The person who has been the prime mover in making the Clarion look like a serious product has retired and sold the business to her step daughter.

I cannot overstate the progress Linda Fowler and partner Mike Spencer have brought to this monthly product. When I first met her, the Clarion was quite literally a cut and paste mess the stories cut with scissors and stuck to the page with sprayed glue. Enthusiasm ruled over any attempt at competence and she still made it look half decent.

With the careful guidance of these two, I have progressed to the current point, where 64 pages of stories and adverts are put together on an Apple Mini Mac computer in a template that makes the whole thing look better than I could have dreamed of. And with just a touch on the right buttons, the whole thing is sent to land on a distant computer in less than two minutes.

That distant computer and the printing hardware have all moved to a new home near Much Wenlock and Imogen Spencer is now the power behind the scene. She produced the copy you are holding now and will be guiding the print quality forward in future.

Having to drive up country to collect it every month will be no hardship; travelling through Shropshire is always a pleasure. Saying thanks and farewell to the two who have been so much help in making the Clarion story a good one is not easy, but times change and we move on.

THE CLARION PRINTS 1,000 COPIES

We've come a very long way since the Clarion first appeared in 2005. Back then it was just 28 pages long and we printed 550 copies; this month it's 64 pages long once again, but we've kept the press churning until it had printed one thousand copies. And that's what we'll be producing from now on.

The demand has risen with our agreement to make a page available for the Benefice of Cleobury Mortimer to advertise its programme every month after the Unity parish magazine ceased publication. That has brought requests from surrounding parish churches to make copies available directly to their congregations. We leave a bundle in those church porches on the first of every month, which means more readers and greater reach for the advertisers whose business keeps the whole thing alive.

My thanks to the church and to every reader, wherever they pick up their copies. JR



ROCK CHURCH ART AND CRAFTS SHOW



The contrast of Pam French's zebras with David Tedham's abstract works lived happily together in such a traditional setting.

This is a well established exhibition and sale that raises fund for Rock's ancient Saint Peter and Saint Paul parish church. No less than 29 artists brought work for visitors to examine, plus a range of crafts people. All arranged in a sympathetic manner around the church, with lighting to add to the effect and light refreshments served in support.

Entry is free, with a gentle invitation telling you that donations would be much appreciated. Hard to refuse such an approach, and it seemed that everyone added to the large jar of coins.

Local shows like this are interesting because of the range of styles and subjects they offer, plus the revelation of names you don't associate with such fine work unless you know the individual very well. It serves as a reminder that there is a great deal of talent hidden away and too seldom seen. David Tedham's work in acrylics is well known;, paintings that have been described as offering a paradoxical relationships between the figurative and the abstract. His work was next to the beautifully realistic examples of Pam French's love of animals, both attracting strong attention.



The show was opened by local artist Claire Spencer, a charming lady from the same area of what is now known as Greater London as the editor. She attended Harrow Grammar School for Girls, while I was at Harrow Weald Grammar and making less of the opportunity than she did.

ROCK POUND THE BOUNDS

The annual Rock 'Pound the Bounds' has grown to become a major fund raiser for the Midlands Air Ambulance Charity and their helicopter rescue service. In rural areas, with road journeys never easy, a helicopter airlift to hospital is quite literally a life saver.

You can help them by joining in this year's Pound on May 6th. There are six routes, ranging from a three mile family treasure trail up to a 26 mile marathon, all through local countryside at its spring time best. Entry costs just £3.00 for the family route, £6.00 for the six mile version and £8.00 for the longer alternatives. Register your place on the net at www.poundthebounds.com simples! You will also find the timetable for the day when you register, with the 26 miles walkers obviously the earliest to sign on and get their instructions for the day.

And it's worth remembering that the Air Ambulance averages six missions every day, with 30 percent of those in the three counties of Worcestershire, Herefordshire and Gloucestershire.

