

BAYTON'S CHRISTMAS CONCERT

This December 3rd gathering had special significance, as Saint Bartholomew's church had been closed for more than a year for a comprehensive rebuilding programme. There was tension right to the last days, when Severn Trent managed to reconnect the water pipes and ensure a supply for tea making.

The concert tickets sold out long before the event and something like 130 people plus the 30-strong Much Wedlock Male Voice Choir under Paul Kelly filled the church to capacity and a wee bit more.



The choir were excellent, with a programme of both carols and popular favourites, then joining in the community singing sessions. They have a total membership of 46 and are hoping to recruit just a few more to help hem celebrate their 50th birthday this year.

Brian Link hosted the afternoon with an easy style and a lot of information about the restoration of the church. He explained that there used to be chicken wire suspended from

the ceiling to catch the ancient plaster that had been falling on the congregation's heads. The roof had been stripped back and remade, with modern insulation and materials. But the main timber spans, apparently installed during a rebuild 500 good were in vears ago, and condition needed no replacement. At the other extreme, the builders had dug down to bedrock to cure an old problem with damp. The stone flag floor does look good.

Before the interval there was a star performance by Ollie Hart-Bradford, booked by Brian Link after he read about this local talent in these pages. Ollie does sing well, in a relaxed manner that the audience loved. Big rounds of applause for both his sessions.

The interval brought another eye opener. Tea was served by a legion of helpers who carried it to the seated audience while the choir queued into the kitchen. Then everyone was handed a foil wrapped package of locally made sandwiches and cakes, including a small piece of the Christmas variety. All made by church volunteers and part of the admission charge. Superb.

There was a raffle, but I didn't see the tickets, so missed out. There must have been close to 20 prizes, the winning numbers picked out and a runner sent off to hand over the prize as the next dip into the bag was just happening. The result was a draw that held the audience's attention and not too much time spent before we were back to the music.

It was close to five o'clock when the concert ended with a presentation to a surprised Ollie Hart-Bradford. This young man does have a modest way, not at all trying to be the star he will surely become.

The final farewell from the host was an invitation to take a bag of cooking apples from the church porch, as they were surplus to needs and what was left was going to West Midlands Safari Park on Monday. And very fine apples they were.

The Concert drew visitors from North and South Wales, plus Birmingham, which shows how its reputation has grown. If you get a chance to go, don't miss it. Great stuff.



CLEE HILL COMMUNITY WILDLIFE GROUP

The Group was formed in 2012 with the aim of bringing together people interested in wildlife to do something positive for local species. The group's activity is centred on the open hill land of Titterstone Clee, Clee Hill Common, Catherton Common and surrounding areas.

HELPING BIRDS TO FIND A HOME

In changing landscape, sometimes birds appreciate a helping hand to find a suitable nest site. Through involvement with the Group, Angela MacKirdy was aware that the number of Kestrels in the UK is declining. Kestrels have nested near her smallholding on Catherton Common for many years but their chosen tree was decaying badly and not providing enough shelter to allow chicks to survive. She and husband Iain researched suitable designs and built a nest box in spring 2017 which was erected on a pole close to the original nest site. They watched anxiously as a pair of kestrels investigated both the old nest site and the new 'des res'. Happily, they chose the latter and went on to raise a single chick which fledged successfully. The chick was ringed to help with future

For 2018 the group has successfully obtained a grant from the Ludlow Rotary Club Cares fund for new nest box schemes in the Clee Hill area for Kestrels, Pied Fly Catchers, Redstarts, Swifts, Swallows and House Martins.

The Clee Hill group is free and open to anyone from anywhere. There is no need to be a wildlife expert or skilled in identification, just an interest in our local area and its wildlife. Becoming involved provides the incentive to become more aware of wildlife and to learn a bit more about the species that

occupy the beautiful landscape of Clee Hill.

TV FILM CREW UNEARTH HISTORIC PORSCHE

In 2014 a German television film crew working on an antiques programme were visiting an old barn where a number of cars had been stored. Amongst them were two of the 911 sports models dating from the 1960s. One of them, a red coupe, was numbered 300 - 057 and a check with the Porsche Museum got a very strong reaction, because it was older than any of the 911 models in the factory's possession.

