



THE CREATIVE WRITING GROUP

"Reflection" singular or plural was the subject testing a modest number at our May meeting. Sylvia recalled grandparents and parents with

contrasting characters, the former loving and cheerful, her father never seeming to smile, a reflection of four years as a prisoner of the Japanese during the 1939-45 World War.

Marian wrote about the lost relatives whose memorials mark so many graveyards and the number of lives lost to the folly of war. The editor contrasted two generations in the pub, arguing over the price of beer reflecting how the world has changed. The two ladies then exchanged stories of the last great war and the lack of proper sweets. Who remembers Cadbury's misshapes that lacked beauty but not flavour?

We meet again at 6.30 on Monday June 12th at 6.30 in the library to explore the matter of 'Hands'. All scribes will be made welcome.

THE BREAKFAST CLUB

For the first time for a year or two, the Club met at the Talbot Hotel on 9 May, when about 25 members gathered to hear Sue Brown ask 'Are You Sitting Comfortably?' Sue is well-known in the town as a chiropractor (and indeed some of the members are customers of hers) who has been established in our High Street for some years.

There was a time when chiropractic was completely unregulated, and anyone could set up as a chiropractor without any training, qualifications, or regulation. Since 1994, however, regulation and oversight has been provided by the General Chiropractic Council and, since

2000, it has been illegal for any unregistered person to describe themselves as a chiropractor.

In brief, Chiropractors diagnose and treat muscularskeletal disorders, which arise from accidents, or from bad habits of posture. These can be unbalanced loadings on the body (and particularly on the spine) from, say, always carrying heavy bags or backpacks hooked over one shoulder, and always the same shoulder. Prolonged slouching over a computer or X-Box can have deleterious results too, and Sue showed us some X-Ray photos of the unhealthy distortions of the spine which can ensue from these - and from bad driving positions.

Sue then gave a demonstration of the way in which we should get up from a chair, keeping one's head vertically above one's feet, and NOT leaning forwards.

Over half of Sue's patients report lower back pain, and recent statistics suggest that there are some 30 million cases of lower back pain in UK each year, costing the NHS well over £1 million each day, and the UK economy about £40 million each day. Not surprisingly, workers in the construction industry are particularly prone to lower back pain, but it can affect anyone. If we take Sue's good advice to heart, we'll have a good chance of not adding to these worrying statistics.

The next meeting of the club will be held on 13 June at the Golf Club, when Eddie Humphries will be speaking about 'The Wind Beneath My Wings'.

FAREWELL MULLERS

Mullers came to England in 1932 and with the outbreak of the 1939-45 Second World War moved on to Cleobury early in 1940. That was to a government built factory that was far away from the threat of German bombs in its old North London base at Park Royal. Popular belief was that the company chose Cleobury because the managing director liked the leaning church spire that reminded him of a similar tower at the company's home base in Soleure

So urgent was the need for the engineering parts the Swiss owned company produced that machines were installed in High Street houses and the Alton Glasshouses factory in Bewdley. We were at war and production was vital.

The company recruited and trained men and women and an apprenticeship school soon followed. They built houses at Curdale Close and bought vacant houses to accommodate staff. It didn't take long for the place to employ about 350 people, which was an enormous change for a small rural community.

Mullers had grown as the producer of high quality parts for the Swiss clock and watch

industry. Ideal people to gain Ministry of Defence contracts for aircraft and armaments parts and in the early years of peace the place grew until about 500 people were employed. A sports field was developed and a Sports and Social Club catered for football, tennis, bowls, cricket, motoring, amateur dramatics, dancing and photography. It produced 'The Sphinx', its own magazine named after the Muller company logo. There was a licensed club based at Spregdon House in the High Street. As you can imagine, this was a buoyant time for the town, with so much well paid employment.

The 60s and 70s brought a great deal of change in industry; anyone who worked in Kidderminster will know about that. Mullers faced stiff competition abroad and put in computerised control that saw the labour force reduced. In the 1980s a management buyout was agreed and Swiss control was handed over. The movement of production to other sites with a pool of engineering experience to recruit from made hard sense and in April this year the doors were closed on a piece of local history.

