

#### **OUR FOOD BANK**

Debbie Brown, Chair of what was then the Parish Council, started the town's Food Bank in the Market Hall. She and Town Clerk Matt Sheehan had seen the need when they heard how people were neighbouring towns to get free food for their families.

"Our first customer was a lady whose husband had lost his job and they were getting by on the Mortimer Running Club, the £40 she earned from cleaning work. When she saw what we Ridge, both Cleobury Mortimer had to offer she just sat down and cried with relief," recalls Debbie. Very few of us realise what a need there is out there in lovely, friendly Shropshire, but today our own Food Bank serves up to 50 people, adults and children, every week.

It remained open through the recent pandemic, when extra that help came in the form of pallets donations every week: Mawley delivered by Defra and local food shops and restaurants were really generous. When the Pandemic was over, the need of help remained and the Bank's work continues. It opens every Friday and will continue that evening habit when they move down the road to their new base at the Fire family coming in will get a £5.00 Station.

Not everything comes free and the Bank became a charity last year, which made access to grant itself raises the money to pay for funding easler. The operation that. has grown to cover the surrounding area and has 15 volunteers who give their time freely. But costs do rise, like the reasonable rent they've been paying for the High Street based Market Hall. That has triggered the move to the Fire Station, where they'll get more space for a peppercorn rent. It will not be as accessible as the Market Hall for the elderly and they're working on ideas to provide transport out to the station and back.

It was in October 2019 that success that people who use it clearly rules. for the first time and realise what an asset it is, then often join as photos of some of the volunteers volunteers. The feedback from who give time and more to help their customers is 100 percent keep the Bank stocked with the good. Support from local groups everyday vitals that are needed: who have seen their work and travelling to want to help still grows.

There's an impressive list of clubs and other bodies who support the Bank in a variety of ways. Like the Cleobury Community Hub, Nineveh schools, plus the Kinlet Primary and CoCo, the Cleobury Compassionate Community that Katja Jones runs and the Hopton Wafers community. The list grows as the awareness of how much good the Bank is doing spreads.

There are four organisations that give food and Milk and the Robinson family; Saint Mary's Church; Platters and Plates and the Doddington Heights community, who make a collection every week that John and Pete bring down to the open

One lovely touch is that a voucher to spend at Londis, Ashley's Bakery or the Freezer Centre. The work of the Bank

There are food donation points around the town at the Co-op, the Library, the Severn Hospice shop, the Market Hall and Saint Mary's Church. You can see people look in at the Market Hall and just leave a modest gift of food.

#### Kathie's tale of 'Three Little Promises'.

In September 1992, Mark and I saved a nine month old Shetland pony from 'the meat man'. We saw his fighting strength and named him Samson! He was just a baby and so wild. With

patience, we eventually taught him to trust us and we made him three little promises: 1. We would never part with him. 2. One day he'd live in our garden. 3. We'd find him a girlfriend.

In 2012, we bought our home in Shropshire, including stables, especially for him. He loved humans, but hated horses, so finding a girlfriend was going to be a huge challenge. She had to be cheeky, smaller and younger than him. I found the perfect yearling Piebald Mini Shetland filly. We put them in their stables next to each other, then divided the paddock outside. Sam neighed to her and she answered back! She looked like a baby cow, so we decided to call her 'Little Miss Daisy'.

That night, I covered Sam with tons of blankets, then lay my head on his neck, I could feel his heart beating through my back and prayed, it would naturally stop beating. We fell asleep together, that was so precious to me!

The following morning, the vet phoned with the news that I dreaded. My beloved Samson passed away in my arms on 28/01/2020. Horses are so sensitive, so we let Daisy in, to be alone with him, she needed to know what had happened. She licked him all over. She was obviously as heartbroken as we were. From that day on, she too, hated other horses. However, she loves her humans, dogs and cats.