The Museum agreed to buy both cars at a price set by an independent valuer and the oldest one was moved to the museum's workshops, where a long process of restoration began. The car had not been restored or altered in any way, which made it even more valuable as a museum exhibit.

The restoration used the original components as much as possible, though the team had to use some body parts from another model of similar age. After three

years of craftsmen's time the job was done and one immaculate Model 901, made in the Weissach factory in October 1964 is now on show at a special exhibition with the title "911 (901 No 57) A legend takes off". The exhibition will run until April 8th this year and Porsche enthusiasts from all over the globe are expected to look in to see this remarkable piece of company history.



This is the only example of the 911 series in the museum that carries the 901 badge of the first cars made. The car was launched and was selling well under that title until the French Peugeot factory's solicitors wrote and pointed out that Peugeot had patented the idea of a series using three numbers with 0 in the middle to identify them. Their 403 and 404 were big sellers globally and the French were not going to have their thunder stolen. Porsche did the honourable thing and changed the badge from 901 to 911, which has gone on to sit proudly on the flanks of over a million elegant sports cars.

Strangles - An Old Adversary

This disease strikes terror into the heart of horse owners probably because of the emotive sound of the name. Although it is true that horses can die from strangles this is very rare in the United Kingdom. More often one sees a profuse nasal discharge (usually from both nostrils), enlarged and sore lymph glands just inside the bone of the lower jaw and throat. The horse may develop a fever, loss of appetite, depression and a cough. Less severe clinical signs can also be seen of dullness, short term fever and inappetance with only a mild nasal discharge. As with human coughs and colds different levels of immunity of individuals means that you get different levels of clinical signs. Very occasionally some cases will have complications where the bacteria spreads throughout the body to cause further abscessation known as 'bastard strangles'.

Up to 10% of horses may recover and appear normal but remain infected. These horses are 'silent carriers' and harbour the bacteria within the guttural pouches of the throat; they can infect other horses.

Strangles is caused by a bacterium called Streptococcus equi equi – usually we forget the second 'equi' when we talk about it and refer to Strep. equi. It is extremely infectious and contagious and it can affect horses of any age.

The key point to remember about infection is that, apart from being spread through the air, it can also be carried on clothing, hands, grooming equipment and even on the coats of dogs and cats.

Once an outbreak starts isolation is the key – but more about that later.

Can we protect our horses against Strangles?

Prevention is most definitely better than cure, this is done by keeping your horse away from infected horses and infected material. There is a strangles vaccine in the UK which can reduce clinical signs though it is not widely used and is actually out of stock at present.

On all livery yards there has to be a policy of openness. It is generally not a matter of neglect that a horse becomes infected with strangles but more one of bad luck. It is not appropriate for any individual owner of an affected horse to keep quiet about the situation – considerable aggravation will ensue as more and more horses become infected. As vets we are bound by client confidentiality but in rare cases where clients are not open about the situation with fellow horse-owners, it can look as though we are colluding with them.

Treatment

Nursing care is the mainstay of treatment involving damp sloppy food to aid swallowing. Where abscess's are forming applying warm poultices to help them mature and come to a head and then flushing once they burst to speed resolution. Anti inflammatory to make the patient feel more comfortable and reduce fevers. Antibiotics are controversial and should only be used in the very early stages as discussed later.

What should we do when an outbreak is confirmed?

Once an outbreak is confirmed then the managers of equine premises should stop all movement on or off the yard. All the horses should be put into at least three categories: those which have had no contact with the infected animals; those which have been in contact; those which are clinically affected

Once these groups have been set up there should only be any movement into the clinically affected group.

Owners of horses in each group should have no contact with those in other groups until the outbreak has been resolved.

It is helpful if owners of horses in groups 1 and 2 take rectal temperatures twice daily and keep a record – if you are unsure how to do this then please ask one of us at Severn Edge. We don't want to hear of any accidents! A rising rectal temperature indicates infection before obvious signs appear.

