After much rumour the simple fact is here. The Muller England engineering works closed its operation here in Cleobury Mortimer on April 21st. It continues work at other sites.







CLEOBURY GARDENERS

May has arrived When we were worrying winter was set forever, Spring has sneaked in.

I have come across a splendid concept "NoMowMay" an initiative developed by the charity "Plantlife". Leave your lawn uncut for the month of May, and this will increase diversity of food and habitat for a wide range of creatures, allowing the flora within the lawn to grow and flourish. This is not just an excuse to take it easy, but will let you give yourself that extra little breathing space to get on with more pressing jobs.

Prepare the soil for planting out, remove weeds and apply fertiliser. Fix supports for perennials before they have grown too tall Plant out sweet peas by the netting or sticks; prune spring-blooming shrubs after flowering, eg forsythias or currants. And there is always the deadheading.

It will soon be safe to start hardening off our tender plants, a gradual process over one or two weeks of putting them outside during the day, and back under cover at night, being wary of sudden warm days (drying) and chilling winds (also drying). It's also an opportunity to inspect for slugs, snails and anything which has taken a fancy to your tender charges; look out for lily beetle; if you have a hosta which is not thriving check for vine weevil. It's always sad when we lose plants, but it happens to us all no matter how diligent we are.

Here at Cleobury Gardeners HQ we are looking forward to a busy month. On May 8th we host Dr Pam Davenport talking about "Chillies - Propagating and Eating": on May 22nd Roger Umpelby discusses "Buying-v-Growing Fruit and Vegetables". Visitors always welcome.

And our very important Fund Raising Plant Sale is on May 13th at the Market Hall, where we hope to have our usual array of excellent plants, allotment produce and cakes for sale to raise funds to support our range of activities. This includes pleaching the lime trees in town, planting and maintaining the flower trough outside The Talbot and engaging the children in our local primary schools and pre-school settings in an annual competition focused on Learning to Grow Food . THE BREAKFAST CLUB

On April 11th, members were entertained by Craig Kershaw with his presentation 'Saudi Arabia through my camera'. Craig had for ten years been leadership development manager at the King Abdullah University of Science & Technology in Saudi Arabia and, as a keen photographer, had taken advantage of the opportunities offered, in particular trips through the deserts of Saudi Arabia.

In the south of the country lies the 'Empty Quarter' - a huge expanse of sandy desert, whose 225,000 square miles covers more than twice the area of the UK. No European had crossed this huge area until Bertram Thomas in 1931. Craig's photo club decided in 2017 to do something similar, so engaged local guides for the memorable four-day journey across the desertin five vehicles. Good planning was essential, as apart from the awkward terrain, there is a dramatic daily temperature change from near-freezing conditions at night to 50° C or higher in the day.

The journey offered some splendid photo

opportunities, with windsculpted sands of various colours, striking sunsets, and brilliant starry skies. Occasional camel trains were encountered, with up to 500 camels being driven across the desert to market.

Craig also described a trip he undertook into a volcanic region to the north, amongst old volcanoes and jagged hills. Sharp rock fragments litter the ground, so careful driving was essential to reduce the chance of tyre bursts. One heartening characteristic is that if a traveller is in trouble a Saudi and his vehicle will appear as if out of nowhere, and be ready to provide whatever assistance is required, without expecting any reward.

Camel racing occupied Craig's last few minutes, as he told us of the modern version, in which boy jockeys are illegal. Instead, robotic jockeys, with radio communication, to carry the owner's encouraging words to the camel, but also to allow the owner to operate an electrically-driven crop to give encouragement of a more direct kind as well!

The next meeting of the club will be held on May 11th at The Talbot, and will be addressed by Sue Brown. Those

THE LATEST FROM CORAL & TOM...

