating around the small table. For just under £11,000 that's a lot of work for a sensible price. Luxurious it's not; smart and practical it is.

There's a fitting for an awning that provides an extra room if she's entertaining. "I've got a small barbecue if I want to cook; I just get the chairs out and we've plenty of room."

It's her everyday transport, easy to drive with more than enough room for a shopping spree and an easy tea making facility if she's taking son Alfie to rugby and wants to relax and watch the game.

And Clare is full of praise for the helpful attitude she found at CCC, who do seem to put themselves out to help customers. They're at the top of the hill at Clows Top, next to the Victory Hall and Poppy's Benches.





#### **Women in Politics**

Prime Minister's Questions is the most popular Parliamentary moment of the week, for MPs at least, when we squeeze into every available seat and step, so there is standing room only. The final Prime Minister's Questions before the summer recess at the end of July was particularly well attended, being Theresa May's first appearance at the Despatch Box as Prime Minister.

She gave an impressive performance, her experience over the past six years in answering questions as Home Secretary clearly having prepared her well.

Theresa May's appearance was notable, as she is only the second woman to stand at the Despatch Box as Prime Minister of the United Kingdom in our nation's history. I am proud both have been Conservative. Theresa May follows in the footsteps of Margaret Thatcher, the longest-serving PM of the 20<sup>th</sup> Century. Women today are better represented in Parliament than ever before. There are currently 192 female MPs, being 29% of members of the House of Commons. Women comprise 36% of Theresa May's new Cabinet.

The 2015 General Election continued the trend since 1966, with the exception of the 2001 Election, of returning an increasing number of female Members. Over 1,000 female candidates stood for Parliament in 2015, the highest ever number. This momentum has been achieved less than 100 years after women were first able to stand for Parliament, in 1918. While progress has been made, more must be done to get this number higher and encourage more women into Parliament. I am hopeful that the current high

profile of female world leaders, including Theresa May and Angela Merkel will encourage more women to consider standing for election. This November may see the election of the first female President of the United States. This would be a powerful symbol to people the world over that there ought to be no limit to the aspiration of girls growing up. Other countries whose heads of government are currently women include Bangladesh, Norway, Namibia, Poland, and most recently Myanmar. In the UK, initiatives such as Women2Win are providing support, advice and training to women who wish to Parliament. With two daughters, I feel strongly that girls should know their gender will not hold them back in life. This means tackling prejudice, removing barriers, and ensuring young girls have aspirational role models in public life.

Within Parliament, a Professor of Gender and Politics at Bristol University, has been brought in for six months to address issues of women's inequality and develop a series of reforms that address existing insensitivities. An advisory board has been set up by the Speaker, with the outcome of this review due in coming months.

From HM the Queen, to the new PM, to women in the cabinet, to peers, elected MPs, MEPs or Councillors in local government, there are inspirational women in politics whom girls in the Ludlow Constituency can respect and admire. I hope this trend will continue, and the contribution of women continues to enrich public life and our national dialogue.

It was something of a brave shot, booking places to take a good friend to a Hobson's Brewery Night that featured Smoking Salop and the Eighth Best Burger in the World. What sort of a claim was that, for goodness sake?

But Hobson's do have a habit of doing things well and the evening proved to be well worth the money. Smoking Salop is the creation of Joe Allwood and contests burger competitions all over the country. In fact, they were so successful in their first year that they were invited to the World Championships in no less a burger-crazy place than America. And in the grand final they finished eighth.

Joe Allwood formed the group and explained the two courses for the evening. All with beers of your choice on tap to wash it down, after we'd made a tour of the brewery. First was brisket cooked for ten hours with smoked pork shoulder cooked for twelve hours and a two hour smoked Hobsons beercan chicken - and that was for starters. With a few more beers poured we chatted with Roy and Joy Powell and Liz and

John Redfern and exchanged stories as the main course sizzled. My mate Norman is quite a raconteur, but John Redfern was even better; we should preserve him as an emblem of the character of Cleobury Mortimer.

