BEWDLEY'S ST GEORGE'S HALL

St George's Hall in Bewdley is today a real community hub. Originally the hall belonged to The George Hotel and was used as a ballroom and for functions. When the owners sold the hotel they bequeathed the hall to the town of Bewdley to be managed by the four main churches there.. Trustees were appointed from each church and the hall was run and managed by them for many years. By the late 90's the hall was becoming tired and in need of renovation.

Bewdley Festival, established in 1987, was looking for a venue to hold arts and literature events so the committee approached the trustees and jointly they managed to get funding from the Lottery and others to commence extension and refurbishment of the hall. The hall was extensively modernised and reopened in 2013. Today there is a very successful community cafe, arts exhibition, weekly cinema, monthly music events and many more uses.

All of these events are run entirely by volunteers with one part time paid administrator. The volunteers offer so much to the local community that in 2019 they were nominated for the Queens Award for Volunteers, the highest award for such work. In May this year we heard that the nomination had been successful and they had won this prestigious award.

Due to the pandemic no celebrations can be held but once things get back to normal the Lord Lieutenant of the County will present the award and two volunteers will be invited to a garden party at Buckingham Palace. Congratulations to everyone who has worked so hard to make the hall the success it is today.

LOOKING BACK WITH CYRIL BREAKWELL

In the early 1930s I was in primary school in Farlow and our school went on a trip to Cadbury's at Bournville in Birmingham. We started the day walking three miles from home at Hill Houses in Farlow to Detton Station, to get the train to Cleobury Junction, where we boarded the train to Kidderminster and changed again there for Birmingham.

When we boarded the train to Cadbury's, the lad I sat by thought the train was bound to end in a shop window with the rocking of the sideways movement. He really did get frightened.

We were taken around the different operations in the factory, where most of the different jobs were done by hand. I remember most of all going into a large room, full of ladies sat at rows of long tables, just picking up toffees with what looked like a long needle, dipping them in chocolate, thus becoming chocolate toffees. I had never seen so many ladies in one place.

When we came away we all got a little bag of different things they made at that time, various chocolates and cocoa drinks. The return trip was the same as the inward one, ending with the walk from Detton Station.

AND THERE'S MORE

I met Cyril in his bungalow to collect the handwritten tale that you've just read. Such a welcoming man with a fund of memories to tell.

If you've been following his stories from earlier editions you'll know that he was a coach driver for many years. But he had a broader experience than that and at one time drove for BRS, or British Road Services to give them their full name. I remember them well, having worked for them myself as a driver more than 50 years ago, delivering parcels in a variety of Austin trucks with a carrying capacity up to five tons; heavier loads than that and you had to have a Heavy Service Vehicle or HSV licence.

Cyril's time with BRS saw him working out of their depot on Clee Hill, where his truck had a steel load floor, so able to move stone from the quarry all over the country. He can still recall his final load of 9 x 5 stones (nine inches long and five inches wide) used to form the bed on which the highway would be built up.

One Friday night the manager asked Cyril to report early next day for a special delivery. It was the tar tank from the old road works, to be transported to Leicester. "It was a Saturday and Wolves were playing at home," he told me. "I left at 4.00, so I'd be back for the match."

The tank had been left with tar still in there, set cold; weight about ten tons. Off he went to Groby in Leicester, where a special framework had been erected to lift the tank, when he'd drive the lorry clear and the tank would be lowered. But that load of cold tar was too much for the crane, which collapsed onto Cyril's lorry.

So the wreckage of the crane had to be cleared before they could drag the heavy tank onto the loading platform and Cyril could head for home. Needless to say, he missed the Wolves game.

A lovely man, it was a privilege to talk to him......*JR*



For much of the time since the previous Mawley Hall Estate newsletter, the world has been operating against the backdrop of the coronavirus pandemic.

This has had implications for work everywhere, and Mawley Hall has been no exception. We have, of course, had the advantage in that much of the work currently being carried at Mawley is in the open air and that individuals have been able to work at a distance from each other. Throughout the Estate we have ensured that working practices have been adjusted to protect all concerned from the risk of infection, and we have been able to carry out a good deal of work.

During the period of lockdown, we have been aware that more people than usual have been taking advantage of the footpaths and bridleways which cross the Estate for exercise and enjoyment. They will have seen the continuing work associated with the repair of dry stone walling and with the management of woodlands.

Work is nearing completion on the replanting of seven hectares of woodland on the western side of the Estate using mixed native species including oak, beech, hazel, wild service, hornbeam and lime. Some sweet chestnut saplings have also been included. Although not native, the sweet chestnut has been naturalised in Britain and is common throughout the Estate.

