INTERNATIONAL CIDER SUCCESS

The 2019 International Cider Challenge has grown out of the global popularity of the drink. At one time we dismissed it as a small time country product with Bulmers the only big operator. In this year's competition the judges had to choose from no less than 180 entries, with the South African Sxollie Pink Lady voted Overall Champion.

Local good news is that our Oldfield's brand won three medals, quite an achievement for a family business

In the 'New World Dry' class they took the Gold Medal with their Applefresco, a 6% sparkling brew that should make a warm summer day taste better.

Oldfield's Medium Dry took the Silver Medal in the 'New World Medium' category and finally Oldfield's Berry, a 4% blackberry cider that's only been on the market since March this year, won the Bronze Medal in the 'Flavoured Cider with Fruits and Flowers' category.

When you consider that the company only have five ciders in their range and they claimed three awards against international competition, there's a strong message about their quality and fine flavoured thinking.

Congratulations to all involved in both the production and entry in the competition. It must have seemed a big ask to take on international brewers, but they came out with their reputation even higher.



Back in February we were sat in the tea room at the Co-op on our break and Sonia said to me "Kemp Hospice are doing a sky dive for their 50th anniversary and they want 50 people to sky dive, I would like to do it but I'm scared of heights and I would like someone to do it with me,." Me being the big mouth I am said I would do it straight away.

Once we signed up and paid our deposit we started our fundraising. Our initial target was £800 which was a minimum requirement from Kemp Hospice. We got to our target very quickly with the kind generosity of our family and friends, I then said to Sonia "Let's go for a £1000." Again, after selling football cards and bucket collections in the Co-op we made it and much more.

In-between all this I got called up for surgery on my knee, time was against us and I didn't think I was going to make it, but with sheer determination I managed to get myself fit for the big jump. The day approached and we did it.

On the 9th June we arrived at Hinton airfield at 7.00am. The sun was shining and we were the first to arrive, signed in and filled out our risk assessment forms, then into the hangar for our training. The training would only be five minutes

and then the realisation hit home we were actually doing this. We met with the instructors, and got harnessed up and off to the plane we went, ready for take off, climbing up into the clouds. We got to 6000feet and Sonia thought we were there - lol! We had another 7000ft to climb before jumping. Finally reaching 13000ft I shuffled forward and was first out of the plane followed by Sonia. What a view, we got a chance to guide the parachute as well. Very quickly, before we knew it we were landing. Adrenaline was definitely pumping. Yes we did it, one very proud moment, a massive challenge accomplished jumping from 13000ft at 120mph."

Would we do it again? Sonia's answer: "Yes, definitely.", My answer: "No, an enjoyable experience but No!"

Finally we would both like to thank our family, friends and colleagues for all the support and help in raising an amazing amount of money for the charity Kemp Hospice. We have raised £2200 and donations are still coming in.

THE SOROPTIMISTS

Our conference in June about Female Genital Mutilation (FGM) was very informative. Two hundred million women and girls worldwide have been affected, including 137,000 in the UK. Our keynote speaker,

Gillian said that Squires, prevention is the kev, as punishment for acts already committed can bе counterproductive as girls generally do not wish to have their parents prosecuted and communities are silent as they feel FGM is part of their culture. Rose Morimbo Simbo shared her personal experience. Rose is committed to speaking out about what happened to her so that other girls do not have to suffer the same fate. Through her charity in Sierra Leone she strives to make a difference to their lives. By winning their trust she hopes to change their culture away from cutting girls. Alison Byrne, a specialist midwife saw her first case of FGM 17 years ago when a young woman was about to give birth. She now runs a specialist clinic in the UK and sees patients from all over the country.

Janice Bell, President of Soroptimist Kidderminster and District said, 'This is an uncomfortable topic and for many may seem to be irrelevant to us here in Worcestershire but hearing the women's stories and trying to understand why this practice is still so prevalent may help to bring pressure to eradicate it.'