The star of this culinary experience was the burger voted eighth best in the world. A third of a pound of Hereford beef aged for three weeks and served with mature cheddar, barbecue sauce, mustard mayo and sundry vegetables, all in a Shrewsbury Bakehouse brioche

Whatever I write here, even to tell you about the juices running down my chin, there's simply nothing to match eating this quality of burger to realise why they are so popular across the Big Pond. Please do not offer me something from a few minutes on the home barbecue and tell me it's a burger; compared with this they are nothing.

From doubts about what we would be eating to this revelation was another lesson in not judging without knowing. I just have one problem after all that - where can I find a burger to match the eighth best in the World Championship?

And the beer? It was Hobson's and when my friend was offered a tour of the brewery he jumped at the offer. A darned good evening. If you get the chance to try one, grab it with both hands.

#### **CRIME REDUCTION GROUP REPORT - CCTV**

The Crime Reduction Group has worked very hard for over a year getting grants of £13,000 from the Crime Commissioner and Parish Council. We visited other towns to see how they operate and what systems they have and then obtained three quotes to look at. With the best value in mind we went with the same contractor as Oswestry who won an award for their system.

We are now able to say that we have 12 cameras around the town, of the quality for the Police to use for convictions, if required, as the old system was not good enough!

The CCTV system will not be monitored but is there recording for the Police to access if and when needed.

Our group of Councillors and community members are continually growing and have had success with the Smartwater initiative and now with the CCTV system.

Next we are looking at what we can do about speeding traffic and bad parking among other items. We welcome new members but only positive people who understand where we are and help to look for solutions. #### CLEOBURY MORTIMER PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

The Parish Council are very active looking after community interests, which has been helped by the partnerships built up over the past few years, especially due to the present climate. No longer is it just the odd pot hole or streetlight to sort out, it is becoming more of a business, like the larger towns. We are growing! The Council are in the process of taking over the Skate Park area, and

have already taken over the play area to ensure they are kept for the community to enjoy. New toilets have been built and managed by the Parish Council, streetlights are being changed to LED as necessary and also adapted for the CCTV and Christmas Lights, which produced many good comments last year. The Cemetery is looked after by us and we also do small jobs around the town, getting a grant from Shropshire Council which helps. We are constantly looking to improve the area, with crossings, dropped kerbs, new pavements, more streetlights, better parking, speeding and anti-social behaviour issues. I could go on.

On The Buses Steve Todd

More breakdowns as usual this month with the 9.14 to Kiddy being a regular victim. We went to Ludlow the other day and were on time both ways although it sounded like every panel on the inside of the bus was loose and trying to out rattle its neighbours. Even when the bus is on time, problems still occur. On one service, it looked like the young driver had his girlfriend up front with him and was so engrossed in their conversation that he went right past a where passengers were waiting. Presumably he was working on the very sensible principle that the job would be so much easier without the bother of picking up passengers. On another occasion, a new driver wasn't sure about the route in Ludlow and had to be guided by a passenger. This was not the first time this had happened so perhaps Liz Bishop should send Diamond an invoice for her services.

There have been a number of sightings of broken down Diamond buses scattered along the route so promises of better, more reliable vehicles seem to have come to nought. It does appear that the very ancient models dating from the 1990's have now been pensioned off and that all those now in use have been built during this century, if only just. Having said that, these vehicles lead a hard life and asking a well used 15 year old example to romp over Clee Hill on a regular basis is perhaps a little optimistic....

Despite the fact that they can't run their existing routes properly, Diamond have announced a new hourly service from Kiddy to Stourbridge. Presumably this replaces the axed no 13 route from Stourport but the new service has been imaginatively numbered 25 to ensure confusion with the 125 which runs on to Bridgnorth via Bewdley, Kinlet and Highley. I hope this doesn't take traffic from the 125 which appears to be well run by Central Buses. They claim that the new service will link

in to a number of other Diamond routes although the 2L doesn't get a mention...