In addition, approximately 100 more specimen parkland trees have been planted in various parts of the estate. These have been protected with tree guards which in materials and design coordinate with the cleft oak and chestnut fencing which is in the process of being erected throughout the entire Estate.

February saw the second of two major flooding incidents of 2019/20, the first

having taken place in October. Amongst other things, these caused significant damage to the Estate's waterfall and surrounding structures, necessitating urgent repair.

The waterfall is, though, the responsibility of the Estate. Thankfully, before the October flooding we had identified a deep scour hole at the base of the waterfall, which we filled. Had we not done so it is probable that the waterfall would have collapsed completely. Mawley has now submitted an application to the planners for the approval of repairs and reconstruction of the waterfall to ensure that it lasts for many more years.

Shropshire County Council, which is responsible for the Upper Forge footbridge over the river which forms part of a footpath, has closed the bridge for the time being for reasons of safety pending a full assessment of any damage it may have sustained as a result of the flooding.

Work has now begun on the construction of an energy centre for the Estate situated close to the North Lodge. This is being built to provide an environmentally sustainable means by which to generate heating and hot water for the principal buildings on the Estate through a central system. The provision of heating is an essential requirement for repair and restoration.

The energy centre will extract geothermal energy from the ground, utilising a network of underground pipes which will be buried in the area known as Parker's Plantation where non-native forestry trees have been felled. The stumps of those trees have been ground out and, once the pipes have been buried, the ground will then be replanted as pasture once again.

THE FOOTPATH ASSOCIATION

In mid August we got the goahead to restart work parties. Restricted measures, no more than six people per work group, social distancing, hand hygiene, not sharing tools and travelling to sites separately. So work party routine will change: rather than once a month, small groups will be put together to do one task on an agreed date.

September, a month when digging holes and the ground is often too dry. There are a couple of jobs which do not need digging so we will get going with those first.

One pressing job is dealing with the missing footbridge on the Simon Evans Way at Reaside. We are talking to local landowners to come up with a solution as a new bridge from the council is unlikely. A padlocked gate at Southwood farm is no longer an immediate problem as the gate is not locked. But it is a problem.

A stile needs repair at Bank Top Farm and others are in need of attention on the path between New House Farm and Barnsland. There is work to be done on the canal towpath at Marlbrook, a problem at the old Horse and Jockey pub and an overgrown stile off Stockhall lane. Plus wobbly stile steps and fingerposts in need of attention.

Our main challenge is the supply of furniture from Shropshire Council, especially gates. All the volunteer groups in Shropshire are in need of stock.

If you have enjoyed our local footpaths in the lockdown, you may have gained an idea what it takes to keep them open. If so and you have the time to help us, please get in touch.







Letter from Westminster



Planning how as a society we decide what buildings get built where, to serve which need, is one of the perennial conundrums of local and national politics. There is no right answer which will satisfy everyone. So devising a system of decision-making which achieves the myriad objectives of those who need to live and work in buildings, during a time of population growth when not enough homes have been built, calls for radical action.

The government has had some success in reforming the planning system since 2010, with the National Planning Policy Framework contributing to more local involvement in deciding how our communities develop, and cutting away red tape. Together, the changes have meant that last year we delivered over 241,000 homes, more new homes than at any point in the last 30 years, all while continuing to protect our environment, heritage and Green Belt.

But frustratingly, the ambition to own your own home remains a distant dream for many young people. There is a significant generational divide, as demand for housing has grown but supply has failed to keep up. Aside from the relative price stability in the mid-1990s, and the financial crash of 2008, house prices have grown consistently over the years.

We cannot ignore the effect our planning system has on the supply of housing. Local authorities take on average seven years to generate a comprehensive housing plan for an area. Developers take on average five years to get permission to build. As we have seen in South Shropshire this can often be followed by very slow delivery of homes with the roads, schools, hospitals and other community infrastructure support their occupants require.

Last month the government launched 'Planning for the Future', setting out proposals to facilitate a more diverse and competitive housing industry, in which smaller builders can thrive alongside the big players, where all pay a fair share of the costs of infrastructure and the affordable housing communities require and where planning permissions are more swiftly turned into homes.

This Green Paper is subject to full public consultation. I would encourage local residents to have their say before the deadline of 29th

October. Full details of the consultation can be found at https://www.gov.uk/government/consultations/planning-for-the-future.

