CLEOBURY'S MEN'S SHED PROGRESSES

It's in a very early stage of life, but the Men's Shed is making good progress. At the mid November meeting a visit to the Oswestry Shed was reported and the basic business structure was agreed.

The Oswestry unit is about two years old and has 35 members, who pay £4.00 a month to cover running costs and insurance. It started with a piece of land and a basic building free of charge, since when it has built the main workshop and added a smaller unit for welding and metal work. It produces and sells items to help funds and has a wood burning stove for warmth, electricity plus and toilet facilities.

Pete Blackburn and Keith Martin have been putting in a lot of hours and one lesson learned is that the group should register charitable as а incorporated organisation under the agreed title of Cleobury Mortimer Men's Shed. Officers of the group were elected: Pete Blackburn is chair, Neil Tysall treasurer and Keith Martin the secretary. There is a need for a board of trustees, which will be those three gentlemen plus Mike Pattison and Gwilym Butler. It was agreed that the group approach a possible president.

The group will need a constitution and professional advice will be sought to advise on this, using the Oswestry group's as a basis for the Cleobury version. All of which sounds about as dry as dust, but

was actually achieved in a friendly way.

It is a credit to both Pete Blackburn and Keith Martin's no-nonsense style that so much had been achieved before this meeting. Α lot of basic administration was then laid down in one hour and people went away with the feeling that this is going to happen. There were twelve men present, all willing to work and contribute a range of skills and knowledge.

The December meeting will be on Tuesday the 12th, 7.00 o'clock in the Market Hall.and there will be less administration work and more of the practical stuff to talk about and move the project further forward. HOSPITAL PARKING CHARGES RISE

The Shropshire and Telford Hospital NHS Trust is proposing increased parking charges at Shrewsbury and Telford hospitals. The new rates would be:

Up to 2 hours: £3.00 (20% rise) Up to 3 hours: £4.00 (33% rise) Up to 4 hours: £5.00 (66% rise) Up to 5 hours: £6.00 (100% rise) Up to 24 hours: £8.00 (128% rise)

As you would expect, the reaction to this idea has been very strong, the Telford and Wrekin Council describing it as

"a tax on visiting the sick". The Press Association has reported that hospitals in England took more than £120 million for parking last year.

For some of us, paying for parking is just a pain to be lived with, but there are people who will struggle to pay such a rate to visit a loved one who may be very poorly. The Chair of the Shropshire Patients' Group has already written to the Trust to protest at the new charges and is asking others to do the same. The greater the number of people who write, the bigger the effect.

You can email Healthwatch S h r o p s h i r e a t enquiries@healthwatchshropshir e.co.uk, they will then compile all the complaints and send them to the Trust.

It may be you or your family facing these new charges, just at a time when you have greater worries to deal with. For the less well-off amongst us, it is simply not fair.

PARKING PROBLEMS

I am sure many readers will at some point have been frustrated with the traffic problems that regularly occur in Cleobury, equally I am sure many readers will have voiced disgust at some of the less than considerate parking that often adds to the difficulties of driving through town, during busy periods of the day.

I believe those same people will be equally disappointed to know that we are suffering our own parking issues at the Medical Centre. Increasingly we find that our disabled spaces are being used by people who really do not need to be parked right next to our front doors.

We have three disabled spaces at the front of the building and encourage the following groups to make use of them: blue badge holders, ambulance crews and patients who temporarily find themselves with mobility issues, due to illness or recent operations. Unfortunately our able bodied patients sometimes see them as drop off points or somewhere to pull up whilst "pop" prescription they request in.

I am writing this hoping that as patients read this letter it makes them stop and think, do I really have a need for a disabled space? If not please use one of the many other parking spaces we have available. After all, would you really want to be someone who may one day have blocked an ambulance, for the sake of a few seconds in your life?

Over the coming weeks we plan to keep a close eye on the parking in these bays, please use your blue badge if you have one. If you do not and have a mobility need, then please do park, but do not be offended if a member of staff runs a spot check on you.

