Lumps and Bumps



Becky Robinson, Associate Vet, Severn Edge Veterinary Group, offers some sound advice

Over the last few weeks we've seen quite a few pets brought in with 'lumps and bumps', so I thought I would share a few insights about them and what they might be.

A lump on your pet can be one of many things. Sometimes it will be nothing to worry about, but occasionally it will be a sign of something nasty, and if so we need to know early so we can help your pet get better.

We recently had Jet, a beautiful six-yearold black Labrador, brought into our branch to see me. Her owner had noticed a lump on her side which was getting bigger. It had started relatively small but had progressed to being about the size of a tennis ball. With most lumps, it's often not possible for a vet to tell exactly what it is by look and touch alone. In cases such as these we will take a small sample with a needle and look at it under a microscope in a laboratory.

This can normally happen right away, without having to put the dog under anaesthesia, and more often than not they don't even notice that we've taken a sample. Most of the time this is all we need to do to work out what it is.

Back to Jet: she was as good as gold when I took a sample of her lump and didn't even flinch. When I looked at it under the microscope, I could see it wasn't just a fatty lump (a lipoma) so I sent the slide off to the lab to tell me exactly what cells they were. The laboratory identified it as a cancer, and one that could potentially spread. As a

result, I knew that the lump had to come off and I had to be sure I removed the whole thing otherwise it would come back.

Jet was booked in for surgery a week after we got the results and I'm pleased to say it was a success, and she is recovering nicely. When Jet and her mum recently popped in to have her stitches checked she looked great. She is now cancer free and can look forward to years of happy, healthy life.

So please remember: if your furry friend develops a lump or bump, take them to your vet so they can make sure there's nothing to worry about. Hopefully it will be nothing, but if it isn't then they will need to act quickly like we did for Jet. *Becky Robinson*





Letter from Westminster - Philip Dunne MP

As a country we have seen a strong economic turnaround in the past few years since overcoming the impact of the Great Recession in 2008. Rural areas like Shropshire were badly hit, as work dried up and people had to rely on welfare to stay afloat.

When the last Coalition Government came into office in May 2010, there were 1,054 people in the Ludlow Constituency claiming Jobseekers Allowance, 2.6% as a proportion of economically active 16-64 year olds. The most recent Office for National Statistics report - from May this year - show the number of people in the Ludlow Constituency relying on JSA to get by fell to just 408, or 1% of the economically active population. That means over 60% of those relying on out-of-work welfare in 2010, have ceased to be dependent on welfare and are now receiving a regular pay-packet. That means more security for local families.

I know for some it can seem like decisions taken in Westminster have little impact in Shropshire. But these figures clearly show how our economic reforms are having a positive effect right here in South Shropshire. Recent figures from the RBS regional growth tracker show economic growth in Shropshire is outpacing most other areas of the West Midlands, at 3.1% for the first three months of this year.

All this is good news for Shropshire, and it's vital we maintain conditions that encourage this growth over the long term. So the Chancellor used his budget speech last month to set out a plan for ensuring the UK's economic future is secure. I am sure people across Shropshire will welcome the Chancellor's announcement of a new National Living Wage. If you are over 25, this will mean a minimum hourly rate of £7.20 from next April,

rising to £9 an hour by 2020. A direct pay rise for 2.5 million people across the country.

The Budget also brought positive steps for Shropshire, including a 50% rise in the Employment Allowance. A new £3,000 allowance will mean local firms can employ four people, full time on the new National Living Wage, and pay no National Insurance contributions at all. This will give small businesses the confidence to take on extra staff as they grow.

Shropshire has one of the largest road networks of any county in England. So local motorists will welcome the decision to amend Vehicle Excise Duty and put it back to its original purpose – to spend on maintaining our roads. The commitment to maintain the freeze on fuel duty will also help Shropshire motorists every time they fill up at the pump.

I was also delighted that the Chancellor committed to maintaining spending of at least 2% of GDP on defence for each year of this Parliament, fulfilling our commitment to NATO allies. This will provide a real terms increase in defence spending, which as Minister for Defence Procurement, gives me renewed confidence that I can ensure our troops have the kit they need to meet our defence commitments for the next five years.