In addition to these long-term changes, the government introduced new rules to boost housing density in the short-term, allowing residential blocks of three storeys or more, as well as terrace buildings in certain commercial uses and mixed-use buildings, to extend upward to create new self-contained homes. A new right on demolition and rebuilding will support the regeneration of vacant and redundant buildings that no longer effectively serve their original purpose, support housing delivery and boost housing density.

These changes should help deliver the growing need for housing while also reducing pressure to build on greenfield sites. Exemptions exist for National Parks, Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty and conservation areas.

The reforms come at a crucial time, since a new Future Homes Standard for all new homes is being developed to ensure that housing quality and energy efficiency continues to improve across the country. I shall be keenly holding Government to account (as chairman of the Environmental Audit Committee) to raise energy efficiency standards of all new buildings, including those constructed under Permitted Development Rights.

Locally, Shropshire Council is undertaking its own review of development in the county, with a draft Local Plan which sets out where and how much development should take place in Shropshire to 2038. This too is under public consultation until the end of this month, so I encourage all those concerned to look at the proposals and have your say at https://shropshire.gov.uk/get-involved/reg-18-pre-submission-draft-local-plan-consultation/.

My hope is that these changes, taken together, will result in a good supply of housing in Shropshire, that takes into account local views. But this is dependent on as many people as possible having your say through these public consultations, to help frame our communities for the future.

When we agreed to meet for this interview, she mailed to say she'd be late because she was dealing with a nervous puppy and had to spend time getting to know the dog and make it feel at ease with her.

Read some of the comments on her Facebook page and you will realise that not all the people in this business have that approach. Dogs that have been bullied will not come back willingly to repeat such an experience. Which you would think was an obvious approach to adopt, but some hairy stories make it clear that's not so. Anna gets to know and build a rapport with both dog and owner, so that she understands what the owner wants and how to get the dog to relax and enjoy the luxury of a bath and a trim or whatever is the big treat this time.

She works out of Great Witley and simple economics dictate her limiting travel because of time and costs. 20 minutes is her normal range, but if there is a chance to service a number of dogs in one day - a normal maximum is four - she can travel further. With business growing because of her understanding of the animals she deals with, you can see the demand building.

THE SWIFT WATCH

Kit Smith with news of our summer visitors and many other fascinating species.

Our swifts have been and gone, having entertained us for three months with their antics in the air. They did not arrive from Africa until May 5th and left late, with stragglers still here until August 12th. It has been an odd summer for many animals, who seem to have altered some of their behaviours due to lack of human interference and possibly climate change.

Swift numbers of breeding pairs have held up well at approximately 12 pairs in Cleobury despite national figures for them, Swallows and Martin being down a bit on previous years. By now Swifts will be back in Africa after the long flight there. Let's hope that they prosper there and return to a more normalised UK next year.

Our two main raptors, Owls and Buzzards have been active. The Buzzard pair nesting in the pine trees of Clavers, fledged at least one chick last month. Their nesting so close to the town has been a delight for many people. Owls have been busy as well with adults and owlets making quite a lot of noise at night this summer. The placing of up to eight additional owl boxes should start again this month despite the social distancing required for the nest box team. There have been reports of Red Kites which have spread from the west and maybe in 2021 they will start to nest here. Kit Smith

CATHERTON COMMON

We must have had one of the hottest and driest summers on record this year. Fantastic if you are out relaxing but a mixed blessing for wildlife. Some species of birds and insects have done very well producing plenty of offspring. I just hope it hasn't had too bad an impact on the wetter parts of Catherton Common where many of our rarer plants and animals rely on the constant wet conditions and do not cope well with drying out.

On a positive note cuckoos seem to have done well around the common. They have all gone now but earlier in the summer we had four on the common being shouted at by the meadow pipits, one of the birds whose nests are targeted by the cuckoo for their eggs. The meadow pipits also seem to be doing well.

I'm sure we have all been driving with our windows down most of the time trying to keep cool but please take care not to drop cigarettes, so far we have been lucky enough to avoid serious fires. Talking of driving I have noticed there seem to be more cars travelling on the roads across the common since lock down eased. My Volunteer Reserve Wardens have reported a number of near misses with sheep and couple of fatalities. The sheep and cattle can be unpredictable, particularly the lambs and calves. They are a critical part of the common and need to be respected by drivers so please drive carefully.



More Sheep Tales Marian Rees

A friend hinted that he would like to hear more of my experiences as a shepherd/lamber, so here goes...