We're proud that we kept our 'Three Little Promises' to our Sam! He certainly repaid us big time, by leaving behind his greatest legacy, his protégé, our Little Miss Daisy. He taught her how to be the most amazing, affectionate, confident and cheeky little friend that anyone could ask for, who can often be found in our kitchen, with her head on the table watching TV! She's been my Fundraising wing lady for several years and she was my only bridesmaid at our Wonderful Wedding, at St John's Church, in Doddington, on 28 September 2023. surgery to have another miles toe amputated following original operation to

have my foot reconstructed. While it is frustrating to be out of action for longer, it shows that recovery can take time and isn't always straightforward. Although the gunshot wound I sustained in the Army was thirty years ago, it is complex with a mix of bone fragment and shrapnel lodged in my foot making it increasingly difficult to walk. I am grateful to my family and fellow residents in South Shropshire for their support. I continue to write to Ministers. ask questions and deal with constituency issues as I recover, so please get in touch if I can be of any help to you.

In between these procedures my advice surgeries returned to Bridgnorth. While there, I met Christians Against Poverty. They are just one example of the incredible social impact being made by local faith communities. Last week, I also met with education leaders from across South Shropshire. This included the Community College in Bishop's Castle and AmazingCPD in Broseley, which offers training for local teachers to develop new skills. I want to support education in South Shropshire so that every child gets the education and support they deserve.

I recently responded to the Local Government Finance Settlement. While the headline figure shows an increase of £1.2 million increase in assessment funding for Shropshire Council, compensation for the hike in employer's National Insurance Contributions at £2.5 million more than wipes this increase out. The rural services delivery grant has also not been continued despite repeated calls I had made, resulting in a deficit of around £10 million. Most of the increase also relies on a full 5% increase in council tax, contradicting the government's pledge not to raise taxes on working people.

I am concerned that Lloyds Bank plans to close its branches in Ludlow and Bridgnorth in May in another major blow for our high streets. This change affects local charities, churches, and communities who rely on their services. At both House of Commons, London, SW1A 0AA branches, two thirds of customers are aged 55 or above. Lloyds' alternative for Ludlow customers is

As I write to you, I am almost 23 miles away in Hereford, while recovering from further Bridgnorth residents have been signposted 11 to the Tettenhall branch away in Wolverhampton. As one of the largest inland complications after my counties in England, Shropshire deserves better access to in person banking service than this. I have implored the Bank's CEO to reconsider this decision and called on the Chancellor to safeguard access to cash in rural areas.

> Constituents have also contacted me with concerns about scams and other fraudulent activities they should not have to put up with including scam texts, phone calls, and fake advertising. These crimes can happen to anyone at any time. Everyone must be equipped with the skills and knowledge to report scams. My Scam Awareness and Support Hub on my website aims safeguard fellow residents from these to pernicious activities. I have also called on Ministers to launch a strategy to improve awareness and increase the confidence to report any incidents so they can be quickly investigated and acted on.

> Our public services are some of the most important elements in our communities that we depend on. From transport links that enable us to see loved ones and travel to work to the emergency services that are there for us we need it most, I want to deliver the funding and support to enhance public services across South Shropshire. The Chancellor must seize the opportunity presented by the Spring Statement on 26th March to positively reset relations with rural communities, delivering investment that will support our residents and opportunities and unlock the skills and opportunities to unleash economic growth. A failure to do this would be catastrophic. I am calling on residents across South Shropshire to let me know what the Chancellor should prioritise. This survey is available on my website.

The fraud we now call 'Scamming' is being largely controlled by what the Police call "OCG" or Organised Criminal Gangs. These gangs have a sophisticated hierarchy with someone at the top, a Chief Executive Officer (CEO) and a board like structure of specialists in Admin, Technology, Human Resources and Finance. Admin does the sales and marketing i.e. Finding potential victims who might be vulnerable to a fraud. Head of Technology is the brain behind the use of ever more sophisticated computing to lure us into a false sense of security. Human Resources recruits the worker bees at the bottom of the chain that make the phone calls, send out the emails and use carefully constructed scripts to lure victims deep into the fraud. These people at the bottom of the food chain are very dispensable and often under pressure to achieve certain targets at the risk of possible physical harm if non-compliant. Authorities have established many of these people may be in this country illegally. Finance is the function that ensures any money from victims usually ends up in offshore accounts in countries where the environment ensures complete silence and anonymity.