I support our ambition to move Britain from a low wage, high tax and high welfare economy to a high wage, low tax and low welfare society. This is the right direction for Shropshire and for Britain. I look forward to playing my part in helping create the conditions for growth, jobs and security in the Ludlow Constituency.



On The Market - Clare Todd, the Lady in Charge

Cleobury Country Farmers' Markets were launched in April 2013. There had been an experiment in 2012, run by Chris Dimond and Sue Davis, that went well and sewed a seed. In 2013, with Clare in charge, the flower blossomed.

There was a lot of work done before it all started: "Negotiating with the church wardens, getting a grant from the Parish Council and licences from Shropshire Council, planning consent for the shed to store all the stuff in and getting a Community Chest grant to buy the shed - we got a good price from M&M for that." And the idea worked

well, so much that a group of traders told her that if she didn't carry on through the winter months, they'd do it.

Ground rules were laid down, to ensure that it remains a true local produce market. Stall holders must sell produce or goods that are locally sourced within a 35 mile radius. If you have a local craft, there's the neighbouring Market Hall with its own show on the same Saturday; the Farmers Market is in and around the church, of course.

To encourage new stall holders, there's a free place for one month as a 'Featured Business' and the Community Table is available for local associations and groups to show off their causes, free of charge.

Estimates of attendance varied at the beginning, so Clare bought a clicker and counts the customers every month. There's an average of about 200 through the year, with a rise to 300 for Christmas.

She's involved with setting up the site on the day before the market, and is there at 7.30 Saturday morning to see the traders in and help them unload. It works smoothly, the people there to sell getting on with the job to be ready for the 9.30 opening. At £10 for a stall it's an affordable place to trade.

By 1.00 it's all over, apart from the odd straggler. Traders don't waste time and clear away very quickly; normally Cleobury Country directors David Webb and come down to help Clare, regulars Steve and Iris Todd and whichever staff members are there help to clear away. It takes about an hour to stow all the equipment in the shed behind the Market Hall and the day's over.

Few people will realise that the staff and Clare are not paid for this Saturday work. They're a keen lot who want the whole idea to succeed.

Future plans? "We'll have features, like the apple pressing booked for September. Things like that do give the day a lift. But not too much, because it makes more work."

And it's mildly profitable, which is split with the church. "Not a lot, really," she admits. "It wouldn't pay wages." A labour of love, then.



Farming - John and Catherine Evans

As always this month's discussion comes down to the weather. In the middle of June the harvest was going to be early, everything was ripening and we needed to take a holiday soon before combining started. Now, in the middle of July, we are still waiting for the corn to ripen sufficiently to start and it is likely to be next week, 21st July. The harvest always starts around the 21st July – how do I know this? It's our wedding anniversary! Top tip to any future farmer's wives – don't get married in the summer as you will never get to celebrate your anniversary (assuming he even remembers)

So August is the month of the Harvest, fields and roads full of giant machinery, size really is everything and it is always a race against the clock to get the crops combined and the straw baled before the weather changes. Hopefully the good weather we have been experiencing will continue well into September. The first crop to be combined will be the winter barley, most of which is used to feed our own stock, next will be oats, and those with oilseed rape will also be harvesting it. The largest crop is wheat, some of which is used

by us and the rest is sold, mainly for pig and chicken feed. Corn is traded globally and the price fluctuates due to events throughout the world. A poor harvest in Russia or USA could mean a good price for UK farmers but when they have a good harvest the price for us plummets. So, when a crop is planted in the Autumn or Spring there is no guarantee of what it will be worth the following August September. We try to sell our surplus crops throughout the year to smooth out some of these variations. After wheat comes beans, these are for animal feed too, although if the quality is good enough, some are exported to the Middle East for human consumption.

Here at Broome Park we have new arrivals – nine baby chicks. Mother Hen sat on 20 eggs so I am quite relieved only nine hatched out, hopefully the majority will be hens and not cockerels as I already have two of those. We will also be getting another couple of weaners in August to fatten up for bacon and sausage for next year's B&B guests.

