They were recommended to apply for a rating two years ago and got the Silver award. With that experience of the test behind them, they set their target higher, aimed for the top and got there. Let's not forget that this is a group of volunteers, given invaluable help of course by Town Clerk Matt Sheehan.

The Clarion will be there on the 2nd, when the public can also attend and witness our town being acclaimed as a place that's well run. We'll have a full report for you next month.

Sow peppers, aubergines and tomatoes in a heated propagator.

Drain and clean out water butts; make sure lids fit tightly.

Lift and divide snowdrops and aconites to make new clumps.

Patch-repair lawns where needed by seeding or cutting a section of new turf.

Check ties on young trees to ensure they are not restrictive.

Photograph and note areas where you'd like more bulbs next year.

Move or plant evergreens. Prune and feed roses.

The 2020 owl season is under way. Having found a mate, a territory and a nesting hole or owl box, our owls are now starting to nest, some even sitting on eggs They seem from reports of increased hoots to be telling other owls to keep off their territories as they prepare for the busy time bringing up their owlets by summer time.

Cleobury Owl Watch did manage to put up three new nesting boxes along Hobson's Wildlife Corridor - one Barn owl and two Tawny. Another seven (two barn, five tawny) are due to be put up in the parish but not until May so as not to disturb existing territories. That will cover and hopefully expand the areas of available nesting sites

identified by owl watchers in 2000.

If anyone hears hootings at different areas from last year please do tell me so placing the new boxes will be easier, and if you hear or see owlets in the next few months please do tell me. Kit Smith worthpack@aol.co. Information is power to help our owls.

CATHERTON COMMON UPDATE

As the nights are drawing out and the days are getting warmer (well soon anyway!) we can look forward to spring. Catherton Common is a particularly important area for ground nesting birds at this time of year and one of its iconic species is the Curlew, also known as the 'Herald Spring'. o f Unfortunately the success of nesting curlew on the common has declined hugely in recent years reflecting a nationwide decline in the species but is also partly due to the increasing numbers of people, dogs and predators forced onto smaller and smaller areas of green space. Curlew numbers have declined 77% in the last 20 years

Shropshire Wildlife Trust has been working with the 'Curlew Country' Project and the local Community Wildlife Group in an attempt to reverse this lack of breeding success. In the Clee Hills, including Catherton, we are looking to identify nest sites and protect them from predators with temporary electric fencing. To find out more visit the Curlew Country website.

To help protect our curlews we need dog walkers to observe the legal restrictions on open access land and keep dogs on a lead. The Skylarks and Stonechats are very busy too and vocal at this early stage, these are also ground nesting birds easily disturbed if dogs are quartering the ground off the lead.

In order to protect our ground nesting birds and avoid any disturbance please act responsibly:

Do not let dogs off the lead roaming across the common between 1st March and 31st July.

Reduce to a minimum driving vehicles off-road onto the common, do not take vehicles where you do not have a right of access.

Keep to rights of way and well worn paths as much as possible when you access the common.

Llewella Harding. You say what you want on your party menu and she'll present it with style.

She bubbles with enthusiasm for the work she does. When Llewella left school she wanted to get into catering and that meant starting at the bottom of the scale. She took a job as a pot washer at a pub and kept her eyes and ears open, learning whenever she could. Chefs who recognised her keenness would explain jobs to her and she took it all in.

She also learned humanity. "When you start at the bottom, you learn the value of people under you as you move up," she reasons. "I know what it's

like to work until 2.00 in the morning."

She did break away and try a more conventional career path, working in an office. But that daily repetition just didn't work for this young woman with an imagination and ambition. She took a job that really appealed; sous chef at the Gainsborough Hotel, working under head chef Phil. "An incredible chef, he really inspired me," she says. But Phil moved on and suddenly she was acting head chef in her early 20s. "Everything from 50 or 60 covers a day to 250 for a wedding. 14 to 16 hours a day."