No more news on the Shropshire Council Bus Strategy although consultation was due to start in 'early August'. I can't find any reference to this on the Shropshire Council website although it was supposed to have started several weeks ago and be – to quote from the document - 'aimed at individuals, groups and stakeholder organisations who have a vested interest in transport within Shropshire'. consultation Apparently, the should available on the 'Shropshire Council online Consultation Portal' so I looked and it isn't. Perhaps they are conducting consultation to ensure that there isn't another Brexit result. Madge Shineton is chasing this so we shall see when (and if?) it appears.

The document also includes a 'Prioritisation Framework' table ranking 29 routes within the county using a number of criteria such as linking key residential areas with employment sites and local services, education, shopping etc and also links with other services as well as the availability of other transport methods. Points are also given for the percentage of journeys taken by concession pass holders. There are a number of others, most of which the 2L route would appear to satisfy if it was included in the list which it isn't... Cock up or conspiracy? You choose.

Sadly, there has been no response to the Shropshire Council second request for expressions of interest in running the 2L. There is to be a meeting of interested parties in September to look for a way forward. I do hear that several Diamond employess have said that they are desperate to ditch the 2L route as they didn't want it in the first place but were obliged to run it as part of a package deal. Perhaps they should be asked how much they would pay to get shot of it and the cash could then be used to persuade another firm to take it on.





Here is the list of local crimes since the last August 8th/9th, from which £2000 worth of update:

August 8th/9th, from which £2000 worth of fishing equipment was stolen. On August 17th

Between 12:00 noon and 4:00pm on July 23rd, two cars parked on the Wyre Forest Visitors Centre car park at Callow Hill were broken into. Various items of value were stolen including driving licences, wallets, bags and cash. Another theft from a parked vehicle occurred on July 25th. The car was on the car park of the owner's place of work, but it had been left insecure with a window open. A sat nav and bank card, (which was subsequently used several times), were stolen. Further enquiries may reveal the thief. Yet another theft from a vehicle occurred between July 22nd and 30th in Cleobury Meadows. Power tools valued at about £2000 were the main items stolen. Two mountain bikes and two chainsaws were stolen from a lock-up adjacent to a house in Button Bridge overnight on July 30th/31st. A possible suspect was identified but although this criminal was in possession of stolen property, none matched that of this crime. Further enquiries are in progress.

A failed attempt at burglary occurred overnight on August 2nd/3rd at Cleobury Mortimer Bowling Club, but overnight on August 3rd/4th, a detached garage in Kinlet was broken into and several chainsaws stolen. Two strimmers and a socket set were stolen from a shed at Cleobury Mortimer cemetery overnight on August 4th/5th. A secure shipping container situated at the rear of a bungalow at Callow Hill was broken into on

August 8th/9th, from which £2000 worth of fishing equipment was stolen. On August 17th between 2:00pm and 5:00pm, a Land Rover Discovery which was left insecure and with keys in an open fronted garage, was stolen.

The first four items and the last one should highlight the wisdom of leaving unattended vehicles locked and with no valuables on board to tempt thieves. It is recognised that sometimes it is difficult to remove all power tools from vans each night, so other measures should be considered for security, including alarms, parking in a brightly lit area and within view, or as close as possible to the house. Provide extra security inside the vehicle if possible. Perhaps store tools in heavy duty containers, also with hefty locks and secured. It's all very tedious, but perhaps less so than having to replace stolen work tools and having insurance premiums go sky high!

The revamped CCTV cameras in Cleobury are now in place and up and running. The quality of images has greatly improved and there are several additional areas now covered which may help to either inhibit perpetrators of antisocial behaviour and crime, or help to identify offenders. Law abiding residents should feel more secure and there is only a need for the 'big brother watching us' school of thought by individuals who have no regard for the law, rules and regulations, or other people. *Nick Morris*



This summer has been lovely and frustratingly wet by turns, so that I have enjoyed many sunny days walking in the forest and peering in the ponds as well as, more recently, lending a hand in the fields to bring in the rain-spoilt hay.