FARMING FAMILIES

84% of those who responded to the Cleobury Neighbourhood Plan Survey a year ago said that the countryside and its environment was important or very important to them. They effectively charged the working group of the Plan to ensure that despite 138 new homes to be built in the next 10 years or so, their countryside and environment should remain sustainable and where possible, be improved. The big question to be answered was "What is it about the countryside that makes it so important to so many local people?". To help answer that, a survey of farming families landowners was carried out in the first part of this year and reports published monthly in the Clarion as Farming Families.

The survey covered over 1,000 hectares (approx. 20%) of the total CNP non wooded countryside. The landowners and farmers are the guardians/ custodians of our countryside, yet we knew little about who they are, what they do and how they help to make the countryside so important to us all. The 20% sampled, showed up some interesting information. There were 3,300 sheep and lambs, 800 head of beef and 300 cows. There are many more sheep, cattle and cows than there are people in the area. Grass for grazing, hay and silage was the predominant crop. Almost all of the arable crops of wheat, barley, oats, rye and maize for silage went to feed the stock. Energy conservation was important for all, especially electricity production from methane, solar power and wind. Within our whole CNP area there is nearly enough electricity generated on farms, to supply the total power needs of the area including Cleobury town. We are over 90% self sufficient for electricity power from our farms. Our perception of our countryside appears to be made up of trees, hedges, green fields, livestock, and our ability to access it with care. Our wildlife is sustained by our wildlife corridors and our woodlands, augmented by over four hectares of sown wild plants for pollinators and for seed eating birds. Hedge cutting is only done out of the bird nesting season. Those in the sample have planted an impressive 20,000 trees and 12Kms of hedges over the past two decades. This does compensate to some degree for the tree and hedge grubbing in the past fifty years as fields were made larger. However, it is vital to keep planting trees and hedges as a tree planted now will become mature in 100-200 years, for our grandchildren, their grandchildren and for a sustainable biodiversity.

There were two farmers who have taken the long term view and have planted trees in the middle of fields to partially restore the feel of parkland, which had been lost over the past century. Thanks to our farmers and landowners, there are few scruffy corners in our countryside - they shame some of our urban front gardens.

Farming is hard work, for long hours, in all weathers and at any time of the year. They do have to earn a living, yet they care deeply about their bit of countryside and its environment.

So, a big thank you to our farmers and landowners for looking after and improving our countryside – keep up the good work! *Kit Smith*

FIVE DAYS IN DRESDEN

A brief break, based upon a visit to the German Moto GP at the Sachsenring, but with a couple of days added on for a little sightseeing. My friend Geoff Hainsworth came along and my son Iain flew in from Hong Kong.

This is not a report on the Grand Prix, well covered by the real professionals elsewhere. But Dresden is an interesting once part of East place, Germany and worth a visitor's report. We were booked into one of the three Ibis hotels in the city centre, clean and quiet rooms at a reasonable price. We were also booked onto a train to reach the race track, ten minutes walk from Hohenstein-Ernstthal station. On time, clean and smooth in operation. What a national railway should be like.

Dresden was badly damaged during the 1939-45 World War bombings and has been largely rebuilt, both as restorations of old buildings in the historic centre and as new structures further out. What did strike as we walked around was the cleanlinesss and the pedestrians-only space. In a city of more than half a million people there was never a feeling of crowding.

The city is on the River Elbe, with pleasure craft moving gently along and large cruising craft moored up and working as restaurants along the proud Terrassenufer where historic buildings dominate and in the distance you can see tower cranes continuing the business of improvement.

We walked a lot in the later days, directed by curiosity and discovering beautiful buildings in areas like the walled enclosure of Zwinger.

Lots of restaurants to choose from and a sad experience when Iain wanted an Italian and having found one we waited over an hour for two pizzas, my pasta only ten minutes quicker. Protests that the kitchen was very busy by the waiting staff did not impress when other people arrived, ordered and finished their meals before ours arrived. Black mark, Ristorante Da Miri.

