CONGRATULATIONS







SWIFT WATCH

They arrived late, but following a good breeding season, 28 swifts left us finally in the second week of August . This is the average for the past eight years. They will by now be flying over their winter quarters of West Africa. Last year we lost several juveniles in the very hot days of late July, when air temperatures were close to 30 degrees. In the last days before their first flight, the

fledgling baby swifts are well fed by their parents to the point of being over fed, over weight with poorly developed flying muscles. It is a critical period for the young birds. Following that first flight most birds will not land for two years. As they can not land they can not rest in the shade and if it is very hot they can easily suffer heatstroke and quite literally drop from the sky. They need to recover and the wind conditions need to be right for take-off from where they have fallen. Climate change may be the cause of that hot weather. so we and the swifts may expect it more often. All animals are good at adapting to change and have done so for thousands of years. Perhaps in the next decade our swifts may be able to change by breeding further north in cooler climates or genetically adapt by turning near black and heat absorbing plumage to lighter grey colour. Only our great grand children will begin to see what they do to survive and prosper. Kit

The Cleobury Manor House

It has stood the test of time. For three centuries the Manor House on Cleobury Mortimer High Street presents itself as a testament to the style, imagination and quality of build that the Georgian era legacy has left for us.

Properties previous from centuries are protected through a listing system by Historic England. A Grade II with * is considered to have a special element of particular interest and in the case of the Manor House this is the curved and swept oak staircase with toad-back handrail. Also, a carved marble fireplace with Bacchanalian figures. This is what makes our Manor House with a separately listed adjoining Stable Block, so special amongst over the 100 listed buildings and structures in our town alone.

It is believed the House, aged at over 500 years, was built in the late 17th Century, by Hugh de Mortimer and was typical of Manorial Houses of that age. Formerly known as Cooks House, it was sold on 30th November 1760 for the sum of £60. Over the years, several exchanges of ownership ended with the property being sold to a Solicitor, George Emerson in 1920.

Since then, after 3 more owners, the property, then used as a Children's Home, finally became a Nursing Home in 1988 and ended up in the hands of its current owners whose business closed down around 2010. The House was closed up and has remained so since then.

In 1974 when Thomas Pain sold the property to The Children's Family Trust he had a Restrictive Covenant placed on the Title Deeds which included the words "That whose ever hands the property came into would forever hereafter maintain in good repair and condition."

By this time the building had been listed by Historic England for 20 years. It is with this in mind when it became obvious that the current owners appeared to show little interest in properly maintaining the building, that a campaign started to save it from further decline.

Known as the **Save The Manor House** campaign, the group built a web site with a lot of detail about the history of the house, photographs and regular updates on the massive challenges faced.

There has been evidence submitted to the team that instances of flooding (in one case through a leaking roof) may have resulted in significant damage to important features internally, not least of all the Grand Staircase and flooring throughout.

The team understands that responsibility for maintaining a watch over listed properties lies with the Conservation Department which is part of the Local Planning Authority.

This responsibility extends to requiring the owner to carry out repairs or maintenance as necessary to protect the property. It is believed this has only happened on one occasion when repair to a leaking roof were required.

Walking past the building today, one can only see the front elevation and it is very clear that urgent maintenance is required to the decaying woodwork and paintwork.

It should not be beyond belief that internally the property could be seriously suffering. With this in mind, the team are pressuring the County Council to require the owner to allow an internal inspection.

To raise local interest and beyond, the team have also been featured on BBC Radio Shropshire, BBC News (Midland) Web site and the Shropshire Star and South Shropshire Journal.

To help with local expense of printing and web site support, a funding effort through Go Fund Me has already raised £140. We have a target of £500 and readers can donate through our web site at www.savethemanorhouse.uk

The campaign will continue and with local support from Cleobury Town Council, Shropshire dignitaries and our MP, we hope that one day this Grand Old Lady will once again be a place that the town can be proud.

HIGH STREET LETTUCE

In July, I visited a friend near Northampton, and when we were looking around his garden, he pointed out a weed about eight feet tall. He told me that he had had just one of these in 2022, but now there were dozens growing in neglected corners of his largish garden.

It was a plant I didn't recognise, but when I was back in Cleobury, I noticed that amongst the plants growing too abundantly in our High Street (as well as the opium poppies) were quite a few of the same plants which had become so common in my friend's garden. The plant is known as the 'prickly lettuce', and although it looks nothing like an ordinary lettuce, it is perhaps reminiscent of a garden lettuce which has bolted, and thrown up a tall flower spike. The lower part of its woody stem is indeed prickly, and the underside of the main ribs of its leaves carry a quite definite line of prickles. There are a number of these plants growing alongside the high brick wall between the Manor House and the Pig Nose Pippin Gallery, and there were several tall specimens (though not eight-footers) in and around the doorway to the disused shop opposite the

My wild flower book, now over 40 years old, describes it as 'scattered and rare' except in south east England, and growing to a height of 1.5 metres. Could climate change be responsible for the fact that it is now perhaps not so rare, and can grow to well over 2 metres?