She stood that for six months before looking for less stress and finding it in the King's Arms here in Cleobury. Five years there established her style and at the end of last year she opted to go self employed. She was already doing little jobs for friends' parties and loving it.

She has a wide variety of work coming her way because she's so flexible. "I'll ask you to write out the menu and I'll do it." All the cooking is by her, using the customer's kitchen ("It's easier serving if you're cooking on the premises.") or if it's big job she'll rent a local facility.



THE HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY

NEEN SAVAGE W.I.

In February we welcomed member Mary Warrilow, to talk about Lipoedema, a debilitating disorder where there is an abnormal build up of fat and fluids mainly on the lower parts of the body. It is a chronic, long term condition that primarily affects women and generally develops at times of hormonal change – puberty, pregnancy and menopause. There is also a genetic link and the condition can run in families, more research is needed to identify those at risk and reasons for the occurrence. Women with the condition are told they are obese and to lose weight; they suffer from poor mental health and low self esteem, limited mobility, skin sensitivity, joint pain and the financial impact of not being able to work. Symptoms can be helped with compression garments or bandages, exercise and skincare, diet and psychological support, however only 5% of sufferers are identified by their GP and 44% by specialist nurses, leaving many women undiagnosed. It is suggested over 10% of women may have the condition so this leaves many suffering in silence. Lipoedema UK was formed in 2012, dedicated to raising awareness amongst health care professionals and others and calling for more research and better funding of treatments by the NHS. If anyone wants more information please contact Catherine on the number below and we can help.

Neen Savage WI are determined to continue campaigning for the National Federation of WIs to adopt Lipoedema Awareness as a Resolution to spread the word to a larger audience.

CLEE HILL BIRD GROUP

The Bird Group has been looking for Curlews and Lapwings around Clee Hill since 2012, and working with the SOS "Save our Curlews" campaign to find and protect nests with electric fences for the last two years. We found seven pairs, and fenced four nests last year.

We are repeating both parts of this work in 2020, and need more helpers for the Bird Survey. Without the survey locating the Curlews in April, the nest finders' job is much more difficult. The survey is easy, and only involves half a day at the beginning of April, beginning of May and mid-June, about nine hours in all. Simple instructions are provided, and there's a practical training session on the hill for anyone that wants it.

In January I was fortunate to be drawn seventh in the ballot for Private Member's Bills – a very rare opportunity, since there are 650 MPs and all but Ministers, the Speaker and Deputy Speakers can apply for the ballot. This was the first time I have had such luck since first elected in 2005.

A Private Member's Bill is one not introduced by government, as it says on the label, but still aims to change the law, on a subject of my choice this session. I was doubly fortunate to be drawn seventh, since it is the lowest place on the ballot that is guaranteed an opportunity for the Bill to be discussed, with enough time remaining in the Parliamentary session to have a chance of becoming law.

I was keen to use this opportunity to make a difference on a health or environmental issue. I had several potential ideas, but was not fixed on any one, so I asked constituents to suggest potential changes they would like to see become law. I am very grateful to the many people who got in touch to put forward proposals. Some were either too general or too substantial in terms of legislative complexity or scope to be suitable for a PMB. But there were several good suggestions.

Since asking constituents for suggestions, I am also delighted to say I was elected by the House of Commons to become Chairman of the Environmental Audit Committee. This is a Committee on which I have sat for the last two years, helping to scrutinise the government's record on climate change and the environment, taking a particularly keen interest in water, air and soil quality.

Given my new role as Chairman of the EAC, I decided an environmental measure would be the most appropriate use of my Private Member's Bill. So in early February, I decided to propose a Bill, suggested by a constituent, with the intention to help materially to clean up Britain's rivers and watercourses. The Sewage (Inland Waters) Bill will seek to place a duty on water companies to ensure that untreated sewage is not discharged into rivers and other inland waters.

