

LACON CHILDE PROJECT AT HISTORIC HOPE BAGOT

Students from Lacon Childe School have completed a 12 week project recording ancient gravestones in Hope Bagot churchyard. They worked with Richard Morley of South Shropshire Youth Project, in partnership with Craven Arms based charity Caring For God's Acre and also Historic Graves. As well as learning about the landscape, they local did practical conservation work and recorded 125 ancient gravestones that will be added to the Historic Graves database.

The course ended with an Open Day, when students took visitors on a tour of the very hilly churchyard, Danny Phillips and Max Woodall explaining in detail the many historic features. The 2,000 year old yew tree is a piece of history in its own right, and below it is a well that is claimed to have provided water for some 10,000 years.

The church is the right size for a small rural community, compact. At the base of one corner is an old millstone as part of the structure, a good example of using whatever material you have to hand. My guide for this mini tour was Ed Sharrad, another well versed student who knew his stuff.

The churchyard itself is a rare gem, Susan Cooper of Caring for God's Acre explaining that the wild meadow grass there includes 80 different grass and flower species. She also told how such areas are being lost: 97 percent of such grassland gone, which makes this a very special place indeed. Hope Bagot is well worth a visit.

THE READING GROUP

The group met on a fine summer's evening in the mood to discuss what some have described as a "holiday read" - 'The Island' by Victoria Hislop.

Although the setting is the isle of Crete, it is in fact a realistic account of how the Cretans coped with infectious disease of leprosy. And the island in the title is the leper colony of Spinalonga. A well researched book which taught us all a lot about this disfiguring and often fatal disease. Victoria's writing style wasn't to everybody's liking, but all agreed it well worth reading. We'd recommend it. This month we have 'The Piano Tuner' by Daniel Mason to read and we meet in the Library on July 20th to swap views. Graham Simpson



AUTHOR SEEKING LOCAL KNOWLEDGE

I am writing a book on the history of City of Coventry School (now the Pioneer Centre), at Cleobury Mortimer and my notes have reached 1970. A tragic accident occurred in or near Kinlet village on 9th July 1970. It resulted in the death of Susan Rowland, the eldest daughter of Mr Rowland who was the headmaster of City of Coventry School in the early 1960's. It was the culmination of a double tragedy as Mr Rowland died in an accident on the M6 motorway in 1963.

The Rowland family lived in the area for many years and their graves are in Neen savage Churchyard; I am trying to find out more about the accident involving Susan. I understand from historical press reports that another car was involved and the driver was a Patricia Jones of Sherrall House, Kinlet. Mrs Jones' daughter Denise Jones was also in the car and according to reports survived the accident. I think, although this needs confirmation, that Mrs Jones was emerging from her driveway onto the main road and was struck by Susan Rowland's car, resulting in the deaths of both women.

The details I have are sketchy as the Kidderminster paper does not go into much detail about circumstances of the accident. Ι am wondering whether anybody who lives in the area remembers the details and if so could they contact me, so that I can describe the events more fully in my book. I cannot find any present day references to Sherrall House so I am wondering if the name of the property has been changed.



CLEOBURY'S SWIFTS

One of the few sorrows my wife and I were having for recently leaving East Kent to live in Cleobury is that we would miss the swirl and screech of swifts.

We had a house in the newly converted Royal Marines School of Music in Walmer in 2000. The buildings were tall with big roof overhangs and lots of ideal nest holes for this wonderful bird. In ten years numbers dropped dramatically from around 20 pairs to only three in 2014. This was mainly due to overzealous house decorators filling soffit holes and to owners not being aware of the danger to swifts.

Last year we started a study group to try and retain our small swift population. We recorded sites, put up nesting boxes and kept the ex barrack community informed. This year I am told there are six nesting pairs and a community much more aware of this fascinating bird. Let us hope we have arrested the decline and the swift population will increase.