If the temperature goes above 38.2C then there is an argument for giving penicillin injections to affected individuals. The incubation period ranges from 3 to 14 days and shedding of bugs takes place 2 to 7 days after this and will persist for 2 to 3 weeks.

Swelling in the lymph nodes under the jaw will usually occur 7 to 10 days after infection and once this occurs then most antibiotic treatment is useless. However, if one can catch the initial rise in temperature then the course of the infection can be significantly shortened.

Management of infected horses.: Arrange for the horse to be swabbed at the earliest opportunity; do not have any contact with any other uninfected horses during the outbreak; try to arrange for only one person to deal with infected horses on the premises; set up a foot bath with Virkon S outside the box; change into overalls before attending to your horse.

NEW FACES, NEW DOG CARE CENTRE



"We're devoted to dogs." Nia and Glenn of Oak Ridge Total Dog Care
Two people who have given up professional positions that took them around the world, to open a dog care centre here in Cleobury Mortimer, are definitely out of the ordinary.

Glenn did 21 years in the international exhibition business and Nia held a high position in IT. They've both spent time in the Middle East and seem glad to be settled in rural England. Glenn quotes one German banker telling him "The Sultan of Dubai has an income from oil of \$120 million US a day, but the real money is in Abu Dhabi." For two people whose feet are firmly on the ground, that's the stuff of fairyland.

They have two loveable mutts of their own, one a rescue dog from Far Forest Kennels. And the two acres of land they have at Mawley is being converted to accommodate dogs taken in for either day care or home boarding. There are two secure outdoor play paddocks, plus indoor play and rest areas. For the day care side of the service,

they're open from 7.30am to 6.00pm, with later pick ups available because they know people don't all work to a fixed schedule. The dogs get play and exercise time plus training if the owner asks for it.

They have been inspected and been awarded a licence for boarding by the County Council. For them, home boarding means the guest dogs allowed to mix with their own pets, in the house or out in the spacious play area. "They are not isolated, they're cared for," emphasises Nia.



Day care units, all brand new, with secure play area around. Even on a snowy day there were dogs playing.

Future plans are ambitious, with a 68 square metre building due to be fitted with a hydrotherapy unit. Not exactly a common service, but well known in horse racing circles as an aid to injury recovery and to keep muscles in the best of tone. They've been talking to local vets about this installation and there's great interest in the venture, which is due to open in July this year.

They see hydrotherapy being used for two particular categories. The first as an aid to

agility and fitness, so of interest to owners entering dogs in the international competition scene.

The second area is rehabilitation, to aid recovery from orthopaedic surgery and reduce the effect of neurological degeneration. It will increase the animal's quality of life, which any owner will understand and wish for.

The hydrotherapy treatment will only be given when the dog has been referred by a veterinary surgeon. It will involve 30 minute sessions that include a warm shower wash, 20 minutes exercise in the unit and a final shower and drying. "20 minutes in the unit is the equivalent of a 10 mile walk," Glenn explains.

The essential curing element is the ease with which an animal can move when the water carries its body weight and eases the burden of its full weight if it is in recovery. It gets confidence in recovery much quicker than simple exercise through walking.

Nia has trained for this work and is Level Three certified by the Canine Hydrotherapy Association, essential for her to offer the treatment. Association will check the unit and her operating competence every year, requiring evidence of continuous professional development with at least 40 hours of training to keep up to date with developments.

It's a serious business and she will stay eligible to do the work only by meeting exacting standards.



I hope readers managed to have a pleasant break over Christmas and the New Year. Unsurprisingly perhaps given the events of the year just past, my New Year's message is similar to that of last year, namely 2017 really was a momentous year in British politics. So for Members of Parliament, like anyone else, some time with family over Christmas provides a welcome respite before we re-enter the fray, re-energised and ready to address the challenges ahead.

Last May Shropshire Council elections saw little change, other than in Broseley. But the General Election in June saw a significant reversion to two party dominance of elections, as in the past. Both Conservatives and Labour increased their vote share from the 2015 election, with the other minor parties losing ground. Here in South Shropshire, I was delighted to be returned with an increased vote share and increased majority, but was surprised and disappointed the Conservatives lost an overall majority in the House of Commons.