Between June 15th and 18th, damage was caused to a door handle and lock of a vehicle parked in St Mary's Place, but no entry was gained. In Grove Meadow between June 13th and 23rd there was an attempt to enter a garage, but although entry was not gained, damage was incurred to the lock. On June 25th/26th power tools were stolen from a garden shed in Bagginswood. Extra security paid off when an attempt to steal a parked Landrover Defender in College Close was foiled. It happened at about 11:00pm on June 26th and two males were chased as they ran away from the scene, but unfortunately not caught.

The Fire Brigade attended two deliberately caused fires by the skateboard park on July 7th, thought to be by youngsters, but there were no witnesses. There was a shed burglary overnight at a smallholding in Button Bridge on July 7th/ 8th, in which power tools were stolen. Five other sheds at the same location were forced open, though nothing more appeared to have been stolen. A caravan which was kept in a secure yard at a house in Kinlet was broken into between July 8th and 11th. Equipment stolen and damage caused amounted to over £3000. The owners had been due to go on holiday in it a few days after the discovery of this crime. Overnight on July 16th/17th a van parked in Rock was broken into and power tools stolen.

On July 13th there were two separate reports of loud bangs being heard. Elderly residents in Eagle Lane were alarmed when they heard what sounded like gunshots a very short distance from their garden at approximately 4:00pm. Youths appearing to be aged about 15 were seen and at least one was wearing a school uniform. Later, at about 8:00pm, loud bangs in St Mary's Churchyard were reported to have been heard by an angry resident who went to speak to youths in the area who he thought were the perpetrators. It seems likely that youths had obtained some 'crow bangers', (used on farms for protecting crops from marauding birds). Although it is illegal to set these off in a public place, and by under 18s, there was probably no attempt to cause distress to anyone, - just a 'schoolboy prank'. However, if this continues, we'll be keen to speak to those involved.

A Crime Reduction meeting is being held at The Market Hall on Thursday, August 6th at 7:00pm. Among items to be discussed will be the project for Cleobury to become a 'Smartwater town' when it is envisaged that every household in Cleobury will be given a Smartwater kit to help protect their property. Also to be discussed is the proposed installation of two further CCTV cameras for which funding has been secured, and the need to upgrade the existing cameras to produce clearer, and therefore more useful, images. Everyone present will be given a chance to speak and put forward any ideas that they have which may help to reduce crime even more in the Cleobury area.

"Bet Mum won't find us in here."

There are plenty of forest-themed events going on this month.

The format of Wild in Wyre has changed a little over the years but still the aim is to give 8 – 11 year olds a time of fun and adventure playing in a secret forest location. This year Thursday 6th and Thursday 20th August are available and one or both of the days can be booked by calling 0300 067 4855 or emailing learning.west@forestry.gsi.gov.uk . The days, which start at the Discovery Centre at 9.00am and end at 4.30, will be led by experienced Forestry Commission Learning Team staff and include shelter-building, fire lighting and making bows and arrows. The cost is £25 per day and a £10 deposit will be needed.

Make sure that you get to the Wyre Forest exhibition at Bewdley Museum over the school holidays. This is an introduction to the

forest for those who haven't been before, and even those of you who know it well may discover something new. You can find out about the archaeology hidden under the trees, learn how the landscape has inspired the arts, and have a go at the quiz centred around the display of weird objects. There will be some wildlife and craft activities for children, and during the month there will be a programme of 14 guided walks in the forest which will cater for a range of interests and abilities. I'd love to go on one of the Dusk Walks to listen for bats and owls, or walk from Bewdley to Cleobury. And will I rise to the challenge of the 7-mile Cleobury Food and Ale Trail? ('It depends how much you eat', I can hear my friends saying) Pick up a leaflet from the library, museum and other outlets around the town or call at the Forest Café or Forestry Commission offices when you're in the forest. The exhibition and 'Walking Festival' are brought to you by the Wyre Forest Landscape Partnership – a group of organisations and individuals who care for 'our forest' and want to share their enthusiasm and knowledge with others.

Don't forget the forest during the holidays. You have to pay if you park your car but the beautiful and varied habitats and their wildlife are there for you, completely free, each day.