Much better luck with good Mexican cooking and service at Enchiladas. So good we went back the next evening. Eating was not expensive and the variety on offer was wide. Late nightcaps at the hotel only looked expensive when one of the bar staff served a single measure and charged for a double, realised too late to protest. Hardened travellers will tell you that it's not an uncommon habit. Naughty.

Curiosity about a railway around the Grosser Garten took us to a model station staffed almost entirely by school age children. including blowing the guard's whistle and signalling the train's departure. The journey was a gentle cruise through a very large park, where traffic gave way at level crossings and passengers used the service to commute. All for just six euros - excellent value.

Signposted nearby was the Glaserne Manufaktur; could that be a glassware factory? Far from it, this was a Volkswagen factory where the E Golf is built in a place looking far too small. there Even better, examples of concept cars, including the ID that UK dealers know about but apparently don't have pictures of it.

They'll be regulars at the Farmers' Market and it's well worth looking at their range of chicken goodies and their ability to supply a whole bird if you need it.

I am sure most readers would expect my Letter from Westminster for August to cover the fact we have a new Prime Minister. But I write before the result is known, so think it better not to make much comment.

We do, however, know the new Prime Minister will have the monumental task of delivering Brexit and managing a minority government with the skills needed to deliver for people across the country.

The leadership election has brought appropriate focus to some issues where the government needs to act. And one issue that has arisen recently is the growing concern about the treatment of veterans, in particular those who served in Northern Ireland, who have been subject to allegations of historic wrongdoing. This has been championed by some national newspapers and concerned MPs.

As a former Defence Minister, proper treatment of our veterans is important to me, though it was never directly part of my ministerial responsibilities. I firmly believe that those who volunteered to join our Armed Forces must be treated fairly during their time in service, and once their service is done.

While not the only issue facing veterans, the impact of historical allegations has brought this issue to the forefront of public debate. I know that it is affecting veterans across the country, including here in Shropshire. I have spoken to some who served in Northern Ireland during the Troubles, who are deeply concerned that they may face lengthy legal procedures, decades after the event, despite the fact they may have been previously cleared, even if no new information may have come forward.

I sincerely hope that whoever becomes the next Prime Minister will take forward recent suggestions how to resolve these cases as a matter of priority. It is vital service personnel and veterans feel the government will back them, just as they backed us when serving their country. The House of Commons does not normally sit in August, allowing MPs to spend more time in our constituencies and possibly fit in a family holiday. I am taking my family to Ireland this year – barring any recall of Parliament.

I expect and hope the new PM and Brexit Secretary, with a fresh negotiating team, will be working tirelessly throughout August to ensure that we do everything possible to prepare for leaving. This means preparing as best we can to mitigate the potential impact of leaving without a deal, while doing everything we can to secure a deal that can pass through the House of Commons.

We know some elements of the economy are particularly vulnerable to tariffs should a No Deal situation occur – like agriculture and the automotive industry, both of which are large primary or secondary employers in the Ludlow Constituency. So I shall be doing everything I can to ensure the new Prime Minister takes these concerns seriously, and plans appropriately.

The memoirs of Cyril Breakwell, born in 1924 on Clee Hill then moving to Cleobury.

Granny was becoming very frail and Mum and Dad decided we would have to move in with her to provide the care she needed. So we moved from Silvington Hill to a little two up two down crofter's cottage at Hill House, a hamlet about half a mile off the road to Farlow. I was probably about four at the time and remember Granny had a bed downstairs.