Stepping Out! Who's Walking, When and Where.

Has anyone else been struck by the abundance of wild flowers and blossom this Spring? Cowslips in particular have caught my eye along with daffodils, bluebells, wild garlic and wood anemone to name just a few. It's lovely to hear the buzz of the bees in the tree blossom.

Thirteen people joined the Country Walk on Sunday May 7th. It was supported by Wyre Forest SusFest, a festival with the brilliant theme of "Greener, Happier, Healthier". Starting at the Golf Club we followed CMFA walk No 23, The Three Coppices. An undulating route along woodland tracks, pastures and paths; after the heavy rain of Coronation Day we did have to avoid some muddy areas. At one point the route crossed the line of the Elan Valley Pipeline which carries drinking water from Wales to Birmingham. The weather was lovely and the bluebells were in full bloom.

Sunday 4th June is the next Country Walk. Starting outside St Mary's church at 10.00am. This is also the date of the full moon for June. Not

hard to guess why it's called the Strawberry Moon!

The second Walking for Health away day of 2023 is on June 14th when we will be going to Upper Arley. Meet at the Cleobury Sports Centre to leave at 10.00. Transport will be available. Or meet at Arley Car park at 10.15. The car park is opposite the village down the road from the Arley Railway Station. The walk will be on pavements, footpaths and fields, with a short incline to start. We will stop at the Arboretum tearoom for refreshments before walking down to the footbridge over the river to the car park.

Walking for Health on Wednesday 28th June will start outside the Market Hall at 10.00 with refreshments afterwards at the CoCo coffee morning.

In May the work party installed a kissing gate to replace a broken stile in Neen Savage. Two new volunteers joined the group and the extra spade power was very welcome. You may have seen on our Facebook page that Footpath Guardians are needed to look after footpaths in Cleobury Mortimer and

surrounding villages. Each guardian undertakes to look after a length of footpath on their own. It mainly involves clearing brambles, nettles or hedge growth at stiles and gates. This is usually only needed a couple of times a year and doesn't take very long. Tools can be provided if requested. Last month my neighbour told me she had heard a cuckoo so I hope that by the time you read this there will be several pairs up to their naughty tricks in this part of the forest.

Butterflies are not seen in droves any more, but we can celebrate every one which we do see. Even in a forest National Nature Reserve which has been managed deliberately to provide good habitat for 'woodland specialist' butterflies for over a decade they seem to be hanging on precariously. This month I hope to be able to watch a few Small Pearl-bordered Fritillaries, as well as their larger relatives who generally appear on the wing in May. The charity Butterfly Conservation recruits and trains volunteers to count the species they see on regular woodland walks so that there is a record of how well, or badly, each is faring. To quote the BC West Midlands' group magazine, 'The purpose of recording butterfly numbers...is to monitor population trends and to feed that information back into habitat management. There's little point in doing surveys unless the results are used to improve habitats and, conversely, there's little point in managing habitats unless the effects of the work are measured.'

At the farm we recently hosted a group of naturalists from Sandwell. They spent the day exploring the orchards and meadows but not venturing very far, focused as they were on the minutiae of the mosses in the farmyard, the invertebrates on the apple blossom and dead wood, the tiny fungi among the grasses and the remains of the cattle's hay. But they didn't fail to notice the splendour of the day or the joyful singing of the Garden Warbler as they sat to eat their sandwiches in the garden. Thank goodness we are a nation of amateur naturalists and conservation volunteers: people who can record what they see and help to care for it. This month we are hosting a 'Pollinators Day' at the farm to learn more about the fascinating creatures which perform such a vital role in the lifecycles of flowers, trees and crops and find out how our gardens can encourage them. I will also be going to a training day at Lower Smite Farm, the headquarters of Worcestershire Wildlife Trust, so that I can identify and record bumblebees in my area. Philip Dunne's Letter from Westminster

I am writing this article, with memories of last month's coronation of King Charles III and the subsequent bank holiday still fresh in my mind. The ceremony, steeped in the history of our nation, unfolded in Westminster Abbey, capturing the attention of tens of millions of people both in the United Kingdom and abroad. The constitutional monarchy, with the King at its helm, stands as a testament to the enduring traditions and values of our country.