THE FAMILY BUSINESS MAN



Peter Roper - A Man About Business

This is a man with a broad experience of business, from success to failure and the determination to get back again. His favourite phrase is based on old fashioned common sense, as he talks about the need to fill the fridge. After all, that's what people are in business for.

His considerable talent at promoting businesses is concentrated on the family run versions these days. He's seen and talked to a lot of them, and recognises that they are often too busy surviving to step back and see what needs to be done to grow and succeed. To fill the fridge. So six years ago he rebranded as The Family Business Man, to offer his experience and knowledge to such people.

"The Edelman Report questioned people in twelve countries and found that 86 percent of them trust family businesses as people to deal with," he explains. Those are his target market and he concentrates on the Midlands, with a lot of success. He started business meetings at the Stone Manor Hotel in Kidderminster and that is the base for his expanding operation. He now hosts monthly meeting in Shrewsbury, Solihull and Wolverhampton, to make life easier for busy people in those areas. His aim is to have ten venues opened within a year, venues where business people can drop in and listen, eat, talk and learn; meetings start at 4.30 and end at 8.00. That leaves time to pick up the groceries to fill that fridge again.

He's very keen on social media, and sees too few family businesses using this tool effectively. "They do some marketing, but in hard times you don't try to build a network when you're desperate." His advice removes the desperation and offers guidance.

The meetings begin at 4.30 with a talk by Peter, followed by something to eat before three members talk about their own experience and how they are building their businesses. Then come one-to-one discussions before everyone heads for home at 8.00. The three satellites are growing; there are about 300 businesses from whom they draw support.

He's always worth listening to and has regular Family Business Man spots online on Wednesdays and Saturdays. If you sign up there's a monthly 'Family Business Man' magazine and regular bulletins and blogs to keep you up to date. What he offers is economical business guidance based on a lifetime's experience. That's worth a lot.

It must have been 25 years ago that Tony Page, the farthest travelled motorcyclist I've ever known, described the roads in Eastern Europe: "The first thing you learn is that you never ride through a puddle, because you don't know what it hides. It could be just water, but it could be a big pot-hole." Self preservation was a good habit.

I was reminded of that wise advice recently when the MoT for my car came with an advisory that one rear tyre was legal but worn. Solution: replace both rears. Then came the call from Lower Street Garage, saying that one of the alloy wheels had two cracks and they would not fit a new tyre to that until it had been mended.

Enter Eddie Roberts of EJR Engineering up on Tenbury Road, the man who can weld almost anything and agreed to let me watch the process. The first stage is to cut the cracked part of the wheel rim out, to give a clean edge to work with. A rotary grinder in a skilled pair of hands makes the job look easy; it's not.



Eddie gets the cracked section removed.

Energetic use of a wire brush got the damaged area cleaned up before the serious business of Tig (tungsten inert gas) welding began, Eddie wearing a serious mask and those who know not looking at the bright arc of the work. Using filler rod, he built up the area where he'd cut away the cracked alloy before grinding and shaping back to the original rim profile.



At this stage you look away as Eddie applies filler rod to build the alloy profile back.

I first came across Tig welding in advanced motorcycle chassis construction 20 years ago, when the man to go to was based at Farnborough and had learned his craft in the aircraft industry. The craftsmen who use it today don't seem to see it as special and with the current state of our roads cracked rims are quite common, according to the Lower Street Garage crew. The cure looks quick and easy, like so many skills do when you watch a craftsman at work. Just be glad they'll take on such jobs, because the cost of a new BMW alloy is something I don't want to know about.

