BIG JOB COMING ON THE MAIN STREET

There will be major work on the town's central lighting system during the week from March 20th to 27th. All our street lighting columns are to be changed, from the New Bridge through to the Western boundary on Ludlow Road. No other roads will be affected, just the main street.

Traffic control will be by a manual 'Stop' and 'Go' board system, which is seen as the easiest way to move the control along the route as each stage is completed. Traffic disruption is inevitable, but the work is scheduled to take place from 9.30am to 4.00pm each day to avoid the peak traffic flow times. It will be done by contractors working for Shropshire Council, who apologise for any inconvenience caused, but the light columns are due to be replaced as they age and tend to be less secure. It's what you'd call good housekeeping if you did it at home.







Dental Disease in Small Animals: the wisdom of checking your pet's mouth

Examining the mouth can tell us a lot about the general health of our pets. As vets we routinely look in and around the mouth every time we examine an animal. The lips, gums, teeth, tongue, and the hard palate can all be quietly brewing some serious problems which may well be related to dental disease. All of these are places that are easily checked in amenable pets, and owners can, and should, look at them regularly (except in rodents). The most important thing for any of us as pet owners is to be able to safely and gently look in our pet's mouths whenever we're handling them. So don't leave it until you're concerned about a problem; get into the habit of routinely checking for anything which looks abnormal. The sooner we know about a dental or oral problem, the better. Most of the conditions which affect the mouth are painful and will therefore need swift investigation and treatment. Smelly breath is not just a sign of old age, and should not be considered normal. The bad breath is just a symptom of a disease process which will progress if it is not dealt with. It is often due to dental disease, but may be due to a tumour in the mouth, a piece of foreign material stuck in the mouth, or ulceration due to a more generalised disease.

Gingivitis (inflamed gums, possibly bleeding), calculus, tooth root abscesses and ultimately tooth loss are all painful conditions, but often do not cause an animal to stop eating. In many instances these are chronic conditions which progress gradually, and so often they are not perceived to be significant factors in our pet's general health. However, they are genuinely debilitating conditions which we certainly wouldn't ignore in

our own mouths, and we ought to learn to appreciate their significance in our pets. Some factors, such as breed, jaw conformation, tooth trauma and viral/bacterial infection can predispose our pets to rapid or severe dental disease. Poor and/or inappropriate diet is a major cause of dental disease in pet rabbits and guinea pigs, who actually only require simple low energy, high fibre food i.e. grass/hay (not concentrated, manufactured pellets). They need to spend long periods of time chewing; otherwise their teeth become too long and irregular in shape. Sharp spurs on the molar teeth dig into the cheeks and tongue, and the abnormally long teeth prevent normal chewing action.

The best advice I can give you is to check your pet's mouth regularly (i.e. at least weekly, if not daily); look at all the teeth, open the mouth wide and look under the tongue and along the hard palate. Look for swellings, bleeding, plaque, foreign bodies etc. If you see anything abnormal, or which concerns you, get it checked by your vet. Prompt action is always best.

Please be aware that insurance policies will rarely cover the cost of dental treatment, unless it is for an acute condition which could not have been prevented by good care and attention. It is our responsibility to make the effort to maintain good dental hygiene wherever possible, and therefore minimise the need for veterinary dental treatment. Appropriate food, chews, toothpaste and mouth washes should all be considered part of a good dental care regimen. The vast majority of veterinary dental treatment requires general anaesthesia and so pets usually stay at the vets for the day to receive the care and attention they deserve.



THE HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY

On February 10th we welcomed renowned naturalist Rosemary Winnall MBE, who gave us a beautifully illustrated

talk on creating a garden for wildlife. Rosemary ran the Wyre Forest Discovery Centre, bringing her knowledge and enthusiasm to students of all ages. She now runs study groups, collecting data of insects and animals found in woodland.