In May this year, we were delighted to find that Cleobury has its own swift colony which seems to be thriving and busy. Though difficult to count I believe there are over 25 pairs of swift circling the sky over Cleobury. Swift by name and certainly swift by nature, they spend all of their time on the wing except to lay eggs and brood their young. Swifts nest

here from May to July, returning to Africa for the rest of the year. The juveniles may not be mature the following year but return here with the colony. This means that many spend the whole of the first two years of their life without landing at all. They delight us with a short play period of chase and scream before roosting at around 8000 feet each night. They even mate midair which rather trumps the human "mile high club".

Given our experience in Walmer I hope that Cleobury can retain its swifts through information, interest and appreciation.

The Dangers and Prevention of Leptospirosis



Leptospirosis is a widespread bacterial disease that affects dogs, rodents and many other species. It's transmitted through contact of urine from infected animals, either directly or indirectly from a contaminated environment. Common sources include slow moving or still water, such as streams or lakes contaminated with the urine of infected rodents.

In truth any dog which is exercised outdoors may be at risk of contracting the bacterial disease.

In its early stages it is often difficult to diagnose in dogs. If left untreated it can progress to potentially fatal liver or kidney failure. Symptoms usually include a sudden fever, soreness, lethargy, vomiting red speckled gums diarrhoea, jaundicing of the skin.

Leptospirosis is also a 'zoonotic 'disease, which means it can infect humans and is equally serious in its risk. In humans the disease is known as 'Weils disease'. It is therefore very important to prevent your dog from becoming infected and shedding bacteria in its urine to minimise any risk to humans.

The best way to protect your dog from Leptospirosis is to vaccinate. Vaccines against Leptospirosis provide immunity for one year, but that immunity is likely to wane thereafter. The vaccines are typically administered alongside other routine vaccinations as part of a regular booster regime.

Leptospirosis vaccines have been available for over five decades. All of them targeting the two most common forms of the bacterium.

However in recent years, across the UK, Europe and the USA, new strains of Leptospirosis have emerged and in many cases are more prevalent than the original forms. For this reason experts recommended the use of newer vaccines which target four strains of the disease rather that the traditional two, providing better protection for your pet and family.

To ensure the best possible care for your animals make sure to ask your vet for the L4 Vaccination Protocol.

Letter from Westminster - Philip Dunne MP

While knocking on doors across the Ludlow Constituency before the General Election, ensuring quality healthcare in Shropshire was a key concern for many people. Since being reelected I have focussed on health issues in the constituency, meeting those with responsibility for healthcare in Shropshire: from Secretary of State Jeremy Hunt; chief executives of the NHS Trusts running all aspects of health; to individual GPs, to discuss issues affecting the Ludlow Constituency. This included focus on my campaign to upgrade community hospitals in South Shropshire to Urgent Care Centres as part of the ongoing Future Fit consultation.

Local people have been pleased with the new Government's commitment to provide further funding for the NHS, but many also raised concerns about how budgets are spent and urged me to ensure this is done as effectively as possible.

We have committed to increasing NHS funding nationally by £8 billion, to meet recommendations of Chief Executive of NHS England, Simon Stevens. The Department of Health and NHS England are currently working out the details of how this will be provided, so it is sensible for the NHS in Shropshire to wait to see how this might impact the affordability of its Future proposals before Fit its public consultation on the options for A&E provision.

This means the consultation will begin later this summer or in early autumn, and offer more time to take into account the additional funding, but also the views of the various stakeholders in Shropshire NHS, including local residents. But it is not enough just to increase health spending. Any government has a responsibility to ensure that taxpayers' funds are spent as effectively as possible. So I am pleased the Health Secretary has acted swiftly to tackle the increased use of agency staff being hired within NHS Trusts on rates far higher than their counterparts.

The NHS needs to reduce its dependency on temporary staff, not least to encourage more stable staffing teams. Staff that work better together, on more stable rotas, without incurring extortionate costs, will help deliver better care for people in Shropshire. Further controls are also being introduced within the NHS to restrict the use of management consultants.

Shropshire health services are not immune to such pressures - there was an understandable outcry at the revelation of senior staff at SaTH being rehired on consultancy rates **j**ust a day after retiring to secure pension benefits.

