#### **ADRIAN SATTERLY**

Mr Satterly appeared at Shrewsbury Crown Court on August 19th in relation to 20 counts of theft, to which he had indicated his willingness to plead guilty to 15.

It was decided that the case be adjourned to allow further consideration of his guilty pleas by the Crown Prosecution Service.

The case will be listed on S e p t e m b e r 13 t h a t Shrewsbury for the CPS to confirm if the basis of Mr Satterly's pleas has been accepted. If the Crown Prosecution Service rejects the basis of the pleas, the case will go to trial.

## A VERY SPECIAL EVENING

It was a complete surprise. A Wednesday morning email from the Regal Theatre in Tenbury Wells, stating that Robert Plant and his new band Saving Grace, would be playing there in six days time.

I had never seen Robert Plant live, but had records going back to his days heading Led Zeppelin through to his latest. What I admire most about the man is his constant drive forwards with little or no reference to his past successes. Tickets would be on sale at noon on Thursday and I was number ten in the queue when I called the booking office at 12.00 precisely. In a fit of optimism I booked two tickets, certain I would find someone to share the experience.

I really should know better at my time of life, but a succession of calls and emails found nobody free to savour an evening with one of the best rock musicians. The editor of a magazine I used to write for suggested Rob Norton, which sounded good to me; she eventually traced him to the tent he was sleeping in in Wales! Damn it, I was going solo.

The Regal had thoughtfully made a video of the new oneway entry and exit, which seemed to work well. But it was slow and the 7.30 start time slipped by until a local trio came on stage at about 8.00 and got their support act under way. Expecting Robert Plant and Saving Grace, a session of mediocrity did not please.

The interval saw some heading for the bar, while we of advanced years looked for the toilet. The first steward sent us off to the left and the next direction was to go right and around the theatre. Hmm. I walked out, crossed the road to the public loos and was back in good time.

At about 9.00 the roadies had removed the opening group's kit and made room for the headliner. The band came on to applause, with vocalist Suzy Dian getting a very warm reception before the man himself just stepped out from the stage wings without any fanfare, but a really warm reception. This was the man we'd come to see, one of British rock's greatest, happy to entertain his local fans in a rural theatre with no display of ego or vanity. He was in his comfort zone.

If you haven't followed this man's career since his headlining days as vocalist and leader of Led Zeppelin, it's worth knowing that he has not coasted through life on past glories. That's for the likes of Status Quo; Plant has moved constantly on, listening and learning from musical sources all over the globe and presenting fresh sounds.

Please don't ask me to list the pieces Saving Grace offered through one and a half hours before they said "Goodnight', only to come back on stage as the audience stamped their feet and kept up a rhythmic applause. We were not ready to go home and they had to acknowledge the fact, singing three more numbers before we all accepted that the night was over and it was home time.

Walking out in a daze of enjoyment, I reflected on my expensive evening, paying for two seats and occupying just one. But that simply didn't matter; I'd had the best musical evening of many years and it was worth every penny. Jim Reynolds

# Cleobury Mortimer Town Council are looking for sites for inclusion in the Cleobury Mortimer Neighbourhood Development Plan.

Shropshire Council has identified a need for another 120-130 houses in Cleobury up to 2038. The Town Council want to ensure that the best sites come forward and have opted to allocate the land in the Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) rather than leave the job to Shropshire Council.

In its confidential meeting on 13<sup>th</sup> July 2021, ratified formally in the Full Council meeting of 2<sup>nd</sup> August, the Town Council agreed a motion to suspend the public consultation of the Cleobury Mortimer NDP. The Town Council are concerned about the possible withdrawal of one site, and the potential traffic impact of other sites that were put forward and therefore there shall be a new "call for sites" in support of the NDP, followed by another public consultation to be organised by the steering group.

Ideally, the Town Council are seeking land of at least 6.5 ha plus additional provision of open areas for public recreation and wildlife improvements. The Town will also need additional land for Cemetery space to ensure we have sufficient capacity for the next 100 years. The proposed employment zone extension at New House Farm remains unchanged and will form part of the new NDP.

This is a very important initiative for our community and we are looking for willing landowners to come forward with proposals for land that they think will be suitable to ensure a good outcome for our community in coming decades.

Landowners with suitable land have been asked to visit the Neighbourhood Plan page on the Cleobury Mortimer Town Council website (<u>www.cleobury.org.uk</u>) to view the Assessment Methodology document which sets out the necessary information.

The call for sites will finish at 12:00 midday on Friday, 17<sup>th</sup> September 2021 after which the sites proposed will be assessed by an independent consultant and the recommendations will be put forward to the Town Council. The NDP will be updated and a new public consultation will take place before Christmas.