Her home is a haven for wildlife. She has a pond which attracts frogs and other pond life. In her two acre wild area she keeps the grass long with the exception of mown strips for access and allows Dexter cattle to graze, as it is very steep and not suitable for machinery. Her aim is to have wild blooms flowering every month of the year and she has scattered seed accordingly. We were advised to scatter wildflower seeds during the summer months so that the flowers will attract bees and other insects. When visiting the garden centre look carefully to see which plants are attracting insects before buying. boxes in several places, insect houses, batboxes and hedgehog houses were also advised. Many of our gardens are possibly not big enough for some of these suggestions but there were ideas we can take on board.

Our next meeting in the Methodist Hall is on March 9th, when Diana Perry will talk on the history of English Roses. It is

also our Spring flower competition where members are encouraged to bring a jam jar of spring flowers.



Letter from Westminster - Philip Dunne MP

Last month I congratulated a constituent in Much Wenlock celebrating her 100th birthday. This prompted me to wonder how many people in South Shropshire have reached this impressive milestone.

We all know we get older every year. But what is striking is how many more of us reach milestone birthdays each year. When first elected your MP, the proportion of those living in South Shropshire aged 65 or over was 20.9%. Today in fewer than 10 years, that figure has risen to 25.2%.

Medical advances are helping many more of us to stay more active in old age. Modern healthcare has made rapid advances, new drugs and treatments ensuring people live longer. So since 2005 there has also been an extraordinary 40% increase in the number of people aged 85 and over living in South Shropshire. Though the gender gap in life expectancy is narrowing, it is still the case locally that more women are living longer than men. The downward trend of smoking, traditionally much higher in men, and healthier diets has helped reduce this gap. Early diagnosis and more effective treatment of conditions like heart disease, diabetes and cancer will help improve life expectancy further still.

This is very welcome news, but not without consequences. The costs of looking after people in old age are naturally going to rise. This will be an important issue for whoever is in government in the next parliament. With significant public debt and the need to live within our means, savings will still need to be made. But I do not believe it would be right to balance the books on the backs of those who have worked hard all their lives and contributed the most to British society today.

Pensioners have had positive protection through the 'triple lock' under which the state pension now rises

each year by the highest of earnings, prices or 2.5%. The state pension is now £950 a year higher than it was in 2010 and at its highest level compared to earnings for two decades. I believe the next government should maintain this triple lock throughout the next Parliament to 2020.

The cost of care in old age can be a big worry to retirees and their dependents. At present those who have done the right thing can see their hard-earned savings wiped out by potentially unlimited, unpredictable care costs. I am pleased action is now being taken to introduce a cap on social care costs. This will be set at £72,000 and will take effect from April 2016. Creating certainty that there is an upper limit to costs will enable many to invest through financial products to cover themselves up to the value of the cap. Crucially, it will reduce the risk of homeowners being forced to sell their homes to pay for care. In another important change, the assets a person can hold and still receive financial support for their care home costs will quadruple from £23,250 to £118,000.

Providing a sense of security in retirement is the right thing to do. This year a new 'pensioner bond', a savings product offering high interest rates for those aged 65 and over was the most successful savings product launch ever introduced. Availability of the bond has been extended so millions more pensioners will have the opportunity to benefit from market-leading savings rates. It is right to support policies for pensioners, like those delivered in this Parliament, grounded by belief in the security and dignity in retirement.

I have still to find out how many local residents may receive a card from Her Majesty in 2015, but am confident it will be materially more than in 2005. *Philip Dunne*

THE STABLE TAVERN - BACK AS A PROPER PUB



New hosts at The Stable. Zol Cox and Kate Tolley have signed up for five years.

You wouldn't recognise the Stable Tavern as the same place that served just beer and bar food a few weeks ago. The place has been given a thorough facelift with new fittings and furnishings and the reputation it once had for good food looks like coming back.

The new hosts are Zol Cox and partner Kate Tolley, who moved in from running the Kingfisher Club in Wall Heath. That was a busy place, with seating for 500 people. Quite a contrast with the Stable Tavern's capacity for 32 on the ground floor. "But this is our show," explains Zol. "We run this as our business, not as managers." They've signed a five year lease and they and the children live premises; the that's commitment, a clear sign that they mean to build a strong business.