The open fire fuelled with wood blazed in the kitchen, we couldn't afford coal. One of the jobs for my brothers and I as we grew older was to go and collect wood from Rabbit House 'copy', bring it home, and saw it up for the fire. The fire not only kept us warm but was also used for all our cooking. The cottage was rented from Hopton Court Estate, to whom we went every six weeks to pay the rent. These were hard times. Mum, who managed the finances, struggled to get the rent together. Every penny counted. It was made worse by the fact that the mines where Dad worked did not always provide regular work if the demand was not there for the coal. Some weeks, not a penny came in from the mine so Dad worked on local farms.

Life was tough. It was a struggle. Materially, we didn't have much but our home had an abundance of love and laughter with a large family and a Mum and Dad who were wonderful. Mum and Dad met at Bewdley where Mum was in service and Dad was working in the mines. Prior to that, Dad had served in the army. He joined at seventeen and was responsible for taking ammunitions to the front line on the backs of mules. Clee Hill lads and lasses knew a thing or two about our four legged friends.

Back to Hill House. We had a piece of land where we grew all the vegetables we needed,

boiled them on the open fire with water we brought back from a spring on Silvington Common, half a mile away. My brother and I took it in turns to bring back the water with yokes across our backs. This was how we transported two buckets. Milk came from our cow and eggs from home reared chickens. Rabbits were our main source of meat as we couldn't afford meat from the butchers who came up to the hill from Cleobury each Saturday. The rabbits were caught by watching where a rabbit went into a gorse bush, putting a net over that opening and going round to the other side to make it run into the net. My Mum had a multitude of recipes for rabbits. The skins were collected and taken on the once weekly bus service to Kidderminster to the tanning factory to be turned into gloves and other clothes.

Our hill was our playground. Sometimes we went up to Magpie Quarry and pushed one another in quarry trucks until we were spotted and had to run off. We whittled wood with a borrowed penknife making the toys we couldn't afford: cricket bats, whistles, animal sculptures. They may not have been very good but we loved them.

We tamed magpies by taking a young bird from the nest, feeding it until it became our friend. One family on holiday from the Black Country were so impressed they gave me half a crown for the bird. Riches in those days. On another occasion a girl lost her deceased mother's wedding ring and was very upset. We found them in our magpie's box. They love bright, shiny objects and must have stolen it; just like Clee Hill steals a piece of your heart and it never leaves you. Happy but hard days!



READ EASY

Steve Peckham reports on the launch of a new service that will help a lot of adults advance.

Some time ago, I wrote a couple of articles for the Clarion about my attempts to get a group going in the area to help adults who struggle with their reading.

Most people are amazed to learn that the reading they do every day, can be such a stumbling block for some adults. In fact, the last Skills for Life Survey in 2011, found that around 5% of adults can barely read and another 2% have reading skills no better than those of a seven year old. Remarkably, one in five adults would not be able to use the index to find a plumber in the Yellow Pages. This means that there will be approximately 8,000 adults in the Wyre Forest and Cleobury area who either don't read at all or who have very low level reading skills.

Things have not improved. In 2013, England's 16-24 year olds were ranked 22nd for literacy out of 24 developed countries by the OECD. And it seems England is the only country in the developed world where the younger generation has been found to have poorer literacy

skills than those approaching retirement.

Against that sad backcloth, I am pleased to tell you that Read Easy Wyre Forest and Cleobury Mortimer recently held its launch event at Kidderminster College. The not-for-profit group recruits and trains volunteer reading coaches. Those coaches then give one-to-one tuition to local adults who either don't read at all or who struggle with their reading.

Read Easy offers a free and flexible approach to helping adults who struggle with literacy. The group prides itself on giving people the chance to learn at their own pace and build their reading skills as well as their self-esteem.





Thanks to some fine, settled weather and invaluable help from the Wyre Community Land Trust volunteers, the hay was cut, baled and brought in with no problems last month. You'll be pleased to hear that the old-fashioned sisal baler twine worked well and will become the twine of choice here at Uncllys.