It's a good year for blackberries and the elderberries too are now ripe. They and the bright red rowan berries have already attracted thrushes and blackbirds, making the most of the late summer glut. The wild and dog roses in the hedgerows are beginning to show their red hips, reminding those of us of the war-time and post war generations of delicious rose hip syrup being teaspooned into our young mouths to boost our Vitamin C levels. The hips were gathered throughout the countryside: about 450 tons a year between 1943 and 1945 according to Simon Fletcher in 'A Wyre Forest Diary'. The seeds are the source of the irritating country itching powder popped down other schoolchildren's backs, so they must be removed before boiling the pulp with its own weight in sugar and straining the resulting syrup.

Heather and gorse flowers brighten the woodland edges and heaths and provide plenty of early autumn food for bees and other nectarloving insects. Acorns and beech mast are ripening and the first of the autumn colour is appearing: wild cherry showing red and purple, orange on the deciduous European larch, and yellow on birch and some of the oaks.

It's changeover time, with swallows and martins preparing to leave on their migration flights to Africa. They do this by massing in large groups and juvenile house martins may help their parents to feed the last, late broods of young still in the cup-shaped nests of mud attached under the eaves of houses. Sand martins are brown and white in contrast to the black and white of the house martins and can sometimes be seen along the riversides in Bewdley – certainly efforts were made to accommodate them when the flood defences were built, so I hope they still breed there. The badgers will be changing over their bedding too, replacing the summer's grass, bracken or straw with a thick layer of fresh material. Even for a badger there must be nothing like a freshly-made bed.

If you fancy giving your fingers a workout and being rewarded with a new skill and a basket to take home, come along to the introductory course in Basket Making on 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> September organised by the Wyre Community Land Trust in Ruskin Land. The tutors, Kirsty Philbrick and Amy Cox, will teach participants how to make a traditional round basket, perhaps with a handle, from locally-grown willow varieties. materials, tools, drinks and home-made lunch will be provided for a fee of £120. No big party, no noisy launch. This is a serious business venture for partners Aaron and Kassie, spreading the word about tattooing, an art that has moved from the shady backstreets to be a fashionable way of showing your individuality.

Aaron's is the skill behind the needle that can paint a design on your body; everything from a modest dedication to a loved one through to an angelic David Beckham figure one customer has ordered. "I can do anything except portraits," explains Aaron. "That's for the really experienced artists."

He served his time in a friend's studio in Birmingham before teaming up with Kassie and committing to the new venture in quiet Shropshire.

The shop is fitted out as a reception area and the actual tattoo work is done in a small private booth. There's a big range of coloured inks available now, including some ultra violet shades to stand out in the dark.

The tattoo market is mainly in the late 20s to mid 30s age range and there is no question of anyone under 18 being tattooed - that's illegal. Before Azkass could open, there was an inspection by a County Council officer and the certificates they issued are on prominent display.

After finding love at the bins and getting engaged on the Number 3 bus home, Kath set about fixing her smile and ditching a ten-a-day denture fixative 'addiction'

SHE looks more than a decade younger than her age, her conversation is regularly punctuated with laughter and in recent years has found the love of her life . . . while emptying waste at the bins on the caravan park where she lives.

Keith, however, does have to live daily with another male who challenges him for Kath's affection – her miniature poodle, Ozzy, named after the legendary Black Sabbath Brummie.

Upbeat, confident and socially engaging, it's hard to imagine this woman, who has a love of sports cars, touring caravan holidays and stimulating chat, could have ever been any different.

But things were. As a 12-year-old she was admitted into hospital for dental surgery. "I can't remember what it was, but it was a rare case," she recalls.

That dental trauma remains with her and her warm smile is momentarily lost as she brings the experience to mind.

"I did have trouble with my mouth, losing some of my top teeth to pyorrhoea [gum disease] in my late 30s, but managed to hang on to my bottom teeth until I was in my 40s," she says.







# THE CLEOBURY MORTIMER LECTURES

Credit for this new idea in promoting the town and interest in its long history goes to Robert Hodge of the History Society. He had the conception, recruited the speakers and cooperated with the Parish Church to stage the lectures there.