Building cars in Bayton? It must rank amongst the most unlikely businesses in the area. But the Gregory family have been offering three-wheelers in kit or fully built form since 1999. That was when Phil Gregory first built a copy of his Pembleton trike for someone who'd seen it and wanted one. Since then he has built about 500 trikes, mostly Citroen 2CV powered.

That engineering knowledge was handed down to Guy, who worked with his old chap to get the first of the new generation of Pembleton V-Sports built in 2014, using an Italian Moto-Guzzi motorcycle engine. It's a logical choice, adequate power from an engine with a reputation for long life and reliability. And the car is light, very light at 290kg dry. Why the Moto Guzzi engine? "You can't beat them for looks and sound and Guzzi do concentrate on torque," Guy explains.

Buying new engines from an Italian manufacturer for such a minor operation? How did he manage that? "Lots of research and I got through to the Head of Engines in Italy. Sent him pictures and they agreed to cooperate. Sent me one engine, then a batch of three and then a batch of ten!" What do ten Guzzi engines look like? Like this:

The engine is mated with a four speed and reverse gearbox from Citroen, which provides the front wheel drive most drivers are used to today. But Guy is not standing still in that department and there may be a Pembleton gearbox available in the near future.

The attractive 1920s styling of the aluminium body hides a steel chassis built in Bayton, the louvres in the bonnet hand made with Gregory designed tooling. The bonnet is held in place with custom made leather straps, another period touch. The wheels are traditional spoked style, the rims finished in black as standard, like cars of the 1920s. And the dashboard is also black, unless the customer wants a machine turned alloy at a little extra.

The braking system is serious for such a light vehicle: twin inboard discs for the front wheels and a single drum brake at the rear end. Reassuring in an open tourer capable of cruising at 80mph on foreign autobahns.

This hand built fun machine is built to each customer's detailed specification and the price starts at a very affordable £17,995. VAT included? "No VAT, I'm not big enough to charge that yet," says Guy.

The options include leather upholstery and there are bucket seats in development. Fancy a period style flyscreen? Of course you can. And the body can come in polished alloy or whatever colour you like.

So is this a weekend plaything, or can it be used seriously? Tours of Europe are known in the owners' group and Arthur and Clair Radcliffe took theirs to New Zealand for a touring holiday. That's serious.

What are Guy's ambitions for such a promising individual car? "I don't want to be too big, maybe have two or three people working with me, making ten or more cars in a year. I'm planning to build a show car to take around to some of the classic events like Prescott and Shelsley hill climbs and the big Silverstone Classic meeting."

checking your pet's mouth

Examining the mouth can tell us a lot about the general health of our pets. As vets we routinely look in and around the mouth every time we examine an animal. The lips, gums, teeth, tongue, and the hard palate can all be quietly brewing some serious problems which may well be related to dental disease. All of these are places that are easily checked in amenable pets, and owners can and should look at them regularly (except in rodents). The most important thing for any of us as pet owners is to be able to safely and gently look in our pet's mouths whenever we're handling them. So don't leave it until you're concerned about a problem; get into the habit of routinely checking for anything which looks abnormal. The sooner we know about a dental or oral problem, the better. Most of the conditions which affect the mouth are painful and will therefore need swift investigation and treatment. Smelly breath is not just a sign of old age, and should not be considered normal. The bad breath is just a symptom of a disease process which will progress if it is not dealt with. It is often due to dental disease, but may be due to a tumour in the mouth, a piece of foreign material stuck in the mouth, or ulceration due to a more generalised disease.

Gingivitis (inflamed gums, possibly bleeding), calculus, tooth root abscesses and ultimately tooth loss are all painful conditions, but often do not cause an animal to stop eating. In many instances these are chronic conditions which progress gradually, and so often they are not perceived to be significant factors in our pet's general health. However, they genuinely debilitating are conditions which we certainly wouldn't ignore in our own mouths, and we ought to learn to appreciate their significance in our pets. Some factors, such as breed, jaw conformation, tooth and viral/bacterial infection predispose our pets to rapid or severe dental disease. Poor and/or inappropriate diet is a major cause of dental disease in pet rabbits and guinea pigs, who actually only require simple low energy, high fibre food i.e. grass/hay (not concentrated, manufactured pellets). They need to spend long periods of time chewing; otherwise their teeth become too long and irregular in shape. Sharp spurs on the molar teeth dig into the cheeks and

Dental Disease in Small Animals: the wisdom of tongue, and the abnormally long teeth prevent normal chewing action.