CLEOBURY PATIENTS' VOICE

A bright yellow object now adorns the exterior of The King's Arms. It should be housing what has been christened The Town Defibrillator. A year ago CPV realised that Cleobury had three potentially life-saving defibrillators and none of them was publicly accessible on a 24/7 basis. CPV decided to try and resolve this and initiated a project. Wendy Satterley of The King's Arms, kindly agreed to the relocation of the pub's defibrillator and when other outdoor High Street sites proved unsuitable, offered an exterior wall too. A secure cabinet was required and CPV successfully applied to Veolia's Make A Difference fund for a community award to help provide this. Funds were also raised through the efforts of Gill and Brian Davies, with support from Mawley Town Farm and Chrissie Woodhouse, among others. The Town Council stepped in to help with the servicing and term maintenance of the defibrillator and cabinet, for which thanks should go to Matt Sheehan and Andy Goold. The final piece of the project fell into place when local electrician David Taylor offered his services freeof-charge to ensure that all was installed correctly.

Unlike most others in the area, the new Cleobury cabinet only has a simple security tag and a keycode is not required to gain access, making it instantly available. This is the recommendation of the British Heart Foundation and the model used throughout London and Scotland, where ambulance services refuse to recognise public defibrillators if they require codes to access.

Sudden cardiac arrest is a leading cause of premature death in the UK and the quicker this can be treated by defibrillation, the greater the chance of successful resuscitation. For every minute a patient is in cardiac arrest, their chance of survival decreases by 10 per cent. It is estimated that each year, around 4,000 people in the West Midlands suffer cardiac arrest outside of hospital, and two-thirds of them do not receive treatment prior to the arrival of an ambulance crew.

Modern defibrillators guide the user through their application and no special training is needed, but a brief training course is planned to promote awareness and confidence in using the defibrillator, with particular focus on those who live or work in the vicinity of the new installation. Further details soon.



Confirmation before Easter that the Treasury and Department of Health had approved the funding case for up to £312m investment in our acute hospitals at Shrewsbury and Telford, was really welcome news for all of us who have campaigned for better healthcare in Shropshire.

My colleague Lucy Allan, MP for Telford, stood up in Prime Minister's Questions to say it was the proudest day of her political career, and I felt equally buoyed by the news. I had called for this funding ahead of the Chancellor's Spring Statement, so to see the NHS in Shropshire recognised as the top priority for investment by the NHS nationally, backed by the government, was extremely welcome.

To put this announcement in context, it is the largest ever public sector investment in healthcare in Shropshire. But it also represents the largest new capital commitment anywhere in NHS England this year, and is 40% of the total funding announced for transformational capital projects across the country, to modernise and transform buildings and services in the year of the NHS's 70th birthday. So this is a huge win for Shropshire.

It is crucial to keep up the momentum for local residents from right across Shropshire to get engaged with the public consultation, due to get underway in coming weeks. I know all too well what can happen to investment in Shropshire healthcare if public support is derailed by those resistant to change, even if this is designed by clinicians to improve services – it risks losing its priority within the NHS.

Some specialist services have already been taken out of county. At the moment, if you have a heart attack you are taken by ambulance to the specialist centre in Stoke or Wolverhampton.

Further delays to Future Fit risks losing less specialist existing services. So with £312m at stake, we should not wait any longer and get on with the public consultation as soon as possible.

While either proposal within Future Fit will involve changes to what is provided at each hospital, this new capital funding will deliver for patients across South Shropshire, with a wide range of improved services at the acute hospitals, releasing more services community settings. Foremost amongst these will be a new Emergency Department and Critical Care Unit, with 50% more capacity than the current A&Es combined, including 32 more hospital beds, and a new Cancer Centre in Telford. There is a lot of information on the options proposed for consultation on the Future Fit website, at nhsfuturefit.org, and I encourage readers to take a look at what the proposals would mean for them.

The reaction from within Shropshire from patients and NHS representatives has been really encouraging, with many constituents getting in touch to say how pleased they are at this news. So I hope sincerely the public support is there to see through this investment and Shropshire healthcare gets this much needed boost.

But I do recognise there will be some concern about change, and that is why ensuring the public consultation is as inclusive as possible is important, especially reaching those of us in rural areas. So I encourage everyone reading this to have your say in the public consultation, to ensure South Shropshire voices play a strong role in shaping the future of acute healthcare provision in the county for decades to come.