I am looking forward to meeting SaTH's new CEO who starts later this month, to reinforce to him the need to maintain public confidence at a time when the future of A&E provision in the county is being considered. People in Shropshire deserve to know their money is being spent effectively to deliver a truly world class health service, on the path towards seven days a week access by 2020.

I will continue to play my part in ensuring any additional funding is used as effectively as possible to procure safe, sustainable, efficient and accessible health services for people in all parts of Shropshire, fit for the future.

On The Market - Oyasin Natural Skincare

Oyasin is an ancient native American word, conveying the belief that all living things are related. An obvious title to use when Julia Kirkpatrick set out to develop a range of natural skincare products. She'd had skin problems with less pure treatments and realised the answer was careful selection of ingredients: the basic thought about some of the things people were putting on their skin - we can easily sensitise our skin with the toxins we have been using over the years."

She found the right source in Aromantic of Norway, whose ingredients are all ethically sourced. They have plant derived ingredients she can use as stabilising, or preservatives that are commonly man-made in non-natural skincare ranges. In 2013 she launched her initial range of skin care products, selling at local markets and supports fairs. She now Ludlow and Cleobury markets on a regular basis, where she can build a relationship with regular customers.

This is an industry that is very carefully controlled. Julia works out the formula for each product and sends a sample to a cosmetic safety assessment chemist for approval. She then sends it to a microbiologist for further tests and when they've been passed she enters it in the Euro Cosmetic Product Notification Portal. All this for a range produced at home in batches of one litre at a time.

She has recently launched her Spa Range, covering needs

as diverse as massage oil, clay face mask, foot balm and eye serum. And that's only a small selection.

She has one local health spa using her products, with good feedback. Another company has approached her - it's quite a surprise to learn how many people visit market stalls to see what the small producer like her has to offer - and there are talks in progress. And she's talking to a digital marketing company about reaching a wider public without expense travel of and exhibitions. That's the eternal problem for a small business how to reach more people with a limit on your time and a home to run. Julia looks after her daughter, runs the home, does a part time job and works building the Oyasin skincare business..

She is unlikely to become another Elizabeth Arden - far too human - but she believes strongly in what she does. That's the battle half won.





I'm pleased to report that up to the time of writing, June 18th, it's been another quiet month regarding crime in the area.

Just after 1:30pm on May 25th a property at Milson was burgled. Although entry was gained to the house by forcing the lock on the garage and then smashing a small window in order to reach and force the lock on a larger window, nothing was stolen. The alarm in the garage and another in the house is thought to have frightened off the offenders. On May 28th/29th at a business premises in Boraston Lane, Burford there was a burglary. Again, nothing was stolen after a failed attempt to enter the workshop. On May 29th/30th a parked on a driveway vehicle Doddington was broken into and a bicycle worth £2500 stolen from the boot. Between 5:00pm on June 5th and 9:00am the next morning a stone was thrown at a leaded window on St Mary's Church causing a small pane of glass to smash. Between 1:45pm and 3:25pm on June 9th a detached garage near to The Blount Arms was broken into; power tools and a bicycle worth £1500 in total were stolen. Between 4:00pm on June 10th and 1:00pm the next day a failed attempt was made to break into a shed at a farm in Rock. However,

although entry was gained to a second shed nothing was stolen.

I've probably mentioned this before but a reminder to all Land Rover Defender owners to be aware of thefts of these vehicles might be worth repeating. These vehicles have been prime targets for thieves for several years because of their popularity and how easy it is to strip them down to sell as spare parts, or to ship them abroad.

There are measures that owners are advised to take to help deter thieves. These include always locking the unattended vehicle, always using the integral steering lock and always using other security equipment such as a heavy duty pedal lock. Fitting a tracker system is a useful option as is marking parts with forensic security liquid such as Smartwater. Never be complacent when leaving the vehicle unattended. Recently in our Defender was stolen overnight from a driveway in Clee Hill, and for two years running a Defender was stolen from the car parking area of Tenbury Agricultural Show. It's a real pain having to constantly be mindful of criminal activity of all sorts, but not as painful as having something you value highly stolen!

