





It was about two years ago that Dick and Barbara Skilton first showed their cheerful little Skillipig characters to the public at the Cleobury Country Farmers Market. Wee hedgehog-like creatures that wore smiles and got up to tricks and mischief. They made people smile and sold well.

Two years later the growth has been astonishing, not least because the Skiltons are bright people who could see a way to reach a wider public. At first they visited local card and gift shops, but realised that they couldn't cover the country and produce a wider range to print and distribute as well.

So they resorted to Google, looking for small shops and then sending a small selection of Skillipigs with a message for the village and inviting people to stock these friendly little folk. When we talked early in June, they had 120 outlets in the country, stretching from Ullapool in West Scotland to Penzance in Cornwall. That's an exercise in sensible communication at minimal cost. The light and friendly touch extends to the matter of addressing their first postal contact, with the parcel marked for the attention of "The person with imagination." It obviously works; current sales level is 1500 to 2000 a month.

Dick will draw a special skillipig to your own design if you fancy being different or he'll produce a Skillipig Christmas card. Look up Skillipig on the web and learn more.

And would you believe they don't have a stockist here in Cleobury! I must remind them where the Larch Barn is - they have imaginative people there. *JR*.

#### SWIFT WATCH 2021

It was not until the third week of May that our swifts arrived from Africa and even then, the weather was cold with very low levels of flies, their main food source. The delay will probably mean that they will not leave us, after their brief three month breeding season, until well into August. By mid June swift numbers were about 22, which is around the average for the past six years of recording. Just under 30 adults and fledglings left for Africa last year, so let's hope the weather and abundant flies make the round trip of 7,000 miles to Cleobury and back, worthwhile for these remarkable birds.

Sand Martins, in normal numbers, were late arriving as well, but swallow numbers for the second year appear to be reduced with reports of some local nesting sites without swallows at all.

Why not visit the main swift nest site around 9.15 in the evening around the church and enjoy the frolics of adults and youngsters just before they retire for the night? Less than a quarter roost in their nest sites, while the the rest fly all night in relaxed, semi comatose mode above 1,500 feet. *Kit Smith*

#### THE MEN'S SHED Progress Update:

1. The highly professional metal security shutters have all been hand made by member Colin Tolley in his garage in Cleobury Mortimer and delivered to the shed. Colin and Iain Smith have been working hard prepping the external side wall shutter mounting points so the shutters can be fitted one by one. Once Colin is happy they all fit OK then they will be removed ready for painting. Thank you Colin for making them and to Iain for his help. 2. Our insulated 20 foot container is now in use and all the materials which were in the shed are in the container, to free up space for work in the shed. Thanks to Guy James, Iain Smith and Peter Cuthbert for this. 3. Guy, Ian and Peter have also done four coats of PVA

on the concrete floor to seal it, having already painted the walls with special fire retardant paint. It looks great!

4. We have had building control sign off for the building and the building regulation compliance certificate has been issued

5. There are plans to start marking out where the machines are best placed to consider the actual machine footprint sizes, to inform the the best lay out. This will help us do a layout plan which is needed to sort out a dust extraction system.

6 We are in talks with Axminster tools, who have refreshed our quote and we are now seeking the estimated lead time for an order so we can plan the right timing around the completion of the security shutter installation.

7. We continue to receive kind offers of tools and thanks in particular to Mike Patterson for helping with this. Mike has also managed to sell some donated tools we do not need, generating more funds for our charity. We are visiting another property near Worcester to inspect more tools offered to our mens shed. Mike and I picked up some donated guttering last week which is under the mobile home with an eye on possible use for any roof structure which we may choose to build over the future patio area.

8. More thanks to Bill Duley for his faithful and valued work with funding applications. Bill is working on one for the patio materials made from recycled bottles (in line with the wishes of our late dear friend, secretary, and a founding trustee Keith Martin's (RIP) last wishes).
9. Thanks to the generous Insurance at Ludlow we are able to keep our momentum going without delays which happen due to lack of funds and waiting for more bid outcomes. I have included Laura Matthews from NFU in the circulation of this update. Thank you Laura and all at NFU Mutual Ludlow.

