THE NEEN SOLLARS SOLAR POWER FARM

We cannot turn our backs on the problem of generating the power that supports modern life. Dreams of going back to a rural idyll of 100 years ago tend to shatter if the winter shopping actually means a pony and trap ride and not the Range Rover.

There are many alternatives on offer, with solar the current favourite; silent, obtrusive only if very large and badly sited, but relatively simple to instal and offering a long life with low maintenance costs.

But when a plan to generate enough electricity for 1300 or so houses means a modest but visible piece of landscape being transformed, hackles and voices rise together. That is what is happening in Neen Sollars and on Page 47 we have tried to summarise the opposing views without taking any side. Read the two views and maybe look a little deeper into the matter before you decide what is right. But do please remember that the countryside does not stand still, even if our dreams of its scenes do.

THE TOWN IS GROWING - BUT HOW MUCH IS TOO MUCH?

The demand for housing in Shropshire inevitably means that market towns such as Cleobury will grow. There will be opposition, and both old hands and newcomers will say "No more" because they don't want too much change. But the world is changing, and to refuse to change is to fall behind.

There are benefits of growth; the new Medical Centre is a good example that will serve everyone in the community. To mention new toilets may seem to be an extreme, but how many other towns have been afforded that luxury in this time of severe cuts? The sports Childe facilities at Lacon School and in the Fitness Centre (or whatever the long damaged sign spells out this week) are outstanding for a town the size of ours. And what more can you say about the Cleobury Country Centre, our community centre effect, home to the library and a buzzing centre of training and community events.



And let's not forget the Market Hall, shown above, one of the restorations that led the town forward, thanks to the vision of the late Adrian Pearce, JP. Once that old wreck had been turned into a place to be proud of, people realised that Cleobury Mortimer could get things done. Chris Dimond and his inspired thinking followed and all around you can see the benefits of his unpaid work.

We are fortunate in having a council who are forward looking while still respecting our heritage - we have a lot of that. But the message we are giving to the world outside is that Cleobury Mortimer is an historic place with its feet firmly in the 21st century.

CLEE HILL'S MISSING MAN RESTORED

The memorial commemorating men from Clee Hill and Knowbury who gave their lives in two World Wars, has been refurbished and the names of the fallen repainted. And a further name and a decoration for bravery has been added to the obelisk in the Church Yard of St Paul's, Knowbury.

This serious omission was discovered by Helen and Alan Iones, members of the Clee Hill Branch of the Royal British Legion who painstakingly researched the histories of all the local men killed. Thev discovered that Private Ernest John Kitson, who was buried in Hampstead Cemetery, had been left off the memorial and an honour bestowed on Private Henry Genner, the DCM, had also been omitted. These errors have now been corrected.

Major Adrian Coles, MBE, a Vice President of the Legion, who instigated the work on the memorial, said that Clee Hill Branch were very grateful to Caynham Parish Council who paid for the work. He also thanked others involved in their s u p p o r t o f t h e refurbishment. He said "Most of those that died, forty four of them, a very large number, came

from Clee Hill and we, as a community, should always remember the sacrifices that they and their families gave for this country".

Major Coles is now a Pensioner of the Royal Hospital in Chelsea and attends functions wearing the world famous scarlet coat and medals. Fay Vass, Secretary of Clee Hill Royal British Legion added "We are very pleased Ernest John Kitson is now on the memorial where he rightly belongs, along with the other 43 men from this area who gave their lives in conflict."





THE CLEOBURY CHRONICLES. SOMETHING SPECIAL

Volume 11 of the History Society's respected Chronicles of the town is a very fine addition to the written record. It is a 100 page commemoration of the sacrifice in the 1914-18 World War, when 29 men from Cleobury Mortimer were lost.

Each of those men is honoured with a record of birthplace - a few were not natives of the town - and background as well as each one's military record and medals won. It is a painstaking piece of research for which Paddy Treves deserves high praise, as do Robert Hodge and Mark Baldwin for the quality of the production.

The Parish Council have generously decided to present a copy to every pupil at Lacon Childe and Cleobury Primary Schools, while the local branch of the Royal British Legion is providing one to every member. Because of this response to such a quality reminder of a conflict that changed Europe forever, the price has been held at £6.00, which makes this excellent value for money. For every copy sold, the History Society will make a donation to the Poppy Appeal.