> The best advice I can give you is to check your pet's mouth regularly (i.e. at least weekly, if not daily); look at all the teeth, open the mouth wide and look under the tongue and along the hard palate. Look for swellings, bleeding, plaque, foreign bodies etc. If you see anything abnormal, or which concerns you, get it checked by your vet. Prompt action is always best.

> Be aware that insurance policies rarely cover the cost of dental treatment, unless it is for an acute condition which could not have been prevented by good care. It is our responsibility to make the effort to maintain good dental hygiene wherever possible, and therefore minimise the need for veterinary dental treatment. Appropriate food, chews, toothpaste and mouth washes should all be considered part of a good dental care regimen. The vast majority of veterinary dental treatment requires general anaesthesia and so pets usually stay at the vets for the day to receive the care and attention they deserve.

The Club met at the Cleobury Café in November to hear Sue Brown explain the basis of her work as a Chiropractic, working in Cleobury's High Street.

Sue opened by stressing that this is now a regulated profession, and it is illegal for anyone in UK to call themselves 'a chiropractic' without prior registration. She followed up by explaining that much of her work relates to spinal problems, many of which her patients bring on themselves through bad posture. This is often associated with frequent lengthy periods of incorrectly positioned seating, especially at computer work stations, or in cars. If we ignore the optimum alignment of the spine, or adopt unbalanced or asymmetrical stances, we are storing up problems for ourselves. Which a chiropractic may be able to solve.

On a show of hands, about half the members revealed that they had at some time had treatment from a chiropractor, or from an osteopath, and as Sue warmed to her subject, one could see members wriggling on their seats, trying to arrange themselves to provide their spines with the approved curves (lower spine IN, upper spine OUT). Sue's explanations were clarified by her use of an excellent model of a human spine (which could hardly be called life-like, but it certainly was realistic). She also provided some simple tips to reduce likely problems - such as careful choices of seating, cushions, and pillows. All in all, a useful talk.

ALEX'S DEGREE SUCCESS



Alex Guest, holder of an Open University Open Degree.

This is a story of devotion and determination, of a young man overcoming a serious illness to realise his ambition to earn a university degree.

Alex Guest was only 12 when he developed Chronic Fatigue Syndrome. It was a devastating blow, leaving him with severe head and joint aches, exhaustion and serious sensitivity to light, sound and touch. Add to that the loss of the ability to read and write and you realise that it was a huge problem to face.

Schooling was one of the problems, Shropshire Education Services unable to provide a tutor or online learning. So his mother Gill approached the Open University, who agreed to take him on at the age of 14, one of the youngest to undertake their courses. The problems he faced would put most people off the idea, but Alex and his mum are made of stern stuff.

"The first module he did was Maths," Gill recalls. "Alex couldn't tolerate the brightness of white paper, so we used to do ten minutes sessions of sums in felt tip pen on the window panes. Our house looked like a scene from Good Will Hunting!"

His natural intellect was there to be seen if you met him. He came to the Creative Writing Group, shy and hesitant in manner, but able produce some great ideas and express them in good English. He is a talented writer.

His mum is rightly delighted achievement. with Alex's "Graduation Day was verv emotional," she admits of the gathering at Birmingham's Symphony Hall, where Baroness Lane-Fox, chancellor of the OU, presented the degrees. "To be among so many Open University students who had supported by their families. It was lovely to see their tenacity and sheer dogged hard work pay off, and celebrate with them. We were immensely proud." Quite right too, it is a remarkable story.

THE READING GROUP

Are we more tolerant of race and class now than we were in the mid 1900s? This was our main topic after reading 'The L-Shaped Room' by Lynne Reid Banks, an authentic sounding story set in the 1950s.