Kate looks after front of house and bar, while Zol is landlord and chef. He's been in the food business a long time, training at Pedmore House in Stourbridge and honing his skills in a range of local pubs and clubs. When he was chef at Wharton Park Golf Club, Kate was a trainee and the two got together, running the Wall Heath Tavern before taking on the Kingfisher Club.

The lounge and public bars are kept separate, to give diners a good, peaceful atmosphere. When we called to take photos, it was at the end of a busy lunch time with lots of local faces smiling, plus a couple who'd driven over from Kingswinford to enjoy Zol's food again.

The bar offers real ales like Three Tuns from Bishops Castle and Ludlow Brewery's Gold, plus good old reliable Banks's. If cider is your taste, they have Robinson's, Strongbow and Thatcher's to tempt you. At the bar you can lunch on cobs or home made pies if you don't want to get formal.

Upstairs the Function Room is nearing completion and will open for business this month. If you have a club dinner in mind, they can seat 40 up there.

The kitchen is a stainless steel place, where a lot of money has been invested. Nobody wanted to say just how much, but we have heard a figure in the region of £35,000. Whatever the price,

the place reflects a commitment to make it work as a good venue to both eat and drink.

So what's the food like? Zol had offered a free meal, which is not in line with the Clarion principle of refusing freebies, but it's quite normal in the food world. Just so you know, I didn't pay.

For a starter, the Black Pudding Stack intrigued. The dominant flavours were that pudding, plus bacon and a cap of Stilton cheese. Wow! That hit several spots in one go and I won't forget it in a hurry. I'd been sipping cider and the strong savoury tang offset the apple sweetness of the cider very well.

The main course eased the juices with a vegetarian Butter Bean Casserole, with goat's cheese and a baltic glaze to smooth it all off. Very nice too, with a glass of red wine to ease its passage. I stupidly took up the offer of a sweet with a banana split; it was lovely, but far too much to finish.

Conclusion: you can see why there were so many smiling faces at lunch time. This man can cook and his menu will change with the seasons; a worthy addition to Cleobury dining.

The Stable opens from 12.00 noon to 11.00 Sunday to Thursday, and over the weekend it's 12.00 til 12.00. You can book your table for lunch or dinner on CM 270382 or through Facebook on thestabletaverninn. It's good to see the place back in the food competition that adds to the town's appeal and we wish Zol and Kate every success in their ambition to succeed through simple hard work.



The winter months have been fairly dormant. Well, as dormant as they can be when there are 700 cattle to look after! Every animal has been housed over the winter and we look forward to warmer drier weather so we can get them outside. Sadly the farm is back under TB restriction having had one reactor on both of the last tests. We will have to test again at the beginning of April, so fingers and hooves crossed for a clear result.

The low milk price that is putting so many dairy farmers out of business has had a lot of press over recent weeks and this prompted a visit from Radio Shropshire to Mawley Town Farm who ran three recorded pieces as we discussed milk price and the pros and cons of processing our own milk.

I'm sure we are all looking forward to the clocks 'springing forward' at the end of the month. To kick start spring we will be fertilizing the crops we planted in the autumn to give them a boost, then machinery will be prepared ready for planting. If we have some nice dry weather we will be letting the cattle out soon, but not until after April's TB test.