# CATHERTON COMMON UPDATE

Often people look at an area of Common such as Catherton and imagine it is an area of wasteland that no one owns. no one cares about and is not particularly important. Sometimes even to the extent that it doesn't matter if they burn some of their rubbish on it or leave their garden or household rubbish to rot down. In fact, commons are very fragile habitats that can easily be damaged by an act of carelessness and are usually rare and valuable. There are very few commons where the landowner is not known, in these cases the local authority looks after them.

I imagine most of you will be aware that Catherton Common is a very important Nature Reserve owned by Shropshire Wildlife Trust with a wealth of important habitats, birds, insects and animals. To mention but a few there are mires, wet and dry heathland, small pearl bordered fritillary butterflies, mats of sundew, curlews and a collection of almost all of Britain's amphibians and reptiles.

What is perhaps less well known is that the whole reserve is Common Land and a lot of it is a Site of Special Scientific Interest and that both of those designations have legal implications. The laws around Common Land and SSSI are quite strict and can be very complicated. Often activities or changes to the land such as digging holes, repairing tracks, cutting vegetation, etc require special consent from Natural England or the Secretary of State as well as from the landowner. even access across the land is very restricted and often requires special permission.

If you are planning any changes that may impact on Catherton Common please get in touch with SWT for help and advice. There is also a lot of information about Common Land and SSSI on the internet. *Clive Dean*





# Philip Dunne's Letter from Westminster

With the upcoming COP26 UN Climate Conference in Glasgow in November, more focus is rightly being placed on what steps we can take beforehand to demonstrate global leadership in the fight against climate change.

The Prime Minister laid out his vision of a Green Industrial Revolution last year, and shortly thereafter published an Energy White Paper to set the framework for the next critical phase of renewable energy rollout. But there remain several detailed strategies of how to get there still awaiting publication, now expected in coming weeks, as part of the preparation for COP26.

Last month the UN's Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) released their latest report, making clear the impact of human activity on global temperatures, and the vital need to take action to avoid a climate catastrophe.

As Chairman of the Environmental Audit Committee, I have been vocal in saying the government needs to meet rhetoric with action. The private sector, galvanised by a mix of greater awareness of environmental issues by senior management and the realisation customers expect companies to play a role in combatting climate change, is ready and willing to invest. But government needs to set a clear direction, to drive investment into net zero technologies.

Unfortunately, industry's confidence has taken several knocks by delayed strategies and some cancellation of policies. The Green Homes Grant voucher scheme for owner occupiers to make energy efficiency improvements for their homes, since cancelled, was overly bureaucratic, and proved difficult to access for both building contractors and homeowners.

Notwithstanding this, to its credit the government has outlined significant ambition on net zero. But there are deep rooted challenges. There remains a shortage of skills in green engineering disciplines, the green automotive sector and qualified installers for energy efficiency measures like heat pumps or insulation retrofits.

The Environmental Audit Committee has undertaken a number of inquiries to help inform debate around achieving Net Zero Britain, and to provide recommendations to government on how to focus policy. Homes account for 20% of the UK's greenhouse gas emissions, but there is significant underestimation in government of the cost of addressing this, and we are still awaiting a Heat & Buildings Strategy.

To support the move to electric vehicles, we must invest in Gigafactory capacity for battery production and EV charging capacity, as other countries have. There have been some encouraging announcements on investment in battery plants recently. But grid connection and regulatory issues continue to hold back community energy schemes, as well as tidal power and further progress in our offshore wind sector – which has proven a real UK success story.

Of course, COP26 is an international conference, and fostering international commitments to combat climate change must be the focus. The UK has made admirable progress in cutting our emissions while growing the economy. So we are well placed to demonstrate to developing nations that combatting climate change does not mean curtailing growth or improving living standards for their citizens. The UK government must seek to be a benchmark to inspire others.

I have been promoting community engagement in COP26, including through presenting the COP26 President, Alok Sharma MP, with a community action plan from South Shropshire Climate Action. I have encouraged local schools to give pupils the opportunity to learn more about COP26 and the issues it is seeking to address. Next month I am hoping to arrange screening locally an educational film on the environment for young people.

#### BRIDGNORTH HIGHWAYS DEPOT

Linda Price wrote to say that she supports Matt Sheehan's move against the closure of our local highways depot. Not a happy prospect for the winter! Here's what she said:

Like me, you have probably been stranded on the roads when snow and ice have taken the Highways Staff by surprise. However, in my experience they have been co operative, such as one particularly icy January, when my father died, they agreed to provide salt to enable the hearse to start from our home in Bagginswood. I'm not convinced that staff driving out of Craven Arms depot will perform as well, even if they reach remote areas of south east Shropshire.