The novel, now social history, covers the stigma of unmarried motherhood and class attitudes. The striking casual racism & anti-Semitism feels shocking now but reflects attitudes in the 1950s. These have changed a great deal for the better but there is still a way to go.

Our next read, 'Elizabeth is Missing' by Emma Healey will be chatted about over nibbles and drinks on December 18th at Cleobury Library.



St John the Baptist Church in Doddington are delighted that they have been given £10,700 in grant money to do a feasibility study. The major part of this is

from the Big Lottery Fund with additional help from Shropshire Historic Churches Trust. Faced with major repair works and no means of knowing how much they would cost, the grant allows the church to turn a problem into an opportunity, including consulting community on how the Church can better serve its needs. "This is fantastic news", said Celia Gibb, Churchwarden. "We rely on donations for our income and keep the Church churchyard in use. This grant allows us to assess the cost of repair, which may be tens of thousands of pounds, as well as find out if there are ways we can better serve the community."

Set in a beautiful location on Titterstone Clee. the oldest continuously active industrial area in Europe, the Church was built for quarry and mine workers 170 years ago and has a number of important features that proclaim the importance of itspheritage and serving the spiritual needs of the area. "The simple calm of St John's, set in its churchyard with views to Worcestershire and Wales, and its heritage, including unusual use of ironwork in the windows make it a very special and precious place." commented Celia. Once repairs are assessed and the community needs are reviewed, then the real work of raising funds to do the work begins. "Its going to be a long and challenging project. We are a little apprehensive, but very excited!" admitted Celia "But the Big Lottery Fund grant is a great start and we are very grateful that they are helping the Church on the Hill to continue to shine out."

CRIME REDUCTION GROUP



Deputy Police and Crime Commissioner Tracy Onslow. A sharp and concise no-nonsense speaker.

New faces were on parade at the Crime Reduction Group meeting in November, most notably Deputy Police and Crime Commissioner Tracy Onslow. In a sharp, concise way she described the West Mercia Police plans to introduce some new services within their £210 million annual budget.

This includes a Victim's Charter, giving those who have suffered from crime easier access to all the services the force can offer. On the matter of domestic violence there is an addition with the recruitment of a male administrator as well as the established females; there is such violence to males, but it gets little publicity.

The budget for Closed Circuit Television installation has been increased from the £300,000 2016 level to £1 million to ensure that all cameras give a clear image of vehicles and criminals. There was strong support for this

news, the town's own old system being expensive and of little practical use, hence its recent replacement.

Mrs Onslow introduced Mick Simpson, manager of the 'We Don't Buy Crime' scheme, who said Cleobury Mortimer was a flagship operation that has attracted attention from many neighbouring towns and villages. The effect has been a reduction of about 85 percent in burglaries, but break-ins at sheds and barns is a growing problem.

Mrs Onslow then advised that West Mercia Police take about 11,000 phone calls a week and the answering delay to 999 calls has been reduced by half. All officers now have laptops and mobile phones to make crime recording more efficient.

Criminal use of social media is a growing problem and she gave a frightening statistic: if a teenager is given a computer, the average time for them to receive a sexting call is within 30 minutes! This is an area where advice to children and parents is given and the force has extra staff working on the matter.

Steve Loveridge spoke about his work as a Crime Prevention Design Advisor, making life harder for the criminal by overseeing obvious targets like pharmacies, hospitals and homes with control drugs in stock. It's all part of the policy of prevention being better than chasing criminals.

Inspector Nigel Morgan introduced himself, the officer now responsible for an area stretching from Shifnal to Bishops Castle. He has a staff of one sergeant and seven

constables and PCSOs. He said that there was an increase in van and shed break-ins, with tools and machinery the targets. He emphasised his willingness to hear feedback from the public.

Kit Smith spoke as a resident, praising the work of the group and the fact that we are well set up to prevent crime, but do depend upon police cooperation and support. He had persuaded his insurer, NFU, to reduce his premium in the light of the town's forward thinking work.