King Charles III's ascension to the throne marked the culmination of the longest-ever apprenticeship for becoming our Head of State. At the age of 74 when most individuals are well into their retirement, he embarks on his reign, building an example of his mother the late Queen and his own experience as her heir for over 50 years.

One of his most effective contributions was his founding of the Prince's Trust in 1976. This charity helped over a million young people in their education, training, and securing employment. His commitment to this cause reflects his genuine concern for the wellbeing and future of younger generations.

While hundreds of thousands of the assembled crowd came out to cheer the King, there was also a very small protest from Republic, the group campaigning to abolish the monarchy and replace it with an elected head of state.

The street parties and gun salutes played their part, and members of the public including here in Shropshire, found idiosyncratic ways to celebrate. From plates piled high with cake to Coronation chicken and quiche, with miles of bunting decorating our shops and streets, across the bank holiday weekend more than 3,000 street parties took place in England alone. Twenty towns in Shropshire, including seven here in the South, put up commemorative plaques on public buildings. In so many ways, the Coronation showed just how important the monarchy remains.

Lisa Baldwin's Letter From America

Lisa's subject this month: Apologies

QUESTION:

Why is it that when I apologise it never quite gets accepted? I have been told more often than once that I do not seem sincere. What am I doing wrong?

ANSWER

The first part of a successful apology is to really listen to the other person without interrupting. We need to understand the impact our words and/or actions had upon another. The tendency is to begin to defend ourselves. We do this in a variety of different ways. One way is to say that we didn't mean to hurt them, and that our intentions were good. Regardless of our good intentions, the other person is hurt, and we need to listen to how they were impacted by us. Instead of moving toward defending ourselves with our good intentions, it can be helpful to say "Help me to understand how I impacted you." This type of open ended question allows the other to explain how they were hurt.

Another common error is to tell the other person that they are too sensitive and you were only joking. Do not minimise the importance of what they are telling you.

Also, turning the conversation to all the things that the other person has done to you, is never helpful. Stick to the issue at hand, and avoid making excuses. For example, if a friend is telling you that she is frustrated because you are late every time you have plans to meet, don't start listing reasons why you run late and how it is often someone else's fault that you get delayed.

If you are feeling overwhelmed in the moment by the other person's frustration with you, tell them that you want to consider what she is saying, and that you will get back to them. Thank them for taking the time to explain, and do be sure to follow through and get back to them.

Then take some time to reflect on the conversation. Do you need to behave differently in certain areas of the relationship? Do you need to be more considerate of their sensitiveness? How would you feel if the situation were reversed?

Perhaps you do not agree with their assessment of your interaction? If you believe that you owe them an apology, simply say. "I understand how I have hurt you, and I apologise. Here is what I am going to do to be better in the future." If you do not agree with the friend's view of the situation, tell them "I am sorry that we are misunderstanding one another, and I hope that we can have a continued discussion to consider how to move forward."

If you can do it sincerely, and the relationship is meaningful to you, tell them, and offer a suggestion for future contact. Perhaps something to do together that you both enjoy. But, don't force this, especially if the relationship is not an important friendship, and you just want to maintain a working harmony.

Some people find it helpful to pray for the person whether or not you have a close relationship with them in the future. You are then left with the knowledge that you have concluded on a positive, giving basis.



'CARTHORSE TO CONCORDE'

Ann and Alf Jenkins' Masterwork

This is a quite phenomenal piece of research and writing. Over 500 pages, turning the scales at an Imperial three pounds and a bit and offering photos from early black and white images to colour shots dating from 2022. If you want a formal history this is not for you, but if you want the recollections of local people in this area, then sit back, have a fresh pot of tea nearby, and enjoy a series of steps back in time. The title is clever, as the memories cover from days of riding in horse drawn carts to the sight and sound of the most graceful passenger plane ever.