#### **Patio position:**

David Robinson, our charity president, has asked if we could place our patio behind the mobile home rather than at the side of the mens shed. This is because the expansion of the industrial estate is in the planning stage and it appears likely the perimeter road will need to be extended south of our shed and it would be helpful if we therefore do not build a patio on that side.

Most of the recent progress is outlined above and it is great to see the passionate e n t h u s i a s m a n d commitment to move the project forward. I hope we can get the shed operational by the autumn and open this y e a r on c e all s a f e t y assessments, policies and training is in place to the satisfaction of the trustees.

That's the proud boast of Mahorall Farm Cider, tucked away on the southern slopes of Clee Hill. It's not a drive for the nervous, half a mile across fields where curious cattle look up from their grazing to see who's visiting today.

But the welcome at the farm is warm, Chris King-Turner smiling and happy to listen to what you want. I first visited the place out of curiosity about ten years ago and came away with a case of 12 bottles that went down very well.

Talking to Chris then, he told that when he started he'd followed an instruction manual for novices and didn't like the very dry cider that resulted. He started again, just working to his own idea and produced what he wanted - a decent cider made from locally sourced apples and fermented by natural wild yeast.

Today the family pick apples in small local orchards by hand and collected in net bags that allow the fruit to breathe. On bigger orchards they use machines, with the capacity to pick up to six tons of apples. When the fruit is ripe it's sorted and washed, then milled into a sauce-like mush with the waste sent to compost. The mush is layered into the hydraulic press and gradually pressed up to ten tons to get all the juice out. The juice is poured into tanks and allowed to ferment for four or five months and then transferred to barrels to mature for a few months. There's no hurry about this process, it's a blend of care and patience to get the final product right.

And it is impressive, the range on offer having grown to offer seven options, from a fresh sparkling medium dry in sparkling or still forms, through damson, elderflower or ginger blend to a mulled version produced for the traditional Christmas season. They proudly state "We do not add sulphites to any of our ciders." You want purity in whatever liquid you sip? Here it is.

Remember that this is part of a 150 acre working farm that offers visitors a free nature trail and when you've looked around the rolling countryside you can walk into the small farm shop and taste a range of flavours before making your choice.

You can use their mail order if you live far away - would our California readers please note - but a drive out to this part of Clee Hill is a gentle way to pass the day. SY8 3AH on your satnav will get you there, with clear signs along the way to confirm you're in the right place.

Chris asked if I could leave copies of the Clarion for visitors. So beginning with this issue, we have a Mahorall outlet to serve readers in the area. And I came away with a case of 12 bottles, good value at £25.



#### THE TETSTILL HYDRO IS ALIVE AND WORKING

Tetstill Mill on the River Rea outside Neen Sollars has a long history of using water power. The Domesday Book records a mill there, owned by Siward the Fat, obviously not a chap with a delicate ego. If they had egos as long ago as 1086, when Siward was paying a 'measure of corn' in rent. The place operated as a corn mill until the early years of the 20th century. Good history to back up the launch of a modern mini hydro, using one of the two mill races to reduce intrusion of noise into what had become a pleasant waterside dwelling.

In 2012 the Neen Sollars Community Hydro Co-op Ltd was launched and a 22-page pamphlet invited investment with the prospect of earning interest over the 20 year agreed lease of the access land and mill structure. The earning was estimated at 4.1% and the investment target was £149,500. It says a lot about the interest in the venture that the total sum was raised. The directors of the group were Bill Duley and Chris Dimond, both from Cleobury Mortimer, Graham Wilkinson of Neen Sollars and Claire Tibbits from Stottesdon. Company Secretary was Jon Halle from Ludlow, a director of Sharenergy.

The turbine installed was an Ampair DRK propeller-type based on a long established design, that had proved reliable over three years service and tests. In the Spring of 2012 the civil works tender process got under way and in 2013 the turbine was started. Neen Sollars had its own source of generating electricity, which fed into the national grid, but it was another example of what could be achieved with careful planning and local enthusiasm.