Did you know sheep can count? I remember on our farm when a ewe had triplets. We had the family penned in an enclosure for perhaps two or three days, then we ended a lamb for another ewe and took one off her. She called and called for this lamb for ages. In most cases ewes are better off with just two lambs, a ewe rearing three or four can develop sore teats, perhaps painful mastitus when the lambs develop teeth. They fight over the milk supply and bite the udder.

My uncle gave me a middle-age sheep once, perhaps five years old; we called her Flop-Ear. She became a well-loved character, a bit spoilt, and every year without fail produced twins until she became very old. We guessed she was well over 20 years old when she walked off to a faraway place on the farm and passed away. I forget if we gave her an official burial; I hope we did.

I was given a pretty, pure white Welsh lamb from another uncle in Wales. We spent many holidays at his farm and I expect I came home with the lamb in a cardboard box. One day before going to school, I was probably doing 'the shed rounds' and found her in a normal sleeping position against a chicken shed but dead. A post mortem revealed she had been struck by lightning, there had been a thunder storm in the night. The only consolation was that she wouldn't have suffered.

I helped to lamb a flock of prize-winning pedigree Southdown sheep near Newmarket for several years. That breed resembles buddy teddy bears with short legs and woolly faces. I can't say I was fond of the breed, they needed a lot of attention, different snacks during the daybut lots of red rosettes was the result from the shows.

Nowadays it is vital that newborn lambs have colostrum containing antibodies. This flock seemed very slow in producing milk after lambing, and the farmer had a stock of tins of evaporated milk for humans to bottle the lambs with, all an extra chore. It must have done the trick though, as this method was used for several years. On our own farm, as on many others years ago, we just fed the lambs cow's milk, perhaps freshly milked from our house

cow, Lucy. Perhaps there were less bugs then for new lambs to pick up. Now it's expensive colostrum powder and lamb's milk. On one farm where i was lambing indoors, we had to inject every lamb born with penicillin to keep away the bugs. I am sure that is not allowed now.

One of the last official lambing jobs was in County Waterford, Ireland. I had heard of Waterford Crystal but saw none, just sheep, horses and local people. The locals on the farm were immensely friendly and kind. Before I left I was invited to one of the farm workers' homes, where he had a delightful family. The wife and their two daughters gave me a demonstration of Irish Dancing - memorable. Understand the accent caused difficulty!

The lambing job was very tough, several hundred sheep in different sheds, some with open sides with just wooden rails to keep the sheep in. I was on night duty, alone, and outside the sheds were foxes waiting to slip in and take a poor new-born lamb. The poor mother too-what a shock for her. I remember the eyes of the foxes shining red in the torchlight - they were like jackals. The farm manager did not try to reduce the foxes, for some unknown reason.

One Sunday the farm became a centre for horse-racing with swarms of people coming to watch and have a bet and a good time. Me being accustomed to going to church on a Sunday found it unusual, but I believe a lot of Catholics would have gone to Saturday night Mass instead. Who am I to judge? I probably caught up on sleep, ready to resume my night duties.

I realised why Ireland is called the Emerald Isle. When we turned the ewes and lambs out to pasture the grass was lush and so green it almost dazzled you. So some happy sheep!

In those days shops in England all shut in the late afternoon, but there they all stayed open until late and people gathered, chatting happily with each other. Another memory I had was the post boxes, all green. I am sure they all are still. I think I summoned up enough energy to write at least one letter home to tell them of life in the Emerald Isle. I kept in touch with the dancing family for a while after leaving and visited them just once later on - but never learned how to tap my feet the Irish way!



'Most people think I'm completely bonkers, A grown woman stopping to pick up conkers'

I may not win any poetry prizes for that one. I love the sheen and rich colours of conkers and I suspect they'll be ripening early this year. I'm glad to say that local children still seem to know the locations of good Horse Chestnut trees and I hope still know how to play 'conkers' (after writing their risk assessments). I also note the positions of Sweet Chestnuts in the forest and surrounding woodlands because I enjoy roast chestnuts. There are some on the Iron Age fort in Trimpley Woods – the rest you'll have to find for yourselves!

The bilberries ripened in July, the blackberries and damsons in August and this month we can look forward to rowan berries, sloes, crab apples and perhaps any ripe hazelnuts that have escaped the squirrels. Apple trees are few and far between in the Wyre Forest and most will be 'wildings' which have grown from discarded pips (an interesting connection with travellers of the past). They may have a wide variety of characteristics, while the true wild crab apple, Malus sylvestris, is a round-headed tree often with rather spiny twigs and small, tart green fruits. The latter are so rich in pectin that a few added to a fruit jam will ensure a good set.