There were three lectures in May and June, all offering free entry but asking for a donation that would benefit the Saint Mary's Youth Project. The speakers gave their time and knowledge gratis.

Peter Sutton opened the series on May 19th, talking about William Langland and his great work 'The Vision of Piers Plowman'. Plowman is remembered in the intricate East Window of the church, which was probably the most appropriate backdrop to such a talk. Peter Sutton has produced recently a new translation of Langland's great work and gave a fascinating

talk that was a fine opening for the series.

Robert Hodge delivered the June 9th lecture, on The Workhouse in Cleobury Mortimer, which he is actively researching. Those who fell upon hard times and turned to the Cleobury Mortimer Union for charity did not always find what they sorely needed. The phrase "Relief refused and the workhouse offered" does not strike dread in people's hearts today as it did in then, and families faced a very hard life when moved into the building just behind the Primary School site.

This proved to be the best supported of the trio of lectures, possibly a reflection of the site of the workhouse being well within living memory.

Philip Hulme, who has recently published a book on the Mortimer family, offered "On the Trail of the Mortimers" on June 30th. He traced their history from Hugh de Mortimer arriving with William of Normandy's

conquering army in 1066 and being being rewarded with the Manor of Cleobury, Claiberie as the contemporary style would have it. The family prosperity and influence through the coming centuries was enormous and Mr Hulme went into it in great detail; a good evening that held his audience in quiet attention to round off a very that successful experiment confirmed the level of interest in the town's history. It was a brave venture by both Robert Hodge and the History Society and they are to congratulated idea on an carried through with care and well placed publicity. The financial result was £425 for St Mary's Youth project, with Gift Aid possibly adding to that figure.

Robert has since confirmed that he has speakers lined up for a second series in 2017 and can see this becoming an annual attraction. Drawing as many as 70 people to the church in the evening suggests that this idea will run and run.



It's a measure of a tradesman's standing when he has customers who call him in regularly to do work on their property. Michael Coombes has a number of those, people who like his work and call him when the next stage of development or restoration is scheduled.

He's been in the building trade for 30 years, learning a lot from a local man until the gaffer retired and Michael opted for self employment ten years ago. At first he concentrated on roof work, but the weather isn't always kind to that specialised trade, so offers his big range of other experience that covers everything except plumbing and electrical work. He concentrates on the local area, normally within a 20 miles radius of his Cleobury home.

He does a lot of renovation work on older buildings, up to 400 years old in some cases. The roofs on such jobs will be stripped and any bad timbers replaced before refelting and tiling and any lead replaced. If the chimney needs rebuilding, he can do that too. He's done small factory roofs as well, but as a one-man band he won't take on big jobs, preferring those that he can handle on his own. He shows no sign of ambition to grow big and employ a lot of labour; he enjoys what he does and keeps busy all year round. He occasionally does flat roofs, but admits that he doesn't like them.

In the winter months he takes on indoor work like wall or floor tiling and some painting and decorating. There isn't much he can't do, and do well. "I've never had a complaint," he explains. "I take a lot of pride in my work."

He gets a lot of work rebuilding and repairing stone walls, using skills he finds are still in demand today. He's learned other things in that time, like not pushing your luck and hurrying to finish a job without using proper safety measures. "I fell off a roof in Hopton Wafers and broke the bones in my heel. I was in plaster for two months with that and couldn't work properly. I use a scaffold more than ladders these days," he laughs at the memory.

What does a customer think of staunchly independent man? "He's an absolute star," Helen Bumford told us. "We've had him here for eight weeks and he's built a new workshop, built a fuel tank installation that the tank people photographed as an example of how to do it, built a stone wall and now he's working on a Victorian greenhouse. He's been flexible, willing to take anything, we wouldn't hesitate to recommend him." What more can you say about the man's work?

He turns up on time, does a job on time and on quote and is enough of a realist to know that he's in just the right business. "Every day's different. I really do enjoy it," he says.

And he gives free quotes, too. The complete independent who loves what he does.