We hope to hold an open day this year, at the end of June. It is a wonderful opportunity for Mawley Milk fans to see the calves, cows, bulls, milking system and farm machinery up close. It is a big undertaking for us to host but we have such positive feedback from visitors it makes it all worthwhile. The first of the reported crimes committed during the last month happened on January 18th between 9:00 and 10:00pm when the cooling system at the Medical Centre was wilfully damaged. There is a suspect for this offence who is being investigated. Between 6:30pm on January 21st and 10:00am the next day, a parked car in Clee Hill was broken into and £200 worth of damage incurred to steal just £6 in cash! There was a failed attempt to break into a secure tack room at a farm in Bagginswood between 8:00pm on January 25th and 9:00pm the next day. During the night of January 27th/28th a large number of tools were stolen from the boot of a car parked in Lion Lane. Between 7:00am on February 3rd and 10:00am on February 5th there was a burglary at a house in Tenbury Road whilst the occupants were away, and a similar offence took place during the same period at a house in Ludlow Road, also when the occupants were away. At approximately 4:00am on February 11th a Land Rover Defender was stolen from the driveway of a house in Clee Hill. During the same night a winch and two side mirrors were stolen from a Land Rover Defender parked at a different location in Clee Hill. The victim of this crime had had diesel stolen from a different vehicle at this location ten days earlier. A burglary was committed at a house in Button Oak whilst the occupants were out, between 1:30pm and 3:00pm on February 16th. Jewellery, cash and a laptop computer were stolen. Between 5:00pm on February 18th and 9:00am the next day a chain saw, a pressure washer, a bow saw and safety equipment were stolen from a farm building between Milson and Nash. On February 20th it was reported that at sometime during the previous fortnight the domestic oil tank at a house in Clows Top had been emptied.

In general, vehicle theft occurs regularly everywhere, so basic security advice should be heeded to help stop yours being stolen. However, certain high value vehicles and iconic vehicles such as Land Rover Defenders are targeted more than most. It must be good policy to obtain and use the best security devices to help give your vehicle protection from thieves. You may note that one such vehicle was stolen from a driveway, which would indicate that any extra security should be employed wherever the vehicle is parked. It has been reported that near to the centre of Cleobury two dogs are let loose to 'do what a dog's gotta do'. If anyone sees this or can shed any light as to who the owners are, it would be greatly appreciated if you let someone in authority know. Finally, for anyone who thinks that parking regulations are for everyone else, a Council CEO attends Cleobury regularly to issue penalty tickets. I often see non-disabled drivers parking in the disabled bay outside Londis. How selfish is that?

ON THE BUSES

Steve Todd brings you more news. How the man keeps his sense of humour after all this is a mystery.

A fairly quiet month with less disasters than usual. We were sat in the Market Hall the other Wednesday when THREE Diamond buses came through in convoy. This was a surprise as I didn't think they ever had that many running at once. Apparently one had broken down and the second had gone to rescue it. Not sure what the third one was for unless it was a reserve in case the second broke down as well.

One resident had an eventful trip back from Kiddy. The bus started off OK but after a few hundred yards, the passengers were turfed off as the driver had an unspecified problem. She got another bus to Bewdley where she managed to pick up the 2L but this only got as far as Far Forest before expiring. However, there was a relief bus waiting to pick them up without delay so perhaps Diamond are using psychic powers to predict when breakdowns will occur. On one Monday, the early bus failed to appear and when Diamond were contacted, they said that it hadn't left the depot as there had been a mix up over the rosters. It eventually appeared 45 minutes late – just the job if you need to get to work on time.

The times on the Cleobury bus stops were finally changed towards the end of January. It always seems to take a month before they catch up. The bad news is that the 2L times have vanished completely from the Corve Street stop in Ludlow. However, the service does still depart from the same spot. As for timetables, I went to the Kiddy depot again, to be told they were being revised and reprinted and would be available 'next week'. I asked if this meant the timetable would be changing again and was told no which probably means it will. In the two minutes I was there, two breakdowns were when I phoned in and commented on the frequency of these was told grumpily that 'Everybody's buses break down' This may be true but probably not as often. On my way back through Kiddy, I spotted a Diamond bus - broken down...