Whatever we think of the result, it did confirm one thing – that Brexit must proceed. In June, over 80% of voters backed candidates who stood on manifestos which included respecting the decision of the British people in the referendum to leave the European Union.

So implementing Brexit will naturally take up the majority of Parliamentary time in 2018. The process by which we leave will define our country's relationship with the European Union for years to come, so it is vital we do what we can to secure the best possible exit for Britain. But it is of course also essential to continue to address the issues facing the country today, and for me, this means ensuring families in South Shropshire benefit as we build a Britain fit for the future.

2017 will also be remembered for a series of tragic events, so I am also hopeful for a more peaceful year in 2018. The terrorist attacks the UK faced last year, including Manchester, Borough Market and Westminster Bridge, and the horror of Grenfell Tower were truly harrowing. In the face of these atrocities it was encouraging to see the way the country came together. I saw first-hand the response from our emergency services, which was exemplary, including the NHS, but I hope sincerely there will be no similar cause for them to repeat their actions again this year.

As always, I will continue to hold my regular surgeries in different towns across the Ludlow Constituency throughout 2018. You have not dreamed of - wheeled and soared and swung

High in the sunlit silence hovering there.

I've chased the shouting wind along and flung

My eager craft through footless halls of air...

Up, up the long delirious burning blue

I've topped the wind-swept heights with easy grace

Where never lark, or ever eagle flew

And while with silent lifting mind I trod

The high untrespassed sanctity of space

Put out my hand, and touched the face of God.

The young man who penned that wonderful description of the thrill of flight did not survive. He was lost in battle a few short months later.

It occurs to me that I give too much space to poetry on these pages and perhaps I should be fitted with a word governor. But please do not let my enthusiasm suggest that we are a solemn lot, preoccupied with the fine detail of such writing as this. We listen, we laugh and sometimes are moved close to tears.

Typical of this approach was the recent proposal that we change the club's title from the rather solemn sounding Poetry Club to The Nearly Dead Poets Society. That was agreed unanimously.

CCTV to protect threatened falcons



Following the deliberate killing of the nesting pair of peregrine falcons in May last year, the Shropshire Peregrine Group, RSPB and West Mercia Police have worked together in order to bring in heightened security measures to assist in the protection of these rare falcons.

The area where the birds nest has been patrolled by local volunteers and Ludlow Safer Neighbourhood Team but unfortunately no less than eight birds have been killed from poisoning since 2010 which amounts to a quarter of Shropshire's current breeding population being lost in such terrible circumstances.

Following an appeal for information, a number of reports were received in confidence identifying local individuals who were suspected of being involved in these attacks against the falcons and work will be carried out in order to observe local areas and individuals in order to gather more intelligence on this matter.

Peregrines have been sighted in the area of Clee Hill in recent weeks and are expected to nest in the area once more in the New Year. Both the police and The Peregrine Group are fully aware of the threats being made towards the falcons therefore security measures have been put in place to aid in protecting them. Surveillance cameras have now been installed that cover the nest site from a number of different angles and operate on a 24 hour basis. The footage will be reviewed by The Peregrine Group on a regular basis and anything of evidential value will be passed on to the police for investigation. In addition, increased numbers of volunteers will be deployed in the area when the peregrines are expected to nest again in early 2018.

With these security methods that have been put in place, we hope that this will deter any further harm being caused to the birds and West Mercia Police ask for anyone with information to come forward and report it confidentially either through 101 Crimestoppers or alternatively you can email the local policing team on ludlow.snt@westmercia.pnn.police.uk.

Like buses, you hear nothing of transport reviews and then two come along at once. In the last few weeks, Cleobury Town Council have been invited to contribute to 'Connecting People with Places – A Practical Vision for Travel in Shropshire' and 'The future of rural bus services in Shropshire'. They have responded to both in quite strong terms, pointing out the inadequacy of the current provision for this area. We await the results with interest...