The market right now is still busy and while the number of houses available to purchase is higher than the last couple of years, the overall inventory of houses on the market is still 43% lower than they were 5 years ago in a "normal market" pre-pandemic. The national average timeframe to sale agreed is now between 8-12 weeks, this is much slower than the last couple of years where some areas were between 2 – 4 weeks.

Nationally, a normal market usually sees about 1.1 million transactions per year. In 2023, the data indications show we are on track to have 500,000 transactions for the first half of the year, and it's expected to improve in the second half.

If you have been reading the headlines recently, you may be surprised to hear this given all the doom and gloom the leading media outlets have been reporting. On a local level, we have certainly seen a jump in activity this year compared to the end of 2022. Mortgage rates have been more stable and plenty of buyers and sellers are actively looking to move, with a raft of sales being agreed in and around the Easter period.

Our overall assessment is that the housing market is neither bursting or crashing and while prices have dipped slightly (on average 2-3% in our area), we saw growth in the last 2 years between 20-25% (according to Nationwide data).

"Everyone has been so kind" she says, "our community always seems to pull together and it's wonderful to experience that first-hand"

Jackie is a self-employed leadership trainer and professional speaker and has needed the support of her clients as she prepares to disappear off the radar for two months. "This walk is too important to me to be checking emails and social media every five minutes – especially now I'm fundraising for such an important cause", she says. "My clients have been brilliant, so I'm very lucky".

She's due home at the start of June. "I have factored in some rest days on route, so I anticipate being away for five to six. I'll let you know how it goes!"

As Spring gets into its stride many cultures name May's full moon the flower moon, an obvious reference to the abundant seasonal blooms. It is also called the hare moon which is evocative of the magnificent sight of 'boxing' hares during their mating

Photo of bluebells in Symond's Stool by Mick Farmer May is Bluebell time and perhaps you have a favourite place to enjoy this feast of scent and colour? Shrawley Wood (south of Stourport on the B4196) is locally famous for its spectacular Bluebell display but smaller patches of the flower can also be seen in many parts of the Wyre if they haven't been swamped by Brambles and Bracken or shaded out by trees. Damp valleys will also have swathes of Wild Garlic (or Ramsons) announcing their presence by their strong scent, echoed by the tall stems of Garlic Mustard which are sought out by Orange Tip butterflies for egg-laying. There should be plenty to see with other butterflies such as Holly Blue, Large White, Green-veined White and Pearlbordered Fritillary all flying and the Painted Lady arriving from warmer climes later in the month. So too with the migrating birds such as Spotted Flycatchers and Pied Flycatchers.

In the past you would have been able to welcome the return of the Turtle Dove and hear its distinctive gentle, purring call but, like the Nightjar and so many other birds which used to animate the summer forest, this visitor has declined to near-extinction levels. It is quite a small bird: about half the size of a Wood Pigeon. It feeds on seeds, especially chickweed, oilseed rape and cereals and frequents hedges, woodland edges, scrub and areas of conifers managed to maintain an open and varied structure. These habitats have largely disappeared from the wider landscape: this, plus the over-use of pesticides and artificial fertilisers, drainage and pollution of watercourses, is the legacy of the last 8 decades of 'agricultural progress' which have deprived so many species of their living.

Fortunately we understand their ecology better now and, where there is sufficient will, the tables can be turned. In 'Wilding' Isabella Tree (her real name, I assume) documents the return of many wild species to the Knepp estate in West Sussex and for them the Turtle Dove became a symbol of the recovery of the land. When conventional (and unprofitable) farming ceased in 2002 there were no Turtle Doves but by 2017 there were 17 male territories and hopefully as many breeding pairs. 'Re-wilding'is in part letting things go, but recognises the need for large grazing animals to counter the unrestricted growth of vegetation and, in the absence of their predators, for human intervention to keep a check on their numbers. This approach is on-going and experimental but I'm sure it has many lessons for the management of the forest and other land used for food production, recreation and conservation in our crowded island. Philip Dunne's Letter from Westminster

As you know, I have focussed my campaigning efforts in Westminster to make a real difference in improving the water quality of our rivers. So last month I welcomed a significant set of measures announced in a comprehensive Plan for Water, which pulled together a wide range of policy initiatives across Government to create a fresh strategy to improve water quality of our rivers and sustainability of water supply.