Our community lost two major figures recently. Words here can only brush the surface of their character and achievements; families and friends know how much more they gave to the world.

PROFESSOR 'TANK' WADDINGTON



Professor Peter Waddington was 'Tank' to all who met him, a 6' 6" tall ex rugby player with the build of a brick outhouse and total modesty about his great achievements and reputation in the world of academia. Dinner with the Wad Squad was always a delicious and happy occasion, Tank sipping his pint and making points in argument with a hint of his knowledge to back it up. If you didn't know your subject well, you learned to be quiet, listen and learn.

He came to prominence as a lecturer at Reading University before moving north to live in Cleobury and lecture at Wolverhampton and launch their special degree course for police students that raised the standard for West Mercia and other forces. He and Diane spent time in America and he later visited South Africa to advise the Truth and Reconciliation Committee in the early post-Apartheid era.

Friends from academia and the police force spoke of the man at his funeral at Saint Mary's. Diane moved us to both tears and laughter with her memories and his friend Reverend Kelvin Price made us smile, laugh and stop to think with his personal eulogy. Helen Ferguson read a poem for Tank and Diane, a group of friends spoke of their experience of the man and at the end of a reverent and loving ceremony we walked out to the tune of Arthur Wood's 'Barwick Green', the theme tune of The Archers that added a Billy Connolly moment to a unique farewell to a man whose like we are unlikely to ever see again. He departed as he lived, with humour and thought.

ELIZABETH RATCLIFF

Elizabeth was the founder of Neen Savage's 'Vital Link' magazine and it was that magazine that published edited highlights of the obituary she wrote for herself in 2009. She came from an academic background and it was during World War Two that she earned her degree in French and German at Reading University. She then joined the Intelligence Corps and worked on interception of Japanese naval signals, something she only revealed to husband Eric many years later on a visit to Bletchley Park.

They moved to Neen Savage in the early 1950s, where she joined the Parish Council and worked with chairman Dr Williams to build the splendid Parish Hall. The Vital Link was started to help raise funds for that work and when she wrote the Neen Savage book all the proceeds went to the same cause. She was probably too modest to mention the project taken on to restore the Elizabethan Detton Hall that stands as a memorial to the Ratcliff family name.

She and Eric travelled in later life and she continued the habit as a widow, including two trips around Australia in a camper van and bathing in the Indian Ocean in a wheelchair. If you can borrow a copy of the April-May 'Vital Link' there is much more in there. She really was a quite remarkable lady.

Q: How many Councils does it take to change a light bulb? **A:** No idea, as they haven't managed it yet. Given this, can you imagine how difficult it would be for them to organise a bus service?. You would imagine correctly – the 2L replacement saga has been an utter shambles, the first problem being that it was entrusted to Worcestershire. Why on earth would anyone think this made sense given their long history of improving services for their residents at Shropshire's expense. In addition, the company involved is based in Shropshire, most of the route is in Shropshire and it is mainly funded by Shropshire so it's a mystery. True to form, they made an absolute Horlicks of it.

Apparently, after negotiations were held with R&B Travel, a draft timetable was produced although it was difficult to get any information from Worcestershire up to that point. After a comprehensive examination of this lasting several seconds, both Madge Shineton and I asked the same question: Where were the early and late services?. According to R&B, they were only asked to tender for the middle of the day and nothing was mentioned about how students or workers would get to either Kiddy or Ludlow. It may be that no one in Worcestershire travels to College or work early in the morning although I find that hard to believe. It may also have been thought that the Bus Fairy would sort it out but as most readers will be aware, there is no Bus Fairy...

Anyway, after much effort and many phone calls by Madge Shineton, a revised timetable was produced which gives roughly the same number of services as before although this is still inadequate given the frequency of services to and from similar sized towns in other parts of the UK. Please therefore ignore the times shown in last months column and collect the updated timetable which is available from the Cleobury Country Centre, Market Hall, Cleobury Cafe and other shops. The good news is that the new 292 service

reverts to the original route and goes through the centre of Bewdley and straight into Kiddy thus cutting the travelling time in half to around 30 minutes. The less good news is that Diamond are still operating the 0740 service to Kiddy returning at 1602 and numbered 292S so we are not yet quite free of the Curse of Diamond although all of these arrangements are to be reviewed in August.