There was discussion of a Community Speed Watch Group that would be trained to operate speed cameras and report offenders. It was felt it would be wise for such volunteers to always work outside their own home area to prevent risk of intimidation. Volunteers for such work are to be invited to apply.

The next meeting of the group is at 11.00 on January 22nd, in the Sports and Social Club.

The meeting with Shropshire Council, due to be held in late October, was postponed as not much is happening. The 2L contract has been extended until April 2018 to tie in with other similar arrangements so that they can all be renewed together and no fresh meeting date has been arranged yet. One problem is that the Worcestershire Council contact keeps changing, resulting in the new occupant having to be brought up to speed – then they move...

The other morning, I noticed a substantial diesel slick running up the High Street and casually wondered if it might have come from a Diamond bus. Later the same day, I heard that much of Kiddy town centre had been affected by a fuel leak from a broken down bus which had left the road surface in a dangerous condition. The Fire service and Police were called out to deal with the resulting chaos which took several hours to resolve. At this point, you may be thinking 'Could the vehicle involved possibly have belonged to my favourite bus company?'. Yes it could! And did! At least it didn't catch fire on this occasion although I gather that at least one elderly cyclist came off as a result of the slippery surface. Apparently the slick started in Bewdley and ran all the way into Kiddy. The Cleobury slick was also said to be the cause of an accident down near Newbridge. Diamond Buses said that the leak was from their 2 service and they couldn't comment further as 'the incident is under investigation'. This is interesting as the 2 doesn't come to Cleobury so I wonder if our problem was caused earlier when that same vehicle may have been used on the 2L route.

As usual, breakdowns have occurred at a number of locations including Far Forest with Hopton being the most common. Perhaps this is a sign of a mysterious phenomenon which we could call 'The Hopton Triangle' which brings vehicles to a halt using supernatural powers. Or perhaps it is just caused by using clapped out and badly maintained vehicles. You choose. Problem: It's

uphill in every direction from there. Solution: Use buses that can go up hills... In one case the bus was stuck on the bridge with a queue of other vehicles unable to get past due to the blind bend. This brings to mind the heavy barriers installed to prevent a terrorist driving a vehicle through the Birmingham Christmas Market. Why go to all that trouble when you could just hire a couple of Diamond buses – they won't ever move...

Further afield, a recent emergency drill at Zurich Airport involved a bus being set on fire to simulate a terrorist attack. Perhaps they should be told we are ahead of them as buses here don't need setting on fire - they do it themselves. And in Tokyo, a train company issued a formal apology for poor timekeeping when one of their services departed 20 seconds early. If only....

Even if the bus gets you to your destination on time, your troubles are not over. Two elderly ladies, one of whom is not in the best of health, wished to alight in Cleobury. Despite repeated ringing of the buzzer, the driver could not be persuaded to stop until they reached Hollywaste. The ladies then had to walk all the way back... At least that driver was on the route – roadworks in Lower Galdeford meant that the bus couldn't get to the last stop in Ludlow and the driver didn't know where to go (or speak much English). Luckily Liz "The Navigator" Bishop was on board and managed to put him right.

Just spent a week in rural North Norfolk and used the buses every day with no problems. A comprehensive and regular service and all on time. When you think that there is only sea on at least two sides, it makes South Shropshire look almost urban. So where are our services? Perhaps Norfolk Council have ensured fair treatment for residents throughout the whole of their patch and not spent years studiously ignoring the problems as has happened here in remote (?) South Shropshire.

ALBERT MANTLE'S MEMORIES OF MULLER'S

After reading Martin Perkins' story of Muller's I decided that I would like to do a similar thing.

I joined Muller's on 30th March 1943 at the age of 14. My job was to collect work tickets and run errands, like collecting cigarettes and tobacco from the newsagents. In September 1943 my apprenticeship started and I

was paid four and a half pence (less than 2p!) per hour but had to work an hour less per day than everyone else due to being a junior.