The new Secretary of State for DEFRA is determined to tackle the long-term challenges posed by under-investment in our drainage and supply networks underground, which have not kept pace with development above ground for 60 years. The need to do so was graphically illustrated again at the end of March by publication of the latest sewage discharge stats for 2022. While these showed a 19% reduction in the frequency of discharges from treatment works and combined storm overflows across England and a 34% reduction in duration compared with 2021, this was primarily due to reduced rainfall during the year. So the pressure remains on water companies to get to grips with preventing these wholly unacceptable routine sewage discharges.

I believe these new measures will make a material difference and have given this Plan a broad welcome - not least since these proposals accept many of the recommendations from the Environmental Audit Committee in our seminal report last year into Water Quality of our Rivers. The Plan also reflects several campaign themes of the Conservative Environment Network contained in their Water Manifesto which I endorsed late last year.

These include giving greater power to regulators, the Environment Agency and Ofwat, to issue unlimited fines on water companies for breaching their permits; and for those fines to be ring-fenced in new Water Restoration Funds to improve water quality. There are currently over 2,000 cases of such breaches by six water companies being investigated by regulators which could lead to fines or criminal prosecution. Regulators will also have the power, which we had also called for, to link senior executives' remuneration and shareholder dividends to environmental performance.

It is not all about water companies either, farmers have a role to play, both reducing nutrient leakage and managing supply of water. So, I welcome further funding for slurry storage and encouragement for buffer zones for pollinators and tree planting along waterways, as well as the consultation on reducing planning barriers for onfarm reservoirs and creating wetlands to help integrate flood planning.

Locally I am encouraged by Severn Trent's engagement with local communities, businesses, and farmers to raise awareness about the importance of protecting and improving the ecosystem of our rivers. It's vital that we work together to ensure the sustainability of our natural resources for future generations. By partnering with local groups, Severn Trent is seeking to work with local community groups in improving the health of our rivers.

Advice and some financial support is becoming available for farmers to help them reduce their impact on waterways. Farmers have a vital role to play in managing pesticide and fertilizer use and improving soil management practices. STWs "Get River Positive" campaign aims to fix its own discharges and encourage sustainable agriculture practice in its catchment.

STW plans to invest £1.2 billion over the next five years to improve water quality, reduce leakage, and increase resilience to climate change. Locally £4.5 million of this is being invested in the next two years in improving treatment works and Combined Sewer Overflows along 12 miles of the River Teme between Leintwardine and Tenbury Wells to get the river to high water quality standard.

We as consumers can also play our part by stopping flushing wet wipes down the loo and putting filters in washing machines to stop microfibres from our clothes being flushed out. There will be a consultation on banning plastic in wet wipes to reduce the risk of blocking sewers.

There is still much more to do to clean up our rivers and coastlines, including reducing surface water runoff from roads and developments, designating more bathing waters, and tackling nutrient pollution. But the measures set out in the Plan for Water represent a credible and wideranging strategy to tackle the scourges of pollution and underinvestment that have blighted England's waterways for too long.

Simon Morton - In The Garden

Sowing the Seeds of Summer

Despite my protestations at the time, my school reports had it right. No matter which school I attended (and, let the record state, there were quite a few) nor which stage of my academic journey I was battling through, they all came to the same conclusion - 'Simon lacks patience' (they all also happened to mention that I viewed school as more of a social occasion than a place of education, but that's not important right now).

