BURY С L Ε 0 G ARDENERS I decided to make water the subject of this month's article after reading the 'Telegraph's diatribe on the economic health and future of Thames Water: and by inference most other water companies which no longer belong in our national control and are owned by every Tom, Dick and Harry throughout the world, from Canada, France, Dubai, some Scandinavian countries and even to China. No wonder we have rivers running with effluent, when profits are being hived off as dividends to shareholders and pension funds all over the world.

The main point of this article is water butts to save the environment, save your wallet and save water - what's not to love. They come in all shapes and sizes, and are available cheaply from Shropshire CC on application. It's a rare garden which will be unable to accommodate one; even a small shed can provide enough water for a small butt. And why stop at one? If you are warm to this idea, place a second alongside and the runoff from the first overflows into the second. The Diverter Kit and Linking Kit are available at most Big Brand Hardware outlets and are fairly easy to install. One

point elevated on bricks and slabs to the next use. I do not understand ensure your watering cans fit this concept of recycling pots to under the opened tap. Water comes from the heavens free gratis; we turn on our taps and out it comes, and whilst the rain still falls, what's the problem. Are you aware that as soon as the rain hits your roof and flows down the spouting, this free gift acquires the first of its several pricing charges and becomes a commodity, and a highly priced one, considering the base material is free. Your water company charges you for collecting 'ground water' to channel it into a system to make safe drinking water. And if you water plants from a tap, you are using the highest priced water of all. The expert view is that something like a 40% increase in water charges is on the cards if we want out rivers cleaned up. To make your investment really work, have several buckets available. When rain is promised, drain the stored water into the buckets leaving the Butt(s) to be refilled, thus always making greatest and extended use of the availability of cheap water. I always have a trug near my butt to catch any surplus water, and use that to immerse my used pots ready for cleaning.. Even that used water goes on the garden.

locate the water butt(s) Let your pots dry and store for garden centres. I never seem to have enough, and never recycle them unless they are totally worn out. Please forgive this bout of personal whimsy, but in the future water will become a very precious commodity, not just price, but also availability. In some parts of the world, water may become more expensive than oil, and fought over in small wars. So what has this to do with gardening? Dear Reader, water is everything. Linda Ashman, Secretary





August in the Wyre Forest

It's been a good year for bilberries. Not enough to make a pie, though: I've only had that happen once, and those bilberries were from Derbyshire. The plants like acid soils and cope with a shady woodland setting, but only fruit well with enough sunshine. I look forward to the blackberry harvest but that won't be until September, when I can enjoy some of the crop destined to be consumed by insects, birds and mammals.

At the moment the forest is still looking lush, with enough rain to keep leaves green and encourage flowering. The insects should be having a happier time of it than during last year's drought and I hope some will be able to recover after a very cold and difficult spring. Consequently there should be a good number of baby birds too, and that will be good news for a number of predators.

One such is the Sparrowhawk. It is the commonest bird of prey in the forest and could possibly be confused with the larger Goshawk, which is also sometimes seen hereabouts, since both birds have striped grey and white plumage on the breast and underparts. The female is considerably larger than the male, which has a more reddish-brown colour to the underparts. Their presence is a happy indication of the recovery of their numbers after the use of organochlorine insecticides such as DDT caused the population to crash in the 1960s and 70s. The discovery that DDT caused fragile egg shells and the death of embryos led to it being banned in 1972 in the USA and in most other countries during subsequent decades.

The Sparrowhawk feeds entirely on birds smaller than itself, which means that the male catches sparrows, finches and tits while the female can go for something larger such as a thrush (or a Greater Spotted Woodpecker as Norman Hickin noted in 'The Natural History of an English Forest'). They are superb hunters, materialising 'out of nowhere' to grab their prey along woodland rides or hedges, or indeed from garden feeders. Like other raptors they pluck their bird prey, leaving a pile of whole feathers under their perch.

The nests are built high in conifers or among growths of ivy on deciduous trees, using twigs of birch and larch, with downy feathers added as the eggs (up to 6 of them) are laid. While the female sits the male feeds her (and, I hope, receives no complaints about the size of the portions!).

On 22nd June the Bank of England raised the base rate a further 0.5% up to 5% and the market reaction has been a noticeable slowdown in activity, with enquiries, viewings and sales at a lower volume than previous months.

A BEACON ON THE HILL

High on Titterstone Clee Hill, St John's in Doddington has stood at the centre of its community for 175 years. After several successful pilot activities and consulting with key groups, we have designed and now launched a project to support local pride and inspire learning at the same time as providing a sustainable future for St John's. It is called A Beacon on the Hill.