It is available from the Society's website on www.cleoburymortimerhistory.co.uk, from Baldwin's Bookshop, from the Library or you can find it on Amazon. The History Society quietly work away with occasional publicity; this is a real feather in their cap.



Diabetes

They call it 'starvation in plenty'. Diabetes in animals is very similar to the disease in humans. Insulin acts on the cells within the body to make glucose travel from the bloodstream (where it is useless) into the cells (where it can be used). A lack of insulin production from an organ called the pancreas means that the sugars taken in with their food don't make it into the cells. Instead they stay in the bloodstream.

The body has an overflow system for sugars in the kidneys. If there is too much sugar in the blood, it is passed out in the urine, but this (through osmosis) pulls more water with the urine leading to excessive urination, and the dog has to compensate by drinking more. Another side effect is that the sugar in the urine provides an excellent growth medium for bacteria, meaning diabetic dogs are more prone to recurrent urine infections.

However the main problem is that the brain cannot function without glucose. The body panics and starts breaking down fats to make ketones (a reasonable energy substitute for most tissues), but the brain MUST have glucose. This can lead to diabetic crises, comas, and death.

'Starvation in plenty' – the dog is usually eating very well, but continues to lose weight as the body panics into using fats as energy.

Hopefully all of the above highlights the importance of that little question that we always ask you; "Is he drinking well? Normal amounts? Or more than normal?", and members of our Pet Health Plan can request a free urine test with every checkup

for dogs over the age of seven. Often a quick urine test can highlight problems early and allow us time to start treatment before things get too poorly.

The best thing that you can do to try and avoid your pet becoming diabetic is to control their bodyweight closely. Our brilliant nurses at Cleobury run free pet weight checks and will provide all appropriate advice to get your pooch back into fine form.

Cats can also suffer from diabetes, and require the same treatment as dogs with regular insulin injections. Overweight cats are more likely to become diabetic than their slim cousins.

Happenings on High Street

WHOOPS!



Not a good way to start the day.

High Street traffic was delayed on the morning of August 7th as it picked its way around a Mercedes truck stuck in the pavement outside the Wash House. Not an early customer trying to get the laundry done, it was making a delivery to the Londis store and mounted the pavement as it tried to get into a convenient kerbside space. But a laden truck is too heavy for a trio of drain covers to take and the Merc's front wheel sank in.

One report told us that the driver said it would be possible to reverse the truck out, but he didn't want to leave a gaping hole in the pavement. So the truck sat there until a barrier could be put around the hazard. Top marks to the man for thinking that way, but not for driving up a pavement. They are for pedestrians, you know.

The damage has been put right, and there are three new drain covers in place. We're not sure if they are the truck-proof variety.

LEAVING THE HIGH STREET FOR BIGGER THINGS

Ashley and Estelle Pugh have been looking to move their bakery operation from its High Street base for two years or more. The demise of Cornbrook Homes presented them with the chance to move up the Bridgnorth road a little to the Old Town Station Business Park. There's not a lot more room than they have at present, but it will be an easier building to lay out the workplace to meet the growing demand for their breads and cakes.

"We'll actually have the house ourselves now," Estelle explained at the Farmers' Market. "It's a pity in a way, as it's been a bakery for 110 years." The Pughs have come a long way in 25 years, since they offered sandwiches and cakes from the tiny High Street shop then moved into a bakery and on to open the Cleobury Cafe and shops in both Bewdley and Tenbury Wells. Today they employ about 25 people and this latest move will make the whole operation easier to run. They are a really good example of doing the job right and achieving your goal.

AND JUST OFF HIGH STREET...

A change of management at the Stable Tavern, where owner John Green has been trying to re-establish the place's restaurant trade, having spent some serious cash on a kitchen refit. Terry Windmill wanted to run it as just a simple pub and inevitably there was a parting of the ways over its future direction.

So it's goodbye Terry and hello to Andrew Davis, better known as Daisy, who used to run The Old Lion in Lower Street. Expect an announcement about food soon.

THE LAMP SHINES ON

The Agility Test really puts a dog's training through it. This is Emma, manager of the kennels, bringing her charge to a stop on a steep descent.

The weather was kind on August 17th and a good crowd of doggie people filled a busy field in front of the Forest Dog Rescue Centre kennels. There were a series of agility tests for the dogs, including some that had only been training for this for twelve months. The trust an owner can command, as his pet charges into tubular bend where he can see no exit, has to be seen. And when one shy mutt turned off several times and went back to his new found mates, it showed this is not an easy task they face. All with a good commentary that

explained what was happening and built a little tension.