No sooner had the ink dried on last month's column when news came in of yet another major fuel leak, this time in Bewdley. Apparently it was the same vehicle that had shut down much of Kiddy three days before and was said to have been fitted with a new fuel tank. This time the cause was claimed to be the driver going over speed humps too quickly and he was sacked (probably the first time problems have been caused by a Diamond bus going too fast!). Still, it made the front page of the 'Shuttle' with a photo showing local residents mopping up the spillage using anything to hand including incontinence pads... Thinking about it, these could be a useful product to carry on the buses as passengers may rightly feel a little 'nervous' when contemplating their trip with Diamond.

More complaints in the 'Shuttle' about the recently reprieved No 1 service with regular breakdowns and no shows. This is not restricted to that service as one 2L was diverted up the Bewdley bypass due to roadworks and broke down. A relief vehicle was sent and that broke down as well. They were finally picked up by yet another vehicle driven by an Inspector as they had run out of drivers. You couldn't make it up.... On another occasion, the engine of a 2L from Ludlow kept stopping as it came over the hill and one elderly lady, fed up with the delays, asked the driver if Diamond had considered installing a coffee machine and a toilet... Apparently, as part of the Government's plan to get rid of old polluting diesel cars, owners are to be offered the option of either a scrappage payment to enable them to buy a cleaner vehicle or a bus pass... 

I'm writing this article on The Snowy Day. It remains to be seen whether there are lots more snowy days before publication.

Some thinning has been going on in the forest belonging to the Guild of St. George at Ruskin Land. Stacks of oak are accumulating in the loading area down the hill from Uncllys Farm and being taken away periodically by timber lorries, sadly mainly for use as firewood because of its poor quality. The objective of management is to establish a regular thinning regime so that the timber grows more strongly and the woodland becomes lighter and richer in species. Between the farm and the cattle grid on Tanners Hill the thinned woodland will be fenced so that it can be grazed by cattle, producing a 'wood pasture'- a habitat which will form a natural link between the orchards of Bowcastle and Uncllys and in which we hope that the rare Lesser Spotted Woodpecker will thrive.

It may be, though, that the success of this lovely bird may be beyond our local help: 'The Nature of Wyre' quotes a study which suggests that climate change may be responsible for a lack of invertebrates in the tree canopy at the right time to coincide with the hatching of young. If you listen very carefully on your forest walks this month (and are very lucky) you may hear woodpeckers drumming on resounding branches as they begin to attract mates and demarcate their territories. The Lesser Spotted is said to drum more rapidly and produce a sound rather like a ruler being twanged on a table (do schoolchildren still do that?).

On a much smaller scale, the length of hedge which we planted at the farm soon after we moved there was needing some attention and was deemed ideal to be used for a hedgelaying course. Under the skilful hand of Wade Muggleton and the quick-learning Wyre Community Land Trust volunteers it took only a day for the hedge to be trimmed, cut, staked and laid in traditional style. It looks very fine and so do they! If you would like to join them for countryside work parties and learn new skills, contact the Trust volunteer@wyreclt.org.uk. The hedge should now thicken up to form a stock-proof barrier. With its variety of nut- and berry-bearing trees and shrubs (hawthorn, hazel, elder, dogwood, rose and field maple) it will be a food source for many kinds of wildlife and the blossom will provide nectar in the spring.

ANOTHER MUSICAL EVENING AT CLOWS TOP VICTORY HALL

It's good to hear that the popular Shindig events are back at Clows Top Victory Hall, starting the 2018 season with a visit from the Carrivick Sisters, twins Laura and Charlotte. They're from South Devon and present their own compositions based on local folk tales and traditional songs. They started out as professionals in 2007 and in 2010 were finalists in the BBC Radio 2 Young Folk Awards.

With tickets at £10, this promises to be a lively evening of bluegrass folk presented on a wide range of instruments.

CLEOBURY PATIENTS' VOICE

As I write, the celebrations of a birth in a manger for want of a bed, are approaching their annual climax. How ironic that Shropshire's health authority has just announced the permanent closure of the midwife-led delivery units at Bridgnorth and Ludlow Hospitals. With Shrewsbury's delivery unit currently closed for at least a month because of snow damage, it's now a choice between a home birth or a journey to Telford Hospital for Shropshire's mothers-to-be.