It has, apparently, the alternative name of 'compass plant', because its upper leaves point north and south when in full sun. How it can do that is beyond me, and why should it, anyway? I haven't been able to check out whether our High Street plants can do that - because we haven't had enough sun recently!

The Wyre Forest is full of streams and pools. Even though many of the larger pools are manmade they all provide habitats for freshwater creatures. Some of the most fascinating are the amphibians: the frogs, toads and newts that need water bodies to complete their life cycles.

One of the earliest and most exciting signs of spring is the appearance of frogspawn, usually in February but delayed until March in cold conditions. The frogs are followed by the toads spawning in April, their strings of eggs wrapped around plants on the pond edges. The tadpoles of both species tend to disappear after hatching, their dark brown colour camouflaging them from predators as they nibble algae around the pond margins. By early summer though, warm days bring the developing toad tadpoles to the surface in great black drifts and when they have all their little legs and can use their new lungs to gulp in air they are ready to leave the water. This spectacular exodus happened in late June this year: a day when it was impossible to walk on paths near the reservoir without sending great numbers of tiny toads scuttling for their lives.

Our farm pond missed its usual newt survey this year but usually my friend Val (who is licensed to handle newts!) sets the box trap on our pond in May and we do the count the next day. We photograph the belly markings on the Great Crested Newts to identify individuals, just in case anyone has the time to collate the pictures from different years to see how long the newts live and how far they venture. Other researchers have found that they live an average of 7 or 8 years and can easily travel between ponds (see 'The Nature of Wyre' by the Wyre Forest Study

Group). I did my own surveying in May using a torch at night and saw at least 4 Great Crested Newts and many Palmate and Smooth Newts snoozing in the shallows of the pond. We have also seen several spindly Palmate tadpoles during pond-dipping sessions.



To bring us up to date, the young of all these species will now be roaming the forest – the adults too. I have to be very careful moving piles of weeds or soil in the garden as I usually come across tiny toads such as the one in the photo – a perfect little replica of its parents but only about 17mm long. This is the time of year to do some pond maintenance and I shall be scooping out some of the pond weeds which have grown prodigiously. I'll leave them a while on the pond edges though so that little critters can find their way back to safety in the water.

Philip Dunne's Letter from Westminster

In August, I visited Kerry Taste and Nutrition in Burford. As well as being one of the largest employers in South Shropshire, they are also taking real strides in reducing their carbon footprint.

While there, I was able to see installation of the last row of 750 solar panels on their food processing plant's roof, which has the power to generate over 300kW - equivalent to over 1 million miles driven in an Electric Vehicle per year. This will help Kerry T&N reduce their operating costs, ensuring they continue to contribute to the local economy.

The capital cost was funded by a Community energy scheme, Big Solar Co-op, one of the first such schemes in the country, through an innovative funding arranged by Sharenergy in Shrewsbury. Community Energy schemes received a real boost last month when the government announced a new £10m Community Energy Fund. This new fund will help to tackle barriers to entry to the market by providing grants to the community energy sector to help them develop projects for commercial investment.

Alongside the new Community Energy Fund, the government has announced a consultation on the barriers the community energy sector faces, and an annual report on the community energy sector.

I have been convinced of the value of community energy schemes to promote renewable energy sources locally for some time. I must declare an interest, as I have been a member of Ludlow Hydro Cooperative for a number of years, also put together by Sharenergy, which generates clean electricity via an Archimedes screw turbine alongside the Horseshoe Weir in Ludlow. I hope we will see more projects in South Shropshire as this funding comes onstream.

Important as the contribution these schemes can be towards net zero, and as keen as I am to support them, I do acknowledge, as does the Committee on Climate Change, that we will continue to need carbon based fuel sources for decades to come, not least as it will take years for the 29 million petrol and diesel vehicles to be replaced from our roads – which is why I did not leap to the barricades when the government announced last month it was issuing new North Sea oil and gas licences.

I have called for the Government to set a date to end further exploration and development of fossil fuels in the North Sea, and still believe that is right. But it is worth considering the context that oil and gas production from the UK side of the North Sea is declining at around 8% a year. So the logic behind granting new licences during the transition to wholly renewable energy, is to enable the production profile to decline more gradually so that we can balance our energy security by enabling our reliance on imported additional oil and gas to be reduced. The actions of Putin show how risky it is to rely entirely on imports, or to rely on higher emission fossil fuels from less stable states.