The plant was installed by Ampair, but just four months into the operation the company declared itself bankrupt. Bill Duley, who showed us around and provided much background information, says there was very little instruction given about the running and maintenance of the plant. If the company were on the edge of bankruptcy, you can see that there would be gaps in communication.



The mill as it is today, running smoothly and putting out about six kilowatthours,. even with low water flow.

The group, left to pick up the pieces, struggled on with just intermittent output. Then severe flood damage last year, when we had record bad weather and rain in this area, saw the plant shut down to prevent damage. Shropshire County - bless 'em - came up with funding for a business suffering loss due to the flood, plus there were contributions from other sources.

As a result of the rebuild, with guidance for the redesign coming from Shropshire company Sharenergy, the plant started up again on December 7th last year. Since when it has generated over 40,000 kilowatt hours and a conservative estimate is that the rebuild has doubled the capacity of the plant. That has possibly upped the power supply from 20percent to no less than 50percent of the local requirement.

It's an intriguing experience to stand beside the River Rea and look at this historic site and realise that it represents what may be a normal power source in rural areas in future. Rivers won't stop flowing and they do provide a reliable source of energy if we can just get the engineering sorted not a big problem in the 21st century.

The machinery looks well maintained. Water flow to the turbine is monitored by mill owner Kevin Flook and protected by a screen that prevents harmful material passing through. The upstream passage of salmon to spawning grounds is eased by a ladder that bypasses the weir. It has survived flood and early engineering failure to still be providing electricity. It is not a revolution, it is the product of careful planning and imagination. For some, it is the future.

### Philip Dunne's Letter from Westminster

#### Proposed Boundary changes

Last month, the Boundary Commission released their proposals for changes to the borders of the parliamentary constituencies.

Boundary Reviews happen routinely to address demographic changes over time, to ensure that constituency sizes are broadly equal. The last review was based on the number of electors at the 2000 General Election. But clearly, over twenty years on, as the population of the country has grown and areas have become more or less densely populated, this can lead to big discrepancies in the number of electors in each constituency.

To show how diverse this can be, at the 2019 General Election the Bristol West constituency had 99,253 electors, whereas our neighbour Montgomeryshire had only 48,997. Both return one MP – so clearly, not all votes carry the same weight in electing their MP. So this latest review from the Boundary Commission is long coming, and necessary.

The initial proposals involve some change to the Ludlow Constituency – not least a proposed name change, to 'Ludlow and Bridgnorth'. The Shropshire Council wards of Burnell and Severn Valley – currently part of the Shrewsbury & Atcham constituency – would be included in the new Ludlow and Bridgnorth constituency. This would increase its geographic area significantly – by over 100 square miles, to some 700 square miles, which would make it the 5<sup>th</sup> largest constituency in England by area. It would also increase the number of electors by 7,500, over 10% on current levels, to some 77,000 electors.

This is however markedly less change than the previous iteration of the proposals from the Boundary Commission, which would have split the Ludlow Constituency in three, part of which would have created a new seat of Ludlow and Leominster in Herefordshire.

The current proposals keep five constituencies in Shropshire and Telford, and do not cross other county boundaries. The rest of Shropshire sees some limited movement of Shropshire Council wards, to ensure all constituencies have between 75,000 and 77,000 electors, with the exception of Telford, which would initially have 70,000, providing some room for this high growth town to increase its electors in years to come.

Across the West Midlands, there are no changes to the number of constituencies in Herefordshire, Shropshire, Worcestershire, Warwickshire, Coventry, and Birmingham and Solihull. Staffordshire and the Black Country reduces from 25 constituencies to 23. So the West Midlands reduces overall from 57 constituencies to 55.

I stress these are just initial proposals. The Boundary Commission will report with their final recommendations by 1<sup>st</sup> July 2023, but there will be revisions off the back of feedback from MPs and the public. The public can have their say now through the current consultation, which finishes on 2<sup>nd</sup> August.

I shall be studying the detail closely, and I would also welcome feedback from constituents on the proposals, in particular the proposed change of name.