The garden bird feeders are almost knee deep in baby Blue and Great Tits, forced aside regularly by the Great Spotted Woodpecker family. The woodpeckers are rather wary of our presence and veer off with a loud squawk if they see us nearby. They are a species that has benefited greatly from garden peanut feeders but still rely on old trees, mainly in the forest and old orchards, in which to bore a nest hole. The British Trust for Ornithology's Nestbox Guide gives instructions how to try and attract Great Spotted Woodpeckers to use medium-sized birdboxes by stuffing them with rotten wood, which the birds can then excavate. It seems a lot of trouble when there is plenty of old wood round here.

Our efforts in putting up bird boxes are beginning to bring results with the smaller birds. An increasing and vociferous gang of House Sparrows use some boxes near the house and a gap in the masonry of the north-facing wall (we've no idea how many are in there!). Redstarts have made fleeting appearances in past years but this year our friend Elaine pointed out that a pair were nesting in a box fixed to one of our young apple trees. As it was fairly near the house we were able to keep an eye on progress and latterly to hear the parents and fledgling(s?) calling to each other as feeding was carried out. The birdbox they used was shaded by the lower branches of the tree and a lower twig was used by the adults to land and check that the coast was clear - both factors that probably contributed to

its attractiveness to the birds. Thanks again to Mick Farmer, who managed to take some fantastic pictures of the parent birds, in this case



Another way in which we try to help wildlife is to put out small sections of corrugated iron on the ground to provide reptiles with safe places to bask (safe, that is, from buzzards). We lift them regularly and are rewarded with sightings of Slow-worms, Grass Snakes and Common Lizards, in declining order of frequency. Grass Snakes like compost heaps and grass piles for breeding and the eggs generally hatch in August, as do those of Slow-worms, although I'm wondering if they are earlier this year judging from the tiny individual I've already seen under one of the tins. We were pleased to see so many of you at the Cleobury Festival. The Plastic Reduction Group stall was based on the sports field, near Lucy Shier's Bee Biotic stall. Our aim was to get the people of Cleobury to pledge to reduce their single use plastic. The pledges were:

- 1. Reuse carrier bags and carry reusable ones
- 2. Find "water on the go" for your water bottle www.refill.org.uk
- 3. Buy loose leaf tea or check that teabags are plastic free
- 4. Cook from scratch and avoid packaged food
- 5. Buy loose food products and take your own containers
- 6. Instead of wipes and disposable cloths use washable cloths and scrubbers
- 7. Swap to paper wrapped or unwrapped soap instead of liquid soap
- 8. Buy washing-up and laundry liquid in refillable bottles
- 9. Swap to washing powder and dishwasher powder in cardboard boxes
- 10. Take a reusable cup when you travel and to the coffee shop
- 11. Try beeswax coated cloth wraps instead of cling film

12. Switch to biodegradable toothbrushes, zero-waste floss and toothpaste in jar

Over the course of the day 84 pledges were made by local people to reduce plastic. What a great effort.

On the stall we had a display of everyday items you can use to help with your pledges to reduce the plastic you bring into your home. These included bamboo toothbrushes, a bar of soap, loose leaf tea, a teapot with infuser, washing powder in a plastic free box, beeswax wraps to wrap your food in, a reusable cup for takeaway drinks. refillable water bottle.... By making one or more pledges to reduce their own plastic use, people had the chance of winning this fantastic single use plastic-free hamper.

Andrea was ecstatic to have won the hamper of plastic free goodies and said winning this would really help her and her family think about these and other ways to reduce plastic in the home. For a trip down memory lane visitors can enjoy the classic vehicle and classic caravan displays on the lower field.


THE CLARION HAS A NEW PRINTER

I attended the FIT (Foundation for Integrated Transport) launch in Shrewsbury on 29th June. The meeting was attended by around 30 individuals representing a cross section of interested parties including Town and Parish Councils, bus user groups and various members of the public including those opposed to the Shrewsbury North West Relief Road project. There was also a representative of Shropshire Council who left part way through the event (which may have been a blessing given some of the opinions expressed on the Council's performance in this area).