At present, treatment of waste water is required to different standards according to the area and population it serves. But given that an Environment Agency report found 86% of our rivers do not meet current environmental standards, it is clear the current system is not working. So my Bill aims to clamp down on raw sewage entering rivers from overflowing or poorly functioning sewage treatment works.

Work has now begun with the Parliamentary Clerks to find the best way of drafting this Bill to make it effective. I am engaging with government to seek their support, as well as many interested experts and organisations, to have the best chance of my Bill passing and becoming law. I will formally introduce it on the floor of the House on Friday July 10th, my first opportunity to do so in the Parliamentary calendar. I will update constituents from time to time about its progress.

The Cleobury Mortimer Plastic Reduction Group visited all Cleobury Country schools and nurseries to get them to pledge to reduce their single use plastic. With the expert staff to guide them, these children hold the future in their hands. What an inspiration those staff and children were! They are already doing so much to reduce plastic but were also really keen to pledge to do even more. We had a great day, feeding off the enthusiasm they all show for helping to look after our environment. All the establishments were given a Cleobury Mortimer Plastic Reduction Group pledge certificate to display. And we will go back and visit again in a few months to see what they have achieved.

Here are the pledges made:

Farlow C of E Primary School- have pledged to start an Eco Club after half term and will work to reduce plastic in lunchboxes.

Kinlet C of E Primary School - will continue to recycle crisp packets in Bewdley, and will work to further reduce plastic in lunch boxes. Have also pledged to only laminate display work when necessary.

Ever After Day nursery- will continue with their ban on plastic bags. Will continue to recycle plastic milk bottles (staff take them home) They have pledged to contact carers to encourage them to further reduce plastic in what they send in to nursery with their child.

Abkats nursery will continue to recycle everything they can and reuse plastic pots that come in with lunchboxes. Have also

pledged to start recycling crisp packets in Bewdley.

Stottesdon C of E Primary School will continue to recycle as much waste as possible from staff with Terracycle and have pledged to try to extend this to students' waste too.

Bayton Primary School will continue with their toast club at break (reducing the need for children to bring in plastic wrapped snacks). The Eco Club have pledged to introduce a recycling bin in the lunch hall and will try to start recycling crisp packets.

Little Learners nursery in Bayton- have stopped using plastic aprons. They will contact carers to encourage them to further reduce plastic in lunchboxes and will continue to recycle as much as possible. They have also pledged to buy more wooden and other natural toys.

Cleobury Mortimer Primary School have pledged to recycle crisp packets and research milk companies to find one who can supply with less plastic. A Year 3-4 class is going to do a project looking at the use of plastic around the school and how it can be reduced.

Lacon Childe School- have already introduced a plastic bottle recycling scheme and reduced plastic in the canteen (no plastic cutlery, no plastic straws and no plastic takeaway boxes). The enthusiastic Eco Group have pledged to deliver an assembly to Year 7's encouraging them to give up single use plastic for Lent.



MUSIC IN SAINT LAURENCE'S

A good crowd gathered in the principal church in Ludlow on February 15th, ages ranging from babes in arms to ancients in their 80s. The rain doesn't put of music lovers when an event as promising as this comes with free admission.

Ulrich von Hecker opened the afternoon with Stravinsky's 'Suite Italienne', his fine violin work accompanied by David Gaukroger. Some interesting notes on the performers were available, from which we learned that Herr von Hecker is a lecturer at Cardiff University and a violinist purely as a lover of that instrument. His obvious enthusiasm for the performance drew warm applause before the debut of David Gaukroger's 'Shropshire Journey', with Kim Begley offering briefs extracts from Housman between each movement. Kim has a very fine voice, and his clear diction added to the atmosphere of the occasion.

I am not in the least qualified to judge this professional pianists's technique, but his composition skill in capturing the rural atmosphere was very impressive. There was prolonged applause for both player and narrator before Ulrich von Hecker closed the concert with Schubert's 'Sonatina in A Minor'. A lovely, gentle performance that the dignified present of Saint Laurence's simply enhanced.