At Uncllys Farm we recently had an encounter with things that go squeak in the night and I realised that I had heard the sound before, in fact I wrote about it in one of my articles. It was just as if someone had trodden on a squeaky toy, or several squeaky toys, and happened at dusk, which turned out to be a bit of a clue. Thanks to the technical wizardry of a smart phone we were able to send a recording to the ever-helpful Rosemary Winnall, who identified the source as a family of Tawny Owl chicks letting their parents know that they wanted feeding! They were a bit bigger than those in the photo, having flown the nest to take up positions around the edge of our hay field. Judging by the number of times I spot a little brown shape scooting across a garden path I think the Field Vole population is plenty big enough to sustain several owl families. While

listening for the owls subsequently we heard the strange call of the Woodcock in the distance – quite different to the sound of the owl fledglings.

Last year I started to keep a diary of the things I was seeing around the farm and the local woods. It's been fascinating to look back, comparing this year to the last. What surprises me most is that the events I noted (flowerings, fledgings etc) have occurred at virtually the same dates this year, despite my recollection being that last spring and early summer were very warm and this year started very cold. Sadly there are things completely missing this year. A couple of House Martins investigated the eaves of the Studio but didn't stay, and we saw no Swallows at all. I haven't heard a Cuckoo yet this year. I watched a lovely, bright-winged Tortoiseshell butterfly in the garden a few days ago and realised that I was hardly seeing any butterflies this year, but maybe things will improve as the good weather goes on.

This month we expect to hear the young Buzzards shrieking for their parents from the woods and field fences. Another feature of July in this part of the woods is the eruption of numbers of tiny Common Toads moving out from their birthplace in the little reservoir. If you get the timing right you can go down to its margins and watch them moving out into the forest, but be careful where you walk! *Linda Iles*

This trip of discovery was inspired by a birthday present from my son David, a bottle of Penderyn Welsh Whisky. It was a surprise to learn that malt whiskies were being distilled in the Principality and a real pleasure to try one. The unusual bottle with long flutes down each side and long empty, stands on the window ledge in my kitchen as a reminder.

A visit to their website revealed they would be doing tours of the place when the lockdown eased and as soon as I could there were two places booked for my lady and me on June 17th. A relaxed drive to Hereford, then pick up the A465 that becomes the famous Heads of the Valleys road. We were at Penderyn in good time, despite road works where this major westward route is being improved.

We were welcomed by charming staff who explained we were part of a group of eight, the maximum allowed at the time. We wandered around the visitor

centre, where clear drawings and photos showed the processes that turns water into a very strong wine via malted barley and is then blended with pure water drawn from the surrounding Brecon Beacons to mature in a variety of casks that add to the final flavour.

The original still is a single copper pot that produces a very strong spirit (about 92% abv) that is then blended with the pure water. The still was designed by Dr David Faraday, a descendant of the great Victorian Michael Faraday. So even the production plant has a good

Our guide on the tour was Lee, who explained that the place was not working fully, this being one of the regular cleaning periods. As you would expect of a unit producing a drink, the whole place was very clean.

Detailed explanation was difficult to give and to hear with everyone wearing masks, but at regular points there were small public address systems to aid the process. The climbs up and down amid widely varying temperatures meant this is not a job for the unfit and if the noise did intrude a little the scent of the liquor made up for it.

Back in the visitor centre we had a chance to talk to Lee and I asked if the two pot stills they have are the same as those used in the Writers Tears distillery in Ireland - a favourite of mine. His eyes lit up at the mention of that name; clearly a man who knows his market and appreciates quality.


The range of flavours was detailed and small samples offered to everyone in the party, with small taster bottles the alternative for drivers. So herself had her samples and mine and I brought a small bottle home. I lost a friend to a drunken driver years ago and the memory of that has never left.

From a small company that started distilling in 2003 and now sells this distinctive Welsh whisky to 40 countries, this is a remarkable story. They have also just started a northern distillery in Llandudno as their range of whiskies and other products grows. And the friendly way they treat visitors is well worth the 80 mile drive to try it.