Following the 'temporary' closure of these units earlier in 2017, before the near-paralysis of the pre-Christmas snow, four local mothers had given birth without midwife support in recent months because it can take up to two hours for a midwife to reach a woman in labour. Long-term understaffing by a cash-strapped local health system has generated this situation, yet rather than transfer to Telford's short-staffed Obstetric Unit a significant number of the midwives from Bridgnorth and Ludlow have understandably resigned instead.

For low-risk pregnancies (typically 45% of all cases), a study led by Oxford University found that midwife-led units were just as safe for babies as consultant-led obstetric units, and were better for the mothers themselves. They were also significantly cheaper, and National Institute for Care and Health Excellence guidance now recommends that more women should be encouraged to give birth at midwife-led units. The existence of successful rural midwife-led units placed Shropshire in a great position to lead the way in national policy; instead, it has decided to squander this advantage.

In defending the closure decision, one local councillor has started to intone a new mantra: "If you choose to live in the countryside, you can't expect to have the services". When I last looked, the NHS was still a universal service, as intended by its founders, and not a postcode lottery: if any locals are paying lower rates of tax and National Insurance than people in other parts of the country, I'm sure many of us would like to hear about it. Not all who live here 'chose' to do so, least of all children, and encouraging us to see ourselves as second-class citizens is shameful.

CPV meets at the Medical Centre every third Monday of the month at 6:30pm. The meeting on January 15th will be our Annual General Meeting, at which officers will be elected for the coming year. The objective of the group is to promote positive patient involvement in monitoring, communications improving about, developing our local health and social care services. 

Number 30 High Street was vacant, there were customers waiting and her long established physiotherapist colleague Jill Sharp was looking to develop her own business as an alternative to her successful career working in the NHS. Kim Stanley Health and Beauty was back in business.

"We came in on a shoestring," says Kim. "I gradually ploughed money back into the business when I could and it grew organically. When Kelly Allen came on board I had a great team, a great landlord who supported the business and we really have a lot to offer. We open six days and offer three late evenings."

"Kelly has five years experience, one of those as a beauty therapist on one of the large cruise ships. What skills does she bring to the operation? Absolutely everything. She's a very valued addition to the team."

Jill Sharp has quit her NHS work and works three days a week in the salon, the other two days given to home calls. She's a chartered physiotherapist whose background includes time as a clinical educator for Birmingham University students. She is also a pain relief acupunturist with the capacity to help with pain management. Her latest qualification is in another method using a gentle touch - the Emmett Technique. to anyone who has experienced Jill's gentle touch and they'll tell you how she has a magic touch that brings relief from pain with only a slight fingertip pressure.

Kim's own range of treatments ranges from waxing through electrolysis, eye care, facials, body massage by Spa Find, hot stone or bamboo, aromatherapy, manicure and pedicure, polish to non-surgical facelift. All in the welcoming atmosphere of one of the smartest places in the town.

The new interior was designed by Paul, after a long discussion about the best way to make their customers feel welcome and comfortable. It must be said that the smiles help that process no end.

It's taken a year to do the job, Kim and Paul working at weekends and using outside contractors only when there was a job they couldn't do well. "If we'd closed the shop it would have taken about six weeks," she explains. But six weeks with not one customer looked after is not a good business plan, so they rolled up their sleeves and got on with the job.

"The object was to have more space for people to sit down. We had the new seats to measure by Wenlock Upholstery, with the seat height comfortable for people with back issues." Gone are the display cabinets, replaced by wall shelves; the storage unit is beneath the counter, out of sight. Beyond the counter is the manicure unit.

Curves are dominant through the scheme, with a hint of more to see when you move on into the treatment area. Lighting is carefully executed, clear enough to see, gentle enough to relax you. The theme is "Make Some Space Just For You" and the welcoming atmosphere combined with comfortable seating backs up the message. For a DIY job, quite amazing.

This year will be a busy one for these pieces as it is the anniversary of the last full year of the Great War.