I could not get near David after the event, he was surrounded by friends and happy admirers. But correspondence later revealed that he had not given a recital for more than 20 years, so he sat and devoted four to five hours of practice a day for six months before this appearance. To sit and listen to such a competent player gives pleasure, but few of us realise just how much effort is made before we hear the result.

David is concerned that music is not being widely taught in Shropshire schools and has plans to raise funds to address this shortcoming; his target is £20,000 this year. I hope to sit and learn more about this selfless plan when details are finalised, and will report in full when I have done so.







The Wyre Forest is drained from west to east by the Dowles Brook, which in turn is fed by its smaller tributaries such as Dell Brook, running from its source near the A456 northwards through Uncllys Farm then on down a delightful little valley. (The photograph by Mick Farmer shows the waterfall on the brook.) Dotted around the nearby forest are freshwater pools sitting on impermeable clay and draining into the nearest downhill watercourse. Recently I have written about the 'Slow the Flow' scheme which delays the water in these upper catchments from joining the Dowles and Severn to help avoid destructive flooding.

I am one of the volunteers who wander the forest from February to April making note of the amount of frogspawn in these large and small pools. I was recruited to the team by Rosemary Winnall of the Wyre Forest Study Group, present organisers of the survey which began in 1988 under the auspices of the Nature Conservancy Council. Long term studies of this kind are extremely valuable, especially in view of likely climate change. The frogs are, in general, breeding successfully but we do notice that the pools gradually change over time, responding to local conditions, and can become less attractive to frogs and their tadpoles. To help this situation some of the ponds on Forestry Commission and Natural England (i.e. public) land will be managed by cutting back vegetation around their edges and also taking out some excess water plants. The wildlife in each pool will be monitored to see if these actions have the desired effect. As I am the kind of person who enjoys getting wet and muddy (but not cold) I hope I'll

be able to lend a hand with the work later in the year when the water warms up!

The other survey in which I will be involved this month is the deer census. On a couple of consecutive Saturdays about 30 volunteers will arrive in their allocated sections of forest before dawn and will comb the woodland noting any deer they encounter. The majority will be Fallow Deer but the little Muntjacss have shown a steady increase in numbers, to the annoyance of foresters whose young trees they like to chew. They are the size of a dog and bark like one too, and breed all year round unlike the Fallow does, who produce a single fawn in June. At the collection point our survey results are rewarded with a hot cup of tea and a bacon sandwich. The privilege of experiencing a spring dawn in one of the best woodlands in England may only occur to me once I've enjoyed a hot bath at home.

More joy from Diamond with sporadic requests for payment on the 8.54 to Kiddy although this should have been sorted by now (again!). This particular service also seems to arrive spot on – 15 minutes late - most mornings although I'm not sure why they should already be running late so early in the day. One morning it was 30 minutes late which we thought would not bode well for the 10.06 to Ludlow but that was spot on time so they must be using at least one bus on occasions. I did risk a trip both ways in the last week. The Kiddy journey was spot on time going in and about 15 minutes adrift on the way back so not too bad. The Ludlow trip was even better, being on time both ways. Diamond do appear to be using better buses now these look to be some of those inherited from Central Buses and only about 3 or 4 years old. The climb up over the hill was handled without any problems and they seem to be quite lively vehicles although there was a fair amount of crashing and banging. This, I suspect was mostly down to the dire state of the roads in the area - until you get to the Worcestershire border when they magically smooth out. Shropshire Council make great play of the fact that their budgets have been cut, but no doubt Worcestershire are in the same position and they haven't forgotten their border areas. Perhaps Shropshire could ask them how they do it ...