THE RECYCLING CENTRE The Parish Council issued the following statement on June 22nd:

A very positive meeting took place at Lacon Childe School on Friday 12th June to discuss the concerns of the school over the recycling bins. Representatives from Veolia, Shropshire Council, Parish Council, Lacon Childe and the Sports & Social Club all agreed that the recycling facilities are a real community asset but the area does need looking after better. The bins have been located there for ease of use by the community without any formal agreement and this has led to additional being placed without consideration for the school. Linda Iles July In The Wyre Forest





Do you think of Wyre as 'My forest'? There's quite a lot of people who do, and not just the locals. It's a good thing, because it means there are plenty of people who care passionately about it and will fight to take care of it. We don't know what's on the cards for the 'National Forest' under the new government but you can be sure that the friends of the forest will be rooting for it. (I don't usually use that expression but it seems apt).

While some visit the forest on a regular basis, others are just glad it's there, and others haven't discovered it yet! It's the last group who can really benefit from the exhibition in the Saw Yard of Bewdley Museum all through the school holidays , from July 25th to September 6th. Yes, we're bringing the forest to you!

There will be information about access to the woods and what you can expect to find there in terms of wildlife, archaeology, history, landscapes and recreational facilities. There will be quizzes, children's activities and some weird and fascinating objects for you to look at. There will be a tree where you can add a note of your feelings about the forest (poems welcome!) and there will be suggestions for

how to get involved in wildlife and volunteer groups.

Best of all is a programme of guided walks during the same period. Here is a selection:

A look at the archaeology of Ribbesford and the Snuffmill, starting from Bewdley Museum and led by Sue Duffield (0845 603 5699) on August 6th

'Wyre Forest and its management' – an inside look at the wildlife, the trees and the future starting from the Forestry Commission's centre and led by Liz Bunney (0300 067 4855) on August 13th

A cross-forest walk from Bewdley to Cleobury on August 29th. After meeting at Cleobury Golf Club a coach will take participants into Bewdley and they will return on foot. Led by Susan Sharp, walks@eaglelane.co.uk

Not to mention the Disabled Ramblers, butterflies, dusk walk, orchards, Ruskin and the Cleobury Food and Ale Trail! You'll need the Wyre Forest Landscape Partnership's walks leaflet (available at Bewdley Museum TIC and exhibition, Cleobury and Bewdley libraries, Cleobury TIC, the Forest Café and SVR stations) or website www.wflp.org.uk to get full details and book your places on these wonderfully varied walks.

And for details of a 'Forest Feast' on 4th September ring Georgina Coen on 01299 822987. Meanwhile, here's the story behind this month's photo. My husband, John, met keen bird spotter Vince Garvey aiming his lens at the old cherry orchard along the lane, hoping to catch sight of the lesser spotted woodpecker. In that he was unsuccessful, but took this beautiful photo of a wood warbler. If you search the internet for 'wood warbler' you'll find the BBC's 'Tweet of the day' from May 2013. It's worth it for the song alone, described as resembling 'a spinning coin on a marble slab'. Their domed nests are built in hollows in the ground, making them susceptible to predation and disturbance (dog walkers please note), and though they will still be breeding at the beginning of the month they will soon be preparing to migrate back to Africa.

ON THE BUSES The saga continues.....

A busy month. The timetable changed once more on May 31st as little notice consultation as usual (i.e. none). The route now covers even more of North Worcestershire with the result that the journey from Cleobury to the centre of Kiddy now takes a staggering 62 minutes to cover about 13 A top class marathon runner could do this distance in the same time. The cumulative result of the timetable changes over the last two years means that if you do a return journey to Kiddy, you have lost an extra hour from your day. As usual, as I write this on June 22nd, the times on the bus stops have still not been officially changed (we have stuck copies of the latest times on them) and yet another trip to the Diamond depot in Kiddy has failed to find any timetables. 'With the printers' apparently.....Thanks Cleobury Country funding the copying, the latest timetables are available at the Market Hall and Cleobury Country Centre/ Library. The good news is that it appears the 2L service is to be re-tendered and that Shropshire Council have made representations regarding the convoluted route so Diamond may get their wish to be rid of us (and vice versa).