As I write this, the revised service has been in operation for several days and seems to have largely operated on time although the 1730 departure from Kiddy didn't turn up on one occasion. I am a little concerned that the schedule as it stands doesn't allow any time for delays due to traffic, roadworks etc so if there is a problem, it may be difficult to catch up. Hopefully any hiccups will be mainly teething troubles but please let either Madge or myself know of any issues. We followed one service towards Cleobury the other day and it went very well, even accelerating uphill which isn't something you saw very often with Diamond... As I have mentioned the 'D' word, there have been the usual no shows - we saw a recovery van speeding up the High Street early one morning last week. Obviously in vain as the 9.14 to Kiddy failed to appear. There was also a collision with a caravan in Lower Street – after all, it's not as if caravans are big and white so they are easily missed.

As we go to press, there is a rumour that Shropshire Council are going to ask people to stop reporting potholes and just report if they find any tarmac. It's not that the roads are bad but some of them don't look like they've been touched since the Romans left... Apparently at the beginning of April, new contractors were appointed to fix the holes but no-one seems to have seen them yet... I understand that this is because it didn't occur to anyone to organise an ordering process with them before the contract started. Another 'lightbulb' moment?....

And we hear that the matter of registering as a charity is under way, with their submission accepted and being processed. More progress.

At this time of year everything is growing quickly but some plants take this to exremes. You'll probably be familiar with Himalayan balsam (*Impatiens glandulifera*), an enormous relative of the 'busy lizzie' (a colourful occupant of bedding schemes and hanging baskets) from the Western Himalayas. It has a pretty pink flower which is why it charmed its way into British gardens in 1839, but this is followed by seed pods which explode when touched, scattering seeds 5 metres from the plant. It favours damp areas and is steadily spreading up British rivers including the Severn and its tributaries. You won't have to go far to see masses of it, e.g. on the river bank beside the Bewdley School.



Although it can be said to provide nectar for insects (and can be used by bees to produce a very respectable honey) its ability to spread quickly and form dense stands is very harmful to our native flora. A broken-off plant can root from the nodes of the stem and the root can regrow to branch and produce even more flowers than before. For this reason, uprooted plants or pieces

of stem have to be crushed and disposed of carefully. If there are only a few plants they can be hung over branches to stop them taking root again.

The Forestry Commission's Wildlife Ranger, Phil Rudlin, has been doing battle with it at Shrawley Wood for about 16 years and seems to be winning, using an ATV- drawn roller to crush the stems and then finishing off by hand weeding with the help of volunteers. In various locations alongside the river and brooks in the main forest there have been concerted efforts to remove the plant by hand pulling wherever it has appeared, but in every case it has proved to be a mistake to assume that it can be completely eradicated: balsam is a tireless invader and its reappearance needs to be dealt with quickly.

The Environment Agency are trialling biological control using a variety of rust fungus which is specific to Himalayan Balsam. After four years of research it was approved to be released into the wild in 2014 and although its use is at a very early stage, it appears to damage the leaves and weaken growth of the plant. Locally the River Stour is going to be used for a trial this year.

You can do your bit for our native flora and fauna while having a lot of fun (legitimate destruction is always to be relished) by joining one of the work parties being organised by Steve Bent in late July and early August – contact him at stevenclivebent1@aol.com. And when you're out walking, keep an eye open for those big, succulent stems so that you can pull them up and hang them up!

THE BREAKFAST CLUB

The Breakfast Club met at the Cleobury Café on April 10th to hear Paul French talk about his work for the Samaritans. In a brief historical introduction, Paul told us that the organisation was founded in 1953 by an Anglican vicar in London, the Reverend Chad Varah, whose work experience had convinced him that there was a need for a free, unbiased, listening service to help people in distress. The iconic name by which his organisation is now known was coined by a writer in the Daily Mirror.