The keynote presentation was by Professor John Whitelegg, the project co-ordinator who gave the background to the study and explained the methodology. He set out the three objectives of the study which are, 1: Make sure all Councillors, MP's and decision makers are aware of the multiple benefits of high quality bus services. 2: To identify improvements in bus services to meet the needs of all users. 3: To work with other organisations to argue that central government should fund high quality rural bus services to a level found in other countries.

He said that the response from local Councils to the consultation document circulated in 2017 had been very disappointing. (Cleobury Town Council did respond although Cleobury does not even merit a mention anywhere in the report).

He pointed out that there are air quality problems in a number of towns within the County including Shrewsbury, Bridgnorth and Ludlow and that prioritising public transport would contribute to addressing this. He added that Shropshire Council's track record in this area was poor, citing the example of Cornwall Council who have introduced a single timetable for all bus services within the County and a ticketing system that was accepted by all operators (cross ticketing). There are similar bus partnerships in

operation in Brighton and York. He also mentioned Nottingham where a workplace parking levy had raised £9 Million in a year which had been used to improve public transport including the introduction of electric buses.

He then described case studies of rural towns in Germany, Sweden and Switzerland where all forms of public transport are integrated and coordinated, resulting in a much higher level of use. This contrasted with the UK which is the only nation in the world where it is illegal for different transport operators to co-operate(!). There also appeared to be a difference in attitude by politicians in say, Germany, where they compete to do better than each other, and the UK, where they seem to do the opposite....

The other problem within Shropshire is the sources of funding. Our Council will not use capital funding to support rural bus travel, preferring to class such support as a subsidy. Contrast this with road building where the Department for Transport funding for the Shrewsbury north west relief road is £17 million short. As a result, Shropshire Council have found this sum (which is some 10 times the bus support budget) and have called it investment funding. At the same time, they have attempted to slash rural transport funding by £405,000, calling it a subsidy. This has now been reduced to £180,000 after a public outcry but it seems that spending on road schemes is investment, which is good but supporting public transport is a subsidy, which is bad. This approach is not supported by evidence from studies of many road improvement schemes which did not remove congestion but merely postponed the problem for a time until the inevitable increase in traffic filled the extra space.

A brave initiative, but unless attitudes from both central and local politicians change, progress will be difficult. Steve Todd



We are catching up here, as there was not room in the July issue for this report. At the June 6th lecture Robert Hodge told the story of Bessie Blount of Kinlet, mistress to King Henry VIIIth who bore him the son he wanted so much. But the boy never did reach the throne as his heir, thanks to all sorts of politics and power play.

June 20th saw the History Society tell about the story of the trial and execution of William Handley of Bayton. He was out poaching with his brother and they came across the gamekeeper, who Handley shot but did not kill.

The story was told by a succession of narrators, quoting from trial reports and local records, with Robert Hodge as link man explaining the process of law in the early 19th century, when being poor meant precious little justice. Handley was found guilty and hanged at Shrewsbury Jail.

In the open discussion that followed, the audience could offer opinions and questions; the consensus seemed to be that the. man should not have been hanged. The Society had produced a detailed leaflet with contemporary reports that was handed out as a souvenir and probably to provoke furher debate about the rough justice suffered. William Handley another When man who committed a similar crime was judged at the same court by the same judge and the presented by the same lawyers." he was not hung, but on appeal was banished to Australia.

I used to work in the carpet manufacturing industry, at first selling Lamtex fireside rugs and then moving on to bigger things, like rolls of 12'0" wide axminster. I realised I hadn't joined the best organised company in business on my first day as a rep, April 5th, 1965. I walked into the first call at 9.15, gripped the shop manager with a firm handshake and told him: "My name is Reynolds, I'm the new rep for Lamtex Rugs."