In my opinion, the decision has been made by people who have no experience of the areas we live in. I travelled between Bagginswood and Bridgnorth to school, which during heavy snowfall resulted in walking f r o m S i x A s h e s t o Bagginswood and being ordered to push a 52 seater coach up Nortons End bank. Having lived in Bridgnorth for 23 years and travelled to work in Shifnal, Telford, Church Stretton, Broseley and Shrewsbury, I have experienced some scary moments. With the proposed development in Bridgnorth and surrounding areas, I believe Shropshire needs a depot in this challenging landscape.

Far from being political, I am being practical. I now travel from Shrewsbury to Bagginswood at least once a week, if not more to care for my mother who continues to reside in Bagginswood. She needs support every week, not just in fair weather.

In summary, I wondered if it was possible to nudge a few readers into signing the epetition, in order to bring the proposal to the agenda for discussion by people who represent the area? I must admit, I needed a push to remind me how to do this and the link was provided for me. *Linda Price*

#### Simon Morton in the Garden.

Here's a fascinating fact to drop into conversation when the topics of the weather or which flavour of vaccination you got runs dry - a single bulb for the (admittedly rare) Semper Augustus tulip fetched a price of 10,000 Dutch Guilders in January 1637. For some context, the same amount of Dutch wonga would have been bought you one of the grandest homes on the most fashionable canals in Amsterdam, complete with coach house and 80-foot long garden.

#### For a single bulb.

While not on the same scale, bulbs have loomed large in my life for the last week, too. It all started when doing the 'big shop' in Kidderminster. There, amongst the usual Summer themed paraphernalia - water pistols, beach balls, blow-up unicorns were bag upon bag of daffodil bulbs. Tantalising me. Taunting me.

#### In August. August!

That's right - the schools haven't even gone back, yet those clever retailers are already guilting gardeners into planning their bulbs for next year.

Of course, that feeling that you're behind on your homework comes with the territory as a gardener. There never seem to be quite enough hours in the day. Rare is it that you get a chance to put your feet up and actually enjoy your garden, as most of the time you're busy attempting to tick deadheading/ pruning/ digging/ weeding/ protecting/ mulching/ planning off your list. I acknowledge that this last sentence might sound like a little bit of a moan, but the fact is that, perversely, we gardeners rather like the enforced momentum that each season brings. The never-ending jobs keep us on the straight and narrow and out of the pub. No rest for the wicked and all that...


The only thing is (and yes, I recognise that *this may be an age-related condition*) is that I'm pretty convinced that it was only a few short months ago that I was wringing my hands in despair at the poor showing of my freshly dug tulip beds. A thousand or so bulbs were carefully placed into beautifully tilled patches of soil, each holding the promise of glorious blooms this Spring. After a soggy winter and a lot of waiting, the much-anticipated display was, on the whole, underwhelming. I took solace in the odd flurry of colour here and there, but on the whole, we'd probably be best to file the whole experience under the heading 'patchy'.

Ever the confident soul, I've managed to convince myself that the poor showing has nothing to do with my planting technique (*just how deep should they go? Asking for a friend...*) or the fact that the squirrels looked particularly well fed throughout the winter. Nope - let's blame it on the dodgy batch of tulips bought in a panic from an eBay seller with less than perfect credentials (1 star is better than none at all, right?).

Things could be worse - at least I didn't fork out 10,000 Dutch Guilders. Now that would have been tricky to explain away to my wife.

So with optimism that only a gardener can muster, here's hoping that by planning and buying way ahead (yes, in August), I can be assured of top-notch tulips to bring a little more colour in the garden at some point in 2022. It all depends, of course, on me getting them in the ground in time, but that's another story...

In September there is often some lovely, warm weather still to come but the shortening day length sends us indoors in the evenings and a heavy dew often greets us in the mornings. This is the month when many British plants and animals switch from the serious business of reproduction to strategies for surviving the winter.



All through the summer, bats have been roosting among the roof tiles and in the farm's out-buildings. Their foraging flights around the buildings at dusk are visible through our uncurtained windows, and sometimes, when insomnia strikes on a warm night, I wander into the garden to see the stars and watch the bats' rapid acrobatics as they home in on their prey using echolocation. 10 species of bat have been recorded in the Wyre Forest, possibly more, but I think most of the bats I see are tiny Common and Soprano Pipistrelles or Brown Long-eared Bats (like that in the photo). I have no evidence to say whether or not any of these breed at the farm, although a nice, warm loft makes for a very desirable bat residence, but the mature oak trees around us are very likely to provide suitable sites too. Features such as woodpecker or rot holes, torn branches, loose bark and dense ivy or honeysuckle growth, all

enhance a tree's attraction as a bat residence, and the older a tree is, the more likely it is to have them. The local woods are further enhanced by bat boxes, just in case.