These businesses can be operated and controlled from anywhere in the world.

What are the authorities doing about it?

Across the world, law enforcement works behind the scenes to gather intelligence, collate & organise the data to build a picture of the bigger organisation. Success is measured in getting all the bits of the jig saw together and identifying the bigger picture. There are two recent scams that have emerged in the last month you should be aware of.

#### DIGITAL PHONE LINE UPGRADE

Criminals are posing as BT staff and phoning residents to ask them for their personal and payment details in order to upgrade their phone lines to the digital service. If you refuse to cooperate then they threaten to cut off your landline.


They are also using emails with similar messages. As with other frauds, the criminal will also add pressure by claiming the deadline is imminent, even though the deadline set up by BT is January 2027.

#### **GWR "UK ANNUAL PASS"**

This potential fraud has been circulating for a while now, mainly on Facebook.

The tempting offer is a "£3 Great Western Railway UK Annual Pass" which could give you unlimited travel around the country. The web site may look like an official GWR website, it has been confirmed that no such offer is available and should be ignored.

## March in the Wyre Forest

#### Linda Iles

This month I'll be doing quite a bit of counting. In early March we'll still be counting clumps of frogspawn in the many pools of the forest. It's a survey that's been going on for over 40 years and the results cast light on the status of the common frog in our area over that time, as each female produces a single clump of spawn. Although we look for spawning to start in early spring, the timing is affected by temperature and a cold snap will cause activity to stop and start again. Shallow water warms up more quickly than deep water, which explains the rather desperate appearance of clumps in shallow ruts and ditches. What if the weather is too dry?



The frogs will be forced to spawn in whatever water is available (as amphibians they must lay their eggs and the tadpoles must develop in water) but that shallow rut may dry out before the early stages of the frog's lifecycle are complete. The flora and fauna in a water body must also contribute to its attractiveness as a breeding place, but not in a way that is easy to understand. I assume frogs must be able to 'taste' these differences in the water.

Without human interference a pond will evolve from a fairly sterile hollow through stages of colonisation by plants and animals, eventually silting up and drying out as larger shrubs and trees establish themselves. One small pond that I have visited annually since 2023 has only just been colonised by water plants, and I have no idea how frog tadpoles (up to 65 clumps of them) have managed to survive in it before now. Or maybe they didn't! I've heard it said that frogs always return to breed in the place where they were spawned, but I've also read that they can migrate one or two kilometres from a pond and we know that new ponds carefully created within that radius can become new breeding areas. Making a wildlife pond is always a valuable addition to your garden, and there are many books and articles available to help you. If you are interested in joining in with the frogspawn survey there's still time: email info@wyreclt.org.uk or ring 01299 488083.

I'll also be counting something larger this month, as 8<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> are the dates of the annual deer census. The results in recent years show a steady increase in numbers, with more and more Muntjac and Roe Deer joining our more common Fallow Deer. Dawn on those two Saturdays will see me walking quietly through Seckley Wood, binoculars at the ready and clipboard in hand. In spite of trials with drones in 2023 and 2024 the human version of the census will be needed for many years to come.

#### **Fly Tipping and Littering**

Fly Tipping is the illegal disposal of household, industrial, commercial, or other controlled waste and is a crime that carries penalties. You can report fly tipping to Shropshire Council or via Fix My Street. This will ensure that each incident is logged, acknowledged, and issued with a reference number. Shropshire Council works with West Mercia Police and government bodies such as the Environment Agency to tackle fly tipping. Residents can dispose of most waste through their fortnightly household waste collection service. If you have an excess amount this can be taken to a Household Recycling Centre or arrange for an authorised person to collect the waste to ensure that it is disposed of correctly.

Locally, small amounts of litter makes our community look untidy and we encourage everyone to use the bins around town. We would like to thank the volunteers who regularly litter pick, showing care for our community and the environment. It is appreciated - thank you!