Varah started with a single local group of telephone listeners, but there are now 201 groups, supported by over 20,000 unpaid volunteers. The necessary funds are raised solely by donation or bequest - no Government money is provided. Groups operate in a wide range of settings – schools, prisons, universities, railway stations, etc. (By training railway staff, the Samaritans have brought about a noticeable drop in the number of rail suicides in the UK.)

Although many of us associate the work of the Samaritans with providing comfort and support for anyone feeling suicidal, Paul stressed that most calls are about other problems financial, social, relationships and much more. Although prepared to listen to anyone with a problem, the Samaritans do not offer advice or judgement. They are specifically trained in the skills needed to provide an empathetic ear, without giving their own opinions. The discussions are totally confidential unless it transpires that someone (caller or otherwise) is at risk from abuse in which case there are specific protocols that must be adhered to.

Paul himself does one shift per week (in Telford), and ended by giving us some

interesting figures of the work the Samaritans did on Christmas Day. They handled about 7,500 phone calls, 500 text messages, and 1,000 emails. We should all be grateful to the Samaritans for the valuable work they do, still needed even in an age when Social Services have expanded way beyond what was available when Chad Varah founded the Samaritans 65 years ago.

The Breakfast Club next meets on May 8th at the Golf Club to hear Claire Hadwell tell us something of her experiences teaching the children of those serving in Britain's armed forces. Members wishing to attend should contact Jonathan Fair (CM 271913) or Angela Drennan (270636) to book places.



The "trench" and "trench warfare" are synonymous with The Great War but what was a trench exactly and what was it like to serve in them?

By November 1914 there was a continuous line of trenches covering 400 miles from Switzerland to the North Sea. Trenches varied in design according to the conditions but most were reinforced to prevent collapse, sand bags, timber or anything remotely suitable for purpose was used. The process was known as "revetting". In wet ground trenches were not dug at all but just built up from ground level using sandbags and wood and called "breastworks"

When forward progress was swift during major advances there was little time to dig deep and trenches could be little more than eighteen inches deep.

The elements of a trench system were a main "Fire Trench" which was the front line and had a firing step to allow observation and firing over the top. Trenches followed the ground contours which allowed good observation points and defensive positions. They were not dug in a continuous line but dog legged, allowing bays or 'traverses" to be created. If shells exploded in these it meant that damage was confined to this part of the trench only

Behind the front line was a similar support trench which had "dugouts "cut into the wall, large enough to shelter three or four men or a telephone operator. Communication Trenches linked the rear to both front and support trenches. The final element of the system were "saps," trenches probing forwards from the fire trench into "no man's land", they usually contained a listening post manned by infantrymen.

The infantry primarily occupied the trench systems together with mortars, machine guns, forward artillery spotters and medical teams. A typical routine for trench duty was four days in the front line four in close reserve and four at rest.

"We stuck it at all costs if necessary, as long as ordered, but everyone is glad to hand over to someone else. And anyone who says he enjoys this kind of thing is either a liar or a mad man"

Captain Kings Own Rifle Brigade

Conditions in trenches varied according to the theatre of war, the time of the year and weather, but all offered squalid living conditions. Discarded food, empty ration tins and the latrines coupled with the difficulty of washing or changing clothes meant considerable health risks. Vermin were attracted and responsible for spreading disease.

"There were rats as big as cats" Harry Patch.



It's amazing what skills and crafts you can find tucked away in Kidderminster. I'm not talking carpets, it's the less obvious skills that have emerged and adapted to meet the demands of a changing market. In the Wyre Forest the ability to use local timber for building, heating, fencing and protection was a natural path for a craftsman to take, but as buying fashions changed the more canny took note and changed with them.