As I write this (20th Feb) Drivers are still charging users of the 9.19 to Kiddy £1. This is despite Shropshire Council's assurance on the December 3rd 2014 that this had stopped happening. I'll chase them

about this (again!). The only good news is the fact that we have been to Ludlow twice in the last 10 days and - I never thought I would say this - the service has run on time every time. I wonder if this means that Diamond are taking notice of complaints or it's just an accident. One piece of news relates to a woman in Bristol who got so fed up with delayed buses and a lack of response to her complaints that she invoiced the bus company (First Bus) for her time at £9.19 an hour. The total came to £103.30. She didn't get the money but she did get an apology and some free tickets. Steve Todd

Linda Iles March In The Wyre Forest





The New Orchard at Uncllys Farm. Linda's home.

I'm busy putting the final touches for an orchard plan at St George's Farm. Land given to the Guild of St George in 1871, cleared of forest then planted with its first orchard in 1880.

The original planting list reveals some interesting differences between culinary habits then and now. The apples, cherries, pears and plums which were chosen to feed the populations of Bewdley, Birmingham included many cooking varieties, for instance the May Duke cherry and both Yellow and Purple Pershore plums. I wonder what the demand will be for bottled fruit, jams and pies in the decades to come? It's anybody's guess. So I'm faced, even these days, with a bewildering choice of varieties old and new, all with different attributes.

With apples, should I go for eating, cooking, juicing or cider-making, or rather, in what proportion? (Will perry ride the same wave of popularity as cider?) When I select apples for resistance to canker, a disease which has been a

problem in the new trees at Uncllys Farm, should I prioritise that over good juicing, or keeping quality? Shouldn't I also keep in mind the need to avoid scab and mildew, and choose lateflowering varieties to escape early frosts? It's all very complicated and to avoid an eternity of indecision I may well go for those which I just like the sound of. We already have Pitmaston Pineapple and D'Arcy Spice, but perhaps I can sneak in some Pig's Nose Pippin or Slack Ma Girdle!

If I make poor decisions and the new orchard fails to deliver in terms of saleable fruit, at least there will be plenty of locals happy to make use of the crop. At harvest time the human munchers, juicers and cider-makers will be joined by an army of birds, foxes, deer, wasps, hornets etc. and even at other times of the year the trees will be hosting nectar-loving insects, beetles, bats and woodpeckers.

On a different subject, I must convey a little request from Butterfly Conservation. Surveyors are needed to help assess the health of the forest's butterfly populations. You don't need to be a specialist but you need to be able to commit time every other week to walking a set transect, recording butterflies as you go. It should only take about an hour, and as it's alongside Dowles Brook who knows what else you might see? Please contact Mike Williams at mike@stagborough.fsnet.co.uk if you think this may be for you.

Enter Stefan Brick of Brick Plant Hire, who booked half a day off work at the family business, taking a mini digger with him. Just the right tool to shift the remaining 18 tonnes to give Marion dry paths to walk around, whatever the weather. A really great and neighbourly thing to do.

BELARUS

Jenny Vanderhook has been there and to other places where the Christmas Shoe Boxes go.

Many people said to me 'You've seen all that happens with the Samaritan Shoe Boxes at this end, you really should see the other end." So I have; twice to Kyrgyzstan and to Swaziland and now Belarus, a Eastern European country about the same size as the UK. It is the only European country still with a Communist dictator, although I must say it never made any difference to us and our stay. But we were 13 English people taken around by four Belarusians, so maybe that made us OK. Also, Belarus has had the shoe boxes for a long time, with lovely local organiser Nicolai, who was with us for the whole time we were there

Nicolai, the minibus driver and all the interpreters lived in the capital, Minsk, where we flew in and stayed for most of our visit, travelling out to villages most days. In the five days we gave out shoe boxes, we did 15 distributions in schools, churches, sanitaria and centres for handicapped children. One school was for blind children and one of our team a blind lady; she was able to interact well there. Another

was a music school and after tea we were treated to an impromptu singsong by the director and some of the staff. Two others were art schools, with wonderful work on show.

I noticed that every time we arrived at a place for a distribution we were obviously expected and you could feel the excitement, but the children were very subdued and just sat where they were told and looked at us.