I do remain an optimist on our ability to meet net zero by 2050. After all, the UK has decarbonised faster than any other country in the G7, cutting emissions by 48% between 1990 and 2021, while the economy grew by 65%. But I have made no secret of how I think the government needs to go further and faster in some areas.

I shall continue to bang the drum for net zero, and the economic growth that can accompany it, as this latest renewable energy investment in South Shropshire at Kerry T&N shows.



So, Thames Water 'stars' again for having the worst environmental performance of all the companies according to the latest Environment Agency annual assessment, being responsible for 17 of the most serious incidents. Anglia were second bottom with 'just' 11. The good news: Severn Trent came top. The bad news: it was top of 'a very poor league' according to the head of the Environment Agency. It makes you wonder whether the EA and OFWAT have been asleep for the last few years. It's true that the EA has had their funding cut by about 30% over the last decade but, speaking to those who have or are working there, much of their time is spent hanging around waiting for someone to tell them what jobs needed doing or awaiting 'elf and safety clearance. Mind you, they became very good at cards...

The political arena is starting to warm up as the various participants limber up for the next general election. The last little flurry of by-elections seem to have ended in a score draw with the major parties winning one each. The problem for me is that none of the major participants appear very statesmanlike and as George Pompidou, past President of France once said: 'A statesman is someone who puts himself at the service of his nation, a politician is someone who puts his nation at the service of himself'. Sadly, recent events have shown how true this remains.

A £130 million UK charity has succumbed to 'Colonial Guilt' and decided to cease operations. Was it that their money came from the slave trade or colonial looting?

No. It was that their income derived from global investments and this was felt incompatible with their 'social, racial and climate justice' agenda. So they are winding up and their annual grants of around £13 million to needy charities will cease. No doubt potential recipients will be delighted that this grand gesture will deprive them of much needed income...

I gather that you don't need a dog to go dogging although an audience helps. An outbreak of people indulging in the pastime at a car park near Cheltenham has spurred the police into action. They have installed CCTV and the Gloucestershire Police and Crime Commissioner has issued a statement saying 'You are being watched'. So, HS 0.9 has now been coded 'Red' by the Infrastructure and Projects Authority. This means 'successful delivery of the project appears to be unachievable'. As one wag put it 'It was called HS2 because it would cost twice as much and take twice as long as planned to complete'. That's true and then some.

I see that the train companies and rail unions are jointly working night and day to make train travel as difficult as possible. The latest wheeze is to shut ticket offices and force travellers to either book online or wrestle with the complexities of the ticket machines. They claim that the affected staff will be deployed within the station to assist passengers especially those who are disabled but I'll believe that when I see it.

A recent review of some 30 medical centres in the area resulted in the Cleobury set up coming first so well done to them for their efforts. If you are thinking of having a moan about their performance, just consider that it is likely to be much worse elsewhere.

So, The Lionesses got to the final. Shame about the result. Still, they have the European Cup but it seems ironic that they are probably paid far less for winning trophies than the men's team who don't. Proves that when you want a job done properly, get a woman...

Letter from America. Lisa Baldwin's advice.

Question

I am finding that I want to spend more time alone. My friends are concerned that I may be depressed. I do enjoy their company when together. I have read that isolating oneself can be a sign of depression. How can I tell if there is something wrong with me?

Answer

It is true that isolating oneself <u>can</u> be a sign of depression. Other signs may include under- or oversleeping, eating too much or too little, feelings of hopelessness and sadness, and a tired but wired feeling. Some also express depression as feeling like "I am swimming in molasses." It can impair one's ability to function at work, or just to complete basic tasks of living.

There are different types of depression. Some are situational. We may be going through a difficult period in our lives that may include challenges and loss. Other forms of depression are biochemical in nature. No matter how hard we try, we can't seem to will ourselves to feel better. Although the symptoms of depression have a common theme, each person's life circumstances and biochemistry are unique. It is good to meet with your doctor to determine if there are underlying physical causes to what you are experiencing.

It can also be the case that wanting to spend time alone can be anything but depression. It can be a healthy time of growth and purpose. It can be restorative and renewing. It is a sign of psychological health to be able to be alone with oneself. We can be uplifted and inspired spending time with others, but we often deepen and receive clarity about ourselves during alone time.

One way to determine if your desire for more time alone is healthy is to consider the following questions: Am I avoiding something or someone? Are my thoughts ruminating in a negative spiral of guilt about the past? Am I spending time worrying or resenting something? Where are my thoughts?

If you are experiencing peace, contentment, clarity and calmness, chances are high that your desire for alone time is a positive experience, and not depression.