'A' shop was my port of call with Mr Guilder as my boss. I moved around different autos including a while working with Roy Burrows who is now in his 90s. In 1946 my apprenticeship ended and I was given a section of machines to run, which I was not familiar with. I was helped along by the new apprentice Ted Cartwright who was a great asset. In 1948 a Swiss lad came and took my place so that I could take over my cousin's section while he was away on National service.

In 1950 I was diagnosed with TB so had 2 years and 3 months off sick. 11 months of that time was spent in the sanatorium at Shirlett Broseley. I returned to my duties in 1953.

In 1958 I helped to run the Muller football team and in 1963 became secretary to the union. In 1965 came an all out strike for better pay which eventually Mr Hartmann awarded.

In 1973 I left for pastures new (Big Mistake!) and returned in 1977, but with the prospect of redundancies in 1980 I took on the security guard job in the gatehouse rather than unemployed. In 1983 I went back onto the shop floor working as part of a team making parts for a new contract with Parker Pens. I stayed there until I retired in 1995. I was not retired for long as I was asked to return to help out the delivery driver on a part time basis which turned out to be more like full time. There was much amusement between us and we

ended up being named Crashem and Basham.

2001 saw the end of my era with Muller at the age of 72 and after 54 years service.

Browsing through my copy of the NFU's 'Countryside' magazine (always a good read) I spotted that an Avian Influenza Roadshow - a free event to give poultry keepers the latest advice to avoid an outbreak of the disease and what would happen if that occurred - was coming to Ledbury that very week. My diary told me I could make it and I duly found myself in The Feathers Hotel, a lone backyard poultry keeper in a room full of others with tens of thousands of birds.

Through the presentations of the next few hours I learnt many things, including that out of 13 infections last winter, six were in backyard poultry flocks.

The global picture: How the different strains of AI are spreading worldwide with the associated risk of mutations producing new forms highly pathogenic to humans as well as birds. I hadn't appreciated that my response as a very small scale chicken farmer had a serious part to play in the battle to prevent or delay a dangerous epidemic.

An outbreak or even an infection investigation would severely restrict movements of not only poultry and their products but vehicles too within a 3km radius (Imagine having to apply for a licence to take the kids to school!). I wouldn't want to be the cause of such trouble and economic difficulty if I could help it.

So, how do I stop my birds catching AI? We kept ours indoors for the first 30 days control order a year ago then made a covered run for them so that they could be outside. Our difficulty was in stopping wild birds, especially those cheeky robins, from getting into the run and hen house through the tiniest holes. Now I have picked up some good, practical ideas and have a 'to do' list which includes making a better run, blocking access holes in the hen house and dealing effectively with rats. I also picked up a bunch of AI posters to pass on to fellow keepers. All in all a day well spent.



With the chickens tucked up safe and well I can spend the shortest days of the year enjoying whatever sunshine we get and collecting natural materials for some Christmas decorations. A handful of long (5' to 7') prunings of wisteria, willow or vine can easily be wound into a ring that can have cones and seedheads attached by wire or glue gun. Some gold spray, glitter and ribbon will add colour and sparkle and your front door will gain a seasonal creation all of your own! Linda Iles



CLEOBURY PATIENTS' VOICE

In July last year, we reported the Care Quality Commission review of Doddington Lodge home, found to 'Inadequate' and placed 'Special Measures' after consecutive inspections revealed breaches of at least five aspects of the Health and Social Care Act. Short-term improvements meant a subsequent inspection gave the home a qualified rating of 'Good' and even generated a gushing article in April's Clarion, although one could now be forgiven for thinking that this was another April Fools' joke. This September the CQC made three unannounced returns to Doddington Lodge deemed it 'Inadequate' again, with seven breaches of the Health and Social Care Act.

The report makes for grim, sometimes shocking, reading and has been featured by the BBC and the Shropshire Star. The care home has now closed down, despite a last-minute attempt by another provider to take it over, with its remaining residents moved elsewhere at very short notice, and several workers out of a job.