My next trip to Kiddy didn't go so well. On time on the way there but on the return, the 292 duly appeared 25 minutes late – only to drive right past us and disappear! As you will appreciate, this caused some consternation amongst the waiting crowd who had already been there for over 30 minutes in a cold wind. I spoke to another driver who pointed out an Inspector. She told me that our bus had a brake warning light showing and had been told to go straight back to the garage. It would return as soon as it had been checked. Sure enough, a few minutes later, it appeared and we finally got home about 45 minutes late. Why the driver or any of the Diamond staff present couldn't have told us this straight away is a sad reflection of Diamond's service standards.

Shropshire Council get yet another mention in the 'Rotten Boroughs' column of 'Private Eye' This is the third edition running in which they have starred (which may be a record). The piece included a reference to photos of a line of vehicles, all suffering from burst tyres or worse, having been savaged by a single pothole near Bridgnorth. The chasm by the Larch Barn Cafe just up the Bridgnorth Road has also claimed three victims in as many days, including a Police car... To add insult to injury, they are now employing a 'Pothole Consultant' at a cost of £1000 a day for six months! As we already have loads of potholes, I would have thought that a 'Pothole Repair Consultant' would have been more useful. An estimate of the total cost comes out at about £130,000, so the inmates have truly taken over the asylum that is Shire Hall. I had a week in Lancashire using the buses most days. All were on time give or take a couple of minutes and were operated by different companies, both small and large, so it can be done. Another revelation was the roads. Even the back lanes were in better condition than the main road through Cleobury. There was only one place where there were potholes and beside them was a notice apologising and saying they were scheduled for repair in three days time....

Just to get an idea how Diamond are doing, Bruce Webster and I lurked in the High Street and noted the times of all arrivals for a day. The results: of the 13 scheduled services, 3 were on time (two of which were the 292S) and the rest late. This gives an on time score of about 23%. Compare this with the fact that Northern Trains were given the shove with a success rate of nearly three times this figure, it makes you wonder about nationalisation... I have great sympathy for the large number of passengers trapped on a cruise ship in Japan because of an outbreak of coronavirus. The name of the vessel? 'Diamond Princess'. It brings to mind a variation of the old Carlsberg advert: 'Diamond Buses don't do cruises, but if they did'....





THE FOUNDING FATHER

I heard Doctor William Bird MBE talk about setting up the first Health Walk at the Festival of Ageing in Shrewsbury last year. He was a GP, practising in Reading in 1996, when he started the scheme and was named 'Innovation Doctor of the Year' in recognition of that breakthrough in getting people actively involved in exercise.

"Our bodies are meant to be active and we're designed to be connected to nature," he says. "We are hunter gatherers and our bodies currently exist in an alien environment of being indoors all the time and living under artificial lights and so on." So he got people walking and exercising, socialising along the way. He has been acclaimed by 'The Independent' as one of the top 100 people making Britain a happier place. WALKING FOR HEALTH

Cleobury's own Walking for Health movement is eleven years old and runs under the umbrella of the Ramblers' Association and Shropshire Council, with local support from CMFA. To see how it works, I joined their February 12th outing, when they met at the Sports Centre car park and drove to the Wyre Forest Visitor Centre. Mazella Witts-Hewison was the day's leader, who explained the two routes available and the terrain we would find. She and other trained helpers all wore yellow reflective jackets and were easily picked out at a distance. Alan Kimber was the back marker, there to see that nobody was stranded.



The pace was dictated by the slower members of the party, the fitter walkers waiting at

intervals for the rest to catch up. No sign of competition; it was a stroll through the forest on a bright morning - what a privilege that is - and a pleasant chat along the way until we slowly made our way up the final long climb and back to the Centre. Alan Kimber explained that on a run through the area, that final test was known as Cardiac Hill.

This was a good experience for a Walking for Health novice. Kind but cool weather, excellent company and a pleasant place to sit and take in a hot drink and a slice of fruit cake to round the morning off. Two and a bit miles of hilly terrain was no hardship on a good path surface and while proper walking boots were recommended, a decent pair everyday boots or shoes would have been fine. Clarion Clippings - The April News

Important Notice to our readers. This exclusive report is embargoed until next month and should not be read until the day after March 31st, unless you wish to experience stress and concern for your sanity.