In the neighbouring ring, the current stock of dogs for rehoming were paraded, again with a clear explanation in the commentary. Then people who had taken on rescue dogs had the chance to show how well behaved they were as they walked calmly next to their new owners. Impressive.

Neil Salter explained how big this movement is: "At the Nationals in Corby, there were 15 rings for the agility test, 3,000 dogs entered and 450 caravans on site. When booking for camping sites opened, they sold the lot in 50 minutes!" Dogs are big business.



Ken Price, who has a stable at Little Lakes, had brought along two Shetland ponies for youngsters to ride. proceeds to the kennels' funds. As you'd expect, the children could not resist the chance to ride or try to groom the gentle, patient miniature horses whose appeal is universal.

If you commute via M5 and 42, you'll have noticed the Hall Green Retired Greyhound Trust on the A491 to Hagley. It's supported by Hall Green Stadium in Birmingham, and exists to help find new owners for dogs whose racing life is over. These retired athletes don't need loads of exercise and are patient, gentle companions who only show their racing history in the graceful way they move when off the lead.

This was a lovely, family event, with loads to do and a variety of animals well beyond friendly tail waggers. Worth putting in your diary for next year and if you're looking for a family pet, this is a very good place to start.



Letter from Westminster -Philip Dunne MP

This month voters in Scotland will go to the polls to decide the future of our Union. The outcome of this referendum will have profound repercussions, both for Scotland and the UK as a whole. In both my role as a Minister for Defence and as a whole hearted supporter of the Union, I have been pleased to support the campaign to keep the UK together. I have long maintained that Alex Salmond and others arguing for Scottish independence have serious questions left to answer, and with the referendum only days away, they remain unanswered.

As a member of the United Kingdom, Scotland benefits from membership of a number of international organisations, in particular the EU and NATO. An independent Scotland would have to apply to join the EU, and each of the other 27 member states would have a veto. It is not guaranteed that Scotland's accession to the EU would be automatic and would likely take years to achieve. All new EU member states are required to commit to the Euro as their eventual currency. Conservatives, Liberal Democrats and Labour have all agreed that an independent Scotland would not be able to use the pound, so a change in Scotland's currency may well be forced upon an independent Scotland. The only way for Scotland to keep the UK pound is to keep the UK, so those advocating Yes need to be straight about what their currency plan is.

Within my ministerial role I have seen at first hand the direct benefits of UK defence investment in Scotland. HMS Queen Elizabeth, officially named by Her Majesty in July, serves as a reminder of the importance of UK defence to jobs and growth in Scotland. Around 4,000 jobs in shipyards across Scotland are directly linked to this programme and from 2015 the Clyde will be the UK's single sovereign capability for building complex warships. Other than during the World Wars, the UK has not had a complex warship built outside the UK since at least the start of the 20th Century. The Government has made this choice to protect our national security interests and sustain the strengths of UK industry. There are no Government plans to change this policy in the event of Scottish independence.

An independent Scottish state would lose the benefits of one of the largest defence budgets in the world and of an integrated approach to defence that currently protects all parts of the UK. The start-up costs and complexity of establishing separate defence capabilities for an independent Scottish state would be significant, and have not been factored into the Scottish Government's budget estimates. Imagine the costs of building and equipping new training centres for all troops, new ships, planes, tanks and intelligence systems.

I was in Scotland last month for the Tattoo in Edinburgh Castle, attended a number of Festival and Fringe events and enjoyed a week's holiday in the Highlands with my family. I firmly believe the United Kingdom is better with Scotland as a key part of it. Both nations are better together.

Clarion Coppers With PCSO Nick Morris



These are the reported crimes for the area for the last month until the time of writing on August 14th. Or to put it another way - the activity of horrible, selfish people.