Apples and other top fruits are enjoyed by a host of wildlife, especially birds such as Blackbirds, Missel Thrushes and Jays. When they start to rot (perhaps after a peck from one of these) they attract wasps, flies and butterflies.



Probably the best way for most of us to study the hornet is in pictures like this photo from *Erik Jorgensen*.

Hornets are amongst those enjoying the feast, and are a very good reason to be careful when apple-picking! Although they are huge (up to 3.5cm long) and intimidating-looking, I admire them. They sometimes find their way into the house and I can usually usher them out without any trouble. (The exception was when they built a nest in one of our fireplaces, but that's another story!) Their natural homes are holes in trees and so it's not surprising that they may choose to build in bird boxes or spaces in house walls. Their food consists of nectar, sap and fruit but they catch many invertebrates to feed to their larvae. Unlike the Asian Hornet, which preys on honey bees and other insects, they are almost wholly beneficial - a true friend to gardeners.







A reminder about the Government grants worth up to £5,000 for improving home insulation.

Vouchers worth up to £5,000 will be issued to homeowners in England to make their homes more energy efficient under a Government scheme being launched in September – here is the latest info we have following an update issued on 4 August. To qualify for any financial support, you will need to be installing at least one of the following "primary" improvements: Insulation, including solid wall, cavity wall, underfloor, loft or roof insulation. Low carbon heating, such as air-source or ground-source heat pumps, or solar thermal systems, which provide renewable ways of heating your home. 

Beating the Scammers

Do please read this article carefully and take in the advice Nigel Reid offers. Scams are really big business and I know because I've been taken in that we're all vulnerable. JR

This month we are going to lift the lid on Telephone Scams. These are targeted at anyone who has a telephone, landline or mobile, so the elderly and vulnerable who may not have internet access are often seen as easy prey for these criminals. These scams often appear to come from genuine sources and fall into several categories.

BANKING – where someone may call claiming to be from your bank telling you there is a problem with your account or debit/credit card.

ACTION: Hang up, wait a minute or two, and call the number your bank has given you to check if they have actually called you or not. Most likely they have not called you. Warning—do not give out your bank details or PIN number over the phone. A genuine call from the Bank will never ask for your PIN

HMRC – this is usually an automated call advising you that there is a tax payment overdue and if you don't take the action requested, you could face prosecution. You are usually asked to press 1 on your phone to be connected to an 'agent'.

ACTION: Do not press anything, just hang up. HMRC, formerly known as Inland Revenue, will never call you directly, they always write to you and usually quote your National Insurance number on the letter.

A N Y O T H E R G O V E R N M E N T DEPARTMENT such as DWP, DVLA or TV Licencing: These are less common but can still happen, The DVLA and TV Licencing ones tend to come in as emails.

ACTION: See last month's article on dealing with these emails.

POLICE AND OTHER AUTHORITY CALLS - We have become aware of a new telephone scam, usually in the form of an automated voice, purporting to be from the police telling the listener that HMRC have taken out a warrant for their arrest. The message then gives a warrant number and requests the listener to contact HMRC or in some cases a number that the scammer wantS you to call back on.

ACTION: Do not respond! Hang up immediately.

FAMILY/FRIEND/IMPOSTER SCAMS - The so-called "grandparent scam" is a popular one targeting older adults, and it's seen an In a fairly straightforward increase lately. plot, the person on the other line will pretend to be the grandson or granddaughter of the older victim. They'll then concoct a story ending with a request for immediate financial assistance. Often, tricked seniors will end up sending money via wire transfer to the scammers as a result. Even more disturbing, criminals who employ this type of scam are successful in part because they already have some of their potential victim's information, including grandchildren's names, phone numbers, and even addresses. These scammers have typically bought or stolen this personal information in order to sound legitimate to potential victims.

ACTION: Unless you are totally convinced this is a genuine family member (check by asking a personal question that only they and you would know). Otherwise hang up and call the known number that you have for the family member to verify.

These are just a sample of the main scams where the telephone is used to try and trick the victim. The main points to remember are:

- 1. Treat any calls you get from an unknown number or a withheld number with suspicion.
- 2. If in any doubt hang up and do not respond in any way to the caller.
- 3. If you suspect it is a scam caller, then block the number from your phone if you have that capability.
- 4. Call the ACTION FRAUD HOTLINE 0300 123 2040 to report it. The call is free.