An early pleasant surprise for me was reading next door neighbour Des Gwilliam's story, from his birth at Crumps Brook in 1939, working down the pit at Highley and building a successful selling career as a self employed agent. Along the way he played in local bands and played tricks on the likes of ex Ludlow town crier Barry McQueen. He still laughs a lot talking about his memories.

Lionel Preece of Coreley tells a good tale. Like using a big hay knife at the age of just eight and collecting empty bottles from the dump - no rubbish collection then -and adding whatever tops would fit and taking them to the Colliers Arms to be paid three pence each. Or the M&M school bus stopping under apple or damson trees for the kids to pick their choice. Fresh fruit, part of a healthy diet!

In icy conditions the children crowded to the front of the bus so that the rear driving wheels spun and progress was slow. The bus was blamed, not children who knew such tricks.

A quote from Ewart App: "Mrs Edwards often gave me some bread and jam, the fust jam I had ever tasted. The blackcurrants and gooseberries came from the gardens at Railway Terrace. They used to grow some fantastic rhubarb in them 'ouses and it was from emptying lavatory buckets round the plants."

Dennis Crowther, known to many as 'The Bard of Titterstone Clee Hill', he gets a chapter to tell something of his music and comedy talents. Alf knew him as the singer and musician who called in at the Dhu Stone Inn, the pub where Alf was born and raised, in a quarryman's normal dress of cloth cap, muffler, corduroy trousers and hobnail boots. He was renowned for impersonating the local vicar and giving his own version of a sermon....





A recent photo in the papers shows Arnie Schwartzenegger filling in a pothole in California after claiming he had waited three weeks to have it fixed. Only three weeks? Perhaps he could pop over here if he has some spare time. Mind you his repair won't last as, like Arnie himself, the pothole 'will be back'. Talking potholes, East Sussex Highways claim that it is cheaper to temporarily fill a pothole SEVEN times than it is to repair it properly once. Given that a first class stamp now costs £1.10, you might think that correspondence might actually arrive the next day as promised.

However, some services work well. I recently had suspected cystitis (it's no fun is it girls?) so rang the Medical Centre who advised me to go straight up and provide a sample. I did this and within an hour had a call to say that I did have an infection and that a prescription was waiting

for me in the pharmacy. Given all the problems with the NHS at present, I think this was brilliant service so well done to our Medical Centre.

So, if you find your non HP cartridges won't be accepted when you come to fit them, this may be the reason. Apparently, it is possible to disable this feature in some cases but it depends on the model of printer.

Sarah Price has been running CM Bespoke Care for seven years. That has included tough times like the Pandemic, when she and her staff worked all the hours they could to keep their patients as safe and well as possible. No small task for a young company offering care for sufferers from dementia, people over and under 65 years old, mental health sufferers, those with physical disabilities and sensory impairment. They are still there, putting in the hours, calling regularly on their charges and giving care.

There's a clue to the company style when Sarah tells you "You can teach skills, but not care." It showed when I walked into the smart offices tucked away at Upper Baveney Park, off Baveney Lane. She offered a cup of tea and checked who else needed one and made the lot herself. No sign of the boss sending someone else to do it, this is a place where team spirit really works.

That caring attitude carries on in places where they may not be working. Like Bonnie in a supermarket, recognising that a lady was unloading her basket because she couldn't pay for all that she wanted. Bonnie helped her put it all back

and forked out to help with the bill; a clear case of care not being taught, but part of a decent character.

"There's NHS funding, local authorities and charities like the Nightingale Nursing Fund - they're really a great help. We offer training to other companies and other training sources as necessary. Shropshire is a good authority to deal with, they have easy lines to communicate upwards if you need it."

Sarah herself still gets out on the road to make care calls, it's a habit she won't drop because she then sees the job as those she employs see it. She did step back from the caring task to do eight months work for the Department of Work and Pensions. But she came back to this side of the business, where care is all important

At their Pre-Pandemic peak the headcount at Upper Baveney was 58, down a shade to 40 in the more stringent present.