An empty factory unit was broken into in Boraston Lane, Burford between July 19th and July 21st. Copper cable worth £400 was stolen. At 6:20pm on July 20th two males were caught on CCTV stealing two bottles of whisky from the shelves at Tuffins. The investigation is ongoing to try and trace the offenders. In the early hours of July 24th there was a theft of 1400 litres of heating oil from a detached property in Stottesdon. Between 10:00pm on July 25th and 9:00am the next day a dovecote worth £100 was stolen from a front garden in Vaughan Road. In the early hours of August 2nd a home made trailer worth £500 was stolen from the side of a lane in front of a house in Clee Hill. A Landrover Defender was stolen from the public car park at Tenbury Country Show in the afternoon of August 2nd. The vehicle had been securely locked. Overnight on August 3rd/4th there was a burglary at a business unit on Bridgnorth Road where a CCTV system was de-activated and computer equipment stolen together with construction materials and power tools. It is thought that those responsible may be known, because they knew how to access the site without causing damage. A burglary took place at a stable near Kinlet between 2:30pm on August 4th and 10:30 am on August 5th; a large petrol mower was one of the items stolen. Criminal damage was caused to a motor horsebox at Hopton Wafers between 4:00pm on August 1st and 2:00pm on August 11th; it appears that the intention of the offender was to cause further serious damage. Whilst it was parked in Langland Road in front of the rear gate to St Mary's Place between 8:00am and 9:00am on August 11th, a car was 'keyed' on the and rear passenger doors. investigation has commenced into a large scale theft of fuel at Kinlet which was reported on 11th. Another business unit Bridgnorth Road was broken into between 5:00pm on August 11th and 7:30am on August 12th. Four chainsaws had been moved ready to steal but it is thought that the thieves were disturbed and left the scene. Overnight on August 13th/14th a hedge cutter and other tools were stolen after a shed was broken into at a property in Covert Lane, Billingsley.

From September 1st there will be a number of front counters in police stations across West Mercia and Warwickshire having their opening hours reduced, and some police stations will not now offer a front counter service. Stations where the front counters will are Kidderminster, Shrewsbury, Worcester, Hereford, Telford and Redditch. All other stations will have 24/7 intercoms for connection to a police call taker. The main method of contacting the police is by phoning 101 for non emergency calls - 999 is for reporting emergencies only. This is at least as efficient as reporting something at a police station. If you have other business you will be given the correct advice. For instance, if you have some found property it will be arranged for someone to collect it from you. All this is down to having to save money whilst remaining efficient.



The Farming Page - Catherine and John Evans of Broome Park

This year our harvest seems very stop/start. When the weather was perfect at the first part of July nothing was ready to combine and now the crops are ready the weather is changeable. It is a constant dilemma – whether to harvest the crop when it is slightly damp then dry in the shed or wait for the optimum moisture level and miss the opportunity due to the weather. Ideally corn is harvested when the moisture content is around 14 - 16% and we use a meter to test a sample of the crop before starting to combine. If there is a weather window and we need to get on then we will combine anything up to 20% and then dry the crop in the shed or corn bins. Obviously this incurs additional cost so this is used as a last resort. The next problem has been breakages, fortunately nothing major with the combine so far this year but lots of trouble with the dryer and the auger which is used to move the corn from dryer to bin. This is an Archimedes screw inside a metal

casing that winds the corn from one location to another.

Where our food comes from and how it is produced has been under the spotlight in the media again and I watched with interest a programme about meat and methane. production I concerned to see the presenter advocating intensive farming methods, particularly for beef, showing American system where cattle are kept in enormous sheds and fed a diet mainly derived from maize to bulk them up quickly. Whilst this may reduce the amount of methane produced I am sure the meat produced must lack complexity and flavour, also the dependence on maize may be contributing to the increasing obesity of the American population. Please don't stop eating meat as a result of these programmes but instead, source top quality, locally produced meat from a butcher or farm shop, pay a bit more and eat a little less! ANOTHER GOOD PLACE TO EAT

The progress of the Royal Fountain pub from sad closure to revival and on to be one of the most popular drinking places is an interesting process. The gardens have had a makeover to be even better for families and the recent Sausages and Cider promotion saw the place rammed full.

Alan and Helen continue to plough money back into the place with new furniture in the bars. And the introduction of food has meant recruiting a chef, local man Ross Hector. He learned his craft at The Feathers in Ludlow before getting a post nearer home - he's a true Cleobury Mortimer

chap, born here, educated here and still living in the place. So the travelling expenses are low.

We promised last month to test the new Mediterranean menu offering and early in August shared a table and a bottle of red with John Carter. He had already eaten at home so didn't indulge; I would have offered him a chip, but this is not that sort of caff.

I started with chorizo in red wine, a spicy reminder of good days in Spain, then moved to a pizza for the main course. Ross hand pulls his pizza bases and uses team's own range of toppings; the result was one of the best pizzas I've ever had. Carter, ever the realist, said "It is just a pizza, you know." Yes, quite so. But I've eaten pizzas in cities throughout Europe, including Rome, and this was as good as any I can remember. It's miles from what you buy off the super market shelf, it's pizza as it should be made.

