

He stressed, demonstrated, that Emma was very much more than the mistress of Horatio Nelson. Born Amy Lyon in 1765, she was of lowly stock, daughter of a Bright, Cheshire blacksmith. lively and beautiful, she moved London becoming companion of several wealthy including men, Sir Harry Fetherstonhaugh, who disowned her once she became From pregnant. understanding aristocrat, Greville, Charles she then obtained protection and some respectability, when he set up Emma (her new name) and her widowed mother in a cottage in Paddington Green. One visitor was Sir William Hamilton, who invited her and her mother to Naples, where he was the British Envoy. She was initially his companion, not lover, but he eventually proposed, and they married in 1791, remaining so until his death in 1803. By then she had been Nelson's mistress for several years, and they lived together until Nelson's death.

London alertness and displayed an intelligence surprising in one who had had such a poor beginning. She knew many notable figures, such as the King & Queen of Naples, Marie Antoinette, Goethe, Sheridan, Sir Joshua Reynolds, Haydn, and the Prince Regent. Of the many artists who painted her, George Romney was the most prolific, and many of his portraits attractive of survive.





THE MANOR HOUSE

It is officially spring and as I look out of my window, I am fortunate to watch new lambs frolicking in this spring sunshine. But I am sorry for those residents in the town whose windows overlook the Manor House. What a sad sight to wake up to every day. The visitors who grace us with their presence and spend some of their money in town leave with an impression that Love Cleobury is maybe not living up to the call.

The town council through the hard efforts of our Town Clerk has tried it's best to engage with the owner of the Manor House who no doubt looks out of his own front window and is not faced with

the eyesore that we are.

It's hard not to be convinced that living in the Home County of Buckinghamshire is a world away from what should be a significant responsibility for addressing the decay of this once wonderful 18th Century house. But that appears to

The saying, "Out of sight out of mind" seems very appropriate here. In the last newsletter we disclosed that vegetation appeared to be growing inside the lower rooms of the property, evidenced by the appearance of a branch of some plant or other inside the space between the glass and the shutters. This is most likely to happen when both light and moisture are present to enable growth and it begs the question that what else is growing inside that should not be there? There are various bodies in the UK that concern themselves with this rich heritage that is Great Britain, but it is also the case that properties have to reach a stage of decay or disrepair before organisations like English Heritage, The Georgian Society and others are either able to or have the available funding to go after those that own properties and effect change. Despite the support in our community, which is property that requires past, current and future amazing, and for which this campaign truly appreciates, it seems sometimes like a sone voice in condition. This covers the fabric of the building, the wilderness.

So it's time for change! Time to make some noise and grab the attention that we need to save this property from further decay and return it hopefully into a property that our town can be proud of and a contributor to our town's economy. The forthcoming elections for seats at the County table in Shrewsbury will take place on May 1st. Whichever party gains control of the Cabinet we sincerely hope that our campaign will gain some traction amongst those who wish to

roles and can only prioritise what the various Cabinet committees demand of them.

Many of us will be familiar with the case of Mr Bates versus the Post office where the little man took on the might of a huge organisation that was ignoring things going wrong under their very noses. Well we can take that crusade and take our campaign to the heart of County Government with a petition demanding that our local Conservation Officers use whatever powers are available to them to establish the exact internal condition of the Manor House. Pictures taken of the rear of the property show how easily that Mother Nature can take over and significant sting vegetation is pushing up against the rear walls of the property. Evidence is also showing that some mature trees are suffering damage and potential loss through total lack of management or maintenance and once again this is an issue given the property sits within a conservation area in the

So here is what we propose.

A request to raise a formal petition with Shropshire Council has not even acknowledged in well over 4 weeks. Therefore this newsletter contains the format for a petition with the UK wide CHANGE.ORG petition system that we invite everyone to sign and encourage friends and family who are not included on this newsletter to sign as well. Please click here to access the petition.

The petition is calling for the owner to permit officials from the County Conservation office to be allowed entry to the property to establish the internal condition and if necessary make orders for the owner to carry out whatever work is required to maintain the property in good order.

There is a paragraph in the Title Deeds of the owners of the Manor House to maintain it in good the grounds and the interior. None of these appear to have been maintained since the Manor House closed down as a Nursing Home nearly 15

So we urge you and anyone you know to please click on the link above or below to complete this petition and we will ensure it gets to Shire Hall in Shrewsbury after a new Council is elected. the will of course keep everyone informed through our social media pages and these newsletters.



Winging It in the Wild: One Man's Quest for Blisters and Solitude

Warning: this month's article has absolutely nothing to do with gardening. Not a single mention of mulch, seedlings, or slugs. You've been warned.

Instead, I'd like to waffle on about a new annual tradition I've adopted in recent years. Each year, I pack a bag, lace up my boots, and vanish for a week. No Wi-Fi, no responsibilities, and -mercifully - no one asking if I've ever tried companion planting.

Last year, it was the Northumberland Coast Path. Stunning views, hearty pub lunches, and a strong chance of being blown into the sea. And, of course, there's the gear. Oh, don't get me started on gear. I've become mildly obsessed with rucksacks - sorry, packs. That's what we seasoned walkers call them, don't you know? Choosing the right pack is a rabbit hole of straps, back ventilation, load distribution, and litres. So many litres. I now know more about pack ergonomics than I do about tax returns. It's oddly comforting.

Then there are the books. Tiny, waterproof guidebooks you can slip in your pocket without looking like you're smuggling a paperback novel or something else down your trousers. I've spent hours watching YouTube videos about blisters, weather-proof jackets, and which socks will "change your life." (Spoiler: they won't.)

This year I've learned to plan my mileage sensibly. Twenty miles on day one might feel heroic—until you wake up on day two walking like John Wayne after a particular bumpy cattle drive. No, it's a marathon, not a sprint. Maybe more of a plod, perhaps? Yes - that's it - a scenic, windswept plod. Accommodation? Let's be honest. It's just me. so I'm not seeking high-thread-count sheets or a minibar. My perfect stopover involves a bed upstairs and a pint and a pie downstairs. Pubs are top of the list. B&Bs, acceptable. Hotels? Only in an emergency or if I've taken a wrong turn and ended up somewhere unexpectedly swanky.

Packing will begin shortly, which means the house will be strewn with kit, and I'll descend into that delightful mental cocktail of excitement, panic, and vague dread. I'll wonder whether I've packed too much (Answer: yes.) and I'll question my decision to do this sort of thing on my own. (Answer: still yes.)

And why the Isle of Man? Simple. I not only like coastal walks, I'm also a huge fan of navigational ease. If the sea stays on my left, I know I'm going the right way. If it's on my right, I've either turned around or had a breakdown.

So, off I go—armed with maps, overconfidence, and a small pharmacy's worth of blister plasters. Wish me luck.

And no, still not gardening. Maybe next month.