Few, if any, of Doddington Lodge's bed places were funded by Shropshire Council, and it is understanding our that Cleobury Fields, the 60-bed care currently construction in Cleobury, will only offer self-funded places. Newcastle University's Institute Ageing predicts a UK shortfall of 71,000 care home places by 2025 and, for the foreseeable future, it looks as though local people who need residential care and are without independent means are going to have to go further afield to find

MQP HELP THE TOWN AGAIN

This time it was the supply and installation of five dog boxes in the popular dog walking spots around the town. We already had two, courtesy of Severn Edge Vets, and the amount they collect shows what an effective idea these boxes are.

They are easy to spot with their distinctive doggy profile on the front of the box. You'll find one in the Parish Churchyard, two on the Playing Fields, one at the Skate Park and the fifth by the gate on the path to the caravan park.

All we have to do now is persuade dog owners to use poo bags and put them in the right place.

LOCAL JOINT COMMITTEE

The Cleobury Rural Local Joint Committee met at Hopton

Wafers in November, with Road Safety high on the agenda. There was a report of tractor drivers on the High Street using their mobile phones. There will be a Police check.

MQP quarry manager Hugh McGuigan explained an increase in lorry traffic as the quarry has gone through a recovery from a low position. If there are any of his contractors speeding, he needs a registration number or the name on the cab, plus time and place. He can check the speed of any lorry from the onboard cameras and if it has exceeded the limit there will be a warning to the driver. Persistent problems will mean suspension and loss of income.

Parking in the area of the Primary School is to be looked at and possible solutions sought. The new crossing west of the town centre will be sited outside the phone exchange, subject to the Town Council's consent.

If the latest application for a grant goes through, Cleobury Mortimer will have 24 CCTV cameras, which means more cameras than hairdressers! It's all part of preventing crime, with cameras able to automatically recognise a car or van's registration number. Not a comfortable feeling for anyone paying a late visit with crime in mind - the Police will know who they are.

There have been reports of several vehicles being broken into and items taken. At this time of year especially please make sure all presents etc are hidden and vehicles left secured, I will leave posters to place in car windows at the library.

Please be aware during the winter that putting antifreeze in fountains to stop them freezing up is harmful to animals.

Zoe Partington and Squeeze Hems: artistic ambitions.



First, a brief account of the development in planes over the course of the war .

1914-1915

We had the BE2 as a prominent feature of the RFC. This was not a military design, in fact not ideal at all having the pilot in the rear cockpit and the observer in the front. This configuration on a biplane meant that very little could be observed due to the wings being in the way. Machine guns could be fitted using one of four sockets at different positions but this required the observer to stand up lift the gun and replace it in a new position, all this while the pilot manoeuvred. Guns were unable to fire through the propeller arc until later.

At this stage aircraft carried out mixed duties as observation platforms, low level bombing missions and air combat. This plane was a good platform and was used to observe and to carry bombs, but only if the observer did not go as the plane would then be overloaded.

1915-1916

In the summer of 1915 a German threat appeared in the form of the Fokker Eindecker which was a monoplane with the ability to fire forward due to the development of a device known as an 'interrupter' which synchronised with the propeller. This plane developed a mystique with the Allies and was the aircraft that the early German air aces flew. The bubble was burst in April 1916 when a complete aircraft was captured (now in the Science Museum) and then flown against Allied aircraft and found to have poor manoeuvrability.

1916-1917

At the end of 1916 the German Albatross fighter was introduced and reigned supreme until the introduction of the first new British fighter designs in mid 1917.

The single seat Sopwith Camel was a fighter which could carry small bombs and was used for attacking trenches. It had to fly directly towards its target to use the twin Lewis guns and was therefore vulnerable to fire from the ground. It was however a very nimble and manoeuvrable aircraft.

The SE 5A, also a single seater, was the most successful fighter of the conflict and armed with one fixed gun and a tilting gun above the wing

The Bristol, armed like the SE 5A but with an extra Lewis gun. Sometimes a double gun flew with the Camel on bombing and ground attack missions. As the best all round fighter it was one of those adopted by the post war RAF.

1918

The final development came in this year with the appearance of the large Handley Page bombers that flew on missions to bomb German cities up to the end of the conflict.