Like Mark at Wyre Forest Woodcraft, whose business started 22 years ago, making gates and windows for the mass market; we're talking about 36,000 gates a year. When the recession hit in 2009 he felt the effect but also noticed that the quality market suffered less. That's where the business went and it's been steadily growing ever since.

They manufacture windows, doors stairs, conservatories and timber frame buildings with the bulk of their trade coming from restoration work, where a wide range of traditional styles is produced on modern machinery to give the benefit of greater efficiency. Like the recent installation of a four sided planer that stands where the showroom used to be. Not a cheap job at all, but it can handle a planing job in a quarter of the time it took before. Same timber, same operator skill, much lower production time. And they are building another showroom, above one of the processing units.

Their objective is to use sustainable timber in line with the international movement to reduce use of third world varieties with the attendant damage to the global climate. So they can offer a variety of timbers including Accoya, farmed in New Zealand, processed in Holland and supplied here by an importer. It's easy to work, has

excellent environmental credentials wears exceptionally well and can be painted or sprayed to the customer's chosen shade. There's a big spraying and drying plant, where finished articles are given three coats of water based paint or stain and dried in a booth fired by production off-cuts. Sawdust waste is bagged and dried sold as fuel or processed into small nuggets to feed the burner or to sell on as fuel. A very impressive control of waste.

Martin and a partner since retired started the company and his sister Claire joined to watch over the administration side years later. The other partner is Ross, who joined on an apprenticeship from school 21 years ago and has worked his way up. You'll notice we only use first names in this story, a reflection of the happy atmosphere that shines through. In 22 years the company has grown to employ nine skilled staff and currently appoint a new apprentice every year. They grow because they have high standards that please. Makes sense.

A RECORD TOWN A.G.M?

You do not expect a town Annual General Meeting to attract a lot of people and generate a buzz of interest. And you wouldn't expect an attempt at running a drop-in meeting with lots of local clubs and bodies to be a success. You'd be wrong.



There's a quiet revolution going on here. It's the Town Annual General Meeting and lots of people are turning up and asking question. Amazing!

There were two parts, the first at the Primary School, where 85 people were clocked in, and the second at Lacon Childe, where 73 came through the door. There they looked around a range of 25 the new including nursing home development, Cleobury Patients' Voice and our own Concert Brass. There was a two minute interruption for the formal bit, when Cllr Debbie Brown explained what was going on, then it was back to questions, answers and chat.

Edwin Sayers sold five copies of his fine little Coracle Boy books, people learned about activities they'd not heard of before and at 7.15 we all packed up and went home. If this was the Town Council on show, it impressed.

ABOUT PLASTICS

A working group has been formed under the umbrella of the Town Council to see how we recycle and what can be done to reduce the risks of plastics harming our environment.

They are looking at the 3Rs of Recycling, Reducing and Replacing. The town is reasonably good at recycling plastic using Veolia's kerb side collection crates and it looks as if around 40 tons of plastic a year are recycled in this way. There is still some confusion as to which plastic can not be recycled eg black plastic trays, polythene, cling film and the mixed plastic/card Tetra products.

The Government's scheme to reduce plastic use by charging 5p a polythene bag was successful. More can be done by shoppers reducing buying plastic into the home, such as shopping in plastic free aisles in supermarkets where available, using paper bags, selecting wrap free products, and reusable containers such as lunch boxes.

We shall have to replace plastics within 20-30 years as hydrocarbon oil and gas reserves dwindle and new plastic production ceases. Pressure applied to retailers and manufacturers will create new alternatives to plastic use and its dangers.

National and our local Women's Institute are leading on the End to Plastic Soup. Microplastics fibres are shed from synthetic clothing with every wash and are the main contributors to microplastic contamination of our oceans.

The working group needs more volunteers. Please contact Cllr. Neil Tysall or Kit Smith if you are interested and do please fill in the Big Cleobury Survey on line or on a hard copy to influence how you want the Neighbourhood Plan to shape the future of our town.