The man looked at me for 20 seconds without speaking, then —— —— is asked: "Where the my Christmas order?" Welcome to the world of selling Lamtex, where you survived by graft, luck and some very patient customers. I stuck it out for two years, by which time I was the longest serving rep in the south of the country, reasoning that if I was no good and they sacked me, few would notice. If I survived, I could look for a better job. Which I did.

In 1967 I joined Goodacre Carpets of Kendal, who sent a car to the Lamtex factory in Bradford to collect me after I'd returned my company car. What a contrast in treatment, working for the Kendal company was a joy, with really good quality pure wool axministers and people at the factory who would make a promise and keep it. I liked the

company so much that I forgave them presenting me with a run down Vauxhall Victor that was replaced with another of the same uncomfortable breed. The driving position was an ergonomic nightmare and after 100,000 miles in there anything was better.

There was a subsidiary company, Bolton Carpets, that made cheap stuff and supplied mail order companies in the UK and the bottom end of the Middle East market; they would take orders for hundreds of rolls of 12'0" wide tat. Their Midland rep was due to retire and they had me trying to sell some of their stuff.

I learned a lesson when I took an order for three rolls and the buyer asked for a discount. No discount on this product, it was all nett price. He insisted, I tried my established trick of calling the Sales Office Manager and asking what we could do. after explaining the situation. The fool in the Bolton Carpets office trimmed the price and then wrote to me saying that he'd helped me out of a tricky situation and I was not to ask for that again. A complete lie! I had made it clear that I had refused to give a lower price, and he had cut my feet from under me. Not a man to trust.

Just by hard work I built up the quality business until a decision from On High was made to have a proper sales force for the poor little Bolton Carpets. And I was asked if I'd take the position. After some negotiation over the salary with the Carpet Group chairman, whose lack of sobriety did not help his case, I agreed.

We were living in the Midlands and every Monday morning I was up and off by 7.00 to stay the week in Bolton. I had to recruit reps from within the established force and as there was not even an order pad, I designed the new company stationery as well.

The bone-headed approach of some senior people had to be seen to be believed. Like a new lightweight fluffy range that included what they had called Pearl White; it looked slightly dirty. Who would buy a dirty looking carpet? Very few people. And the handle of the cloth was harsh, which killed its appeal. The board wanted to drop the range, I argued for different and better colours. More colours? they asked in horror. No, better colours and a softer handle for what was basically a bedroom carpet. I was an awkward young so-and-so and got my way. That became the top selling range and proof that common sense works. There were more frustrations to come in the months ahead.

The dog training area is getting well used and will also soon have a new dog bin put inside too, it has been a great success, which is what you asked for in the Big survey and the Town council listened and delivered. An official opening will be announced soon.

The biggest project we are in the middle of, is getting the grant funding from the European Union to give the Love lane play area a complete makeover and get some adult outdoor gym equipment in the park area. The council office is working hard to get all the relevant paperwork together. We are also working with parents and the primary school to make this happen and we should hear in September if we have been successful in obtaining the Grant. Three companies have put in tenders with designs and all look really good so it will be difficult to choose. If you would like to be involved, contact the council office.

To update on Highways issues, we now come under Bridgnorth area due to all the reorganisation in Shropshire Council. Cllr Shineton and the Clerk had a two hour walk around Cleobury Mortimer with the new contact from Bridgnorth and pointed out all the issues that we have struggled to get done, as well as in surrounding roads and parishes. The Clerk attended a Town clerks meeting at Shire Hall and pushed for outstanding work to be done. The drains that are all blocked in the town and have not been done for years, the Talbot car park, safety at Newbridge corner, state of the roads. The first job they want to get onto is the cleaning out the drains. We shall see. Other items raised were disabled parking, dropped kerbs, state of the roads, potholes, road markings and street cleaning, among our long list. The new people at Shire Hall have promised action, so we will continually keep on at them going forward.