Pilots' Watches

We have seen several instances in previous pieces how developments in technology allowed one side to catch up and overtake the other.

The Great War was also an enormous catalyst for changes in society. One example might be the emancipation of women who took on jobs previously only done by men. At the end of the war therefore society needed to embrace this change.

In 1914 wrist watches were rarely worn by men, the pocket watch was still order of the day irrespective of class.

It was not uncommon to see women wearing small pocket watches on a ribbon on their wrist in the late 1880s... more feminine and less cumbersome than carrying the pocket watch. The British Military had from the same period worn pocket watches on leather bands for ease of use.

In the 1914 1918 war the front line was well forward of headquarters, there was no chance of taking instruction by flags or other visual methods. If movements were to take place at a certain time the only way to coordinate action was by the watch. Pilots similarly needed to know exactly at what time they should be at a certain position.

A pocket watch was entirely unsuitable. You had to find it and check it wearing cumbersome clothing and very thick leather gloves or gauntlets. The obvious thing was to adapt a pocket watch and wear it outside the jacket and glove. The large numerals and large winder (crown) meant it was easy to see, wind and alter. Early flyers watches mirrored these features but were specifically designed to be worn on the wrist.

The adoption of the wrist watch first by officers, both ground and air, rapidly spread to other ranks. Those on leave wore their watches on the wrist which caused those not serving to reconsider the issue of the suitability of wrist watches for men. By the end of the 1920s the wristwatch had overtaken the pocket watch in popularity and became a 'must have' item.

So the specific needs generated by the development of air warfare turned the very humble time piece into an important tool for flyers.

If you would like to look further into the RFC, search for The Royal Flying Corps 1914 -1918 which is a very useable site.

KATE'S MESSAGE OF HOPE



Kate Jones is quite a bundle of energy, running four choir groups in the area and practicing the gentle Reiki form of alternative medicine. You'd never guess she had been a serious diabetes sufferer unless you heard her tell the story.

She did that in the Market Hall in November, recounting how in 2013 she lacked energy and a series of blood tests eventually revealed diabetes. She resolved to sort out the problem herself and not resort to drugs for three months. "Fat around the middle is the cause," she explained, with irregular eating adding to problem. the Informed recommendation was to go no more than three hours without food, with proteins the best to snack on, like nuts, houmous and apples.

She exercised with walking and has progressed to going to the gym today. Reiki helped her relax and stop worrying. A further test of the amount of sugar clinging to blood cells revealed a level of 66 percent; 48 is the maximum acceptable. By 2015 self-treatment and discipline had got that down to 45 and today her level is 39. Her

blood pressure has plummeted too. She recommends gradual change, checking one element at a time to ascertain progress.

She follows her own CRANES discipline. C for Choice of food, R for rest, A for activity, N for nutrition, E for engagement with life and S for support from friends and family.

A fascinating tale, told modestly to an appreciative audience who applauded her and wanted to know more. This was really an experiment to test public reaction, and there was clearly a positive one. Watch this space to know when she's speaking again.

CATHERTON COMMON UPDATE

The weather is very up and down in terms of temperature at the moment but we are slowly moving into winter and creatures are beginning their preparations. Slow worms are prolific on the common and along with other amphibians and reptiles, e.g. lizards and snakes, are looking for bracken litter to hibernate in over winter. Bracken has its uses and we do not want to eliminate it from the Common, just keep it in balance with other habitat

Shropshire Wildlife Trust volunteers will be spending at least one day a month on gorse removal where it becomes tall and dense and takes over, also around small pools and damp areas where it can shade the water and surrounding plants, also on bell pit mounds where it can damage the acid grassland, a habitat becoming more rare.

Now is a time of year when people are cutting back hedges and trimming other plants in their gardens so that things are tidy for the winter. It may seem the common is an ideal place to dispose of this green waste but PLEASE DON'T leave any of your garden waste hedge cuttings or grass cuttings on the common. They are a source of very concentrated nutrients and the common is special for wildlife because of its very low level of nutrients. Not only does this waste look untidy and encourage others to leave their waste, it will harm the local wildlife and environment.