Consultation with potential audiences explored different future uses for the building while retaining its role as the local church. In discussions and through a questionnaire, respondents highlighted the lack of any site locally which enables people to understand and appreciate the natural and industrial heritage of the area. Community consultation particularly noted the need for a place which would enable locals to connect with their shared heritage, as well for toilet and kitchen facilities in the building. In addition, several well-established local interest groups reported the need for a site from which they can engage with the public. With over 10,000 people passing the churchyard every day as they travel to and over Clee Hill in this Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, it has the potential to be the gateway to discovering the rich and important heritage of this unique area.

Having established the need, we are embarking on a redevelopment to restore a heritage building at the heart of the community and use part of it to create a flexible area to serve as a hub and gateway for people, both local and from further afield, to explore and benefit from all this area has to offer, as well as facilities to run activities with and for local groups of all ages. This project will create an exciting future for St John's and help us to serve our community better.

We are incredibly grateful to the National Lottery Heritage Fund who have funded us to develop this project and to Jim from Grevatte & Co who has been our Project Development Manager.

We are applying for grants (with some success already) and will continue to fundraise with regular events - our next is a Jumble Sale on 5 August at Doddington Village Hall. Apart from the large scale cull of experienced officers in 2010 as a result of David 'Call me Dave' Cameron's botched austerity measures, he also had the brainwave of introducing greater political oversight of Police services. This involved the creation of 'Police and Crime Commissioners' based on party lines which mirrored the US system where senior posts are filled by political appointees. And if a crime doesn't get recorded, statistically it didn't happen... As Benjamin Disraeli (and others) have said, 'There are lies, there are damned lies and then there are statistics'...

Still no news when we might get our Post Office back. Enquiries have been batted off by the Post Office with no indication given as to when normal(ish) service will be restored. They are probably scratching their heads about how to deal with a substantial backlog of letters and parcels which is resulting in erratic deliveries. Even if services are restored, older people are discouraged from entering the premises due to the crowd that usually hangs round outside (and inside) the shop. To be fair, they are not aggressive and usually only fight amongst themselves but for an establishment that could handle substantial amounts of cash, this is not a good look.

More HS2 (currently HS 0.9 and falling) insanity. We are now told that the cost of remodelling Euston Station is now likely to exceed £5 Billion. £5 Billion on a single station??? How? -perhaps everything will be gold plated. It's not clear what has caused a doubling of the cost since the previous estimate but you can imagine the conversation that took place with the contractors. Project Manager: 'Can we discuss the layout of the platforms?'. Contractor: 'I wasn't aware you wanted platforms'. PM: 'Of course we do, it won't work without them'. C: 'Oh, shame you didn't mention that before - a full set will cost you, er, about £1 billion give or take a few hundred million'. PM: ' What?, with cost escalation like that, this whole project could hit the buffers'. C: 'Oh buffers? - Just let me cost them out for you...'.

So, Thames Water looks like it might go under, having borrowed about £7 billion which they are struggling to repay. They are now tapping up shareholders for 'up to' 1.5 billion so perhaps the latter could respond by repaying some of the dividends they have received...

I realised the other day that I've been gardening for over four decades.

Granted, the first two were very much a means to an end, namely sweet/beer money from my parents (the focus of my spending evolved somewhat over the years).

Most of the third decade was on strict instruction from my wife, with all my digging/weeding/mowing being an attempt at maintaining some form of matrimonial harmony.

Frankly, gardening for most of my life was very much a means to an end.

However, over the last decade or so, something changed. I gardened because I wanted to. No nagging or financial reward required. It didn't happen overnight; it was a gradual process that crept up on me. My wife would be looking on, sporting Barbara Good style dungarees (don't judge me - it's a thing) and smiling beguilingly at her man as he uses nothing more than his bare hands and innate hunter-gatherer instincts to provide for the family. Of course, the reality was somewhat different, and while yes, there was the odd victory (courgettes, obvs - almost impossible to mess up), they were quickly overshadowed by a long list of failures (gluts that would put the butter mountains of the Eighties to shame, plus the minuscule carrot harvest that tasted so bizarrely metallic haunts the family to this day). The list goes on, including several herbs I've never heard of and will undoubtedly never use in cooking. What I can confirm is that homegrown basil - all six varieties of the stuff is so much stronger than the little pots you can buy in the supermarket. It also seems indestructible and is the dictionary definition of cut and come again, bursting back into life every time it's attacked (around tea time most nights). It's a cracking little plant. Shame, then, that my over-excitement and the ridiculous number of varieties means we now have a glut of the stuff and, let's be honest, there's only so much pesto or tomato-based pasta sauces one family will take in a week. Words have been had.

So, it seems that things have come full circle. Despite the glut of herbs, I'm back to enjoying the process of 'growing my own'. I'm starting to eye up new edibles for next year and may even have another crack at carrots (the nonmetallic tasting variety). Now, if only I could talk my wife into some dungarees...



With Airline strikes affecting the many travellers who just need a well deserved holiday, to the emerging concern about some banks arbitrarily closing down customer's accounts. Everything that falls out of our 'normal' becomes an opportunity for the crooks.