Patience is not a virtue I have ever possessed. And while this zest for trying new stuff might be charming in a child, it's a major character flaw in adulthood. My poor wife has to put up with my giddy excitement for every new hobby or passion - playing a wide variety of musical instruments, countless DIY projects, taking up golf, there's quite a list - and then deal with the subsequent

detritus as I realise that I don't have the time, tenacity and talent to get any of them over the line.

I simply don't have the patience for it. Never had. Never will.

This impatience has played havoc in the garden for many years, most notably in the greenhouse and, more specifically, in the lines of carefully labelled and symmetrically placed sowing trays. The thing is, I LOVE sowing. It's by far my favourite gardening job. There is something incredibly calming about the whole process of standing in a warming greenhouse, with a sleeping dog by your feet, radio on, a flask of coffee on the go and packets of seeds that need decanting into trays. Each step of the process, from mixing the compost (a cunning 1:3 mix of potting and regular peat-free compost seems to perform well) to sieving a light covering over the seeds, is an exercise in mindfulness. It's no wonder the NHS has started to prescribe 'gardening' as a treatment for depression and loneliness.

Clee Hill Community Wildlife Group Bird Survey

It's not too late to help with the Bird Survey, if you want to join in. We found seven pairs of Curlew last year, and we hope they have all come back. We need to count the breeding population, and monitor the outcome of nesting attempts, to see if any young fledge.

If you see or hear a Curlew, please tell us.

We would also like to know if you see or hear any Lapwing, Kestrel or Cuckoo, or see evidence of breeding Red Kite, please.

If you've seen or heard any of these species, please don't assume we know about them.

Please report all your observations, especially any Curlew ("the most important bird conservation priority in the UK")



So, Donald Trump has finally appeared in court to answer charges of falsifying business records with the main topic of interest the \$130,000 payment to an 'Adult' film actress. Given that this sum was allegedly paid as 'hush' money to conceal an affair, perhaps rather than claiming it as a 'Business' expense, it should have been shown as a 'Doing the Business' expense...

What is happening to the blood donation service? They used to have local events where donors could turn up without an appointment to have an armful removed. No longer. Now volunteers have to go to Kiddy or Stourport having booked a timed appointment and are turned away if all appointments for a session are filled. Once, during the Pandemic, at least they were allowed free parking but the next time around fines were issued. So, apart from the time and transport costs required to attend, there were parking penalties as well. That'll encourage people to come forward...This would be less of a problem if the blood banks were overflowing but we are being told that supplies are desperately short so why make it so difficult to donate? A cynic (me?) might wonder whether the blood isn't needed as so many operations are being delayed or cancelled.

If you walk down the main road approaching New Bridge, you might spy a small notice on the fence to your left. It is a planning application for a new sewage treatment plant by Severn Trent. This appears to be a well kept secret although there was talk of the need for more capacity some years ago. Looking at the plans on the Shropshire Council website (ref 23/00908/MAW if you are interested) reveals that ST are planning to build a new plant in the field just the Cleobury side of the river to the north of the A4117. There are 40 documents attached to the application and not all of them have been included in full so, given that the last date for comments was 21st April, this seems a little tardy. I understand that a request is being made to extend this date so it might change.

From my examination of what is there, it appears that the actual plant would be well away from the road with an access road from the A4117. The site won't be fully self contained as sludge would need to be exported by truck 2 or 3 times a month. Any storm overflow pipework would be joined with that of the existing plant and the site would not normally be staffed so let's hope nothing goes wrong... Still, if it does what it says on the tin, it might reduce the amount of effluent discharged into the Rea. Some time ago, Severn Trent were asked by Fish Legal, a campaign group, to give detailed figures for discharges into the Severn from their Worcester sewage treatment works which involved 81 spills totalling 3000 hours in 2021. This is the equivalent of discharging 24 hours a day for 125 days.... They declined to provide them saying that the records sought do not constitute environmental information (why not?), a decision which is being examined by the UK's data watchdog.