Welcome to the July Edition of our quest to stay ahead of Scammers. While we thought that June was going to be the month of freedom, it looks like constraints on our freedom remain for a bit longer. This is good news for the scammers who will undoubtedly find ways of using our current slightly restricted freedom to come up with new ways to coerce us into giving up personal details and leading to losing money or our life savings. This month I am going to introduce readers to a term known as Online Social Engineering which is on the rise. Online covers any communications between you and a scammer whether it is through the internet or via a telephone call. In much less frequent instances this can also include cold calling at the door.

Online social engineering is when scammers emotionally manipulate you into handing over some or all of your personal information. They take advantage of human behaviour and trick you into thinking they're the real deal. Here are four tips to prevent a social engineering attack.

1 Never reveal passwords or PINs via email or phone, no matter how legitimate sounding the request seems. No company will ask for these this way.

2 Call back. If you receive a call from a company requesting sensitive info, ask for their full name and call the company from their official website number. 3 Resist the urge to click on suspicious links from anyone. Even if you think you know them. Always double check the web address first.

4 Think twice. If something sounds too good to be true or attractive, then it is most likely a fake. Even if it looks and sounds like it is coming from a reputable source.

Here are some examples of the most recent scam activities. Firstly, the use of the telephone is still high on the scammers list. Current technology enables the scammers to generate hundreds of thousands of outgoing calls every day. They can also manipulate the technology to make the call look like an authorised or official number. Using these techniques if you use call back to the number displayed on your phone, you will find that the call is redirected to the scammer who may sound very plausible and convince you to disclose personal information. Other incoming telephone calls to your home phone or mobile number may come from overseas. If your phone has the capability of showing the incoming number, beware if the number is prefixed with a 2- or 3- digit country code (the first digit will never be a 0 but may be a + sign). If you answer the caller invariably hangs up but they have registered it as a valid number just because you answered it. Your number, along with

other (valid) numbers, will then be sold on to the big-time scammers for future use. This is how it works. The small-time scammers will use technology on a computer to dial a range of numbers, e.g., 01299 270001 to 270999. Many of the interim numbers will be unused but those that are used will produce a ringtone when the computer dials it. If the number is answered the computer disconnects the call but flags the number up as valid. The only numbers the computer rejects are those that produce a solid tone which indicates the line is not in use. As I stated, only the valid numbers are passed on for the real scam. The 2<sup>nd</sup> scam group is the internet, specifically email, group. This is the highest scam group of all where scammers send emails that appear to be from valid sources, advising that accounts have been suspended or debit/credit card transactions have failed or a subscription is due for renewal etc. Recent examples I have received have been from EE the mobile phone company, Santander the Bank, Lloyds Bank, GOV.UK etc. I don't bank with either of the mentioned banks or have a mobile phone account with EE, so these are easy for me to spot. But if you did have one of these, you may be tempted to click on a link or follow the instructions. DON'T. Do the simple test first. If you are opening the email on a desktop computer, the sender's details may look authentic, such as EE or GOV.UK but look at the real senders address alongside it when you click on the email. It will look like this, <u>name@xx.yy</u> where xx.yy could be .co.uk or gmail.com or something else ending in a 2-character code indicating the user is sending from an address abroad. If the senders address does not compare to a known source from your Bank, Building Society or Phone provider, it is most likely a scam. Do not follow any instructions or links in the email. Just delete it. If you are opening the email on a tablet or mobile device the sender's details may be masked, but if you click on the name, you will see who the sender really is. For example, a recent email from EE showed this.

EE <u>couk@limited-invoice.co.uk</u> Definitely not EE. I hope this has helped to build understanding of how to protect your identify and your money. For more information see <u>www.which.co.uk/consumer-</u><u>rights/scams</u> or contact Action Fraud on <u>www.actionfraudalert.co.uk</u> These organisations keep up with all the latest news so it's good to visit regularly. The aim remained the same, however to get round the problem of Covid restrictions and reduce overheads it was decided that creating a website where customers could order and have their items delivered locally in a re-usable box would be much better.

The problem of customers not being able to bring their own containers, was solved by sourcing a fantastic biodegradable range of plantbased packaging. This packaging disappears within 12 weeks of hitting your compost or greenwaste bin. As soon as it has been delivered, it can be de-canted into your own storage jars and bunged in the green bin!