The subject of the buses is to be discussed at the next LJC (Local Joint Committee) meeting to be held in Cleobury Market Hall on Tuesday July 28th at 7.00pm. I am told that a representative of Shropshire Council is being invited and I will submit a list of questions before then for them to answer.

Please come to this meeting if you can make it, if only to share with Shropshire Council your views on the current set up (you may be searched for weapons on your arrival...) I have written to the Transport Commissioner and the Council with my thoughts and await a response.

On more mundane matters, getting on a 2L bus can still be an adventure. There should be a photo here somewhere showing one bus 'grounded' after trying to turn round at the Coreley junction for reasons unknown (but probably a breakdown)

At one point several Diamond buses were seen recovered on low loaders and I wondering whether wouldn't be simpler just to put them on these in the first place and save time. Another 2L was delayed while five or six drivers and two buses were tried until a suitable combination was found to operate the service. One driver was even seen thumping the bus in frustration so not much job satisfaction there...

On the same day, the bus to Ludlow got as far as Bewdley before running out of fuel and yet another has been spotted burned out at the bottom of the Bewdley bypass, not to mention various sightings of broken 2L's awaiting rescue. Looks like you might need a fire extinguisher as well as a Red Cross food parcel before boarding. Passengers on the 9.14 (was 9.19) are still being charged £1 and this is now being levied on passengers boarding at Far Forest due to the earlier running time. Mind you, it didn't make much difference last week as the service was late on most days and didn't arrive until after 9.30. There has also been a letter in the Kiddy Shuttle about a 92 year old lady who had to wait 90 minutes for a Diamond bus on the Number 7 service in Kiddy so it's not just the 2L...

Hope to see as many as possible at the meeting on July 28th. Steve Todd

A MAN KEEN TO WORK



Darrell: "I can't stand having a day off!"

Darrell Painter had served 18 years in the Army when the axe fell and he was redundant. He had risen through the ranks to become an Acting Colour Sergeant and was responsible for a lot of training work. The sort of man you'd want on your

side, but still redundant. The family moved back to the Midlands, where he retrained as a Close Protection Officer and for other guarding work, but got turned down at every job application because he had no civilian experience.

So he turned to decorating, work he'd done with his dad's firm since the age of 14, where he learned every aspect of the trade. He put flyers out in the area and he took an advert in the Clarion. The result was a busy three months but not enough to support his family in the long term; a common story with people turning to self employment.

So he did what a lot of people in country areas do: he took on another job, in this case surface preparation for the laying of railway tracks. It brings in a regular wage and he makes up any shortfall with decorating. "Sometimes I get home from the railway job at six, get showered and changed and go out for a few hours on decorating work."

He has a straightforward way of charging. He looks at what has to be done, explains how he can do it economically and how long it will take, and that's the price. The estimate of time charged is one area where he has surprised some customers, in one instance saying the job would be done in five days when another contractor quoted ten. He got the job done and finished it right on time. When you're hiring a tradesman on a daily rate, that could make a big difference.

He knows why he does't take too long: "I start at eight, get there five minutes before, then normally don't stop all day. If I'm hungry, I'll eat as I go along."He's a driven man, driving towards success.

IN BUSINESS: James Smith, Osteopath

It's been a long journey for James Smith to become an osteopath. Five years of training, with every other weekend devoted from 9.00 to 5.00 through Saturday and Sunday. Plus spending 1,000 hours working in a clinic with a tutor watching and coaching him. And then the final exams.

He is now entitled to call himself an osteopath and to share Sue Brown's Cleobury Chiropractic premises in the High Street. He has been able to offer sports injury treatment there in the past year, but is now a fully qualified and registered professional osteopath.

Moving from Bewdley into Cleobury 12 years ago, he was production working in management at Brinton's Carpets.