In a further development, the Shrewsbury River Classic fishing competition has been cancelled this year as the organisers felt that, due to levels of pollution in the river, competitors would be more likely to catch sanitary products than fish. ST say that the local sewage plant is due to be upgraded by 2025 but given that ST plants discharged sewage into rivers for nearly 250,000 hours in 2022, I wonder how much difference this will make. so nothing to see here....

And nothing to see in relation to the SNP accounts and the vanishing £600,000. Oh, apparently there is, with the arrest of the recently resigned Chief Executive, Peter Murrell who is also the husband of Nicola Sturgeon and the seizure of a nearly new and virtually unused £100,000 motorhome from his mother's house. He has now been released without charge pending further investigation so we will see what happens.





Welcome to the Month of May, a bridge between spring and summer, hinting at warmer weather for those still stuck in Spring's cooler grasp. This month for many will be the upcoming celebrations of the crowning of a new King, but for others the cause for some celebration of results in a darker side of life. For the last two years I have tried to highlight the scourge of the "con man" known today as "Scammers". These people take many forms and rarely have worked alone, often in what the Police refer to Organised Crime Groups (OCG for short). While much is read about the impact they can have on people's lives, little is heard about the successes in identifying them and shutting them down.

However in March and April this year, two significant announcements were made regarding coordinated efforts across the Globe to identify and arrest suspected scammers. The first was a huge alleged global fraud syndicate which has been smashed and its suspected British mastermind arrested. Law enforcers say the gang operated out of Malaysia, placing adverts on Facebook targeting savers, mainly in Britain and Australia.

One of the ringleaders was a 54 year old man from Birmingham along with his son and two other British Nationals. The gang had been operating since 2019 using promises that their money would be kept safe in escrow accounts and further reassured by professional-looking websites, which only lasted a few months before disappearing, with new ones taking their place.

A private cyber security firm estimated that the 20 individuals they represented had lost the equivalent of £35 billion. But don't be fooled into thinking that this is the sort of scam that does not target someone living in sleepy Shropshire. No one is safe from highly professional approaches using glossy convincing websites and techniques.

Follow the guidance I have been giving over these pages and you will stand a far better chance of keeping your money safe.

Also in March the National Crime Agency in Operation Henhouse made hundreds of arrests and millions in assets seized in tackling fraudsters.

The month-long activity, which resulted in 290 arrests by police forces, ROCUs and the NCA,

included high-value seizures, such as a BMW M5 Competition worth £96,000, and multiple luxury items including Rolex watches and jewellery. In total more than £6.2 million in assets was also seized or restrained.

Crime really does not pay!

But you may ask what happens to anything seized in the detection of crime. Criminal money is usually funnelled back into the relevant police force so as to aid in future crime prevention – reinvestment in police forces is paramount when fighting crime, especially in the current climate.

Assets are usually split between the police, the Crown Prosecution and the Home Office. High value items such as cars, jewellery and other significant assets will be auctioned off with the resulting money going to the public purse in many forms. In the case where an individual can be identified as having lost goods or money to a specific conviction this can be reimbursed directly. It just goes to show that some good might just come out of it in the long run when the illegal assets of flashy criminals are recycled back into our local communities

However, the DVLA, TV Licence and PayPal scams still go on, a recent scam email with a link to a Government web site went one step further with many links on the fake web site going to genuine pages of the real web site. This is upping the game from the scammers point of view, but the acid test as I have frequently advised is to check the source of the email by clicking on the sender. Expanding it to show the real sender will help to identify whether or not it is genuine.


Beware also there is an increase in Twitter and Instagram messages usually with a link to either a fake YouTube video or some other web page. At best it's just a harmless advert (although this is rare), at worst it's an attempt to infiltrate your mobile, tablet or computer to access your contacts or leave a nasty little hidden program to record all your keystrokes.


Follow the simple guidance, if you are not expecting it, be very careful how you handle it. If it's from someone you know, check by a different means that they really sent it and it's ok. Otherwise DELETE it!