Social media is overflowing with advertising these days and it's not all genuine. You may have had a holiday cancelled due to a strike at the airport or with the airline or even due to some action outside this country. In comes the rogue with an advert that promises all your holiday plans can be Very rarely will this be a genuine attempt to save us.

False promises backed up with a strong demand for upfront payment will always result in financial loss. For a family of four, this can run into thousands of pounds. How do you protect yourself against that?

Any travel plans especially if it involves flying should be made with reputable operators who are protected by ATOL. A more inclusive protection for any form of booked travel is ABTA. Always check that any deal you make is with a company that is ATOL and/or ABTA regulated.

How should you pay.

Never use a Debit card, if you can use a Credit Card. This is because Credit Card transactions are more protected against fraud helping to get your money back. That rule applies to almost any purchase where there is a risk of fraud, particularly on-line purchases offered through social media.

A newish form of scamming has emerged and we refer to it as Romance Fraud. West Mercia Police report that the number of Romance Frauds identified each week remains very high. Sadly, many go unreported as the victims are too embarrassed to formally report them. Romance Fraud not only involves the victim's losing money, and often in considerable amounts, but they also have their mental wellbeing affected, as well as experiencing a feeling of guilt and shame.

Fraudsters are always seeking new platforms to set up fake profiles and draw victims into false relationships before the requests for money start to come in. These are accompanied by heart rending pleas about personal or family problems, and emergencies which need finance.

Fraudsters continue to target users of popular social media platforms such as Facebook and Instagram, plus dating sites such as Tinder and Plenty of Fish. As well as conventional dating platforms.

Online Gaming platforms may also be used to seek potential victims since there are fewer protective measures in place. Females over 40 years are common victims as well as younger males, but older users also need to be aware on age related dating platforms too.

Basically, criminals will go to great lengths to gain the victim's trust by claiming they are in a genuine relationship which is built up over time. They will manipulate and exploit the victim to the extent they are persuaded they are in a real and genuine relationship. Then when they ask for money, the victim is convinced there is no problem with the request which can be very emotive citing reasons such as medical emergencies, travel costs, payment of fines or taxes, or even claiming their bank account has been frozen.

Tell-tale signs a friend or family member is involved in a Romance Scam

• They may be secretive about their affair or provide excuses for why their online partner has not video called or met them in person.

• Unwilling to discuss their online relationship

• May express strong emotions for someone they have only just met

• They have sent money to someone they have not met face-to-face. They may withdraw cash from their pension to send money..

Letter from America.

Self-care is much more than spending a weekend at a spa, although such a retreat can be helpful. Self-care is ultimately a state of mind that encompasses our thoughts, actions, and relationships with others. It is valuing ourselves enough to care for ourselves.

In today's fast- paced world it is so easy to be unaware of how depleted we can become. The key is to pause on a regular basis to check in with ourselves. This process is known as a "time in." Allow yourself just 5 minutes up to 3 times per day to take a break. First of all remind yourself you are just as deserving of a balanced life as those you are serving, and ask yourself the following questions: How am I feeling physically? Am I getting enough sleep? Am I hungry or thirsty? Am I choosing healthy foods? Am I drinking enough water? Am I getting in some fresh air and exercise? It is surprising how we can be unaware of our basic needs when we are busy, and making even small changes can help us k e e p balanced. Where are my thoughts? Am I able to stay focused in the present moment or am I worrying about the future? Do I have a sense of urgency that may be beyond what is required for the situation at hand? Take a few deep breaths and remind yourself to focus upon o n e thing a t а time. How am I spending my time? Am I able to set healthy boundaries with others? Am I able to say no to invitations that may not be in my best interest during this season in my life? Am I overly concerned with pleasing others?

Some people, when they think of self-care, equate it with selfishness. It is difficult for them to take time for themselves, although they may be very good at caring for others. Watch your thoughts and choices to help you

become aware of how sacrificing yourself may become an unhealthy default mode. It can be helpful during your end of the day "time in" to ask yourself how many times that day you made a choice that took an excessive toll, that ultimately was not in the best interest of yourself, or those you care for? Awareness of our default mode is an important step in beginning a process of self-care. Perhaps it is something as simple as telling someone you will get back to them about an invitation, instead of feeling you have to say yes immediately. And a "not this time" reply won't bring on the end of the world!

Each person's situation is unique to their own mindset and life circumstances. For one selfcare may be require reevaluating lifestyle choices such as reminding oneself not to overschedule commitments, or perhaps finding a way to draw in other help if you are stretched too thin. For someone else it may be becoming aware of how thinking processes may be preventing them from staying in the present moment.

Just as each person's situation is unique, so are different seasons in our lives. Are we going through an especially stressful period that requires different choices than perhaps worked for us one year before?

Balanced self-care is necessary to mental health. 