Rather than write about one aspect for this issue I have picked two different threads relating to the conflict, one concerning an incident at home and one offering a small insight into serving in the trenches in Belgium. The only connection being a Scottish one. I hope this piece is of interest.

The Battle that Never Was

Rosyth on the Firth of Forth has been and still is a major Naval base. On the night of 31st January 1918 a large fleet left Rosyth to join Operation E.C.1 in Orkney, which was to happen the following day. The Entire Grand Fleet was taking part and the forty vessels that left were only a small part of it.

Arranged in their squadrons and groups there were three battleships, four battle cruisers, two cruisers, destroyer escorts and two flotillas of K class submarines, each led by a cruiser. It's interesting to note that compared with the size of the fleet today even this small part of the Grand Fleet was huge in comparison.

They left Rosyth and steamed in one line nearly 30 miles long with the submarines on the surface and all the battleships at the rear. As a German submarine was suspected in the area, each vessel showed only a dim stern light and all maintained radio silence.

At the mouth of the Firth of Forth is the Isle of May. As they passed the "May", as it is known locally, they adjusted course and increased speed to 20 knots.

As one of the submarine flotillas passed the island a pair of lights were seen approaching and they altered course but submarine K14's helm jammed, throwing her out of line and she turned on the navigation lights, freeing the helm at the same time and attempting a return to the line. The following vessel due to

the heavy mist failed to stop and hit K14, crippling her. About fifteen minutes later the lead vessel in the following group ploughed through the wreckage and disabled a second submarine. Within the next hour further collisions took place resulting in the loss of 104 sailors two submarines plus damage to a further four submarines and the cruiser 'Fearless'.

Black humour resulted in the incident being known as the "Battle of May Island" even though the enemy caused no loss of life. Being a fishing community this part of Scotland is known for its wry sense of humour and if you are familiar with the area, as the writer happily is, it comes as no surprise.

The investigation and courts martial were kept very quiet with much of the information not released until the 1990s. In 2002 a cairn was erected in the town of Anstruther opposite the Island of May to honour those lost. If you visit, find the cairn and also please enjoy the best fish and chips in the world!

Extracts from a diary kept by Private James Beatson 9th Royal Scots Regiment

I felt it fitting to use these words to stand for all those who kept notes diaries and journals during their service. They are not passed on to illustrate any point or enlighten about specific events. James was however eloquent in his recording and I hope they throw some light on events which are hard for us to comprehend at this distance. *PF*

25th January 1915

Left Edinburgh two nights ago. The less I say of how I felt the better. I propose keeping a rough record of future days so that when I return (May God grant it), I may faithfully recount them.

15th March 1915

We can rough it hard when needed but in the present circumstances a little more grub would leave us less hungry and these damned Belgians fleece us at every opportunity.

23rd March 1915

Last night, while a few of us were carrying rations to the reserve trenches, young Bennet fell, hit in the forehead, two paces in front of me. Just a flutter and another gone west. I'm in easy times with death but its damnable to be hit in the dark by a sniping cur. God pity us.

8thApril 1915

Oh, for a ten minutes in front of the fire at home with a wash up in warm water and able to stand without bringing down an avalanche of dirt all over you and your kit. Tea and dirt taste rotten.

13th April 1915

In a communication trench, I crept through the skeleton of a Frenchman lying beneath the water, the white bones sticking out of his tunic, poor chap. Scots, French, Germans, Austrians, Russians and the rest return to Mother Earth groaning and cursing.

Beatson found a magazine containing diary extracts from a Prussian soldier known as Heinrich. The extracts are too long to reproduce here but our soldier found a bond with his counter part so here is the very last reference to Heinrich in the diary.

22nd August 1915

A remark that the food is a lot better lately. And the diary ends. Are you dead Heinrich? I know you would die bravely and quietly. Fate has labelled you Prussian and me British, but I would do a long pilgrimage to lay flowers on the grave that holds your body.

7th December 1915 (last entry)

The situation here is a bit peculiar, the line is broken by the river Somme and its marshesthe space between the broken ends of the two lines.

James was killed in the Battle of the Somme on 23rd July 1916.