ON THE BUSES

It's official. The inmates have actually taken over the Asylum! Worcestershire Council have again awarded the 2L contract to Diamond Buses. The reason given is that they submitted the lowest tender (of two) and despite the fact that they have just been fined nearly £35,000 by the Traffic Commissioners poor levels of service on other routes. You might think that this would colour the views of potential customers (i.e. Worcestershire and Shropshire councils) but apparently not, as the fine having been paid, no further notice has been taken of any infringement. Even 'Fawlty Towers' would have rejected this as a plot line...

Diamond Bus combustibility, fast becoming a legend, reared its head again the other week with the Cleobury fire crew being called out to Angel Bank to find another of their finest wreathed in smoke. Apparently there were no passengers on board which was a blessing – perhaps they had all been frightened off. Reliability is still a problem as a friend bought a weekly ticket for his daughter to go to Kiddy each day but had to go and collect her on two out of the first three evenings due to the non appearance of the 2L. There have also been a number of reports of buses awaiting rescue or under tow. Further to the time taken to get to Kiddy, the World record for the half marathon (just over 13 miles) is 58 minutes 23 seconds which means that the holder could leave Cleobury at

the same time as the 2L and still have time for a fag at the bus station before the bus rolled up. (Editorial Intrusion: Excuse me, Mr Todd, but are you seriously suggesting that the holder of the World Record Half Marathon smokes?)

Yet another trip to the Diamond depot in Kiddy in search of timetables yielded a nil result: 'All out with the drivers'. Later the same day, I asked a 2L driver for timetables. She had one, her own, which she kindly gave me. I am guarding this jealously as it could well be rarer than original copies of the 'Magna Carta'.

Question: When the timetable changes, how long does it take Shropshire Council to change the information at the bus stops to reflect this?

Answer: No idea, as the last change was on 31 May and as I write this on 25 July, they have still not been altered.

This will soon be academic as I am told that the timetable is to change yet again in September. Not sure if this will involve further diversions en route to Kiddy but there will be a small prize for the first person to correctly guess the new route. Suggestions to the 'Clarion' editor by 10 August please. (Helpful hint: a route via anywhere south of Buenos Aires is probably a non starter...)

Drivers are still charging users of the 9.14 £1 despite assurances from Shropshire Council dating back to last December that this was not happening. This charge has now been extended to Far Forest due to the earlier

running time. A (very) rough calculation indicates that this charge has raised around £600 from the stop in the centre of Cleobury alone so is this fraud or theft? No, I don't know either. I have asked Shropshire Council how they plan to claim it back but am still awaiting a response.

I have now written twice to Traffic Commissioners about the 2L but have yet to receive an acknowledgement, let alone a response. Perhaps this is now official policy in the hope that the problem will go away. It won't. This edition goes to press before the LJC meeting on 28 July so a report will have to wait until next month. However, I gather that the Operations Director of Rotala (the parent company of Diamond) is due to attend although representatives of both Councils are likely to be conspicuous by their absence. 'Too expensive' apparently, although possibly not as expensive as throwing nearly £40,000 of taxpayers annually at a service that doesn't serve.

Sorry this is all negative but as one friend said : "At least Diamond don't run the Brewery"

It's been a faithful, roomy friend since I bought it February 2012. It was owned from new by the Prison Service, to ferry staff about, and had been fitted with a new engine in December 2012.

It's a Citroen C8 LX, with the well respected 2.0 litre HDi engine, which gives about 40mpg on a journey. It cruises very quietly at 70mph on Motorways and tackles the hills

on the monthly distribution run around South Shropshire's hills with little effort.

It has a five speed manual gearbox, a radio/CD unit, air conditioning and the previous owners left a fire extinguisher and a First Aid box in there.

IN BUSINESS: We Gleam

Peter Saunders is a highly trained upholsterer. The sort of craftsman who will take away a tattered antique chaise longue and bring it back looking like new. That skill comes from a apprenticeship and strong drive to do whatever job he faces to the highest possible standard.

He was getting refurbishment contracts from hotel chains and other big businesses, flat out to keep up with demand for his skill, when he was asked if he could clean as well as repair. With that question a new idea was born - he should offer a cleaning service as well. Not that he didn't have a full time job already, but no ambitious self employed person turns away work.