When I called to get a photo of Ross, he and Helen were working on a new menu to start this month. On this showing, I must go back to see and taste what's new. A good addition to Cleobury's quality.

APPLETEME

Have you seen the BBC Midlands TV News series on Farmers' Markets? One featured the ancient Ludlow gathering and Jane Cullen with AppleTeme's range of natural juices. Jane was Head of English at Lacon Childe and when she retired bought into the business to join Tish Docherty.

Their focus is on locally grown apple varieties, hand picked and processed produce small batches of very fine juices. I've recently tried a Tangy and a Medium and can strongly recommend them; at £2.25 a bottle from their market stall this is top value. The tangy 'Sweeney's Bite' I tried uses the juice of Scotch Bridget and Sweeney Nonpareil to gently tickle your tastebuds and leave you wanting more. The two also have a stall at the Craven Arms Local Produce market.

Take a look at their website on www.appleteme.com to learn more about a small local producer with a big taste and reputation. And if you get a chance to try a bottle, please do grab it with both hands. It adds to Ludlow's name as a foodie place.

Linda Iles September In The Wyre Forest



Here we are, recovering from a rather wet day in August sent to try the organisers of the Far Forest Show. Considering everything it went pretty well, with a good few punters wandering among the stands. Along with the poultry tent, the ferret racing, the vintage caravans and the 'duck dog' demonstration, there were excellent cakes on sale, which makes it well worth the entrance fee in my book. The Wyre Community Land Trust's stand offered a chance to pat a sheep or watch oak logs being cleft by hand (using those fine ancient tools, the froe, draw knife and shaving horse) into pallets for fencing.

The purpose of all this, apart from entertainment value, was to engage with local people and help them find out about two aspects of the Trust's work which are slowly and quietly transforming the Wyre Forest for good. As I've written before in these articles, the Forest includes among its acres of broadleaves and conifers a number of meadows and orchards, which contribute valuable habitats in addition to the woodland and help to give us the variety of wildlife which we so enjoy. The best way to keep the wildflowers in these grasslands is to put sheep or cattle on them at specific times of the year, which can be adjusted to allow certain species to seed or, for instance, for young adders to find their way safely into cover. The WCLT has a herd of Dexter cattle (58 at the last count) who spend their time doing the good work of munching pastures belonging to public and private landowners and converting grass into beef. The Wyre is such a complicated forest that no commercial outfit would bother with the many negotiations, grant applications and animal movements needed to make it all work.

Good results are already being seen, with rich flower meadows being conserved and allowed to spread, and the attendant butterflies and other species thriving alongside them.

The other theme is timber production and use. In common with most woods in the UK, the Wyre Forest has some areas that are managed productively and others not managed at all. What we have is a sustainable resource which could provide firewood, fencing and garden poles and also top quality timber for buildings and furniture. Markets need to be developed and small businesses encouraged. The result of increased production will be a change in the forest landscape but that won't necessarily be a bad thing. The needs of wildlife and those who want to enjoy the woods can be taken into account in an holistic planning process.








IN BUSINESS: Rae Luckett's Quercus Landscapes



Talking to Rae Luckett, it seems that she was destined to do landscape design from an early age. "I've always wanted to work outside. I just love nature, I'm outdoorsy," she admits.

Early student days brought her a B.Tech in Building Construction and a job with architectural giant Aedas. It's no surprise that she was there as a landscape technician, and showed enough prowess for the company to sponsor her for a degree course at Manchester. There's an extra dimension with such jobs, and she will happily take people to

Paul's Landscape Plants on the Bridgnorth Road to see just what each plant looks like. Such a good facility nearby is a great help, and as the customer's choice of plants is the final decider on a job, it does help all parties. She also of fers a follow-up maintenance service if a private customer asks for it.

Which does she prefer when planning a garden, a greenfield site or a mature garden suffering neglect? "The established garden, because there are things there you can easily develop."

Would she see her son Archie - see August's front cover - following her into the business? "I'd love to think so," and she smiles at the idea.

The seeds of that may have been planted, through the Garden Club that she helps with at Abberley Primary School. They entered the CPRE's schools competition at this year's Malvern Show and won top marks for their scheme. "It was very carefully run, with the children having to be involved at every stage," she recalls. There were 22 schools entered, of all ages, and Abberley Primary brought home the CPRE prize.