Then we started to undo the crates with the boxes in and give them to the children. What a difference! They just lit up. Some took the gifts out slowly and wonderingly, looking carefully at each item; others quickly got it all out, then put it all back and went off to their dormitory with it. It was lovely to see and this time I did what I'd always meant to and stood and watched the scene while the others gave the boxes out, especially when there were only a few children. I was the only one in the team, apart from the leader, who'd ever ben on a distribution before, so was able to tell them how very different each country

Would I go again? I would like to, if I'm chosen. Meanwhile, please keep on filling the shoe boxes.

IN BUSINESS: Reiki Master Kate Jones



Kate Jones. No pressure, no stress, just a gentle touch and a great capacity to listen.

Kate Jones learned about Reiki and her own ability to generate a gentle curative touch 26 years ago. "In Birmingham, in someone's house. The lady who taught us travelled up from Cardiff." She's come a long way since then, just as this Japanese way of gentle healing has spread worldwide. Kate moved on to teach the art and is now recognised as a Reiki Master.

The global spread of acceptance began in Hawaii, after Hawayo Takato experienced its effect when visiting Japan, became a Reiki master, and eventually took Reiki to America. Having worked and converted people in both North and South of that huge landmass, she then moved on to Canada.

To show how universal this peaceful art is, Kate quotes people from both sides of the Israel/Palestine border who travel across that troubled line to share treatment and to learn. It knows no political or religious boundaries.

That all sounds wonderful, but how does someone as experienced as her measure the success of this art from the mysterious East? "My own health is much improved, I have masses of energy, I'm slimmer and I have a peaceful and happy life. My own success I see in the increasing joy in other people's living."

She's not reading that from a corporate pamphlet like a double glazing salesperson, she looks you in the eye and talks with a quiet smile that reflects in her whole demeanour. Nobody could say this is a belief that will appeal to everyone, but as an ambassador for the movement she does have you feeling that life can be a better and more peaceful experience.

The starting point in most Reiki treatment seems to be when life is getting on top of people and they look for something better than another course of pills. "The key to everything - through the Reiki touch - is a calm mind and a relaxed body," she explains. She quotes a recent example of a nurse in a low state, feeling stressed out and suffering almost continual colds. After a few treatments the colds had gone, she had her confidence back and with a monthly top-up life is a great deal better.

"Reiki can help people dealing with cancer too," she explains. "Including chemotherapy treatment. It makes the patient feel more comfortable about a course of treatment. It's being accepted more by conventional medicine; some doctors learn how to treat their patients, others call us in as support."

A sign of that growing acceptance is the National Register of Reiki Practitioners, so that hospices can call in the more advanced people to help patients. Kate helped to set up that Register.

Some doctors have had Reiki practitioners working in their surgeries, where the doctor's time is precious and the Reiki practitioner can give hours of contact if the patient needs it. "We're really helpful," explains Kate. "Drug free, so at less cost."

Her base is in Ludlow, where she gives both treatment and teaching in Reflections, opposite the Assembly Rooms. From there she travels out to see individuals, normally within a 30 miles radius, but that is flexible. For example she travels Birmingham on occasion. More than flexible is the possibility of starting a group in Scotland, which she admits could be handy, as she's found family roots there.

She's in Cleobury every Tuesday afternoon, at Kim Stanley's Health and Beauty at No 30, High Street. Other times can be booked with a call to her at 01584 890284. Kate and Kim got together after meeting at a Cleobury Country Networking evening and Kim invited her to add to the services available.

She adds to the range of help that renowned place offers: "Some times I can help people see what they hadn't seen in themselves. It can be help at times of trauma, uncertainty or a need for change. What I don't do is advise."

The impression she made very firmly in the course of our talk was that she helps people find inner strength they did not know they possessed, which helps them face life with more confidence. And how does she see her future in Reiki? "I'd be very happy with another 25 years just helping people," she says with that quiet smile. Quite a lady.