From May to August females group together and seek out warm, secure maternity roosts in which to give birth to their single pup. The babies are suckled by their mothers for four to five weeks, after which they will leave the nest to forage for their food. Although bats may move to different roosts during the course of the year, the mothers are very sensitive during the breeding season and may abandon their young if disturbed.

At this time of year, with the breeding season over, the males and females share roosts and mate, but the sperm is stored by the female and embryo development only begins in the spring. Soon adults and young will be finding places to hibernate, which need to be cooler than the maternity roosts. Whether in buildings, trees or caves all bat roosts are protected by law and we are obliged to check for their presence before development or tree felling can go ahead.

September is a good time to get the garden pond ready for winter, before its resident creatures start to hibernate in the mud and surrounding stony crevices. Some of the plants, such as the water lilies, have put on exuberant growth and need 'a good hack'. It would also be a good idea to scoop out some of the sludge that has accumulated at the bottom....but maybe I'll leave that for another year!





The scams just keep on coming and crime never stops, never takes a rest, it's happening 24 seven. It would seem that the focus these days is on email and mobile phone scams and by mobile phone I mean texts or SMS messages that come through with a very genuine look about them. For the uninitiated, quite worrying. Despite the fact that major companies and big names seem to appear regularly on these message scams it is obvious that they are not doing enough about it, but as an individual if your awareness is sufficiently high, you won't be beaten by them. This month I would like to illustrate the level of sophistication with this live example that came to my attention a few days ago. The 'victim' was a local resident, who I will not name but this account was written in the first person. I have annotated where I think there are key messages which I have explained at the end.

Last week I fell victim to a very clever bank scam. I received a call from " my bank's fraud team" and so, I said I understand that the bank never calls a customer. He said it was urgent because my accounts were being attacked and they had been trying to get hold of me for the last couple of hours; read my messages. So I read my messages and sure enough I had two apparently genuine 1\* ones from my bank asking if I'd made transactions for two different very high cost purchases. I hadn't. <sup>2\*</sup> This man assured me he was genuine and told me my full name, date of birth, postal and email addresses, and bank account numbers, etc. 3\* He said " I'll send your house phone an automated call, ring, ring, it came and sure enough it was my bank! 4\* He also sent me another message on my mobile which came onto the chat stream I'd previously had from my bank. More of my money was apparently being sent out of my accounts! I became stressed and confused. Then he told me where he reckoned the scammer had got my bank card details from and sure enough he gave me the name of someone I'd paid a small amount to a few weeks ago but the item I had ordered and paid for had never arrived. 5\*Due to the high number of people reporting scams I had not managed to report this crook and so when this chap mentioned the name I told him about the non -delivery. It all made sense to me. Then he asked me to take some details from him and gave me a name, sort code and bank account number which he asked me to pay a couple of thousand pounds to via the department he was going to put me through to, I was just helping him catch a bank worker who was putting money into his own account rather than paying into the account the paying customer wants.<sup>6\*</sup>At this point I was not happy risking my money so I said my phone battery was dying and I cut him off. I rang the help number on my bank card and found that I was right that the bank NEVER phones customers, and that my accounts had all been targeted but the bank were suspicious and had sent me the two messages which I had seen while talking to this man. This whole saga lasted from 5:30pm until 1:25am the next morning! I hadn't eaten or had a drink since I got home that afternoon. I was a nervous wreck the next day, or should I say later that same day! I was lucky, my real bank refused to pay any of the transactions that I said I hadn't made, replaced all my bank cards immediately (I got the new ones the following morning!) So PLEASE don't get caught out like I did. The scammers are getting very clever at tricking us. If you get a call from someone saying they are from your bank, say thanks and put the phone down and call your bank yourself.7\* NOTES:

- 1. This confused the customer as it's not common for scammers to have that capability to send Text messages like this. In this case these were coincidentally genuine messages.
- 2. In this case the customer had not made the transactions but the scammer with her bank details had made them, presumably to have the goods sent to a different address.
- 3. The scammer most likely obtained sufficient details of the customer to convince them. This is done by crooks through 'data mining' and matching personal details to build a convincing profile of someone.
- 4. Getting enough personal data about someone makes it much easier for scammers to impersonate and break through their personal social media accounts.
- 5. The message here is if you have ordered goods and they don't arrive, the moment you become suspicious call and report it through the channels I have already written about.
- 6. The customer (victim) became suspicious enough to stop the call and then call a genuine number for her bank. Banks publish these numbers on all their paperwork. Call the number and ask to be put through to the Fraud Department.
- 7. As in 6. If in doubt stop and check with your bank or whatever using only a number you know is genuine.