As you will be aware, there have been a number of recent revelations regarding A&E delays and other healthcare issues in Shropshire. However, a leaked NHS document contains a number of radical proposals for addressing these problems. It is thought that this may be one of the first efforts by Dominic Cummings 'Misfits and Weirdos' team.

Firstly, the document tries to identify the root cause of these issues and has identified that the main reason is the fact that people are living longer (who knew?) and that, as they age and become more infirm, 'they are a barrier to an efficient and economical healthcare system'. Secondly it explores possible solutions to the problem, starting with local healthcare provision by GP's. Apparently, statistics show that around 10% of patients do not turn up for their appointments thus wasting the doctor's time. As result, the document suggests that surgery times are reduced by a similar amount which will relieve the pressure on doctors and stem the current exodus from General Practice. A more radical suggestion to reduce delays in obtaining appointments is to ration the number that an individual is entitled to by giving them an annual allowance of, say, three consultations. This would discourage frivolous use of GP's time as many conditions will clear up by themselves and would enable those in real need to be seen much more promptly. To provide extra flexibility, patients would be able to 'Bank' one years allowance until the next year if the appointments were not needed. They could also do the opposite and bring one years allowance forward. Prescription costs could also be greatly reduced as such products as paracetamol are regularly prescribed (at an admin cost of around £10 per item in addition to the cost of the medication) when they can be purchased at a chemist for pence.

Another area for consideration is a reorganisation of Accident and Emergency (A&E) provision. Encouragingly, this would not involve any closures, just a redrawing of


boundaries and catchment areas. Less encouragingly, the effect will depend on the locations of the patient population and their designated A&E. In the case of Cleobury residents, their A&E would be Norwich which you might feel is an extreme but have a thought for Truro residents who would have to travel to Newcastle upon Tyne. A quick look at the annexe to the document reveals the thinking behind this proposal which runs along the following lines: Many people (around 30%) attending A&E are not sick enough to warrant attendance and just get in the way. Another substantial number (estimated at 35%) are really sick and will die in any case, no matter what treatment they receive. In the former case, they will be put off by the journey and not bother to attend and in the latter, they will be unable to survive long enough to arrive. Thus, the remaining 35% who need to attend and will benefit from the treatment they receive will be able to access this much more swiftly, thus improving their chances of making a full recovery. This, the authors claim, will solve the current A&E crisis at a stroke. Apparently, objections were raised by environmentalists who felt that pollution caused by the higher mileage covered by ambulances would endanger national carbon emission targets. As a result, the initial proposals were modified by requiring the journeys to the designated A&E to be made by public transport. In the case of Cleobury residents, this should not take more than about 7 hours, assuming a suitably early start and not missing any connections, so not a problem.

It must be emphasised that this is only a discussion paper at present, so people should not become too alarmed. Having said this, a couple of items in an annexe showing aspects that had influenced thinking are concerning, including a reference to 'Coffin Dodgers who don't have the good taste and decency to die at a sufficiently early age' in a document produced by a right wing healthcare privatisation pressure group and a mention of 'Logan's Run' a 1970's film starring Michael York and Jenny Agutter where everyone is killed when they reach the age of 30 to prevent overpopulation.

At one time Lacon Childe School kept a goat tethered in the grounds for the Rural Science pupils to tend and milk, as you would in a rural area. The trouble was that one day a Rottweiler was running loose and attacked it. The only person who could step-in and deal with the dog and save the poor goat was John. The RSPCA awarded him a medal for his bravery. It was around that time I was told by man who went on to be a Parish Councillor that I shouldn't be seen drinking with John; I ignored that advice.

He wasn't everyone's mate, but he was a man who did a whole range of jobs and never asked for charity. Our sympathies go to his children and grandchildren.



SMART CAFE








